NABARD Reasoning Preparation Tips Grade A 2018

Reasoning section is always considered tough to crack for many candidates. This section **evaluates the sharpness of your mind through various puzzles and questions.** It **tests the candidate's capacity for logical thinking and analytic skills**. Therefore, you must solve as many questions as you can within the stipulated time. A candidate has to begin the practice early as the questions can be tricky and sometimes confusing. This will definitely help you ace Reasoning in NABARD Exam.

There are various things you should take care of during your preparations. The Reasoning section is basically divided into six sub-topics. Here, we will tell you important tips to prepare comprehensively for the Reasoning section.

> FASTEST WAY TO PREPARE CURRENT AFFAIRS

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- This part will have <u>**2-3 Qs**</u>.
- There will be <u>direct questions</u> with 2-3 statements and 2-3 conclusions. So, you should have a clear concept of this kind of questions.
- According to the past pattern of the exam, <u>the possibility based questions</u> <u>and negative information based questions</u> are always asked. Therefore, try to practice as much as you can during the preparation to get accuracy.
- You can have a better understanding of syllogisms by reading <u>Concepts of</u> <u>Syllogism</u>.

(2) Arrangement:

- This part will have <u>8-10 Qs</u>.
- The number of questions in this part is more, therefore your preparation should be focused more on this section.
- The <u>expected questions</u> are Uni & Bi-directional problems on linear, circular, square, rectangular, hexagonal tables and Matrix Arrangement. So, you need to have a clear idea and adequate practice in these kinds of problems.
- The examiner may combine these topics with other information to make it difficult. Hence, **practice all kinds of problems** that you think might come.
- With the help of proper <u>Study Material</u> like <u>How to Approach Circular</u> <u>Arrangements</u> you will be able to have a clear concept in this area.

(3) Inequalities:

- This part will have <u>2-3 Qs</u>.
- The expected topics in this part are <u>Mathematical Inequalities & Coded</u>
 <u>Inequalities</u>. Therefore, your preparation should be based on these two topics.







- Acing these types of questions requires <u>knowledge of your symbols</u>. Read some tips for developing better solving skills on <u>How to Solve Inequalities</u>.
- You should also practice from the Study Materials such as <u>How to Solve</u> <u>Coded Inequality</u>.

(4) Machine Input Output:

- This part has <u>3-5 Qs</u>.
- <u>The expected topics are</u> Pattern based on shifting, arrangement, mathematical operation, miscellaneous approach or other patterns. So, plan your preparation considering that in mind.
- It is difficult to crack this section without referring to proper Study Material. Testbook provides you with these kinds of study materials like <u>Short tricks</u> <u>for input-output</u>.
- Input-Output can be solved with various tricks. These can be used for timesaving. Read this article for knowing about these: <u>Tips for Input and Output</u>.

(5) Comparison:

- This part consists of <u>1-2 Qs</u>.
- You should be well prepared with topics like arranging by order & ranking, ages, height, weight etc to score well.
- <u>Study Material</u> like <u>Tricks to Crack Ordering & Ranking</u> are very helpful in cracking this exam.
- You should **practice paying attention to the details**. Questions are asked with respect to various comparison scales.

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(6) Data Sufficiency:

• This part will have <u>1-2 Qs</u>.

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- In order to prepare well, you should prepare questions based on <u>Blood</u>
 <u>Relations</u>, Coding-decoding, and Circular Arrangements.
- Problems of <u>Directions & Distances & Ages & Birthdates</u> also need to be covered and prepared well.
- You need to <u>practice questions</u> based on Number System, Averages, Percentages, Ratio & Proportion, Profit & Loss, Simple & Compound Interest.
- Time Speed & Distance, Time & Work, Problems on Age, Mensuration and Mixtures & Allegations should also be prepared with proper attention.
- You will be able to score well if you well keeping all these points in mind.

Some General Tips for NABARD Reasoning Preparation:

- 1. Read some general tips about these topics to have a thorough understanding of the questions you can have like,
 - <u>Concepts of Syllogism</u>
 - Shortcut to Solve
 - Coding Decoding
 - Letter Shifting Problems in Coding-Decoding
 - <u>**Tips for Coded Inequality</u></u>.</u>**
- A lot of questions require proper techniques and step-by-step solving.
 You need to come out with your own tricks for the sums you find. Some questions can be tricky that will require your attention.
- 3. There are some topics that are time-consuming. Therefore, you need to practice various tests beforehand to know how much time you spend on each question.
- All arrangement questions need daily practice as they are very timeconsuming. Hence, you must prepare an effective time management strategy for the exam.







- Arrangement Problems require clean charting with proper technique and step-by-step solving. These questions are puzzle-like and can be quite tricky. However, moderate to high accuracy is possible.
- 6. You need to **first do the questions that you are familiar with**. This will give you confidence & save time.
- 7. While solving mock tests, solve these questions when you have a lot of time. It will help you to give more time to these confusing questions. You can remember all your tricks that time.
- 8. **Check the questions previous year Question Paper** & practice them. These will help you in a better preparation for Reasoning section & you will analyze how much time you are taking to solve them.
- 9. Practice on <u>App</u> daily. You can do this anywhere you want or if you are free.
- 10. Give mock tests to prepare yourself completely. **The more you solve, the more you will become efficient**.
