Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay - An Introduction

Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay was born on 3rd April 1903. Today, i.e. 3rd April 2018 marks her 115th Birth Anniversary. A perfect occasion for a Google Doodle. Kamaladevi is always remembered for being the driving force behind women's movement in India during the Independence Struggle. She was also big in supporting cooperative grassroot movements & supporting handicrafts. She always believed that social & economic upliftment of the society can only be possible from the grassroots. You can always see her right beside Sarojini Naidu, leading a movement for rights & freedom. She was a social activist & a talented theatre artist as well. Being a staunch feminist at those times, made her a woman who was far ahead of her era.

Personal Life of Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay

- Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay was born to a District Collector in Mangalore to a Saraswat Brahmin Family.
- Her mother & her maternal grand-mother were both strong ladies learned in ancient scriptures, who became quite an inspiration.
- Her parents had very friendly social relations with various social activists & freedom fighter, viz., Justice Ranade, G.K. Gokhale, Annie Besant, etc.
- She learned the basics of theatrics in the form of an ancient drama tradition called Kerala-Kutiyattam.
- She was married at the age of 14 but was soon widowed in 2 years.
- While studying in Chennai, at Queen Mary's College, she met Sarojini Naidu & Suhasini Chattopadhyay's younger brother Harindranath, whom she later married.

Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay - Arts & Theatre

- Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay's husband, Harindranath was a well-known poetplaywright-actor.
- He helped her & further fanned her interest in art & theatre.
- She acted in various films, at a time, when women who acted in films & theatre were looked down upon.
- She acted in the 1st Kannada silent film, *Mrichhakatika*.
- Kamaladevi also acted in a Hindi film in 1943 named *Tansen*, along-side K. L. Saigal.

Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay & Freedom Movement







- Kamaladevi was in London for a short while, with her husband, when she completed her Diploma in Sociology.
- While still in London, she was influenced by Mahatma Gandhi's Non-Cooperation Movement.
- She came back to India & soon led the Seva Dal, to recruit, train & involve women & girls.
- She was also a suffrage activist & soon became the 1st woman to run for Legislative Seat in India.
- She was one of the 7 leaders for the Salt Satyagraha with Mahatma Gandhi.
- Soon after Independence, she turned to social work & was instrumental in refugee relief work.
- Kamaladevi was a supporter of modern & western machines & industrial development too

Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay - Awards & Accolades

- Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay was awarded with a Padma Bhushan in 1955.
- Later, she was awarded with the Padma Vibhushan in 1987.
- In 1966, she was bestowed with the Ramon Magsaysay Award for Community Leadership.
- The Sangeet Natak Akademi also awarded her with Ratna Sadsya, for her contribution in arts.
