## **Important Current Affairs 22nd November 2017**

### • Feroz Shah Kotla gates to be renamed

- o The Delhi and District Cricket Association (DDCA) has decided to name the Gate No. 3 and 4 of the Ferozshah Kotla stadium after Anjum Chopra.
- o Chopra has represented India in six World Cups.
- In addition to that, the DDCA has planned to name two stands of the stadium after former India captain Bishan Singh Bedi and former India all-rounder Mohinder Amarnath.

# • Ira appointed DG of Doordarshan News

 Ira Joshi was appointed as the Director General of Doordarshan News following the retirement of Veena Jain.











- Earlier, Ira Joshi was the Press Information Bureau (PIB) director general.
- PIB Director General Ghanshyam Goel has been made the new Director General of Directorate of Advertising and Visual Publicity (DAVP),
   replacing Esther Kar, who was put on compulsory wait.

## • Mastercard, Mswipe tie-up

- Mswipe, a domestic maker of Point of Sale (PoS) terminals, has partnered
  MasterCard to digitize merchant acquisition and can now enable a
  shopkeeper anywhere in India to acquire a card swipe machine.
- Mswipe will enable a merchant to complete the 'know-your-customer'
  (KYC) requirement using a mobile application that will scan documents.
- o It is developed by Bengaluru-based startup Signzy.

#### • Issue size of Bharat 22 ETF increased

- Central Government announced that issue size of New Fund Offer (NFO)
  of Bharat 22 Exchange Traded Fund has been raised to Rs 14500 crore
  from Rs. 8000 crore earlier.
- Bharat 22 ETF was oversubscribed by four times.
- It received the highest subscription to any new fund offer (NFO) in the history of Indian mutual fund industry.
- NFO of Bharat 22 ETF was managed by ICICI Prudential Mutual Fund.

#### China launches remote sensing satellites

- On 21st November 2017, China launched three remote sensing satellites
  Jilin-1 04, Jilin-1 05 and Jilin-1 06 from Taiyuan Satellite Launch Center
  in China's northern Shanxi Province.
- The satellites have been designed to improve observation capability to promote commercial use for the remote sensing industry.
- The system will be used for wide imaging, video imaging, and multispectral imaging.









### Asia-Europe Foreign Ministers' Meeting

- Two-day 13th Asia-Europe Foreign Ministers' Meeting begun on
  November 20, 2017, in Nay Pyi Taw, the capital of Myanmar.
- The meeting was inaugurated by Aung San Suu Kyi, the de facto leader of Myanmar.
- The meeting was held with an objective to boost cooperation between Asia and Europe in political, economic, social and cultural spheres.
- o Representatives from 51 countries attended the meeting.

## • Parab Fest takes off in Koraput, Odisha

- 'Parab-2017', the annual cultural festival of Odisha's Koraput district, showcasing the tribal art and culture, started.
- Parab 2017 started from the shrine of goddess Sankulai Devi of B Singhpur under Borigumma block, with a tribal dance.
- The objective of this festival is to protect & promote the region's rich cultural heritage.
- A 5-day Pallishree Mela will be organised on 21 December 2017

# SHB proposes building Ram Temple

- UP Shia Central Waqf Board, unveiled a proposed solution for an out-ofcourt settlement of the Ram janma bhoomi-Babri Masjid case: a Ram temple at the disputed site in Ayodhya and a mosque in Lucknow.
- o Ram Temple in disputed Ayodhya land and mosque in Lucknow.
- Shia Board said the state government may, in turn, allot one acre of land for a mosque for Shia Muslims in Lucknow's Husainabad area.

# • Gender Budget cell for WCD: Maharashtra

- Maharashtra's Minister for Finance and Planning, Sudhir Mungantiwar has announced to set up Gender Budget Cells in his ministry.
- It is being done for improving coordination, implementation of various schemes of WCD with other government departments.











 The Gender Budget Cell will not only ensure quality and effective implementation of WCD schemes but shall also strive to improve its outcome.

## • FOGSI launches 'Manyata' movement

- Federation of Obstetric and Gynecological Societies of India (FOGSI)
  launched 'Manyata', a nationwide movement emphasising the need for
  quality care for mothers during and immediately after childbirth.
- FOGSI has launched 'Manyata' in partnership with MSD for Mothers,
  MacArthur Foundation and Jhpiego.
- o The movement was flagged off by Bollywood actress Shilpa Shetty.

#### Andhra Bank launches scheme

- Andhra Bank has launched a scheme for SHGs to encourage entrepreneurship.
- It is introduced to commemorate the 138th birth anniversary of its founder Bhogaraju Pattabhi Sitaramayya.
- Under the scheme, SHGs having 5 years of association with Andhra Bank
  & having successfully completed 3 credit rotations with good repayment
  record and an aptitude for entrepreneurship will be eligible for a loan.

## 2nd largest Fish Producing Country:India

- Combining the production of all types of fisheries (capture and culture),
  the total fish production has reached about 11.41 million tonnes in 2016 17.
- By this India has become the second largest fish producing country in the world.
- Due to scheme 'Blue Revolution' overall fish production has registered an increase of about 18.86% in comparison to the last three years.

# • Zimbabwe's president, Mugabe resigned

 Robert Mugabe has resigned as president of Zimbabwe with immediate effect after 37 years in power.









- The man who ruled with an autocrat's grip for so many years finally caved to popular and political pressure hours after parliament launched proceedings to impeach him.
- He has ruled as an autocrat, prepared to sacrifice the economic well-being of 16 million people in order to remain in power.

#### • Conf. of Commanders of Eastern Command

- A two-day conference of all Commanders of Eastern Air Command commenced at Shillong in Meghalaya, where issues pertaining to security are being discussed.
- The conference is being hosted by Air Marshal Anil Khosla AVSM VM, Air Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Eastern Air Command.
- Air Force Station, Chabua was awarded the 'Pride of EAC' Trophy, for standing best in overall performance.

## • Infrastructure status to Logistics

- The government has given infrastructure status to logistics sector, covering cold chain and warehousing facilities.
- It is done in a move to attract more funding at competitive rates for these segments.
- The infrastructure status would help the logistics sector get credit at competitive rates and on a long-term basis as rising logistics cost impacts the global competitiveness of exporters.

#### NSE arm launches SME Index

- o IISL, a NSE Group entity, launched Nifty SME Emerge Index, a new Nifty Index to measure the performance of SMEs.
- This index represents about 62% of the full market capitalisation of all SMEs listed on EMERGE.











 The index value will be calculated and published at the end of every trading session and will thereby help investors to track the performance of SMEs listed on EMERGE.

### · Bengaluru joins network for climate data

- Bengaluru has joined 91 cities across the globe in Datacity programme to collate data on climate change.
- Datacity programme was launched in Paris in 2015 with an objective to develop data which can help resolve climate challenges.
- This programme is led by French start-up accelerator NUMA and is supported by technology experts including Carto, OpenDataSoft, and Dataiku.

### · Modi Govt. 3rd most trusted in the world

- Indian government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi has ranked as the third most trusted government in the world as per Government at a Glance 2017.
- It was published by Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development.
- As per the report, nearly 74 percent of Indians have expressed confidence in their national government.
- o This list is topped by Switzerland and followed by Indonesia.

#### Haryana to offer power Connection on EMI

- Haryana CM Manohar Lal Khattar announced a new scheme offering Domestic Power Connections in rural areas on EMI.
- Currently, it costs between Rs. 3000/- to Rs. 4000/- to get a domestic power connection.
- Under this new scheme, households in rural areas can pay just Rs. 200
  and get a domestic power connection.
- The remaining amount can be paid in easy instalments of Rs. 100 to Rs.
  200.









## • Maharashtra's to Curb Childhood Obesity

- Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis launched a new initiative against childhood obesity in Pune.
- Under this initiative, schools will be given Body Mass Index (BMI) dialler, through which children will be able to know their BMI.
- According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), India is projected to be the second-largest country with childhood obesity by 2025.
