SATURDAY'S GAME PREVIEW...

Heading to play in the Beehive State for the second time in the last four weeks, UNLV (2-8/1-5) takes on BYU (5-4) Saturday evening on ESPNU ... This marks the first meeting between the schools since the Cougars left the Mountain West Conference to become an Independent after the 2010 season ... Last time out, the Rebels fell at home to Air Force 48-21 while the Cougars enjoyed a bye ... UNLV is the fourth Mountain West team that BYU has played in 2014 ... UNLV has lost just two fumbles this season, which is tied for third in the nation. The Rebels tied a school record with five given away in 2013 and have averaged just 5.2 lost fumbles per year under head coach **Bobby Hauck** (26 in 61 games) ... UNLV rookie receiver **Devonte Boyd** out of Henderson's Basic HS now ranks second in the nation among all freshmen with 751 receiving yards. He needs five more receptions and 161 yards to break UNLV's single-season freshman records set by **Ryan Wolfe** (55 for 911) in 2006. Boyd has also tied the Rebel mark for 100-yard receiving games by a freshman with his three this fall (set by Wolfe in 2006 and **Carlos Baker** in 1995).

REBELS vs. COUGARS NOTES...

BYU leads the all-time series 15-3 and has won six straight over the Rebels ... UNLV, however, has fared relatively well in Provo, having won three of the nine games played in Utah ... Six of the last 11 games between these programs have been decided by 10 points or less ... The first-ever meeting between the Rebels and Cougars took place in Japan in 1978 and the 28-24 BYU win stands as the only regular-season game in UNLV history played in a neutral city ... BYU offensive coordinator **Robert Anae** was an assistant at UNLV in 1997-98 ... Rebel QB **Blake Decker** (Mesa, AZ), who has started all 10 games this fall but was knocked out of last week's contest, walked on at BYU and redshirted the 2009 season after high school before leaving on a church mission and then heading back to Arizona for junior college.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

(Nov. 6, 2010)
BYU 55, UNLV 7

PROVO, UT -- Jake Heaps threw for 294 yards and two touchdowns while BYU amassed 516 yards of total offense in a 55-7 rout of the Rebels in Provo. The Cougars jumped out to an early 14-0 lead and extended it to 38-0 by half, racking up the most points in a game all year in just two quarters of play. Brian Logan picked off Omar Clayton's pass on the first play from scrimmage, setting BYU up at the UNLV 41. The Rebel defense held tough, forcing a three and out in their first series of the day. Following UNLV's three and out, the Cougars started their second drive inside the Rebel 50, this time capping it off with a Joshua Quezada touchdown run from 13 yards out to go up 7-0. Quezada finished the game with 65 yards on 13 carries, scoring three times on the day. BYU would score on its four ensuing possessions, including an 11-play, 86-yard drive capped by Bryan Kariya's two-yard touchdown run. The Cougars rushed for 216 yards on the day, with JJ Di Luigi leading all runners with 80 yards on 19 attempts and adding a touchdown. Freshman Tim Cornett rushed for 47 yards on 13 carries and was one of only two Rebel rushers to gain positive yards in the game as UNLV ran for a season-low 22 yards. Cornett also became the first Rebel to lead the team in both rushing and receiving in a game this year after grabbing three catches for 26 yards.

DECKER WINS JOB

Blake Decker became the ninth different quarterback to start the opening game for UNLV in the last 11 seasons when he took the first snap at Arizona on Aug. 29. He responded by becoming the fifth Rebel signal caller in history to pass for at least 250 yards in a lid-lifter and only the second to do it on the road. He also led the team in rushing against the Wildcats with 56 net yards on 10 carries. Head coach Bobby Hauck announced August 15 that Decker had won the quarterback battle with veteran Nick Sherry and would become the first junior college transfer to start the season-opening game at quarterback for UNLV since Jason Vaughan (Middle Georgia College) led the Rebels to a 26-3 win at North Texas in John Robinson's coaching debut at the school on Sept. 2, 1999. Against NIU, Decker completed 24 of 42 attempts for 397 yards and two TDs. The passing total ranked 13th in school history and was the most yards tossed by a Rebel since 1997. A NJCAA Second Team All-American at Scottsdale Community College in 2013, Decker is a Mesa, Ariz., native who attended Mountain View High School. He threw for 4,241 yards and a stunning 47 touchdowns last season for the Fighting Artichokes. The former church missionary turned 24 years old on Sept. 28.

YOU SAY DEVANTE, I SAY DEVONTE...



Easily the deepest position on the UNLV team, the receiving corps showed up strong in the season opener as senior All-America candidate **Devante Davis** and true freshman **Devonte Boyd** (pictured) both finished with at least 100 yards receiving. Davis (100 yards) posted his eighth career century-mark effort on a game-high eight catches while Boyd, out of Basic High School in Henderson, NV, got to 102 yards on six grabs. That made him only the second freshman to have 100 yards receiving in his first game as a Rebel and the first to do it away from home. All-time leading UNLV receiver **Ryan Wolfe** was the first to do it when he piled up 160 yards vs. Idaho State in the 2006 season opener in Las Vegas. Another talented frosh, **Kendal Keys**, also contributed with 25 yards on three receptions.

BOYKO'S THE TOP PROSPECT (EH)

UNLV senior offensive lineman **Brett Boyko** on Sept. 14 was named the No. 1 eligible prospect for the 2015 Canadian Football League Draft in the league's official September rankings. Boyko (6-7, 310), a four-year starter at left tackle from Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, was a unanimous 2014 preseason All-Mountain West Conference selection and a member of the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List. He was also listed among the Top-10 NFL Talent in the league and "Best Pass Blocker" by Lindy's magazine. After joining the Rebels in 2010, he converted to the offensive line after having played quarterback and defensive line for St. Joseph's High School. The 2015 CFL Combine will be held in Toronto from March 27-29. The date of the 2015 CFL Draft has yet to be confirmed. The CFL Scouting Bureau releases its rankings three times each year: in September, January and April. The CFL's Scouting Bureau is comprised of CFL scouts, player personnel directors and general managers from the league's nine teams.

#REB BLOODED



Bobby Hauck, who was the winningest coach in Division I FCS, was hired as the 10th head coach in Rebel football history on Dec. 23, 2009.

Hauck (pronounced HOWK) immediately got to work building the UNLV program and guided his new school through some of the toughest schedules in program history. After UNLV posted a trio of two-win campaigns, all of Hauck & Co.'s hard work in Las Vegas last year produced a team that won more games than those first three seasons combined. In fact, the 2013 Rebels won five games in the Mountain West for the first time ever, hit the seven-victory mark for only the third time since 1984 and appeared in the postseason for the first time since 2000 when they played on New Year's Day in the Heart of Dallas Bowl.

Before coming to the desert, Hauck had spent seven seasons as the record-setting head coach of the University of Montana where he compiled an overall record of 80-17, including leading the Grizzlies to three national championship games in the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA). The winningest coach in Big Sky Conference history, Hauck earned at least a share of the league's title all seven years at Montana en route to compiling a record of 47-6.

Hauck, 50, was named Big Sky Coach of the Year in 2006, 2007 and 2009 and AFCA Regional FCS Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2009. He became the youngest head coach in modern Montana history when he was named to the post in 2002, and

record-setting success soon followed as he compiled four more conference championships than anyone else in Grizzly history. A veteran of nine bowl games, Hauck also brought tremendous experience from stints coaching in the Pac-10 and Big 12. Previous to taking over his alma mater, he spent four years at the University of Washington (1999-2002) where he coached defensive backs and special teams and was considered one of the top recruiters in college football. Before that he was at the University of Colorado for four seasons (1995-98) where he was the special teams and recruiting coordinator while also coaching the safeties.

Before joining the Buffaloes, Hauck coached the outside linebackers and handled recruiting duties for Northern Arizona University (1993-94). He served as a graduate assistant at UCLA in 1990-91 and in 1992 served as the Bruins' on-campus recruiting coordinator. Hauck began his collegiate coaching career as a volunteer assistant for Montana in 1988-89, working with the secondary and then the inside linebackers. A native of the Treasure State, Hauck was a three-sport star at Sweet Grass High School in Big Timber, MT., and went on to twice letter in track and field at the University of Montana. His first coaching position was in 1987 as an assistant at his prep alma mater before joining the collegiate ranks.

Hauck, born on June 14, 1964, earned his bachelor's degree from Montana in 1987 and master's from UCLA in 1991. He and his wife, Stacey, have four children: daughters Sydney, Alexandra and Elise and son Robby. His late father, Robert Hauck Sr., coached high school football in the state of Montana for three decades and his brother, Tim Hauck, played 13 seasons as a defensive back in the NFL and joined UNLV as defensive coordinator last year after spending the previous season on the coaching staff of the Cleveland Browns.

UNLV ranked second in the nation for most total receptions returning this season, as players who combined for 249 catches are back for the Rebels. In fact, UNLV lost only 50 of its 299 total catches from a year ago and 30 of those were by former running back **Tim Cornett**. Only 10 of the 299 receptions lost came by way of a receiver who graduated (**Jerry Rice Jr.**). That means 196 of the 206 catches from receivers are back (95.1 percent). UNLV ranks 13th in the FBS for overall returning receptions by percentage. UNLV also ranked seventh among all schools

in career returning receptions with 345, sixth in receiving yards with 4,428 and fifth in career TD receptions at 34.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAINS

Six players were voted UNLV's permanent team captains for the 2014 season, head coach **Bobby Hauck** announced before the season opener. After a vote by players, senior offensive lineman **Brett Boyko** (Saskatoon, Sask./St. Joseph HS), senior wide receiver **Devante Davis** (Galena Park, TX/North Shore HS) and senior tight end **Taylor Barnhill** (Rhome, TX/Justin NW HS) from the offense joined senior defensive back **Mike Horsey** (Baltimore, MD/Dunbar HS), junior safety **Peni Vea** (Kailua-Kona, HI/Kealakehe HS) and junior defensive lineman **Sonny Sanitoa** (Pago Pago, American Samoa/Samoana HS) from the defense in being elected to lead the team this fall.



PRO-REBEL FORCES

A total of five former Rebels are part of NFL rosters to start the season, including two -- Jacksonville Jaguars LB **John Lotulelei** and Washington Redskins WR **Jerry Rice Jr.** -- on Injured Reserve. Also, cornerback **Quinton Pointer** started the year with Tampa Bay before being let go. Frank "The Tank" **Summers**, who was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2009 and also spent time with the San Diego Chargers, worked his way back into the league last season and is the No. 1 fullback for the Buffalo Bills.

HIGGINS ON HELMET

UNLV is wearing two special stickers on the back of its helmets this season. A black circle with white lettering spelling "DOC" debuted to honor the memory of longtime and beloved team physician Dr. **Gerald Higgins**, who passed away in August at the age of 79. The other sticker is a red and clear representation of the official "Battle Born - Nevada Proud" logo celebrating the state's 150th anniversary of statehood. Another change to the uniform this fall came on the jerseys as UNLV is wearing names on the backs of its jerseys during the regular season (also did it in last year's bowl game appearance) for the first time since **John Robinson's** final outing as head coach on Nov. 20, 2004.



BORNAND TWICE EARNS MW WEEKLY HONOR

Sophomore LB/PK/P **Nicolai Bornand** (NEEK-oh-lye BOR-nand) was named Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on both Sept. 8 and Oct. 13. His first honor came after tying the school record for longest field goal, as his 54-yarder helped the Rebels down Northern Colorado 13-12. Bornand also kicked off six times, resulting in two touchbacks and two others that saw the Bears start drives at their own 17-yard line. On Oct. 10, Bornand contributed in three phases of the game to help UNLV upset Fresno State. Bornand's 46-yard field goal tied the game at 27 with 3:37 remaining in regulation and then his 33-yarder won it in overtime on the Rebels' first possession. Bornand also punted twice for a 44.5-yard average and kicked off six times, producing two touchbacks and saddling the Bulldogs with an average starting field position of their own 23-yard line. He is the first UNLV PK to win the award at least twice in the same season since **Sergio Aguayo** in 2005.



THE YOUNG-INS

UNLV saw a pair of true freshmen play in the 2014 season opener at Arizona: wide receivers **Devonte Boyd** and **Kendal Keys**. That's down significantly from a year ago when five true freshmen played in the 2013 opener, all on special teams. In addition, just three more redshirt freshmen made their Rebel debuts vs. the Wildcats: LB **Matt Lea**, DL **Antonio Zepeda** and OL **Kyle Saxelid**. Under **Bobby Hauck**, the Rebels played 14 (2010), 13 (2011), 7 (2012) and 11 (2013) before playing just those five total freshmen in the first game of the year. In addition to those players already mentioned, playing their first game for the Rebels in the opener were the following players: transfers DE **Josh Shirley** (Washington) and DT **Brandon Willis** (UCLA); JC transfers PK **Jonathan Leiva**, S **Blake Richmond**, QB **Blake Decker**, RB **George Naufahu**, DL **Najee Johnson**, LB **Ryan McAleenan**, and redshirt DL **Tuli Fakuho**; plus sophomore squad member OL **Patrick Carroll**.

FINNISH PRODUCTS

One category UNLV looks to be the all-time leader in among FBS teams is players from Finland. **Max Ehlert**, who started at linebacker as a senior last fall, signed with the Rebels two years ago out of Chabot College in Hayward, CA. A second Finn, freshman running back **Henri Jussila**, joined the squad in time for fall camp directly out of Finland last fall but then redshirted in 2013. He did spend the 2010 season playing American football at a high school in Utah. Both players competed for the Helsinki Roosters American Football club team back home and while it is difficult to track, the American Football International Review claims that only two Finnish players had previously earned a scholarship at this level. The University of Nebraska is credited with featuring the first native of Finland -- offensive lineman **Seppo Ewvaraye** -- to sign a letter of intent with an American FBS program in 2001.

STATES OF THE PROGRAM

From Hawaii to Florida, from Canada to Finland -- the 2014 Rebels come from hometowns spread across the globe. In fact, no less than 14 different states, two countries and one U.S. territory (American Samoa) are represented on this year's roster. While a vast majority of Rebels naturally hail from California (42) and Nevada (22), a state that continues to become even more fertile recruiting ground is Texas as currently 10 UNLV players are products of the Lone Star State. Meanwhile, nearby Arizona is home to no less than six current Rebels -- Florida, Maryland, New York, Oregon, South Carolina, Utah, Vermont and Washington are each represented. Las Vegas, of course, is nicknamed the "Ninth Island" by Hawaiians, which is one reason six players from that state are on this season's roster.

TRIPLE (OT) PLAY

After dropping its first four overtime games and seven of its first eight since the rule was instituted in 1996, UNLV has won three of its last four. That includes **Bobby Hauck's** first overtime win at UNLV on Oct. 10 when the Rebels broke a 10-game losing streak to Fresno State with a 30-27 triumph in the first extra

session. In 2008, the Rebels won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State. They became only the sixth team to ever win in overtime in consecutive games: Northwestern did it in 2004 and '07, Boston College (2006), TCU (2005), USF (2003) and San Diego State (1998).

KICKOFF KING

Senior wide receiver and Las Vegas native **Marcus Sullivan** is on target to leave UNLV as its career kickoff return average leader as he currently ranks first with 26.4 yards per attempt. While he technically did not make it into the NCAA stats due to missing the first four games of 2013 because of a personal issue, Sullivan's average of 28.3 yards per return on a team-leading 18 attempts a year ago ranked third in school history and 10th in the nation.

CANADIAN CREW

UNLV again sports a trio of Canadians on its roster as senior **Brett Boyko** is joined by sophomore **Tom Clarkson** along the Rebel offensive line and both block for former junior-college transfer running back **Shaquille Murray-Lawrence**. In 2011, Boyko became the first player to join the program from North of the Border since walk-on **Andrew Dubiellak** lettered as a receiver in 2000 and '01. Overall in 2014, there are 31 Canadians playing FBS football across the United States and 17 schools had one such



player on their active roster. Michigan State leads the way with four Canucks while UNLV, UConn and Wyoming each have three. Boyko, however, does have the distinction of being the only current player on the FBS level to attend high school in the province of Saskatchewan. Murray-Lawrence traveled south from Ontario to attend a pair of Texas JCs before signing with the Rebels last year and leading them in yards per rush with an eye-popping 8.9.

PLAYING AFTER THE POMP & CIRCUMSTANCE

There are a total of 10 players on the UNLV football team that have already graduated but are still eligible to play during the 2014 season. That number ranks seventh nationally as Alabama and Boston College lead the country with 15 graduates apiece who are eligible to play this season. There are also six more Rebels that are on track to graduate in December: WR **Devante Davis**, DB **Tajh Haddon**, DB **Mike Horsey**, OL **Andrew Oberg**, DB **Kenneth Penny** and WR **Marcus Sullivan**.

nic Furio in 2003, Roth is a versatile three-year letterwinner who has played up and down the line and is vying for the starting left guard spot as a senior. The native of Lake Forest, CA, graduated from El Toro High School in 2010. At UNLV, Roth has played in 35 games on offense and special teams. He also earned a spot on the 2013 Mountain West Academic All-Conference Team. The award, which debuted in 2002 and is voted on by the coaching staff and senior class, was created to honor one Rebel senior that best exemplifies the late Mr. Wiesner's courage, enthusiasm, dedication and toughness. A Wisconsin native and three-time letterman on the Badger football team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of the Las Vegas' leading businessmen, philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia.



PHILIPPI IS BATTLE BORN!

Head Coach **Bobby Hauck** began a new tradition at UNLV in 2010 with the introduction of the "Battle Born Jersey No. 36." In 1864, Nevada became the 36th state to enter the union, and the state's nickname, which appears on the state flag, is "Battle Born," reflecting the state's entry on the Union side during the American Civil War. Rebel Football Jersey No.

36 -- complete with a patch on the back of the state flag -- is worn annually by a Nevadan who best exemplifies the Battle Born spirit of his state and the toughness and pride of Rebel Football. The inaugural recipient was senior linebacker **Ronnie Paulo**, who turned in his No. 56 just before the season. In 2011, another senior LB from Las Vegas took over the honored number as **Nate Carter** switched from his usual 55. The next honoree was cornerback **Sidney Hodge** out of Palo Verde High School. Last year's award winner was senior **Alex Klorman**, who was the first defensive lineman to earn the honor. This year's honoree is sophomore linebacker **Marc Philippi**. Born and raised in Las Vegas, the graduate of national prep powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School redshirted his first season before earning his first letter in 2013. He is vying for starting spot among the LBs this fall. "I was excited when Coach Hauck told me about it," Philippi said. "I have a lot of respect for the guys who wore this jersey before me and I am going to work hard to play up to the standard that they set for this number."



REBELATIONS...

Redshirt freshman quarterback **Jared Lebowitz** made his collegiate debut in the third quarter last week when starter **Blake Decker** was knocked out of the game. He completed his first pass attempt as a Rebel, hitting TE **Taylor Barnhill** for six yards, but finished just 3 of 12 for 18 yards ... With two straight games vs. run heavy opponents, UNLV has only allowed a combined 161 passing yards the last two weeks. In fact, the five total yards passing by New Mexico on Nov. 1 marked the second-lowest such total ever by a UNLV opponent. The record is 0 yards through the air by Louisiana-Lafayette back in 1985 ... UNLV WR **Devonte Boyd**'s career-high 11 receptions vs. New Mexico tied six other Rebels for the fifth-most in a game ... The Rebels picked up their first 100-yard rusher of the season against the Lobos when **Shaquille Murray-Lawrence** finished with a career-high 125 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries ... UNLV QB **Blake Decker** already has seven 200-yard passing efforts in 10 career starts as a Rebel, which tied him **Jason Thomas** (2000-02) and current teammate **Nick Sherry** (2012-SA) for 10th place in UNLV history. Decker needs one more to move into eighth ... The Rebels saw two walkons make their collegiate debuts vs. the Lobos as WR **Rob Jameson** and PK **Brian McIntyre** both saw time. McIntyre, who filled in for injured kickoff man **Nico Bornand**, attempted a 55-yard field goal on the game's final play. The boot, which fell just short, would have been the longest field goal made in school history. McIntyre was assigned jersey No. 27 for the remainder of the season ... With last year's game reaching 20 degrees below zero with the wind chill at the Air Force Academy and temperature's reaching 81 degrees in Las Vegas on Nov. 8, this year's game between the Rebels and Falcons was 100 degrees warmer. ... Against the Falcons, UNLV took its first possession of the day 75 yards down field and scored on QB Decker's fifth rushing touchdown of the season. It marked the seventh time in the last 10 games that the Rebels scored on their opening drive (four touchdowns and three field goals) ... Junior **Sonny Sanitoa**'s 2.5 QB sacks this fall give him 9.5 for his career but this year's team lead is held by senior **Siuea Vaesau**, who is tied for ninth in the league with 4.0 sacks after 10 games. Vaesau also is tied with USU's **Devin Centers** for the conference lead with three fumble recoveries ... Against NIU on Sept. 13, UNLV trailed 28-5 early in the third quarter but stormed back to tie it at 34 with 9:18 remaining in the game. If the Rebels had won, it would have marked the biggest comeback in school history (23 points) ... NIU committed a chop-block in the end zone in the first quarter, which resulted in a safety for UNLV. It was the first two-pointer recorded for the Rebels since a ball was illegally batted out of the end zone by Wyoming on Nov. 29, 2003 ... With both offensive coordinator **Timm Rosenbach** and defensive coordinator **Tim Hauck** returning for their second season with UNLV, this marks the first time since 2010-11 that the Rebels will have the same coaches in the coordinator positions for two consecutive years. In fact, UNLV returns all nine assistant coaches this season. The only new member of the staff is in the weight room as former Washington, Cal and Weber State staffer **Eric Hohn** took over as the Rebels' strength & conditioning coach ... For the third straight year, UNLV offensive lineman **Robert Waterman** has been named to the official Watch List for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded each year to the nation's top college football center. Waterman headed into his final season as the Rebels' anchor in the middle after starting all 38 games of his career at center, a streak that tied for the sixth longest among active FBS linemen ... Waterman (pictured) also came into the season ranked seventh in the nation among OL with 2,679 career snaps played ... Among the 12 league teams, UNLV had the most offensive players named to the official MW preseason all-conference team announced at Media Day as Waterman, OT **Brett Boyko** and WR **Devante Davis** were all voted to the squad ... Since the Rebels first joined a league in 1982, they have never had more than one offensive lineman named first team all-conference. In fact, it's been a dozen years since UNLV had even one first-teamer up front (**Tony Terrell** in 2002). That could change this season as Boyko and Waterman both swept preseason honors from Lindy's, Athlon and Phil Steele's in addition to the official league team ... Two UNLV players were named to the official watch list for the new Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award: junior safety **Peni Vea** (pronounced "PENNY VAY-ah") and junior defensive lineman **Sonny Sanitoa** (SUN-e-TOW-ah) are both part of the 34-player list from 20 schools.



PRACTICE PALACE

One of college football's largest and most impressive areas of its kind, Bill "Wildcat Morris" Rebel Park has been transformed into an athletics showcase over the past decade. In 2010, a state-of-the-art UBU synthetic surface was installed at a cost of \$700,000, replacing an artificial surface originally installed in 2002 thanks to a \$1 million gift from the family of Ernie Becker Sr. The new surface and lighting system followed other donations secured since 1999, such as dozens of palm trees to line the fields and a desert garden built behind a Rebel Red archway welcoming fans, all of which have turned the park into one of the most aesthetically pleasing sports training facilities in the nation.

REBELS FALL TO WILDCATS IN SEASON OPENER

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Blake Decker threw for 252 yards and a touchdown in his debut for the Rebels, who lost to Arizona by the same score last season in Las Vegas.

Anu Solomon spent his freshman season learning Arizona's system while redshirting behind B.J. Denker, then emerged from a four-way battle to start this season's opener.

Coach Rich Rodriguez said Solomon wouldn't have to worry about looking over his shoulder if he makes a mistake, but added the other quarterbacks

would likely play this season, if not Friday.

Solomon, who's from Las Vegas, had a bit of trouble with his touch early, overthrowing a couple of long passes, including one to Samajie Grant that would have been a touchdown.

He finally dialed one late in the first quarter, dropping in a pass behind coverage for a 39-yard touchdown to Nate Phillips.

Solomon kept the big plays rolling after that, squeezing a ball in front of coverage to Grant, who turned it into a 63-yard touchdown pass. Solomon added a 13-yard scoring pass to Davonte' Neal that put Arizona up 24-6 at halftime.

Solomon opened the second half with the 92-yard catch-and-run TD to Hill and Jones-Grigsby was rewarded for his hard work with a 2-yard touchdown run that made it 38-13.

Solomon finished 25 of 44 and completed passes to 10 different players. Hill (110) and Grant (101) each went over 100 yards receiving.

Like Solomon, Decker won a close quarterback battle, edging out junior Nick Sherry after transferring from Scottsdale Community College.

Decker was able to gouge out a few big chunks in the first half, including a 52-yard pass to Devonte Boyd and a 49-yard run. The Rebels couldn't capitalize on the good field position, settling for a pair of field goals and a 43-yarder that Jonathan Leiva missed at the horn.

Decker hit Anthony Williams on a 2-yard score early in the third quarter to give UNLV its first touchdown of the season.

REBEL NOTES

• UNLV dropped its season opener for the fifth consecutive season and dropped to 22-25 all-time in lid-lifters.

• The Rebels lost for only the second time in nine all-time Friday games and are now 6-2-1.

• UNLV wore names on the backs of its jerseys for the first time in a regular-season game since John Robinson's final outing as head coach on Nov. 20, 2004.

• UNLV played in Tucson for only the second time and first time since 2001. It also opened a season against a team from the Pac-12 Conference for only the third time in history (1978 & 1986 at Washington State).

• The Rebels started Arizona native Blake Decker (Mesa) at quarterback. The 23-year-old junior college transfer (Scottsdale CC) became the ninth different QB to start a season-opener at UNLV in the last 11 years.

• UNLV freshman WR Devonte Boyd posted a 100-yard effort in his first game as a Rebel.

• UNLV boasted two different receivers with at least 100 yards in the same game for the first time since Davis (141) and Marcus Sullivan (113) did it vs. Hawaii on Oct. 12, 2013.

• The crowd of 50,102 at Arizona Stadium represented the 21st-largest attendance at a game involving UNLV.

• Davis posted his eighth career 100-yard game to move into a tie with Lenny Ware (1996-99) and Jim Sundusky (1981) for second all-time at the school behind record-holder Ryan Wolfe (12 from 2006-09).

REBELS HOLD OFF BEARS FOR FIRST WIN

LAS VEGAS (AP) -- George Naufahu ran 22 times for 90 yards and UNLV overcame four turnovers to beat Northern Colorado 13-12 Saturday night.

Mike Horsey's third-quarter interception - the first of the season for the Rebels - led to a 35-yard field goal by Jon Leiva with 22 seconds left in the period, giving UNLV (1-1) a 13-10 lead.

UNLV barely outgained the Bears, 332-327, with 211 yards coming from its rushing game.

Keith Whitley ran for 82 yards on 12 carries for the Rebels.

In just his second-ever start at the Division-I level, Blake Decker completed 11 of 18 passes for 121 yards, while throwing one touchdown and three interceptions.

Trailing by one with 5:45 left in the game, Northern Colorado's Seth Czapenski missed a 24-yard field goal.

UNLV opened the scoring with a 5-play, 64-yard drive on its first series, highlighted by a 48-yard pass from Decker to Devonte Boyd. Decker later found Marcus Sullivan over the middle for a 5-yard TD.

After crossing midfield and feeding off momentum, the Rebels committed their first turnover when they attempted a double-reverse trick play and receiver Sullivan's pass was intercepted by Courtney Hall, resulting in a Bears field goal.

Northern Colorado (0-1) tied it late in the third quarter, when Robert Holland rumbled in from three yards out at the 6:55 mark.

The Bears converted 2 of 12 third downs and crossed midfield just four times.

• UNLV got its first takeaway of the season in the third quarter when senior DB Mike Horsey got his second career interception. It led to a 35-yard field goal by Jonathan Leiva.

REBELS CAN'T COMPLETE RALLY, FALL TO HUSKIES

LAS VEGAS (AP) - Northern Illinois ran up more than 600 yards in total offense Saturday night, but the Huskies still needed to hold off a furious rally by UNLV to beat the Rebels 48-34 Saturday night.

The Huskies (3-0) held a 23-point lead in the third quarter before UNLV (1-2) scored three touchdowns and eventually tied the game 34-34 on a 9-yard scoring run by **Shaquille Murray-Lawrence** and a two-point conversion in the fourth period.

But Northern Illinois broke the tie quickly on its next drive, getting a 54-yard touchdown pass from **Drew Hare** to **DaRon Brown** to regain the lead, 41-34.

The Huskies gave themselves an additional cushion with an 80-yard scoring drive after safety **Marlon Moore** intercepted a pass by UNLV's **Blake Decker** in the end zone.

Decker led the Rebels with 397 yards passing, completing 24 of 42 passes for two touchdowns. UNLV had 499 yards of total offense.

The Rebels almost pulled off a comeback after scoring three times in the third quarter. A roughing-the-punter call on Northern Illinois gave UNLV new life when the Rebels were deep in their own territory, and they converted it into a 53-yard scoring pass from Decker to **Devante Davis**.

Davis finished with six catches for 150 yards and two touchdowns.

Rebels defensive end **Jordan Sparkman** recovered a fumble by Hare at the Northern Illinois 10-yard line, leading to a 2-yard touchdown run by Murray-Lawrence that pulled the Rebels to within five points, 31-26.

But the closest UNLV could get was the tie game. Northern Illinois appeared to take control of the game in the first half, scoring three times for a 21-5 lead and totaling 271 yards in total offense.

After UNLV scored first on a 25-yard field goal by **Jonathan Leiva**, Northern Illinois grabbed the lead with a 15-play, 76-yard drive that ended with Stingily scoring from five yards out with 7 minute 26 seconds left in the opening quarter.

UNLV cut its deficit to 7-5 late in the first quarter on a safety, but the Huskies ground out two 80-yard scoring drives in the second period to pull away.

Hare, who came off the bench the previous week to lead a 23-15 win over Northwestern, threw TD passes of 12 yards to **Keith Harris** and 10 yards to **Juwa Brescacin**.

REBEL NOTES

⇒ UNLV trailed 28-5 early in the third quarter but stormed back to tie it at 34 with 9:18 remaining in the game. If the Rebels had won, it would have marked the biggest comeback in school history (23 points).
⇒ NIU committed a chop-block in the end zone in the first quarter, which resulted in a safety for UNLV. It was the first two-pointer recorded for the Rebels since a ball was illegally batted out of the end zone by Wyoming on Nov. 29, 2003.
⇒ Senior tailback Shaquille Murray-Lawrence, who did not appear in the first two games of the season, made his first career start at running back. He ran for 60 net yards on a career-high 17 carries (previous high was 10 last year) and had two touchdown runs (2 and 9).
⇒ Senior WR/KR Marcus Sullivan missed the game after leaving last week with a leg injury. Sophomore Keith Whitely took over and returned three kicks for an average of 27.7, including a 38-yarder on the first play of the game.
⇒ Devante Davis's made a big move up the UNLV record books Saturday. His two touchdown receptions gave him 20 in his career, which moved him into a tie for fourth place at the school. He also recorded his ninth career 100-yard day, which ranks second in UNLV history. Davis also moved up three spots to No. 5 on the all-time receiving yards list with his six catches for 150 yards. His career total is now 2,454 yards.

AZTECS RUSH PAST REBELS IN SAN DIEGO

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Donnel Pumphrey had 22 carries for 167 yards and four touchdowns and San Diego State defeated UNLV 34-17 in the Mountain West Conference opener for both teams on Saturday night. Pumphrey scored three of his touchdowns in the second quarter as the Aztecs (2-2, 1-0) surged ahead to lead 28-10 at halftime. He also broke away on a 71-yard score on San Diego State's second drive in the first quarter.

Quinn Kaehler finished with 209 yards on 16-of-27 passing and Larry Clark had 71 yards on 4 receptions

for the Aztecs. Donny Hageman kicked field goals of 24 and 31 yards to cap two time-consuming drives in the fourth quarter.

Blake Decker threw for 346 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions for UNLV (1-4, 0-1). His 2-yard rushing score made it 31-17 with 10:47 remaining, but the Rebels couldn't pull any closer.

UNLV freshman Devonte Boyd caught his first career touchdown pass as Decker connected with the Basic High School grad on a 44-yard score to give the Rebels a 10-7 lead in the first quarter. Boyd finished with a game-high 86 yards on four catches in the game.

Fellow freshman receiver Kendal Keys made his first start for the Rebels in his hometown of San Diego, CA. Keys finished with one catch for 38 yards.

Sophomore Tau Lotulelei led the Rebels on defense, finishing with eight total tackles. Defensive lineman Sonny Sanitua recorded his first sack of the season in the game.

UNLV CAPTURES OVERTIME VICTORY ON HOMECOMING

LAS VEGAS (AP) - Nicolai Bornand made a 33-yard field goal in overtime, lifting UNLV to a 30-27 victory over Fresno State on Friday night in a game of missed opportunities for both teams.

Bornand also made a 46-yard field goal to tie it at 27 with 3:37 left in the regulation as UNLV ended a 10-game losing streak to Fresno State.

The Rebels (2-5, 1-2 Mountain West) had a chance to win on the last play in regulation, but short kicker

Jonathan Leiva missed a 26-yard field goal from the left hash wide right.

In overtime, the Bulldogs (3-4, 2-1) did not score on their opening drive. Brian Burrell found Marteze Waller in stride in the right side of the end zone, but Waller dropped it on the fourth-down play from the 18-yard line.

Burrell connected on 25 of 44 for 302 yards, three touchdowns, and two interceptions as Fresno State's three-game winning streak ended. Josh Harper had 183 yards receiving.

UNLV's Blake Decker finished 29 of 40 for 332 yards, a touchdown, and an interception.

After building a 17-0 advantage, the Rebels' next six drives ended in five punts, and a failed fake-punt attempt. On the seventh drive, Decker's four-yard run up the middle gave the Rebels temporary breathing room, 24-14 with 2 seconds left in the third.

The Bulldogs took the lead as Burrell passed to a wide-open Chad Olsen with 13:47 left in the game, and Waller's 13-yard rush through the middle on a 4th-and-inches with 7:21 to go gave the Bulldogs their first lead, 27-24. Fresno kicker Kody Kroening however missed the extra point after the touchdown.

The Rebels' previous win this season came against Colorado State, 13-12 on Sept. 6. In all other games, UNLV was outscored 220-88. Meanwhile, Fresno State outscored opponents in its last three games 115-53.

This was the Bulldogs' first game against UNLV at Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas since 1996. However, Fresno State did play in the 2013 Royal Purple Bowl, losing to USC 45-20.

REBEL NOTES

• UNLV broke a four-game losing streak by upsetting Fresno State 30-27 in overtime in what was the first meeting between the two programs in Las Vegas since 1996.

• The victory snapped the Rebels' 10-game losing streak against the Bulldogs, which dated back to 1985 and was the second-longest such streak in school history against any opponent (11 to Utah from 1980-2009).

• UNLV improved to 4-8 all-time in overtime games but has won three of its last four such finals. This was only the second overtime game under head coach Bobby Hauck at UNLV (triple-OT vs. Minnesota on Aug. 30, 2012). It also marked only the second OT win by UNLV against a conference opponent, joining the 49-48 thriller over Wyoming on Nov. 2, 2002.

• The Rebels improved to 7-2-1 all-time on Fridays and 16-12-1 in all non-Saturday games.

• UNLV improved to 24-23 all-time in its Homecoming games.

• Sophomore LB/PK/P Nicolai Bornand won the game with a 33-yard field goal after Fresno State turned the ball over on downs. Bornand also made a 46-yard field goal in the fourth quarter. He improved to 4 of 6 in field-goal attempts this season while sharing duties with Jonathan Leiva.

• UNLV QB Blake Decker completed 29 passes (40 attempts), which marked a career-high for him as a Rebel. He completed at least one throw to nine different teammates, led by freshman Devonte Boyd's seven for 77 yards.

Teriyon Gipson put the Lobos (3-5, 1-3 Mountain West) ahead with 1:22 left in the game, as he scampered untouched up the middle from three yards out.

UNLV (2-7, 1-4) was led by running back **Shaquille Murray-Lawrence's** 125 yards rushing and two touchdowns, while quarterback **Blake Decker** completed 28 of 44 pass attempts for 271 yards.

The Lobos were led on offense by **Jhurell Pressley**, who ran for 138 yards on 20 carries and three touchdowns. New Mexico freshman quarterback **Lamar Jordan** finished with a passer rating of 34.6, after completing just 2 of 7 pass attempts. New Mexico's previous season-low for yards passing was in its previous game, at Air Force, where Jordan and **Cole Gautsche** combined to throw for 33 yards. Jordan now has two fourth-quarter game-winning drives to his credit.

UNLV, looking like an entirely different team than the squad that opened the contest and trailed 17-7 at halftime, came out in the third quarter and marched downfield to cut the gap to three, driving 77 yards in 10 plays, as Murray-Lawrence scored from 1 yard out with 11:46 left in the quarter.

After holding the Lobos on their first possession of the second half, the Rebels went 95 yards in 13 plays, capped by Murray-Lawrence's second rushing score of the day, to give the Rebels their first lead of the day at the 5:49 mark in the third.

New Mexico capitalized on **Isaiah Brown's** first-career interception, as he returned it 43 yards to put the Lobos in great field position at UNLV's 4. Pressley bullied his way into the end zone on the next play, as the Lobos took a 24-21 lead with 12:05 left. The Rebels answered with a 12-play, 85-yard drive, **Keith Whitley** pummeling his way in from the 3 giving UNLV a 28-24 lead with 8:28 remaining.

UNLV outgained the Lobos, 485-306, but the Rebels committed three critical turnovers -- two interceptions and a fumble.

REBEL NOTES

• UNLV freshman WR **Devonte Boyd** had a career-high 11 catches for 108 yards, which marked his second consecutive 100-yard game and the third of his career.

• UNLV senior RB **Shaquille Murray-Lawrence** became the first 100-yard rusher for the Rebels this season, finishing with a career-high 125 yards on 20 carries and two touchdowns. It was his first 100-yard game since the 2013 season opener at Minnesota.

• UNLV senior DB **Mike Horsey** doubled his career-high with 14 total tackles, which included 3.5 TFL.

• Walkon place-kicker **Brian McIntyre** saw his first action as a Rebel, kicking off in place of injured PK **Nico Bornand** and then attempting to tie the game as time expired on a 55-yard field goal attempt that fell just short. The 55-yarder would have not only sent the game into overtime but it also would have marked the longest in school history.

• Also making his collegiate debut was redshirt sophomore WR **Rob Jameson**, a walkon from Mojave High School in Las Vegas who formerly was a team manager in 2012. He played on special teams and at wide receiver.

FALCONS SOAR PAST REBELS

LAS VEGAS (AP) -- Air Force (7-2, 3-2 Mountain West) scored on eight of its 13 drives to power past UNLV (2-8, 1-5) 48-21 on Saturday. The Falcons' high-powered rushing game led an offensive charge that saw them outgain UNLV 542-339 with 386 yards coming on the ground.

It was the second consecutive week the Rebels fell to a run-heavy offense after New Mexico rushed for 301 yards on 61 carries last week, and went to the air just seven times. This time, it was **Kale Pearson** completing 5 of 6 for 115 yards and a touchdown while he also ran for 67 yards on 15 carries and another score.

UNLV scored on the game's first possession, moving 75 yards in 13 plays in a little more than five minutes, capped by **Blake Decker's** 11-yard touchdown scramble.

Air Force, meanwhile, used its highly potent triple-option attack to trudge through UNLV's defense, methodically grinding out scores on all four of its first-half drives, other than kneeling out to end the first half. After a 39-yard field goal by **Will Conant** got the Falcons on the board, they forced the Rebels to punt and then drove 62 yards in nine plays for their first touchdown to take a 10-7 lead when **D.J. Johnson** rumbled in from 8 yards out, with 49 seconds left in the first quarter.

After forcing another UNLV punt, the Falcons consumed 6:35 and went 78 yards in 17 plays, culminating with Pearson's 1-yard plunge to extend to 17-7. The Rebels failed to produce after a substantial drive that last 10 plays, and the Falcons wasted no time as Pearson found a wide open **Jale Robinette** over the middle for a catch-and-run that went 59 yards and gave Air Force a 24-7 lead.

UNLV cut the Falcons' lead to 24-14 on its next drive with 2:14 left in the half, but Air Force wasn't finished. After **Jon Lee's** spectacular kick return put the Falcons near midfield, they moved quickly over six plays, driving 55 yards for their fourth TD of the half to move ahead 31-14.

Air Force opened the second half with a quick scoring drive, moving 67 yards in just four plays and spanning 1:12, to go ahead of the Rebels, 38-14. The Rebels appeared to have a bit of momentum on their side after driving into Falcons territory, but stalled after **Devonte Boyd's** outstanding circus catch was ruled out of the end zone on fourth down. UNLV got another chance when it recovered Air Force's fumble at the Falcons' 3-yard line, and two plays later **Shaquille Murray-Lawrence** plunged in from a yard out to draw the Rebels closer 38-21.

Freshman **Jared Lebowitz** replaced **Decker** and looked a bit out of sync in his first-ever appearance for the Rebels, completing just 1 of 3 pass attempts as UNLV was forced to punt on a three-and-out series. The Falcons' rushing assault on UNLV's stop unit continued, as Owens' 55-yard run sparked another scoring drive, this time a 33-yard field goal by **Will Conant**.

Decker was 18 of 32 for 263 yards and a touchdown for UNLV before getting knocked out of the game.

Wide receiver **Devante Davis** finished with 114 yards, six receptions and a touchdown. It was the 10th 100-yard receiving game of his career.

REBEL NOTES

• Air Force's 48-21 victory was its first over UNLV since 2011 and first in Las Vegas since 2010.

• With last year's game reaching 20 degrees below zero with the wind chill at the Air Force Academy and temperature's reaching 81 degrees in Las Vegas, today's game between the Rebels and Falcons was 100 degrees warmer.

• UNLV senior **Devante Davis**, who was injured in Game Three and missed a total of five games, started at a wide receiver spot and made an immediate impact. He caught a four-yard touchdown in the second quarter to give him 21 for his career, which moved him into a tie with Sam "Disco Kid" Greene for third place in Rebel history.
