Now that you know about the RBI Exam Pattern, you should start your preparations with the RBI Grade B Preparation Strategy.

#1. Go through the Syllabus & Mark Distribution

- Before starting with your preparation, you should know the Syllabus for the exam & Mark Distribution for each topic.
- You should also **be aware of the weightage each section** carries in the exam.











- This will also help you know which subjects are to be prepared for.

#2. How to Prepare for Economics & Social Issues - RBI Grade B Exam

In this paper, one thing you must keep in mind is that this **paper is not just about economics** but also about **Social Issues**. Therefore, your preparation should be of optimum level. Keep in mind the following points.

- First of all, go through the sample paper.
- **Clear concepts of macroeconomics** like national income, repo rate, bank rate, fiscal deficit, revenue deficit, budget, inflation, banking sector.
- Read economics NCERT textbooks of class (X,XI,XII) for basic concepts of macroeconomics.
- For **social issues**, the questions asked are of very **generic nature**.
- Read the social sector schemes, welfare programs, current affairs related to economics of at least last 6 months thoroughly.

#3. How to Prepare for English - RBI Grade B Descriptive Exam

This section is the **deciding factor in your selection**. You should **aim to score minimum 65-70** in this paper. English section comprises of **3 parts -Essay**, **Precis Writing** & **Reading Comprehension**. This section is to **check your writing skills** and not your knowledge. **Pay attention to following aspects**.

- Ensure **correct usage** of grammar, spelling and punctuation.
- Stick to the word limit.
- Avoid using difficult and fancy words.
- Read the newspaper.
- **Make short notes** of important facts and figures.
- Go through some sample precis writing & practice a few questions before the exam.
- Rules of precis writing writing 1/3rd words, use your own words, give a suitable title, don't changing the tone of the passage etc
- In the English paper, you will have to type on the keyboard. For those who type slowly, **do not take the time limit for granted**.
- The keyboard will be of the old type.









#4. How to Prepare for Finance and Management - RBI Grade B Exam

This section for some might be **difficult** because of its **technical nature.** You should **aim to score at least 60**. Most of you will not have a background in finance and management, so this is the section you should work on the most. **Last year**, there were around **6-8 numerical asked** from this section.

- Make sure you are aware of topics like Inflation, Banking Sector, Budget, Derivatives, Corporate, Governance, Portfolio investment.
- To cover regulatory and financial institutions like **SIDBI**, **EXIM**, **NABARD** etc. **visit the official website and read the FAQs**.

#5. Go through Previous Year Questions Papers

- **Going through previous year question papers** will help you notice the trend in questions.
- They will also make you practice more questions before the exam.

#6. Know How to Manage Time
