Is it time to sleep?”



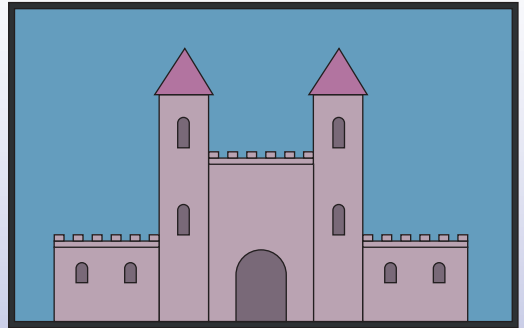
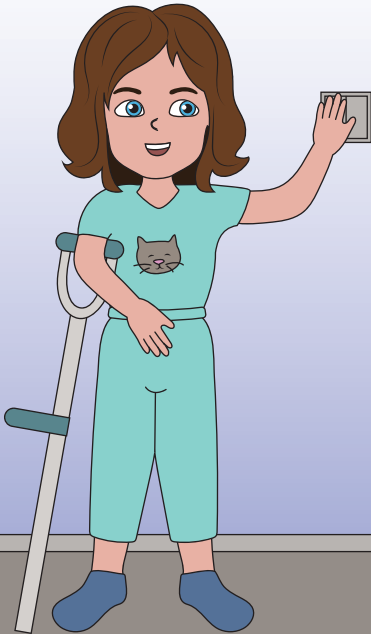

“But I brushed my teeth!”



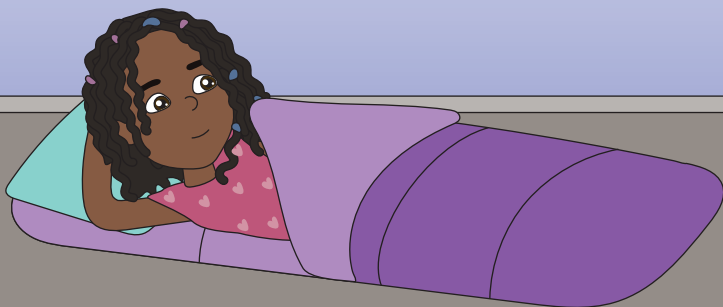
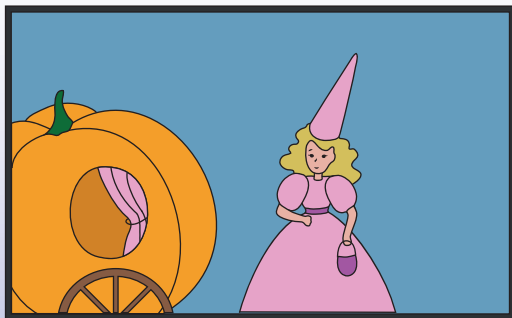
Layla turns off the lights.
