

Redefining the College Senior:

Modern residences include one- and two-bedroom apartments and free-standing homes, onsite activities, dining and recreational amenities and the continuum of care. Such communities generally have a minimum age requirement of between 55 to 65.

Seniors who are interested in academia have the ability to audit classes and participate in lifelong learning courses. Life-long learning is a way to bridge the gap between retirees and college students. New opportunity presents itself with the cross generational interaction.

Seventy-five percent of rent proceeds from Broadview's ground lease will be used for student scholarships, while 25 percent will go toward faculty hiring at Purchase College.

Opportunities to attend cultural attractions on campus include theatrical and cultural events at the Performing Arts Center offering world-class music, dance and theatre productions, and the Neuberger Museum of Art, world renowned for its collection of modern, contemporary and African art.

Located in a serene grassy and wooded landscape, Broadview will be situated on 40 acres at the southwestern portion of the 500-acre Purchase College campus. More than 10 acres of the site will be dedicated to open space, providing walking trails and outdoor activity space for residents and students. Broadview will serve as a leading UBRC with its top-of-the-line offerings, creating an extraordinary and uncommon lifestyle community.
