

CETA is a landmark agreement




EU is Canada's 2nd largest trade and investment partner



World GDP*, 2014





CETA: A progressive trade agreement for a strong middle class

What is CETA?

The Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) will create jobs, strengthen economic relations and boost Canada's trade with the world's second-largest market. CETA is a progressive free trade agreement which covers virtually all sectors and aspects of Canada-EU trade in order to eliminate or reduce barriers. For example, prior to CETA's entry into force, only 25 percent of EU tariff lines on Canadian goods were duty-free. Upon CETA's entry into force, the EU will remove tariffs on 98 percent of its tariff lines. Once CETA is fully implemented, the EU will have eliminated tariffs on 99
