

THE STARTING FIVE

1 Winners of the very first NCAA Men's Basketball Championship (1939), Oregon is making its 12th overall NCAA Tournament appearance. The Ducks are 14-10 in Tournament games, including an NCAA Sweet 16 run last season. This will be just the third time that Oregon has made back-to-back Tournament appearances in school history, joining 1960-61 and 2002-03.

2 Oregon has set the school record for most victories in a four-year span. The Ducks have 96 wins over the last four seasons, having surpassed the legendary "Tall Firs," who won 94 games between 1935-39, culminating in the 1939 NCAA title.

3Eight Ducks have previous NCAA Tournament experience. Johnathan Loyd, Damyean Dotson, Waverly Austin, Dominic Artis, Ben Carter and Nick Lucenti all played for Oregon in last season's Tournament. Mike Moser was a member of UNLV's 2013 NCAA team, and Jason Calliste played for Detroit's 2012 NCAA squad.

4 Oregon's bench continues to be exceptionally productive in 2013-14. The Ducks are averaging 29.2 points per game from the reserves (933 total). By comparison, opponents are getting 16.3 points per game off the bench (520 total).

5 Already the winningest player in school history, when Johnathan Loyd takes the floor Thursday against BYU, he will be playing in his school record 143rd game, passing former teammate E.J. Singler, who made 142 appearances (2010-13).

* The Ducks are 11-8 versus the top 100 RPI teams in the nation.

*The Ducks played 23 games vs. top 111 RPI (14-9), and only 10 games versus teams lower than 111 (not to mention just 5 versus those in the 200-plus range). Therefore, two-thirds of Oregon's schedule has been against the top third of teams nationally.

* No losses to teams outside the top 104 RPI.

* An 8-6 road/neutral record with wins at UCLA, Utah and Mississippi, plus neutral site victories over Georgetown and Illinois.

DUCKS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS

Oregon leads the Pac-12 and is seventh nationally in free throw shooting at 76.6 percent. The Ducks have three of the top six free throw shooters in the league in Joseph Young (.884, first), Jason Calliste (.858, third) and Johnathan Loyd (.820, sixth). What's more imprerssive, Young had only five misses in Pac-12 play (86-of-91). Oregon also leads the league in scoring (81.8 ppg; 11th nationally), and is second in steals (7.9 per game; 20th nationally).

EIGHT POINTS FROM A TITLE

Oregon was eight points away from winning the Pac-12 title in 2013-14. Had the Ducks won the four Pac-12 games they lost by two points (Stanford, UCLA, Arizona, Arizona State), they would have tied Arizona for the league crown at 14-4.

CALLISTE LEADS THREE-POINT CHARGE, NAMED 6TH MAN OF THE YEAR

Oregon has made 79 three-pointers during its last nine games (8.8 per game). That's thanks in no small part to Jason Calliste, who leads the Pac-12 and is fourth nationally in three-point field goal percentage. He has hit 63-of-124 for 50.8 percent on the year. The Oregon single season record is .500 by Anthony Lever in 2001-02. Calliste was named the Pac-12's Sixth Man of the Year by collegehoops daily.com. The transfer from Detroit is averaging 12.4 points in 26.4 minutes per game off the bench.

YOUNG, LOYD, ENTER SINGLE SEASON LISTS

During the March 13 game versus UCLA, Joseph Young entered Oregon's single season top 10 in scoring and free throws, while Johnathan Loyd did the same in assists. Young has now scored 595 points in 2013-14, which ranks eighth all-time at Oregon. He has also made 145 free throws, which is tied for 10th on the UO single season list. Loyd has given out a career-high 150 assists this season, which is tied for ninth all-time at Oregon.

"HOO-AH" DUCKS HONOR TROOPS WITH A WIN IN SOUTH KOREA

Oregon opened the regular season on Nov. 8 by defeating Georgetown 82-75 in the Armed Forces Classic on Army Base Camp Humphreys in South Korea. The Ducks travelled more than 12,000 miles round trip to participate in a game that honored the troops serving America. The crowd in attendance consisted entirely of active military members and their families based at Camp Humphreys. At the end of the game, Oregon players removed their jerseys and gave them to the troops, who had stormed the court to celebrate with the Ducks.

The team also got a helicopter hangar tour, where the servicemen and women who fly and maintain four different types of helicopters - Chinook, Blackhawk, Apache and Kiowa - showed off their impressive machines. The Ducks also served lunch to the troops, had a meet and greet at the gym and conducted a kids' clinic. Said Oregon coach Dana Altman after the game, "the servicemen and women came out and cheered for us and made us feel like we were the best team in America, but it's those men and women who are the real heroes. Our guys are going to remember this experience for a long time."

Oregon continues to remember the troops they met in South Korea by breaking their team huddle with the Army cry "HOO-AH" as opposed to the traditional "TEAM."

BENCH PRODUCTION

Oregon's bench continues to be exceptionally productive in 2013-14. The Ducks are averaging 29.2 points per game from the reserves (933 total). By comparison, opponents are getting 16.3 points per game off the bench (450 total). March 12 in the opening round of the Pac-12 Tournament, the Ducks outscored Oregon State's bench 46-6. Two prior to that in Los Angeles, the bench came through with 35 points at USC and 39 points at UCLA. The bench scored a season-best 47 points Jan. 19 at Oregon State. Other big games from the bench include 44 in the OT win versus Brigham Young, 43 against both San Francisco and North Dakota, 38 versus UC Irvine, 37 against Washington, 36 in the OT win at Ole Miss, 36 at home against UCLA and 31 at Washington State.

ON THE PERIMETER

Oregon's perimeter defense has shown marked improvement the last 14 games. During that span, only three opponents have shot better than 32 percent from beyond the arc and six of 13 teams hit 25 percent or less.

CLOSE GAMES CONTINUE

Oregon has played four overtime games as well as 15 contests that have been decided by single digits so far in 2013-14.

YOUNG, MOSER HONORED BY PAC-12

Joseph Young was named to the Pac-12 all-conference second team and **Mike Moser** earned honorable mention honors. Young, a junior from Houston, Texas, leads Oregon and ranks fifth in the conference in scoring at 18.6 points per game. The transfer from the University of Houston is also the conference leader in free throw percentage (.892), ranks third in three-pointers per game (2.2), seventh in three-point field goal percentage (.406) and fifth in steals (1.4 per game). Moser, a senior transfer from UNLV, leads Oregon and is seventh in the Pac-12 in rebounding at 8.2 per game. He also ranks 17th in scoring (13.7 per game), 10th in three-pointers per game (1.7) and 12th in steals (1.2 per game).

YOUNG EARNS ALL-TOURNAMENT NOD

Joseph Young was selected to the five-player Pac-12 all-tournament team after scoring 48 points in two games, including 29 against eventual champion UCLA.

LOYD PASSES JACKSON FOR TOP 5 IN ASSISTS

Johnathan Loyd moved into the top five in Oregon career assists with four Feb. 23 against Washington State. Loyd now has 457 career assists, and this season has moved past a handful of Duck legends. He's gone by Kamikaze Kids' point guard **Mike Drummond** (309/1974-78), NBA all-star **Terrell Brandon** (315/1990-91), former NBA player **Fred Jones** (367/1998-02) and most recently all-American **Luke Jackson** (424/2000-04). Earlier this season, Loyd recorded a pair of impressive assists totals. First, he tied the Matthew Knight Arena record with 13 assists Nov. 29 against Pacific. Former Duck **Malcolm Armstead** also had 13 assists at MKA against Oregon State in 2011. A week later, Loyd set a career high with 15 assists Dec. 8 at Ole Miss. He also just missed a career high with 23 points, but did record the first double-double of his career. The 15 assists were the second-highest single game total in school history. Only the great **Ronnie Lee** had a bigger assist game at Oregon, doling out 17 in a 116-77 win over Villanova (12-23-74).

LOYD MOVES UP STEALS LIST

Johnathan Loyd Loyd passed Luke Ridnour (150/2000-03) for fourth in career steals March 12 versus Oregon State. He now has 151 career swipes and is three behind Malcolm Armstead (154/2009-11) for third.

MOSER POSTS HISTORIC NUMBERS

Not only has **Mike Moser** posted four consecutive double-doubles heading into the Pac-12 tournament, he's done it in eye-catching fashion. His 20 rebounds Feb. 27 against UCLA were the most by a Duck in 37 years. The last Duck with 20 boards was **Greg Ballard**, who corralled 20 caroms in an epic five-overtime game at Cal (2-10-77). March 4 against Arizona State, Moser nearly joined Ballard in another remarkable feat. With 22 points and 17 rebounds, Moser was just three boards shy of becoming the first 20-20 Duck since Ballard dropped in 41 points in that 1977 game at Cal (41 pts, 20 reb!). The last Oregon player with four consecutive double-doubles was **Maarty Leunen**, who accomplished that feat during the 2006-07 season. The last Duck with at least five consecutive double-doubles was Ballard, who notched six consecutive double-doubles late in the 1975-76 season.

MOSER EARNS NATIONAL, PAC-12 HONORS

Mike Moser was named the Athlon Sports national player of the week March 3, and the Pac-12 player of the week after averaging 16 points, 16 rebounds and 4.5 assists in the sweep of UCLA and USC. He repeated the conference honor a week later (March 8) when he led Oregon to a sweep of Arizona State and Arizona. He had 22 points and 17 rebounds against the Sun Devils and 10 points and 10 rebounds in the upset of the third-ranked Wildcats.

DUCKS HIT 90-WIN MARK

Oregon has now won 96 games over the course of four seasons for the first time ever. The previous best was 94 victories from 1936-39. Overall, it is just the fifth time in school history that the Ducks have reached at least 90 wins in a four-year span. Oregon won 91 games between 1937-41 and 1938-42, 93 games from 1936-40 and 94 times from 1935-39, culminating in the 1939 NCAA Championship.

20 WINS

Oregon has recorded 20 wins for the fourth straight season. That has been done just once previously in school history, 1936-39 under Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson.

LOYD GETS WINS RECORD

Johnathan Loyd is now the all-time winningest player in school history. He passed former teammate E.J. Singler (2009-13) for the most wins in an Oregon uniform Feb. 19 versus Washington. Loyd now has 96 wins as a Duck. Loyd is one of just six players in school history to reach 80 wins in an Oregon uniform joining Singler (89), Fred Jones (81), Joevan Catron (81), Luke Jackson (80) and Dick Wilkins (80).

STEALING AWAY

Thanks in part to a season-high 16 steal effort (a Matthew Knight Arena record) Feb. 1 versus USC, Oregon ranks 19th in the nation at 7.9 steals per game. That mark is second in the Pac-12. Individually, Joseph Young set career highs in steals in back-to-back games. He had five Jan. 30 against UCLA and followed that with six versus USC.

ALTMAN WINS 500TH CAREER DIVISION I GAME

Oregon's victory over Washington on Feb. 19 was **Dana Altman's** 500th coaching win at the Division I level. He has 15 wins at Marshall, 68 wins at Kansas State, 327 wins at Creighton and now 96 at Oregon. Altman also won 123 games at the junior college level.

OREGON CLINCHES 4TH STRAIGHT WINNING SEASON

Oregon's Feb. 19 win against Washington guaranteed the Ducks' fourth straight winning season. That's just the fifth time in school history that Oregon has strung together four or more consecutive winning seasons. The Ducks last did that from 2002-05 under **Ernie Kent** (4 straight). The other streaks are six seasons from 1973-78 under **Dick Harter**, seven seasons from 1934-40 for coaches **William Reinhart** and **Howard Hobson**, and 10 consecutive seasons from 1923-32 under **George Bohler** and Reinhardt.

TURNOVER TRENDS

Oregon has forced opponents into double-digit turnovers in 29 of 32 games this year, including a season-high 22 by USC on Feb. 1. The Ducks had a Matthew Knight Arena record 16 steals against the Trojans, which was one off the school's all-time mark. Oregon is third in the league in turnover margin at plus-2.0.

BUCKET LIST

Oregon's two-point losses last month at Arizona (67-65) and Arizona State (74-72) were the Ducks' third and fourth two-point set backs in Pac-12 play this year (UCLA 70-68, Stanford 82-80). In fact, of Oregon's eight losses, seven have been by single digits as the Ducks have been a handful of plays or less from owning several more victories. The last time Oregon dropped four conference games by two points or less: 2006.

1,000 POINT SCORERS

Feb. 16 against Oregon State, senior **Mike Moser** joined the 1,000 career point club, becoming the third player on the current roster to reach that milestone. Moser netted 690 points at UNLV and 9 at UCLA before graduating and transferring to Oregon for his final season (431 points). **Joseph Young** reached the 1,000 point milestone of his NCAA career early this season. Young scored 916 points in two seasons at Houston, and has added another 595 this year for 1,511 career points. He joins **Jason Calliste**, who surpassed 1,000 career points in three seasons at Detroit and now shows 1,465 career points.

BACKCOURT EXPERIENCE

The Ducks have five backcourt players who combined to play nearly 5,000 minutes in 2012-13, and own more than 600 career three-pointers at the NCAA Division I level. The breakdown in 3's: **Jason Calliste** - 240, **Joseph Young** - 193, **Johnathan Loyd** - 73, **Damyean Dotson** - 72, **Dominic Artis** - 42.

REVVED UP TO 80

The Ducks have scored at least 80 points in 17 games this season. Oregon has also gone over 90 points nine times and 100 four times.

MAKING PLAYS FOR THEIR TEAMMATES

The Ducks have had at least 15 assists 17 times this season. In fact, Oregon has been held below 10 assists just four times this year.

CLUTCH SHOT DOT

Damyean Dotson has a couple of overtime game-winners to his credit this year. He had the steal and dunk with :00.6 left in overtime to lift Oregon to the 70-68 win Jan. 2 at Utah. Earlier in the season, he made the go-ahead lay-in with :35 left in overtime as the Ducks topped BYU 100-96 on Dec. 21.

FLYING THE NORTHWEST FLAG

With the Seattle Seahawks becoming the first team from the Pacific Northwest to win the Super Bowl, it's a good time to put out the reminder that Oregon is the only team from the Northwest that has won an NCAA men's basketball title (1939). The Ducks are also the only school from the Northwest to have advanced to the NCAA Elite 8 this century (2002 and 2007). Other Northwest schools most recent Elite 8 trips: Gonzaga (1999), Oregon State (1982), Idaho State (1977), Seattle U. (1958), Washington (1953) and Washington State (1941). No Elite 8 appearances for Boise State, Eastern Washington, Idaho, Portland or Portland State.

GAME #33 NCAA TOURNAMENT VS. BYU

A SUPER SHOUT OUT TO SEATTLE'S PRO DUCKS

Oregon has a pair of alums on the Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks' roster in starting center **Max Unger** (2005-08) and cornerback **Walter Thurmond III** (2006-09). Oregon's basketball alums who played professionally with the Seattle Supersonics (years at Oregon) include **Luke Ridnour** (2001-03), **Greg Ballard** (1974-77) and **John Greig** (1980-82).

CENTURY NOTES

Oregon tied a school record by reaching the century mark for the fourth time this season Dec. 21 against Brigham Young. It is just the third time in 109 seasons of basketball that the Ducks have scored 100 points four times in the same season. Oregon has never had more than four 100-point games in the same year. The Ducks last had four 100-point games in the same year in 2001-02. Oregon first accomplished that feat in 1995-96.

DUCK NEWCOMER COUNT HITS 10

Ten newcomers have seen action for the Ducks this season. Senior transfers **Mike Moser** (UNLV), **Jason Calliste** (Detroit) and **Richard Amardi** (Indian Hills CC), junior transfers **Joseph Young** (Houston) and **Brian Crow** (Sonoma State), and sophomore transfer **Elgin Cook** (Northwest Florida State) all played in the season opener versus Georgetown. Those six players combined to score 66 of Oregon's 82 points versus the Hoyas. Freshman **Theo Friedman** became the seventh newcomer to play this season when he entered the Western Carolina game. Freshman **A.J. Lapray** made it eight newcomers with his debut in the Utah Valley game. Then after missing a few weeks due to injury, **Jalil Abdul-Bassit**, made his debut against San Francisco. The Ducks hit 10 newcomers Jan. 26 at Washington State when football defensive tackle **Aric Armstead** made his debut on the court for the Ducks. Armstead, a potential starter this fall, has since decided to concentrate on his football career and give up basketball.

SCORING MARK, SEVEN MKA TEAM RECORDS FALL VERSUS WCU

Joseph Young set a Matthew Knight Arena record with his 36 points in the Nov. 13 home opener versus Western Carolina. That was the highest total by a Duck since **Tajuan Porter** netted 38 against Portland State in the 2006-07 season. In addition to Young's scoring record, the Ducks set a number of Matthew Knight Arena team records in the Western Carolina game. Perhaps the most impressive mark established was the field goal percentage record, .653 (32-of-49). Other MKA marks included points in a half (66), points by both teams in a half (110), free throws made (35), free throw attempts (47), fouls (34, by Western Carolina) and fouls by both teams (53). Oregon's 107 points was one shy of the MKA record of 108 scored versus lowa in the 2012 postseason NIT.

DUCKS ADD AUSTIN

Oregon has added Providence transfer **Brandon Austin** to the roster. Austin was a top-50 rated prep player who helped Imhotep Charter High School record a 28-5 mark and capture the PIAA AAA championship in as a senior in 2013. He will be eligible to play for Oregon at the conclusion of the 2014 fall quarter.

LOOKING AT THE 2013-14 TEAM

The Ducks return two starters, **Dominic Artis** and **Damyean Dotson**, and Pac-12 Tournament Most Outstanding Player **Johnathan Loyd** for the 2013-14 season. Four seniors departed from the Ducks' 2012-13 Sweet 16 team — **E.J. Singler, Tony Woods, Carlos Emory** and **Arsalan Kazemi**. Singler finished his career with the Ducks as the program's winningest player (89) and ranked 11th all-time in scoring (1,546). Kazemi totaled 56 double-doubles in his four-year career at Rice and Oregon, including 11 during the 2012-13 season, before becoming a 2013 NBA Second Round draft choice by the Philadephia 76ers (following a trade from Washington). Woods finished his time in Eugene as the program's third-best shot-blocker, racking up 91 blocks in two seasons. Emory, who appeared in all 37 games in 2012-13, finished third on the team in scoring (11.1 ppg).

DANA ALTMAN

• Head coach Dana Altman won his 500th game at the Division I level when the Ducks defeated Washington on Feb. 19.

• Altman is just the second coach in school history to post four straight 20-win seasons, joining Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson, who led the "Tall Firs" to four straight 20-win campaigns from 1935-39. Altman's 2012-13 team became just the sixth UO squad to reach an NCAA Regional Semifinal.

• Altman was the recipient of the 2013 Jim Phelan Award as the national coach of the year.

• Altman guided the Ducks to a 28-9 overall mark and the program's first trip to the Sweet 16 since 2007, racking up the fourth-most wins in a single season in UO history in the process.

DANA ALTMAN

HEAD COACH

A 2013 National Coach of the Year selection, Dana Altman is the 19th head coach in the history of the University of Oregon men's basketball program. He is 96-45 in four seasons in Eugene and 505-289 in 25 seasons as a head coach at the NCAA Division I level in stints at Oregon, Creighton, Kansas State and Marshall.

In his first four years at Oregon, Altman has led the Ducks to four consecutive 20-win seasons and four postseason appearances, including the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16. It marks just the second time in school history UO has produced four consecutive seasons of 20+ wins. Altman now has 16 seasons of 20+ wins to his credit (11 at Creighton, four at Oregon, one at Kansas State).

The 2013-14 season saw Altman win his 500th game as a Division I head coach when Oregon defeated Washington on Feb. 19. He also joined Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson as the only men to lead Oregon to four consecutive 20-win seasons. In fact, Altman has led Oregon to the most prosperous four-year stretch in school history, accumulating 96 wins in that time. Joseph Young was an all-conference second team selection, while Mike Moser was an hororable mention selection.

Altman's 2012-13 Oregon Ducks became the first UO team since 2008 to qualify for the NCAA Tournament. The Ducks finished the season 28-9 and won the Pac-12 Tournament. Altman was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year before going on to earn Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honors. Senior E.J. Singler was an all-league first team selection, while Damyean Dotson claimed a place on the Pac-12 All-Freshman team. Johnathan Loyd was named Most Outstanding Player of the Pac-12 Tournament as the honors were spread around nearly the entire team. Senior Arsalan Kazemi was a Pac-12 all-defensive pick before going on to become a second round draft choice of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers. Singler was a free agent signee by the Portland Trailblazers.

During the 2011-12 season, Altman led the Ducks to a 24-10 overall record and an 13-5 Pac-12 Conference mark which was good for a share of second place in the final league standings. The Ducks earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament and recorded victories over LSU and Iowa before falling at top-seed Washington in the tournament quarterfinals.

Under Altman's tutelage, four UO players were recognized as part of the 2012 Pac-12 All-Conference teams. Devoe Joseph became the first Duck since the 2006-07 season to be named first team all-conference. Singler was named to the all-conference second team and NABC All-District 20 second team, while Garrett Sim earned honorable mention all-league recognition and Tony Woods was named honorable mention all-defensive team.

In his first season at Oregon, Altman led the Ducks to just the 12th season of 20+ victories in the history of the program. He became just the third UO head coach to tally 20+ wins in his first season on the job. Oregon went 21-18 overall and 7-11 in Pac-12 play which earned them a seventh-place finish in the final league standings.

Altman posted the second-highest win total of any first-year UO head coach. Only John Warren (30 wins in 1944-45) posted more in his first year on the sidelines. The 2011 postseason included a pair of wins at the Pacific Life Pac-10 Conference Tournament, highlighted by a 76-59 upset win over No. 2-seed UCLA in the quarterfinals. Oregon participated in the 2011 College Basketball Invitational, defeating Altman's former team – Creighton – in the best-of-three championship series.

Altman arrived at UO after spending 16 seasons at Creighton where he became the school's all-time winningest coach with a record of 327-176 (.650). He led the Blue Jays to 13 consecutive postseason appearances, a stretch of 11 straight seasons with 20-plus wins, all while producing 10 or more league victories in each of the last 14 seasons. Those three feats were unmatched in the 103 years of the Missouri Valley Conference.

He won four Coach-of-the-Year awards from three different conferences in a span of 13 seasons, including back-to-back MVC coaching honors while he was at the Omaha, Neb., educational institution in 2001 and 2002. Altman was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and was named the NABC District 12 and USBWA District VI Coach of the Year following the 2002-03 campaign.

Creighton participated in seven NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and five National Invitation Tournaments under Altman, advancing to the second round of the NCAA championships in both the 1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons. He led the school to a MVC regular-season title in 2000-01

- its first in 10 years. The Bluejays posted a school-record 29 wins in 2002-03, finishing the season 15th in the Associated Press poll and 23rd in the coaches' voting.

Altman finished his career at Creighton ranking third all-time on the MVC list of all-time wins (327), trailing only Basketball Hall of Fame coaches Henry Iba (486) and Eddie Hickey (337). In 2007, he was one of 10 coaches named as part of the MVC's All-Centennial Team. His teams claimed shares of three regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championships (including the 2008-09 crown) and six conference postseason tournament titles.

Student-athletes under his direction at CU earned six All-America honors on the court and four Academic All-America laurels in the classroom. Three players he coached at Creighton - Kyle Korver, Rodney Buford and Anthony Tolliver - have played in the NBA.

Along the way, Creighton established school records for most victories in a two-year (52), three-year (76) and four-year span (99). From 1998-99 through 2008-09, Creighton was one of just six schools to win 20 or more games each of those seasons, an elite list that also included Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Kansas and Syracuse.

In addition, Altman's teams ranked in the top 30 nationally for attendance in his final seven years at Creighton. Altman became the 15th head coach in Creighton history following the 1993-94 season after four successful years as the head coach at Kansas State and a season at Marshall.

Hired by Creighton on March 31, 1994, Altman inherited a team that posted a 7-22 ledger the year before his arrival and led the Bluejays to a slightly improved 7-19 record in 1994-95 before his 1995-96 squad jumped to 14-15. In 1996-97, Altman's team was 15-15 and followed with another substantial jump to 18-10 and a bid to the NIT in 1997-98. Altman compiled a 68-54 record in four seasons (1990-94) at Kansas State University. During that time, Altman led the Wildcats to three straight postseason tourneys and was named the Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year after leading KSU to a 19-11 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

Altman's final Kansas State club turned heads nationally with a 68-64 win at No. 1 Kansas on Jan. 17, 1994. K-State eventually advanced to play in the NIT Final Four. Altman's success at KSU followed him from a brief head coaching stint at Marshall where he was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1990.

While head coach at Southeast Junior College in Fairbury, Neb., his first team (1982-83) rolled to a 29-6 record and a third-place finish in the junior college national tournament and Altman was honored as both Region 9 and the Nebraska College Coach of the Year.

In 1983, Altman accepted the head coaching position at Moberly (Mo.) Junior College, with a three-year run resulting in a staggering 94-18 record (25-9 in 1983-84; 35-5 with a third-place finish at the national tourney in 1984-85; and a 34-4 mark in 1985-86 with a sixth-place finish at nationals).

He was named Region 16 Coach of the Year in both the 1984-85 and 1985-86 seasons, and was also a finalist for 1986 National Junior College Athletic Association Coach of the Year accolades. Altman's playing career began at Southeast Junior College in 1976, where he captained teams to a 22-10 mark in his freshman year and a 26-5 record in his sophomore season.

Altman completed his undergraduate education and playing career at Eastern New

Mexico University. After earning his associate degree in business administration from Southeast in 1978, Altman graduated magna cum laude from Eastern New Mexico in 1980 with his bachelor's degree in the same field.

Altman received his master of business administration degree from Western (Colo.) State in 1981. He served as an assistant coach on the Western State staff from 1980-82.

At Wilber (Neb.) High School, Altman was a two-sport letterman, earning all-conference honors as a quarterback on the football team and as a guard in basketball. Altman was born June 16, 1958, in Crete, Neb. He and his wife, the former Reva Phillips of Stanton, Neb., have three sons, Jordan, Chase and Spencer, and one daughter, Audra.

Tony Stubblefield is in his fourth season as an assistant coach with the University of Oregon men's basketball program. Stubblefield has 20 years of coaching experience at the college level.

Stubblefield came to the Ducks after spending four years as an assistant at the University of Cincinnati, serving as the BearCats' recruiting coordinator from 2006-10.

Prior to joining the staff at Cincinnati, Stubblefield served as assistant coach at New Mexico State for six seasons, one of which he served as interim head coach. He was responsible for all aspects of the basketball program at New Mexico State. Prior to the start of the 2004-05 season, he was elevated to interim head coach when Lou Henson's health forced him to miss the season.

As recruiting coordinator for the Aggies, Stubblefield attracted three national Top-100 rated players, including one McDonald's All-American, a junior college all-American, and first-team all-state high school players from six different states.

Prior to his tenure at New Mexico State, Stubblefield was the lead assistant and recruiting coordinator at the University of Texas-Arlington for four seasons. He successfully recruited two Top-10 prospects from the state of Texas along with first-team all-region junior college players from Texas, Louisiana, Alabama, and Mississippi.

Stubblefield began his coaching career as a student assistant for two seasons at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, his alma mater, where he completed his undergraduate degree in 1995.

Stubblefield, who transferred to UNO following two years at Clinton (Iowa) Community College, earned two letters playing guard at Nebraska-Omaha where he was the team captain his senior season.

Upon graduation from UNO, he became an assistant coach at the University of Texas-San Antonio for the 1995-96 season, where he was responsible for coaching the guards and was the program's top recruiter.

In high school, Stubblefield was one of the top players in the state of Colorado. He was the runner-up for state Player of the Year honors at Bloomfield (Colo.) High School his senior season, while picking up first-team all-state and Boulder County Player of the Year accolades.

BRIAN FISH

ASSISTANT COACH

Brian Fish is entering his fourth season as assistant coach with the University of Oregon men's basketball program. Fish has been a long-time assistant to head coach Dana Altman, having spent 13 seasons under his direction in stints at Oregon, Creighton and Marshall.

Fish has 24 years of coaching experience overall at the NCAA Division I level. Seven programs that Fish has been associated with as either a player or coach have reached the NCAA Tournament. During his eight seasons at Creighton, the Bluejays advanced to postseason play on six occasions.

Fish was a part of two separate Altman staffs at Creighton. He was a member of the first staff from 1994-96, and then returned to the program in the summer of 2004 after coaching a combined eight years at Texas Christian and San Diego.

Fish spent the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons at San Diego, helping the Toreros to the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament. Fish was promoted to associate head coach for the 2003-04 campaign.

Prior to San Diego, Fish was on Billy Tubbs' staff at TCU as an assistant coach. At TCU, Fish served as recruiting coordinator and oversaw academics for the basketball team. In his six years at the school, TCU made three postseason appearances and compiled an overall record of 125-68.

Fish and Altman first worked together during the 1989-90 season, when the two were at Marshall. Fish was breaking into coaching as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, while Altman earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year recognition in his lone year with the Thundering Herd.

Two years after Altman went to Kansas State, Fish rejoined his mentor in Manhattan as a video/ film coordinator. Paired together again, Altman and his staff earned 1993 Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year accolades.

When Altman moved to Creighton prior to the 1994-95 season, Fish followed and served in the same capacity for the program. Together, they helped lay the groundwork for Creighton's run of 12 straight postseason appearances.

A native of Seymour, Ind., Fish played two seasons for Clem Haskins at Western Kentucky before transferring to play at Marshall. Fish earned a degree in sport management from Marshall in 1989 before becoming a graduate assistant there.

In the spring of 2009, Fish was named to the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame Silver Anniversary Team along with 16 other former Indiana high school basketball standouts and Hoosier legends, a class that also included Steve Alford, Gregg Popovich and Scott Skiles.

KEVIN MCKENNA

ASSISTANT COACH

Kevin McKenna is in his fourth season as assistant coach with the Oregon men's basketball program. McKenna spent nine years as an assistant coach under Dana Altman at Creighton University prior to becoming the head coach at Indiana State, where he coached from 2007-10.

McKenna has 24 years of coaching experience, including seven years as a head college coach in stints at both ISU and Nebraska-Omaha.

His 2009-10 Sycamores recorded the program's first winning season since 2001. ISU also reached postseason play for the first time in nine years when it accepted a bid to the 2010 College Basketball Invitational. The Sycamores' success, despite being devastated by injury for the greater portion of the Missouri Valley Conference slate, led McKenna to being tabbed as the MVC Coach of the Year by CollegeInsider.com.

The Sycamores finished the 2009-10 season as the nation's No. 2 free throw shooting team. ISU's 76.9 percent mark at the line finished just behind NCAA Tournament qualifier BYU on the Division I list.

At ISU, McKenna mentored Harry Marshall to Second Team All-MVC and MVC's All-Defensive Team recognition. He also helped Jay Tunnell to All-MVC Honorable Mention and MVC Most Improved Team honors. In addition, Jordan Printy and Aaron Carter were tabbed as MVC All-Scholar Athletes under McKenna's watch. He compiled a 43-52 overall record while posting a MVC mark of 24-30 in three seasons at ISU.

In the summer of 2009, McKenna was selected as the head coach of the Athletes In Action college basketball team during a tour of Poland and Germany. He led the team on an 11-day summer tour playing contests in Katowice, Poland as well as Berlin, Germany. The AIA team was comprised of NCAA Division I basketball players.

Before accepting the head coaching position at ISU, McKenna completed nine seasons at Creighton as an assistant coach. During that time the Bluejays went to four NCAA Tournaments as well as two National Invitation Tournaments. McKenna made the first of two stops on the Bluejays' bench from 1994 through 2001, and then returned in 2005.

Before McKenna returned to Creighton, he spent four years across town as head coach at Nebraska-Omaha. He guided the Mavericks to four consecutive 20-win seasons, two North Central Conference titles and three appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

McKenna was named the NCC Coach of the Year in both 2004 and 2005 as well as North Central Regional Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) in 2005. He finished with an 89-33 mark in his tenure at UNO which included a conference mark of 40-20 (.667).

As a player at Creighton from 1977-81, McKenna led the Bluejays to a MVC regular-season championship, two MVC Tournament titles and a pair of NCAA Tournaments. He was an All-MVC pick and team MVP in each of his final two seasons.

McKenna ended his collegiate career with exactly 1,500 points and was drafted in the fourth round of the 1981 draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. He was a member of the Lakers' 1982 NBA championship team and also played for Indiana, New Jersey and Washington during a six-year NBA career.

He remains the only person in MVC history to win an regular-season title, tournament title, NBA championship and CBA crown.

Following his NBA career, McKenna helped lead the La Crosse Catbirds to the 1989-90 CBA Championship as a player and assistant coach. He then served as the head coach and director of basketball operations for the CBA's Sioux Falls Skyforce from 1990-93. He spent time as a regional scout for the Washington Bullets in 1993-94 before returning to Creighton as an assistant to Altman in 1994.

He earned his bachelor's degree in organizational communications from Creighton in 1993 and added a master's degree in counseling education from his alma mater in 1997. McKenna and his wife, Nancy, have a daughter, Megan, and a son, Bobby.



NCAA TOURNAMENT

FIRST NCAA CHAMPIONS -- THE TALL FIRS

Oregon's 1939 basketball team earned a niche in sports history by winning the first NCAA championship basketball tournament ever held.

With a first unit composed of four native Oregonians and one Washingtonian, Coach Howard Hobson guided the Tall Firs to a 29-5 season record and Oregon's only NCAA basketball title.

The starting five listed three All-Americans in 6-foot 8-inch Urgel 'Slim' Wintermute from Longview. Wash., sharp-shooting Laddie Gale, a 6-4 forward from Oakridge and 5-8 guard Bobby Anet from Astoria. In addition, John Dick, a 6-4 forward from The Dalles, earned All-America honors the following season.

The guard spots were manned by Astorians Anet and 5-11 Wally Johansen. The two had teamed since their grade school days in Astoria.

For reserve strength, Hobson called on the likes of Bob Hardy, Red McNeely, Ford Mullen, Matt Pavalunas, Earl Sandness and Ted Sarpola. Gale, Wintermute, Anet, Johansen and Mullen played on three consecutive Northern Division championship teams.

The Ducks posted a 10-3 non-conference record, highlighted by a two-week Christmas tour that opened in Madison Square Garden with a 38-36 loss to CCNY and concluded with a 50-46 defeat at the hands of Stanford.

In between, however, the Tall Firs won six of seven games giving them a highly respectable 6-3 road mark against some of the nation's finest teams.

Oregon powered to the Northern Division title with a 14-2 record, sweeping four-game series from Idaho and Washington and capturing

es from Idaho and Washington and capturing three of four battles each with Oregon State and Washington State.

That set the stage for a best-of-three playoff with Southern Division champion California at McArthur Court. Before capacity crowds, the Ducks captured the Pacific Coast Conference title in two games. Gale scored 18 points and Wintermute added 11 as the Ducks won the opener, 54-40, and Wintermute and Dick each tallied 16 points in the 53-47 triumph that put Oregon in the NCAA Western Playoffs.

Oregon quickly went to work in the Western Playoffs at Treasure Island, knocking off Texas, 56-41, and dumping Oklahoma, 55-37.

On March 27, the Tall Firs faced Ohio State on the neutral Northwestern University court at Evanston, III., for the national title. Dick


scored 13 points and Gale and Anet contributed 10 apiece as the Ducks rolled to a 46-33 victory and the NCAA crown.


Huge crowds welcomed them in Portland and Eugene to climax one of the legendary events in the state's athletic history.

Rob Mullens Director of Athletics 4th Year

Since being named the University of Oregon's 12th director of intercollegiate athletics on July 15, 2010, Rob Mullens has wasted little time in putting his own stamp on the continual success of the Ducks' athletics department while being the beneficiary of one of the most successful eras in school history.

Mullens arrived at Oregon from the University of Kentucky, where he served as deputy director of athletics and managed day-to-day operations for Kentucky's 22-sport athletics department, with an annual operating budget of \$79 million.

In his brief tenure in Eugene, he has implemented his philosophy of financial effiency while overseeing an \$93.5 million budget for the coming year, in addition to enhancing the department's model of self-sufficiency.

He has assisted with the continued success of a football program that has been surpassed by few nationally, with the Ducks claiming an unprecedented three straight conference championships while becoming the only school in the country to appear in a third consecutive BCS bowl game following the 2011 season. Following an appearance in the 2011 BCS National Championship Game, Oregon posted a win over Wisconsin in the 2012 Rose Bowl Game.

In fact, 15 of the school's 19 intercollegiate sports advanced to the post season during the 2011-12 season, including women's indoor track & field and acrobatics and tumbling which both claimed national championships. In addition, the Ducks finished 24th in the country in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup competition as the top program in the country fielding 18 sports or less.

He also was at the helm as the Ducks opened their spectacular Matthew Knight Arena, which plays host to the school's men's and women's basketball teams, women's volleyball and acrobatics and tumbling, in addition to benefitting the entire Eugene-Springfield communities as a state-of-the-art venue for concerts, cultural forums and world-class entertainment.


Off the field, Mullens was just as excited to witness an accumulated graduation rate of 74 percent among all of the Ducks' student-athletes, a single-season best six first-team Capital One Academic All-Americans and 105 academic all-conference honorees.

His background is in accounting and auditing, and he promoted sound fiscal management and self-sufficiency at the University of Kentucky. During his total of eight years at Kentucky, the athletic department's operating budget expanded by nearly 70 percent. Fundraising for the department hit record levels each of the past seven years prior to his departure.

Prior to being named deputy director of athletics at Kentucky in 2006, Mullens began as the university's executive associate director of athletics in 2002. He served at the University of Maryland from 1996 to 2002, starting as assistant director of athletics for business and ultimately as executive senior associate director of athletics and chief of staff.

The West Virginia native was senior athletics business manager at the University of Miami (Fla.) from 1994 to 1996, and prior to that he was an accountant/auditor at Ernst & Young in Raleigh, N.C.

The 43-year-old Mullens earned a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's in sport management from West Virginia University in 1991 and 1993, respectively. He and his wife, Jane, have two sons - Cooper and Tanner..



Michael Gottfredson University President

2nd Year

Dr. Michael R. Gottfredson began his tenure as the University of Oregon's 17th president on Aug. 1, 2012.

Previously, he was a professor of Criminology, Law, and Society and of Sociology at the University of California, Irvine, where he also served as the executive vice chancellor and provost since 2000.

Gottfredson holds a Ph.D. and an M.A. from the State University of New York at Albany; and an A.B. from the University of California at Davis.

His research and teaching specialties are the causes of crime and delinquency and the criminal justice process. He (with Travis Hirschi) is well known for the development of the self-control theory of crime and delinquency and for the study of how these behaviors relate to age. The theory has stimulated a great deal of research and their description of how and why age relates to crime has become central to research, theory and policy about crime and delinquency. His work on victimization led to the development of the "lifestyle/opportunity" theory of criminal victimization, a prominent explanation for differential risks from crime. His systematic study (with Don Gottfredson) of how arrest, prosecution and sentencing decisions are made in criminal justice contributed to greater understanding of the use of discretion and to the widespread use of structured guidelines in the criminal law.

In addition, he led a major expansion of the UC-Irvine infrastructure, blending state, campus and private support. He helped to create the California Institute for Telecommunications and Technology, including the construction of a \$55 million research facility, and the new public law school.

He is the author or editor (with others) of several books, including Control Theories of Crime and Delinquency (2003); Personal Liberty and Community Safety (1995); The Generality of Deviance (1994); A General Theory of Crime (1990); Decision-making in Criminal Justice (1988); Positive Criminology (1987); Policy Guidelines for Bail: An Experiment in Court Reform (1985); Understanding Crime (1980); and Victims of Personal Crime (1978). He has published numerous articles in journals, including Criminology, American Journal of Sociology, American Sociological Review, Advances in Criminological Theory, and various law reviews. He has frequently consulted with state, county, and federal governments concerning criminal justice policy.

He is a Fellow of the American Society of Criminology and was the Andersen Consulting "Professor of the Year" in 1996 at the University of Arizona's College of Business and Public Administration.

Prior to joining UC-Irvine, Gottfredson served in several positions at the University of Arizona from 1985 to 2000, including interim senior vice president for academic affairs and provost, vice provost and vice president of Undergraduate Education. Other academic positions Gottfredson has held include associate professor at The Claremont Graduate School, Claremont, California, from 1983-1985; associate professor of Sociology, University of Illinois, Urbana, from 1981 to 1983; assistant professor at the Graduate School of Criminal Justice, State University of New York at Albany from 1977 to 1979; and director of the Criminal Justice Research Center in Albany, New York, from 1976 to 1979.

He is married to Karol Gottfredson, who was the coordinator of the Intern Teacher Credential Program at UC-Irvine. The Gottfredsons have one daughter, Katherine, a son, Bryan, and daughter-in-law, Meghan, and two young granddaughters. IT STARTS WITH THE FUSE THAT THE GAME LIGHTS INSIDE US.
