2022 Cowboy Team Captains

Named: The Wyoming Cowboys have selected captains for the 2022 season. This year's four team captains are:

- Easton Gibbs, So.,** Linebacker
- Cole Godbout, Jr.,** Nose Tackle
- Andrew Peasley, Jr.,** Quarterback
- Treyton Welch, Jr.,** Tight End

It is the first season each of the four Cowboys have been elected team captains.

Cowboys and Cougars Will Play for the 79th Time on Saturday, Two Teams Were Conference Opponents From 1921 to 2010:

For the better part of a century, the Wyoming Cowboys and Brigham Young Cougars played each other in football on an annual basis. But since 2011, when BYU left the Mountain West Conference to become an FBS independent in football, the two long-time rivals have played only once -- in the 2016 Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego.

The Cowboys and Cougars will renew their rivalry this Saturday in Provo, Utah, in the 79th meeting between the two schools.

Notes on the Wyoming-BYU series

- Wyoming trails in the overall series vs. BYU 30-45-3.
- The last time Wyoming defeated BYU was in 2003 in Laramie by a score of 13-10.
- Wyoming and BYU last met in the 2016 Poinsettia Bowl. BYU won that game 24-21 in San Diego.
- The two teams first met in 1922 when they played each other twice as members of the Rocky Mountain Faculty Athletic Conference (RMFAC), with BYU winning 7-0 in Provo on Nov. 14, and Wyoming winning 13-0 in Laramie on Nov. 30.
- From 1929 to 1942, the two teams played every season. After the series was interrupted during World War II, the two teams renewed the rivalry, playing every year from 1946 to 1992.
- Wyoming and BYU played in the same conferences from 1921 to 2010.
- From 1921-1937, they were both members of the Rocky Mountain Faculty Athletic Conference (RMFAC).
- They were both founding members of the Skyline Conference, which was in existence from 1938-61.
- In 1962, the two schools were founding members of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) and were WAC foes from 1962-98.
- The two were founding members of the Mountain West Conference in 1999 where they both remained until 2010. Wyoming remains a member of the Mountain West today.
- In 2011, BYU became an FBS Independent in football.
- The only interruptions in the series from 1946 to 2010 came in 1993 and '94 due to the WAC adding a 10th team in Fresno State. Because of the 10-team league, UW and BYU didn't meet those two seasons. And in 1997 and '98 due to the expansion of the WAC to 16 teams, the two old rivals didn't play.

Cowboys Coming Off Biggest Win of the Young 2022 Season: From their first possession of Wyoming's game against Air Force on Friday, Sept. 16, the Wyoming Cowboys showed they were determined to play their best football of the season and they did just that, winning their third straight game by capturing a 17-14 win over the previously unbeaten Air Force Falcons.

The Cowboy offense out gained the Falcons on both the ground and through the air. Wyoming accounted for 180 rushing yards to Air Force's 171. The Cowboys threw for 162 yards to Air Force's 101. Wyoming also converted 6 of 11 third-down attempts and won the all-important time of possession battle when playing the Falcons, holding the ball for 30 minutes and 34 seconds to Air Force's 29 minutes and 26 seconds.

Facing an Air Force rushing attack that entered the game ranked No. 1 in the nation, averaging 508.5 yards per game, the Cowboy defense held the Falcons to 171 rushing yards -- 337.5 yards under their average.

"Great team win," said Wyoming head coach **Craig Bohl**. "We've always had very competitive games against Air Force. I felt like this was Air Force's best football team since I've been our head coach.

"Our guys had a great week of practice. We are an emerging football team. We are a young football team in a lot of spots, and a lot of those guys are growing up fast. I really think our coaching staff did a great job composing a game plan and the players went out and executed it."

Wyoming Sitting Atop the Mountain West Standings: With its 17-13 victory over Air Force last Friday, Wyoming finds itself holding the best record in the Mountain West at 3-1 overall and 1-0 in league play.

The win was the Cowboys third victory in a row this season, which is the longest current streak of any Mountain West team. In addition to Wyoming's victory over conference opponent Air Force, the Cowboys also have a win over American Athletic Conference member Tulsa.

Last Meeting Between Wyoming and BYU Came in the 2016 Poinsettia Bowl:

It has been six years since the Cowboys and Cougars last played one another. That meeting in the 2016 Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, Calif., saw Wyoming come back from a 10-0 halftime deficit to draw within three points at 10-7 following a four-yard touchdown run by Cowboy running back **Brian Hill** with 6:35 remaining in the third quarter. BYU extended its lead to 17-7 late in the third quarter and built that lead to 24-7 with a touchdown at the 14:07 mark of the fourth quarter.

But the Cowboys came storming back, led by sophomore quarterback **Josh Allen**. Allen threw two fourth-quarter TD passes to his favorite target, wide receiver **Tanner Gentry**. The first was a nine-yard touchdown strike at the 7:35 mark and the second went for 23 yards with 2:11 remaining in the game.

Wyoming's defense forced BYU into a three-and-out series on its next possession, highlighted by a sack for 11 yards from Cowboy defensive end **Kevin Prosser** that put the ball back at the BYU 10-yard line. After a BYU punt, Wyoming took over at the Wyoming 49-yard line with 1:35 remaining in the game. The Cowboys had one final opportunity to win the game. On first down, Allen connected with running back Hill on a 19-yard pass completion down to the BYU 32. It looked like the Cowboys might pull off the comeback after all, but on second down Allen's pass was picked off at the BYU 11-yard line by Cougar Kai Nacua. He returned the interception 20 yards to the BYU 31. The Cougars ran out the last 1:20 and the final score was 24-21 in favor of BYU.

Cole Godbout Nearing Wyoming Top 10 for Career Tackles for Loss:

Wyoming's junior nose tackle **Cole Godbout** has been a standout for the Pokes the last four seasons. From the 2019 season through this season, Godbout has appeared in 34 games and started 26. He has made a total of 19.0 tackles for loss over his career.

About the BYU Cougars: BYU is ranked No. 19 in this week's Associated Press media poll and No. 23 in this week's USA Today Sports AFCA Coaches Poll.

BYU brings a 2-1 record into this week's game versus Wyoming. BYU has defeated South Florida (50-21) and Baylor (26-20) this season. Both games being played in Provo, Utah. The Cougars lost last week to Oregon by a score of 41-20 in Eugene, Ore.

Titus Swen Earns Honorable Mention Honors From the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Player of the Week:

Wyoming running back **Titus Swen** was named by the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award as one of its Honorable Mention Players of the Week for his performance in a 33-10 win over Northern Colorado.

Swen rushed for 76 yards on 15 carries and scored three rushing touchdowns vs. UNC.

The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award recognizes the top offensive player in Division I Football who also exhibits the enduring characteristics that define Earl Campbell. Individuals nominated for the award must either be born in Texas, graduated from a Texas High School or played for a Texas-based junior college or Division I Texas college.

Swen was named to the 2022 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List earlier this year.

John Hoyland Named a Groza Award Star of the Week:

Wyoming place-kicker **John Hoyland** was named one of three Lou Groza Award Stars of the Week for his performance in a 33-10 win over Northern Colorado.

Hoyland was a perfect 4 for 4 in field goals against UNC and made all three of his PAT attempts to score 15 of Wyoming's 33 points in the home win. He successfully converted field goals from 41, 39, 35 and 23 yards.

On Target -- Cowboy QB Andrew Peasley's Consistent Play Has Helped Fuel Wyoming's Early Success:

Wyoming quarterback **Andrew Peasley** played another exceptional game for the Cowboys in UW's 17-14 win over Air Force on Friday, Sept. 16. He completed 18 of 23 passes for a 78.3 completion percentage, 162 yards, threw one touchdown pass and one interception.

It marked the third consecutive game this season that Peasley completed over 60 percent of his passes. He completed 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) in a win over Tulsa and 19 of 30 passes (63.3 percent) against Northern Colorado in a home victory. That was the first time a Cowboy quarterback had completed over 60 percent of his passes in three consecutive games since **Cameron Coffman** accomplished that in 2015 against Washington State, New Mexico and Appalachian State.

Comeback Cowboys: This year's Wyoming Cowboys have shown an amazing ability to comeback to win games.

In Wyoming's home game vs. Tulsa on Sept. 3, the Pokes trailed 34-24 with 14:52 remaining in the contest. **John Hoyland** would kick a career best 55-yard field goal and Cowboy quarterback **Andrew Peasley** would connect with wide receiver **Joshua Cobbs** on a 51-yard TD pass to tie the game at 34-34 and force overtime, where Wyoming would win the game in double overtime 40-37.

Against Air Force on Sept. 16, the Cowboys faced a 14-10 deficit with 9:58 remaining in the game. Peasley would lead the Wyoming offense on an eight-play, 75-yard drive with running back **Titus Swen** finishing off the drive with a five-yard TD run to regain the lead for good on way to a 17-10 victory.

Punter Clayton Stewart Becoming a Weapon for the Cowboys: Wyoming's junior punter **Clayton Stewart** is becoming a weapon for the Cowboys.

Stewart currently is averaging 44.5 yards per punt this season to rank No. 3 in the Mountain West and No. 25 in the FBS.

He averaged a career high 51.5 yards per punt on four punts in helping Wyoming secure a 17-14 home win over Air Force last Friday night.

Stewart connected on a career long 66-yard punt in the second quarter that bounced out of bounds at the Air Force three-yard line.

After Stewart's punt pinned the Falcons back on their three-yard line, the Falcons went three-and-out on their next offensive series. The Falcons punted at the end of that series, and Wyoming started its next drive at the Air Force 42-yard line. That field position allowed the Cowboys to score a touchdown three plays later.

Stewart had another punt of 43 yards to the Air Force 27-yard line in the second quarter, and he punted 46 yards to the Air Force 28-yard line that forced a fair catch in the third quarter. His final punt in the fourth quarter went for 51 yards for a touchback.

The Falcons' average starting field position after Stewart's four punts was the Air Force 19 and 1/2 yard line, with starting field positions of their own three-yard line, 20-yard line, 27-yard line and 28-yard line.

AFCA Coaches Unite Again to Raise Awareness for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, 15th Annual Coach To Cure MD Sept. 22-24, 2022:

College football is bigger than ever, and this week rival coaches are all on the same team. It's Coach to Cure MD, the annual sideline charity initiative that unites football coaches across America.

An initiative of Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD), Coach to Cure MD was launched with the American Football Coaches Association in 2008 and now includes most college coaches in all divisions.

"Football coaches are dedicated to the development of young people, and our coaches are always proud to stand with the brave individuals battling Duchenne muscular dystrophy," said Todd Berry, Executive Director of the AFCA. "Fans will see AFCA coaches wearing the Coach to Cure MD logo patch on the sidelines, educating fans about the cause on their social media, and inviting individuals battling Duchenne to their campuses."

"Our 15-year partnership with football coaches is making a difference in raising awareness, to help keep moving us closer to a cure for Duchenne," said Pat Furlong, Founding President & CEO of PPMD. "The Duchenne community appreciates having hundreds of football coaches on our side."

Duchenne is the most common fatal genetic disorder diagnosed during childhood, primarily affecting boys. People with Duchenne develop progressive muscle weakness that eventually causes loss of mobility, wheelchair reliance, and a decline in respiratory and cardiac function. Currently, there is no cure for Duchenne. Life expectancy can extend to age 30.

Wyoming Natives Play Starring Roles in Double-Overtime Win Over Tulsa:

Last Saturday's double-overtime win over the Tulsa Golden Hurricane saw a number of Wyoming natives play starring roles in the Cowboys' victory.

Casper, Wyo., native **Jordan Bertagnole** started out the game with a huge play from his defensive tackle position as he knocked the ball out of the hands of the Tulsa quarterback on the second play of the game. The ball bounced into the Tulsa end zone and was recovered by Cowboy linebacker **Easton Gibbs** from Temecula, Calif., for a touchdown to give UW a 7-0 lead. Bertagnole made a total of five tackles in the game, including 1.0 quarterback sack.

Sophomore fullback/tight end **Parker Christensen** from Sheridan, Wyo., caught a career high four passes for a career best 45 yards last Saturday. His long catch on the day was a 17-yard reception that helped set up a 55-yard field goal for the Cowboys that was critical in their fourth-quarter comeback. In the second overtime, Christensen caught an 11-yard pass that gave Wyoming a first down and set up the 30-yard game-winning field goal for the Pokes.

Sophomore wide receiver **Will Pelissier** from Big Horn, Wyo., caught a 48-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter to give Wyoming a 17-13 lead. His three receptions, 67 receiving yards and one touchdown were all career highs for Pelissier. He also added a 19-yard run in the game. In the first overtime, Pelissier caught a seven-yard pass down to the Tulsa six-yard line to put Cowboy place-kicker **John Hoyland** of Broomfield, Colo., in great position to kick a game-tying field goal.

John Hoyland, Place-kicker

Place-kicker John Hoyland Selected MW Special Teams Player of the Week vs. UNC: For the second consecutive week, Wyoming Cowboy place-kicker **John Hoyland** has been named the Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week. The announcement was made by the Mountain West on Monday.

Hoyland was a perfect 4 of 4 in field goals in a 33-10 win over Northern Colorado last Saturday. His three first-half field goals from 23, 41 and 39 yards were critical to Wyoming's win and staked the Cowboys to a 9-0 halftime lead.

His four field goals in Saturday's win tied a career high for Hoyland. It was the third time in his career that he had made four field goals in a single game. The other times were vs. Tulsa in 2022 and at Nevada in 2020.

Hoyland added a perfect 3 for 3 in PATS against Northern Colorado last Saturday to score 15 of Wyoming's 33 points.

Midway through the fourth quarter with Wyoming holding a 16-10 lead, Hoyland kicked his fourth field goal from 35 yards out to extend the Cowboys lead to 19-10.

A sophomore from Broomfield, Colo., where he played at Legacy High School, Hoyland earned Second Team All-Mountain West Conference honors in 2020, and he was named to the 2020 Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-America team.

Hoyland is currently ranked No. 1 in the nation in field goals made, averaging 3.33 field goals per game. He is also ranked No. 6 in the nation in scoring, averaging 12.3 points per game.

He has made 10 of 11 field goals he has attempted this season, including a career long 55-yard field goal. Hoyland is a perfect 7 of 7 in PATs on the season.



Shae Suaiaunoa, Linebacker

Cowboy Linebacker Shae Suaiaunoa Named MW Defensive Player of the Week vs. Northern Colorado:

Wyoming sophomore linebacker **Shae Suaiaunoa** recorded a career best eight tackles in Wyoming's 33-10 home win over Northern Colorado last Saturday, and he added an interception in the fourth quarter that he returned 18 yards down to the UNC three-yard line to set up a Wyoming touchdown two plays later.

Suaiaunoa also recorded 1.0 sack for 10 yards, 1.0 tackle for loss and one quarterback hurry in the game, as he helped lead a Wyoming defense that held Northern Colorado to only 15 rushing yards and only 147 yards of total offense.

The sophomore from Houston, Texas, played at Clear Lake High School. He and his Cowboy defensive teammates limited UNC to an average of only 2.4 yards per play.

For the season, Suaiaunoa is second on the Cowboy team in tackles, with 21, and is tied for the team lead in solo tackles with 15. He has 3.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, one interception and one pass breakup. Suaiaunoa is tied for 25th in the nation in interceptions this season.

Wyoming Offensive Line Impressive in First Four Games of the Season: The Wyoming offensive line has started the 2022 season with four strong performances.

- The Cowboys have allowed only 2.0 quarterback sacks this season..
- UW has allowed only 14.0 tackles for loss for a minus 46 yards through four games.
- Wyoming is ranked No. 2 in the MW and No. 11 in the nation in fewest sacks allowed at 0.5 per game.
- The Cowboys are ranked No. 2 in the conference and No. 22 in the country in fewest tackles for loss allowed, giving up only 3.5 per game.

Cowboy Defense Among Best in the Country in Quarterback Sacks: The Wyoming Cowboy defense has been very disruptive this season, ranking among the nation's leaders in quarterback sacks.

•Wyoming ranks No. 3 in the MW and No. 44 in the nation entering this week, averaging 2.5 sacks per game. The Cowboys have recorded 10.0 sacks through the first four games of the season.

•Redshirt freshman defensive end **Oluwaseyi Omotosho** leads the team with 3.0 sacks this season. He ranks No. 3 in the Mountain West and No. 14 in the country in quarterback sacks.



Cowboy QB Andrew Peasley Earns MW Offensive Player of the Week vs. Tulsa:

The University of Wyoming Cowboy junior quarterback **Andrew Peasley** was selected as the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week on Monday for his performance in leading Wyoming to a 40-37 double-overtime home win over Tulsa last Saturday.

With the Cowboys trailing by 10 points, 24-34, with 14:54 remaining in the game, Peasley guided the Cowboys on two scoring drives in the fourth quarter to send the game to overtime.

Peasley completed 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 256 yards, 2 TD passes and 0 interceptions on the day. His touchdown passes went for 48 and 51 yards. The 51-yarder came with 6:19 remaining in the game to tie the game at 34-34 and force overtime.

He also led Wyoming in rushing with 45 yards and he accounted for 301 yards of total offense. Peasley guided the Cowboys on six offensive scoring drives and accounted for 12 of Wyoming's 17 first downs (10 passing and 2 rushing). He also connected with eight different receivers on the day.

Peasley is a native of La Grande, Ore., where he played at La Grande High School. He is in his first season at Wyoming after transferring from Utah State University this past offseason.

This is Peasley's second Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week award of his career. He also earned the award in the 2020 when he guided Utah State to a victory over New Mexico.

UW Place-kicker John Hoyland Selected MW Special Teams Player of the Week for Win Over Tulsa:

On Monday, Wyoming Cowboy place-kicker **John Hoyland** was named the Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance last Saturday in a 40-37 double-overtime home win over Tulsa.

Hoyland tied a career high with four field goals in helping the Wyoming Cowboys to the victory over American Athletic Conference member Tulsa.

He kicked a career long 55-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to pull Wyoming to within a touchdown at 27-34. Hoyland also kicked a clutch 25-yard field goal in the first overtime to force a second overtime.

In the second overtime, Hoyland scored the winning field goal from 30 yards out to give the Cowboys their 40-37 win.

Hoyland was a perfect 4 of 4 in PATs and was 4 of 5 in field goals with his only miss being a 44-yard field goal that hit the right upright in the fourth quarter, but he came back to make both of his overtime field goals after that miss to secure the Cowboys' victory.

In addition, Hoyland's seven kickoffs resulted in six touchbacks and only one kickoff return for 21 yards. He also earned the award in the 2020 season opener at Nevada.

John Hoyland -- It's Good to be No. 1 -- Again: Wyoming sophomore place-kicker **John Hoyland** has gone from walk-on, to starter, to Freshman All-American, to one of the very best place-kickers in the country.

For the second time in his career, Hoyland is leading the nation in field goals made per game. He is averaging **2.75 field goals per game** this season and has **made 11 of 12 field goals through the first four games of the season for a field-goal percentage of 91.7**. He also ranks **No. 1 in the nation in scoring, with 42 total points to date**.

All Hoyland did as a freshman in 2020 was lead the nation in field goals made per game (2.17), rank No. 6 in the nation in field-goal percentage (92.9 percent) and rank No. 19 in scoring.

Now in 2022, Hoyland is once again atop the national kicking stats, again ranking No. 1 in field goals made per game.

Former Wyoming place-kicker and Colorado native, **Cooper Rothe**, became the leading scorer in University of Wyoming history over his career from 2016-19. But Rothe wasn't the only successful UW kicker from Colorado, in fact four of the all-time leading scorers in Wyoming Football history were place-kickers who grew up in Colorado.

Super Bowl Cowboys -- Wyoming Well Represented in Super Bowl LVI at the Conclusion of the 2021

NFL Season: Wyoming Athletics was well represented in last year's Super Bowl LVI. Wyoming had three alumni who were members of last year's Super Bowl teams -- the Cincinnati Bengals and Los Angeles Rams. Former Cowboy **Logan Wilson** was the starting middle linebacker for the Cincinnati Bengals in Super Bowl LVI. Wilson lead all defensive players from both team in tackles with nine total tackles in the game. One of the coaches for the Los Angeles Rams for Super Bowl LVI was Special Teams Coordinator **Joe DeCamillis**. DeCamillis was an All-America wrestler at Wyoming in 1988. He has coached in the NFL for 33 years. Another former Cowboy who was a member of the 2021 Los Angeles Rams was cornerback **Tyler Hall**. Hall played for the Cowboys from 2016-19. Wilson and Hall were teammates at Wyoming throughout their college careers.

Idaho Potato Bowl. The Pokes previously won the 2017 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl over Central Michigan by a score of 37-14, and captured a 38-17 victory over Georgia State in the 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Coaching Firsts: Head coach **Craig Bohl** and his staff accomplished two coaching firsts in Wyoming history with their appearance in the 2021 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

- Bohl and his staff became the only Wyoming football staff to guide three Cowboy teams to bowl victories.
- In 2021, Bohl and his staff became the first Wyoming football staff to lead four of their teams to bowl game appearances.
- Bohl was previously tied with UW Athletics Hall of Fame Coach **Paul Roach**, with both coaches having taken three Wyoming teams to bowl games.

A First in Wyoming History: Wyoming's bowl invitation to the 2021 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl marked the fourth time in six seasons that Wyoming earned a bowl bid (2016 Poinsettia Bowl, 2017 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl and 2021 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl). That was a first in the 125-year history of Cowboy Football. The previous best for the Wyoming Football program was four bowl game appearances in seven seasons from 1987 to 1993 (1987 Holiday Bowl, 1988 Holiday Bowl, 1990 Copper Bowl and 1993 Copper Bowl). Those four bowl appearances between 1987-93 where split between the coaching staffs of Paul Roach and Joe Tiller.

Cowboys Played a Schedule That Included Nine Postseason Teams in 2021, Wyoming One of Only Two Teams Nationally to Defeat Two Conference Champions on the Road Last Season: Wyoming's schedule last season featured nine teams who participated in postseason play last year.

UW posted a 5-4 record against those nine teams, including wins over: Mountain West Conference Champion Utah State and Mid-American Conference Champion Northern Illinois, both on the road. The only other FBS team to defeat two conference champions on the road in 2021 was Western Michigan, who defeated Northern Illinois (MAC Champions) and Pittsburgh (ACC Champions).

The Cowboys also defeated Ball State of the Mid-American Conference and Montana State, who was the runner-up for the 2021 FCS National Championship. The Cowboys concluded the season defeating Kent State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

UW lost to postseason teams Air Force, Boise State, Fresno State and Hawai'i.

Wyoming Will Face a 2022 Schedule That Will be Filled With Seven Postseason Teams From Last Season: The 2022 Wyoming schedule will be filled with seven teams who earned postseason bids a year ago.

The seven teams on Wyoming's 2022 schedule who, like the Cowboys, earned bowl bids last season, include non-conference opponents BYU and Tulsa and Mountain West Conference opponents Air Force, Boise State, Fresno State, Hawai'i and Utah State. Four of those postseason teams will play in Laramie -- Tulsa, Air Force, Boise State and Utah State.

Wyoming Football Enjoying One of the Most Successful Periods in School History:

Wyoming head coach **Craig Bohl** is entering his ninth season guiding the UW football program in 2022.

During his time in Laramie, Bohl and his coaching staff have enjoyed a great deal of success, including some accomplishments that have never before been achieved in Wyoming Football history.

Wyoming Head Coach Craig Bohl

Wyoming Head Coach Craig Bohl Named 2022 AFCA President:

Wyoming head coach Craig Bohl will lead the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) in 2022 as president of the organization. Bohl, who moves up from first vice-president, succeeds outgoing president Pat Fitzgerald of Northwestern. Bohl was elected president by members attending the Association's 2022 Convention.

Bohl enters his ninth season as the head coach at Wyoming in 2022. He became the first Wyoming head coach to lead the Cowboys to four bowl games and

the first to win three bowl games. Bohl led the Cowboys to a Mountain West Conference Mountain Division title in 2016. He has also registered three eight-win seasons at Wyoming.

Bohl came to Wyoming after 11 successful seasons at North Dakota State. Earning his first head coaching job with the Bison in 2003, Bohl guided NDSU to a 104-32 overall record with three straight NCAA FCS National Championships. Bohl's first title came in 2011 when the Bison went 14-1 and tied for the Missouri Valley Football Conference championship. They repeated in 2012 with the same 14-1 record, then in 2013 became the first undefeated FCS national champion since 1996 with a 15-0 mark. Bohl was named AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013. He also earned two AFCA Regional Coach of the Year honors in 2011 and 2013.

He returned to his alma mater, Nebraska, in 1995 as linebackers coach and was part of the Huskers' 1995 and '97 National Championships. He was named defensive coordinator at Nebraska in 2000 and stayed at Nebraska until he was named head coach at North Dakota State in 2003.

Bohl was named to the AFCA Board of Trustees in 2012. He has earned five conference coach of the year awards and two Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year honors during his head coaching career. Bohl was appointed to the 13-member NCAA Division I Football Competition Committee in January 2017 and has also served on the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee.

Head Coach Craig Bohl Earns His 150th Career Win as a Head Coach:

Wyoming head coach **Craig Bohl** won his 150th career game as a head coach in the Cowboys' 40-37 win over Tulsa on Sept. 3, 2022. Bohl's overall head-coaching record now stands at **152-83 (.647)** in 20 seasons as a head coach, nine seasons at Wyoming and 11 at North Dakota State.

He has guided the Wyoming Cowboys to four bowl game appearances and three bowl victories, making him the only coach in Wyoming Football history to accomplish each of those feats.

At North Dakota State, he won three consecutive Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) National Championships in 2011, '12 and '13. As an assistant coach at his alma mater, Nebraska, he was part of National Championships in 1995 and '97.

Wyoming's Craig Bohl and Air Force's Troy Calhoun Among the Nation's Winningest Active Head Coaches:

The two longest serving head coaches in the Mountain West Conference are Wyoming head coach **Craig Bohl** (9 years at Wyoming) and Air Force's **Troy Calhoun** (16 years at Air Force). They are also two of the winningest active coaches in college football. See below the top active coaches ranked by their total career wins as a head coach.

Cowboys Welcome Two New Veteran Line Coaches to 2022 Coaching Staff -- Oscar Giles and Joe Tripodi:

Wyoming Football added two veteran coaches to its coaching staff for the 2022 season. **Oscar Giles** will serve as Defensive Run-Game Coordinator and Defensive Tackles Coach for the Cowboys, and **Joe Tripodi** will coach the Cowboy Offensive Line.

Giles most recently coached at his alma mater, the University of Texas. He will be entering his 23rd year in college coaching in 2022.

Giles served as an assistant coach at Texas on two different coaching staffs. He originally coached on the staff of Texas Head Coach Mack Brown for nine seasons from 2005-13. During that time, Texas won the National Championship in 2005 and played in the BCS National Championship Game at the conclusion of the 2009 season, finishing as the national runner-up. For four seasons from 2017-20, Giles returned to Texas to serve as the defensive line coach on the staff of head coach Tom Herman. During that four-year period, the Longhorns won four consecutive bowl games. For three consecutive seasons from 2018-20, Texas ended the season ranked in the Top 25 -- No. 9 in 2018, No. 25 in 2019 and No. 19 in 2020.

He was an All-Southwest Conference selection his senior season at Texas in 1990.

Tripodi coached the offensive line at Temple University for three seasons from 2019-21 and previously coached nine seasons at Northern Illinois.

He is a former starting offensive lineman himself at Northwestern University of the Big Ten. He started the final 24 consecutive games he played for the Wildcats and was part of two Northwestern teams to earn bowl bids -- the 2003 Motor City Bowl and the 2005 Sun Bowl. He was the co-recipient of the inaugural Randy Walker Wildcat Award in 2006, which is awarded to the player with the best work ethic, toughness and warrior attitude.

During Tripodi's three seasons at Temple from 2019-21, he coached First Team All-America center Matt Hennessy in 2019. The Owls' earned a berth in the 2019 Military Bowl.

Prior to Temple, Tripodi spent nine seasons at Northern Illinois. During his time with the Huskies, NIU captured four MAC Championships and won seven MAC West Division titles. Tripodi was a member of eight bowl teams at Northern Illinois in nine seasons, highlighted by an appearance in the Orange Bowl at the conclusion of the 2012 season. The Huskies won the 2010 uDrove Humanitarian Bowl, the 2011 GoDaddy.com Bowl, and played in the 2013 Poinsettia Bowl, 2014 Boca Raton Bowl, 2015 Poinsettia Bowl, the 2017 Quick Lane Bowl and the 2018 Northern Illinois Boca Raton Bowl.

The Wyoming Cowboy Football team will see a number of new players take on leading roles this coming 2022 season. But while the team will be younger, it is a team that features a strong group of talented and experienced players.

Among the talented returners for the Cowboys are running back **Titus Swen**, linebacker **Easton Gibbs**, nose tackle **Cole Godbout**, offensive tackle **Frank Crum** and kick returner/cornerback **Cam Stone**. All five of those individuals earned All-Conference recognition a year ago. Stone is a sophomore. All the other All-Conference returnees are juniors.

Other top returners on offense include: senior offensive lineman **Eric Abojei**, sophomore wide receiver **Joshua Cobbs**, sophomore fullback/tight end **Parker Christensen** and junior tight end **Treyton Welch**.

To be considered for a spot on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining strong academic standing.

A native of Mt. Carmel, Ill., Marcotte has faced a series of challenges on the football field, including a severe knee injury followed by a second knee injury -- both of which he overcame.

With a bachelor's degree in political science and now pursuing his law degree, Marcotte sees politics as a possibility in his future.

Titus Swen Selected to Doak Walker Award Watch List, Award is Presented to the Nation's Top College Running Back:

University of Wyoming junior running back **Titus Swen** has been named to the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List by the PwC SMU Athletic Forum. The Forum annually presents the award to the nation's top college running back. This is the first time Swen has been named to the preseason list.

Swen is coming off an extremely productive 2021 season. He earned Second Team All-Mountain West Conference honors from Pro Football Focus, while rushing for a career high 785 yards and seven touchdowns.

Swen averaged 5.95 yards per carry to rank No. 2 in the Mountain West and No. 26 in the nation. He recorded two 100-yard rushing games in '21 -- 166 yards in a home win over Colorado State and 169 yards in a road win over eventual Mountain West Champion Utah State. The 169 yards at Utah State included a 98-yard run for a touchdown that put on display Swen's explosive running style.

University athletic departments nominate candidates for the award and can continue to do so through October.

The PwC SMU Athletic Forum Board of Directors will name ten semifinalists in November. Three finalists, as voted on by the Doak Walker Award National Selection Committee, will be announced later in November. The committee will cast a second vote in December to determine the recipient. The National Selection Committee consists of past recipients, former NFL All-Pro and college All-America running backs, media members and selected special representatives.

The recipient of the 2022 Doak Walker Award will be announced live on The Home Depot College Football Awards.

The award is named for SMU's three-time All-America running back Doak Walker. It is the only major collegiate award that requires all candidates to be in good academic standing and on schedule to graduate within one year of other students of the same classification.

Wyoming Football History and Facilities



2022 Marks the 126th Season of Wyoming Football:

The 2022 season will mark the 126th season of Wyoming Football. The Cowboys first season was 1893.

Since that first season, there have been only four seasons in which Wyoming has not played football. In 1918, Wyoming did not play any games due to an influenza epidemic. The other three seasons Wyoming did not field a team were 1943, '44 and '45 during World War II.

Wyoming Football's All-Time Record:

The Wyoming Cowboy Football program has played a total of 1,171 games in its history. Wyoming is 35 games under .500 all-time (554 wins to 589 losses), and has played 46 more road games than home games in its history (552 home games to 598 road games). The Cowboys played their 1,000th game on Sept. 6, 2008, against Air Force.

War Memorial Stadium Will Host Its 73rd Season in 2022, Wins 250th Game in Stadium History in Border War Victory Over Colorado State in 2021:

The 2022 college football season will be the 73rd season of War Memorial Stadium.

The Cowboys won their 250th game in War Memorial Stadium on Nov. 6, 2021, with a 31-17 win over Colorado State.

Wyoming has won 65.9 percent of its games in War Memorial Stadium.

"The War" first opened on Sept. 16, 1950, with UW recording a 61-13 win over Montana State. War Memorial's original capacity was 20,000 in 1950. It was expanded to 25,500 in 1970, and the seating was increased to a capacity of 33,500 in 1977.

Following reconstruction of the upper deck on the West side of War Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2004, the new capacity of War Memorial Stadium was 30,514. With the construction of the Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites in 2009-10, the current capacity is 29,181.

Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center Benefitting All UW Student-Athletes:

The University of Wyoming held a Grand Opening for the Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center (HAPC) on Aug. 18, 2018. The HAPC is one of the preeminent athletic facilities in the country. It will add 71,000 square feet of new space and will expand the current Curtis and Marian Rochelle

Athletics Center to over 118,000 square feet.

"A successful athletics program generates excitement," Wyoming Gov. Matt Mead said in when fundraising was announced. "This leads to better student recruitment, better alumni support and stronger schools. I recommended \$20 million in matching funds for the expansion and renovation of the Rochelle Athletics Center for these reasons. I thank Marian H. Rochelle for this generous gift and her continued support of the University of Wyoming."

The project is funded by \$24 million in private donations that were raised by UW Athletics and the UW Foundation and \$20 million in state matching approved by Gov. Mead and the Legislature. Overwhelming interest by donors—55 total—saw the fundraising efforts completed ahead of schedule. Marian Rochelle and her family donated \$3 million as a leadership gift to kick off the project, and the combined gifts of Marian Rochelle and her daughter April Brimmer Kunz have since grown to \$4.1 million.

"Mick and Susie McMurry's generosity and their commitment to making the University of Wyoming a premier university in both athletics and academics will be symbolized by the High Altitude Performance Center that will bear their name," says Tom Burman, UW athletics director. "We also want to thank Marian Rochelle and April Brimmer Kunz for their generous lead gift for this project. And we of course want to thank Governor Mead and the members of the Wyoming State Legislature for making funds available to match the private funds that we raised for this facility."

"The High Altitude Performance Center will be one of the best facilities of its kind in all of college athletics. It will provide the student-athletes in all of our sports the athletic training resources to compete with the best in the nation, and it will provide our academic counseling unit exceptional resources to help our student-athletes achieve their educational and career goals."

"The Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center will redefine Cowboy football," says UW Head Football Coach Craig Bohl. "This facility will play a critical role in our vision of recruiting to what we call the Wyoming Profile. That recruiting effort involves attracting a young man who is committed to earning a meaningful degree from an outstanding academic institution and has a laser-like focus to win Mountain West Conference championships. The High Altitude Performance Center will put us at the top of the league in terms of training and academic facilities, which is where we also aspire to be on the field of competition."

The new facility will focus on the unique advantages of training at an altitude of 7,220 feet. From strength and conditioning training, to nutrition, to recovery and rehabilitation services following injuries, the HAPC will serve the needs of all of Wyoming's 400-plus student-athletes.

The facility's design will stay true to the architectural tradition of iconic sandstone buildings featured throughout the UW campus.

Located just beyond the north end zone, the High Altitude Performance Center will enhance the aesthetics of War Memorial Stadium. Due to its location, the HAPC will be highly visible for national television audiences. It will show the commitment that the state of Wyoming has in ensuring Wyoming Athletics continues to successfully compete at the NCAA Division I level -- the highest level of competition in college sports.

The ground level of the HAPC will house both an Olympic sport weight-training area and a separate strength and conditioning center for the Cowboy football team that will overlook Jonah Field. Also on the first floor will be a sports medicine area that will nearly double the size of its previous space, allowing for more effective and efficient treatment of UW student-athletes. The football locker room, like the football strength and conditioning area, will overlook the field and will include a player lounge.

The second floor will include an expansive academic center to house academic counselors, tutoring areas and a computer lab, as well as enhanced and renovated football offices, meeting rooms, a new recruiting lounge and the nutrition center/training table. The theater-style team meeting room will span both the first and second floors.

Construction on the project will begin after the conclusion of the 2016 Cowboy football season. It is estimated that the project will take 18-20 months to complete.

The original Curtis and Marian Rochelle Athletics Center was opened in 2001 at a total cost of \$9.4 million. Fundraising for the RAC included a historic \$4.2 million gift from the Rochelles, which was the largest donation in school history at the time. A total of 167 donors contributed to the original RAC.

Chad Muma Drafted in 2022 NFL Draft: University Former Wyoming Cowboy linebacker **Chad Muma** was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the 70th overall selection in the 2022 NFL Draft. Muma was the sixth pick in the third round of the NFL Draft.

Muma becomes the eighth Cowboy selected in the NFL Draft in the past eight seasons since **Craig Bohl** took over as head coach at Wyoming.

Muma was recognized as one of the top defensive players in college football in 2021. He is coming off a 2021 season in which he was named a Second Team All-American by both the Walter Camp Football Foundation and Pro Football Focus (PFF). He was a Third Team All-America selection by Associated Press.

A native of Lone Tree, Colo., Muma was one of only six national finalists for this year's Butkus Award, honoring the nation's best linebacker, and he was one of 18 national semifinalists for the Chuck Bednarik Award, recognizing the nation's outstanding defensive player. For the past two consecutive seasons, Muma was selected First Team All-Mountain West Conference by conference head coaches and media.

Earlier this year, he was selected to and played in the 2022 Reese's Senior Bowl. Muma was also invited to and participated in the 2022 NFL Combine.

Muma ranked No. 3 in the nation in solo tackles (6.5 per game) and ranked No. 4 in the nation in total tackles (10.9 per game) for the 2021 season. He also tied for No. 2 in the nation in interceptions returned for touchdowns, with two "pick sixes" on the year. Muma recorded double figures in tackles in 11 of 13 games during the 2021 season. He was credited with 142 tackles for the 2021 season, which ranks as the fourth best single-season total in school history behind only linebacker Galand Thaxton, who had 158 tackles in 1986 and 143 in 1987, and free safety John Salley, who had 143 tackles in 1982. For his career, Muma totalled 267 career tackles.

He first made his mark as one of the nation's top linebackers in 2020. He ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 3 in the nation in tackles, averaging 11.8 tackles per game. He also ranked No. 16 in the nation in solo tackles, averaging 5.5 per game. He was selected First Team All-Mountain West by MW head coaches and media in 2020.

Muma helped lead Wyoming to two bowl victories during his Wyoming career -- the 2019 Arizona Bowl Championship and the 2021 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl title.

Muma became the eighth Wyoming Cowboy to be selected in the NFL Draft during the first eight seasons Craig Bohl has been the head coach at Wyoming. The previous NFL Draft picks during the Bohl era include: **2015 Mark Nzeocha**, Dallas Cowboys, 7th Round, 19th Pick; **2017 Brian Hill**, Atlanta Falcons, 5th Round 12th Pick; **2017 Chase Roullier**, Washington Commanders, 6th Round 15th Pick; **2018 Josh Allen**, Buffalo Bills, 1st Round, 7th Pick; **2019 Marcus Epps**, Minnesota Vikings, 6th Round, 18th Pick; **2020 Logan Wilson**, Cincinnati Bengals, 3rd Round, 1st Pick; **2020 Cassh Maluia**, New England Patriots, 6th Round, 25th Pick; and now **2022 Chad Muma**, Jacksonville Jaguars, 3rd Round, 6th Pick.

Muma will join 16 other former Wyoming Cowboys who were on NFL rosters at the conclusion of the 2021 NFL season -- some on active rosters and others on developmental squads. That was more than any other Mountain West Conference school.

Head Coach Craig Bohl



Craig Bohl will be entering his ninth season leading the University of Wyoming Football program in 2022 and his 20th season as a head coach at the collegiate level. During the past eight seasons under the direction of Bohl, Wyoming Football has enjoyed a level of excellence that has never been reached in the rich history of Cowboy Football.

Bohl and his coaching staff became the first Wyoming Football staff to lead UW to three straight bowl victories -- the 2017 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, the 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl and the 2021 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

He and his staff also are the only football staff in Wyoming history to lead four different teams to bowl appearances. Wyoming's 2021 bowl appearance marked the fourth time in six seasons (2016, '17, '19 and '21) that Bohl guided the Cowboys to a bowl bid, which is a first in school history. The previous best was four bowl appearances in seven seasons (1987, '88, '90 and '93).

Bohl currently serves as President of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), having been elected as President at the 2022 AFCA Convention, and he serves on the AFCA Board of Trustees. He was appointed to the 13-member NCAA Division I Football Competition Committee in January of 2017 and has also served on the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee.

In terms of success, the Cowboys have become regular contenders in the race for the Mountain West Conference title. UW won eight games in 2016, '17 and '19, and hosted the 2016 Mountain West Championship Game by virtue of being the highest ranked team in the conference at the time of the championship game. The Cowboys earned bowl eligibility a fifth time in the 2018 season.

During Bohl's tenure, Wyoming has had more former Cowboys on NFL rosters than at any other period in Wyoming history. There were a total of 16 former Cowboys on NFL rosters as of Jan. 1, 2022 -- some on active rosters and others on developmental squads.

In terms of NFL Draft picks, UW's most recent was linebacker Chad Muma, who was selected as the 6th pick in the 3rd round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars. Muma became the eighth Wyoming Cowboy to be selected in the NFL Draft during the first eight seasons Bohl has been the head coach at Wyoming. The previous NFL Draft picks during the Bohl era include: 2015 Mark Nzeocha (Dallas Cowboys, 7th Round, 19th Pick); 2017 Brian Hill (Atlanta Falcons, 5th Round 12th Pick); 2017 Chase Roullier (Washington Commanders, 6th Round 15th Pick); 2018 Josh Allen (Buffalo Bills, 1st Round, 7th Pick); 2019 Marcus Epps (Minnesota Vikings, 6th Round, 18th Pick); 2020 Logan Wilson (Cincinnati Bengals, 3rd Round, 1st Pick); and 2020 Cassh Maluia (New England Patriots, 6th Round, 25th Pick).

Wyoming has had at least one player selected in six of the last eight NFL Drafts (2015, '17, '18, '19, '20 and '22) and twice had two players taken in the same draft (2017 and 2020).

The excitement surrounding Wyoming Football included the extensive coverage of former Cowboy quarterback Josh Allen, who was selected as the No. 7 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills. That marked the highest selection by a Wyoming Cowboy in the history of the program and was the second highest selection by a Mountain West player since Utah's Alex Smith was selected No. 1 in 2005 by the San Francisco 49ers. Leading up to Allen being drafted, Wyoming's Pro Day was covered live by both ESPN and the NFL Network. Beginning with the 2017 football season through the 2018 NFL Draft, media coverage of Wyoming Football for that time period was estimated by Joyce Julius & Associates at over \$159 million.

Cowboy linebackers Wilson (in 2019) and Muma (in 2021) were each one of only six national finalists for the 2019 and 2021 Butkus Awards, respectively. The Butkus Award honors the nation's top collegiate linebacker. Wilson earned multiple All-America honors, including being named a First Team All-American by Pro Football Focus, Second Team by USA Today and Third Team by the Associated Press. Muma was named a Second Team All-American by both the Walter Camp Football Foundation and Pro Football Focus, while earning Third Team All-America honors from the Associated Press.

In 2018, Wyoming had two finalists for national awards for the first time in program history. Place-kicker Cooper Rothe was one of three national finalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, that honors the nation's top collegiate place-kicker each year. Free safety Marcus Epps was one of only three national finalists for the Burlsworth Trophy, which is awarded to the most outstanding football player in America who began his career as a walk-on. Epps went on to be drafted by the Minnesota Vikings in the sixth round of the 2019 NFL Draft.

During Bohl's tenure as Wyoming's head coach, he has had a freshman earn Freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) five times. The most recent Cowboy freshman to receive the honor was place-kicker John Hoyland in 2020. The other four Pokes coached by Bohl to be named Freshman All-Americans by the FWAA were: safety Andrew Wingard (2015), linebacker Logan Wilson (2016), center Keegan Cryder (2018) and defensive end Solomon Byrd (2019).

The 2021 season saw the Cowboys score its most points ever in a bowl game in a dominant 52-38 win over Kent State. The Cowboy rushing attack once again ranked among the best in the nation at No. 20, and the Wyoming pass defense ranked No. 12 in the country in fewest passing yards allowed. Wyoming was again one of the most disciplined teams in the country, ranking No. 26 in fewest penalties committed. The Pokes concluded the season with a 7-6 record for their fourth winning record in the past six seasons.

In 2016, Bohl's team defeated two Top 25 ranked opponents, was named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) for one of those wins and received votes itself in the national polls. Wyoming also captured the Mountain Division title of the Mountain West Conference, earned the right to host the 2016 MW Football Championship Game as the highest ranked team in the conference and was invited to the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. His Cowboys ended the year with an 8-6 record and featured one of the NCAA's top scoring offenses, averaging 35.9 points per game to rank No. 25 in the nation. Bohl was recognized for his turnaround of Cowboy Football by being named the 2016 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in voting by conference head coaches and media.

Two Cowboys earned All-America honors in 2016 in running back Brian Hill and center Chase Roullier. Linebacker Logan Wilson earned Freshman All-America honors in 2016, joining Andrew Wingard, who earned Freshman All-America honors a year earlier.

Bohl came to Wyoming after building a national power at North Dakota State as a head coach for 11 seasons from 2003-13. His teams won three consecutive National Championships at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level in 2011, '12 and '13. NDSU became only the second FCS school in NCAA history to win three consecutive national football titles, tied the FCS record for consecutive wins (24 from 2011-13) and became the first undefeated FCS National Champion since 1996.

In 2012 and '13, Bohl received both The Sports Network Eddie Robinson FCS National Coach of the Year Award and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS National Coach of the Year Award. He became the first coach in the first 27 years of the Eddie Robinson Award to win it in consecutive seasons. In 2013, he also received the Liberty Mutual FCS Coach of the Year Award, which is presented in partnership with the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame. His other National Coach of the Year honor came in 2006, when he was recognized by the Football Gazette as the FCS National Coach of the Year and the Northwest Region Coach of the Year.

In addition to his 20 years of experience as a head coach, Bohl has 19 years of experience as a full-time assistant coach at the collegiate level and three seasons as a graduate assistant. His last eight years as an assistant coach were spent at Nebraska. He was the linebackers coach under head coach Tom Osborne for five of those seasons and was part of the 1995 and '97 Nebraska National Championship teams.

Born July 27, 1958, Bohl will be 64 years old when the 2022 season kicks off. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Nebraska in 1982. Bohl's family includes wife Leia, and children Mallory and Morgan, Aaron and Elijah.

About BYU: The Cougars head into Saturday's contest with a 2-1 overall record and ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press poll and No. 23 in Coaches' poll after falling on the road at Oregon last Saturday by a score of 41-20. BYU has wins over top-ten top-25 ranked Baylor and South Florida.

BYU is scoring 32.0 points per game and are allowing 27.3 points per contest. BYU averages 435 yards of total offense per game passing for 283 yards per game and rushing for 152 yards. Defensively, the Cougars allow 340.3 yards per game, as opponents pass for 178.7 yards and pass for 161.7 yards.

The Cougar offense is led by quarterback Jaren Hall, as he passes for 275.7 yards per game completing 68.8 percent of his passes with five touchdowns and one interception. Running back Christopher Brooks averages 64.7 yards per game with two touchdowns. Wide receiver Chase Roberts has 15 catches for 223 yards with a touchdown.

The BYU defense is led by linebacker Max Tooley with 26 tackles. He also has one interception on the season. Linebacker Ben Bywater has 23 tackles on the season and is one of five players tied for the team lead with one sack on the season. He has also added 1.5 tackles for loss, which is also tied for the team lead.

Head Coach Kalani Sitake: BYU head coach Kalani Sitake enters his seventh season as head coach at his alma mater. He owns a 50-30 overall record with the Cougars. He was a 2021 Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award Finalist and 2021 George Munger Collegiate Coach of the Year Award Semifinalist for the second consecutive year after leading BYU to 10-3 record, including 6-1 mark against Power 5 teams, and No. 19 final ranking, the program's first back-to-back top-20 rankings since 2006 and 2007.

With an 11-1 record in 2020, Sitake's team achieved only the sixth one-loss or undefeated season in BYU football history and the first since 1996 when quarterback Steve Sarkisian led BYU to a 14-1 record and No. 5 final ranking after winning the Cotton Bowl. BYU also recorded 11 wins for the first time since 2009 and only the 12th time overall in program history. In 2009, BYU finished ranked No. 12 in both final polls with an 11-2 record.

He helped mentor 28 NFL Draft picks as a coach, most recently with five players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft, highlighted by No. 2 overall pick Zach Wilson (New York Jets). Left tackle Brady Christensen went in the third round to the Carolina Panthers while receiver Dax Milne (Washington), defensive tackle Khyiris Tonga (Chicago) and defensive back Chris Wilcox (Tampa Bay) were each seventh-round selections. Other recent selections include BYU linebackers Sione Takitaki (2019 third round by the Cleveland Browns) and Fred Warner (2018 third round by the San Francisco 49ers) along with running back Jamaal Williams (2017 fourth round by the Green Bay Packers)

Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000

Pokes' Overtime History: Wyoming has played 18 overtime games in its history. The most recent overtime game the Cowboys played was Sept. 3, 2022. The Cowboys defeated Tulsa 40-37 in double overtime. Wyoming has played five overtime games at home in War Memorial Stadium. Two of Wyoming's 18 overtime games have been played on neutral sites. The other 11 overtime games have been played on the road.

RECAP: The Wyoming Cowboys fell to the Illinois Fighting Illini in the season opener on Saturday by a score of 38-6 in Memorial Stadium in Champaign, Illinois. It marked Wyoming's first loss in a non-conference season opener since falling to Iowa in 2017. The contest saw 19 new players make their debuts and nine of those make their first career starts.

"We came into the contest with a plan to win, but we didn't execute," UW head coach Craig Bohl said. "Illinois had some playmakers make plays. To beat a Big Ten team, you need to be ahead in the turnover margin, and we didn't do that. We have to work on things to get better and move forward. This will be a learning experience for us, and our guys will band together."

Illinois held the Pokes to 222 yards of total offense. The Fighting Illini offense added 475 yards rushing for 260 yards and passing for 215. Illinois held a 36:36-23:24 advantage in time of possession.

The Cowboy offense was paced by Titus Swen with 98 yards rushing on 17 carries. Quarterback Andrew Peasley rushed for 76 yards and was 6-of-21 passing for 40 yards. Joshua Cobbs added two catches for 14 yards.

The defense was led by linebacker Easton Gibbs with nine tackles. Nose tackle Cole Godbout added seven tackles and one tackle for loss. DeVonne Harris, a defensive end added a career-high six tackles with a tackle for loss. In his first start, linebacker Shae Suaunaona added six tackles for his career high. Wyatt Ekeler added six tackles as well for a career high.

Kicker John Hoyland added a pair of field goals including a career-best 46 yarder.

Illinois got on the board first using a 60-yard kickoff return by Peyton Vinning to set up a two-play drive that ended in a Tommy DeVito touchdown pass to Chase Brown from 14 yards 41 seconds into the contest.

The Cowboy defense settled from their as the Wyoming offense tacked on a field goal from John Hoyland from 22-yards for a 7-3 contest in the closing minute of the first quarter. The drive was set up by a trio of runs. Swen added an 11-yard rush followed by a 17-yard and 37-yard rush from Peasley.

The Illini took a 14-7 advantage in the second quarter on a 11-yard run from Brown with 8:12 left in the first half. Illinois would add a field goal by Caleb Griffin from 27-yards for a 17-7 lead with 4:33 left in the frame. It was paced by an Illini interception returned into Cowboy territory.

The Pokes opened the second half with a field goal for a 17-6 contest for Illinois. This time a career long from Hoyland from 46-yards. The first drive of the frame saw Swen open with a 25-yard scamper. He also added an 11-yard carry, as Treyton Welch and Will Pelissier add a catch on the drive.

Illinois made it a 24-6 contest with 2:56 left in the third quarter on a 11-play, 78-yard drive. The tally was a pass from DeVito to Pat Bryant from six yards. The score was set up by a ground game for the Illini rushing for 31 yards.

The Cowboys went for it on fourth down but were stopped by Illinois. The Fighting Illinois responded with another score to take a 31-6 lead in the opening seconds of the fourth quarter. Brown found the endzone from five yards for his second score of the day.

The Illini added another score in the fourth quarter and took the contest 38-6.

The Illini were led by running back Chase Brown with 151 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Quarterback Tommy DeVito added 192 yards passing going 27-of-37 with two touchdowns.

RECAP: The Wyoming Cowboys excelled in all three phases of Saturday's home opener against the Tulsa Golden Hurricane. Wyoming scored a defensive touchdown, blocked a punt for a touchdown and scored two offensive touchdowns plus place-kicker John Hoyland made a career long 55-yard field goal and tied a career high with four made field goals, including the game winner in the second overtime as Wyoming captured a 40-37 double overtime thriller.

Offensively, Cowboy quarterback Andrew Peasley had an outstanding day, completing 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 256 yards, two TD passes and no interceptions. Peasley also led Wyoming in rushing with 45 yards and accounted for 301 yards of total offense. He threw a touchdown pass of 48 yards to wide receiver Will Pelissier in the second quarter to give Wyoming a 17-13 lead, and he threw a 51-yard TD to wideout Joshua Cobbs in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 34-34 and force overtime. Cobbs set a new career high in receiving yards with 77 yards on five catches. Pelissier set career highs in both receptions (3) and receiving yards (67). Fullback/tight end Parker Christensen added four catches for 45 yards, which were both career highs for him. Eight different Cowboys caught passes from Peasley on the day. UW running back Titus Swen added 40 yards rushing on Saturday. The Pokes used four different running backs in the game as Dawaii McNeely, D.Q. James and Joey Braasch all joined Swen in carrying the ball.

Wyoming's defense got the Cowboys off to a fast start as the game began with a big play by defensive tackle Jordan Bertagnole and safety Miles Williams. The two Cowboys put pressure on Tulsa quarterback Davis Brin on the second play of the game at the Tulsa 28-yard line. Bertagnole punched the ball out of Brin's hands and the ball bounded into the end zone and was recovered by Cowboy linebacker Easton Gibbs for a touchdown. Place-kicker John Hoyland added the extra point and Wyoming had a 7-0 lead only 37 seconds into the game. Gibbs would lead the Pokes in tackles on the day with eight. His running mate at linebacker, Shae Suaiaunoa was credited with seven tackles and had a huge sack in the second overtime. Nickel back Keonte Glington recorded six tackles, one fumble recovery and three pass breakups, including a critical pass breakup on Tulsa's final possession in the second overtime to force the Golden Hurricane into a field-goal attempt that was unsuccessful and gave Wyoming its 40-37 victory.

Saturday's game marked the first time since a Sept. 30, 2017, Wyoming home win over Texas State (45-10) that Wyoming scored a touchdown on offense, defense and special teams. Wyoming's special teams' touchdown came in the third quarter when Cowboy wide receiver Ryan Marquez blocked a Tulsa punt and then picked up the blocked punt and returned it nine yards for a TD.

RECAP: For the second straight week, all three phases of the Wyoming Cowboy Football team played critical roles in capturing a home victory. Wyoming was fueled by three turnovers from its defense that also held Northern Colorado to 147 yards of total offense, including only 15 rushing yards. The Wyoming special teams were led by place-kicker John Hoyland, who made four field goals for the second consecutive week to tie a career high, and the Cowboy offense featured an extremely balanced attack, rushing for 149 yards and passing for 144 for a total of 293 yards of total offense. In the end, the Cowboys recorded a 33-10 win to improve to 2-1 on the season. Northern Colorado fell to 0-2.

Wyoming's outstanding defense was led by linebacker Easton Gibbs, who totalled nine tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and two quarterback hurries. His running mate at linebacker, Shae Suiaunoa, tallied a career high eight tackles, 1.0 sack, 1.0 tackle for loss, one quarterback hurry and the first pass interception of his career. Safety Wyatt Ekeler added five tackles and a fumble recovery. Ekeler's fumble recovery was caused by his fellow safety Miles Williams, who also added three tackles. Defensive end Oluwaseyi Omotosho had a career high 3.0 sacks and forced one fumble. Omotosho is the first Cowboy to record 3.0 sacks in a single game since former Cowboy linebacker and current Jacksonville Jaguar Chad Muma had 3.0 sacks against UNLV in 2020. Cornerback Cam Stone intercepted the first pass of his career to go with a pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.

On offense, junior running back Titus Swen rushed for 76 yards on 15 carries and scored a career high three rushing touchdowns. He was joined by running backs Dawaiia McNeely, with 48 rushing yards, and Joey Braasch, with 38. Cowboy quarterback Andrew Peasley completed 63.3 percent of his passes (19 of 30) for his second straight game completing over 60 percent of his pass attempts. Peasley threw for 144 yards and once again spread the ball around to eight different receivers. One of those receivers, Wyatt Wieland, caught a career high five passes for a career best 53 yards. Wide receiver Joshua Cobbs and fullback/tight end Parker Christensen each added five catches for 44 and 31 yards, respectively.

On special teams, place-kicker Hoyland was not only a perfect 4 for 4 in field goals on the day, but he also was a perfect 3 for 3 in PATs and scored a total of 15 of Wyoming's 33 points. Cowboy punter Clayton Stewart averaged an amazing 48.5 yards per punt on four punts.

"This game didn't turn out the way I thought it would, but I was glad we got some separation at the end," said Wyoming head coach Craig Bohl at his postgame press conference. "There were some really good things we did. I thought our defensive guys did really well. We got good pressure on the quarterback.

"There was some resolve (among our guys), and there's things to improve. John Hoyland continues to be money, and we are excited about that.

"I'm glad we were able to pull away in the end. What you have (against an FCS opponent) is an opportunity for (their) players to show they belong on a different stage. You're going to get max effort, and we told our guys that. We anticipated that today and certainly got that (from Northern Colorado).

I know they talk about having a prolific passing game (at UNC), which I think they do, but we were able to make them one dimensional. If you can shut the run down, then you have so many more tools in your toolbox. That was going to be critical for us. They were constantly behind the sticks and then our defensive linemen were able to pin their ears back and get some pressure. I don't know how many times we hit the quarterback, but it was countless times."

RECAP: From their first possession of Friday night's game, the Wyoming Cowboys showed they were determined to win their best football of the season and they did just that, playing their third straight game by capturing a 17-14 win over the previously unbeaten Air Force Falcons.

The Cowboy offense outgained the Falcons on both the ground and through the air on Friday night. Wyoming accounted for 180 rushing yards to Air Force's 171. The Cowboys threw for 162 yards to Air Force's 101. Wyoming also converted 6 of 11 third-down attempts and won the all-important time of possession battle when playing the Falcons, holding the ball for 30 minutes and 34 seconds to Air Force's 29 minutes and 26 seconds.

Facing an Air Force rushing attack that entered the game ranked No. 1 in the nation, averaging 508.5 yards per game, the Cowboy defense held the Falcons to 171 rushing yards -- 337.5 yards under their average.

There were plenty of individual accolades to pass around for the Pokes. Middle linebacker and defensive captain Easton Gibbs did not start the game after suffering with flu-like symptoms Thursday night and into Friday. Although he didn't start the game, he came in early in the first quarter and ended the day with six tackles and 1.0 tackle for a loss. His fellow defensive captain, nose tackle Cole Godbout, led all players in the game with nine tackles, had 1.0 tackle for loss and two quarterback hurries. Redshirt freshman defensive end Braden Siders had the best game of his young career with six tackles, and defensive tackle Jordan Bertagnole also made six tackles. Redshirt freshman linebacker Read Sunn, who started in place of Gibbs, contributed four tackles against the Falcons.

Cowboy running back Titus Swen recorded his first 100-yard rushing game of the season and the fourth of his career with 102 rushing yards. Swen scored the winning touchdown with 6:06 remaining in the game on a five-yard run where he would not be stopped -- forcing his way into the end zone with the help of his teammates who pushed the Air Force defense back over the goal line. Swen also had a huge run on Wyoming's final possession of the game. Facing a third and 13 at the Wyoming 29-yard line, Swen cut back to his right and out ran the Air Force defense for a 17-yard gain and a first down. That play and a play later in the drive when his running back mate, Dawaiian McNeely, gained three yards on a third and two at the Air Force 46 enabled the Wyoming offense to run out the final 4 minutes and 47 seconds of the game and prevented Air Force from getting the ball back.

Quarterback Andrew Peasley played another exceptional game for the Cowboys. He completed 18 of 23 passes for a 78.3 completion percentage, 162 yards, one touchdown pass and one interception. It marked the third consecutive game this season that Peasley completed over 60 percent of his passes. He completed 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) in a win over Tulsa and 19 of 30 passes (63.3 percent) against Northern Colorado in a home victory. It marks the first time a Cowboy quarterback has completed over 60 percent of his passes in three consecutive games since Cameron Coffman accomplished that in 2015 against Washington State, New Mexico and Appalachian State.

The Wyoming Cowboys played a near perfect first half. Wyoming's defense held Air Force to only 87 yards of total offense and only 47 rushing yards, while the Cowboy offense generated 183 total yards in the first half, including 111 rushing yards and 72 passing yards.
