Game Notes: Week of Jan. 22-28

After back-to-back wins against Fairleigh Dickinson, the Cougars moved up one spot to No. 12 in this week's AVCA coaches poll. BYU pulled off two sweeps over FDU, improving to 4-0 on the season. In 2022, the Cougars pulled off a sweep just two times, with one 3-0 victory over UC Irvine and another versus CUI. In 2023, BYU has swept opponents in three out of its four matches.

Freshman outside hitter Trent Moser debuted in his first match as a starter for No. 13 BYU last weekend, totaling 20 kills through two games. Moser also rounded out his performance by adding two service aces, 9 digs and four total blocks, with a .357 clip. The freshman from Gilbert, Arizona led BYU's offense in kills against Fairleigh Dickinson as the youngest starter on the court. Moser was also nominated by BYU as MPSF Offensive Player of the Week.

On Wednesday and Friday, BYU will face No. 6 UC Irvine in California. In the latest matchup between the two programs, BYU won in Provo 3-0 (25-22, 25-18, 25-21).

The Cougars hosted UC Irvine in the Smith Fieldhouse during the opening week of the 2023 season, but the two teams never faced each other. In Provo, UC Irvine defeated both McKendree (3-0) and No. 14 Lewis (3-1). Against McKendree, the first set went to 36-34.

The Cougars lost three-time All-American Davide Gardini from last season. In 2023, BYU features a young team, with nearly 70% of its roster filled with lower classmen (freshmen or sophomores).

BYU keeps four of its starters in Mitchel Worthington, Kuponu Browne, Gavin Julien and Miks Ramanis. Worthington enters the 2023 season in his fifth year as a Cougar due to COVID-19 eligibility. In the 2022 season, Coach Olmstead had 16 different starting lineup combinations.

BYU head coach Shawn Olmstead is beginning his eighth season leading the men's volleyball team. With a 133-50 (.726) overall record (as of December 2022), he has the third highest Division I men's volleyball win-loss% out of all active D-1 head coaches. The four-time MPSF Coach of the Year, Olmstead added a new staff member to his squad in 2023. Otavio Souza will serve as a new men's volleyball assistant coach who comes with experience from coaching at Cal, Saint Mary's and Missouri State. Olmstead helped BYU to 3-straight NCAA Final Four appearances for the first time in program history (2016-2018).

Helped BYU win National Championships in 2001 and 2004, along with a national runner-up finish in 2003. During his senior season in 2004, Olmstead recorded the third-most digs in a single season in school history with 230. Overall, he recorded 320 digs in his career.

Olmstead played volleyball at Carpinteria High School in California. He was named the high school league's Most Valuable Player during his senior season. He set a school record by recording 47 kills in a match.

Conference Championships

MPSF Tournament. Three (2016, 2018, 2021)

Shawn Olmstead has been the head coach of the BYU Men's Volleyball program since 2015, with the 2016 season being his first. Olmstead has advanced BYU to the national championship match of the NCAA Tournament three times so far in his coaching career: 2016, 2017 and 2021. He also helped BYU to three-straight NCAA Final Four appearances for the first time in program history from 2016-2018. Olmstead led BYU to three MPSF regular-season titles in his first three seasons as head coach from 2016-2018 as well. Along with this, he guided BYU to three MPSF Tournament championships in 2016, 2018 and 2021. He is a four-time MPSF Coach of the Year (2016, 2018, 2020, 2021). Nine athletes that he has coached are All-Americans, with a total of 19 AVCA All-America honors. At the end of the 2020 season, his winning percentage of .784 (105-29) is the highest of any active men's volleyball coach in the NCAA Division I-II. Olmstead coached BYU to a winning record for six years in-a-row (2016-2021) at the helm of the program. For the first time since 1996 in BYU Men's Volleyball history, the Cougars finished with a losing record last season in 2022. When asked about the 2022 season, Olmstead said, "I was proud of our team and the way they stayed the course throughout the entire season. It was a difficult season no doubt as it relates to overall wins and losses. Despite this, the team never hung their heads and never shied away from the task at hand. I'm proud of them for that. The amount of gratitude we have as a coaching staff for them and their heart, can't be put into words." Two seasons prior, Olmstead and the Cougars got their magical 2020 season devastatingly cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During that time, Olmstead guided BYU to a 17-1 (6-0 MPSF) record and No. 1 national ranking. He also coached the AVCA National Player in 2020 as well, Gabi Garcia Fernandez. Throughout Olmstead's career, he's coached six AVCA First Team All-Americans, namely Gabi Garcia Fernandez (2021, 20), Davide Gardini (2020, 21, 22), Wil Stanley (2020), Brenden Sander (2018, 16), Ben Patch (2016) and Jake Langlois (2017). In his first year with the men's volleyball team, Olmstead coached the squad to the national championship match of the 2016 NCAA Tournament. He led his team to an outright MPSF regular-season and tournament title while being named the 2016 MPSF Coach of the Year. The Cougars finished with a 27-4 (19-3) record in 2016.

BYU Women's Volleyball Era

Olmstead saw his most successful season as head coach of the BYU women's volleyball team in 2014. He coached BYU to the national championship match of the NCAA tournament for its first time in program history. The Cougars became the first unseeded team in tournament history to make it to the final match. To get there, BYU upset No. 11 Arizona, No. 6 Florida State, No. 14 Nebraska and No. 2 Texas. The Cougars also won an outright West Coast Conference title after Olmstead led his squad to a 16-2 league record. Olmstead coached three All-Americans in 2014, including Jennifer Hamson, Alexa Gray and Amy Boswell. In 2012, Olmstead led the Cougars to their first conference title since 2005 and best season record (28-4) since 1998. Olmstead and the Cougars hosted the first two rounds of the 2012 NCAA tournament before losing in the round of 16 to No. 5 seeded Oregon, who went on to play in the natty against Texas. In 2011, Olmstead's first year as head coach and BYU's first year in the WCC, he led the team to a 21-9 record, its first season with 20 or more wins since 2007.

Assistant Coach Devin Young

Former Cougar Devin Young joined the BYU men's volleyball team as an assistant coach ahead of the 2019 season. Young played middle blocker for the Cougars from 2008, 2011-14.

As a player, Young helped the Cougars win the 2013 and 2014 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation regular-season and tournament titles. BYU played in the NCAA tournament both years and advanced to the national championship match in 2013.

Young was named to the All-MPSF Second Team as a senior and made the MPSF All-Tournament Team in both 2013 and 2014. During his career, he averaged 1.38 kills per set as well as 1.09 blocks per set.

After graduating from BYU with a degree in business management, Young moved to Wisconsin where he stayed close to volleyball by coaching high school and club teams. In 2017, he returned to Utah to work for VolleyMetrics, a volleyball analytics company, where he worked with Division I volleyball coaches from across the country.

Young served a mission in Long Beach, California, after redshirting during the 2008 season. He hails from McMurray, Pennsylvania, and is married to Marie. The couple have three children.



Assistant Coach Otavio Souza

Souza comes to BYU with three years of experience as the assistant coach for Cal's women's volleyball team, as well as two-year stints at both Saint Mary's College and Missouri State. Before that, he also coached at Missouri Western and Georgetown. In Souza's first year at SMC in 2018, the Gaels finished the regular season 19-9, their best winning percentage since going 20-8 in 2010. The Gaels also went 2-0 against Pac-12 programs that season and punched their first ticket to the NCAA Tournament since 2012.

Souza wore a BYU jersey from 2009-2011, starting in 22 matches during his senior year, while collecting 119 kills, 94 blocks, 35 digs, 16 assists and seven service aces, with a .431 hitting percentage.

"Playing volleyball in the Smith Fieldhouse in front of thousands of fans at BYU is where I created great memories as a student-athlete," Souza said. "Our program has been competitive for many years. Coming back now as a coach is something really special for me to be a part of."

A Florianópolis, Brazil native, Souza went on to play professionally for Itajai Pro-Volei and Florianopolis Voleibol in Brazil, along with the Florida Wave.

Souza will debut as an assistant coach on January 6th, 2023 for Brigham Young University.

More than 53,000 full-time missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Most missionaries are young people under the age of 25, serving in 407 missions throughout the world. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 10 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching.

The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Brazil, Colombia, England, Ghana, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, and South Africa. In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize. Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions, except for their transportation to and from their field of labor, and are not paid for their services.

Missionaries may communicate with their families on their weekly preparation day via text messages, online messaging, phone calls and video chat in addition to letters and emails. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Many players on the BYU Men's Volleyball team have served a mission, or are currently serving a mission. This map shows approximate locations of where they have served/are serving. The Church teaches that missionary work is necessary in order to give the people of the world an opportunity to hear and accept the gospel.
