ABOUT THE PILOTS

- The Pilots (15-12, 7-8 WCC) dropped a 61-59 decision at San Diego on Thursday. Junior C Thomas van Der Mars led all scorers with 18 points, while junior G Bobby Sharp added 16 points in his second career start.
- Portland played without leading scorer Kevin Bailey (leg injury) for the third straight game. Bailey is doubtful for Saturday's contest.
- Sophomore G Bryce Pressley had a solid all-around game with 11 points, six rebounds and five assists. Freshman PG Alec Wintering was also hobbled by a leg injury and played just 22 minutes. He is questionable for Saturday's game.
- Portland's first five WCC games were at home, while the second half of UP's schedule features 7-of-9 games on the road.
- Nicholas joined Portland's 1,000-point club in the second half against Princeton on Dec. 21. He is the WCC leader in rebounding (9.0) and is third on the team in scoring (12.8). He also ranks fifth on Portland's career rebounding and double-doubles lists.
- Van der Mars has had a breakout year averaging 12.9 points and 6.8 rebounds per game. His 19-point, 18-rebound effort vs. Portland State earned him league player of the week honors on Dec. 9.
- The Pilots are No. 20 nationally in three-point percentage (.395).
- Portland returns all five starters and nine lettermen from last year's team that finished 11-21 overall.
- Head coach Eric Reveno returns for his eighth year on The Bluff and recorded his 100th career win on Nov. 27 vs. San Jose State.
- Assistant coaches Eric Jackson and Mike Wolf also return for their eighth year, while Colin Pfaff returns for his second year as an assistant coach.
- Portland looks to return to its 2008-11 success, a stretch that included back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history and 60 wins over three seasons.
- The Pilots were invited to the ColleagueInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) for three consecutive seasons from 2008-2011.
- The Pilots were picked to finish ninth in the 10-team West Coast Conference in the pre-season coaches poll.
- Coach Reveno posts a 100 percent graduation rate and the men's basketball program has one of the top APR scores in the nation (995), receiving a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA last spring.

ABOUT BYU

- The Cougars (19-10, 11-5) moved into sole possession of second place in the WCC standings with a 73-65 win over No. 24 Gonzaga on Thursday night. Junior G Anson Winder led four BYU players in double figures with 17 points in the win.
- Junior G Tyler Haws leads the WCC and ranks fourth nationally in scoring (23.6).
- BYU is one of the fastest paced teams in the nation and ranks third nationally in points per game (85.1).
- Head coach Dave Rose is in his ninth season with the Cougars.
- BYU owns a 9-1 overall series edge over Portland, including 5-0 margin at the Marriott Center... Portland picked up its first win over BYU on Jan. 23 at the Chiles Center with an epic 114-110 triple overtime victory... Bobby Sharp and Thomas van der Mars scored 27 points each for the Pilots, while Tyler Haws set a new Chiles Center record with 48 points in a losing effort.

INJURY REPORT

- After staying healthy for most of the year, the injury bug bit the Pilots last week as Kevin Bailey (leg injury) has missed three straight games. He is doubtful on Saturday.
- Freshman PG Alec Wintering injured his leg vs. Pepperdine on Saturday and he is questionable for Saturday.

SENIOR MOMENTS

- All four seniors earned the start on Senior Day vs. Pepperdine last Saturday and came out firing. Portland built an early 10-point lead as Tanner Riley scored all 10 of his points in the game's first seven minutes.
- Korey Thieleke also drilled a three-pointer and made big plays in the second half at both ends of the court, while Ryan Nicholas finished with a game-high 21 points.
- It was the first career start for John Bailey, who grabbed a rebound in four minutes.

NICHOLAS CLIMBING CAREER CHARTS

- Nicholas scored his 1,000th career point in the second half against Princeton on Dec. 21 to become the 35th player in school history to reach the mark. He currently ranks 15th in school history with 1,185 points.
- The Spokane, Wash. native is leading the WCC in rebounding (9.0) and double-doubles (9) and cracked the top 10 in school rebounding history after his 16-rebound effort against North Texas. His 803 career rebounds are fifth all-time.
- Nicholas is a three-year starter and led the Pilots in scoring and rebounding each of the past two seasons.
- Nicknamed 'Rhino', he sat behind All-WCC forward Luke Sikma and four-year starting center Kramer Knutson as a freshman but followed with a breakout sophomore year (11.5 ppg, 7.6 rpg). He averaged 13.0 points and 8.7 rebounds last season.

BAILEY AMONG ELITE WCC SCORERS

- Junior G Kevin Bailey has had a breakout season.
- Earlier this year he joined teammate Ryan Nicholas as the 36th member of the 1,000 point club. His 10 points at Santa Clara on Feb. 1 pushed him over the mark and he now has 1,020 points for his career.
- He has reached double figures in 22 of the 24 games, scored 20 or more points eight times, and logged a career-high 29 points in the season opener over UC Davis.
- A three-year starter, the Clovis, Calif. native averaged 11.4 points last season and 9.5 points per game as a freshman.

AMONG THE WCC LEADERS...

- Portland is second in the WCC in assists (15.1) and 3-point pct. (.395), and third in scoring (76.5), assist-turnover ratio (1.3), FT pct. (.741) and blocked shots (4.3).
- Ryan Nicholas leads the league in rebounding (9.0), Thomas van der Mars is No. 1 in FG pct. (.610), and Bryce Pressley is second in three-point percentage (.465).
- Pressley (2.3) and Alec Wintering (2.2) and are second and fifth in assist-to-turnover ratio, respectively.
- Wintering is also fifth in assists (4.5), fifth in steals (1.6) and 11th in free throw percentage (.833).

VAN DER MARS ERUPTS

- Junior C Thomas van der Mars has had a few monster games this season, while putting up career numbers. His seven double-doubles are tied for third most in the WCC.
- He scored a career-high 28 points with 11 rebounds at Santa Clara on Feb. 1. He was 9-for-10 from the field and 10-for-10 from the free throw line.
- Van der Mars previously scored 27 points with 18 rebounds in the triple overtime win against BYU on Jan. 23. 21 of his points came after halftime.
- He also dropped a 19-point, 18-rebound effort against Portland State on Dec. 7 that earned him WCC Player of the Week honors.
- He became the first Pilot to win the weekly honor since Jan. 31, 2011.
- Van der Mars had a remarkable second half against the Vikings, finishing with 17 points and 11 rebounds after the break. Overall, he was 6-for-8 from the field and made 7-of-9 free throw attempts in the victory.
- The Gouda, Netherlands native scored 21 points with 12 rebounds against North Texas. He also had 15 points and 12 rebounds against Idaho.
- He ranks 4th in school history in FG percentage (.567) and 7th in blocks (69).

WINTERING GIVEN THE KEYS

- Freshman PG Alec Wintering has dished out 10 or more assists three times this year.
- His season-high 13 assists with just one turnover against San Francisco on Dec. 28 was the most assists by a Pilot against a Division I school in program history, and one shy of the school record set by Dionn Holton (14 vs. Southern Oregon — Dec. 9, 1995).
- His 5.3 assists per game in league play is No. 3 overall.
- The Concord, N.C. native has started all 27 games for the Pilots.
- He is shooting a team-best 83 percent from the free throw line this year.
- Portland secured a commitment from Wintering out of United Faith Christian Acad. in North Carolina, where he was coached by former NBA point guard Muggsy Bogues.
- Wintering's ties to Portland go back to when he lived in Arizona and looked up to former Pilot PG T.J. Campbell, a two-time All-WCC selection for the Pilots in 2008-10.

THREE-POINT THREATS

- Portland was one of the top three-point shooting teams in the nation three years running from 2009-11 and the touch has returned to The Bluff this year.
- The Pilots are shooting 39.5 percent this year from beyond the arc, second in the WCC and tied for 20th nationally.
- Those numbers are even better in league play as UP is shooting a league-best 42.8 percent from downtown.

SHARP SHOOTER

- Junior G Bobby Sharp drilled three three-pointers in his first career start on Thursday vs. LMU and has been on fire during league play.
- He is shooting 45.6 percent from beyond the arc in league play which ranks seventh, while his 36 three-pointers made in conference play are third overall.
- Sharp not only hit eight three-pointers and broke his previous career-high of 18 points with his 27-point effort against BYU on Jan. 23, many of the three-pointers were clutch and against defensive pressure.
- The two biggest threes came in the final 30 seconds of the second overtime period as the Pilots came back from an eight-point deficit with 2:39 remaining.
- His fade-away three tied it at 103 with 13 seconds left and UP cruised in the third OT.

IM-PRESSLEY

- Sophomore G Bryce Pressley had a remarkably efficient game in the win over Gonzaga on Jan. 9. He finished with 16 points on 5-of-6 from the field, 2-of-2 from three-point range and 4-of-4 at the foul line. He added nine assists with zero turnovers, and also had two rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals.
- Pressley previously earned WCC Player of the Week honors on Dec. 23, joining Thomas van der Mars as the second Pilot in three weeks to be recognized.
- He was named the MVP of the South Point Holiday Hoops Classic after scoring a career-high 25 points in the win over Princeton. He was 8-for-10 from the field, 5-for-5 from three-point range and 4-for-4 at the foul line. His previous career high was 10.
- The Sacramento native picked up his first career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Pacific on Jan. 2.
- Pressley started the final seven games of the 2012-13 season and also took over backup point guard duties late in the year.
- The son of former NBA standout and NCAA Champion Harold Pressley (Villanova, '86), he has started every game on the wing this year and is also the backup point guard.
- An all-around versatile talent, Pressley has improved his shot is second in the WCC in three-point percentage (.465).

RECORD BREAKING GAME

- The win over BYU on Jan. 23 marked just the second triple overtime game in UP history. The other was an 82-81 win over San Jose State on November 27, 1984.
- BYU's Tyler Haws scored 48 points to break the Chiles Center individual scoring record, previously held by UP's Matt Houle (43) on Feb. 13, 1993 against San Francisco.
- The 114 points scored by the Pilots were the most against a Division I opponent in school history.
- Bobby Sharp, who hit seven three-pointers over the games final 22 minutes, was trending nationally on Twitter during the overtime periods.

SCORING PUNCH

- Scoring is up significantly this season for the Pilots as the team is averaging 76.5 points per game, the highest for a UP squad the 1991-92 season when current Miami HEAT head coach Erik Spoelstra was a senior point guard for the Pilots and the team averaged 80.9 points per game.
- Portland ranks third in the WCC in team scoring.
- Last year the Pilots averaged 61.0 points and the team averaged 65.1 points during the 2011-12 season.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Pilots have a 57-29 record at the Chiles Center since the 2008-09 season.
- Portland had a 19-game home winning streak snapped by Gonzaga in 2011.
- Signature home wins have come against Gonzaga, BYU, Washington, Oregon, Nevada and Saint Mary's three times.

IT'S ALL ACADEMIC

- Thomas van der Mars (3.95, Operations Technology Management) was named to the Capital One Academic All-America Third Team, becoming the second UP men's basketball player in school history to earn the honor.
- Van der Mars joins Rick Raivio (1980) to earn third team honors and is the 30th student-athlete to earn Academic All-America honors across all sports.
- Ryan Nicholas (3.47 GPA, Psychology) and van der Mars were named to the 2013 WCC All-Academic Team, while Riley Barker (3.46, Marketing) was honorable mention.
- Nicholas picks up his second award in as many years.
- Coach Reveno has had a total of 13 WCC All-Academic selections in his seven years.
- Reveno also posts a 100 percent graduation rate (17 players) and the men's basketball program has one of the top APR scores in the nation (995), receiving a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA last spring.

SPAIN FOREIGN TOUR

- Portland benefitted from a 10-day Foreign Tour to Spain and the Canary Islands back in August.
- On the court, Portland went down to the final possession against both Angola (No. 15 ranked team in the world) and Venezuela (No. 24) while in Madrid.
- The Pilots then routed three select teams in the Canary Islands to finish the tour 3-2.

BIG HOME WINS

- The Pilots snapped a 20-game overall losing streak to Gonzaga and picked up the first win at the Chiles Center over the Bulldogs since 1996 with an 82-73 win on Jan. 9.

- After being outrebounded in the first three games of the season, Portland has had a positive rebounding margin in 16 of the last 24 outings.
- For the season the Pilots have a +2.0 rebounding margin.

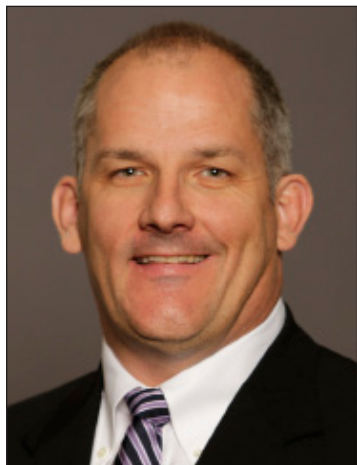

HEAD COACH ERIC REVENO...



Eric Reveno was named head coach of the men's basketball program on April 10, 2006, becoming the 20th coach in Pilot history. He previously served nine successful seasons as an assistant at Stanford. Reveno has spearheaded Portland's rebuilding effort and has already achieved remarkable results in his first six years on The Bluff.

From 2009-11 Pilots basketball reached historic highs. With 60 wins, the team set a school record for the most wins over a three-year period. The Pilots reached the post-season all three years, were ranked in the Top 25, and secured three wins over ranked opponents and a 38-6 home record at the Chiles Center. Portland was also the top three-point shooting team in the nation over that period.

Twelve Pilots have been named to All-WCC teams since 2008, including six first-team selections, and all 11 of the program's graduates since 2009 have gone on to play professionally.

And the success hasn't just been on the court. The team boasts a 100% graduation rate, a perfect 1000 rating in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, and 13 Academic All-WCC selections since 2007.

The 2009-10 squad matched a school-record 21 wins and went 10-4 in the WCC to match the best league record in program history. Despite returning just one starter, Reveno led the Pilots to another 20-win season and a third straight trip to the CIT. It also marked the first back-to-back 20-win campaigns in program history.

Reveno was named the 2009 West Coast Conference and District 9 Coach of the Year after leading the Pilots to a 19-13 record and invitation to the inaugural CIT. It marked a 10-win improvement from 2008 and the program's first postseason appearance since 1996. The Pilots also finished third in the WCC standings (9-5)

and posted its first win over a ranked opponent (84-66 over #18 Saint Mary's) since 1981.

Reveno preaches a disciplined style of play, has a track record of player development, and respects the role of the student-athlete. He has built the foundation for future success through quality recruiting and an emphasis on development, both on the court and in the weight room.

Voted one of the Top 25 Recruiters in the nation by rivals.com in 2006, Reveno has brought his eye for talent to Portland with good results. The Pilots have had a total of 12 All-WCC honorees over the last six years.

Academic integrity is another cornerstone of Reveno's program. A Pac-10 Conference All-Academic Team selection himself in 1989, Reveno helped coach 14 players to 25 all-conference academic honors as an assistant, the most of any school in the Pac-10 during his nine-year tenure. He has already had 13 players earn WCC All-Academic honors at Portland, including a league-high three all-academic team members in 2010.

Reveno, long recognized as a leader in the use of sports performance analysis technology, spoke in Sydney, Australia during the Fall of 2008 at a worldwide summit hosted by SportsTec, one of the foremost providers of video & technology solutions to the international sports community. The cutting edge approach to technology has become a staple of the Pilot program in teaching, player development and recruiting. As a result, Reveno was the lone representative from the United States asked to speak to an audience of performance professionals from some of the top sports leagues and organizations in the world. Dave Telep, ESPN.com Senior Recruiting Analyst, said that, "Reveno is unofficially the most technologically advanced man we've met in college basketball. His new I-Phone is wired up to the point where he's got his recruiting database, clips of his offense, directions to gyms in Vegas AND his favorite Johnny Cash songs all in one."

An imposing 6-foot, 8-inch figure, Reveno commands respect not with his mere presence, but with his passion for, and teaching of, a disciplined style of play reminiscent of his formative coaching years as an assistant under legendary coach Mike Montgomery at Stanford. He also points to the coaching philosophies of Tom Davis, the man who recruited and coached him at Stanford his first two years, and legendary coach Pete Newell as major influences on his coaching style. Reveno served as an assistant coach under Montgomery for seven years before being promoted to associate head coach during the 2004-05 season alongside Trent Johnson.

A post player for the Cardinal in the late '80s under both Davis and Montgomery, Reveno helped coach his alma mater to seven 20-win seasons, three 30-win seasons, eight NCAA Tournament appearances, an NCAA Final Four in 1998, three years with a No. 1 national ranking, four Pacific-10 Conference Championships and a .768 overall winning percentage.

He has developed a reputation as one of the top post player coaches in the country. Reveno recruited and coached numerous outstanding frontline players for the Cardinal including Mark Madsen, Jarron Collins, Jason Collins, Curtis Borchardt, Tim Young, Rob Little, Justin Davis and Matt Haryasz. He was also a prominent staff member at the nationally renowned Pete Newell Big Man Camp for six seasons. Seven players under Reveno's tutelage at Stanford went on to play in the NBA.

Described as a "fierce competitor" on the court, Reveno played in 116 games during his career at Stanford (1985-87, 89), including 30 games as a starter during his senior season in 1988-89. He was a two-time team captain and most inspirational player and averaged 9.4 points and 5.1 rebounds per game as a senior, helping the Cardinal to a 26-7 record, a 15-3 mark in the Pac-10, and a No. 12 national ranking. The Cardinal advanced to the NCAA Tournament, Stanford's first appearance in the tourney since the 1942 season.

After graduating from Stanford in 1989 with a degree in economics, he spent four years playing professional basketball in Japan. He returned to Stanford and obtained his masters degree in business administration in 1995. Prior to joining the Stanford coaching staff in 1997, he served as president for two years of Riekes Center in Menlo Park, a non-profit mentoring organization that works with athletes of all ages.

Reveno was born in Stanford, Calif. on March 12, 1966 and attended The Menlo School during his high school years. He and his wife, Amanda, have two children: Katie (11) and Andrew (8).
