Important Current Affairs 12th November 2017

• First woman President of Nasscom

- National Association of Software and Services Companies (Nasscom) has named Debjani Ghosh as its President-Designate, who will succeed R Chandrashekhar after completion of his tenure in March next year.
- Ghosh, former managing director of Intel South Asia, will be the first woman President of Nasscom.
- Ghosh has been a member of Nasscom's Executive Council and a trustee of Nasscom Foundation.
- Second national judicial pay commission
 - Union cabinet chaired by PM Modi approved the appointment of 2nd national judicial pay commission for subordinate judiciary.













- Commission will decide on a salary hike for almost 21,000 judges of the subordinate judiciary level.
- Commission is to be headed by retired justice of Supreme Court, J.P.Venkatrama Reddi. R. Basant, a former judge of Kerala high court is also a member of the commission
- Creation of National Testing Agency
 - The Union Cabinet has approved the creation of a National Testing Agency (NTA) to conduct entrance examinations for higher educational institutions.
 - Its creation will relieve CBSE which conducts exams like the NEET and AICTE of the burden of conducting entrance tests.
 - The NTA will begin by conducting exams managed by the CBSE and gradually conduct other examinations too.
- 1.3 lakh Indians book ticket to Mars
 - More than 1.3 lakh Indians have booked a flight to Mars which is a part of National Aeronautics & Space Administration's InSight mission.
 - US had the most number of people sending their names followed by China & India
 - InSight, scheduled to land on Mars on 26 Nov, next year, will be the 1st mission to look deep beneath the Martian surface, studying planet's interior by listening for marsquakes

Cooperation in Indo-Pacific Region

- Officials from India, Australia, the US and Japan met and discussed issues relating to cooperation in the Indo-Pacific region.
- It is seen as a first move to set up a quadrilateral grouping to pursue common interests in the strategically key area.
- The move to set up the quadrilateral comes in the backdrop of growing Chinese assertiveness in the South China Sea.

- The first Nordic-Baltic youth film festival will begin in Delhi on 13th November, showcasing a diverse mix of some of the most celebrated and Oscar nominated movies from the region.
- The festival will give the Indian audience an opportunity to connect with these countries and strengthen the cultural bond.
- The festival will open with Land of Mine from Denmark, an Oscarnominated film.

• Mumbai to host ABA Summit

- For the first time, Mumbai will host the 34th annual conference of the Asian Bankers Association.
- The 2 day conference will be held in the megapolis from November 16 & will
 be hosted by State Bank, with the theme of 'Asia's turn to transform.
- Founded in 1981, ABA serves as a forum for advancing the cause of the banking industry and promote regional economic cooperation across the continent.

Twitter doubles length of display name

- Twitter has more than doubled its count for users' display names from 20 to 50 characters.
- It comes days after the social media giant ended the iconic 140-character tweet limit.
- The change comes as a relief to many users who have bigger names or want to add colour to their names.
- P-notes investment drops to 8-year low
 - Investments in Indian capital market through participatory notes (P-notes) plunged to an 8 year low of Rs1.23 lakh crore at September-end.
 - P-notes are issued by registered foreign portfolio investors to overseas players who wish to be part of Indian stock market without registering themselves directly.











Over past few months, Sebi has taken several measures to stop misuse of the P-notes.

• Varanasi is the most polluted city

- A report by the Central Pollution Control Board has found that the air quality of holy city Varanasi is most polluted among the 42 cities monitored recently.
- Varanasi's Air Quality Index was at an alarming 491, followed by Gurugram at 480, and Delhi at 468.
- Stubble burning by farmers in Punjab & Haryana are speculated to have added to the factors causing pollution in northern belt of India.

• Air India gets ₹1,500-cr loan from BOI

- Air India has received a loan worth of ₹1,500 crore from Bank of India to meet urgent working capital needs.
- In the last nearly three months, at least two public sector lenders Bank of India and Punjab National Bank have provided loans to the airline.
- Air India is surviving on taxpayers' money under the bailout package extended by the previous UPA government in 2012.

• Federal Bank gets RBI nod to open office

- Federal Bank has obtained RBI approval to open representative offices at Kuwait and Singapore.
- With the opening of these offices, the Bank will be able to widen its services to NRI diaspora and also enhance the international visibility of the Bank.
- The bank has been the preferred banker for NRIs and the NRI friendly measures have resulted in increasing inflow of foreign remittances.

• UNESCO confirms Azoulay as the new chief

UNESCO's member States have voted to confirm nomination of former
 French Culture Minister Audrey Azoulay as the body's new leader













- Her nomination was confirmed in Oct by members of the agency's board, making her the organization's 2nd woman director-general
- Azoulay is the successor of Irina Bokova, who served as UNESCO's 1st female director-general & who is expected to finish her term in Nov.
- Not to pursue Islamic banking in India
 - RBI has decided not to pursue a proposal for introduction of Islamic banking in the country.
 - Islamic or Sharia banking is a finance system based on the principles of not charging interest, which is prohibited under Islam.
 - Taking into account, wider & equal opportunities available to all citizens to access banking & financial services, RBI has decided not to pursue the proposal further.

MS Dhoni launches global cricket academy

- Mahendra Singh Dhoni has inaugurated his first global cricket academy in the bustling metropolis of Dubai.
- The facility named the MS Dhoni Cricket Academy (MSDCA) will have coaches from India to train the wards.
- It is a joint venture of Dubai-based Pacific Sports Club and Aarka Sports Club which has been in operation for a couple of months at the Springdales School in Al Quoz.

• Delhi govt 'defers' odd-even

- Delhi govt has called off the odd-even scheme, which was to be implemented from 13th Nov, after the National Green Tribunal ordered withdrawal of exemptions under it.
- The decision came in view of the directive by NGT, which ordered withdrawal of all exemptions, including to two-wheeler riders & woman-only vehicles.
- Trucks and two- wheelers are the major polluters in Delhi.

- Veteran cyclist Ashok Khale, who was recently injured in an accident on the Sion-Panvel highway, died in a hospital during treatment.
- Khale, won several medals for cycle-riding in state and national-level championships and was also the recipient of the Shiv Chhatrapati award.
- He had represented India in Giro d'Italia event and was also called as the King of the Ghats.

Modi leaves to attend ASEAN Summit

- PM Modi has left for Philippines, where he will participate in various bilateral & multilateral programmes, including India- ASEAN Summit.
- Modi would also take part in celebrations of the 50th anniversary of ASEAN,
 RCEP Leaders' Meeting & ASEAN Business & Investment Summit.
- The 10-member grouping ASEAN & India comprise a total population of 1.85 bn people which is 1/4th of global population.
- Sur<mark>endra Ku</mark>mar Sinha resigns
 - Bangladesh Chief Justice Surendra Sinha has resigned amid criticism over a Supreme Court verdict which scrapped Parliament's power to remove judges on grounds of misconduct & incapacity.
 - Sinha whose term was scheduled to expire in Jan next year is the 1st top judge of the country to step down.
 - SC has issued a statement saying he is facing 11 charges including money laundering & corruption.

• Home Ministry sets up two new divisions

- Union Home Ministry has formed 2 new divisions to exclusively deal with emerging security challenges such as radicalization & cyber crime
- CTCR wing will focus on tracking & assessing online reach of global terrorist outfits & devising strategies to counter their propaganda
- CIS division will monitor online crimes & threats including cyber fraud, hacking & suggest ways to minimize & fight them
