### January 2017

- CCS among top 100 think tanks
  - The Centre for Civil Society (CCS) has been ranked among the top 100 think tanks globally.
  - It is as per the Global Go to Think Tank Index Report 2016 released annually by the Lauder Institute of Pennsylvania University, U.S.
  - Nine other Indian institutes figured among the top 175 for the year 2016.
     The CCS is ranked 80 which is one lower than last year's rank.
- Summons might be served through email
  - A key amendment in the law could soon result in summons being serviced in civil matters through email, cutting through layers of red tape and delays, top sources in the ministry of law and justice said.
  - Currently, a summon is served in accordance with the rules under Order V of the Civil Procedure Code of 1908 that governs the functioning of civil courts in India.
- Govt launches film heritage mission
  - The information and broadcasting ministry launched a film condition assessment project.
  - Under this almost 1.32 lakh film reels at National Film Archive of India will be assessed and preserved for future use.
  - The project marks the beginning of National Film Heritage Mission, an initiative by the government of India.







- Solar parks to come up in Ladakh
  - The Jammu and Kashmir govt has signed an MoU with the Centre for the development of two mega solar parks in Ladakh with a total capacity of 7500 MW.
  - The State Government has signed MoU with the Centre for the development of 2 Mega Solar Parks of 5000 MW capacity in Leh district & 2500 MW capacity in Kargil district.
- President appoints Governors
  - President Pranab Mukherjee appointed Banwarilal Purohit, the Governor of Assam to execute the functions of the Governor of Meghalaya & Arunachal Pradesh.
  - He also appointed P. B. Acharya, the Governor of Nagaland to discharge functions as the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh.
- WB sees highest no. of police injuries
  - The Bureau of Police Research and Development released its report on police injuries
  - Out of the 1623 police personnel injured in the country by riotous mobs in 2015,641 (39.5%) are from West Bengal, Kerala came second.
  - The statistics also reveal that of the total of 34 persons killed in police firing across the country, only 4 were from West Bengal.
- India sees increase in tourist arrivals
  - India registered an 11% increase in foreign tourist arrivals in 2016 over 2015, with as many as 9 million tourists visiting the country.
  - During a session on 'Partnering with diaspora to accelerate tourism in India', Vinod Zutshi, Secretary, Ministry of Tourism, said this was way above the projected 4.5% growth.





- This also resulted in a 15% growth in income from FTAs, he said.
- Naidu Inaugurates Conf. for e-Governance
  - Information and Broadcasting Minister Venkaiah Naidu inaugurated the 2-day National Conference for e-Governance in Visakhapatnam.
  - The theme of this year's conference is 'Internet of Things and e-Governance'.
  - The conference is an opportunity for the public and private sectors to discuss best practices related to e-Governance.
  - Three books have been released on the 1st day of the conference.
- Modi Inaugurates Global Trade Show 2017
  - PM Modi formally inaugurated the Vibrant Gujarat Global Trade show at Gandhinagar.
  - More than 1500 representatives of about 80 countries in the world have participated in the trade show.
  - The trade show has different pavilions of various sectors like automotive, pharmaceutical, agro, bio technology and among others.
  - This year special emphasis has been on start ups, women entrepreneurs & MSME.
- Maharashtra Govt Launches Largest WiFi Service
  - Maharashtra government has launched India's largest public WiFi service called 'MumbaiWifi'.
  - Under the current phase, hotspots were installed at 500 locations.

- These include tourist destinations like Gateway of India, Churchgate, CST along with slum clusters and public places.
- In Phase II, expected to launch by May 1, the hotspots will be installed at the remaining 700 locations.







- BMC Launches Toilet Locator Mobile App
  - Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has a mobile application to locate toilets in Mumbai.
  - "Mumbai Toilet Locator" was launched by municipal commissioner Ajoy Mehta.
  - The civic body has connected over 800 pay-and-use toilets across the city on "Mumbai Toilet Locator" through GPS.
  - The easy-to-use application is meant for android phones.
- PM Announces Pravasi Kaushal Vikas Yoj.
  - PM Modi launched Pravasi Kaushal Vikas Yojana, a skill development program targeted at Indian youth seeking overseas employment
  - It was launched after inauguration of 14th Pravasi Bhartiya Divas convention in Bengaluru.
  - It will be implemented by the National Skill Development Corporation, for this purpose, NSDC will leverage various MoUs it signed between 2011 and 2015 with different countries.
- Dangal Becomes Bollywood Highest Grosser
  - Aamir Khan's Dangal has overtaken his previous film PK to become the highest-grossing Hindi film in history with Rs 345 cr
  - The film, is based on life of Haryanvi wrestler Mahavir Singh Phogat.
  - The list of top earners included Aamir's PK & Salman Khan's Bajrangi Bhaijaan & Sultaan.
  - The overall revenue of PK was Rs 340.8 crore, while Salman's films netted Rs 316 cr & Rs 300.4 cr respectively.
- 4th Assam Int. Agri-Horti Show Begins
  - Fourth Assam International Agri-Horiculture show has begun in Guwahati.








- o It was inaugurated by state CM Sarbananda Sonowal.
- Nearly 600 farmers of Assam will be trained on doubling farmers' income, more crop per drop and agri-preneurship development.
- Over 200 organizations from across the country have taken part in the show.

- Two day Assam Biotech Conclave Begins
  - The two day Assam Biotech Conclave began in Guwahati.
  - CM Sarbanand Sonowal inaugurated the conclave in presence of Science and Technology minister Keshab Mahanta.
  - The conclave will create business and partnering opportunities for its stakeholders and to showcase the facilities and opportunities offered by Guwahati Biotech Park.
  - Several MoUs have been signed as a part of the conclave.
- Govt Launches IPR Enforcement Toolkit
  - The Union Minister Nirmala Sitharaman launched an Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Enforcement Toolkit for Police.
  - The toolkit has been prepared by Cell for IPR Promotion and Management & FICCI.
  - This toolkit will be a ready reckoner for police in dealing with IP crimes, specifically Trade Marks counterfeiting & Copyrights piracy. It provides for checklists for registering a complaint.
- Govt Launches Swachh Bharat Survekshan
  - The Union Ministry of Urban Development launched Swachh Survekshan 2017 to rank 500 cities/towns across the country on cleanliness with a population of 1 lakh and above.

- The survey will be conducted by Quality Council of India. It will judge cities on the basis of data provided by Municipal bodies, data collected through direct observations & independent assessment & citizen feedbacks.
- Justice JS Khehar sworn in as CJI
  - Justice Jagdish Singh Khehar was sworn in as the Chief Justice of India.
  - Khehar was administered the oath of office by President Pranab
     Mukherjee at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi.
  - He succeeded Justice Tirath Singh Thakur.
  - Khehar is the 44th CJI and also the first Sikh to hold the apex office. He would have a tenure of little over seven months.
- India Opens First School for Transgender
  - India's first transgender school opened in Kochi, Kerala.
  - The school, named Sahaj International, was inaugurated by transgender activist, writer and actor Kalki Subramaniam at Thrikkakara in Kerala's Ernakulam district.
  - This alternative learning centre works in collaboration with National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS).
  - The school is the first of its kind in the country.

## February 2017

- Rajasthan Inaugurates RAHAT project
  - Rajasthan CM Vasundhara Raje inaugurated a medical project Rajasthan
  - She also flagged off an ambulance fitted with equipment and trained paramedical staff required for treatment of heart disease.
  - RAHAT aims to provide people in remote and rural areas with timely treatment during heart attacks.
- Darjeeling"s new Himalayan cycle trail





- India's first hill station bicycle path was inaugurated in Darjeeling, WB at an altitude of over 2,000 metres.
- The 20 km long cycle route runs through thick pine forest and Senchal wildlife sanctuary, one of India's oldest nature reserves.
- The route starts from near Jorebunglow, south of Darjeeling and ends at a small local First Hill Station Bicycle Patheco-village resort in Chatakpur.
- Conclave under "Hamari Dharohar" Scheme
  - Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi said that India is enriched with talent in art-culture, music & literature and this rich cultural heritage can become an effective mission of – "social & cultural harmony"
  - The first meeting under Hamari Dharoharl scheme of Minority Affairs Ministry was held.
  - It is the need of the hour to provide a platform and an opportunity to these talents.
- Indian Railways unveils Antyodaya Exp.
  - Indian Railways has unveiled Antyodaya Express, a new train for the unreserved passengers. It was unveiled by Union Railway Minister Suresh
     Prabhu in New Delhi's Safdarjang station.
  - The first Antyodaya Express is slated to start between Mumbai and Tatanagar (Jharkhand) and second between Ernakulam and Howrah.
  - The facilities provided in Antyodaya coaches are similar in first class coaches.
- PM unveils 112 feet statue of "Adiyogi"
  - Extolling the ancient Indian discipline of Yoga, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday called for efforts to protect nature and mound human activities to bring them in sync with ecological surroundings.
  - o He also termed unity in diversity as the specialty and strength of the

- The President of India inaugurated an international conference on Bharat
   Bodh' (Idea of Bharat) organized by the IGNOU and Bhartiya Shikshan
   Mandal on Feb 23, 2017 in New Delhi.
- He added that Bharat has always been recognised "as the storehouse of knowledge and discovery - knowledge which liberates, and discovery which fathoms the deepest thoughts of humanity and co-existence.
- Health Min. conducts largest drug survey
  - Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, GOI had entrusted the work relating to carrying out a largest ever drug survey in the world for determining the quality of drugs to the National Institute of Biologicals (NIB).
  - The statistical design of the Drug Survey included as many as 224 Drug molecules belonging to 15 different therapeutic categories of the National List of Essential Medicines 2011.
- Delhi to get India's first heliport
  - The first heliport in India will be inaugurated by Civil Aviation Minister Ashok Gajapathi Raju in North Delhi on Tuesday (28 February 2017).
  - The heliport, built by state-owned Pawan Hans, consists of a terminal building, nine parking bays and four hangars with a parking capacity of 16 helicopters.







- o It was built at an investment of ₹100 crore.
- Health Secretary launches "SAATHIYA" Kit
  - Health and Family Welfare launched the SAATHIYA Resource Kit including Saathiya Salah' Mobile App for adolescents.
  - This is a part of the Rashtriya Kishor Swasthya Karyakram (RKSK) program.
  - One of the key interventions under the programme is introduction of the Peer Educators who act as a catalyst for generating demand for the adolescent health services & imparting age appropriate knowledge.

### March 2017

- Online Film Certification System
  - Information and Broadcasting Minister M. Venkaiah Naidu launched the Online Film Certification System of the Central Board of Film Certifications.
  - He said the initiative was on the lines of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of ease-of-doing business and digital India, making the entire process transparent and efficient.
  - The new system uses email, QR code and text messages for any updates
- J&K government approves smart city proposals
  - A committee of the Jammu and Kashmir government has approved the Smart City Proposals for the twin cities of Jammu and Srinagar for submission to the Centre.
  - Considering the vulnerability of the cities to multiple hazards, the calamities like floods and earthquakes, risk preparedness and risk response have received special focus in the SCPs' proposal.

- India's second tallest flag post
  - Kolhapur will soon get a 300-feet flag post to fly the tricolour, which would the "second tallest" flag pole in the country.
  - A 360-foot high flag post, said to be the country's tallest, was inaugurated on March 6 at the Indo-Pak Attari Border.
  - Chief Minister of Maharashtra is likely to attend the flag hoisting ceremony on May 1, the foundation day of Maharashtra state.
- Mining banned in Uttarakhand
  - The Uttarakhand High Court ordered a complete ban on mining activities in the State for four months.
  - The move comes 4 days after a forest worker was allegedly killed in Ramnagar while he was chasing the mining mafia.
  - The court directed the State government to refrain from granting any fresh licence, mining lease, reconnaissance or prospecting licence till the committee submitted its report.
- Shortest, widest Highway in the world
  - Haryana would soon have the widest and shortest National Highway (NH) in the world with 16 lanes in a 3-km stretch.
  - Detailed Project Report (DPR) of the proposed elevated National Highway, costing around Rs 700 crore.
  - The three kilometre road with 16 lanes will be built on the Sohna Road in Gurgaon.
  - It will be the shortest and widest National Highway in the world
- First Body for complaints against cops
  - Maharashtra became the first state to set up the State Police Complaints Authority (SPCA).







- People can approach the SPCA office to lodge complaints against police personnel for any alleged abuse of power,
- The authority is headed by a retired high court judge and comprises retired IPS and IAS officers.
- India's first vertical garden
  - Emulating China and Italy's vertical forests, Bengaluru got its first vertical garden, which it hopes will help in curbing pollution and in beautifying the city.
  - An NGO, installed the first vertical garden in the city on one of the pillars of the Hosur Road flyover.
  - An automated drip irrigation system has been installed that will water these saplings every day.
- India, Pakistan to review Miyar project
  - India and Pakistan agreed on redesigning the Miyar Hydroelectric project, at the end of two-day talks of Indus Water Commissioners in Islamabad.
  - They raised concern over 1000 MW Pakul Dul on Chenab, 120 MW
     Miyar, located across Miyar Nalla which is a right bank main tributary of River Chenab and the 43 MW Lower Kalnai hydro project on Lower Kalnai Nalla, a tributary of river Chenab.
- India's 1st carbon neutral district
  - Assam CM launched initiatives to develop Majuli as India's 1st carbon neutral district and as a biodiversity heritage.
  - CM launched "Forests are Lives" campaign to celebrate the importance of Assam's rich forest and biodiversity and urged







people of the state to take a pledge to conserve its biodiversity to make a pollution free state.

- Majuli is the biggest river island in the world.
- Asia's longest bidirectional road tunnel
  - PM Modi will dedicate to the nation, Asia's longest bi-directional road tunnel on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway on the 2nd of next month.
  - The nearly 11-km long state-of-the-art tunnel will cut down travel time between Jammu and Srinagar by 2 hours.
  - The road distance from Chenani and Nashri will now be 10.9 km, instead of the existing 41 km.

# April 2017

- Aerial survey of Tapi
  - To meet the demand of potable water in future, the Surat Municipal Corporation started a heliborne survey of Tapi riverbed and its banks.
  - The SMC has thus become the first civic body in the country to carry out a scientific study to find out potable water.
  - Through this survey, scanning will be done around 500 m beneath the riverbed to identify and locate confined and saturated aquifer.
- Change of status for marine body IALA
  - The government gave its approval to change the status of global marine body IALA to inter government organisation from non-governmental organisation.
  - The move will foster the safe, economic and efficient movement of vessels. It will bring IALA at par with International Maritime Organisation.
  - St Germainen Laye (France) headquartered IALA was established in 1957 under French law.







- Justice S N Dhingra report
  - The Justice SN Dhingra Commission concluded that Robert Vadra made illegal profits of Rs 50.5 crore from a land deal in Haryana in 2008 without spending a single penny.
  - The commission was constituted in 2015 to investigate a mutation of land deal between Vadra's firm Skylight Hospitality and realty major DLF.
  - The committee submitted its report on August 31, 2016.
- Karnataka the most corrupt state
  - Karnataka occupies the first slot in a list of states perceived to be corrupt on the basis of people's experience in paying bribes for public services.
  - Karnataka is followed by Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Jammu & Kashmir and Punjab.
  - Himachal Pradesh, Kerala and Chhattisgarh are least corrupt.
  - The report was published by Centre for Media Studies.
- Press freedom rankings
  - India slipped three places in the 2017 world press freedom rankings to
     136th among 180 countries, the dismal performance blamed on "Modi's nationalism" and growing "self-censorship" in the mainstream media.
  - India was ranked just three places above Pakistan and was one notch below violence-torn Palestine.
  - The report was released by Reporters without Borders.

- India's 1st green highway
  - India's first smart and green highway, Eastern Peripheral Expressway will be ready by August this year.
  - It has been built a t a cost of Rs. 11000 crore.
  - At least 2.5 lakh trees will be on the both sides of the roads with solar panels.
- Lavasa Committee submits report to FM

- Around 43 lakh central government employees and 57 lakh pensioners are eagerly waiting for the Ashok Lavasa committee to submit its final report.
- The Ashok Lavasa Committee was formed in June 2016.
- PM launches UDAN Scheme

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi has launched the UDAN (Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik) scheme from Jubbarhatti, an airport on the outskirts of Shimla.
- He flagged of the first UDAN flight under Regional Connectivity Scheme on Shimla-Delhi sector.
- UDAN flights on Kadapa–Hyderabad, and Nanded-Hyderabad sectors were also flagged off.
- Sukma attack
  - Twenty-five CRPF jawans were slaughtered in one of the deadliest attacks by Maoist rebels.
  - Around 300-400 Leftist insurgents ambushed and outgunned 99 troopers deployed to help with the construction of a road through the Maoist stronghold of Sukma in Chhattisgarh.
  - This was one of the three biggest attacks on security forces in seven years, and the second in the last one and a half months.
- Rs 10000 minimum monthly wage
  - The Labour Ministry has proposed a minimum monthly income of Rs.10000 for contract workers.
  - The move will drastically increase the minimum wages of contract labourers from around Rs.6000 per month that is paid to them in a few sectors at present.







- At present, employers give the fixed minimum wages to workers for 45 economic activities.
- Child artistes can work only for 5 hours
  - The Labour Ministry has proposed draft rules to fix the working conditions for child artistes and for employing children in family enterprises.
  - While a child artiste will not be allowed to work for more than five hours a day, a child "assisting" in a family business can only work for three hours a day.
  - An amendment to the Child Labour Rules, 1986 has been made.
- UID numbers for cows
  - The Centre has proposed issuing "Unique Identification Number Sequences" for cows and their progeny to protect them from cattle smuggling.
  - It is the brainchild of the Union Agriculture Ministry.
  - The Ministry of Agriculture has devised a method of tamper-proof identification of cattle using polyurethene tags with Unique Identification Number Sequence.
- Agriculture Ministry unveils APMC Act
  - In order to give more freedom to farmers to sell their produce, the agriculture ministry has unveiled "The State/UT Agricultural Produce and Livestocks Marketing (promotion and facilitation) Act, 2017".
  - The draft law proposes to cap market fees and commission charges payable by a farmer after bringing produce to a wholesale market.
  - The Act was passed in 2003.
- Northeast India's largest IT hub opens
  - Northeast India's sixth and largest Information Technology (IT) hub was inaugurated in Tripura.







- It will boost employment and e-governance besides to export software technology.
- The hub has been built at a cost of Rs. 50 crore. 0
- Central university for Divyangs
  - Government will set up a Central university for Divyangs in Uttar Pradesh.
  - This was stated by HRD Minister Prakash Javadekar while addressing the 0 convocation function of Shakuntala Mishra national rehabilitation university, Lucknow.
  - The Minister said, the University Grants Commission has been instructed 0 to make arrangement for special training of instructors providing education to Divyangs.
- India-Bangladesh Friendship Bridge
  - The Tripura government has commenced the land acquisition process for the construction of India-Bangladesh Friendship Bridge over river Feni that demarcates boundaries between the two countries in south Tripura.
  - The bridge would facilitate implementation of a protocol India earlier signed with Bangladesh to use Chittagong sea port as a 'port of call'.
  - The govt is bearing the entire cost.
- First underwater metro tunnel
  - A gigantic Tunnel Boring Machine is being used to build a underwater tunnel which will connect Howrah with Kolkata.
  - The construction will be completed by July.
  - The two 520-metre structures are part of a 10.8 km underground stretch 0 and are crucial to the East West Metro project.
  - They are being built at a cost of Rs. 8900 crores. 0
- India's first sea ropeway
  - India's first and longest ropeway to connect Mumbai with the famous Elephanta Island in the Arabian Sea is planned to be constructed by the Mumbai Port Trust.







- The 8-km ropeway will begin from Sewri in Mumbai's east coast and end at Raigad district's Elephanta Island, globally renowned for Elephanta Caves.
- Subsidised solar water pumps
  - The Madhya Pradesh government would soon provide nearly 18,500 solarpowered water pumps to farmers in the state at subsidised rates.
  - MP Urja Vikas Nigam would be the nodal agency to make available the solar pumps to the farmers.
  - MP has the highest agricultural growth rate of over 20% since last couple of years.
- Utkrisht Double-Decker AC Yatri Express
  - The Indian Railways will launch in July the Utkrisht Double-Decker AC Yatri (Uday) Express+, a special class service for overnight journey that will ply on high-demand routes.
  - The main USP of this train is that it will have fares lower than that of 3AC class.
  - It runs at a speed of 110 km/hr.
- Jat quota violence : Jha panel
  - The Haryana Government has given second extension of six months to Jha commission to complete its investigation into the conspiracy angle in the violence that occurred during the Jat quota stir in February 2016.
  - The panel had received 82 complaints till August 31, 2016 which was the last day to submit complaints in regard to the violence.
  - The commission is headed by SN Jha and NC Padhi.

- Punjab govt to set up 'book banks'
  - The Punjab government has decided to set up 'book banks' in different schools so that needy students do not have to buy books at the start of every academic year and also to prevent "wastage of paper".











- The students would be asked to submit their old books which would be provided to needy children free of charge.
- It is a voluntary initiative and is not binding on any student.
- 25% of ex-husband's net salary to wife
  - The Supreme Court has set a benchmark for maintenance to be paid by a husband to his estranged wife.
  - The Court said 25% of his net salary might constitute a "just and proper" amount as alimony.
  - The ruling has come on a man's plea challenging Calcutta High Court's order that asked him to pay Rs 23000 every month as alimony to his former wife.
- Socio progressive tourism in Guwahati
  - Swapnanil Talukdar and his team are all set to give boost to Prime Minister's Start UP India initiative in Guwahati.
  - Launching their Venture 'Finder Bridge' in Guwahati the budding entrepreneurs seek to uplift the tourism sector in the state.
  - It shows and promotes tourism spots and ecotourism.
- National Lok Adalat settles 6 lakh cases
  - The National Legal Services Authority has accomplished its latest feat of settling over 6 lakh cases in just 24 hours.
  - The Second National Lok Adalat for 2017 was conducted on April 8 throughout the country.
  - The award of a Lok Adalat is final and cannot be challenge in any way.
  - o It was established on 5 Dec 1995.
  - o It was established under the Legal Services Authorities Act 1987.
- Dhaka-Kolkata Maitree Express
  - A fully-airconditioned Dhaka-Kolkata Maitree Express with improved coaches was inaugurated on April 14 in Dhaka.







- The Maitree train was launched on Pahela Baishakh in 2008 with once-aweek service. With its increased popularity, it now runs four days a week.
- The coaches have been manufactured in India.
- Indian Academy of Highway Engineers
  - A MoU was signed between the Ministry through the Indian Academy of Highway Engineers and University of New South Wales to bring innovations in road transport.
  - It will set up a Centre for Advanced Transportation Technology and Systems.
  - This would be the worlds first transportation centre involving two countries committed to seeing technological innovation for economic development.
- Fire breaks out near Mount Abu
  - In Rajasthan, a fire broke out in the forest area near Mount Abu and the administration tried to control it with the help of a helicopter.
  - South West Air Command- headquarters at Gandhingar has received a call from Rajasthan Government seeking help in dousing a massive forest fire in the hills around Mount Abu.
  - The operation is likely to be augmented by an additional IAF MI-17V5 helicopter
- 7000 girls dance to set new record
  - As many as 7000 girl students performed 'Kuchipudi' in Vizag, Andhra Pradesh to set a Guinness World record.
  - The girls from 21 government-run residential schools in north coastal Andra participated in the event to commemorate 125th birth anniversary of B.R. Ambedkar.

- Operation 'Clean Money'
  - Income Tax Department launched the second phase of Operation 'Clean Money' to detect the flow of black money into the banks after demonetisation.
  - According to Central Board of Direct Taxation the I-T dept has detected unaccounted income worth Rs 9,334 crore after the demonetisation till February 28th.
  - The first phase of the operation was launched in January 2017.
- Operation Durga in Haryana
  - The Haryana government has launched 'Operation Durga' to ensure women safety in the state.
  - Under this operation, teams formed by the Chief Minister's Flying Squad visited public places such as schools, colleges etc to check criminal activities.
  - The campaign was launched so that flying squads patrol those areas where such anti-social elements committed crimes against women.
- Taare Zameen Par program
  - Jharkhand Police has initiated Tare Zameen Par programme to enlighten children in Naxal-affected areas in the Palamau district of Jharkhand.
  - This programme is aimed to restore confidence in the state police force and to encourage children to lead happy lives.







- As a part of the programme, the state police appealed the locals to donate bags, shoes, books etc for the children.
- CM relaunches 'Adarana' scheme
  - Reiterating his resolve for the uplift and all-round development of people belonging to the Backward Classes, Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu announced the re-launch of 'Adarana' scheme.
  - The scheme will help improving traditional occupations.
  - o It will use modern technology, marketing for artisans.
- Committee submits its report on Ganga
  - Nine months after it was set up, a committee under Justice (retd) Giridhar Malviya submitted its report to save the Ganga river from pollution.
  - The four-member committee had been asked to prepare the draft of a comprehensive Ganga law that is being considered for at least four years now.
  - The draft would now be examined by ministerial committee before being converted into a bill.
- Kerala, Maharashtra top in power supply
  - According to Urban Jyoti AbhiyaanKerala app, Kerala, Maharashtra and Rajasthan top the list in supplying uninterrupted power.
  - The Urja application meant to bring transparency in the performance of utilities and states captures the stark contrast in how consumers are served in different parts of the country.
  - Jharkhand, Uttarakhand and Assam have a lot to catch up.

- 1st time Ranking of Ports on Sanitation
  - For the first time ever, the twelve major ports under the Ministry of Shipping have been ranked on sanitation parameters.



  - In a bid to bolster India-Bangladesh bilateral ties, a Kolkata-Khulna-Dhaka bus service, covering 409 km, was flagged off.
  - This is the third such service that has been introduced. The two other services are on the Kolkata-Dhaka-Agartala and the Kolkata-Dhaka routes.
  - The service would be available on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays from Kolkata and on Tuesdays, Thursdays & Saturdays from Dhaka.
- Haryana sex ratio highest since history
  - For the first time in the history of the state, the sex ratio at birth in Haryana has touched the 950 mark.







- The state govt launched a massive campaign by implementing the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act, 1994, and Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act, 1971.
- Haryana had ranked the worst among all states in sex ratio in the country.

- The Union Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh will inaugurate the web portal and mobile application named "Bharat ke Veer" on April 9.
- The portal is an IT based platform, with an objective to enable willing donors to contribute towards the family of a braveheart who sacrificed his/her life in line of duty.

- 1st NIMCARE World Health Day Summit 2017
  - President Pranab Mukherjee inaugurated the first NIMCARE World Health Day Summit 2017 in New Delhi.
  - The slogan of the first NIMCARE World Health Day Summit is, 'Unite for a Healthy Mind'.
  - He also launched the eCAP & SOL's Telepsychiatry application for the rural and urban population in need of mental health consultation.
- India 9th in business corruption
  - India ranks 9th among 41 countries in bribery and corrupt practices in businesses, according to the findings of a recent survey.
  - Nearly 78% respondents queried in the country said that bribery and corrupt practices happen widely in businesses here.
  - The report was published by the EY Europe, Middle East, India and Africa (EMEIA) Fraud Survey 2017.
- Free legal aid in triple talaq cases
  - Women in Kerala divorced through the Islamic tradition of triple talaq can now receive free legal aid sponsored by the state government.











- Kerala's minority commission constituted a special committee under retired judge PK Haneefa to provide legal assistance to divorced women.
- It also set up a toll free helpline number (0471-2315122).
- CAG to audit UN Secretariat in New York
  - The Comptroller and Auditor General of India will audit the UN Secretariat in New York, a job which till now was the exclusive domain of developed countries.
  - o It will be done by Shashi Kant Sharma.
  - The CAG is the external auditor of several UN organisations and Sharma presently is the Chairman of the UN Board of Auditors.
- 2016 Global Slavery Index
  - Nearly 46 million people live under conditions of slavery across the world, with 18 million (39%) of those in India.
  - Globally, modern slavery includes child workers in African mines, deforestation crews in the Amazon or people trapped in commercial sexual exploitation in Europe.
  - In India slavery is banned as per the Bonded Labour System (Abolition) Act 1976.
- TN leads MHRD's top-100 colleges list
  - A whopping 37 colleges in Tamil Nadu have made it to the rankings released by the Ministry of HRD, with three TN colleges coming in the top-10 list.
  - $\circ~$  Delhi's Miranda House has the top spot in the list.
  - Chennai's Loyola College came in the number two spot.

- A total of 535 colleges have been ranked in this first-time exercise.
- First bio-gas bus in Kolkata
  - A city based company has claimed to have launched the first bio-gas fuelled bus in Kolkata keeping a flat fare of just Re 1.







- All buses will have a flat fare of Re 1 irrespective of the distance, even in excess of 40 km.
- The first bus will run a distance of 17 km between Ultadanga and Garia.
- The bus service will be run by Phoenix India.
- IISc ranked best educational institution
  - The IISc, Bengaluru was adjudged as the best Indian university in the 2017 National Institutional Ranking Framework released by Union HRD Ministry.
  - This year it is 2nd edition NIRF survey and was released as part of the India Rankings 2017 for the Educational Institutions.
  - Seven IITs have also made it to the list of the top10 educational institutions, the other two being BHU and JNU.
- Haryana becomes kerosene-free
  - Haryana has become kerosene-free as the supply of the fuel has been stopped under the Public Distribution System from April 1.
  - With an aim to provide smoke-free and healthy environment while cooking, the state government had decided to provide free-of-cost LPG connections under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana.
  - As per the report of oil companies, 272949 gas connections have been made.
- Rice scheme for tribal families
  - Nearly 70000 families of Jharkhand's primitive tribal groups will get foodgrains at their doorsteps with the state government launching the "PTG Dakia Yojana".
  - Under the scheme, employees of Food and Civil Supplies Department would deliver a packet of 35 kg.
  - The scheme was formally launched in Godda, Sahebganj and Palamu districts.









- CIRT now authorised body
  - Pune based Central Institute of Road Transport has, for the first time, become an authority to certify vehicle engines for their emission standards.
  - Earlier, such tests could only be carried out at Automotive Research Association of India.
  - Operating under the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, CIRT recently signed an MoU with FEV India a German company in the automobile sector.
- Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana
  - "Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana", a 'Scheme for providing Physical Aids and Assisted-living Devices for Senior citizens belonging to BPL category' was launched in Nellore, Andhra Pradesh.
  - The govt will provide devices to help the senior citizens to overcome their age related physical impairment and to lead a dignified and productive life.
  - The scheme is expected to help 520000 senior citizens.
- Rs 5 cr tax evasion to be non-bailable
  - The government has decided to make tax evasion of over Rs 5 crore under the proposed Goods and Services Tax regime as a non-bailable offence.
  - The earlier threshold for treating tax evasion as a cognizable and nonbailable offence was proposed to be at Rs 2.5 crore.
  - In a revised set of FAQs on GST, the CBEC said other offences under the act are non-cognizable and bailable.
- 2 ILO conventions approved
  - The government has approved ratification of two fundamental conventions of International Labour Organization to address concerns related to child labour.







- They are Minimum Age Convention and Worst Forms of Child Labour Convention.
- India would join majority of countries who have adopted the legislation to prohibit and place severe restrictions on the employment and work of children.

- Delhi Police Launches Bicycle Patrols.
  - Delhi Police has launched a bicycle patrol scheme to increase police presence in congested areas of the city.

  - Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation has launched a nation wide campaign titled 'Darwaza Band .
  - The aim of the campaign is to promote toilet use and freedom from open defecation across the country's villages.
  - The campaign will run under the Swachh Bharat Mission and is supported by World Bank.
  - Anushka Sharma will be seen encouraging women to stand up for this issue.
- Amul inks MoU with ISRO.
  - Amul has signed an MoU with ISRO for fodder Acreage estimation.

- Pune police wins FICCI smart policing.
  - The Pune city police have bagged the FICCI Smart Police Award for the year 2017.
  - 'Mahila Suraksha' project of city police won the award.
  - Rashmi Shukla, Commissioner of Pune Police received the award.
  - Initiatives like "BuddyCop" was launched to help women working in IT
     companies and "Damini squad" involving women police officials played a
     key role in tightening the security.







- First digital bank for sanitary pads.
  - Mumbai MLA Bharati Lavekar has launched India's first digital bank for sanitary pads on the occasion of World Menstrual Hygiene Day.
  - People can log in to teefoundation.in to either donate pads or money to those in need.
  - The needy can also access available resources on the portal.
  - According to the 2015-16 National Family Health Survey, 57.6% of Indian menstruating women use sanitary napkins.
- Biodiversity Heritage Site in Manipur.
  - Manipur government has declared Dailong village of Tamenglong district as a Biodiversity Heritage Site of the state.
  - Dialong village covers an area of 11.35 sq km.
  - The village has been declared as Biodiversity Heritage Site under Section 37(1) of Biological Diversity Act, 2002.
  - The declaration was made after the recommendation of Manipur Biodiversity Board.
- UGC App to fight ragging.
  - HRD minister Prakash Javadekar has launched an Anti-Ragging Mobile App introduced by the University Grants Commission.
  - This mobile app will help students register complaints to counter the menace of ragging.
  - Now the Students can login and register their complaints instantaneously.
  - The app will work on android system.
- Desiliting of Mettur Dam
  - Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami inaugurated desiliting works in Mettur Dam at Moolakadu.













- Stanley Reservoir, commonly known as Mettur Dam, was built in 1934 with a storage level of 124 feet. The dam is the main source of water for 12 districts.
- The desilting is unique inasmuch as it is being undertaken for the first time since 1934.
- Munnar: Best Destination for Romance
  - Munnar has bagged the award for 'Best Destination for Romance' at the Lonely Planet Magazine Indian Travel Awards 2017.
  - P Bala Kiran, Director of Kerala Tourism received the award.
  - Munnar is a hill station located in the Idukki district of Kerala.
  - It is known for its romantic cottages, cloudy mountains, lively tea gardens, green valleys, waterfalls.
- Vijay Goel flags off 'Slum Yuva Daud'.
  - Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports Vijay Goel flagged off the Slum Yuva Daud to mark the beginning of the Adopt Slum Campaign in New Delhi.
  - It was initiated by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports and Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan.
  - The run started from Delhi University's Shankarlal Hall and ended at the Rugby Stadium with participation of about 5000 youngsters from various slums of Delhi.
- 1st professional football academy in J&K
  - Jammu and Kashmir's first professional football academy was launched in Srinagar in a bid to boost sports in the state.
  - India footballer Mehrajuddin Wadoo would be the head of the academy.
  - Initially, the academy will train footballers in the age groups of 13, 15 and
     18, and three professional coaches will be employed for the purpose.
- India's longest bridge named
  - Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the strategically important Dhola-Sadiya Bridge in Assam.







- It spans the Lohit River to connect the states of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh and is 9.15 kms in length.
- The construction began in 2011 and was completed on 10 March 2017. It was built by Navayuga Engineering Company Limited.
- It has been built at a cost of Rs. 2056 crores.
- E-clinics for J&K farmers.
  - The J&K government has launched an e-clinics service for farmers with the aim to double farmers' income by 2022.
  - Department of Agriculture, in collaboration with Centre for Agriculture and Biosciences International has set up 15 plant clinics in Samba, Kathua and Jammu.
  - These clinics will help in protecting the crops from diseases, thereby, increasing productivity and income of farmers.
- Anti encephalitis campaign in UP.
  - Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has launched a campaign to eradicate the deadly encephalitis disease.
  - Close to 40,000 children have died of the disease in the past four decades in the region.
  - The campaign has been launched for 38 districts in UP.

  - "Swachh Bharat App" has been launched in National Museum under Ministry of Culture by the Minister of State for Culture & Tourism Dr. Mahesh Sharma.
  - The main focus of the app is to involve people actively to become part of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.
  - The App will be monitored by the Ministry of Culture and will play an important role in cultivating the significance of cleanliness to the citizens
- Karnataka child marriage Bill gets nod.
  - President Pranab Mukherjee has given his assent to Prohibition of Child Marriage (Karnataka amendment) Bill, 2016.
  - Karnataka is among the States that record a high number of child marriages in the country.









- The amended Bill seeks to ensure zero tolerance towards child marriage, granting powers to policemen and enhancing penalties for those attending wedding ceremonies of minors.
- IIT-KGP signs MoU with Madhya Pradesh.
  - IIT Kharagpur's Rekhi Centre of Excellence for the Science of Happiness and MP government's 'Rajya Anandam Sansthan' has signed an MoU to collaborate on the development of a Happiness Index.
  - Happiness Index will be developed for measuring the well-being of people of the state.
  - IIT-KGP will develop the index and analyse data collected by the state government to assess the level of happiness.
- Piyush Goyal launches 'SEVA' App.
  - Union Minister Piyush Goyal launched the Saral Eindhan Vitaran Application.
  - It is a part of 'Digital India' initiative, which is aimed at increasing the Consumer Connect and Transparency and Accountability in Coal dispatch.
  - The application has been developed by Coal India.
  - It will also provide summary of quantity of coal dispatched for a given day, month, and yearly updates as well.
- New award category in MAMI fim festival
  - Jio MAMI Film Festival has announced a new award category for digital content for this year's festival to be held from 12th-18th October.
  - This Award will encourage young talent to break the boundaries of their creative prowess and take Indian cinema to new and greater heights, especially in the digital space.
  - The winners receive a prize of Rs. 2.5 lakh.
- Michael Porter to give lecture

- The theme of Porter's lecture is "Competitiveness of Nations and States: New Insights".
- The lecture which will revolve around the idea of productivity and competitiveness of Indian regions will be addressed to the government.
- Free Wi-Fi at 28 railway stations
  - Minister of Railways Suresh Prabhu inaugurated free Wi-Fi facility at 28 Railway Stations of Konkan Railway from Kudal Railway Station in Maharashtra.
  - Indian Railways has tied by with SYSCON/JOISTER for providing 2 Mbps peer-to-peer 24 hrs Free Wi-Fi bandwidth.
  - Konkan Railway always believes in providing better passenger amenities to its passengers for their comfortable journey.
- GM squad to curb open defecation.
  - Maharashtra govt. has decided to form squads in a bid to curb open defecation across the state and bring about change in the mindset of people indulging in this practice.
  - "Good Morning" Teams will not only monitor areas where this practice is still prevalent, but also check whether residents have access to toilets.
  - Team will comprise representatives from local bodies, self-help groups, NGOs.
- Haryana launches e-textbook portal.
  - Haryana govt. launched e-textbook portal for school students that will allow students to download school books instantly.
  - As of now, 26 textbooks of classes IX to XII have been uploaded on the portal and these can be easily converted into audio files.









- The portal also provides a facility to highlight certain portions of the etextbooks making it easier for students to study.
- 4 Slab Service Tax Structure
  - The GST Council headed by finance Minister Jaitley has finalised a 4 slab service tax structure at the rates of 5, 12, 18 and 28% as against the single rate of 15% levied on all taxable services.
  - Healthcare and education will be exempt from the GST on services.
  - Finance Minister Arun Jaitley asserted that the net effect of the GST will not be inflationary.
- NITI Aayog holds first Samavesh meeting

- First Tejas train to run on May 22.

  - Developed by Rail Coach Factory, Kapurthala, the first rake was on display in Delhi on May 19.
  - It has 19 coaches and runs at a speed of 200 km/hr.
  - It has facilities like USB charger, automatic doors and other upgrades.
  - It will run from Mumbai to Goa.
- IARI in Assam.
  - Government has decided to set up the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI) in Assam of worth Rs. 155 crore to promote agri education and realize second green revolution in the northeastern region.







- The first IARI was set up in the national capital way back in 1967. The Modi government announced plans to set up four such institutes.
- Visakhapatnam has the cleanest station.
  - In a report released by Union Railway Minister Suresh Prabhu
     Visakhapatnam railway station in Andhra Pradesh was rated the cleanest station among the 75 busiest stations in the country.
  - According to the report Visakhapatnam railway station is the cleanest followed by Secunderabad, Jammu, Vijayawada railway stations while Darbhanga station in Bihar was rated as the dirtiest station.
- Govt approves Maternity Benefit Program.
  - The government has given approval to Pan-India implementation of Maternity Benefit Program which now has been extended to all districts of the country.
  - It will provide compensation for the wage loss in terms of cash incentives so that the women can take adequate rest before & after delivery & not be deprived of proper nutrition.
  - Women will receive cash benefits of Rs 5000 in 3 installments.
- Kerala govt to distribute sanitary pads.
  - To ensure 'menstrual hygiene' among girls, the `She Pad' scheme for school students across Kerala was announced by chief minister Pinarayi Vijayan.

- Plastic park to come up in Panipat.

- Odisha to introduce boat ambulances

  - he boat ambulance service will be available in the districts of Koraput,

  - People in these areas face problems in availing 108 ambulance service due to intervening large water bodies.
- Centenary of Bharat Sevashram Sangha
  - Prime Minister Narendra Modi will address the centenary celebrations of Bharat Sevashram Sangha being organized at Shillong.
  - Bharat Sevashram Sangha is a vast network of volunteers across the globe dedicated to helping people in distress.
  - It was founded in 1917 by the Acharya Srimat Swami Pranavanandaji Maharaj.
- Odisha communities notified as SCs
  - Odisha's Sualgiri and Swalgiri communities have been notified as Scheduled Castes.







- The SC category status will entitle these communities to reservation in government jobs and admission in educational institutions, besides some other financial benefits.
- Some of the major schemes for the scheduled castes include scholarships and fellowships, concessional loans and hostel facilities.
- World's highest railway bridge
  - In around two years from now, the Chenab river in Jammu and Kashmir will be spanned by the world's highest railway bridge that is expected to be 35 metres taller than the Eiffel Tower.
  - The massive arch-shaped structure, being constructed at a cost of around Rs 1,100 crore in hostile terrain.
  - The bridge forms a crucial link in the 111-km stretch between Katra and Banihal.
- Portal for info on tower radiation
  - The Telecom Department has launched a portal that will allow people to track radiation emitted from mobile towers within a locality.
  - Launching the 'Tarang Sanchar' web portal, Ministry hopes that the site will help in clearing "myths and misconceptions" about emissions from mobile towers.
  - This decision coincides with the recent SC order on deactivation of a mobile tower in Gwalior.

  - Kailash Mansarovar yatra through Nathu La in Sikkim has been cancelled.
  - The decision comes in the wake of face-off b/w Indian and Chinese troops over a disputed area along Sino-Indian border.
  - The yatra is considered holy by Hindus, Buddhists and Jains and is undertaken by hundreds of pilgrims every year.
  - However the pilgrimage through Lipulekh Pass in Uttarakhand will continue as scheduled
- Training programme COMMIT launched
  - Training programme "Comprehensive Online Modified Modules on Induction Training" for State Govt officials has been launched by Dr Jitendra Singh.
  - It's Objective is to improve public service delivery mechanism & provide citizen centric administration through capacity building of officials who interact with citizens on day-to-day basis.
  - It has been developed by DoPT in collaboration with UNDP



  - The state government has raised the retirement age from existing 58 to 60 years.
- 'Digital MSME' scheme launched
  - On the occasion of first International Day for MSMEs, Union Minister Kalraj Mishra launched a new shceme 'Digital MSME'.
  - The Scheme has been launched for promotion of Information & Communication Technology in the MSME Sector.
  - The scheme revolves around Cloud Computing which is emerging as a cost effective and viable alternative in comparison to in-house Infrastructure installed by MSMEs.
- Govt defers TDS, TCS provisions under GST





- Govt has deferred implementation of TDS and TCS provisions under GST to ensure its smooth rollout.
- Based on the feedback received from trade and industry, the govt has decided to postpone provision relating to TDS and TCS.
- Businesses with turnover of less than Rs20 lakh, will also not be required to register themselves under GST for selling goods or services through e-commerce portal.
- Rajdhani and Shatabdi to get makeover
  - Indian Railways has undertaken a complete makeover exercise in which 30 trains - 15 Rajdhani and 15 Shatabdi will under go a make over at an estimated cost of Rs 25 crore.
  - Railways have launched a 3 month programme under Project Swarn to refurbish coach interiors, improving toilets and cleanliness in coaches.
  - Passengers will also be offered films, serials and music for entertainment purpose.
- Jagannath Puri chariot festival begins
  - The most awaited annual festival of Rath Yatra or Chariot Festival commenced today at Puri, Odisha.
  - It is one of the most celebrated Hindu festivals of the country as well as the whole world.
  - It is celebrated usually in the month of June-July when the chariots of Lord Jagannath accompanied by his elder brother Balabhadra and sister Devi Subhadra are brought out on to the main street of Puri.
- 24/7 helpline launched for women
  - To address problems faced by women in Manipur, state govt has launched a toll free 24/7 helpline number '181' for women in the state.
  - The helpline will provide 24 hour telecom service to women affected by violence seeing support and information.











- The helpline will also provide information about appropriate support services, govt schemes and programmes available to women affected by violence.
- Jewar to be second airport in Delhi NCR
  - Ministry of Civil Aviation has given its NOD to set up a greenfield airport in **Greater Noida's Jewar region in UP**.
  - The international airport will cater to 30-50 million passengers per year over next 10-15 years and is likely to be operational in next 5 to 6 years.
  - The airport will not just address the aviation needs of Delhi but also a number of major cities like Agra, Mathura among others.
- World Bank, AIIB to grant \$380 million
  - World Bank and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank have together agreed to extend \$380 million of Ioan to Andhra Pradesh.
  - The loan has been provided to build and offer a reliable, quality and affordable power supply to citizens of Andhra Pradesh and provide 24X7 power to all.
  - The World Bank and AIIB will provide loans in a 60:40 ratio for all the components of the projects.
- RBI amends Banking Ombudsman Scheme
  - RBI has amended Banking Ombudsman Scheme, under the amended scheme a customer would be able to lodge a complaint against the bank for its non-adherence to RBI instructions with regard to mobile/electronic banking services.
  - Banking ombudsman has now been powered to pass an award of Rs 20
     lakh as against earlier threshold of Rs 10 lakh.
  - Amended Scheme shall come into force from July 1, 2017.
- MERIT Web portal launched
  - Piyush Goyal has launched "MERIT" portal which displays extensive array of information regarding the merit order of Electricity procured by State.







- The portal also give information regarding reasons for deviation from merit order such as must run conditions, transmission constraints etc.
- It has been developed by Ministry of Power in association with POSOCO and Central Electricity Authority.
- Maharashtra Govt ties up with Ola
  - Maharashtra govt has entered into an agreement with Ola, under which Ola will train 20,000 youth to become micro-entrepreneurs in the field of passenger transport in next 5 years.
  - Youth from districts like Palghar, Raigad, Aurangabad, Amravati would be given preference for skill training.
  - Ola has created employment for about 5 lakh youth in the nation and ferries around 4 crore passengers.
- Portal on weather information launched
  - Union Minister, Piyush Goyal launched a portal on weather information that will help discoms manage power distribution.
  - The Portal has been launched in association with POSOCO and IMD.
  - It will help in better planning for infrastructure availability to ensure cost effective and reliable supply.
- Passports to be in English and Hindi
  - While addressing an event to mark 50 years of the Passport Act, 1967,
     External affairs minister Sushma Swaraj announced that passports will now be in both Hindi and English, and not just in English.
  - Personal details in passports are now printed only in English.
  - She also announced 10 per cent reduction in passport fee for applicants who are under eight and over 60 years of age.
- No Cars, Phones For Uttarakhand Govt
  - Uttarakhand High Court has put a ban on purchase of cars, mobile phones and other luxury items by the government.

- Pune raises 200 crore in municipal bond
  - Pune Municipal Corporation has become the first local body in the country to issue municipal bonds in 15 years, raising Rs 200 crore for the smart city project.
  - The issue was handled by SBI Capital Market, was oversubscribed six times, having received subscriptions worth Rs 1,200 crore.
  - Domestic insurers, pension funds, and large state-owned banks have invested the PMC bonds.
- Delhi Metro introduces smart watches
  - DMRC has introduced a smart watch which will act as a smart card and can be used as entry and exit pass.
  - The commuter will simply have to touch the watch to the screens of the AFC gates at the metro stations to get access.
  - DMRC has partnered with LAKS GmbH which will manufacture the watch.
  - These watches will be called Watch2Pay, are available through an online ecommerce site.
- MeitY launches GST portal
  - Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology has launched a dedicated webpage to address issues related to IT Services and Electronics goods ahead of the roll out of the GST.

  - Individuals, Companies and Entrepreneurs in IT and Electronics sector can visit the webpage for sector specific information.

- Minister for Science & Technology Dr. Harshvardhan launched a Mobile
   App "Celebrating Yoga".
- The Mobile App developed by DST provides a platform to share information and insights about peoples' participation in Yoga activities on the occasion of the International Yoga Day 2017.
- The App will be connected with Google Map where shared information can been seen by the users.
- Energy Conservation Building Code 2017
  - Piyush Goyal launched the ECBC Code 2017 which prescribes energy performance standards for new commercial buildings to be constructed across India.
  - It aims to optimise energy savings with comfort levels for occupants, and prefers life-cycle cost effectiveness to achieve energy neutrality in commercial buildings.
  - Adoption of ECBC could lead to 30%-50% energy savings by commercial buildings.
- Govt announces 149 new POPSK
  - External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj has announced that the govt. will soon open 149 new Post Office Passport Seva Kendra.
  - These will be in addition to 86 POPSKs announced by MEA in the first phase.
  - Govt. has set up a target that no one has to travel more than a radius of 50 kms to get a passport.

  - Kochi Metro is the first in India to use Communication Based Train Control technology to maximise frequencies and minimise errors.
  - Each station on Kochi Metro will have solar panels, which will focus on producing 35% of the total power usage.







- It is the first public transport system to reserve jobs for members of the third sex.
- Punjab govt inks MoU with Centre, AAI
  - Punjab government has signed a tripartite agreement with the Centre and Airports Authority of India under UDAN scheme.
  - The four airports of Bathinda, Ludhiana, Pathankot and Adampur have been connected under the scheme through five proposals.
  - Approximately one lakh seats will be made available to passengers under the scheme, wherein 50 per cent 50,000 seats will be under fare cap.
- Nalanda University signs MoU
  - A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between Nalanda University and Academy of South Korean Studies in Patna for academic linkages and collaborations.
  - The two universities agreed to enhance their bilateral ties through joint research programmes, faculty and student exchange etc.
  - The MoU will be in effect for five years.
- NERCPA conference inaugurated



- Jail term for not printing new MRP
  - Consumer Affairs Minister Ram Vilas Paswan warned of a fine of up to Rs
     1 lakh, including a jail term, if new, post-GST rates are not printed on the inventory in the interest of consumers.
  - Manufacturers have been allowed to clear the unsold stocks by September with new MRP.
  - Under the GST regime, he said some prices of goods have fallen and some have risen.
- JIGYASA programme launched
  - Jigyasa, a student- scientist connect programme was officially launched in New Delhi.
  - Council of Scientific and Industrial Research has joined hands with Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan to implement this programme.
  - The focus is on connecting school students and scientists so as to extend student's classroom learning with that of a very well planned research laboratory based learning.
- Garib Nawaz Skill Development Centre
  - Minister of State for Minority Affairs, Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi has said that Garib Nawaz Skill Development Centres will be established in 100 districts of the country.
  - They will effectively ensure employment oriented skill development of youth belonging to Minority communities.







- In next 6 months, Garib Nawaz Skill Development Centres will be established at Hyderabad, Noida, Lucknow etc.
- Anti-Hijacking Law Comes Into Force
  - India's new anti-hijacking law which prescribes capital punishment in the event of death of "any person", has come into force.
  - It replaces a 1982 law, according to which hijackers could be tried only in event of death of hostages, such as flight crew, passengers.
  - The law mandates central govt to confer powers of investigation, arrest and prosecution on any officer of central govt or NIA.
- Customers should report fraud in 3 days
  - According to RBI, Customers will not suffer any loss if unauthorised online banking transactions are reported within 3 days.
  - The amount involved will be credited in the accounts concerned within 10days.
  - In case the third party fraud is reported with a delay of four to seven working days, a customer will face liability of up to Rs25,000.
- India declared free from H5N1 & H5N8
  - India has declared itself free from highly pathogenic Avian Influenza (H5N1 & H5N8) after surveillance in the states showed no evidence of its presence.
  - India reported outbreaks of Avian Influenza at epicentres in Delhi,
     Gwalior, Rajpura among others during Oct 2016 to Feb 2017.
  - The move will help India to resume export of poultry products to countries which had banned trade in such items.
- EC to tally paper trail slips with EVMs
  - Election Commission has decided to mandatorily tally paper trail slips with the results of EVMs in 5% of polling stations in each assembly seat, for all state and Lok Sabha elections.













- Counting of paper trail slips, however, will not take place in more than 14 polling stations and less than five polling stations in each assembly seat.
- The stations will be selected or identified at random.
- Target of constructing 57,000 km of road
  - Govt has set a target of constructing 57 thousand kilometers of roads under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana during 2017-18.
  - According to the Rural Development Ministry, the roads will be constructed at an average rate of 156 kilometers per day.
  - Pace of construction of PMGSY roads reached a 7 year high of 130 km per day in 2016-17s against an average of 73 km during the period 2011 to 2014.
- J&K assembly passes resolution for GST
  - Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly has finally adopted the GST resolution during a special session on 5th July.
  - The resolution moved by state finance minister Haseeb Drabu was adopted through a presidential order calling on the Centre to safeguard the special status and exclusive taxation powers of the state.
  - With this J&K has become the last state to pass the GST bill in the state.
- MERIT app and e-Bidding portal launched
  - Piyush Goyal launched the MERIT app and e-bidding portal for offering an e-Bidding solution to States.
  - It will help States to select Independent Power Producers for procurement of power by transferring their domestic coal under the scheme of flexibility in utilization of domestic coal.
  - It would result in optimum utilization of Coal which would save consumer close to Rs. 20,000 cr in 5 years.
- Electric Buses in Gurgaon
  - Haryana govt will set up an environment-friendly transportation system in Gurgaon on the pattern of Poland.







- In the first phase, 75 to 100 electric buses would be operated.
- Each electric bus would help save about 4.25 lakh litres diesel & reduce carbon emissions by 1150 tonnes in 10 years of operation.
- JBM Group would soon begin manufacturing electric buses under the Make in India programme.
- July 19 as Save public sector banks day
  - United Forum of Bank Unions has decided to observe July 19, the 48th anniversary of nationalisation of major banks, as 'Save public sector banks' day.
  - Members will wear a commemorative badge on the day, display posters in front of all branches, distribute leaflets & hold rallies at all centres across the country.
  - The main challenge that PSB face today is the alarming increase in bad loans.
- UDAY covers 97% of discom debt
  - The Union Ministry of Power has announced that about 97% of the total outstanding debt of all state power distribution companies has been covered under the Ujwal DISCOM Assurance Yojana.
  - As on September 2015, the total debt of all state-owned discoms was Rs
     3.95 lakh crore.
  - The 26 states and 1 UT which have joined the UDAY scheme accounted for total outstanding debt of Rs. 3.82 lakh crore.

#### • India's tallest ATC tower

- The new 101.9-metre air traffic control tower at the Delhi airport -- touted to be the country's tallest -- is likely to start operations by December.
- The tower, among the tallest structures in Delhi, will give a 360-degree view of the airport to the controllers who will be able to see all the three runways, aprons and taxiways.

- President clears bill banning hookah bar
  - President Pranab Mukherjee has approved a Legislative Bill to ban the hookah bar in Gujarat.
  - Violation of this law will attract Minimum 1 year and maximum 3 year sentence, provision of Rs 20,000 to Rs 50,000 fine is also mentioned in this amendment.
  - Most of the hookah bars in the state were running on the restaurant licence illegally and also selling products which are harmful to youngsters.
- AFSPA in Nagaland extended
  - Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act has been extended for 6 more months in Nagaland beginning June 30.
  - According to home ministry, Nagaland is in such a disturbed & dangerous condition that use of armed forces in aid of the civil power is necessary.
  - AFSPA has been in force in Nagaland for several decades and has not been withdrawn even after a framework agreement was signed on August 3, 2015.
- MP plants record 6.63 crore saplings
  - Madhya Pradesh govt has claimed that record 6.63 crore saplings were planted on the banks of river Narmada as part of its river conservation efforts.
  - The drive started at 7 am continued till 7 pm along the banks of the river covering 24 districts.
  - Drive might find a place in Guinness World Records as the current record of planting max saplings in least time is 5 cr in 24 hours by UP.
- AIIMS to adopt 50 elderly people
  - AIIMS in association with an NGO would adopt 50 elderly people, who are economically & physically challenged, to provide them with health care facilities.









- They will be adopted from various old age homes and society as per their health requirements and access to health care facilities.
- Geriatric department of AIIMS and NGO Healthy Aging India would provide free medicines at their doorstep.
- Free education for transgenders
  - Indira Gandhi National Open University has announced that transgender students can now study in any of the programmes offered by the university for free.
  - This is set to benefit 4000+ transgenders in the state who have lost out on job opportunities as they don't have necessary qualifications.
  - Vice Chancellor, Ravindra Kumar announced the initiative during the 22nd Prof G Ram Reddy Lecture.
- Kerala CM Vijayan launches G-Ride
  - Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan launched G-Ride, a digital ride sharing platform designed and deployed for the IT industry.
  - The platform has been developed by the Group of Technology Companies (GTech), the industry body of IT companies in the state.
  - G-Ride app automatically matches co-workers and neighbours and help them travel together to work. It is available both Android and iOS.
- Agriculture budget from next year
  - Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao has decided to present a separate agriculture budget from next year.
  - He also asked the officials to form farmers' associations at various levels.
    from villages to the state to organise the cultivators.
  - Farmers would also be provided training of modern and scientific methods of farming so as to increase the farm output.

• Govt completes safety audit













- The Road ministry has completed safety audit of 1.6 lakh bridges in the country out which 147 bridges were found to be unsafe during the audit.
- The government had launched an Integrated Bridge Management System to create data of all bridges and culverts in the country to avert mishaps
- Technologies using nano, laser and sensor are being introduced for realtime monitoring of bridges.
- TN to set up Rs 2350 cr solar park
  - The Tamil Nadu government will setup an Ultra Mega Solar Photovoltaic Power Park in Ramanathapuram district at an estimated cost of Rs 2350 crore.
  - State-run TANGEDCO will establish the 500 MW power park on Engineering Procurement Construction (EPC) basis at Naripaiyur and adjoining villages in the district.
  - It is one of the several new initiative launched by the government.
- 'No-Development Zone' near river Ganga
  - National Green Tribunal has declared 100m from the edge of River Ganga as a 'No-Development Zone' in the stretch b/w Haridwar in Uttarakhand & Unnao in Uttar Pradesh.
  - An environment compensation of Rs.50,000 will be imposed on anyone who dumps waste in Ganga.
  - NGT has also directed UP and Uttarakhand govts to formulate guidelines for religious activities on ghats of Ganga or its tributaries.
- SBI waives charge on IMPS fund transfer
  - SBI has waived charges for fund transfer of up to ₹1,000 through its Immediate Payment Service to promote small transactions.
  - SBI had been charging ₹5 along with service tax for fund transfer of up to ₹1,000.
  - Charge will be ₹5 along GST for fund transfer in range of 1,000 to 1 lakh.







- IMPS is an instant interbank electronic fund transfer service through mobile phones and internet banking.
- HAL signs MoU with Defence Ministry
  - Hindustan Aeronautics Limited has signed a MoU for 2017-18 with Ministry of Defence.
  - MoU outlines targets on various performance parameters of the company during 2017-18.
  - HAL has also laid specific emphasis on capacity building, modernization & solar plants aiming to achieve capital expenditure of 1300 cr.
  - HAL's thrust is on Make-in-India projects such as HTT-40, Light Combat Helicopter etc
- President inaugurates 'Ashiana Annexe'
  - President Mukherjee inaugurated Ashiana Annexe in Dehradun.
  - It comprises of 12 low cost dwelling units constructed to accommodate officers & staff of Rashtrapati Bhavan.
  - The units have been constructed using Habitech-NivaraTantra Onsite Sanitation Integrated Community Housing Technology Innovations.
  - Innovations comprise unique blocks "compacted intermeshing" which are made from local soil
- India to Become Largest Milk Producer
  - According to UN and Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development India will become the largest producer of milk in the world by the 2026.
  - India is also expected to triple its total milk production over the first quarter of the 21st century.
  - Milk production in India will grow by 49% in 2026.
  - India is also expected to record the biggest increase in wheat production globally.

- NGT bans use of nylon & synthetic manja
  - National Green Tribunal has banned use of 'Chinese' kite strings, made of nylon or any synthetic material.
  - o Ban also includes cotton 'manja' coated with glass
  - They have been banned as they poses threat to life and environment.
  - State govts have been directed to prohibit "manufacturing, sale, storage, purchase and use" of synthetic 'manja' or nylon threads used for flying kites.
- Free contraceptive injections for women
  - Maharashtra has become the first state in the country to provide women an injectable contraceptive for free.
  - The state's public health department launched a programme called Antara to offer women an injection of Medroxyprogesterone acetate, a birth-control hormone.
  - The injection is supposed to be used within a week from the day a woman's menstrual cycle starts.
- Committee for separate state flag
  - Karnataka Government has constituted a 9 member committee to study the possibility of designing a separate state flag and providing it a statutory standing.
  - The committee was constituted following representation of social activists from the state urged the government to design a separate flag for Kannada **'naadu' and give** statutory standing for it.
  - o J&K is the only state to have separate flag
- Govt increases import duty on sugar
  - Government has increased import duty on sugar to 50% from 40%, to restrict cheap inward shipments and maintain domestic prices.
  - Food Ministry had proposed increase in import duty on the grounds that fall in local prices will affect millers' capacity to pay cane dues to growers.







- In April this year, govt had allowed import of 5 lakh tonnes of raw sugar at zero duty to boost domestic supply.
- Aaykar Setu launched
  - Finance Minister Arun Jaitley has launched Aaykar Setu.
  - It is an e-initiative for Income tax Department to directly communicate with the taxpayers and aimed at providing information on useful tax services.
  - It compiles various tax tools, live chat facility, dynamic updated and important links to various processes within the Department in a single module.
- Govt saves over Rs 57,000 cr
  - Govt has saved more than Rs. 57,000 cr with its Direct Benefit Transfer scheme under which subsidies are given directly to beneficiaries.
  - DBT programme is a major reform initiative to check graft in welfare funds and is aimed at transferring benefits of various central govt-run social welfare schemes to bank accounts of beneficiaries.
  - Till March, 2017, there were 140 schemes under the DBT.
- 2nd state to accept online RTI apps
  - Delhi has became the second state to launch e-RTI portal that will enable citizens to file online Right to Information.
  - Portal will enable citizens to file RTI and seek information related to 172 departments of the Delhi govt including the office of the chief minister and his ministers.
  - Maharashtra is the first state to launch the online RTI platform.

- The Portal has been designed by NIC.
- Merger of Ministries
  - Government has merged the urban development and housing and urban poverty alleviation ministries.













- It will now be known as Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA).
- This is third time the ministries have been merged. With this merger, the government now has 51 ministries.
- The merger will create synergy, better coordination and planning between housing and urban infrastructure projects.
- International meet on social justice
  - A 3 day Babasaheb B.R. Ambedkar international conference on social justice will be held in Bengaluru from July 21 to 23.
  - Conference will unveil 'Bengaluru Declaration' outlining specific constitutional, institutional and policy responses to concerns of equity, freedom and democracy.
  - It also commemorates the 126th birth anniversary of the architect of Indian Constitution, B.R. Ambedkar.
- No non-veg food on domestic flights
  - The national carrier Air India has stopped serving non-vegetarian meals to economy-class passengers on all domestic flights from mid-June this year.
  - However, non-vegetarian meals would continue to be served in business and executive class on domestic as well as international flights.
  - The decision was taken to cut wastage and cost, and to avoid mix-up of vegetarian with non-vegetarian meals.
- Digital initiatives over e-education
  - President Mukherjee launched 3 digital initiatives Swayam, Swayam
     Prabha and National Academic Depository to push e-education in the country.
  - Aim of the initiatives is to raise the Gross Enrollment Ratio in higher education from 24.5 to 30 by 2020.
  - Swayam will host courses taught in classrooms from Class 9th to postgraduation, which can be accessed by anyone, anywhere at any time.
- Beef detection kit







- Directorate of FSL in Maharashtra has developed a portable kit which can determine if a meat sample contains beef or not.
- If meat sample fed into the kit is beef, the sample turns yellow and will be sent for further confirmation to FSL.
- Cow Meat Detection ELISA Kit can provide results within 30 mins.
- It will help police secure more convictions in cases of beef possession or transportation.
- Lower berth in 3AC coach to be reserved
  - Indian Railways has fixed quota for 'Divyangs' in 3AC of mail and express trains to make the journey hassle-free. A lower berth in 3AC coach will be reserved for Divyangs.
  - Currently, there is a provision for lower berth quota in sleeper class only.
  - In order to facilitate smooth entry into platforms, all stations are being made accessible for differently-abled passengers.
- First Maize based Mega Food Park
  - Harsimrat Kaur Badal, Union Minister of Food Processing Industry laid the foundation stone for 1st Maize based Mega Food Park in Kapurthala, Punjab.
  - It is a major step for containing desertification problem of Punjab and would make farmers turn to maize cultivation which need less water for more production.
  - It will provide employment to 5,000 persons & benefit about 25,000 farmers.
- Easy to clean blankets to be introduced
  - The railways have roped in the National Institute of Fashion Design to design lightweight blankets with less wool content.
  - A trial of 'thin, cold washable blankets' is also being carried out in the Central Railway zone as a pilot project.



- Jiyo Parsi phase II campaign launched
  - The Union Ministry of Minority Affairs has launched Jiyo Parsi Publicity Phase-2 in Mumbai, Maharashtra under the Jiyo Parsi scheme.
  - The campaign was launched in 2014, to address the issue of dwindling population of India's Parsi community.
  - The last 2011 census put the number of Indian Parsis at 57,264, dropping from 114,000 in 1941.
- Women commission to ink pact with UNDP
  - Maharashtra's women commission will ink an agreement with United Nations Development Programme for rescue & rehabilitation of women who are victims of sex trafficking, acid attack & domestic violence.
  - Under the pact, one of the key areas would be to impart skills to the affected women to help them sustain themselves financially.
  - An MoU with UNDP in this regard would be signed in next 15 days
- Ban on liquid nitrogen in drinks, food
  - Haryana govt has banned mixing of liquid nitrogen in drinks & food, days after a man burnt a hole in his stomach after drinking a cocktail containing the chemical.
  - Due to its low temperature liquid nitrogen can be extremely damaging to body tissue, causing cryogenic burning on contact.
  - It releases large volume of gas on evaporation & can burst open the stomach if ingested in large quantities
- Injection safety programme
  - Punjab has become the 1st state in the country to introduce injection safety programme.
  - For this Punjab signed an agreement with Foundation for Innovative New Diagnostics on World Hepatitis Day.







- It will support Punjab Health Department by providing Rapid test kits for screening of high risk patients.
- WHO & Health Department together will work in sensitising public regarding safe injections.
- Lok Sabha passes IIM Bill, 2017
  - Lok Sabha has approved Indian Institutes of Management Bill 2017 that promises to grant administrative, academic and financial autonomy to the B-Schools and allow them to award degrees to their graduates.
  - The bill will grant greater autonomy to these schools and ensure they are board-driven, with chairperson & director selected by board.
  - The govt also agreed not to change the name of IIM-C.
- Delhi Metro first to become 100% 'green'
  - Delhi Metro has become the only completely green Metro system in the world for adhering to green building norms for its residential colonies.
  - Delhi Metro has secured platinum rating for adherence to green building norms for its 10 residential colonies from Indian Green Building Council.
  - DMRC also announced that it is now generating 20 MW of solar power after adding new solar power facilities
- Earthquake Parameter Dissemination app
  - Govt has launched 2 Mobile apps 'India Quake' for dissemination of earthquake parameters and 'Sagar Vani' to disseminate ocean related information & alert users in timely manner.
  - Developed by NCS, India Quake will automatically disseminate relevant parameter after occurrence of earthquakes.
  - The app will make information dissemination faster with no restrictions on the number of recipients.

  - It will ensure children of those serving in lower categories in PSUs & other institutions to get benefit of OBC reservation at par with children of people serving in lower categories in govt.
  - Candidates whose parents hold constitutional posts or group A & B posts are excluded.
- Host city logo for Kochi
  - Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan launched the host city logo for Kochi, one of the venues of Fifa Under-17 World Cup.
  - The logo represents and reflects Kochi's identity and will be a valuable tool in linking the local community in a global World Cup.
  - The host city logo will allow all football fans in Kochi to have a local flavour and will be critical in the promotion of the tournament.
- No interview in government jobs
  - Uttar Pradesh Govt has decided to end the process of holding interview for selection of candidates for the govt jobs in all the non-gazetted posts of Group B, C and D categories.





- This new rule will not be binding on the on-going recruitment for Class II officers.
- The decision was taken in a cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath.
- Jammu gets Rs 200 crore funds
  - Over Rs 200 crore funds have been allocated for Jammu under the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation.
  - Several major towns of the state would also be covered under the AMRUT programme so that they are replete with all modern facilities of urban living.
  - Funds have been allocated for development of various sectors like urban transport, green spaces, drainage and sewerage.
- PM Modi inaugurates hanging bridge
  - Prime Minister Modi dedicated a hanging bridge built across the Chambal river at Kota to the nation.
  - The bridge took 10 years to meet its completion at a cost of over Rs 200 crore.
  - Cables of the bridge are aerodynamic giving them the ability to be neutral in stormy winds.
  - The bridge is a part of the East West Corridor of Golden Quadrangle
     Project of National Highways Authority of India.
- Ease of Doing Business report
  - NITI Aayog launched Ease of Doing Business report based on an Enterprise Survey of 3,500 manufacturing firms across Indian states & UT's.
  - Survey has conducted along with IDFC Institute, to assess business regulations & enabling environment across India from firms' perspective.

- Synergy Conference on Defence Pension
  - The Defence Accounts Department, DAD organised its first Synergy Conference on Defence Pensions in New Delhi.

  - The Union government had argued that privacy is a common law right.

  - Union Minister for Social Justice & Empowerment Tanwar Chand Gehlot inaugurated a 9 day campaign on Clean Society-Healthy Society in Delhi.

  - The 17th Meeting of the Financial Stability and Development Council was held in New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Arun Jaitley.
  - The Council took note of progress of Financial Sector Assessment Program for India, jointly conducted by IMF and World Bank.
  - The Council also deliberated on strengthening the regulation of the Credit Rating Agencies.
- First Videsh Bhavan in Mumbai

  - 5 judges of different faiths heard the case over 5 days from May 12 to May
     18
- 8th World Renewable Energy Technology
  - 8th World Renewable Energy Technology Congress took place in New Delhi.
  - It focusses on Green Technologies to ensure clean & affordable Renewable Energy supplies.
  - It provides an opportunity & open forum to exchange info & best practices by bringing together multi stake holders.
  - It is visualized & planned in backdrop of India's vision on achieving Energy Independence & Power for all by 2022.

• Physical Police verification to end







- Govt is planning to end physical police verification for passports by replacing it with a connection to national database of crimes & criminals that will keep track of background of a passport applicant.
- CCTNS is expected to be linked with passport service allowing online police verification for passports within a year.
- It will minimise contact with police & reduce time.
- AP adopts national policy for Tibetans
  - Arunachal Pradesh has adopted a rehabilitation policy which deals with matters concerning land lease, extending Central & state benefits to Tibetans residing in the state.
  - With this AP joins Himachal Pradesh & Uttarakhand who have already done the same in 2015 after Govt of India formalized Tibetan Rehabilitation policy act in 2014.
  - Arunachal Pradesh houses 4h largest no of Tibetans in India
- Clouding seeding Project Varshadhari
  - The cloud seeding experiment called Project Varshadhari was launched in Bengaluru under which an aircraft will spray chemicals to induce rainfall.
  - The flight for cloud seeding BQ-100 Beechcraft will spray Silver Iodide, Sodium Chloride & Potassium Chloride to condense water particles.
  - It aims to condense small water particles by clouds to droplets of 50 microns, which can constitute rains.
- Delhi bans manual cleaning of sewers
  - Delhi social welfare minister Rajendra Pal Gautam has announced a blanket ban on manual cleaning of sewers.
  - Any contractor or engineer found getting the sewer lines or tanks cleaned manually will be booked under culpable homicide instead of negligence.
  - This comes after a man died while cleaning a sewer tank in LNJP Hospital of the Delhi Govt, while 3 others were injured.







- NABARD sanctions loan to Rajasthan govt

  - It will also provide citizens. facility for online complaint registration and request for antecedent verification.
- Scheme for Compassionate Family Pension
  - Assam govt will launch a new Scheme called, Scheme for Compassionate Family Pension in lieu of Compassionate Appointment.
  - The scheme will be applicable to those employees who died in harness on or after April 1, 2017.
  - It will be applicable to all employees of the state govt, all others as eligible under Assam Services Rules, 1969 & All India Services officers borne on Assam cadre.
- SDMC launches 'terminator train'

- o It will not only eliminate larvae but also neutralize mosquitoes.

     medical outlets of AMRIT Deendayal in Assam, UP & Punjab.
  - He will also inaugurate one outlet of AMRIT Deendayal at Indira Gandhi Medical College Shimla.
  - A purpose of AMRIT Deendayal programme is to provide different kind of medicines & equipment's on cheap rates to patients, discount up to 60% on MRP is provided to patients.
- JEE advanced to go completely online
  - Joint Entrance Examination for Indian Institute of Technology will go completely online from 2018.
  - Joint Admission Board, which is the policy-making body on IIT admissions, took the decision at a meeting in Chennai.
  - Union HRD Ministry had earlier introduced the option of taking JEE-Mains online.
  - JEE-Mains is the entrance examination for admission to engineering courses offered across India.
- Delegation of Powers to BRO
  - Defence Ministry has approved delegation of administrative & financial powers to Border Roads Organisation.

- Common use items exempt from e-way bill
  - LPG, kerosene & currency are among the common use items that have been exempted from e-way bill provision.
  - Council has approved a list of 153 items that have been exempted from obtaining e-way bills.
  - GST mandates obtaining e-way bills for transporting goods consignment of more than Rs 50,000 in value.
  - E-way bill is not required if goods are transported by non-motorised conveyances.
- One year exemption for TN from NEET
  - Central govt has decided to grant exemption of 1 year from NEET system for students of govt colleges in Tamil Nadu.
  - TN comprises of more than 90% students from State Board, which makes it difficult for them to qualify NEET which is based on CBSE syllabus.
  - NEET is an entrance exam for students who wish to study graduate medical course or PG course in govt or private medical colleges in India.
- Sankalp Se Siddhi Program in Coimbatore
  - To take forward the initiative PM Modi for a New India movement from 2017 2022, a Sankalp Se Siddhi programme was held in Coimbatore.

- Person converting willingly will have to inform Deputy Commissioner.

     Livelihoods Mission.
  - Self Help Groups under DAY-NRLM will operate road transport service in backward areas & will provide safe, affordable & community monitored rural transport.









- AGEY will be initially implemented in 250 Blocks in the country on pilot basis
- Namami Gange Jagriti Yatra
  - Uttar Pradesh Govt has launched a new awareness drive called Namami Gange Jagriti Yatra.
  - The drive will be focusing on cleanliness along the banks of Ganga river and maintain hygiene.
  - The drive has been organised by Uttar Pradesh Homeguard volunteers and will help in spreading awareness in about 25 districts situated on the banks of river Ganga in the state.
- National Deworming Day

- Online Registration for custodians
  - SEBI has introduced an online registration mechanism for custodians of securities to make it convenient for them to do business.
  - The new system will help custodian of securities to complete registration and other regulatory filings with Sebi much faster and in a cost-effective manner.
  - The new system has been made operational with immediate effect.
- Ban on non-biodegradable plastic bags





- Once the e-way bill is implemented, all goods and services worth Rs
   50,000 or more would need to be registered before these are moved 10 km for sale.
- There would be very few check posts to ensure the smooth transport of goods. These rules would not be applicable for exempted goods.
- SUVs, luxury cars to cost more
  - GST Council has approved a proposal to hike cess on SUVs, mid-sized, large & luxury cars from 15% to 25%.
  - While all cars attract a peak GST rate of 28%, large motor vehicles, SUVs, mid-segment, large, hybrid cars and hybrid motor vehicles attract a cess of 15% on top of it.
  - Cess collected on cars as also tobacco & coal will be used to compensate the revenue loss of states by implementing GST
- Govt merges NCRB with BPRD
  - National Crime Records Bureau has been merged with another central police organisation the BPRD by the govt.
  - Merger aims to improve efficiency of development works related to policing. It will also boost crime data collection & research efforts of the two organisations.
  - BPRD Director General will head the merged new entity, NCRB Director, an Additional DG rank post will report to the former.
- Green Airports in Andhra Pradesh
  - As part of the Green airports initiative taken by Ministry of Civil Aviation, 2 airports in Andhra Pradesh are soon going to turn into Green Airports.
  - Installation of 1 Mega Watt solar power plant at Tirupati and Vijayawada airports has commenced.

- Motorbike ambulance service launched
  - Maharashtra govt has launched a motorbike ambulance service to provide swift medical assistance to patients.
  - Ambulance will be available through `108' helpline, have teams of paramedics providing treatment, especially in places inaccessible to larger ambulances, to patients during the golden hour.
  - Royal Enfield motorbikes have been converted into ambulances with emergency medical equipment
- Indian Railways signs first EPC
  - Indian Railways signed its first Engineering, Procurement & Construction contract with L&T for large electrification projects.
  - Contract valuing Rs 1,050 cr for electrification of 781 RKM was awarded by Central Organisation for Railway Electrification & Konkan Railways.
  - Contracts were awarded to speed up electrification of railway lines under
     'Mission Electrification' plan.
- Centre proposes to set up 14 new AIIMS
  - Govt proposes to establish additional 14 new AIIMS under various phases of Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana in different parts of country.
  - AIIMS in Bhubaneswar, Jodhpur & Raipur have been almost operational & are receiving patients not only from states but also from neighbouring regions.
  - Govt is also working on enhancing capacity of Delhi's medical institutes by adding 1,563 new beds.
- Measles-rubella vaccination campaign
  - Govt has launched Measles-Rubella vaccination campaign in a phased manner for across the country to reduce measles morbidity and mortality.











- The MR vaccination campaign will cover children in the age group of 9 months to less than 15 years.
- Campaign started in February 2017 from five states and UTs and has covered about 3.33 crores children have been vaccinated during this campaign.
- Lok Sabha passes Banking Regulation Bill
  - Banking Regulation (Amendment) Bill 2017, which was promulgated in May, was passed in Lok Sabha.
  - It will replace Banking Regulation Act 1949, giving govt power to authorise RBI to issue directions to banks to initiate insolvency resolution in case of a default.
  - Bill empowers RBI to issue directives for resolution & appoint authorities to advise banking companies on stressed asset resolution.
- Govt ends 10-yr pact with GVK-EMRI
  - Department of Health & Family Welfare has terminated its 10-year contract with GVK-EMRI which provides emergency response service 108 Arogya Kavacha.
  - Decision was taken citing certain shortcomings of GVK-EMRI group such as delay in providing services, shortage in manpower & not addressing employees' grievances.
  - Govt had entered into an agreement with GVK-EMRI in 2008 which was to end in 2018
- Aadhaar-authenticated DBT portal
  - Maharashtra has launched MahaDBT portal, through which benefits of all govt schemes will be transferred directly into bank accounts of beneficiaries in the state.
  - It has been designed on lines of central govt's DBT scheme, Aadhaar will become mandatory to claim benefits through the portal,







- Maharashtra is the 1st state to launch this system to give direct benefits with Aadhaar authentication
- Govt inks MoA to set up IRRI
  - Agriculture Ministry has signed a MoA for setting up a regional centre of global rice research institute IRRI in Varanasi, to develop high- yielding rice varieties.
  - This will be 1st international centre in eastern India & will play a major role in sustaining rice production in the region.
  - IRRI is known for its work in developing rice varieties that contributed to green revolution in 1960s.
- Lok Sabha passes NABARD (Amendment) Bill
  - Lok Sabha has passed NABARD (Amendment) Bill, 2017 by voice vote that seeks to amend National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development Act, 1981.
  - Bill allows central govt to increase authorise capital of Bank from Rs.
     5,000 cr to Rs.30,000 cr.
  - NABARD is responsible for providing & regulating facilities like credit for agricultural & industrial development in rural areas.
- Scheme to boost farm start-ups
  - Govt is launching a new AGRI-UDAAN programme that will mentor startups & help them connect with potential investors.
  - It will be managed by Indian Council of Agricultural Research & will help convert innovative ideas from India's rural youth into viable businesses.
  - Under the programme, start-ups will get incubation space to run their businesses and access to research laboratories & libraries.
- LS passes 2 bills extending CGST, IGST
  - Lok Sabha has passed 2 bills extending Central GST and Integrated GST to Jammu and Kashmir.

  - Indian Army has developed a mobile application through which serving soldiers can track details like postings & promotions.
  - Through the app named Humraaz, soldiers can view their monthly salary slips & Form 16 and also download them.
  - For security reasons, the installation of the application has been linked to verification of Aadhar details.
  - The app has been developed in-house by the Army.

• Cabinet clears proxy voting for NRIs







- Cabinet has cleared a proposal to extend proxy voting to overseas Indians by amending electoral laws.
- While NRIs & overseas Indians are free to cast their votes in their constituencies, the proposal would allow them to use proxy which was only available to service personnel.
- 16m NRIs will be able to vote in elections by appointing proxies residing in their constituencies to cast their votes.
- Scrapping of no detention policy
  - Cabinet has approved scrapping of no-detention policy in schools till Class
     8.
  - Policy was introduced under RTE 2009 according to which schools were not allowed to fail or expel a student up to Class 8.
  - It will now allow states to detain students in class V & class VIII if they fail in the year-end exam.
  - States will have to give them a 2nd chance before stopping their promotion to next class
- Modi to inaugurate 'Rajaswa Gyansangam'
  - Prime Minister Modi will inaugurate 2 day 'Rajaswa Gyansangam' on September 1, during which central & state tax officers will brainstorm on major issues.
  - To be held in New Delhi, focus of the discussion will be on GST as well as on unearthing black money
  - This will be for the first time that the tax officers of state governments will also be invited for discussion on the GST related issues.
- RBI cuts reporate by 25 bps
  - The Monetary Policy Committee of the Reserve Bank of India slashed the short-term lending rate, or repo rate, by 25 basis points to 6%, the lowest in more than six-and-a-half years, at its third bimonthly policy review.











- RBI's move comes on the back of inflation running well below its target for consecutive quarters.
- Reverse reportate was also reduced by 25 basis points to 5.75% from 6%.
- Jharkhand clears bill to ban conversions
  - Jharkhand cabinet has approved draft of a bill that will ban religious conversion by force or allurement.
  - It aims for tougher action on forced conversions of minor girls & women from scheduled tribes.
  - Anyone found violating it will be liable for 3 years' imprisonment or Rs
     50,000 fine or both.
  - The law already exists in MP, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Gujarat, Maharashtra
     & Himachal Pradesh.
- Govt launches portal e-RaKAM
  - Govt has launched a portal e-Rashtriya Kisan Agri Mandi which will provide a platform to sell agricultural produce.
  - It is developed by MSTC Limited & supported by marketing & logistics partner CRWC Limited.
  - E-RaKAM is a first-of-its-kind initiative that leverages technology to connect farmers of the smallest villages to the biggest markets of the world through internet and e-RaKAM centres.
- Government to end LPG subsidy
  - Govt has ordered state-run oil companies to raise subsidised cooking gas, LPG, prices by Rs.4 per cylinder every month to eliminate all subsidies by March next year.
  - It will be in effect till the reduction of govt subsidy to 'nil', or till March next year, whichever is earliest.
  - Every household is entitled to 12 cylinders of 14.2-kg each at subsidised rates in a year.
- RBI plans to extend cyber audit





- RBI is planning to conduct a cyber-audit of all banks in the country instead of just a few bigger banks as it did in the past.
- Banks which do not have security measures in place as per the RBI standards will be given time to comply, failing which the regulator may initiate action.
- RBI is also expected to do a gap analysis on the basis of the reports and ask banks to bridge the gaps.
- SC bans use of 5 metals in firecrackers
  - Supreme Court has imposed a ban on use of 5 harmful metals in firecrackers as they cause enormous air pollution.
  - A bench headed by Justice Madan B Lokur prohibited use of lithium, mercury, arsenic, antimony, lead metals which are used in manufacturing of firecrackers.
  - Court have also asked CPCB & PESO to setup standards regarding air pollution caused by bursting of fire-crackers.
- Swachh Survekshan launched
  - Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs Narendra Singh Tomar launched Swachh Survekshan-2018 in New Delhi.
  - The third in the series Survekshan will rank all 4,041 cities & towns of India based on infrastructure development for improved sanitation services & their sustainability, outcomes.
  - It will assess sanitation levels in all cities & towns impacting the lives of about 40 crore urban people.

  - Chef Sanjeev Kapoor will be the brand ambassador of the event at the global food fair.
- PM Modi to flag off Mahamana Express
  - PM Modi will flag off country's 3rd Mahamana Express from his Lok Sabha constituency of Varanasi.
  - It will connect Varanasi with Surat & Vadodara in Gujarat.

- Campaign to sensitise women about cancer
  - Union minister Anupriya Patel has launched a nationwide health campaign to sensitise women about the early screening and preventive care for cancer.
  - Themed 'Nurturing the Nurturer', campaign was launched by FICCI Ladies Organisation in partnership with the Apollo Hospitals group.
  - With cancer cases on the rise in the country, government plans to set up 27 cancer centres in the coming days.
- Electric Bus Service in India
  - Himachal Pradesh has become the first hill state in the country to run electric buses.
  - The buses will ply on Manali-Kullu and Mandi routes during winters when the road to Rohtang is blocked with snow.
  - Electricity charging points have been installed at Manali and Marhi.
  - Initially, two mid-size buses with a seating capacity of 27 and 32 respectively will ply on the route.
- Udaan extended for Jammu and Kashmir
  - The Union Cabinet extended the time period for Udaan the Special Industry Initiative for Jammu and Kashmir till 31 December 2018.
  - Udaan is a centrally funded skill enhancement scheme for J&K youth implemented by National Skill Development Corporation.
  - The scheme is run by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC).
- Puducherry to ban plastic bags
  - The Puducherry government decided to ban manufacture and use of plastic packaging materials of less than 51 microns.

- Aircraft services to hilly areas

  - UDAN is a regional airport development & Connectivity Scheme aimed at making air travel affordable.
- Bill on fugitive economic offenders
  - The law ministry has given its concurrence to a draft bill that will give powers to the government to confiscate property of economic offenders and defaulters who flee India.
  - The proposed law will be applicable in cases where the value of offences is over Rs 100 crore.
  - The bill also has provision for appointment of an administrator to dispose off the property to pay off the creditors.
- North East Festival to return to Delhi
  - The fifth edition of the North East Festival, which brings together the numerous colours and talents of the region, will begin in Delhi.
  - The three-day festival, to be held at IGNCA, Janpath, will present Naga warrior dance, Thang ta of Manipur, Hojagiri of Tripura and much more.
  - Various northeastern states, developmental councils will present investment and tourism potential of the region.









## October 2017

- New railway line from Bidar-Kalaburagi
  - Modi dedicated the Bidar Kalaburagi New Railway Line to the Nation by unveiling a plaque at Bidar Railway Station, in Karnataka.
  - The 110 km Bidar-Kalaburgi railway track in the Hyderabad-Karnataka region that will reduce the distance between Bengaluru and New Delhi by 380km and travel time by six to eight hours.
  - Prime Minister also flagged off the DEMU Service between Bidar and Kalaburagi.
- Government relaxes Arms Rules
  - On 30th October 2017, it was announced that, to boost the 'Make in India' initiative, the Union home ministry has relaxed the Arms Rules, 1959.
  - The Arms Rules has been relaxed to encourage investment in the manufacturing of arms, ammunition and weapon systems in the country.
  - This will increase employment opportunities in turn. The new rules came to effect on 27th October 2017.
- 2.9 mn children w/o measles vaccination
  - According to a new report published by leading health organisations, around 2.9 million children in India do not get vaccinated against measles.
  - It is a highly contagious viral disease that claims nearly 90,000 lives globally every year.

- More than half of these unvaccinated children live in six countries Nigeria, India, Pakistan, Indonesia, Ethiopia and Democratic Republic of the Congo.
- 1st shipment of wheat to Afghanistan















- External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj and Foreign Minister of
   Afghanistan Salahuddin Rabbani, through a joint video conference,
   flagged off the first shipment of wheat from India to Afghanistan.
- It would be transhipped through the Chabahar port in Iran.
- The shipment is part of India's commitment to supply 1.1 million tonnes of wheat for the people of Afghanistan on grant basis.
- Mobile Aadhar can be used as ID proof
  - According to Bureau of Civil Aviation and Security, Mobile Aadhaar can be used as an identity proof to enter airports.
  - BCAS has said that passengers entering an airport premises need to produce any one of the 10 identity proofs, which include passport, voter ID card, Aadhaar / m-Aadhaar, PAN card.
  - Students also have the option to furnish a photo identity card issued by a government institute
- Air Chief Marshal visits Vietnam
  - Air Chief Marshal Birender Singh is on an official visit to Vietnam from 30
     Oct 17 to 03 Nov 17.
  - During his visit, he is scheduled to hold bilateral meeting with Vietnam
     People's Air Force.
  - The main focus of the visit would be on improving bilateral relations, promoting defence ties and evolving steps to further strengthen defence cooperation between the two Air Forces.
- Vigilance Awareness Week
  - The Central Vigilance Commission has decided that this year the Vigilance
     Awareness Week would be observed from 30th October to 4th November, 2017.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  The theme of the week would be "My Vision-Corruption Free India".







- Purpose of observing Vigilance Awareness Week is to educate the public at large about the corruption related practices and also educating them how to report about it.
- Italy PM Paolo arrives in New Delhi
  - Prime Minister of Italy Paolo Gentiloni arrived in New Delhi on a two day visit to India.
  - The visit coming after a gap of more than a decade, is aimed at strengthening the bilateral political and economic relations between the two countries.
  - The last visit of the Italian Prime Minister to India was in February 2007.
- RORO ships Chennai Port to Bangladesh
  - Nitin Gadkari digitally flagged off a Roll-On/Roll-Off (RoRo) ship from Chennai Port to Mongla port in Bangladesh.
  - M.V. IDM DOODLE, a RoRo cum general cargo vessel carried an export consignment of 185 trucks by Ashok Leyland to Bangladesh.Export of these trucks was earlier done through land route.
  - Transport through the sea route will save about 15-20 days of travel time.
- Rs 8698 cr as GST compensation to states
  - Central Government has released Rs 8698 crore as compensation to states for revenue loss following implementation of GST.
  - All states except Rajasthan and Arunachal Pradesh have been given compensation for July-August after GST rollout.
  - GST, which was rolled out on July 1, 2017, is a destination-based, single indirect tax that is levied on consumption of goods or use of services across India.
- 7,000 crore for 6 IIT Campuses
  - The Union Cabinet has approved over Rs 7,000 crore for construction of permanent campuses of six new IITs across the country.













- Campuses will be built at Tirupati (Andhra Pradesh), Palakkad (Kerala),
   Dharwad (Karnataka), Jammu (Jammu and Kashmir), Bhilai (Chhattisgarh) and Goa.
- Each of the permanent campuses will have a facility for housing 1,200 students from the academic year 2020-2021.
- Justin Bieber's wax figure in Delhi
  - Madame Tussauds India unveiled a statue of Grammy award-winning singer Justin Bieber in a mini preview at The Grub Festival.
  - In the festival visitors will have the opportunity to interact with the figures of celebrities, which is a unique part of the show.
  - The final display of all statues at the wax museum will take place on December 1.
- Vrindavan, Barsana declared sacred sites
  - Uttar Pradesh State Government issued an order notifying Vrindavan and Barsana towns in Mathura district as "pavitra teerth sthals" (sacred pilgrimage sites).
  - No meat and liquor shops will be allowed in these towns.
  - These are first two places to be notified as teerth sthal in Uttar
     Pradesh. Earlier, a similar order was passed to notify Haridwar as 'teerth sthal'.
- Kovind launches technocity project
  - President Ram Nath Kovind launched a Technocity in Pallippuram, Kerala.
  - He also laid foundation stone of Kerala Government's first Information Technology building in the campus.
  - Once the Technocity is fully operational, it is expected to create 100000 employment opportunities as reputed IT organisations including TCS, SunTec and KASE have already taken land for development at Technocity.
- India, France held talks on defence







- Ms. Florence Parly, the French Minister for the Armed Forces, was on an official visit to India from 26th 28th October, 2017.
- India and France agreed to strengthen bilateral defence cooperation.
- They talked about initiatives to further strengthen bilateral defence cooperation between India and France. It is to be noted that France is India's major supplier of defence equipments.
- Shipping ministry offers grant to JNPT
  - Shipping Ministry announced that it has sanctioned Rs 25 cr to the Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust and another Rs 50 cr to the Karwar port in Karnataka.
  - Funds are given for development of coastal berth under the flagship Sagarmala project.
  - Sagarmala project was launched by Union Shipping Ministry in 2015, with an aim to modernize India's Ports which will contribute in country's economic growth.

## Suresh Prabhu launches CIPAM's Website

- Minister for Commerce and Industry, Suresh Prabhu launched the official website for the Cell for IPR Promotion and Management of the Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion.
- CIPAM has been set up under the support of DIPP to implement the National Intellectual Property Rights Policy.
- The CIPAM website is interactive and provides regular updates on all upcoming events.
- Ban on pics of living persons on banners
  - Madras high court banned the use of pictures of living persons on banners and hoardings in Tamil Nadu.
  - The order states that, pictures of the chief minister, ministers or politicians cannot be used in posters or hoardings.









- It has also banned the use of photos of people sponsoring the pictures.
- 'Focus State' at World Food India-2017
  - Odisha will be the 'Focus State' in the World Food India (WFI)-2017, the international food event to be held at New Delhi from 3 to 5 November 2017.
  - More than 200 global companies from 30 countries would participate in the World Food India-2017.
  - Odisha would set up its own Pavilion with 12 stalls. It would showcase various processed food items of Odisha like spices, cashew.
- Meghalaya ED enters Limca Book of Record
  - Meghalaya Election Department has entered Limca Book of Records for the formation of the biggest human logo comprising young voters in the state.
  - The logo formation was part of Mission Unite (U and I towards Enrolment) as part of the Special drive to enroll young and left out voters.
  - A total of 2,870 students, 113 schools, three colleges participated. The logo size was 120ft x 75ft.
- MP tops in digital initiatives
  - As per a report by Coeus Age Consulting, Madhya Pradesh has emerged as the top state in terms of digital initiatives undertaken by State Government.
  - Coeus Age Consulting is an organisation which provides consultancy services on various aspects of digital economy.
  - A comparative assessment of digital initiatives by 36 states and Union Territories was undertaken by Coeus Age Consulting.
- Foundation Stone of Aerospace Park in TN
  - The Tamil Nadu Chief Minister, Edapaddi K Palaniswami, laid the foundation stone for an aerospace park at Kanchipuram district.







- The park will be set up by the State Government in 245 acres at an estimated cost of Rs 198 crore.
- When fully ready, the park will attract a total investment of nearly Rs 1,000 crore and create job opportunities for nearly 30,000.
- 1st War of Independence: Paika Bidroha
  - Union HRD Minister Prakash Javadekar mentioned that from the next academic session, 'Paika Bidroha' of 1817 will be included in history text books as 'the First War of Independence'.
  - Paika Rebellion was an armed rebellion against British East India Company, which broke out in the year 1817 across Odisha.
  - Combination of social-political-economic causes triggered the Paika rebellion.
- 7-lakh cr to develop 83,000 km Highways
  - Cabinet has approved the biggest ever highway project to develop and expand approximately 83,000 km of roads at an investment of Rs 6.9 lakh crore by 2022.
  - Project also includes the new 28,400 km Bharatmala highway program connecting border areas, improving international, port and coastal connectivity.
  - Bharatmala is government's mega plan for improving connectivity in border and other areas.
- Govt de-affiliates 400 ITIs
  - The government has de-affiliated close to 400 ITIs after quality inspections.
  - Government found the institutes lacking the requisite infrastructure and trainers for imparting vocational training to students.
  - Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship conducted the inspection.

- Sachin gave fund for foot overbridge
  - Cricket icon and Rajya Sabha member Sachin Tendulkar has sanctioned
     Rs 2 crore for revamp of rail foot over bridges in Mumbai.
  - The fund is given from his Members of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme fund.
  - On September 29, 23 people were killed in the rush-hour stampede on a narrow foot overbridge (FOBs) linking Elphinstone Road and Parel suburban stations during heavy rain.
- BHEL starts execution of Yadadri plant
  - BHEL announced that it has commenced execution of Yadadri supercritical thermal power project ordered by the Telangana State Power Generation Corporation Ltd.
  - Project is located at Damaracherla in Nalgonda district of Telangana.
  - This is the single largest order for BHEL so far. BHEL is already executing 800 MW Kothagudem and 1,080 MW Bhadradri power projects.
- MIDC to get anti-encroachment cells
  - Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation will finally get a dedicated encroachment removal department.
  - The MIDC is presently in control of nearly 1.5 lakh hectares of land, in various stages of acquisition.
  - The mandate of the department that was set up in 1962 is to acquire land, undertake provisioning of infrastructure on these plots and facilitate setting up of industrial units.
- Kolkata food items have high lead levels
  - According to Geological Survey of India, Raw food items sold in Kolkata city markets have Lead concentration far above the permissible limit.
  - High concentration of Lead can permanently damage key human organs.







- Samples of raw food items collected from 12 markets in the city showed a mean Lead (Pb) concentration between 3.78 and 43.35 mg/kg (average 23.56 mg/kg).
- IAF Exercise on Lucknow-Agra Expressway
  - The Lucknow-Agra Expressway will be closed for commuters from 10 am on October 23 till 2 pm on October 24 as the IAF plans to conduct a major touchdown exercise.
  - 20 planes, including the AN-32, will take part in exercise on the highway.
  - The AN-32 are meant for humanitarian assistance and disaster relief. It can bring a large amount of relief material and can also help in evacuating people.
- No probe against judges in Rajasthan
  - Rajasthan government has passed an ordinance which seeks to protect both serving and former judges, magistrates and public servants in Rajasthan from being investigated for on-duty action without its prior sanction.
  - The Criminal Laws (Rajasthan Amendment) Ordinance, 2017 has been promulgated in this regard.
  - The ordinance amends the Criminal Code of Procedure, 1973.
- PGs for cattle to boost milk production
  - Haryana government has decided to introduce a new concept for people living in high-rises, or in urban areas, who want to rear their own cattle and produce "quality milk" for their consumption.
  - The government will set up PGs for cattle for them.

- The objective is to make Haryana the best state in milk production.
- Mega textile park in Warangal
  - Telangana CM K Chandrasekhara Rao laid the foundation stone for the Kakatiya Mega Textile Park.















- It is a fibre-to-fabric integrated textile cluster proposed to be built on
  1,200 acres of land in the Warangal district.
- This is going to be one of the largest textile parks in the country.
- BSF organises Half Marathon 2017
  - The BSF Half Marathon 2017 was flagged off in the memory of martyrs.
  - It was organised by the Minister of State for Youth Affairs (I/C) & Sports and Information and Broadcasting Col. Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore.
  - All trophies and prizes were dedicated to force martyrs. Medals and certificates were distributed to all the participants.
- Sitharaman to attend meet in Philippines
  - In her first foreign visit as Defence Minister, Ms. Nirmala Sitharaman left for the Philippines to attend the Southeast Asian Defence Ministers' Meeting.
  - The two-day ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting will discuss ways to enhance defense and security cooperation among the member nations.
  - Sitharaman will also hold bilateral talks with her counterparts from a number of countries.
- Now IDs mandatory with Photocopies: PMLA
  - The Government has made it mandatory for banks and financial institutions to check the original identification documents of individuals.
  - The Department of Revenue in the Finance Ministry made amendment in the Prevention of Money-laundering Rules.
  - The Prevention of Money Laundering Act forms the core of the legal framework put in place by India to combat money laundering.
- Modi Inaugurates RoRo ferry service
  - Modi has inaugurated the first phase of ambitious Ghogha-Dahej Roll-on Roll-off ferry service at Ghogha in Bhavnagar district in Gujarat.
  - With this, the distance between Saurashtra and South Gujarat regions could be covered in less than an hour via-sea route.







- This passenger movement service reduced the distance between the Ghogha and Dahej from 310 kilometres by road to just 30 kilometres.
- Hirasar airport project gets clearance
  - The Centre has given green clearance for a greenfield airport project at Hirasar to the Gujarat State Aviation Infrastructure Company Ltd (GSAICL).
  - The state government has proposed a new airport in Rajkot district as the existing one is small and the earlier plan to extend the current runway could not materialise because of high land cost.
  - The project is worth Rs. 1,400 crore.
- Modi's visit to Gujrat
  - Prime Minister Narendra Modi is visiting Gujarat for the third time this month, as the BJP pulls out all the stops ahead of the assembly elections in the state.
  - Modi will inaugurate and lay foundation stones for a number of projects in Bhavnagar and Vadodara districts.
  - The projects that will be launched by Modi include the first phase of the Rs 650-**crore 'roll**-on, roll-off ferry service.
- Dasna Jail to rename its dental clinic
  - As a gesture to acknowledge the Talwar couple's services, the Uttar
     Pradesh government has decided to rename the dental clinic at Dasna Jail
     in Ghaziabad after Aarushi Talwar.
  - Aarushi was murdered at the age of 14 at her residence in 2008.

- Aarushi Talwar's parents Rajesh and Nupur Talwar, who are also dentists spent four years in the jail since 2013 as the accused in the murder case.
- Committee to select RSTV's editor

  - These centres of excellence are being set up in Bengaluru and Hyderabad.
  - These centres will promote AI-based start-ups and will enlist global best practices including regulatory aspects.
- Global Ayurveda meet in Kochi






- Kochi will organise a four days international seminar and Global Ayurveda meet in Kochi on February 2018.

  - This year India slipped by three positions as compared to 97th rank in 2016 GHI.
  - GHI is a multi dimension measure that describes state of hunger situation on regional, national and global level. It is published annually by International Food Policy Research Institute.
- 1st hybrid annuity mode sewage plant
  - A tripartite agreement was signed between National Mission for Clean
     Ganga and the state level executing agencies Uttarakhand Pey Jal Nigam
     and Uttar Pradesh Jal Nigam, for setting up of India's first Sewage
     Treatment Plants under Hybrid Annuity mode.
  - The plants are built at Haridwar and Varanasi.
  - The Minister also launched an interactive website on National Mission for clean Ganga (NMCG)
- Aadhaar units to be put in post offices
  - Central Government has approved Rs 2,000 crore for setting up Aadhaar centres in post offices.






- The West Bengal government has decided to construct 3 river bridges, two over the Hooghly and one over the Ajay.




- The statue was unveiled by Vice-President Venkaiah Naidu on the occasion of the 148 Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi

  - The 15-day festival aims at promoting women entrepreneurs & farmers in the organic sector.
  - The theme of the festival is Good for Women, Good for India, Good for You.

- Govt to exempt small exporters
  - Government has decided to exempt small exporters from furnishing bank guarantee for shipping goods and services.
  - Under the Goods and Services Tax, an exporter can get exemption from payment of IGST if he submits bonds or Letter of Undertaking.

  - The state-of-the-art bridge is a major development on Shyok Gong River which will enhance travel of locals as well as Army in this strategic region.
  - It will increase travel & communication for strategic transport

## November 2017

- Centre sanctions Rs 275 cr
  - Central Government has sanctioned Rs 275 crore for establishing a Global Centre for Security and Counter-Terrorism in Jaipur, Rajasthan.
  - The announcement in this regard was made by Rajasthan Home Minister, Gulab Chand Kataria on November 28, 2017.
  - Central Government will allocate Rs. 165 crore and Rajasthan State Government will bear Rs 110 crore for setting-up this centre.
- India Hypertension Management Initiative

  - IHMI will be progressively rolled out in 25 districts selected by the Health Ministry.
- SAUBHAGYA Scheme launched in Manipur
  - The Pradhan Mantri Sahaj Bijli Har Ghar Yojana (SAUBHAGYA) was launched in Manipur by Union Minister of State (IC) for Power and New &







Renewable Energy, Shri R.K. Singh and Shri N. Biren Singh, CM of Manipur.

- A total of approximately 1.75 lakh households are proposed to be included under the Scheme.
- This is such a scheme where the poorest of the poor can afford electricity in their homes.
- Chhattisgarh Govt bans Firecrackers
  - The Chhattisgarh Govt has imposed a ban on the bursting of firecrackers in 6 of its cities ahead of the wedding season from Dec 1 to Jan 31.
  - The decision has been taken to control the pollution, which increases during winters due to the direction of wind.
  - The decision was taken under the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act of 1981
- India's first rooftop solar carport
  - Tata Power Solar Systems has commissioned India's first rooftop solar carport at 70000 sq. meter Unity One Mall, in Rohini, Delhi.
  - Tata Power Solar Systems is a wholly owned subsidiary of Tata Power Company.
  - Solar carports are overhead canopies (mounted with solar panel) built to cover parking areas.
  - This solar carport will make the mall self-sufficient in terms of energy requirement.
- INSPIRE 2017 kicked off in Jaipur
  - First edition of the International Symposium to Promote Innovation & Research in Energy Efficiency (INSPIRE 2017) begun in Jaipur, Rajasthan.
  - It brings together various stakeholders to showcase best practices in the sector.

- The capacity of the plant will be 10 million liters of water per day.
- The plant will operate on Low-Temperature Thermal Desalination (LTTD), a low cost and environment-friendly technology to get potable water.
- West Bengal gets GI Tag for 'Rosogolla'
  - On 14th November 2017, the Geographical Indications (GI) Registry announced that West Bengal has been awarded the GI status for 'Rosogolla'.
  - The Geographical Indications (GI) Registry has said that the 'Rosogolla' originated in West Bengal and not Odisha.
  - West Bengal and Odisha have been fighting a legal battle over the origin of **the sweet meat 'Rosogolla' since June 2015.**
- DVDB for civic works in Delhi
  - Delhi Cabinet approved to set up Delhi Village Development Board (DVDB) for civic works in rural and urban villages of Delhi.
  - All 300 villages in the national capital will come under the purview of the board.
  - DVDB will look after the construction of approach roads, link roads, village roads, development of cremation grounds, ponds, water bodies, cremation grounds, parks and other facilities.
- IORA to set up Centre of Excellence
  - Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) is to set up a Centre of Excellence in Kochi, Kerala.
  - This centre will facilitate the exchange of research findings and studies in the field of fisheries and ocean studies among IORA member countries.
  - IORA Centre of Excellence in Kochi will be **digitally connected to IORA's** member countries.
- NCERT conducts largest ever survey







- National Achievement Survey (NAS), the largest ever assessment survey on national level was conducted by NCERT.
- NAS was conducted for the Classes 3, 5 and 8 in government and government-aided schools.
- The survey is to ascertain learning level of students. The inferences drawn from the analytical reports will be used to design classroom interventions.
- Railways launches Project Saksham
  - Railways will launch the country's largest time-bound "upskilling" exercise for government employees to upgrade the skill sets of its 13 lakh-strong workforce with a single drive spanning 9 months.
  - Project Saksham will start in January 2018 and go on until September.
  - The launch date of the project has been tentatively scheduled to coincide with the 155th birth anniversary of Vivekananda.
- 37th India International Trade Fair
  - 37th India International Trade Fair (IITF) has begun at Pragati Maidan in New Delhi.
  - The 14-day annual event has been organised by the India Trade Promotion Organisation (ITPO). This year the theme of the fair is "Startup India Standup India".
  - Vietnam is the Partner Country, while Kyrgyzstan is the Focus Country. Jharkhand is participating as a Partner State in the event.
- Govt launches Bharat Net phase 2 project
  - Central Government launched phase 2 of Bharat Net project to connect 1.5
     lakh gram panchayats with high-speed broadband by March 2019.
  - Bharat Net Project, formerly known as National Optical Fibre Network (NOFN) was launched by Central Government in October 2011 with an aim to deploy high-speed optical fiber cables across rural areas of India.
  - The project is being implemented by BBNL.











- India to be 3rd largest aviation market
  - As per a report by global consultancy and research firm, Centre for Asia
     Pacific Aviation, India will be world's third largest aviation market for departures by 2019.
  - Currently, India is the fourth largest aviation market in the world with 131 million passengers per annum (for the year 2016).
  - India is the largest aviation market with 815 million passengers, followed by China and Japan.
- Asian Bankers Association summit
  - For the first time, Mumbai is to host the 34th annual conference of the Asian Bankers Association on 16th and 17th November 2017.
  - Summit will be hosted by State Bank. The theme for this year's summit is
     'Asia's turn to transform'.
  - The summit will discuss the impact of the ongoing global downturn on the outlook of the Asian economies, economic consequences of the Brexit in March 2019 on Asia.
- Sainik welfare boards for Andhra Pradesh
  - Sainik Sankshema Sabha will be organised in all districts in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.
  - The announcement was made at a rally and a grievance redressal programme organised in Hyderabad.
  - This is done as a measure taken by the Indian Army to reach exservicemen and widows of those who had served in the forces.
- Airport-like amenities at Rail stations
  - Rail Land Development Authority has signed a MoU with NBCC to redevelop 10 railway stations across India with airport-like amenities by the year 2020.







- 10 railway stations which would be redeveloped are Delhi Sarai Rohilla, Lucknow, Gomti Nagar, Kota, Tirupati, Nellore, Ernakulam, Puducherry, Madgaon, and Thane.
- The redevelopment will be carried out at an estimated cost of Rs 5000 crore.
- India Youth Development Index and report
  - Minister of State for Youth Affairs and Sports Col. Rajyavardhan
     Rathore released the India Youth Development Index and Report.
  - The objective of constructing YDI 2017 is to track the trends in Youth Development across the States.
  - The Index enables recognizing the high and low performing states, identifies the weak domains and informs the priority areas of intervention for youth development.
- Army Organises Youth Fest at Kishtwar
  - Army organised a mega event Youth Fest : 2017 on 13 Nov 2017 at the historic Chowgan ground of Kishtwar.
  - The Fest was an amalgamation of varied programmes highlighting the rich culture of different regions of India and stalls of food and games for people of all the age groups to rejoice & cherish.
  - The event also encompassed display of various ethnic specialties from across the country.
- Northeast to get 'Air Dispensary'
  - Northeast is all set to get India's first-ever "Air Dispensary" based in a helicopter.



  - India sees big opportunities to attract Chinese companies to Make in India, besides attracting investments.
- Amusement park in Surat
  - Turner International India and Rajgreen Group are making Amaazia –
     India's first Cartoon Network-branded amusement park, in Surat.
  - Cartoon Network's popular characters will be part of the amusement park.
  - Amaazia will be divided into four major sections a theme park branded by Cartoon Network, a water park, a family recreational hub and a service apartment and retail shopping area.

- Creation of National Testing Agency
  - The Union Cabinet has approved the creation of a National Testing Agency (NTA) to conduct entrance examinations for higher educational institutions.

- Not to pursue Islamic banking in India
  - RBI has decided not to pursue a proposal for introduction of Islamic banking in the country.
  - Islamic or Sharia banking is a finance system based on the principles of not charging interest, which is prohibited under Islam.
  - Taking into account, wider & equal opportunities available to all citizens to access banking & financial services, RBI has decided not to pursue the proposal further.
- Home Ministry sets up two new divisions
  - Union Home Ministry has formed 2 new divisions to exclusively deal with emerging security challenges such as radicalisation & cyber crime
  - CTCR wing will focus on tracking & assessing online reach of global terrorist outfits & devising strategies to counter their propaganda

- New outsourcing norms for NBFC
  - RBI issued a notification outlining norms for outsourcing of functions by Non-Bank Financial Institution.
  - As per the new norms, NBFCs cannot outsource core management functions like internal audit, management of investment portfolio, strategic and compliance functions for know your customer norms and sanction of loans.
  - All NBFCs' have been directed to set up a grievance redressal machinery.
- India Disaster Response Summit in Delhi
  - Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Kiren Rijiju inaugurated 'India Disaster Response Summit' in New Delhi.







- India has become the first country to partner with Facebook on disaster response.
- Facebook introduced a Disaster Information Volunteers programme.
   Under DIV, a network of trained volunteers would provide supplementary information on disasters in their local communities.
- Second Economic Advisory Council meeting
  - The 2nd meeting of the Economic Advisory Council to PM Modi spelt out a clear road map towards skill development, job creation; enhanced resource investment in the social sector.
  - The meeting was chaired by Bibek Debroy.
  - Economic Advisory Council to the PM is a non-constitutional, nonpermanent and independent body constituted to give economic advice to the Gol, specifically the PM.
- 23rd GST Council Meet held in Guwahati
  - 23rd meeting of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council headed by Union Finance Minister, Arun Jaitley was held in Guwahati, Assam on November 10, 2017.
  - GST rate on 177 items has been reduced from 28% to 18%. Now only 50 items, mostly demerit, sin and luxury goods will attract 28% GST rate.
  - Goods and Services Tax (GST) was rolled out from July 1.
- Odd-Even Scheme again in Delhi
  - The Delhi government announced that the odd-even scheme will be reintroduced in the national capital from November 13 to November 17.
  - This comes after the Indian Medical Association (IMA) declared a state of public health emergency in Delhi.
  - The Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority had declared that the pollution has reached 'Severe Plus' level or emergency condition.











- PM Modi flagged off Bandhan Express
  - 'Bandhan Express' a passenger train between Kolkata and Bangladesh's southwestern industrial city of Khulna was inaugurated on November 9, 2017.
  - It is a fully air-conditioned passenger train and will run every Thursday from both Kolkata and Khulna.
  - It is the second Indo-Bangla train service after the Maitree Express, which runs between Dhaka and Kolkata.
- Nordic-Baltic youth film festival
  - The Nordic-Baltic embassies are set to host the first ever youth film festival of the European nations at India Habitat Centre in New Delhi from 13 – 18 November 2017.
  - The film festival is organized by Nordic-Baltic embassies in collaboration with the India Habitat Centre.
  - The Nordic-Baltic countries are Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Iceland, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway and Sweden.
- Chennai in UNESCO's Creative cities list
  - 64 cities from 44 countries have been designated as UNESCO Creative Cities by Director-General, Irina Bokova.
  - Chennai is the third Indian city on the list of UNESCO Creative Cities list after Jaipur and Varanasi. Chennai has been for contribution in music.
  - After this, the UNESCO Creative Cities Network now counts a total of 180 cities in 72 countries.
- Sanjeev as whole-time member of SEBI





- These grid-connected rooftop solar projects which will together generate 575 mw.

  - JGU became the YOUNGEST Indian University and also the FIRST and ONLY private university in Haryana to have been ranked in an international ranking.

  - This was announced by Maharashtra Environment Minister Ramdas Kadam.
- MP launches Ek Bharat-Shreshtha Bharat
  - Madhya Pradesh is the partner state of Manipur and Nagaland under 'Ek Bharat-Shreshtha Bharat' Yojana.
  - An 8-member team from Madhya Pradesh has already toured Manipur and Nagaland in this regard.
  - This yojana was announced by Modi on October 31, 2015 (celebrated as Ekta Diwas) on the occasion of birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel.
- Karnataka passes anti-superstition bill

     Bill, 2017'.
  - This anti-superstition bill is aimed at preventing and eradicating inhuman evil practices propagated and performed in the name of black magic by a conman to exploit the common people.
  - The bill has two categories of practices 'savings' and 'schedule'
- BS VI policy to come in 2018







- Petroleum Ministry announced that Bharat Stage VI fuel will be introduced in Delhi from April 1, 2018, much ahead of the earlier deadline of 2020.
- BS-VI is the cleanest fuel. Thus, advancing its introduction will help to curb air pollution in Delhi that has reached alarming levels.
- BS-VI grade fuel contains 10 parts per million (ppm) of sulphur as against
   50 ppm in BS-IV fuels.
- Stone sculptures of Mamallapuram get GI
  - The hand-crafted stone sculptures of Mamallapuram have been granted the Geographical Indications tag by the GI registry, in recognition of the art's uniqueness to the region.
  - GI protection affords better legal protection against infringement .
  - Now that the state-owned corporation has been recognised as the GI tagholder, it has become the authorised user of Mahabalipuram Stone Sculpture name
