- Gokul to be Signed by NBA G-League Side
 - Gokul Natesan is the 97th pick in the NBA draft.
 - He became the second Indian-origin player to be signed by an NBA G-League side.
 - Natesan, 23, was picked by Canton Charge, a minor league affiliate team of Cleveland Cavaliers, completing a remarkable journey of the computer science graduate, who shuffled between playing college basketball and designing apps.
- EDII bags AICTE award
 - Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII) has received an award from All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) for supporting start-ups.

- The award was given during the International Science Festival's Start-up Summit
 2017 at Chennai.

• Jacinda became PM of New Zealand

- o Jacinda Ardern was officially sworn in as the Prime Minister of New Zealand.
- o At the age of 37, Ardern is the youngest New Zealand PM in 150 years.
- She is also the country's third woman leader and says she will lead a government that is active, focused, empathetic and strong. This was the first time New Zealand adopted proportional voting since 1996.

• RIL Cross Rs 6 Trillion Market Capital

- Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) became the first Indian company to cross Rs 6
 trillion market capitalization after its shares surged over 75% so far this year and hit a fresh lifetime high.
- Currently, its market cap is at Rs 6.02 trillion.
- The recent rally in the stock was due to tariff hike by its telecom arm Reliance Jio which, analysts expect, will improve the company's profitability.

Jeff Bezos: World's richest person

- According to Forbes magazine, Jeff Bezos surpassed Bill Gates as the richest person in the world.
- The fortune of Amazon's founder reached some \$90.6 billion, compared with the
 \$90.1 billion that the online edition of the magazine attributes to Gates.
- This is not the first time that Bezos has outpaced Gates it previously happened in July 2017 when Amazon shares hit a historic high.

• Infantry Day - 27 October

- o On 27th October 2017, Infantry Day was celebrated by the Indian Army.
- Wellington Military Station celebrated the 71st Infantry Day on 27th October
 2017. A wreath laying ceremony (laying flowers at a memorial site) was organized at the war memorial of the Madras Regimental Centre.
- Wreaths were laid in the honour of infantry men who made sacrifice for India.

- On 27th October 2017, Malayalam writer Punathil Kunjabdulla passed away at a private hospital, in Kozhikode, Kerala.
- o Kunjabdulla was suffering from an aging-associated disease for a long time.
- He was a doctor by profession. He was a well-known Malayalam writer. He had published more than 45 books, including 7 novels, 15 short story collections, memoirs, an autobiography and travelogues.

· Manikchand Group chairman died

- Rasiklal Dhariwal, an industrialist popularly known as the 'gutkha baron', died due to parotid gland cancer, at Ruby Hall Clinic, in Pune.
- o Rasiklal Dhariwal was 78 years old. He died due to parotid gland cancer.
- He is survived by his wife, son and four daughters. Rasiklal Dhariwal was the chairman of Manikchand group of companies. He was born in Shirur tehsil of Pune district.

Amanpreet wins bronze at ISSF World Cup

- India's Amanpreet Singh secured third place in the 50-metre pistol final at the
 International Shooting Sport Federation World Cup Final in Delhi on October 27,
 2017.
- o He shot 76 out of 80 targets, three behind gold medallist Hu Binyuan (79).
- Amanpreet shot 202.2 to win the bronze in the final of men's 50m pistol at the Dr Karni Singh Shooting ranges.

• Jurassic-era 'fish lizard' fossil found

- In almost completely fossilized skeleton of 'fish lizard', a type of marine reptile that lived in the Jurassic-era, has been discovered for the first time in India from Kutch district of Gujarat.
- The skeleton was discovered by a team of Indo-German geologists near the Kaas hills of Bhuj town.
- After a year-long study experts have concluded that fossil was of ichthyosaur from the Jurassic era.

Naidu receives 'Golden Peacock Award'

 Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu received the Golden Peacock Award, at the 17th London Global Convention, held in London.

- The Golden Peacock Award was instituted by the Institute of Directors (IOD) of India in 1991.

• First SAP Leonardo Centre in Bengaluru

- $\circ~$ SAP launched the Asia Pacific Japan region's first SAP Leonardo Center, in Bengaluru.
- The Leonardo Centre in Bengaluru is the first in Asia Pacific Japan region and the fourth SAP Leonardo Center globally.
- The Leonardo Centre in Bengaluru will consist of digital transformation elements like IoT, Blockchain, Analytics, Machine Learning, Big Data, Data Intelligence and SAP Cloud Platform.

ADB signs \$65.5 mn Loan with GOI

- Asian Development Bank has signed a USD 65.5 million loan agreement with Government of India for checking coastal erosion on the western coast of Karnataka.
- This is the second tranche of a USD 250 million financing facility under the Sustainable Coastal Protection and Management Investment Programme.
- Funds procured through this loan will be deployed for immediate coastal protection needs.

• India to build houses in Sri Lanka

- India and Sri Lanka signed two agreements for construction of 1,200 houses through 50 model villages in Sri Lanka.
- 1200 houses will be constructed with Indian grant assistance of 600 million rupees.
- Indian Government had committed 50000 houses for the Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in the war-affected Northern and Eastern part of Sri Lanka.

Burundi becomes 1st country to leave ICC

African country Burundi has withdrawn from International Criminal Court (ICC)
 with effect from October 27, 2017 and has thus become the first nation to do so.

• India, US to implement HOSTAC

- In a bid to strengthen maritime security, India and the United States have agreed to implement the programme for Helicopter Operations from Ships other Than Aircraft Carriers (HOSTAC).
- o India, US to implement HOSTAC to strengthen maritime security.
- This decision was taken during a meeting between Indian Defense Minister, Ms.
 Nirmala Sitharama and US Secretary of Defence Jim Mattis.

Centre for Disaster Research at JNU

- Shri Kiren Rijiju inaugurated the Special Centre for Disaster Research at Jawaharlal Nehru University in Delhi.
- The centre will offer Masters and Doctorate programmes in Disaster Risk Management.
- For the first year, the centre will focus on disaster research in North Eastern states of India.
- He also released the book 'Disaster Law, Emerging Thresholds' by Prof. Amita Singh.

· Railway's first set of solar plants

- Piyush Goyal launched railway's first set of solar plants with a total capacity of 5
 megawatt peak installed on the roof tops of Hazrat Nizamuddin, New Delhi,
 Anand Vihar and Delhi railway stations.
- Plants were inaugurated at the International Conference on Green Initiatives and Railway Electrification.
- o These plants will generate will generate 76.5 lakh units of solar power per year.

• Conference on Consumer Protection

 Modi inaugurated 2-day International Conference on Consumer Protection for east, south and Southeast Asian countries in New Delhi.
