Nasau:

I was a gang member and drug dealer, and I was in and out of prison. I needed to get out of that lifestyle in southern California, so I moved north to Bonners Ferry, Idaho to start a new life. I wasn't working but was with my kids while living at my In-laws. Which wasn't a great situation. Before I knew it, I was kicked out of the house and issued a no contact order. A Sheriff's officer brought me to the mission. He gave me a choice: you can either stay here and use the opportunity to change your life or not. Then he pointed in the direction of the Amtrack Station.

I was angry, resentful, prideful, and not interested in Christianity. I didn't have any church background or what to expect from the mission. I was immediately accepted by the other men. The color of my skin was never an issue.

After about a month, I started to help in the kitchen, prepping and serving meals. Hearing the gospel every morning and worship in music on Monday nights. Ryan and Todd, 2 men from a local church came regularly and showed the love of Christ to me. They taught how and what it meant to work and serve others without expecting anything in return. I accepted Christ as my Savior on a Monday evening worship time service.

I was hired at the Hoot Owl, busing tables, working as a prep cook and serving where ever they needed me. It's a real joy being part of that family.

On December 18th I was contacted by my wife to be served custody papers. I was broken all over again. But God had a different plan. Two weeks later she had a change of heart because she saw that I wasn't the same man that she once knew. She brought my 3 daughters to see me whom I hadn't seen for 6 months. Since that time our relationship began to heal and got stronger. We've been attending church as a family. Something I never would have believed 6 months ago.

Today is Valentines Day 2023, and I'm leaving the mission to be reunited with my family. I give all the glory to God! Only He could have done this miracle.

A verse that is close to my heart is Exodus 14:14 "The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to be silent."

That's what I did and was blessed way beyond my expectations.
