# USD Toreros (16-14) play host to BYU Cougars (20-10) on Saturday at 1:00 p.m. (TWCSN tv)

**GAME #31:** The San Diego Toreros (16-14, 7-10 WCC) close out their regular-season slate this Saturday, March 1st, against the BYU Cougars (20-10, 12-5 WCC). Tip-off is scheduled for 1:03 p.m. at the Jenny Craig Pavilion (5,100 capacity).

**SERIES RECORD:** This is the 10th meeting between USD and BYU with the Cougars owning a 7-2 series lead... BYU won back on January 4th, 87-53 (Chris Sarbaugh, 10 points)... The Cougars received a career-high 28 points from Skyler Halford... USD had won the previous two meetings (72-69 at WCC Tournament, March 8, 2013; 74-68 at JCP, Feb. 7, 2013)... **Johnny Dee** (25 points) and **Christopher Anderson** (16 points) led the team to victory in Las Vegas, while Dee paced the Toreros with 19 points in the home victory.

**RADIO-TV:** All USD home and away games will be broadcast live on ESPN 1700AM with Andy Masur (7th season) bringing you all the action; his pre-game shows air 15 minutes prior to tip-off. The contest is the WCC Game of the Week and will be televised by Time Warner Cable SportsNet (Steve Quis and Jon Crispin), and also air on CSN California, ROOT Sports NW, ROOT RM, and TheW.tv (everywhere).

WEST COAST CONFERENCE STANDINGS (thru Feb. 22nd): Gonzaga (13-3 WCC, 23-6), BYU (12-5, 20-10), San Francisco (11-5, 18-10), Saint Mary's College (10-6, 20-9), Pepperdine (8-8, 15-13), Portland (7-9, 15-13), San Diego (7-10, 16-14), Pacific (5-11, 14-13), Santa Clara (5-11, 12-17), Loyola Marymount (3-13, 11-17).

**BILL GRIER (7TH YEAR):** Coach **Bill Grier (Oregon**, 1990) is in his seventh season at the helm of the USD program... He enters the BYU game with a 16-14 record, and the team's 7-1 mark thru the first eight games was only matched by the 2000-01 Torero team since San Diego joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1979-80... Coach Grier owns six of USD's seven program wins over top-25 programs, and his recent win over No. 22 Gonzaga was his 100th career victory... Last year's squad finished 16-18 overall and advanced to the semifinals of the WCC Tournament where they just missed out on advancing to the title game... The Toreros were playing their best basketball down the stretch highlighted by two wins over BYU... The 2011-12 team finished 13-18, winning 4 of its final 6 regular-season WCC games before falling to BYU by just 5 points in WCC quarterfinals... The 2010-11 season was highlighted by a 74-66 home win over #23 Saint Mary's, along with a 67-64 win over Utah... The 2009-10 season was highlighted by wins over Stanford, #25 Oklahoma, Houston and Boise State... His 2008-09 campaign (16-16) was highlighted by road wins over Oregon and Mississippi State... In his rookie year (2007-08) he guided the Toreros to an overall mark of 22-14 and 3rd place finish in the WCC race at 11-3... He guided the Toreros to three wins and the championship title at the WCC Tournament with wins over Pepperdine, Saint Mary's and No. 20 Gonzaga... The Toreros then upset No. 15 UCONN in the NCAA Tourney opener with a 70-69 overtime victory, before falling to Western Kentucky in the second round... His 11 WCC wins were the second most for league wins in a single season in program history... Grier is USD's 11th head coach overall and just the 4th head coach since the Torero program moved to the NCAA Division I ranks in 1979-80... His 22 wins in 2007-08 were also the most by a Torero coach in his first season at USD. In addition to knocking off Kentucky on the road, 81-72, the Toreros earned three wins over Top-25 teams: #21 Saint Mary's, #20 Gonzaga and #15 Connecticut... Bill and his wife, Nicole, have two daughters, Giselle & Ashley.

### UNIVERSITY OF SAN DIEGO TORERO MEN'S BASKETBALL TIDBITS:

- ♦ Saturday's game is Senior Day for three Toreros... It is a Torero Tradition to recognize them in a pre-game ceremony with family members guard **Michael "MJ" Marconi** (Tustin, Calif.), guard **Mike Davis** (Houston, TX) and forward **Dennis Kramer** (Encinitas, Calif)... Kramer is the lone 4-year player and enters Saturday with the following career numbers 122 games (80 starts), 323-646 overall shooting (50.0%), 809 points, 482 rebounds and 95 blocked shots.
- ♦ A win over BYU guarantees USD a first round bye in the upcoming WCC Tournament... A Torero loss would mean that Portland would need to drop both games (@ SMC on Thur., @ Pacific Sat.).
- ♦ Last Saturday's win over No. 22 Gonzaga was USD's seventh over a top-25 program, and head coach **Bill Grier** owns six of them... The win was also Grier's 100th career victory in seven seasons.
- ♦ The Toreros continue to lead the WCC in scoring defense (64.1 ppg) and rank second in overall field goal percentage defense (.423).
- ♦ The Toreros are back in action at the JCP where they own a record of 9-6 and three Toreros are averaging in double-digit scoring **Johnny Dee** (16.1 ppg), **Duda Sanadze** (14.3 ppg), **Dennis Kramer** (12.1 ppg)... As a team USD averages 68.6 ppg while limiting its opponents to 62.8 points.
- ♦ Junior guard **Johnny Dee** continues to rank 3rd in the WCC in scoring (17.0 ppg) for all games... He was recognized by the San Diego Hall of Champions as an amateur star of the month for January, as well as a Capital One District VIII Academic All-American (3.41 GPA, Finance)... With 1,448 career points, he ranks #5 all-time among USD scorers and needs just 6 points to pass by #4 Nick Lewis (1,453 points; 2001-06)... He also has a legitimate shot at the school record for points scored in three seasons (#3 Stan Washington with 1,472 points, 1971-74)... He owns a school-record 243 career makes beyond the three-point arc, and this season ranks 14th in the nation in 3-point accuracy (.436; 84x192) ... He continues to lead the WCC in free throw accuracy (.938, 105-112) and ranks 2nd in the nation... Earlier this season he converted a school record 47 straight free throws, and his current streak is up to 22 straight makes.
- ♦ Junior point guard **Christopher Anderson** continues to lead the WCC in assists (5.9 apg) and ranks 20th in the nation... He is second all-time among Toreros in this department with 521... He is 5 dishes away from setting a new all-time Torero mark of 526... He is also 2nd all-time at USD with 185 career steals, and needs 15 more to set a new all-time mark of 200... Both of the current all-time marks (525 assists & 199 steals) are held by Brandon Johnson.
- ♦ Sophomore center **Jito Kok** leads the Toreros in blocked shots with 53 (1.8 blocks per game, 3rd in WCC)... Against Pacific (Feb. 1st) he matched his career-high of 5 blocks he had set at Portland (Jan. 25th)... Last year as a freshman Kok tied the USD single season mark with 55 blocked shots... He needs just 3 more blocks to set a new USD single season mark of 56, and now owns 108 career blocks school record for career blocks is 189 (Scott Thompson, 1983-87).
- ♦ Sophomore guard **Duda Sanadze** ranks second on the team in scoring at 13.3 ppg (17th in WCC)... He tallied back-to-back 15 point outings off the bench in recent wins over Portland and Gonzaga... His 23 point effort against Santa Clara was two points off his season-best (25 @ SCU)... He has scored in double figures 22 times with four contests of 20 or more points.
- ♦ USD's top four scorers account for 76.0% of the team's scoring (1,527 of 2,008 points) **Johnny Dee** (17.0 ppg, 511 points), **Duda Sanadze** (13.3 ppg, 385 points), **Dennis Kramer** (11.5 ppg, 345 points) and **Christopher Anderson** (9.5 ppg, 286 points).
- ♦ Over the past five games in which USD has gone 3-2, the Toreros have been paced in scoring by **Johnny Dee** (16.4 ppg), **Duda Sanadze** (15.8 ppg) and **Dennis Kramer** (9.6 ppg, 6.6 rpg)... As a team during this stretch USD is averaging 64.0 ppg/31.2 rpg, and giving up 63.6 ppg/30.2 rpg.

**SCOUTING THE BYU COUGARS:** The BYU Cougars (20-10, 12-5) come to town riding a three-game winning streak and having won seven of their past eight games... The recent three wins came against Saint Mary's (60-57), Gonzaga (73-65) and Portland (89-72)... With the win over Portland last Saturday, BYU has now reached 20 wins for the ninth-

consecutive season... Junior guard Matt Carlino came off the bench to score 30 points (made 8 threes) in win over Portland and was named WCC player of the week after averaging 22.5 ppg in the two wins over the Pilots and Gonzaga... Junior guard Tyler Haws continues to lead the WCC in scoring (23.3 ppg) where he ranks fourth in the nation... He has scored 25 or more points in 11 contests this season... Haws is followed by Carlino (14.1 ppg), guard Kyle Collinsworth (13.7 ppg) and forward Eric Mika (12.2 ppg)... Forward Nate Austin leads the team in rebounding (8.2 rpg)...The Cougars lead the WCC (third nationally) in scoring (82.2 ppg) and have tallied four games of 100 or more points... Head Coach Dave Rose is in his 9th season at the helm of the BYU Cougars program (229-76).

**TRIO OFRETURNING STARTERS EXPECTED TO KEY SUCCESS:** The Toreros will be in good hands with the return of three starters who played a key role in USD's late season success a year ago. The junior backcourt tandem of **Johnny Dee** and **Christopher Anderson**, both All-WCC honorable mention picks, return with two years of starting experience. Dee led the team in scoring at 15.0 points per game while Anderson once again led the squad in assists (5.7 per game) and steals (2.1 per game) while ranking third in scoring at 9.4 points. Senior forward **Dennis Kramer** started 21 of 32 games last year with averages of 4.2 points and 2.7 rebounds.

**JITO KOK TIES USD SEASON RECORD FOR BLOCKED SHOTS:** Sophomore center **Jito Kok** will also play a huge role for the Toreros at both ends of the floor. Last year he averaged 3.2 points and 3.2 rebounds. He tied the school record for blocked shots in a season, and his 55 blocks also led all players in the West Coast Conference.

**DAVIS OUT INDEFINITELY WITH BROKEN HAND:** Mike Davis, a 6'2" senior guard from Houston, Texas, sustained fractures to his right hand that required surgery prior to official practices. Davis is out indefinitely. This past season Davis appeared in 24 games and averaged 6.2 points and 1.6 rebounds. In a road game at Saint Mary's on January 24th, 2013 he sustained a knee injury late in the game and would eventually miss nine straight WCC games before returning to USD's last regular season game against Pepperdine on March 2nd. He would go on to play in all three WCC Tournament games totaling 7 points against Pepperdine, and 6 points against BYU and Saint Mary's.

TWO NEW RECRUITS EXPECTED TO HELPIMMEDIATELY: The Toreros are counting on two of their three newcomers to play key mintues and make an impact this season - junior guard Chris Sarbaugh (Spokane, WA) and freshman forward Brett Bailey (Spokane, WA). The third newcomer, 6-7 transfer Brandon Perry (Fresno, CA) will have to sit out the year after transferring from Cal State Northridge. This past season Sarbaugh helped North Idaho College to a 26-5 record while averaging 7.6 points, 4.6 rebounds and 3.8 assists. Bailey averaged 23.0 points and 8.1 rebounds while leading University High School back to the state playoffs for the second straight year. Perry averaged 6.3 points and 3.5 rebounds while ranking second on the team in blocked shots with 19.

**SINIS BEGINS PROFESSIONAL CAREER EARLY:** John Sinis (Patras, Greece) decided to begin his career as a professional basketball player early. Sinis, who had two years of eligibility left with the Toreros, joined AGO Rethimno, a team ranked 4th in last year's Greek First Basketball League. This past season Sinis appeared in 33 games with one start (Montana) and averaged 4.1 points and 2.5 rebounds. He converted 39.8 percent of his overall shot attempts (47-118), 35.7 percent from three-point range (25-70) and 68.0 percent from the free throw line (17-25). He reached double digit scoring three times with a personal high of 13 points against Santa Clara. During his freshman campaign he appeared in all 31 games and averaged 4.0 points and 2.8 rebounds.

**TRIO OF SENIORS WILL BE MISSED:** The Toreros lost three seniors from last year's squad and their play and leadership will be missed - forward **Ken Rancifer** (10.2 ppg & 3.7 rpg), center **Chris Manresa** (9.0 ppg & 7.1 rpg) and guard **Cameron Miles** (4.9 ppg). Rancifer is playing for El Massagno, in Switzerland's first division. Manresa has begun a professional career in Germany's Pro A Division, playing for Cuxhaven Bascats. Miles tried out for the NBA Developmental League's Bakersfield Jam.

### 2013-14 WCC PRESEASON **COACHES POLL:**

For the second consecutive year the USD men's basketball team has been picked to finish in 5th place in the West Coast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll. Gonzaga received 8 of a possible 10 first place votes and 80 points to earn the top pick to win the league title in 2013-14. They were followed by BYU (72 points, 1 vote), Saint Mary's (66 points, 1 vote), San Francisco (51 points), San Diego (50 points), Loyola Marymount (44 points), Pacific (28 points), Santa Clara (25 points), Portland (24 points) and Pepperdine (10 points).

## Toreros sign Marcus Harris to NLI

(Nov. 24, 2013) University of San Diego men's basketball head coach Bill Grier and his staff are excited to announce that Marcus Harris has signed a national letter of intent and scholarship agreement for the upcoming 2014-15 school year. Harris is a 5'11", 155 lb. point from San Antonio, Texas. He is currently in his senior year at MacArthur High School where he plays for coach Mark Murphy. He is expected to play both guard positions for the Toreros.

"I think we got a steal in Marcus...a guy that was a little under the radar," said head coach Bill Grier. "He has good quickness and athleticism, yet has the ability to shoot the ball from deep range. He is good playing out of a pick and roll and will be tough for teams to guard. He can get to the rim but you can't play off of him because he shoots it so well." This past season as a junior Harris averaged 21.1 points per game, 4.2 assists with the team finishing 21-12. He was selected 1st Team 5A All-District and All-Region. Heading into this season he was ranked the No. 30 senior in the state of Texas for the Class of 2014. "I felt like I was at home when I was there," said Marcus Harris, who visited USD this past September. "I felt they'd take care of me the next four years. I'm glad to be part of the USD family." Through seven games this season with the team off to a 5-2 start, Harris is averaging 24 points, 6 rebounds, and 4.1 assists. He opened the season with a 30-point effort in a 76-68 victory, including 5-of-9 shooting in three-point attempts.

### **USD TORERO RECAPS (GAMES 26-30)**

GAME #30 (FEB. 22) TOREROS UPSET #22 GONZAGA 69-66: The USD Toreros upset No. 22 Gonzaga by the score of 69-66 before 4,126 fans at the JCP and before a national ESPN audience. The win was USD's third straight as they improved to 16-14 overall and 7-10 in the WCC standings. USD was paced by junior guard Johnny Dee (16 points) and sophomore guard Duda Sanadze off the bench with 15 points. First place Gonzaga dropped their second straight league contest and see their record go to 23-6 (13-3). In the first half the Toreros got out of the gates slowly falling behind 10-2. Two free throws by Simi Fajemisin knotted the score at 19-all with 12:12 to go. A Gary Bell three put the Zags up by five (24-19) a few minutes later, but the Toreros battled and stayed close the rest of the way and actually didn't take their first lead of the game until two ticks were left in the half as Christopher Anderson buried a three-pointer for the 36-34 intermission lead. Halftime scoring leaders were Dee (9 points) for USD and Bell (11 points) for the Zags. The second half was a different story as the Toreros opened up with a 13-4 run for a 49-38 lead as the USD run was capped off by a Sanadze three. Although USD would hold onto the lead the rest of the way, the Zags rallied to get within three points four more times with the last coming with 19 seconds to go on a David Stockton lay-up. Duda Sanadze made the second of two free throws for a 67-63 advantage with three ticks left. Stockton added a three-pointer with two seconds to pull within 67-66, but Sanadze was immediately fouled on the inbounds play and iced the game with two free throws. For the game the Toreros got a lot big minutes from a lot of players as Dennis Kramer chipped in with 9 points and 7 rebounds. Jito Kok added 9 points and 5 rebounds. Christopher Anderson tallied 7 points, 6 assists and 4 steals. And Thomas Jacobs and Simi Fajemisin each added 5 points. Gonzaga was paced by Sam Dower (18 points, 15 rebounds) and Przemek Karnowski (17 points).

GAME #29 (FEB. 20) TOREROS HOLD OFF PORTLAND 61-59: The USD Toreros earned a big 61-59 home win over the visiting Portland Pilots to improve their season mark to 15-14 and up their league record to 6-10 with two regular-season games to go. Johnny Dee and Duda Sanadze led the way with 15 points each, and for the second straight game the bench played a key role as they outscored Portland's reserves 26-2. In the first half the Toreros got off to a slow start as they found themselves down 20-10 at the 12:51 mark. From there USD responded with a 14-3 run to take their first lead at 24-23 with 5:57 to go on two free throws from Sanadze. Dee and Christopher Anderson each had 8 points by the intermission break with the Toreros up 35-31. In the second half both teams got off to slow starts with the first bucket coming from UP's Thomas van der Mars at 17:06. The score would stay 35-33 USD until a Dee three with 14:50 to go and then both teams improved offensively from there. Portland would regain the lead at 52-51 on a Ryan Nicholas jumper and extend it to four points (56-52) with 2:33 left in the game. Two buckets from Sanadze and four straight made free throws from Dee gave the Toreros a 60-56 margin with 27 ticks left and from there the Toreros would hold on for the two-point victory. Anderson followed Dee and Sanadze in the scoring column with 9 points. Simi Fajemisin chipped in with 5 points and 4 rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

GAME #28 (FEB. 15) TORERO BENCH LEADS WAY PAST PACIFIC 70-55: Propelled by a big first half that saw USD take a 44-23 intermission lead, the Toreros came away with a big 70-55 victory over the Pacific Tigers. USD received a huge lift from the bench as the reserves contributed 29 points. Johnny Dee scored a game-high 19 points, but the Torero bench, led by reserve Nick Kerr (12 points), was the key as they outscored Pacific's reserves, 29-12. Pacific came into the game averaging 76.1 points per game and the Toreros were able to hold them to a season-low 55 points. In the first half guard Kerr came off the bench to hit 4-of-5 threes to help USD to a commanding 44-23 intermission lead. With Duda Sanadze out of the lineup (ankle), freshman Brett Bailey started and helped USD jump out to a solid start as he scored 6 of the team's first 10 points. In addition to some excellent team defense, the Toreros received some additional solid play off the bench Thomas Jacobs (4 points, 4 rebounds) and Simi Fajemisin. Pacific opened with an 8-0 run to start the second half to pull within 44-31, but the Toreros answered with their own 11-0 run to go up 55-31. In the run Christopher Anderson buried two threes and Dee added a bucket and trey. From there the Toreros were able to maintain a double-digit lead the rest of the way. Anderson, who was held scoreless two nights ago at Saint Mary's, almost pulled off a rare triple double as he finished with 10 points, 10 rebounds and 9 assists. Pacific (14-11, 5-9 WCC) was paced by Tony Gill (16 points) and Sama Taku (15 points).

GAME #27 (FEB. 13) SAINT MARY'S HOLDS OFF TOREROS 69-57: Despite a career-night by senior forward Dennis Kramer with 25 points, the Toreros dropped a hard-fought 69-57 contest to the Saint Mary's Gaels. Johnny Dee followed with 14 points to move him into the No. 5 all-time scoring spot among Toreros. His three from the right corner for his 12th point of the night moved him past Bob Bartholomew, and he was set up on the play by Christopher Anderson's 500th career assist. Dee now has 1,398 career points. Saint Mary's received a team-high 21 points from guard James Walker III, with other double-digit games coming from Stephen Holt (13 points) and Kerry Carter (12). The Toreros did a nice job defensively on center Brad Waldow holding him to just 6 points. For USD Duda Sanadze also reached double-digits with 10 points, and the Toreros held a 24-23 advantage in rebounding. The Toreros shot 51.2 percent from the field, and a solid 76.9% from the free throw line, but ended up with 13 turnovers to just 7 for the Gaels. The Gaels held a slim 35-34 intermission lead as James Walker III converted the second of two free throws with two ticks left for the one point advantage. In the second half the Toreros battled back to take a 45-40 lead on a Kramer bucket at the 15:00 minute mark. A Simi Fajemisin basket with 12:13 to go kept the Toreros on top 49-47, but from there USD wouldn't see their next points until 7:49 to go on a Jito Kok basket. During that 4:24 stretch the Gaels outscored the Toreros 11-2 to take a 58-49 lead. With 5:47 to go a Dee lay-in pulled USD to within 60-55, but from there SMC closed with a 9-2 run over the final 5:11.

**GAME #26 (FEB. 8) TOREROS FALL TO SCU BRONCOS 69-63:** Junior guard **Duda Sanadze** scored 23 points and **Johnny Dee** added 18 points, but it wasn't enough to get past the visiting Santa Clara Broncos who came away with a 69-63 victory at the JCP. Sanadze almost matched his season high of 25 points he set in the 69-66 road win at Santa Clara earlier this season. The Broncos made 10-of-20 three-pointers and guards Brandon Clark (23 points) and Jared Brownridge (17 points) practically matched USD's scoring leaders. With the loss the Toreros even up their season record at 13-all while the Broncos move up to 11-15. The Broncos took a slim 35-34 lead into the locker room at halftime with Dee and SCU's Clark each leading the way with 13 points. In the second half the contest was close the entire way. With 4:06 to **Dennis Kramer** hit his first bucket of the game to pull within 58-56, but Broncos' guard Nate Kratch connected on a three-pointer from the top of the key and the closest USD would get from there is four points. For the game USD struggled in the shooting department - 37.7% from the field (20-53), 4-of-12 beyond the arc and just 19-of-30 from the free throw line. Besides making 10-of-20 threes, the Broncos cashed in on 13-of-17 free throws. SCU held a 39-34 rebounding edge and totaled 16 offensive boards. For USD **Christopher Anderson** chipped in with 11 points, 7 rebounds, 8 assists and 4 steals.

### **USD TORERO RECAPS (GAMES 21-25)**

GAME #25 (FEB. 6) TOREROS COME UP SHORT AGAINST USF DONS 74-67: The USD Toreros dropped a hard-fought 74-67 decision to the USF Dons at the JCP on Thursday night. Down 34-30 at the half, the Toreros rallied to take a 10 point lead midway through the second half, but the Dons made the plays down the stretch to pull out the win. USD's Johnny Dee scored a team-high 18 points and with four made three-pointers became the program's all-time leader with 232 makes. The USF Dons (15-9, 8-4 WCC) received a game-high 21 points from senior forward Cole Dickerson. Dee was followed in the double-digit scoring column by Duda Sanadze (15 points), Christopher Anderson (13 points, 6 assists) and Dennis Kramer (11 points, 9 rebounds). For the visitors, Dickerson was backed up by Avry Holmes (15 points), Kruize Pinkins (14 points, 11 rebounds) and Tim Derksen (13 points). USF shot 50% from the field (29-58) and out-rebounded the Toreros 38-35. USD shot 42.1% from the floor and were just 8-of-26 from downtown. With 13:33 to go in the game two Johnny Dee free throws put the Toreros ahead 44-43. Over the next four minutes the Toreros (13-12, 4-8 WCC) outscored the Dons 12-3 with Dee capping off the run with a three-pointer at the 9:22 mark. USF's Derksen answered right away with a three of his own and that would begin a Dons run over the next 4½ minutes that would put the game in a 58-58 tie. An old fashioned three-point play by Anderson put the Toreros ahead 61-58 with 4:05 to go, but it was all USF from there as they outscored USD 16-6 to close out the game.

GAME #24 (FEB. 1) TOREROS FALL TO PACIFIC 84-67: The USD Toreros saw their two-game winning streak come to an abrupt end as the visiting Pacific Tigers dealt them a 84-67 loss. San Diego, which was coming off an impressive home win over Saint Mary's, jumped out to an early 12-0 lead, but it was all Pacific (12-9, 3-7 WCC) from there as the WCC's newest member earned its first league road win. Senior Dennis Kramer paced the Toreros (13-11, 4-7 WCC) with a game-high 19 points to go with 8 rebounds. In the 12-0 start to the game, Kramer scored 7 of the points with his three-pointer at the 17:09 mark giving USD its largest lead of the game. Over the next five minutes of play the Tigers answered with a 16-6 run to get back in the game. A Duda Sanadze three and Thomas Jacobs bucket would give the Toreros a 26-16 advantage, but over the final 9 minutes of the half the Tigers would outscore the Toreros by 20 points and lead 50-40 at the break. Pacific continued its solid play to start the second half as they opened on a 15-5 run and the closest USD would get is 13 points (65-52) with 9:47 left on a Dee three-pointer. Following Kramer in the scoring column was Johnny Dee (17 points) and Sanadze (15 points). Pacific shot 54.7% from the field for the game and canned 8-of-15 threes; USD shot 50.0% and converted 11-of-21 three-pointers. Pacific cashed in on 18-of-21 free throws while the Toreros struggled (14-26).

GAME #23 (JAN. 30) TOREROS SHUT DOWN SMC GAELS 61-43: The USD Toreros, playing their first home game since January 11th, turned in arguably their best defensive effort of the season in shutting down the Saint Mary's Gaels, 61-43. The Toreros held SMC to season-lows of 43 points and 25% shooting from the field. USD was led by Johnny Dee (17 points) and 14 points each from Dennis Kramer and Duda Sanadze. In the first half the Toreros were sparked by 12 points from Sanadze as they went into the locker room ahead, 29-18. Sanadze was matched by Gaels' center Brad Waldow with 12 points who scored most of his on inside power moves. Sanadze made both of his three-point attempts in the half as USD converted 4-of-8 threes. In the second half Christopher Anderson buried a three and Kramer added two free throws as USD jumped ahead 34-18. The closest SMC (16-6, 6-3 WCC) would get is 12 points (44-32). From there Dee hit a three and Chris Sarbaugh scored 5 straight points and USD would cruise to victory. Johnny Dee missed his first free throw attempt of the game to see his school record streak end at 47. Saint Mary's was paced by Waldow (18 points, 9 rebounds), while USD's top rebounders were Kramer (8) and Jito Kok (7 rebounds, 3 blocked shots).

GAME #22 (JAN. 25) TOREROS RALLY TO DEFEAT PILOTS 65-63: Junior guard Johnny Dee finished with a team-high 21 points as the Toreros earned a hard-fought 65-63 over the Portland Pilots. Dee calmly sank two free throws with 7.4 seconds to go to give the Toreros a 65-61 advantage to make UP's lay-up at the end of the game a non-factor. Dee extended his streak of consecutive made free throws to 47. The win improved USD's record to 12-10 on the season (3-6 WCC). The host Pilots, who were led by Kevin Bailey (21 points), fall to 12-9 and 4-5 WCC. Torero senior forward Dennis Kramer also had a big game as he notched a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds. In the first half the Pilots held a 42-41 advantage on the strength of 14 points from junior guard Kevin Bailey as he made two threes and was 4-of-6 from the field. USD was led by senior Dennis Kramer who tallied 10 points while Johnny Dee and Duda Sanadze each chipped in with 8 points. Despite converting 60% from the field (15-25), the Toreros didn't help their cause with 10 turnovers after having totaled single digits in that department the previous two games. A Dee bucket followed by a three-pointer out of the halftime break gave USD a 46-42 lead early. Behind Dee's 11 points in the first 6:20 of the second half the Toreros bolted to a 54-45 advantage. During the opening run Dee buried all three of his shots from beyond the three-point arc. The Pilots rallied to get within 56-55, but the Toreros responded with a Thomas Jacobs free throw and back-to-back baskets from Kramer to edge ahead by six again. The Toreros would never give up the lead in the 2nd half despite the Pilots getting within one point on four different occasions. Jito Kok totaled a new career-high with 5 blocks with four of them coming in the final 20 minutes of action.

GAME #21 (JAN. 23) TOREROS UPSET BID COMES UPSHORT AT #21 GONZAGA: The Toreros (11-10, 2-6) came up just short at Gonzaga, falling 59-56 to the No. 21 Bulldogs (17-3, 7-1)... Junior Christopher Anderson had a chance to tie it up with four seconds left, but his three-point attempt fell short. Johnny Dee was nearly perfect for the Toreros. The junior guard scored a game-high 26 points on 8-of-10 shooting and was perfect for the free-throw line (7-of-7) and from three (3-of-3). Senior Dennis Kramer chipped in ten points to go with his seven rebounds. The Toreros were able to open up a five-point advantage midway through the first half, but the Zags responded with a 17-0 run and never relinquished the lead. The Toreros remained in striking distance throughout the second half, and were able to tie the game at 55-55 with 5:55 left. However, they could only score one more point as the Zags held on to stay undefeated at home on the season. Sam Dower, who registered a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds for the Zags.

### **USD TORERO RECAPS (GAMES 16-20)**

GAME #20 (JAN. 18) TOREROS FALL TO USF DONS 64-62: The host USF Dons held on for a 64-62 home win over the visiting Toreros in a WCC contest at Memorial Gymnasium. USF guard Avry Holmes canned the game-winning jumper from the right side with 0.5 seconds left in the game to break the 62-all tie. After a timeout USD attempted to inbounds the ball to Johnny Dee for a final shot at around the half court area, but the play failed. Holmes finished with a team-high 15 points, while USD was paced by Johnny Dee with 16 points. Holmes played a key role in the final minute of play. After Dee made two free throws to pull USD to within 60-59 at the 1:01 mark, Holmes scored with 27 seconds left for a 62-59 advantage. He just beat the shot clock buzzer after some tough Torero defense. Christopher Anderson answered with a bucket inside to get USD within one again at 62-61. USF called for a timeout and on the inbounds play Thomas Jacobs stole the ball and was fouled. He made the first of two free throws to knot the score, but Holmes followed with a step-back jumper from the right wing for the game-winner just before the buzzer. For the game Dee was followed by Anderson with 15 points and Duda Sanadze with 11. Chris Sarbaugh chipped in with 12 points. USD made 8-of-18 threes, but converted just 21-of-49 overall. For USF the Dons also got a big lift from Kruize Pinkins with 14 points and 11 rebounds. The game was tied at 36-all at half.

GAME #19 (JAN. 16) TOREROS RALLY TO BEAT SANTA CLARA 69-66: Sophomore guard Duda Sanadze scored a careerhigh 25 points, including two free throws with five seconds left to help seal a hard-fought road win over the Santa Clara Broncos. Santa Clara's Evan Roquemore got off a desperation three from just past the half court line but it fell way short. The win improves USD's record to 11-8 on the year and improves their WCC mark to 2-4. Late in the game Dennis Kramer made a huge three-pointer from the top of the key with 2:35 to go that gave USD a 67-60 lead. A Brandon Clark lay-in following a Sarbaugh missed free throw cut the deficit to 67-64 with 40 ticks left. The Broncos fouled Sanadze with 19.1 seconds left and he missed the front end of a 1-on-1. Santa Clara called timeout with 13.1 seconds to go, and then the Torero defense made the Broncos call another one with 7.5 seconds left. Preventing a potential SCU three-pointer, Jito Kok fouled Jared Brownridge with 5.6 left who would convert both charities to pull within one at 67-66. SCU immediately fouled Sanadze who calmly made both for a 69-66 lead. That led to the final score as SCU's long three before the final buzzer was on line but short and Brett Bailey grabbed it. For the game USD shot 53.3 percent from the floor (24-45) and 58.3% from three-point range (7-12).

GAME #18 (JAN. 11) PEPPERDINE WAVES HOLD OFF TOREROS 69-65: In a hard-fought WCC contest, the visiting Pepperdine Waves (11-7, 4-2 WCC) came out on top against the Toreros, 69-65. Waves' sophomore forward Stacy Davis had a big night for Pepperdine finishing with 28 points and 10 rebounds, including a perfect 11-of-11 from the free throw line. USD was paced by senior Dennis Kramer with 17 points, but turnovers and free throw shooting played a key role why the Toreros came up a little short. In the second half Pepperdine scored the first bucket to make it 38-30, but the Toreros went on a 12-4 run over the next 4:10 to knot the score at 42-all as Kok scored two buckets, Dee and Kramer hit threes, and Duda Sanadze scored. A Sarbaugh bucket at the 11:48 mark gave USD its first lead of the second half (50-49), and five minutes later another Sarbaugh basket gave the Toreros a 59-51 lead with 6:51 to go. A three-point play by Davis sparked Pepperdine's rally in the closing six minutes and a Brendan Lane dunk with 2:56 to go put the Waves back on top, 64-63. After Christopher Anderson made both free throws for a 65-64 lead (1:36 mark), Lane put them ahead for good with another dunk with 39 seconds left (66-65). Pepperdine would close the deal for the 69-65 victory. Kramer was followed in the scoring column by Sanadze (14 points), Sarbaugh (career-best 12 points) and Dee (11 points). Dee moved into the #10 all-time Torero scoring with 1,244 points.

GAME #17 (JAN. 9) USD RALLIES TO DEFEAT LMU 74-67: The USD Toreros, on the strength of a very solid second half, earned a 74-67 victory over the Loyola Marymount Lions before 2,605 fans on Military Appreciation Night. The win snapped a three-game skid and improved USD's overall record to 10-7 and 1-3 in league. Sophomore guard Duda Sanadze (22 points) and Christopher Anderson (20 points) led the way as the Toreros rallied from a 28-25 intermission deficit. Senior forward Dennis Kramer also reached double-digit scoring with 14 points. Following a first half that saw the Toreros struggle to 38.5% shooting, the Toreros came out over the final 20 minutes to convert 14-of-28 (50%). USD also finished with a 37-23 rebounding edge, and also finished with a very solid 79.3% from the free throw line (23-29). USD's leading scorer, Johnny Dee, was limited to just 3 minutes of action in the second half and 20 for the game as he was battling an illness that came on in the late afternoon – he finished with 3 points on just 4 attempts. An Anderson layup with 16:02 to go in the game gave USD a 34-33 lead that they would not relinquish the rest of the way. Despite USD never losing the lead in the second half, LMU continued to battle and stay close, pulling to within 52-51 on an Evan Payne three-pointer with 6:54 to go. An old-fashioned three-point play and lay-in by Sanadze gave USD a 57-51 lead with 6:16 left. LMU (10-7, 2-3 WCC) would get within 57-54 on an Anthony Ireland basket, but from there the closest they would get is five points. USD extended their advantage to 11 points twice, the last coming at 70-59 with 34 ticks left before settling for the final 74-67 margin.

GAME #16 (JAN. 4) BYU RUNS PAST TOREROS: The BYU Cougars snapped their four-game skid with an 87-53 win over the USD Toreros at the Marriott Center. Junior guard Skyler Halford, making his first start of the season for BYU, sparked the Cougars (8-8, 2-1 WCC) with a career-high 28 points. Fifteen of his points came in the first half when BYU jumped out to a 41-23 advantage. Halford made 11-of-16 shots overall and 4-of-8 threes before leaving the game for good with 6:50 to go. San Diego (9-7, 0-3 WCC) was paced by Chris Sarbaugh with a season-high 10 points. He was followed by Dennis Kramer (9 points), Johnny Dee (8 points). The 34 point loss is USD's worst since losing to this same squad two seasons ago at the Marriott Center, 88-52 (Dec. 31, 2011). Two areas the Toreros struggled in was shooting (20-58, 34%) and rebounding. BYU finished with a dominating 45-27 advantage in the rebounding department. On the other hand, BYU shot a solid 53% from the field (31-58) and knocked down 8-of-17 threes. Halford was followed in the scoring column by Tyler Haws (17 points). BYU held a 41-23 halftime lead behind 15 points from Halford. In the second half BYU got off to another solid start with a 14-3 run to take a 55-26 advantage and pretty much put their stamp on the eventual outcome.

### **USD TORERO RECAPS (GAMES 11-15)**

GAME #15 (DEC. 30) TOREROS FALL TO LMU LIONS 65-62: The Toreros (9-6, 0-2) dropped a heartbreaker 65-62 on the road to LMU (10-4, 2-0) Monday. Down by three, senior Dennis Kramer had a chance to tie the game with seven seconds left, but his three-pointer just missed. Fueled by a 10-0 run late in the second half, the Lions opened up a 61-54 lead with just over three minutes remaining. The Toreros rallied to close the deficit to one with 44 seconds remaining, but that would be as close as they would get. Johnny Dee led all scorers with 28 points on 11-of-17 shooting. Christopher Anderson dished out 12 assists and Duda Sanadze, who came off the bench for the first time this season, chipped in 18 points. Dee and Kramer combined to score the first 11 points to give the Toreros an early 11-4 lead. However, the Lions, who knocked off BYU on Saturday, put together an 8-0 run to give the game its first tie at 18-18 with 7:12 remaining. Fueled by a combined 22 first half points from Dee and Sanadze, the Toreros took a 32-28 lead into the locker room at halftime. The Toreros held on to their lead until the 8:51 mark when the Lions' Ben Dickinson knocked down a jumper to give LMU a 49-48 edge. Shortly after the Lions would go on their decisive 10-0 run and the Toreros never saw the lead again. LMU had four players score in double figures and were led by Evan Payne's 16 points. Anthony Ireland chipped in ten points and had eight assists. The Toreros shot 46.2 percent from the field (24-of-52), 47.6 percent from three-point range on 11-21 shooting, and outrebounded the Lions 32-28.

GAME #14 (DEC. 28) TOREROS DROP WCC OPENER TO WAVES 75-64: The USD Toreros (9-5, 0-1 WCC) dropped a 75-64 decision to the Pepperdine Waves on Saturday. Johnny Dee paced the Toreros with a game-high 26 points (10-19 shooting, 4-6 threes) while Dennis Kramer chipped in with 13 points and 8 rebounds. Pepperdine (8-5, 1-0) received a career-high 20 points from Malcolm Brooks, while Brendan Lane (18 points) scored 16 second half points to help hold off the Torero rally. Stacy Davis added a double-double (11 points, 10 rebounds) and freshman guard Jeremy Major tossed in 13 points to go with 7 rebounds. The Toreros earned their first lead of the game at 53-52 on a lay-in by Christopher Anderson with 11:39 left in the game. That capped off a 13-4 Torero run over a three minute stretch after Pepperdine led 48-40. With just under eight minutes left a Dennis Kramer three knotted the score at 58-all, but from there the Waves went on a 10-0 run capped off by an old-fashioned three-point play by Lane for a 68-58 advantage. Dee ended the run with a three-pointer from the left corner with 4½ minutes to go, and another Dee three made it 69-64 at the 3:25 mark. Unfortunately USD would not score from there. For the game USD shot 41.1% from the field (23-56), but were a little better from beyond the three-point arc (7-16, 43.8%). USD outrebounded Pepperdine 37-31, but the Waves committed just 8 turnovers to USD's 14. Jito Kok had 4 blocked shots in the first 20 minutes, matching his career-high.

GAME #13 (DEC. 21) TOREROS BEAT SOUTHERN UTAH 67-52: The USD Toreros closed out their nonconference slate with a 9-4 record after its 67-52 home win over the Southern Utah Thunderbirds. Johnny Dee scored a game-high 16 points along with a season-best 7 rebounds, and Christopher Anderson did a little bit of everything with 12 points, 4 rebounds, 6 assists and 5 steals. Dennis Kramer rounded out the double-digit scoring with 15 points and 8 rebounds. Both teams came out of the gates slowly with the first basket coming at the 17:24 mark by Jayson Cheesman of SUU. After a Simi Fajemisin free throw knotted the score at 12-all with 10:13 left, the Toreros used a 12-0 run over the next six minutes to take control of the game. Chris Sarbaugh and Anderson each chipped in 4 points during the run and the Toreros never looked back. USD would hold a 33-22 intermission lead as they converted 12-of-23 shots over the first 20 minutes. In the second half the USD would extend their lead to as many as 27 points three times, the last coming at the 10:05 mark on two Brett Bailey free throws for a 57-30 advantage. Give credit to the Thunderbirds (1-8) as they kept fighting and would use three three-pointers over the final two minutes of action to get within the final score of 67-52. SUU received a team-high 14 points from Eric Rippetoe off the bench, along with 13 points from A.J. Hess. For the game USD shot 51.2% from the field (21-41), and 22-of-30 free throws (73.3%).

GAME #12 (DEC. 15) TOREROS FALL TO UC SANTA BARBARA 72-61: The Toreros were dealt a 72-61 loss by the UC Santa Barbara Gauchos (5-3). Despite getting 19 points from **Duda Sanadze**, 18 points from **Johnny Dee** and a double-double from **Dennis Kramer** (17 points, 11 rebounds), USD (8-4) dropped its third straight game to UCSB in their series. In the first half UCSB's leading scorer Alan Williams (26 points per game) picked up two quick fouls and sat on the bench the rest of way seeing just three minutes without scoring. Unfortunately the Toreros were not able to capitalize as they had numerous open looks but the ball just didn't go down in the first half as the Gauchos held a 34-30 intermission lead. **Duda Sanadze** (14 points) and **Dennis Kramer** (8 points, 6 rebounds) helped keep the Toreros close. In the second half the Toreros held a one point lead on three different occasions, the last coming at 47-46 on a **Johnny Dee** jumper with 9:39. After a Sam Beeler free throw knotted the score at 47-all, the Gauchos would go on a 16-1 run over the next 7:17 for a commanding 63-48 lead with 2:22 left. The closest the Toreros would get from their was the final 11-point difference in the game as freshman **Brett Bailey** buried a three just before the buzzer. For the game USD out rebounded the Gauchos 36-28 with Kramer leading the way with his 11 caroms. Santa Barbara converted 17-of-25 free throws while USD struggled by making just 5-of-12 attempts. UCSB made 9-of-20 threes (45%) while USD converted just 8-of-26. UCSB was paced by guard Michael Bryson who scored a game-high 21 points, including 5-of-7 shooting from beyond the arc.

**GAME #11 (DEC. 10) TOREROS DEAL PACIFICA 84-47 LOSS:** Behind 21 points and 13 rebounds from senior forward **Dennis Kramer** the Toreros dealt Pacifica College an 84-47 loss to improve to 8-3 on the season. Junior guard **Johnny Dee** chipped in with 16 points and all thirteen Toreros that saw action ended up in the scoring column. Kramer's 13 rebounds was a new career-high while his 21 points was one point shy of his career-best set against Portland. Pacifica College played a strong first half in staying within eleven points at 42-31. By the intermission break Kramer already had a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds, and Dee had totaled 13 points. The Gladiators were paced by John Garnica's 12 points in the first 20 minutes of action as he buried 4-of-7 three-pointers. In the second half the Torero defense, which ranks in the top-25 in field goal percentage defense and three-point percentage defense, held Pacifica to 20% shooting from the field (6-30) and just 1-of-10 from beyond the arc. For the game Pacifica shot just 29.8% overall (17-57), while the Toreros managed an even 50% (35-70). USD also dominated in the rebounding department with a 59-22 edge. Junior center **Simi Fajemisin** chipped in with a career-best 10 rebounds and 4 blocked shots, while **Brett Bailey** added 6 points and 5 rebounds.

### USD TORERO RECAPS (GAMES 6-10)

GAME #10 (DEC. 5TH) SAN DIEGO DROPS HEARTBREAKER IN CITY CHAMPIONSHIP: The USD Toreros put forth a great effort against the 24th-ranked Aztecs in the 2013 City Championship, but came up just short in falling 65-64 before a sellout crowd at the JCP last Thursday. Despite a career-high 22 points from Christopher Anderson and 21 points from Johnny Dee, it wasn't enough. Sophomore guard Duda Sanadze (12 points) made a brilliant defensive effort at the end of the game to allow the Toreros a game-winning shot, but his three-pointer at the buzzer was just off the mark. The USD defense held the Aztecs to 36.2 percent shooting from the field (21-58), but the difference in the game was in rebounding and second chance points. SDSU outrebounded USD 44-29 with 19 of their caroms coming on the offensive end of the floor. The Aztecs also outscored the Toreros 29-2 in second chance points. SDSU was paced by Xavier Thames (17 points) and Josh Davis (10 points, 15 rebounds). The game was tied 32-all at the intermission break, but SDSU would eventually pull away to a 57-47 advantage with 6:34 to go in the game. USD rallied back over the next five minutes to get within one at 61-60 on a three-pointer from Dee. Dee scored 8 points during that run and Anderson helped in the cause by making four free throws. Over the final twelve seconds of the game, Xavier Thames made four free throws, and Duda Sanadze and Christopher Anderson each converted both of their charity attempts. A hustle play by Sanadze that tied up an Aztec with a jump ball gave USD one more chance with about three seconds left in the game. USD got the ball to Sanadze over on the right wing but his three-point attempt was just off the mark at the buzzer.

GAME #9 (NOV. 30TH) SAN DIEGO COMES UPSHORT IN 73-66 CONTEST AT NEW MEXICO: Despite 25 points from Johnny Dee and 18 points from Duda Sanadze, the USD men's basketball team (7-2) just could not hold on, as New Mexico (5-1) rallied past the Toreros to claim a 73-66 win at The Pit. USD's offense was paced by Dee with his 25 points on 8-of-17 shooting from the field, including hitting four three-pointers. Sanadze scored his 18 points on 7-of-16 shooting from the field, including hitting four three-pointers. Jito Kok chipped in with nine points, while Christopher Anderson had seven points and dished out 12 assists. As a team, USD shot 40.3% from the field, and was outrebounded 40-26. In the first half, San Diego managed to lead for a majority of the frame, but the Lobos closed out the frame on a 8-3 run to take a two-point lead into the locker room, up 32-30. In the second half, UNM's lead would be short lived, as a Sanadze 3-pointer jump started the Torero offense, and USD went on a 9-1 run over a span of three minutes to give USD a 6-point edge with 14:37 to go. The Toreros would then manage to remain in front over the course of the next four minutes, until a Cameron Bairstow jumper gave the Lobos back the lead at 49-48 with 9:18 to play. After the Lobos built up a six-point lead with 7:19 to go, a Sanadze 3-pointer sparked an 8-2 Torero run to tie the score up at 56-all with 4:41 to go. USD would tie the score up one more time at 61-all on a Dee 3-pointer with 2:07 to go, however, New Mexico would regain the lead for good on a pair of Kendall Williams free throws as they held on to claim a 73-66 win over USD.

GAME#8 (NOV. 27TH) TOREROS WIN UGLY IN 59-56 VICTORY OVER SOUTHERN ILLINOIS: The Toreros scraped out a 59-56 win over Southern Illinois in the Gulf Coast Showcase to win their final two games in the three-day tournament to improve their season record to 7-1. Junior guard Johnny Dee finished with a team-high 17 points, including a key three-pointer in the second half, and Christopher Anderson matched his career-high of 16 points with all of them coming in the final 20 minutes. USD shot a season-low 29.3 percent from the field, but made up for it with solid rebounding (40-29 edge) and clutch free throw shooting (26-32). Unlike their great start against UNCG the previous day, the Toreros opened the game with a Dennis Kramer bucket, then immediately gave up 8 straight points to the Salukis. The Toreros would trail until the 5:48 mark when freshman Brett Bailey buried his first collegiate three-pointer from the right wing to give the Toreros a 17-15 edge. SIU scored the final four points of the half to take a 23-20 lead into the locker room. The 2nd half was a different story as the junior tandem of Anderson and Dee combined to score 30 of the team's 39 points. Nine of Anderson's 16 points came on the free throw line where he only missed one opportunity. Dee cashed in on 8-of-8 free throw shooting over the final 20 minutes, and his second made trey with 2:58 to go broke a 50-all tie. From there USD would not surrender the lead as the team made their final six free throws to hold off the Salukis. SIU closed to within one point three times in the closing moments, but Anderson, Kramer and Dee were all perfect on their two free throw attempts.

GAME #7 (NOV. 26TH) SAN DIEGO DEALS UNCG 83-71 SETBACK: The Toreros, coming off a tough 74-70 loss on Monday, responded with a great team effort in dealing the UNCG Spartans a 83-71 defeat at the Gulf Coast Showcase. Sophomore guard Duda Sanadze scored a team-high 20 points as all five Torero starters reached double-digits. He was joined by Christopher Anderson (career-high 16), Johnny Dee (15), Jito Kok (12) and Dennis Kramer (10). The Toreros outscored the Spartans 44-30 in the paint, and also held in the edge in points off of turnovers (19-10), and 2nd chance points (13-9). USD opened the game on a 13-2 run behind eight points from Sandaze. UNCG pulled to within one point at 28-27 on a three-pointer from RJ White with 7:32 to go, but USD would hold a 45-38 intermission lead. After the break UNCG closed the gap to 48-46 on a Spain layup with 16:33 left. Sanadze answered with a bucket for a four-point cushion and the closest UNCG would get the rest of the way is three points (58-55) with 12:36 to go. Over the final eleven minutes Jito Kok got free for four inside buckets, including three dunks on his way to matching his career-best. USD would make 10-of-12 free throws over the final 3:11, including 7-of-8 by Anderson. For the game USD shot 53.8% from the field (28-52) and 74.2% from the free throw line (23-31). The Toreros also outrebounded the Spartans, 31-27, with Kramer leading the way with 7.

GAME #6 (NOV. 25TH) TOREROS FALL TO ILLINOIS-CHICAGO 74-70: The USD Toreros were dealt their first loss of the season with its 74-70 loss to Illinois-Chicago in the first round of the Gulf Coast Showcase. Despite receiving a game-high 19 points from junior guard Johnny Dee, the Toreros came up short down the stretch in a closely contested game. USD also received double-digit outings from Duda Sanadze (14), Christopher Anderson (13) and Dennis Kramer (13). The biggest margin in the game either way came in the first half with UIC holding a 7-point edge at 13-6. UIC held a 33-31 halftime advantage. In the 2nd half the Toreros battled back to take 3-point leads on two different occasions, the last coming at 50-47 on a three by Dee with 10:40 to. USD's last lead of the game came at 52-51 with 9:53 left, but the Flames would hold the lead the rest of the way in improving to 2-3 on the season. USD was outrebounded 40-34, and were outshot 41.5% to 38.2%. Kramer led the squad with 8 rebounds. UIC was paced Jake Wiegand (11 points, 10 rebounds).

### **USD TORERO RECAPS (GAMES 1-5)**

GAME #5 (NOV, 21ST) TOREROS IMPROVE TO 5-0 WITH 82-46 WIN OVER SAN DIEGO CHRISTIAN: The USD Toreros improved to 5-0 on the season with its 82-46 win over visiting San Diego Christian. San Diego received a career-best double-double from junior Thomas Jacobs off the bench with 14 points and 13 rebounds. He was followed in the scoring column by sophomore guard Duda Sanadze (12 points, 3 steals), junior guard Johnny Dee (11 poionts) and sophomore center Jito Kok (10 points). The five wins out of the gate ties USD's NCAA Division I mark set back in 1990-91. The all-time program record is the 8-0 start from the 1976-77 squad at the NCAA Division II level. The SDCC Hawks, playing their third game in three nights, came out with a lot of energy and took the early lead at 6-5 on a Derek Dickerson basket. It was still close with 13:13 left in the first half at 18-14 Toreros, before USD went on a 13-0 run over the next 5 ½ half minutes to take control of the game at 31-14. USD would hold a 47-20 intermission lead and did not allow the Hawks to make any kind of run over the final 20 minutes of action. Junior center Simi Fajemisin chipped in with 7 points, and junior guard Chris Sarbaugh added 4 points and 3 rebounds. Christopher Anderson (8 points, 7 assists) and Dennis Kramer (8 points, 5 rebounds) also contributed. For the game USD shot 50.7% from the field (34-67) and was solid from the charity stripe at 75.0% (12-16). The Toreros also came out on top in rebounding (45-38), while the defense limited SDCC to just 25.9% shooting (15-58).

GAME#4 (NOV. 16TH) USD PUTS DEFENSIVE CLAMPS ON NORTHERN KENTUCKY 75-44: The USD Toreros dealt the host Northern Kentucky Norse (0-3) a 75-44 defeat to improve to 4-0 on the season. Despite the lopsided score, this was a solid win for San Diego as NKU recently played Purdue on the road to a 1-point decision (77-76 loss). Senior Dennis Kramer led a balanced attack with 15 points and 5 rebounds in 26 minutes of action. He was followed by Duda Sanadze (14 points, all in the 2nd half), Christopher Anderson (10 points) and Jito Kok (career-best 12 rebounds, 7 points, 3 blocks). Johnny Dee, the team's leading scorer through the first three games, chipped in with 9 points. Northern Kentucky jumped out to an early 5-2 lead in the first three minutes of action, but after that it was all USD as the Toreros would take a 32-21 intermission lead and then build their advantage to as many as 33 points with less than one minute to play. The 31 point win is the team's biggest margin of victory since last year's season opener against San Diego Christian (+33, 9-58). Every Torero on the road trip saw action and at the end of the contest Nick Kerr and Therone Tillett each buried a trey for their first points of the season. For the game USD shot 52.0% from the floor (26-50), 42.9% from beyond the arc (6-14) and 70.8% from the free throw line (17-24). USD outrebounded NKU, 44-40, but gave up 21 offensive rebounds to the Norse.

GAME #3 (NOV. 14TH) SAN DIEGO DOWNS MORGAN STATE 68-61: The USD men's basketball team earned a 68-61 road win over Morgan State to improve to 3-0 on the season. Johnny Dee paced the Toreros with 19 points, and the interior play of Dennis Kramer and Jito Kok down the stretch was pivotal in the victory. The Toreros were down 33-30 at halftime but rallied to outscore the Bears 37-28 over the final 20 minutes of play. A three-pointer by Justin Black early in the second half gave the Bears a 36-30 advantage, but the Toreros went on an 8-0 run to pull ahead 38-36 with 14:39 to go. During that stretch the Toreros received a dunk by Jito Kok, two free throws from Thomas Jacobs and a pair of buckets from Duda Sanadze. Following Sanadze's bucket that gave the Toreros the two-point lead, the game stayed close for much of the second half. With 4:15 to go in the game, a Dennis Kramer dunk off an assist from Johnny Dee made it 57-53. The Bears would take one final lead at 58-57 on a layup by Blake Bozeman, but over the final two minutes it was all USD as they outscored the Bears 10-3. Sanadze and Dee had buckets and the Toreros converted on their final six free throw attempts. For the game Dennis Kramer chipped in with 12 points and 7 rebounds, and Christopher Anderson and Jito Kok each added 11 points. It was a personal-best for Kok. Freshman Brett Bailey, playing in his first collegiate road game, was very productive as he contributed 7 points and 4 rebounds. The Toreros held the edge on the boards, 43-38.

GAME #2 (NOV.9TH) TOREROS DOWN GRAND CANYON 70-59: The San Diego Toreros, hosting their first ever USD Classic, came away with a 2-0 record to the start of their 2013-14 campaign after a 70-59 victory over Grand Canyon. Johnny Dee paced the Toreros in scoring with 17 points and backcourt running mate Christopher Anderson notched a double-double in points (13) and assists (12). Senior forward Dennis Kramer (14 points) and sophomore guard Duda Sanadze (11 points) also chipped in with double-digit outings in the scoring column. In jumping out to a 40-27 halftime lead, the Torero defense held the Antelopes to just 37.9% shooting (11-29), while USD combined to shoot a blistering 68.2% from the floor (15-22). In the second half the Toreros extended their lead to 17 points twice in the early going, the last coming at the 18:04 mark on a Sanadze three-pointer. Over the next 5:22 the visitors went on a 9-2 run to pull to within 49-39 with 12:42 left. A few minutes later they would cut it to 8 points at 54-46 on two free throws from Jeremy Adams, but Dennis Kramer received a nice dish from Thomas Jacobs and slammed it home to get it back to double digits. From there the Toreros would keep a double-digit lead. Grand Canyon (0-2), which is moving up to the NCAA Division I ranks this season as a member of the Western Athletic Conference, was paced by Demetrius Walker off the bench with 19 points. Center Killian Larson turned in a solid effort with 14 points and a game-high 15 rebounds. For the game USD shot 52.1% from the floor (25-48) and matched GCU in the rebounding department at 33-all. USD showed a big improvement at the free throw line connecting on 15-of-19 (78.9%).

GAME #1 (NOV. 8) TOREROS HOLD OFF SOUTH DAKOTA STATE 70-59: The USD Toreros opened up the 2013-14 campaign with a hard fought 74-70 victory over a very good South Dakota State team that has been to the NCAA Tournament the past two seasons. Junior guard Johnny Dee led all scorers with 27 points and Duda Sanadze chipped in with 14 points. Junior guard Christopher Anderson, despite having his struggles at the free throw line, came up huge down the stretch with his defensive play to help the Toreros overcome a 6-point deficit (67-61) with 4:36 to go. Anderson, who finished the game with 11 points and 8 assists, canned a jumper and converted a three-pointer to get USD within one at 67-66 with 3:24 left. South Dakota State went back up 70-66 with 2:12 to go, but Johnny Dee hit his sixth trey of the game to make it 70-69. Anderson stole the ball from Anders Broman and fed Duda Sanadze for a bucket to put USD up 71-70 with 1:00 to go. Following another Anderson steal, USD closed out the game with a free throw from Dennis Kramer with eight seconds to make it 72-70, and two free throws by Sandaze with under one tick left sealed the win. USD led 41-24 at the break as Dee poured in 17 points on 5-of-8 shooting (4-6 in threes). USD would extend their lead to as many as 9 points (45-36) on a lay-in by Sanadze before the Jackrabbits rallied. San Diego also received solid play from senior forward Dennis Kramer (9 points, 10 rebounds) and Jito Kok (5 points, 5 rebounds, 3 blocked shots). For the game the Toreros shot 47.3% from the field (26-55).
