**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy (Level 2)

**SIZE:** Child 3-7, Tween/Teen 8-16

**HAT**

Child's XS-M (L-XL)

**Finished Circumference** About 14 (15 1/2) in. (35.5 (39.5) cm), slightly stretched. Hat is VERY stretchy and will fit a wide range of sizes.

**SCARF**

About 7 x 50 in. (18 x 127 cm), slightly stretched

**Note:** Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

## MATERIALS

- 136-135 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn:  
Yosemite  
2 Balls (A)  
*\*Heartland (Article #136). Solids: 100% Acrylic  
Tweeds: 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size:  
Solids: 5oz/142g (251yd/230m)  
Tweeds: 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)*
- 136-122 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn:  
Grand Canyon  
2 Balls (B)
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 8  
[5 mm]
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles  
(Set of 6)



## GAUGE:

26 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-12, slightly stretched

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

## NOTES:

1. Hat and Scarf are worked in a rib pattern, changing color to create stripes.
2. When changing color, the color change row is knit, rather than working in the K2, p2 Rib. This creates a smooth color change.
3. Do not cut yarn between color changes, simply carry unused color along side edge of work until next needed.
4. Hat is worked back and forth in rows and then seamed.

## HAT

With A, cast on 90 (102) sts.

**Row 1 (RS):** K3, p2, \*k2, p2; rep from \* to last st, p last st.

**Rows 2-12:** K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Change to B.

**Note:** The first RS row of a new color is knit for a smooth transition from one color to the next.

**Row 13:** With B, knit.

**Row 14:** With B, rep Row 1.

**Rows 15-20:** With B, rep Row 2.

Change to A.

**Row 21:** With A, knit.

**Row 22:** With A, rep Row 1.

**Rows 23-28:** With A, rep Row 2.

Change to B.

Rep Rows 13-28 once, then rep Row 13 once more.

Cut A and continue with B only.

**Next Row:** With B, rep Row 1.

**Next 2 (8) Rows:** With B, rep Row 2.

**Shape Crown (top of Hat)**

**Row 1 (RS):** K3, \*p2tog, k2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, p2tog, p1 – you will have 68 (77) sts at the end of this row.

**Rows 2-4:** K the knit sts and p the p sts.

**Row 5:** K2tog, k1, \*p1, k2tog; rep from \* to last 2 sts, p2 – 46 (52) sts.

**Rows 6 and 7:** K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

**Row 8:** P2tog across – 23 (26) sts.

**Row 9:** Knit.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull to gather. Knot securely, then seam sides of piece to make Hat.

## SCARF

**Note:** To help hide the unused color as it is carried along the side of the piece, the first st is worked a bit differently on some of the rows.

With A, cast on 46 sts.

**Row 1 (RS):** With A, sl 1, \*k2, p2; rep from \* to last st, p last st.

**Rows 2-12:** Sl 1, k the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Change to B.

**Note:** The first RS row of a new color is knit for a smooth transition from one color to the next.

**Row 13:** With B, sl 1, knit across.

**Row 14:** With B, sl 1, \*k2, p2; rep from \* to last st, p.

**Row 15:** With B, sl 1, wrapping B over A strand (to secure the strand of A you are carrying along the side edge of the piece) then k the knit sts and p the p sts across.

**Row 16:** With B, sl 1, k the knit sts and p the purl sts.

**Rows 17-20:** Rep Rows 15 and 16.

Change to A.

**Rows 21-28:** With A, rep Rows 13-20.

Change to B.

Rep Rows 13-28 for 16 more times, then rep Rows 13-20 once more.

Cut B and continue with A only.

**Next Row:** With A, sl 1, knit across.

**Next Row:** With A, sl 1, \*k2, p2; rep from \* to last st, p1.

**Next 10 Rows:** With A, sl 1, k the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Bind off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
