BYU STORYLINES

- **FRESHMAN FLYER.** Freshman Violet Zavodnik has already made a mark at BYU. In her first at bat, in her BYU debut, the outfielder blasted a home run. She went a perfect 3-3 against Seattle as well as against UVU where she also hit two homers.
- **RETURNING RYLEE.** After the shortened 2020 season, outfielder Rylee Jensen returns for her second senior year. The Idaho native was an All-American hopeful during the 2020 season and boasts many awards including WCC Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year as well as NFCA All-Region First and Third teams while also being a three-time NFCA Player of the Week honoree.
- **POWER HITTER.** Hunttyr Ava returns to BYU for her sophomore campaign after a standout short freshman season. The Utah native has quickly become a power hitter for the BYU softball team. Following her performance at the Judi Garman Classic in 2020, which included five homers and 10 RBI, she was nationally ranked as No. 4 in RBI per game (1.42), No. 7 in homers (8) and RBI (27) and No. 16 in home runs per game (0.42).
- **SENIOR STAFF.** The 2021 softball staff is full of returning players. The Cougars did not loose any players from the 2020 season including standout Rylee Jensen. In addition, BYU brought in six new freshman to around out the upcoming season.
- **WEEKLY AWARDS.** BYU swept the first week of the West Coast Conference awards as Rylee Jensen and Autumn Moffat-Korth earned Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively.
- **RANKED OPPONENTS.** For the third time, the BYU softball team will match up against a top 25 team. The Cougars have now faced No. 16 Arizona State, No. 2 Washington and now No. 3 Arizona.

BYU TEAM NOTABLES

Strength of schedule

BYU will match up against two 2019 World Series teams including the runner-up Oklahoma, who also won the title in 2017 and 2016. The Cougars will face Oklahoma in the last tournament of the season while also taking on Arizona, earlier in the season. The Cougars will also face six teams that are currently ranked in the top 25.

WCC: Year eight

BYU enters the eighth season in the West Coast Conference after jumping around following its departure from the Mountain West. The Cougars played in the Western Athletic Conference in 2012 and the Pacific Coast Softball Conference in 2013 before softball was added in the WCC beginning in the 2014 season. Spanning the four conferences, BYU has won 11 conference titles in a row.

WCC Preseason Polls

The Cougars were picked to finish first in the West Coast Conference Coaches Poll. Four players claimed spots on the All-WCC Preseason team including Rylee Jensen, Autumn Moffat-Korth, Marissa Chavez and Huntyr Ava.

Postseason consistency

For the past 15 seasons, BYU has advanced to the NCAA regionals. The Cougars have gone to 16 NCAA regionals overall, advancing to super regionals in 2010.

NFCA All-Region

Along with receiving honors in conference play 2019, Arissa Paulson and Rylee Jensen received NFCA Division I All-Pacific Region First Team accolades with Lexi Tarrow making the third team.

Student athletes

On and off the field, BYU softball players are making their mark. Rylee Jensen was named to the 2019 WCC All-Academic Team after earning at least a 3.20 cumulative GPA while also being significant contributors to the team. Also, Tayeli Williams made it on the WCC Commissioners Gold Honor Roll for having at least a 3.75 GPA.

Sisters in softball

The 2020 BYU softball team has two sets of sisters on the team, Arissa Paulson and Aubrielle Gibbons (nee Paulson) as well as Emilee and Kaylee Erickson. They are the third and fourth set of sisters to play together on a BYU softball team, respectively. In the inaugural softball season (2000), twins Jamie and Bryn Kreipl were on the roster. Sisters Anna and Alexandra Hudson played together from 2012-13. Emilee is a senior third baseman while Kaylee is a freshman catcher. Arissa is a redshirt junior pitcher and Aubrielle is a sophomore outfielder. The Paulson's older sister Arianna was a pitcher on the team until 2018.

Gail Miller Field

BYU's field is part of Miller Park, a unique, combined baseball-softball facility. Baseball plays on Larry H. Miller field, while softball calls Gail Miller Field, a back-to-back mirror image of the pre-existing baseball field, home. It was the first combined facility of its kind when it opened in April 2001. BYU has a home record of 233-51 (.820) at the field. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats all in the lower bowl, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility at the time of it's creation. The field dimensions are 210 feet down the left-and right-field lines and 220 in center field.

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin enters his 19th season as the Cougars' head coach and his 21st season at BYU overall for the 2020 season.

Eakin was named head coach in July 2002 after working as an assistant coach since the softball program's inception in 2000. Since that time he has led the Cougars to six West Coast Conference titles, six Mountain West Conference championships, one Western Athletic Conference tournament championship and 15 NCAA tournament appearances.

He was named the MWC Coach of the Year in three-straight years (2009, 2010, 2011), PCSC Coach of the Year (2013) and WCC Coach of the Year for four-straight years (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017).

Eakin has coached 22 All-Americans, 14 Players of the Year including seven MWC, one WAC, one PCSC, nine Freshman of the Year including three MCW and one PCSC and seven Pitchers of the Year including two MWC during his tenure. Since joining the WCC, he has coached five Players of the Year, five Pitchers of the Year, three Freshman of the Year and three Defensive Players of the Year.

He led BYU to one of its most successful seasons in 2017, reaching 46 wins, tied for the most in program history. The Cougars were ranked for 12 weeks of the season and had a program-best 22-game win streak.

In 2010, Eakin guided the Cougars to 46 wins, the most in school history at the time, as BYU advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time ever with wins over East Carolina and host Texas before ending its season at national runner-up Arizona. The Cougars finish second in the country in batting average, seventh in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage as a team last season.

Known as one of the best hitting coaches in the country, Eakin has helped BYU finish in the top-ten nationally six times in slugging percentage, six times in home runs per game, four times in batting average and four times in scoring.

In addition to his duties at BYU, Eakin has also been an assistant coach and the hitting coach for the USA National Team since 2009. In the summer of 2010, Eakin helped guide the National Team to a 17-2 record as USA won the World Championship in Venezuela, the World Cup in Oklahoma and the Japan Cup championship in Sendai, Japan.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Eakin was a successful baseball and softball player. After playing collegiate baseball at the University of Utah, Eakin signed with the Oakland Athletics organization where he played for three years.

Eakin went on to join the United States All-Star team, playing in three U.S. Olympic sports festivals in 1986, 1993 and 1994, winning bronze, silver and gold, respectively. While on the team, Eakin was honored on the ISC All-World First Team and was an ASA All-American. He would later go on to play shortstop on the internationally ranked Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch team, eventually earning induction into the Utah Fast Pitch Hall of Fame in 1998.

Eakin is a native of Holladay, Utah, and graduated from Granite High. He currently resides in Sandy, Utah, and is married to Barbi. They are the parents of three children (Alicia, Ryan and Parker) and have seven grandsons and one
