### STORY LINES

- Baylor hosts BYU Saturday at McLane Stadium for the 97th Homecoming game in school history.
- Baylor's Homecoming parade (8 am Saturday) is the nation's largest. BU held its first Homecoming in 1909, the nation's first of its kind, with a parade, bonfire and pep rally centered around a football game.
- Baylor is 1-1 all-time vs. BYU with a 40-36 win in Waco (1983) and a 47-13 loss in Provo (1984).
- Baylor is 5-1 or better at the halfway point for the 6th time in the last 9 seasons (2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2019, 2021). Prior to that stretch, the last time BU was 5-1 or better after six games was 1994.
- BU rolled up 525 yards of offense on its way to a 45-20 win over West Virginia on Saturday, bouncing back from its only loss of the season at now-No. 12-ranked Oklahoma State (Oct. 2).
- BU beat No. 14 Iowa State on Sept. 25 for its first ranked win since 2015. Saturday's game against No. 19 BYU will be the third top-20 opponent the Bears will have faced in the last four weeks.
- Baylor leads the Big 12 in turnover margin (+1.0), most interceptions (8) and fewest interceptions thrown (0). Baylor and Ole Miss are the nation's only teams to not throw an interception this season.
- Baylor is 1 of 3 Power-5 teams ranked top-25 nationally in scoring offense and scoring defense (BU, Georgia, Michigan). BU is 22nd in scoring defense (17.8) and 17th in scoring offense (38.3).
- Baylor ranks 5th nationally with 11 fourth-down conversions, including 6 times in its own territory.
- Baylor's offense leads the Big 12 and ranks 6th nationally, averaging 7.32 yards per play.
- BU is 16th nationally (10th in P5) with 227.6 rushing ypg after ranking 123rd last season (90.3 ypg).
- Baylor ranks 12th nationally in both pass efficiency (168.31) and pass defense efficiency (108.50).
- Six different Baylor players have intercepted passes this season, accounting for a Big 12-best 8 INTs.
- BU's defense ranks 7th in the Power-5 with only 175.0 passing yards allowed per game.
- BU has forced twice as many turnovers (27) as it has allowed (13) in 15 games under Dave Aranda.
- Baylor's O-Line has allowed only 1.0 sacks per game, which ranks 12th nationally (5th in Power-5).
- Gerry Bohanon and Matt Corral are the nation's only QBs with 1,000+ passing yards and 0 interceptions.
- Bohanon is 1 of 3 players (Matt Corral, Malik Willis) with 6+ rushing TDs and 10+ passing TDs.

## ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

- This is only the third time Baylor has faced a non-conference opponent for Homecoming – 1977 (38-7 win vs. Air Force) and 1992 (31-27 win vs. Georgia Tech).
- Baylor is 48-44-4 all-time in Homecoming games, including 9-1 in Homecoming games since 2010.
- Baylor is seeking its second win over a ranked opponent this season – it would mark the first time BU has defeated two ranked teams in the first 7 games of a season since 1985 (at No. 3 USC, at No. 16 SMU).
- Baylor returned 17 of 22 starters and 54 of 68 letterman from last season’s team.
- The Bears welcomed four new assistant coaches for 2021 – Jeff Grimes (Offensive Coordinator/TEs), Eric Mateos (Offensive Line), Chansi Stuckey (Wide Receivers) and Kevin Curtis (Cornerbacks).
- The Bears added a pair of experienced O-Line transfers with Jacob Gall (13 starts at Buffalo) and Grant Miller (16 starts at Vanderbilt). Four members of the O-Line now have a combined 99 career starts.
- BU returned 7 starters on offense, led by OL Connor Galvin and Xavier Newman-Johnson now with 29 starts apiece.
- Baylor’s defense returned 10 starters from a unit which allowed only 203.0 passing yards per game last season, second-best in the Big 12. BU has allowed 175.0 passing ypg in 6 games this year (16th-fewest in FBS).
- Baylor’s five starting defensive backs have a combined 205 career games played and 105 career starts. CB Raleigh Texada has a team-high 35 career starts, including each of the last 29 games.
- BU is playing its 120th season of football and holds a 614-585-44 (.512) all-time record. Baylor has scored in a school-record 180-straight games - doubling the previous record of 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 - Oct. 23, 1987.

## BAYLOR SET FOR 97TH HOMECOMING CELEBRATION

- Baylor plays its 97th Homecoming game Saturday, marking the 112th anniversary of its first Homecoming in 1909.
- Baylor holds the nation’s largest Homecoming Parade and has a claim as the nation’s first school to celebrate Homecoming. Historians differ on the Homecoming definition, but Baylor held a two-day event in November 1909 that included a bonfire, pep rally and parade centered around a football game, the nation’s first of its kind.
- The Homecoming event became annual in 1924 when the name was changed from “Good Will Week.”
- The Bears are 48-44-4 in Homecoming contests, including a 12-12 record in the Big 12 era. Baylor’s first Homecoming game was a 6-3 win over TCU in 1909, and TCU is the most common opponent (35 games).
- Baylor has played a Homecoming game every season since 1924, with the exception of two years during World War II when BU didn’t field a team (1943-44) and when the 2020 game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

## GRIMES BRINGS RVO TO WACO

- Offensive coordinator Jeff Grimes has brought RVO to Waco - “Reliable Violent Offense” - an attacking, multiple-formation offense that runs a few plays a lot of ways with as much misdirection as any team in the country.
- Under Grimes, Baylor’s offense leads the Big 12 in yards per play (7.31), yards per rush (6.01) and fewest sacks allowed (1.0/game) and ranks 3rd in the league in total offense (461.3 ypg) and rushing offense (227.5 ypg).
- Baylor and Ole Miss are the nation’s only teams which haven’t thrown an interception this season.
- Grimes’ 2020 BYU offense finished 3rd nationally in scoring (43.5 ppg) and 7th in total offense (522.2 ypg).
- Joining Grimes in making the move from Provo to Waco was offensive line coach Eric Mateos, who spent the past two seasons at BYU. Mateos’ offensive line ranked 8th nationally in 2020 with 1.0 sacks allowed per game, and the Bears currently rank tied for 12th nationally with only 1.0 sacks allowed per game in 2021.

## FOURTH DOWN SUCCESS

- Baylor leads the Big 12 with 11 fourth-down conversions, three more than any other team in the league (WVU-8).
- BU is 11-of-14 on fourth downs (79%), the nation’s 4th-best conversion rate among teams with 10+ attempts.
- BU’s only failed fourth-down attempts were 4th-and-17 at Texas State and 4th-and-4 and 4th-and-10 at OSU.
- BU has gone 6-for-7 on 4th downs in its own territory, converting 4th-and-1 (own 34) at TXST, 4th-and-3 (own 37) vs. TXSO, 4th-and-3 (own 46) at KU, 4th-and-2 (own 45) at OSU, 4th-and-1 (own 34) vs. WVU and 4th-and-1 (own 37) vs. WVU. The only failed attempt in its own territory was 4th-and-4 (own 36) at OSU.
- Of the 7 fourth-down attempts in its own territory, the six conversions have led to 31 points for Baylor’s offense, while the BU defense forced a 3-and-out punt immediately after the lone failed attempt.

## BEARS HAVE 5-1 RECORD AT HALFWAY POINT

- Baylor is 5-1 or better at the halfway point for the 6th time in the last 9 seasons. BU won 5+ games in the first half in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2019 and 2021. Prior to that stretch, the last time the Bears did so was 1994.
- Baylor has also won at least 3 of its first 4 Big 12 games for the 6th time in the last 9 seasons. Prior to 2013, BU was 3-1 or better in Big 12 play only twice in the league’s first 17 seasons (2006, 2010).

## RANKED IN 9 OF LAST 12 SEASONS

- With its No. 21 ranking in the Sept. 26 AP Top 25, Baylor has now been ranked in the AP Top 25 in 9 of 12 seasons since 2010, after going 17 years between national rankings (1993-2010).
- The Bears climbed from receiving no votes in the AP poll in any of the first three weeks to No. 21 after their win over No. 14 Iowa State on Sept. 25. The win was Baylor’s first over a ranked opponent since 2015.
- Baylor is listed third among others receiving votes (28th) in the most recent AP Top 25.

**SEEKING BOWL ELIGIBILITY**

- Baylor needs one more win to become bowl-eligible for the 10th time in 12 seasons since 2010.
- Baylor went 16 years between bowl appearances – 1994 Alamo Bowl, 2010 Texas Bowl – but has been to nine bowl games in 11 seasons since snapping that streak.

**BEARS AMONG BIG 12’S BEST DEFENSES**

- Baylor’s defense leads the Big 12 passing defense efficiency (108.5) and interceptions (8). The Bears also allow only 175.0 passing yards per game, which ranks 16th nationally and 2nd in the Big 12.
- Baylor’s defense has allowed only 191.8 passing yards per game in 15 games under head coach Dave Aranda.
- BU’s defense has had 3 interceptions in a game twice this season – Sept. 4 at Texas State; JT Woods, Jalen Pitre and Jairon McVea and Oct. 2 at Oklahoma State; Raleigh Texada, JT Woods and Dillon Doyle.
- The Bears held Kansas to 57 passing yards, the 2nd-fewest by a BU defense in Big 12 play in the last 20 seasons, eclipsed only by the 54 passing yards allowed to Texas in the 2013 de-facto Big 12 Championship game.

**MILESTONES TO WATCH**

- Trestan Ebner needs 169 all-purpose yards to tie Corey Coleman (3,833) for 8th on Baylor’s all-time list.
- Ebner will play his 54th career game on Saturday, 2nd-most in program history (record is Chris Platt-57).
- Ebner needs 8 rushing yards to become the 34th BU player with 1,300+ career rushing yards. He’s currently 34th on Baylor’s all-time rushing yards list and can move up to 29th with 83 rushing yards.
- Ebner (1,308) and R.J. Sneed (1,317) are racing to become BU’s 22nd player with 1,400 career receiving yards.
- Tyquan Thornton needs 148 receiving yards to move into 15th on Baylor’s all-time receiving yards list.
- Terrel Bernard needs 1 sack to tie the 10th-most career sacks in program history.
- Gerry Bohanon needs 4 rushing yards to tie Cody Carlson (424) for 9th-most rushing yards by a QB in BU history.

**BYU SERIES HISTORY**

- Baylor and BYU are meeting for the third time. Baylor won the first meeting 40-36 in Waco in the 1983 season opener, but BYU evened the series with a 47-13 win in Provo in the 1984 season opener.
- BYU out-gained the Bears 494-469 despite running 16 fewer plays in the 1983 meeting in Waco, but Baylor piled up 282 rushing yards and 4 rushing TDs on its way to the win at Floyd Casey Stadium.
- The Bears struggled to run the ball in the 1984 Provo meeting with just 90 yards on 35 carries, and BYU had 315 passing yards and 6 passing TDs on its way to a big win as the nation’s No. 13-ranked team.

**BACK ON TRACK WITH BIG WIN OVER WEST VIRGINIA**

- Baylor bounced back from its first loss of the season with a 45-20 victory over West Virginia on Oct. 9.
- BU scored touchdowns on its first 3 drives, built a 28-10 halftime lead and led by at least 15 the rest of the game.
- The Bears played turnover-free for a second-straight game and racked up 525 yards of offense, averaging 8.3 yards per play. The BU defense shut down WVU’s running game, limiting the Mountaineers to 90 rushing yards.
- Gerry Bohanon passed for a career-high 336 yards and 4 TDs, while Tyquan Thornton had a career-best 187 receiving yards and 2 TDs on 8 receptions. Ben Sims added a pair of touchdown catches.

**BEARS WIN TURNOVER BATTLE, BUT FALL SHORT AT OKLAHOMA STATE**

- Baylor was plus-3 in the turnover battle, but came up short in a 24-14 loss at No. 19 Oklahoma State on Oct. 2.
- The Bears got interceptions from Raleigh Texada, JT Woods and Dillon Doyle, and didn’t commit any turnovers, but BU couldn’t capitalize on two fourth-quarter possessions when facing a 17-14 deficit.
- Abram Smith broke a career-long 55-yard TD run on 4th-and-2 late in the 3rd quarter, and Gerry Bohanon’s 1-yard TD run with 12 minutes left cut the deficit to 17-14, but the Bears wouldn’t score again.

**BU DEFEATS IOWA STATE FOR FIRST RANKED WIN SINCE 2015**

- Baylor scored on its first three offensive possessions to take a 21-10 lead, and the Bears remained in front the rest of the way in a 31-29 win over No. 14 Iowa State on Sept. 25.
- BU sealed the victory with a pair of clutch plays in the final minute. First, JT Woods picked off a 2-point conversion pass that would’ve tied the game, then the Bears recovered two onside kicks (one negated by penalty).
- Baylor won despite having 197 fewer yards of total offense, 12 fewer first downs and 75 more penalty yards.
- Baylor’s 15 first downs were its fewest in a win since Oct. 12, 2013 at Kansas State (15), and this was the first time Baylor won a game with 150+ fewer yards than its opponent since Nov. 29, 2014 vs. Texas Tech.

**DEFENSE SHUTS DOWN KANSAS IN BIG 12 OPENER**

- Baylor’s defense turned in a record-breaking performance in the Bears’ 45-7 win at Kansas on Sept. 18.
- BU’s defense allowed only 166 yards of total offense, its fewest in 211 all-time Big 12 Conference games.
- BU led 14-7 at halftime, then out-scored Kansas 31-0 and allowed only 66 yards in the 2nd half.
- The Bears limited back-to-back opponents to single-digit scoring for the first time since 2014 and held 3-straight opponents below 300 yards of total offense for the second time in the Big 12 era (since 1996).

## OFFENSE PUTS UP BIG NUMBERS IN WIN OVER TEXAS SOUTHERN

- Baylor won 66-7 over Texas Southern on Sept. 11, scoring the most points for a BU team since Oct. 10, 2015.
- The Bears' 419 rushing yards on 43 carries gave them their highest yards-per-carry (9.74) since Sept. 12, 2008.
- Baylor's 714 total yards tied the 12th-most in program history and were the most since Dec. 29, 2015.
- Gerry Bohanon accounted for five TDs, the most by a Baylor QB since Seth Russell on Dec. 3, 2016.

## TWO-FOR-ONE IN TURNOVER BATTLE

- BU has forced more than twice as many turnovers as it has allowed in 15 games under head coach Dave Aranda.
- The Bears have 27 takeaways (20 INTs, 7 FR) and only 13 giveaways (8 INTs, 5 FL) in 15 games under Aranda.
- BU scored defensive TDs in consecutive games for the first time since 2013 – JT Woods had a 20-yard Pick-6 in the season-opener at Texas State, then had a school-record 97-yard fumble return TD vs. Texas Southern.

## FINDING END ZONE ON DEFENSE AND SPECIAL TEAMS

- Baylor has scored seven non-offensive touchdowns in 15 games under Aranda – 3 kickoff returns (Ebner x 3), 3 interception returns (Pitre, Pitre, Woods), 1 fumble return (Woods).
- In six games this season, Baylor's defense and special teams have accounted for 23 points with three return touchdowns (interception, fumble, kickoff) and a safety.

## BOHANON STEPS INTO STARTING ROLE

- Baylor fourth-year junior QB Gerry Bohanon (2020 graduate) made his career-first start in the season opener.
- Bohanon is 1 of 2 QBs with 1,000+ passing yards (1,337) and no interceptions, joining Matt Corral (Ole Miss-1,497).
- Bohanon is 1 of 3 players with 6+ rushing touchdowns and 10+ passing touchdowns this season, joining Matt Corral (Ole Miss) and Malik Willis (Liberty). Bohanon has scored a rushing touchdown in 5-straight games.
- Bohanon joined Bryce Petty (2013) as the only Baylor QBs in the last 20 years to make their career-first starts and lead the Bears to a win in a season opener. Bohanon went 15-of-24 for 148 passing yards in his debut.
- The offensive line has kept Bohanon off the ground, allowing only 5 sacks on his 145 pass attempts this season.

## BEARS HAVE SECOND-MOST WINS IN TEXAS IN LAST 10+ YEARS

- Baylor has won 83 games since 2011, tied for second-most among the state of Texas' 12 FBS teams.
- BU's 83 wins in the last 10+ years trail only Texas A&M (88), tie TCU (83) and Houston (83), and lead Texas (77), SMU (63), Texas Tech (60), North Texas (55), UTSA (54), Rice (47), UTEP (36) and Texas State (34).

## EBNER AN ALL-PURPOSE WEAPON

- Baylor fifth-year senior do-everything-back Trestan Ebner has been an all-purpose weapon throughout his BU career whether on the ground, through the air or on special teams. He was 4th in the Big 12 in APY/gm (116.3) last season.
- Ebner has 3,664 career all-purpose yards, trailing only JD Spielman (TCU - 4,323) among active Big 12 Conference players, and ranking 11th among active FBS players (3rd in Power-5 conferences).
- In 2020, Ebner had 1,047 all-purpose yards and a team-high 6 touchdowns. Ebner was third on the team with 26 receptions and second with 299 receiving yards. His 6 TDs came rushing (1), receiving (3) and on kick returns (2).
- The senior ranks first in BU history among running backs in receiving yards (1,308) and receiving touchdowns (10) and second in receptions (108). He trails only Brandon Whitaker (120 receptions, 2003-07) in receptions by a RB.

## POTENT GROUND ATTACK

- Baylor leads the Big 12 in yards per rush (6.01) and first downs from rushing (71), ranks 2nd in the league in rushing TDs (16) and 3rd in rushing offense (227.5 ypg).
- The Bears needed only 3 games to surpass last season's rushing totals (813 yards, 8 TDs) and have now rushed for 1,365 yards and 16 TDs on the season. BU needs only 261 rushing yards to double last season's totals.
- Abram Smith ranks 5th in the Big 12 with 99.5 rushing yards per game and 3rd in rushing TDs (7), while Gerry Bohanon leads all Big 12 quarterbacks and ranks 5th overall with 6 rushing TDs.
- Smith ranks 24th nationally with 7 rushing TDs and 15th nationally with 597 rushing yards.
- Three BU running backs have combined for six 100-yard rushing efforts in its first 6 games, after not having any 100-yard rushers during the 2020 season – Smith (3), Trestan Ebner (2), Taye McWilliams (1).

## BU WELCOMES FOUR TRANSFERS TO FOLD FOR 2020

- Baylor added four scholarship transfers for the 2021 season, all four of which started last week's game – DT Siaki Ika (LSU), OL Grant Miller (Vanderbilt), OL Jacob Gall (Buffalo) and WR Drew Estrada (Dartmouth),
- Ika is a massive 6-foot-4, 350-pound nose tackle, who played in 17 games over two seasons at LSU.
- Miller is the son of 2010 Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame inductee and 13-year NFL veteran Fred Miller. The younger Miller played in 29 games and made 16 starts over four seasons at Vanderbilt before joining BU as a grad transfer.
- Gall grad transferred to Baylor after playing in 32 games and making 13 starts over four seasons at Buffalo.
- Estrada played four seasons at Dartmouth (2016-19), recording 2,392 all-purpose yards (14th in school history). He joined BU as a grad transfer and made his BU debut at Kansas after missing two games with an injury.

## TWO GRAD TRANSFERS ADD TO EXPERIENCED OFFENSIVE LINE

- Baylor has six offensive linemen (4 returners, 2 grad transfers) who are all in at least their fourth seasons of FBS football and have combined for 207 games played and 117 starts.
- Connor Galvin (37 games, 29 starts), Xavier Newman-Johnson (39 games, 29 starts), Khalil Keith (33 games, 9 starts) and Johncarlo Valentin (25 games, 9 starts) all returned for the Bears. They are joined by grad transfers Grant Miller (35 games, 22 starts) and Jacob Gall (38 games, 19 starts).

## WEALTH OF OPTIONS AT RECEIVER

- BU returned its top 7 in receptions from 2020, including three receivers with 119 combined games played (53 starts).
- Baylor brought back 92% of its receptions from last season (188 of 205), and 83 of 100 receptions this season have been by returning players (Thornton-27, Sneed-19, Sims-13, Ebner-9, Fleeks-7, Smith-4, Dabney-3, Bohanon-1).
- R.J. Sneed (40 games, 24 starts), Tyquan Thornton (39 games, 25 starts) and Josh Fleeks (40 games, 4 starts) give the Bears an experienced wide receiver triple threat.
- Sneed has 106 receptions and 1,317 career yards. He led BU with 39 catches, 497 yards and 3 receiving TDs in 2020. He ranked 6th in the Big 12 in yards per game (55.2) and 6th in receptions per game (4.3) last year.
- Sneed reached 1,000 career receiving yards in the season opener at Texas State, the 39th player in program history.
- Thornton has 1,757 career receiving yards, which ranks 16th in program history, and 14 career receiving TDs.
- Fleeks has 658 career receiving yards on 67 receptions, along with 3 career receiving TDs and 2 rushing scores.

## FOUR TIGHT ENDS WITH STARTING EXPERIENCE

- In addition to the experienced wide receiver corps, Baylor also returned four experienced tight ends for 2021.
- Christoph Henle (37 games, 8 starts), Tyler Henderson (23 games, 2 starts), Ben Sims (23 games, 13 starts) and Drake Dabney (12 games, 5 starts) combine to form quartet of tight ends who all have multiple career starts.
- Sims leads the quartet with 29 career receptions for 321 yards and 7 TDs, while Henle has 13 career receptions for 95 yards, Dabney has 8 receptions for 66 yards and a TD, and Henderson has 6 receptions for 29 yards.
- Additionally, fourth-year junior Jackson Shupp has started 2 games this season as a second TE alongside Sims.

## FIVE DBs WITH 205 GAMES OF COMBINED EXPERIENCE

- The Bears' five starting defensive backs have a combined 205 career games played and 105 career starts.
- CBs Kalon Barnes (35 games, 10 starts) and Raleigh Texada (45 games, 35 starts) join safeties JT Woods (42 games, 20 starts), Christian Morgan (39 games, 17 starts) and Jalen Pitre (44 games, 22 starts).
- Additionally, reserve safety Jairon McVea has played 51 career games and made 3 starts and reserve cornerback Zeke Brown has played 41 games and made 1 start.

## SECOND-MOST GRADUATES IN FBS

- *Preparing Champions for Life* is more than a slogan at Baylor, and coach Dave Aranda's team is proving it in the classroom. The 2021 Baylor preseason roster featured 28 college graduates, including three graduate transfers.
- Baylor's 28 graduates are the second-most in FBS, trailing only Illinois (29). Others in the top-5 include Western Kentucky (27), Arizona (26), Minnesota (26) and Louisiana Tech (26).
- Baylor's list of graduates is as follows: Terrel Bernard, Gerry Bohanon, Zeke Brown, Dillon Doyle, Drew Estrada (Dartmouth), Jacob Gall (Buffalo), Tyler Henderson, Christoph Henle, Gavin Holmes, Bryson Jackson, Khalil Keith, Jackson Kimble, Henry Klinge, Cole Maxwell, Jairon McVea, Grant Miller (Vanderbilt), Christian Morgan, Xavier Newman-Johnson, Chidi Ogbonnaya, Casey Phillips, Jalen Pitre, Thor Rodoni, Gunnar Royer, Rob Saulin, Abram Smith, R.J. Sneed, Raleigh Texada and Johncarlo Valentin.

## FOUR ADDITIONS TO BAYLOR COACHING STAFF

- The Bears welcomed four new assistant coaches for 2021 – Jeff Grimes (Offensive Coordinator/TEs), Eric Mateos (Offensive Line), Chansi Stuckey (Wide Receivers) and Kevin Curtis (Cornerbacks).
- Grimes is a 28-year coaching veteran, who led the BYU offense for three seasons from 2018-20. He was named a 2020 finalist for the Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach.
- Mateos served on Grimes' offensive staff at BYU for the 2019 and 2020 seasons. Mateos' offensive lines have allowed only 18 sacks over 18 games since the start of the 2020 season.
- Stuckey joined the Bears after two successful seasons helping Clemson reach the College Football Playoff. He served in an offensive player development role in 2020 and a graduate assistant in 2019.
- Curtis, who played safety at Texas Tech while Aranda was on the coaching staff in 2000-01, joined BU after three seasons as cornerbacks coach at SMU. He also coached cornerbacks at Louisiana Tech for two seasons.

## ARANDA IS ONE OF TOP DEFENSIVE MINDS IN COUNTRY

- Second-year head coach Dave Aranda has earned a reputation as one of the nation's top defensive minds over his 20-plus year career, including stops as defensive coordinator at LSU, Wisconsin, Utah State and Hawaii.
- Aranda led the LSU defense in 2019 as the Tigers posted a perfect 15-0 record and won the National Title with a 42-25 victory over Clemson in CFP National Championship Game.
- In six seasons as defensive coordinator at a Power 5 school from 2014-19, Aranda's defenses were ranked in the Top 12 nationally in total yards five times. The units also ranked among the top 10 in scoring four times in seven years from 2013-19.

**Abram Smith** and **Trestan Ebner** led a rushing attack that racked up the most yards in the **Dave Aranda** era with 238 against Texas State en route to a season-opening win for Baylor (1-0, 0-0).

The Baylor defense continued its disruptive ways, early, when **JT Woods** put Baylor in the end zone for the first time in 2021 with a 20-yard interception return for a touchdown, just over three-minutes into the game.

With Baylor trailing 10-7 late in the first half, **Abram Smith** put the offense in the end zone for the first time in 2021 with a three-yard touchdown run capping a 13-play 75 yard drive, that gave the Bears the 14-10 lead at the half. The score was Smith's first since September 7, 2019, against UTSA.

Freshman **Isaiah Hankins** connected on his first career field goal with 8:50 to play in the third quarter to stretch Baylor's lead to seven, one of his two field goals on the night. Smith then doubled the lead with his second touchdown of the night from 13 yards out to make it a 24-10 lead.

After a Texas State field goal to make it 24-13 in the 4th quarter, the Baylor defense came up clutch again when **Jalen Pitre** stepped in front of a Brady McBride pass for his 3rd career interception. Pitre also had five tackles, a pair of those for loss, and a pass breakup to go along with a quarterback hurry.

The Bobcats scored with 1:19 to play to cut the deficit to 27-20, and eventually got the ball back, down by seven with 0:15 seconds to play. But the Baylor defense stood tall one more time forcing a safety on the game's final play. It was the second-consecutive year the Baylor defense forced a safety in the season opener.

The Baylor offense put up 386 yards of offense in quarterback **Gerry Bohanon's** first career start. Bohanon became just the second quarterback in the last 20 years to lead Baylor to a victory in his first career start in a season opener. The last to do it was Bryce Petty in 2013.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- BU is now 80-36-4 all-time in season openers. The Bears have won 12 of their last 13 season openers.
- **Trestan Ebner** became the first player in Baylor history to eclipse 1000-yards rushing (1,011) and 1,000-yards receiving (1,225).
- **RJ Sneed** eclipsed 1,000 career receiving yards (1,083), becoming the 39th player in Baylor history.
- **Abram Smith** rushed for 118 yards on 19 carries, his career-first 100-yard rushing game.
- **Tyquan Thornton** (1,340 career receiving yards) passed Kalief Muhammad (1,300) for 23rd on Baylor's all-time receiving yards list.
- Freshman Kicker **Isaiah Hankins** made his career-first field goal (43 yards) in the 2nd quarter.
- QB **Gerry Bohanon**, TE **Jackson Shupp**, OL **Gavin Byers**, LB **Matt Jones** and DL **Brayden Utley** made their first career starts.

## BAYLOR 66, TEXAS SOUTHERN 7

McLANE STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS

Baylor (2-0) dominated Texas Southern from the opening drive in their 66-7 win over the Tigers in their home opener at McLane Stadium.

The Bears scored touchdowns on each of their first seven drives of the game and scored on their way to building a 59-0 lead before Texas State eventually found the end zone.

**Gerry Bohanon** had his best game as a Bear accounting for five touchdowns in the win, the first Baylor quarterback to accomplish that feat since Seth Russell did it in December of 2016 at West Virginia.

After having a pair of 100-yard rushers against Texas State Baylor took it a step further against Texas Southern with three 100-yard rushers. **Abram Smith** led the way with 126 yards and two touchdowns. **Trestan Ebner** eclipsed the century mark for the second-straight week with 125 yards and sophomore **Taye McWilliams** had his first career 100-yard rushing game with 102 yards and a touchdown. It was the first time Baylor had three 100-yard rushers in a single game since September of 2015.

The Bears boasted their ninth highest single-game rushing total in program history with 419 on Saturday. It was their largest rushing output since October 1, 2016, at Iowa State (469). 714 total yards was their largest total since December of 2015 when they put up 756 in the Russell Athletic Bowl.

The Baylor defense was suffocating on the night, holding the Tigers to just 281 total yards while senior **JT Woods** put his defense in the end zone for a second consecutive week with a school-record 97-yard fumble return for a touchdown. With that score the Bears defense scored touchdowns in consecutive games for the first time since 2013.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- This is the first time Baylor has had multiple 100-yard rushers in back-to-back games since Sept. 12 and Sept. 26, 2015 (Shock Linwood, Johnny Jefferson, Terrence Williams vs. Lamar; Linwood & Williams vs. Rice)
- 419 yards on 49 carries averaged out to 9.74 yards per carry, the most for Baylor since September 12, 2008 against Washington State (426 yds on 42 carries for 10.1 yds per carry)
- Baylor's 66 points were it's most scored in a single-game since October 10, 2015 (W 66-7 vs. Kansas)
- Baylor improved to 2-0 for the 10th time in the last 12 seasons
- **Trestan Ebner** passed Jay Finley for 11th all time on Baylor's career all-purpose yards list (3,173)

The Baylor defense dominated the Kansas Jayhawks in their Big 12 opener allowing just 166 total yards in a 45-7 win in Lawrence. Kansas' 166 yards were the fewest allowed by a Baylor defense in a Big 12 game and the fewest allowed in any conference game since Baylor held Arkansas to 125 yards in 1990.

The Bears' offense started quickly with an opening drive touchdown for the second time in as many weeks, capped by **Ben Sims'** 4th career touchdown reception to give Baylor the quick 7-0 lead. Baylor's lead ballooned to 14-0 three plays into the second quarter when **Gavin Yates** plunged in from 2 yards out, becoming the first Baylor player to score from the fullback position since Jerod Monk in 2009.

Kansas cut Baylor's lead to 14-7 late in the 1st half with an 11-play, 76-yard drive, their longest of the day and the only one resulting in points for the Jayhawks.

After a 3-and-out by the Bears defense to begin the 3rd quarter, the offense wasted no time getting back on the board when **Gerry Bohanon** found **R.J. Sneed** for a 69-yard touchdown, Baylor's longest completion since a 78-yarder in the 2019 Big 12 Championship game. Bohanon's second touchdown pass of the game pushed Baylor's lead to 21-7. **Abram Smith** would find the end zone on the Bears' second drive of the second half becoming the first Baylor running back with a rushing touchdown in each of the first three games to start a season since Shock Linwood in 2014.

The defense continued its dominance in the 4th quarter allowing just 25 yards to the Jayhawks, while the offense rolled up 17 more points, including a Bohanon touchdown run that helped him climb into the top-10 in career rushing yards by a Baylor quarterback.

Saturday marked a third-straight game where the Baylor defense limited its opponent to under 300 yards of total offense, the second time that has been done by the Bears in the Big 12 era.

For the second consecutive meeting in Waco the Bears outlasted Iowa State by two points. This time it was a 31-29 victory to improve to 4-0 (2-0) on the season on Sept. 25.

After an opening-drive touchdown by Iowa State the Bears responded with an opening-drive touchdown of their own for a third-straight game as **Gerry Bohanon** found pay dirt with his legs to tie the game at seven.

Baylor took their first lead of the game one play into the second quarter when Bohanon went to the air to find **Tyquan Thornton** for a 21-yard touchdown connection upping the Bears lead to 14-7.

After a Cyclone field goal made it 14-10 Bohanon connected with **Ben Sims** from 33-yards out, capping a nine-play 75 yard drive and giving Baylor a 21-10 lead.

The next six points came from Iowa State as they cut Baylor's lead down to just five at 21-16.

But as the momentum began to shift Baylor's **Trestan Ebner** uncorked a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, the third of his career and the fifth-longest in Baylor history to push the Bears back up by 12 at 28-16.

Breece Hall's second touchdown run of the day pulled Iowa State back within five to begin the fourth quarter. With the Cyclones driving early in the 4th quarter, the Baylor defense came up with their biggest play of the day as a tipped pass ended up in the hand of **Garmon Randolph** for his first career interception thwarting Iowa State's attempt to take the lead.

Special teams came up big once again late in the 4th quarter when Ebner returned an Iowa State punt 41 yards, deep into Cyclone territory setting up an Isaiah Hankins 34yard field goal that would make it 31-23.

After the Cyclones drove 75 yards in 13 plays to make it 31-29 with 24-seconds left on the clock JT Woods picked off a Brock Purdy two-point conversion attempt sealing the win for Baylor.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- It was Baylor's first win over a ranked opponent since December of 2015 against North Carolina.
- Baylor is now 4-0 for the 6th time in the last nine seasons.
- Baylor is now eight for nine on 4th downs this year.
- Baylor has scored seven non-offensive touchdowns in Dave Aranda's first 13 games, the most in a 13-game span since 2013.
- Trestan Ebner's 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown is tied for the 5th longest in Baylor history.
- Ben Sims caught his fifth-career touchdown on Saturday joining Ken Hodge and Ronnie Bo Lee with the third-most touchdown receptions by a tight end in Baylor history.

Baylor suffered their first loss of the 2021 season on Oct. 2 in Stillwater with a 24-14 setback against the Cowboys.

The Cowboys struck first on the opening drive when Jaylen Warren scored on an eight-yard touchdown run, capping a 12-play 75 yard drive to make it 7-0 Cowboys.

From there the Baylor defense bowed their necks, forcing a pair of interceptions from a couple of seniors in the secondary. The first came from senior **Raleigh Texada**, followed by **JT Woods'** second interception of the season and the fifth of his career.

The Pokes pushed their way into the end zone for a second time in the final minute of the first half with a Spencer Sanders 32-yard touchdown toss to Rashod Owens to build their lead to 14-0 at the half.

With both teams exchanging blows in the third-quarter, it was Baylor who struck first in the second half thanks to a 55-yard touchdown run by **Abram Smith** on fourth-and-two. It was Baylor's second-longest run of the season and the longest of Smith's career.

The first play of the 4th quarter saw Oklahoma State's lead grow to ten after a Tanner Brown 20-yard field goal to make it 17-7.

Baylor responded with their second-longest play of the night, a 44-yard completion from **Gerry Bohanon** to **Tyquan Thornton** to get Baylor down to the Cowboys 21-yard line. Three plays later Bohanon cashed it in with his fifth-rushing touchdown of the year to pull the Bears back within three at 17-14.

With 5:32 remaining in the game Oklahoma State took over at their own 44-yard line. From there, they marched 56 yards in eight plays punctuated by a four-yard touchdown run by Warren on fourth-and-two to make it a 24-14 Cowboy lead.

- Baylor had multiple players with double-digit tackles for the first time this season.
- Junior linebacker **Dillon Doyle** had a career-high 15 tackles.
- Doyle also collected his career-first interception.

Baylor remained unbeaten at home with a convincing 45-20 win over the West Virginia Mountaineers on Oct. 9 in Waco.

The Bears' offense wasted no time, scoring on their second play of the game when **Gerry Bohanon** found **Tyquan Thornton** for a 75-yard strike. It was Baylor's longest offensive play of the season and gave the Bears the quick 7-0 lead.

After West Virginia scored on their opening drive, Baylor's offense went back to work covering 75 yards in eight plays, capped by **Ben Sims'** 10-yard touchdown reception to stretch the lead out to 14-7.

With a seven-point lead, **Jalen Pitre** picked off Jarrett Doege at the West Virginia 48 for Baylor's eighth interception of the season and their third-straight game with a pick.

Bohanon and the offense capitalized on the turnover by going 48-yards in five plays to extend the lead to 21-7 after Bohanon's sixth rushing touchdown of the season.

Thornton found the endzone for the second time, early in the second quarter on an 11-yard strike from Bohanon. Thornton finished the game with 187 receiving yards which are the most by a Baylor receiver in a single-game since Denzel Mims in 2017.

With a 28-13 lead in the third, Bohanon connected on his 4th passing touchdown of the game, his second to Sims. Bohanon's four passing touchdowns set a new career-high and gave Baylor the commanding 35-13 lead in the third quarter.

With 4:37 to play in the third quarter Baylor running back **Abram Smith** essentially put the game out of reach with a 31-yard touchdown scamper, his seventh of the season, to make it 42-13 in favor of the green and gold.

The 45-20 victory was Baylor's fourth win in five games against West Virginia, in Waco.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- 525 total yards of total offense are the most for Baylor in a Big 12 game since it rolled up 536 on October 19, 2019 at Oklahoma State.
- Baylor's offense scored on its opening possession for the fourth time in six games.
