BYU VS. SAN JOSE STATE STORYLINES

- This is the 16th meeting of BYU and San Jose State.** BYU trails in the series 6-9 with all but two of the games coming before 1969. The Cougars are making their first trip to San Jose since 1968. Last year BYU won 29-16 at LaVell Edwards Stadium.
- The Cougars are facing their fifth bowl eligible team of the season against an 8-2 Spartan team.** The Cougars are 1-3 against teams that are now bowl eligible this year. Last year, BYU faced just four bowl-bound teams in the regular season, holding a 1-3 record against them also. SJSU is 2-2 against bowl eligible teams.
- BYU is playing just its fifth game in the state of California under Bronco Mendenhall.** The team is 2-2 in the state with two wins over San Diego State during Mountain West Conference play.
- San Jose State comes in averaging just over 325 yards passing per game while BYU is allowing just 172.2 yards per contest.** BYU has allowed just one team to pass for over 300 this season (332, Oregon State) and three in the last 42 games. The Cougars have not allowed more than 230 passing yards to any other teams this year and have held five opponents below 150 yards passing.
- BYU wide receiver Cody Hoffman has a caught a pass in 29 straight games,** tied for the 10th longest streak in the nation. He has caught a pass in 35 of 36 career games. San Jose State's Noel Grigsby is just ahead of Hoffman with 31 straight games with a reception.
- Punter Riley Stephenson was just named one of 10 Ray Guy Award semifinalists, honoring the nation's top punter while San Jose State's placekicker Austin Lopez was just named as one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, given to the country's best placekicker.** Stephenson is No. 4 in the nation, averaging 46.7 yards per punt. Lopez is a perfect 14 of 14 on field goals and has a long of 43 yards this year.
- San Jose State's David Tuitupou, a 6-foot-5, 260-pound defensive end, spent two seasons with BYU** as a member on the scout team. He transferred to Snow College in 2010 and then to the Spartans. Tuitupou's brother Peter, a tight end, played two seasons at Snow in 2007-08 and then headed to San Jose State. They are from Orem, Utah.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

A postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Mendenhall and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Mendenhall's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

NELSON'S THREE TOUCHDOWNS LEAD TO VICTORY ON SENIOR NIGHT

PROVO, UTAH – Senior Riley Nelson threw for 236 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Cougars to a 52-13 win over Idaho on senior night at LaVell Edwards Stadium Saturday night.

With the win, BYU improves to 6-4 and will be going bowling for the eighth consecutive season after accepting an invitation to the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, Calif.

Tonight, the Cougars recognized the 23 seniors on the roster for senior night before the game. Seniors Robbie Buckner, Simote Vea and Russell Tialavea had a part in three of the five turnovers that the Cougars caused in the game. Defensive back Buckner intercepted a pass in the second quarter. Defensive lineman, Vea recovered a fumble towards the end of the second quarter and fellow defensive lineman Tialavea also recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter.

Nelson tossed three touchdown passes and completed 19 of 31 passes for 236 yards and no interceptions in his final home game of his career. Senior James Lark also saw action in most of the second half adding another touchdown pass.

Cody Hoffman led the Cougars with 108 yards receiving on nine receptions and three touchdowns. Freshman running back Jamaal Williams had his second consecutive game of rushing for more than 100 yards, finishing with 104 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries.

The Cougars finished the night with 537 total yards and held the Vandals to 273 yards of total offense.

The Cougars slowed down the pace in the second half, playing several reserves and seniors in the final home game.

NOTES FROM BYU'S LAST GAME

- **Wide receiver Cody Hoffman kept his streak alive, now catching at least one pass in 29 straight games and 35 of 36 career games.** Hoffman finished the first half with eight catches for 91 yards and tied a career best with three touchdown catches, doubling his season total. He finished the game with another catch to finish his night with 9 grabs for 108 yards and three scores.
- **Hoffman now has 168 career receptions, passing Reno Mahe for No. 7 in school history and has 2,267 career receiving yards, good for No. 10 at BYU,** passing Glen Kozlowski. With three touchdown catches, Hoffman moves into No. 4 in career touchdown receptions. He also moved into a tie at No. 3 with his 11th career 100-yard receiving game. Hoffman now sits at No. 8 in all-purpose yards with 3,601 yards.
- **Five of BYU's touchdown drives in the first half took place in under three minutes each,** scoring on drives of 2:31, :32 seconds, 2:47, 2:34 and 2:48. In the second half BYU had a touchdown scoring drive that lasted 3:10 and a field goal drive that lasted a lengthy 6:08.
- **Several seniors saw action on a night with 23 being honored.**
- **BYU's 42 points in the first half are the most points scored in the first half since BYU hung 49 on UCLA in 2008.** BYU went on to shutout the Bruins 59-0 for the win. BYU also scored the most points in game this season with 52.
- **Freshman phenom Jamaal Williams scored two rushing touchdowns, giving him 10 rushing scores this season.** Williams is the 19th player in school history to log 10 rushing touchdowns in a season and is tied for the third-most by a freshman running back in single-season school history. He is No. 3 among FBS freshman running backs with 10 scores on the ground.
- **Williams also recorded his second straight 100-yard rushing game,** racking up 104 yards on just 10 attempts in the first half. He is the first Cougar running back to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games since Harvey Unga had 118 and 149 vs. Utah State and UNLV in 2009.

OPPONENT OUTLOOK

SAN JOSE STATE'S LAST GAME

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - It was the big play on both sides of the ball in the first half for San Jose State in a 47-7 win over New Mexico State in a Western Athletic Conference game.

Three touchdown plays of 50 or more yards and a 37-yard fumble return by defensive back Bené Benwikere propelled the Spartans to a 37-0 halftime lead.

The Spartans (8-2, 4-1 WAC) picked up their fourth win in a row and matched their win total of the last three seasons combined.

The defense did its part in the win coming up with the Benwikere score, three other Aggie turnovers and stopping New Mexico State on the San Jose State 1-yard line on fourth down at the end of the second quarter. The Aggies were limited to 220 yards offensively compared to San Jose State's 505 yards.

Like the UTSA game when the Spartans scored early and often, San Jose State needed only 12 snaps for five touchdowns. Four touchdown drives took two plays or less.

For the second time in 2012, quarterback David Fales threw four touchdown passes in a game. Fales' day was over early in the quarter after completing



12-of-18 passes with an interception for 276 yards.

Running back De'Leon Eskridge initiated the touchdown parade with a 63-yard run through the middle of the New Mexico State (1-9, 0-5 WAC) defense with 6:13 to go in the first quarter. Eskridge gained 96 yards on just six carries as the Spartans rushed for 204 yards.

Two of Fales' touchdown throws came on first-down passes in the flat that quickly inflated the Spartans' scoring total on the day.

New Mexico State scored its touchdown in the final minute to avert a shutout.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR TWO

In 2012, BYU builds on its 10-3 2011 campaign with a more difficult schedule, featuring a road game at fellow independent Notre Dame along with three teams from the Pac-12 and matchups against the ACC, WAC and MW. BYU has had four games on ESPN, one on ESPN2 and others on ABC, NBC, ESPNU, The Fox Sports Network and BYUtv. BYU's remaining three games will be televised on ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPN3. The Cougars have future games scheduled with Wisconsin, West Virginia, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Cincinnati, Virginia, East Carolina, Georgia Tech, Texas, UCF, Houston, Washington State, Boise State, Middle Tennessee State, Utah State, Utah, Southern Miss and Hawai'i.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their peers, quarterback Riley Nelson, linebacker Brandon Ogletree and running back David Foote have been named as team captains for the 2012 season. The three seniors are all new captains for the 2012 season. Nelson will serve as the offense's captain, Ogletree for the defense and Foote for special teams. Nelson has 1,848 total yards of offense and has accounted for 13 touchdowns this year. Ogletree has 78 total tackles to lead the team. Foote has 34 rushes for 135 yards and also has seven tackles on special teams, blocked a punt and has two kick returns for 35 yards.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium will feature new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates 347 missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 53,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 330 missions around the world. Seventy-five percent of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 25. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years or 18 months for women and couples—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

There are currently 38 missionaries from the football team serving in 17 different countries. Members of the current team cover six of the seven continents around the globe and speak six different languages.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team participates in hour-long devotionals prior to eight games this season. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with Holy and Bronco Mendenhall.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **True freshman and 17-year old Jamaal Williams has been a huge part of the BYU offense.** Williams leads BYU in total touchdowns with 11 (10 rushing, one receiving). His 10 rushing touchdowns are the third-most among BYU freshman running backs in school history and rank No. 3 among all FBS freshman running backs in 2012. Against Hawai'i, Williams seized the day, picking up 155 yards and two scores on just 15 carries. He is just the ninth BYU freshman running back to have rushed for over 100 yards in a game. He was an all-purpose threat at Notre Dame with 106 all-purpose yards and was a scoring machine at Georgia Tech with four touchdowns (three rushing, one receiving). Williams had back-to-back 100-yard rushing games with Georgia Tech and last week vs. Idaho. Williams leads BYU in rushing with 620 yards and is fourth in receiving yards with 230. He is second in all-purpose yardage, averaging 85.0 yards per game.
- **Wideout Cody Hoffman leads BYU in receiving in 2012.** Hoffman currently has 65 receptions (career high), 797 yards and six touchdowns. The junior picked up his fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season vs. Idaho with nine receptions for 108 yards and three touchdowns. His 797 receiving yards are No. 35 nationally. He is averaging 79.7 yards per game and 12.3 yards per reception.
- **BYU is winning all four quarters.** BYU has dominated the second quarter 109-13. The Cougars have a slight edge in the third quarter 50-46 and have outscored opponents 64-38 in the final frame. With a 28-point output in the first quarter vs. Idaho, BYU is now winning the first 15 minutes 63-45. The Cougars are out-scoring opponents in a game by an average of 28.6 points to 14.2 points.
- **Thirteen different players have scored touchdowns this year** as BYU has been able to spread the ball around in 2012. Williams leads with 11, Hoffman has six, Friel has five and Taysom Hill has four while the rest go Lasike (2), Mahina (2) and then Lark, Alisa, Apo, Ridley, Falslev, Raymond, and Nelson all with one each. Williams is the only player with both a rushing score and a receiving score.
- **BYU is averaging 171.6 rushing yards per game in 2012.** That number is good for No. 51 in the nation and is the most rushing yards per game for the Cougars since 2001 when BYU had Doak Walker winner Luke Staley as the primary ball carrier. In 2001 the Cougars averaged 217.9 yards per game, No. 13 nationally with Staley averaging 143.8 yards on his own and former quarterback and current offensive coordinator Brandon Doman averaged 35.1 yards. In 2012, BYU is led by Williams, averaging 62.0 yards (89.5 over last five games as primary carrier) and Nelson adding 21.5 yards per game.

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

- 1** BYU is the No. 1 red zone, or as the Cougars refer to it as the blue zone, defense in the nation, allowing scores just 56.52 percent of the time. BYU has allowed opponents inside the 20-yard line only 23 times and allowed just nine touchdowns and four field goals.
- 2** After holding Georgia Tech to 0 for 10 on third down, BYU followed it up by allowing Idaho to convert just 2 of 12 third down attempts. BYU is now No. 2 in the nation in third down defense, allowing just a 24.82 conversion rate.
- 2.9** BYU's run defense has allowed an average of 2.9 yards per carry to opponents in 2012. The Cougars have held four opponents to less than 1.8 yards per carry.
- 4** The Cougars come in at the No. 4 spot in total defense. BYU has held its opponents to 264.5 yards per game. The rushing defense moved up to No. 4, holding opponents to 92.3 yards per game while their passing defense comes in at No. 10 (172.2).
- 66.0** BYU has 66 tackles for loss on the year, No. 32 in the nation. Linebacker Kyle Van Noy leads the team with 12.5 tackles for loss while Ziggy Ansah has 12.0, Brandon Ogletree has 9.0 and Spencer Hadley has 8.5.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **BYU is No. 4 nationally in total defense.** With seven returning starters from the No. 13 defensive unit in 2011, the Cougars have continued to climb the defensive rankings in 2012. BYU has held opponents to an average of 264.6 yards. The powerhouse defense holds seven top-10 major defensive rankings, including the No. 1 red zone defense, allowing scores just 56.52 percent of the time.
- **One of everything almost... again.** After being the only Division I player to record a statistic in each of the major defensive categories in 2011, junior linebacker Kyle Van Noy is back at it again in 2012. The 6-foot-3, 235 pounder blocked a Georgia Tech punt to set up a BYU score and now only needs a fumble recovery to duplicate his 2011 feat. The Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy and Lombardi Award watchlist honoree has top defensive marks for the Cougars in four categories, including tackles for loss (12.5), sacks (7.5), quarterback hurries (8) and forced fumbles (4). The junior playmaker is T-4th nationally in forced fumbles, T-23rd in sacks and T-30th in tackles for loss.
- **Stopping the run is often a theme and BYU is pretty good at it.** After finishing 2011 ranked No. 19 in rushing defense, BYU's run-stopping effort continues to be a trend in 2012. BYU held WSU's offense to -5 total yards rushing, the second time in three years allowing a team to negative rushing yards. The Cougars have held three teams under 50 yards rushing. Against Georgia Tech, a team that had topped 300 rushing yards four times this year and 400 rushing yards twice, BYU limited the Rambler to a season-low 117 rushing yards. BYU is No. 4 nationally in rush defense. The Cougars are holding their opponents to 92.3 rushing yards per game.
- **Ezekiel Ansah has come a long way since 2010** when he had to be taught how to put football pads on. The defensive lineman/linebacker hybrid had a break out game against Boise State, finishing with a career-high eight tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss, while picking up his first career sack. The sack was the first allowed by the Broncos this season. With a 6-foot-6, 270-pound frame, "Ziggy" also batted down a pass and snuffed out a 4th-down attempt from Boise State. The former 200-meter track athlete improved on those numbers against Utah State, wreaking havoc in the backfield for the Aggies defense and setting career highs in tackles for loss (3) and sacks (2), and tacked on two quarterback hurries. Ansah once again led the defensive attack against Georgia Tech, stopping the run game and totalling eight tackles and one sack. He had three tackles vs. Idaho, including one more tackle for loss, giving him 12 on the year.
- **Behind enemy lines.** After recording 4.0 TFL against Oregon State, BYU got back on track against Notre Dame with 6.0 TFL and continued against Georgia Tech with 5.0 TFL. The Cougars have tallied at least 5.0 TFL in eight of nine games so far in 2012 with a season-best 11.0 TFL against Utah. Uona Kaveinga led the defensive attack against Notre Dame with a career-high 2.0 TFL while three other players also made their mark with one each. BYU is tied for No. 32 nationally in TFL with 66.
- **Top dogs.** Five of the team's top eight tacklers are seniors and played their last game at LaVell Edwards Stadium against Idaho. Senior linebacker Brandon Ogletree is leading the No. 4 defense in tackles, solo tackles and assisted tackles. Ogletree has 78 tackles on the season, giving him an average of almost eight tackles per game. Preston Hadley, Ezekiel Ansah, Uona Kaveinga and Romney Fuga join Ogletree as other top senior defenders.

During his seven seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to seven straight bowl invitations, two outright conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings. The Cougars finished their first season as a football independent in 2011 with a 10-3 record and No. 25 final ranking to finish nationally ranked for the fifth time in the last six seasons.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 72-28 (.720) record to date to rank No. 12 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received eight straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first eight teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in five of the last six seasons to become the first Cougar teams to ever win five bowls in a six-year span. Nationally, BYU is one of only seven programs to win five bowl games in the last six seasons. The Cougars have also won 10 or more games in five of the past six seasons and five of Mendenhall's seven seasons overall. In fact, only four programs have had more 10-win seasons over the past seven years.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 88 times in the past seven seasons (46 offense, 32 defense, 9 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 55 top-15 statistical rankings, 37 top-10 rankings and 19 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past six seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member is tied for third nationally for Academic All-America recipients over Mendenhall's seven seasons at the helm. Seven Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans in that span. Among all FBS schools only Penn State and Nebraska have had more during that period.

Mendenhall also serves as the team's defensive coordinator. The Cougars had the nation's No. 13 defense in 2011 to help BYU become one of only 11 programs to receive a final Top 25 overall team ranking in at least one of the two major polls during five of the past six seasons. BYU is one of only nine teams to do so in the USA Today Coaches Poll.
