- CBDT gets govt-honour
 - The Central Board of Direct Taxes was honoured by Minister of State for Personnel Jitendra Singh for successfully resolving public grievances.
 - The awards given to the CBDT was based on the theme of appreciation to the Ministries or Departments.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ The CBDT is the apex policy making body for the Income Tax department.
- Konsam Ormila Devi bags Gold
 - India's Konsam Ormila Devi bagged a gold medal in 44kg weight category of the Commonwealth Youth (boys & girls) weightlifting championships, held at Gold Coast, Australia.
 - Ormila lifted 57kg in snatch and 76kg in clean and jerk for an overall effort of 133kg, to finish on the top of the podium.
 - With this effort, Ormila has registered her best lift so far.

• Central scheme for senior citizens













- Union minister Thawarchand Gehlot launched a scheme that provides for physical aids and assisted-living devices for senior citizens belonging to the BPL category in Gujarat.
- The centrally-sponsored scheme, `Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana', was unveiled on April 1 this year.
- Under the scheme, aids and assisted-living devices like walking sticks, elbow crutches etc are provided free of cost.
- Ryzen Pro processors
 - AMD presented a new line of microprocessor chips called 'Ryzen Pro' for commercial desktop workstations to be available in India and other countries by end of 2017.
 - The Ryzen Pro desktop processor is an 8 core and 16 thread CPU and much faster than the rival Intel's 'Core i7'.
 - The new Ryzen Pro processors are for commercial usage.
- Trump to end Dreamers Program
 - Donald Trump has decided to scrap a program giving work permits to people who came to the United States illegally as children.
 - The program, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, was established in 2012.
 - DACA, as it is usually referred to, protected young immigrants who came to the U.S. as children without legal status.

• Forecasting Dengue

- Scientists have developed a system that can predict the spread of dengue in different parts of India.
- Study focuses on changes in a factor called extrinsic incubation period of the dengue virus, by taking into account daily and monthly mean temperatures different climatic zones.

- Tigers will roar again at Buxa Tiger Reserve in West Bengal.
- Located in Alipurduar district, the reserve, parts of which border Bhutan, has been identified for the tiger augmentation programme by the National Tiger Conservation Authority.
- Notified as a tiger reserve in 1983, Buxa consists of moist, deciduous and evergreen forests.

• New CEO Of Novartis

- Vasant Narasimhan will be elevated as chief executive of Novartis in February 2018.
- He joined Novartis in 2005 and has held numerous leadership positions in development and commercial functions.
- o Mr Narasimhan had also served as a consultant at McKinsey & Company.

Iran tests its homegrown air defence

- Iran has tested its home grown air defence system, designed to match the Russian S-300, the head of the Revolutionary Guards' air defence has said.
- Bavar (which means "belief") is Tehran's first long-range missile defence system, and is set to be operational by March 2018.
- In 2010, Iran began manufacturing Bavar-373 after the purchase of the S-300 from Russia was suspended.

Alphons Kannanthanam- Min for Tourism

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi's new man to handle tourism, an area where the NDA government has launched a number of projects over the last two years, is Alphons Kannanthanam.
- He replaces Mahesh Sharma, who retains his post as MoS Culture.
- Known for his strong anti-corruption stance, the 64-year- old also featured in Time magazine's list of 100 Young Global Leaders in 1994.

• Sports Minister appointed

 Rajyavardhan Rathore replaced Vijay Goel as the new Sports Minister in the latest cabinet reshuffle of the Narendra Modi govt.

- Rathore was named as MoS (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports; and Minister of State in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.
- \circ $\,$ Rathore had won the silver medal at the 2004 Olympics.

• Tejasvi Duduka wins US Open

- Tejasvi Duduka from Hyderabad won the women's singles of U.S. Open Grand Slam Carrom tournament.
- Earlier, she had won the Telangana State Women's singles title in Nizamabad.
- In the men's singles, Vemuri Anil Kumar of India finished runner up for the second year in the U.S Open. It was won by former National Champion
 Radhakrishnan.

Def Ministry to procure weapons from HAL

- The Ministry of Defence will buy 41 more ALH advanced light helicopters from public sector Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd.
- The Rs. 6,100-crore order signed recently includes 40 of the indigenously developed ALHs for the Army and one for the Navy.
- In March, HAL had signed a contract for supply of 32 ALHs to boost the maritime security capabilities of the Navy and the Coast Guard.
- 1st wicket keeper to have 100 stumpings
 - Former India skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni became the first wicketkeeper in the history of One-day Internationals to effect 100 stumpings.
 - He surpassed the record of Kumar Sangakkara who has the record of 99 stumpings.
 - Dhoni, recently, became the sixth Indian player to play 300 matches in the 50-over format.
- Shirish Pai passes away















- Noted poet Shirish Pai, credited with introducing 'Haiku' to the Marathi speaking world, passed away in Mumbai.
- Born in 1929, Pai was the daughter of noted writer-journalist 'Acharya' Pralhad Keshav Atre.
- She started writing 'Haiku' in 1975. She studied Japanese 'Haiku', its origin and nature and published five Marathi 'Haiku' books.
- Australia and Timor-Leste strike deal
 - Australia and Timor-Leste have reached a historic agreement, concluding a long-running and bitter maritime boundary dispute over the Timor Sea through conciliation.
 - The deal clarifies the legal status of the Greater Sunrise gas fields, and
 establishes a regime to develop and share revenue from the resource.
 - Timor sea holds 9tn cubic feet of gas.
- World's most powerful X-ray laser
 - The world's largest and powerful X-ray laser- European X-ray Free Electron Laser presented in Hamburg, Germany.
 - The XEFL is series of 3.4-kilometer tunnels up to 38 meters underground near the city of Hamburg.
 - It took 8 years to build 1.5-billion-euro facility.
 - XFEL is the world's third major X-ray laser facility
- 2017 Italian Grand Prix
 - Lewis Hamilton heaped praise on Mercedes after he and Valtteri Bottas outclassed Ferrari on their 70th anniversary at the Italian Grand Prix.
 - Lewis Hamilton was first, while Valtteri Bottas and Sebastian Vettel came second and third respectively.
 - The 2017 Italian Grand Prixwas the Formula One motor race held on 3
 September 2017 at the Autodromo Nazionale Monza in Monza, Italy.
- India's first woman defence minister













- Thirty-five years since India's defence ministry last saw a woman at its helm, there is another: Nirmala Sitharaman.
- Until now, the only woman to head India' defence ministry was Indira Gandhi: first in 1975 and again in 1980-82.
- \circ She joined the BJP in 2008.
- Before her elevation she was the Union Commerce Minister.
- TRAPPIST-1 planets likely to have water
 - The Earth-sized planets orbiting the TRAPPIST-1 dwarf star may have substantial amounts of water and could be habitable.
 - They had used Hubble Space Telescope, a joint project of European Space Agency & NASA.
 - The seven Earth-sized planets (named TRAPPIST-1b, c, d, e, f, g and h) were discovered in 2017.
