Nevada (3-3, 1-2) returns to the road for the first time in two games, traveling to Provo, Utah, to meet BYU (4-2) on Saturday, Oct. 18 ... Action between the Wolf Pack and Cougars is scheduled to get underway at 7:21 p.m. (PT) on ESPN2 ... Both teams are in need of a win, coming off consecutive losses ... BYU leads the series history with Nevada, 5-2-2 ... Last week, Nevada scored 21-straight points before falling short, 31-24, to Colorado State (5-1, 1-1) ... All of Nevada's three losses have come by seven or less points, with Nevada rallying from two scores down to have a chance to win or tie the game with less than a minute remaining ... Senior QB Cody Fajardo accounted for 385 yards against the Rams, surpassing David Neill (1998-01) for second in total offense in Wolf Pack history with 11,403 career yards ... Fajardo also set the program record for career completions with 770 ... Junior Lenny Jones recovered a fumble against Colorado State, marking the 19th straight game Nevada has forced a takeaway Nevada will be facing the nation's seventh-ranked rushing defense in BYU, who allows just 92.2 yards on the ground per game ... The Pack ranks first in the Mountain West in red zone offense and defense.

Coach Brian Polian and selected student-athletes will be available on a weekly basis at a press conference on Tuesdays, beginning at 11:30 a.m. Requests for student-athletes for the press conference must be submitted no later than 3 p.m. on Mondays to the Nevada Media Services office.

Generally, the Nevada Media Services office will live-stream the Tuesday press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference. For information on receiving a copy of those interviews directly, contact Billy Lee, Director of Digital Media (rjerz@unr.edu).

WEEKLY RADIO SHOW

Brian Polian's weekly radio show with Ryan Radtke is on Wednesday evenings from 7-8 p.m. and will be held at the Little Waldorf Saloon across from campus. It is available in Northern Nevada on ESPN Radio 94.5 and an archive will be posted on the Mountain West Network within 24 hours. In addition to Polian, Radtke will interview assistant coaches and players on the show.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

In general, no coaches or student-athletes are available to media on the field or en route to the locker room, with the exception of the live, originating television broadcast if pre-arranged. Nevada's locker room is closed to the media.

Interview requests should be submitted to Chad Hartley of the Nevada Media Services office no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Assistant coaches are not available after games. Generally, the Nevada Media Services office will live-stream the post-game press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference. For information on receiving a copy of those interviews directly, contact Billy Lee, Director of Digital Media (leew@unr.edu).

Home games:

Postgame interviews will be conducted in the Peteresen Athletic Academic Center (which will also serve as a photographer work area during games). Coach Polian will be available to media after the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period, followed by selected student-athletes.

Road games:

Polian and selected student-athletes will be available outside the visiting locker room or in the designated visiting media interview area after the cooling off period.

MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone

lines available during the game and up to one and half hours after the conclusion of each game. The postgame interview area at the Peteresen Athletic Academic Center is similarly equipped. Media may work in either location but are asked to work in the Peteresen location if working more than 90 minutes post-game. The Mackay press box will also serve as a game and media operations location post-game so the Peteresen location will likely be a quieter work environment after the conclusion of the press conference.

QUARTERBACK CLUB LUNCHEONS

Nevada head coach Brian Polian and two players are available each week at the Wolf Pack's Quarterback Club Luncheon, which is usually hosted at the Peppermill Hotel-Casino. Doors open at 11:30 a.m. and the cost is \$17. This luncheon is open to the media and general public. The luncheons begin Monday, Sept. 9 and run through Nov. 18.

These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.

2014 NEVADA WOLF PACK FOOTBALL — GAME NOTES

HEAD COACH BRIAN POLIAN (@Brian Polian)



A new era of Nevada football was ushered in on Jan. 11, 2013 with the hiring of Brian Polian to serve as the 25th head coach in the history of the Wolf Pack program.

At 39 years old, Polian is one of the youngest head coaches at the FBS level. He

brought to Nevada an impressive football pedigree that includes coaching stops at Notre Dame, Stanford and Texas A&M as part of a 17-year coaching career.

Now in year two of his tenure with the Wolf Pack, the future is bright with 16 starters returning on offense and defensive and a pair of Polian-led recruiting classes that have expanded the Wolf Pack's turf to Texas and the South and elsewhere.

A treacherous schedule in 2013 led to a 4-8 record in Polian's first year but the offseason brought with it a full implementation of his program as an energized community eagerly awaits the 2014 season with Polian and the Pack.

In year one, five Wolf Pack players earned All-Mountain West honors with Joel Bitonio and Brock Hekking named to the first team and Brandon Wimberly, Charles Garrett and Chase Tenpenny earning second-team recognition.

Eight members of Polian's program earned distinction for their work in the classroom with Academic All-MW accolades. And four players earned the Mountain West Scholar-Athlete Award for earning a grade-point average of 3.5 or higher during the 2013-14 academic year.

Polian came to Nevada after a year as the special

teams coordinator and tight ends coach for Kevin Sumlin at Texas A&M, which capped an 11-2 season in 2012 with a win over Oklahoma in the Cotton Bowl and an historic Heisman Trophy for then-freshman quarterback Johnny Manziel.

Polian has coached on both sides of the ball and earned a reputation as one of the top recruiters in the nation in previous coaching roles at Stanford (2010-11), Notre Dame (2005-09), UCF (2004) and Buffalo (2001-03).

Hired by Jim Harbaugh at Stanford, Polian's two-year run with the Cardinal was marked by a pair of BCS bowl appearances and two of the top recruiting classes in school history. He served as the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator while also coaching the safeties at Stanford. Prior to that, Polian spent five seasons with Charlie Weis at Notre Dame, earning a number of honors as one of the top recruiters in the country and was a nominee for the AFCA (American Football Coaches Association) Assistant Coach of the Year in 2008.

During that time, Polian's special teams units set a number of school records and the Fighting Irish went to a pair of BCS bowl games – the Fiesta Bowl following the 2005 season and 2006 Sugar Bowl.

Polian spent one season at Central Florida as the recruiting coordinator and running backs coach and spearheaded recruiting classes that led to the Knights' bowl appearance in 2005. Prior that, he coordinated special teams and coached running backs at the University of Buffalo for three seasons after a previous tenure (1998) with the Bulls. While at Buffalo, Polian worked under Jim Hofher, who is now the assistant head coach for the Wolf Pack.

Polian also worked as a graduate assistant for Nick Saban at Michigan State (1997) and then spent two seasons at as a GA at Baylor (1999-2000).

ALPHA WOLF AWARD

RENO, Nev. - As part of the Nevada Athletics Department's "Born to be ONE" motto, second-year head coach Brian Polian announced the creation of the Alpha Wolf, a weekly honor bestowed upon a walk-on in the program.

Uniform jersey No. 1 will be assigned to a different walk-on player each week who excels on special teams. This weekly recognition will come with the name Alpha Wolf.

"The football program is in lock-step with the 'Born to Be One' marketing campaign set forth by the athletic department and we are true believers in the 'One Community, One Pack' mantra," Polian said. "Because of that, we are excited to announce the Alpha Wolf pro-

gram this year. Jersey No. 1 will be worn each week by a walk-on player who makes a significant contribution to our team on special teams. This player will wear No. 1 because he represents not only the student-body, but also because he truly is member of the 'Community.'

"I am excited about the incentive that this creates within our team and about the group that it represents. Traditions like this are what make college football fun and I look forward to growing the Alpha Wolf."

The Alpha Wolf honor could be earned by the same player multiple times during a season or even for an entire season. Or it could be earned by a different player each week during the season.

LAST TIME THEY MET

RENO, Nev. (AP) - Brandon Wimberly caught 10 passes for 117 yards and a touchdown, but Nevada fell to BYU, 23-28.

The Wolf Pack (4-8, 3-5 Mountain West) led by seven at halftime and scored with 2:42 left in the game, but failed on a 2-point try and BYU ran the clock out to win it. Wimberly caught a 4-yard TD strike late in the fourth quarter to narrow the gap.

The Cougars (8-4) scored all of their points in the second half and were led by Hill, who completed 14 of 18 passes for 98 yards with two touchdowns and ran for 154 yards and a score.

BYU running back Jamaal Williams rushed for 219 yards with a 66-yard touchdown 32 seconds into the second quarter. He had 188 rushing yards in the second half.

2014 NEVADA WOLF PACK FOOTBALL — GAME NOTES

SERIES HISTORY

BYU leads the series history with Nevada, 5-2-2. The Wolf Pack has posted a 1-2-2 all-time record in Provo, Utah, with the lone win coming from a 27-13 victory in Sept. 25, 2010, as Nevada improved to 4-0 on the season. Nevada and BYU met last season in Reno, as the Cougars scored all their points in the second half en route to a 28-23 win.

LAST TIME OUT

RENO, Nev. (AP) - Nevada scored 21-unanswered points in the second half behind Cody Fajardo's three touchdowns, but the Wolf Pack's rally fell short, 31-24, to Colorado State on Saturday night at Mackay Stadium.

The Rams (5-1, 1-1) built a 31-3 lead with 4:48 remaining in the third quarter before the Wolf Pack (3-3, 1-2) awakened with a massive rally. Fajardo tallied Nevada's first touchdown with a 13-yard rush in the third quarter, before tossing touchdown passes to Hasaan Henderson and Richy Turner in the fourth quarter.

After forcing a Colorado State punt with 4:56 remaining, Nevada took over at its 26-yard line needing one score to tie the game. It appeared Nevada did just that as Fajardo found Richardson for a 63-yard touchdown reception, but the play was called back on offensive pass interference. Nevada still managed to drive 64 yards and reach the Ram's 10-yard line before Fajardo was picked off in the end zone, sealing a dramatic Colorado State win.

Garret Grayson completed 26-of-36 passes for 326 yards to lead the Rams, while Rashar Higgins caught 10 passes for 194 yards. Fajardo accounted for 385 yards of total offense - overtaking David Neill for second in Wolf Pack history - with 297 yards through the air and 88 on the ground. PACK'S DEFENSE TURNOVER STREAK REACHES 19

Senior FS Nigel Haikins forced a fumble that was recovered by junior DE Lenny Jones against Colorado State, marking the 19th straight game the Pack defense has forced a turnover. Nevada has forced a takeaway in every game this season and every game in the Brian Polian era. The last time Nevada failed to recover a turnover was Dec. 1, 2012, against Boise State.

This season, Nevada ranks second in the Mountain West in turnovers forced (12) and turnover margin per game (+0.83). The Wolf Pack's turnover margin per game ranks 21st in the nation.

FAJARDO CONTINUES RECORD BOOK CLIMB

Cody Fajardo completed 27-of-50 passes for 297 yards and two scores while rushing for 88 yards and one score last week against Colorado State. Fajardo set a prestigious program record while climbing in numerous categories following the performance:

- Passed David Neill (1998-01) for first in program history in career completions (770)
- Passed David Neill (1998-01) for second in program history in total offense (11,403)
- Passed Jeff Rowe (2002-06) and Fred Gaitlin (1989-92) for third in program history in career pass attempts (1,155)
- Passed Fred Gaitlin (1989-92) for fourth in program history in career passing yards (8,562).

NEVADA'S NEVER-DIE SPIRIT PRODUCES NEAR-COMEBACKS

All three of the Wolf Pack's losses this season have been decided by less than one score (Arizona, 7; Boise State, 5; Colorado State 7). In each loss, Nevada trailed by at least two touchdowns at one point before rallying within a score and having a chance to tie or win the game in the fourth quarter.

- Nevada trailed 35-21 to Arizona before pulling to 35-28 and having a drive stall on fourth down at the 46-yard line with 41 seconds left.
- The Pack trailed by a 51-36 margin to Boise State and scored 10 straight points in the fourth quarter to pull within 51-46 before a turnover on downs with 41 seconds left at the 37-yard line.
- Nevada trailed 31-3, its largest deficit of the season, to Colorado State with 4:48 left in the third quarter. The Pack scored 21 points in the fourth quarter to pull within 31-24. The Pack had a game-tying 63-yard touchdown pass called back by a penalty, and drove 64 yards to the CSU 10-yard line before an interception in the red zone with 46 seconds left on the clock.

• NIGEL HAIKINS DEVELOPS INTO DEFENSIVE LEADER

After earning a starting job in fall camp, senior FS Nigel Haikins has turned into a playmaker on defense with four takeaways in his first six career starts. The Concord, Calif., native recovered a fumble and picked off a pass in the season-opener against Southern Utah, returned an interception 27 yards for a touchdown in the play of the game against San José State and forced a fumble against Colorado State. Haikins ranks third on the team with 38 tackles to go along with four passes defended and four takeaways.

• CHARLES GARRETT TO MAKE 30TH CAREER START

Senior cornerback Charles Garrett is scheduled to make his 30th career start against BYU this Saturday. The Los Angeles native leads the team with five passes defended and ranks 49th amongst active FBS players with 23 career passes defended. Garrett has made 25 tackles on the season with one tackle for loss.

• RICHARDSON TALLIES SECOND CAREER 100-YARD RECEIVING GAME

Sophomore WR Jerico Richardson caught 10 passes for 122 yards against Colorado State, marking his second career 10+ catch, 100+ receiving yards game. Richardson also caught a career-high 13 passes for 177 yards against Southern Utah. The Los Angeles native leads the team with 35 receptions and 441 yards (12.6 ypc). He ranks fifth in the Mountain West in receiving yards per game (73.5) and seventh in receptions per game (5.8).

• FAJARDO LEADS WOLF PACK IN PASSING AND RUSHING

Senior QB Cody Fajardo now leads Nevada in both passing and rushing yards with 1,401 passing yards and 405 rushing yards on the season. Fajardo is one of eight quarterbacks in the nation to lead their team in both passing and rushing (list below). Fajardo ranks third in the Mountain West in total offense (1,806) this season, trailing only Boise State's Grant Hedrick and Colorado State's Garrett Grayson. Fajardo is the only active FBS player in the nation with over 8,000 career passing and 2,000 career rushing yards, ranking as one of the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the nation over the past four seasons.

FAJARDO, OFFENSE GAINING YARDS IN BIG CHUNKS

The Wolf Pack offense has recorded 13 plays that went 20 yards or longer in the past two games. Nevada has 25 explosive plays (20+) on the season with 21 through the air and four on the ground. The Wolf Pack had five explosive plays against Colorado State, four of which came in the second half. Sophomore WR Jerico Richardson caught passes of 23, 26 and 30 yards, while sophomore Hasaan Henderson caught a 30-yard pass and senior Kendall Brock's third catch of the season went for 24 yards.

YATES REACHING PEAK POTENTIAL

Junior DT Rykeem Yates had a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss against Boise State and followed with 2.0 tackles for loss against Colorado State. In the past two games, Yates has 12 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, one pass breakup, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and a blocked PAT.

On the season, Yates has 22 tackles, 6.0 tackles for loss and 18 TFL yards. Yates ranks fifth in the Mountain West in tackles for loss.

HENDERSON POSSESSES BIG-PLAY POTENTIAL

The Wolf Pack's Nevada-born starting linemen are redshirt freshman LT Austin Corbett (Sparks, Nev., Reed HS), sophomore LG Jeremy Macauley (Sparks, Nev., Reed HS), junior RG Connor Talbott (Reno, Nev., Bishop Manogue HS) and senior RT Kyle Roberts (Sparks, Nev., Reed HS). Macauley suffered an injury in practice and missed the Arizona game, being replaced by Joey Anglemire, a native of Hawai'i.

NEVADA WINS DESPITE 0-FOR-9 MARK ON THIRD-DOWNS

The Wolf Pack defeated San Jose State, 21-10, without a third-down conversion - the first time Nevada has failed to convert on third-down in the past 15 years.

The last known time a team won despite not converting a third-down took place on Oct. 26, 2013, when Duke beat Virginia Tech, 12-10, despite going 0-for-11 on third-downs.

BIG PLAYS FROM FRESHMEN/FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Nevada has received big contributions from youngsters or first-time starters this season. The following is a list of notable plays this season from breakout players:

- Sophomore WR Jerico Richardson recorded career-high marks with 13 receptions and 177 yards in the first start of his career, leading Nevada over Southern Utah.
- True freshman DB Kendall Johnson recorded his first career interception, returning a Connor Halliday pass 45 yards to set up a Nevada touchdown against Washington State.
- Freshman RB James Butler scored touchdown in the first two games of his collegiate year, rushing for a score against Southern Utah and Washington State.
- Making his first career start at Arizona, RS-FR strong safety Teré Calloway recorded his first career interception by picking off Anu Solomon in the second quarter.
- Senior FS Nigel Haikins has made his first six career starts this season, leading the team with four takeaways from two interceptions - including a 27-yard pick-six - and a forced and recovered fumble.

DIAPER DANDIES

Head coach Brian Polian has played 12 freshmen in 2014, including seven true freshmen; RS-FR OL Joey Anglemire, FR RB James Butler, RS-FR DB Tere Calloway, FR DL Patrick Choudja, RS-FR OL Austin Corbett, RS-FR OL Ziad Damanhoury, FR WR Wyatt Demps, FR DB Kendall Johnson, RS-FS OL Adam Khouri, FR TE Matt Moen, FR LB Ahki Muhammad and RS-FS DB Jaden Sawyer. True freshmen have provided a number of key plays this season; Butler has rushed for a touchdown in both games, Corbett has started once and been featured heavily on the line, while Johnson returned an interception 45 yards to spark Nevada's first touchdown against Washington State.

CHRIS AULT FIELD

Prior to the UC Davis game on Sept. 7, 2013, Nevada's field was named in honor of longtime coach and former quarterback and administrator Chris Ault. The playing surface is now known as Chris Ault Field at Mackay Stadium.

The winningest coach in school history with a career record of 233-109-1 in 28 seasons, Ault guided Nevada from Division II to I-AA glory in the Big Sky Conference 1980s and early 90s, into I-A and the Big West Conference in 1992 and on to the Western Athletic Conference and the Mountain West Conference.

RENO, Nev. (AP) - Cody Fajardo threw for 303 yards and a touchdown and ran for 68 yards and another score to lead Nevada to a 28-19 win over Southern Utah in the season opener Saturday.

The only FBS player with over 7,000 passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards, Fajardo finished with 371 yards, giving him 9,968 total career yards. He completed 30 of 41 passes. Fajardo is 32 yards away from becoming the third player in program history to reach 10,000 career yards; Colin Kaepernick (14,210) and David Neill (11,145).

Jerico Richardson caught 13 passes for 177 yards for Nevada. Don Jackson rushed for 110 yards and one score.

The Wolf Pack led 7-0 at the half. James Butler scored on a 1-yard run in the second quarter and Jackson scored from the 2 to open the third for a 14-0 lead.

Southern Utah answered when Raysean Pringle broke for a 71-yard TD run to make it 14-6. Fajardo accounted for two scores to give the Wolf Pack a 28-6 lead with 11:47 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Nevada finished with a 300-yard passer (Fajardo, 303), 100-yard receiver (Richardson, 177) and 100-yard rusher (Jackson, 110) for the first time since the San Diego State game in 2013.

Freshman Kendall Johnson intercepted a pass in the first quarter, returning it 45 yards to set up Nevada's first score of the game. Nevada scored in the first half on short runs by Don Jackson and James Butler before Mike Leach's Cougars scored 10 unanswered points to make it 14-10 at halftime.

The Wolf Pack defense turned in one of its best performances

in recent memory, holding the air-raid Cougar offense to just three points in the second half. Meanwhile, Nevada added insurance with another Jackson TD run and a 40-yard field goal by Brent Zuzo to cap a late, clock-killing drive.

Senior QB Cody Fajardo tallied 110 passing yards and 100 rushing yards to lead the way, becoming the third player in program history to reach 10,000 yards of total offense. Jackson added 69 yards and two scores on the ground, while Hasaan Henderson caught six passes for 77 yards.

The Pack defense held WSU to 5-of-15 on third-down, 0-of-2 on fourth-down and 3-of-6 in the red zone.

Arizona responded with consecutive, quick-strike scores from Cayleb Jones touchdown receptions. With the pressure on, Fajardo found Gipson again at the 6:01 mark in the fourth quarter to pull within one. A late Wolf Pack drive stalled on fourth down, and the Wildcats survived to improve to 3-0.

For his efforts, Fajardo was named Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week.

The Rams (5-1, 1-1) built a 31-3 lead with 4:48 remaining in the third quarter before the Wolf Pack (3-3, 1-2) awakened with a massive rally. Fajardo tallied Nevada's first touchdown with a 13-yard rush in the third quarter, before tossing touchdown passes to Hasaan Henderson and Richy Turner in the fourth quarter.

After forcing a Colorado State punt with 4:56 remaining, Nevada took over at its 26-yard line needing one score to tie the game. It appeared Nevada did just that as Fajardo found Richardson for a 63-yard touch-

down reception, but the play was called back on offensive pass interference. Nevada still managed to drive 64 yards and reach the Ram's 10-yard line before Fajardo was picked off in the end zone, sealing a dramatic Colorado State win.

Garret Grayson completed 26-of-36 passes for 326 yards to lead the Rams, while Rashar Higgins caught 10 passes for 194 yards.

Fajardo accounted for 385 yards of total offense - overtaking David Neill for second in Wolf Pack history - with 297 yards through the air and 88 on the ground. Jerico Richardson tallied his second 100-yard receiving game of the season, catching 10 passes for 122 yards.

Nigel Haikins led the Pack defense with 10 stops and a forced fumble.
