

AGGIES PLAY AT BYU ON ESPN

• Utah State will play its third road game this season, and secondstraight away from home, at BYU on Friday, Oct. 3 at 8:15 p.m., in a game that will be nationally televised on ESPN. USU has won 11 of its last 19 road games, dating back to 2012, and is 4-5 in road games under current head coach **Matt Wells**.



• Utah State and BYU spent 37 years as conference foes as the two teams were members of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference from 1922-37 and the Mountain States/Skyline Conference from 1938-61. As conference foes, USU was 21-13-3 (.608) against BYU.

UTAH STATE

Senior LB Zach Vigil (53) recorded a career-high tying 3.0 tackles for loss and a career-high tying 2.0 sacks as part of his career-best 14 tackles at Arkansas State in the Aggies' last game.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR FRIDAY

• Utah State has won 27 of its last 37 games and those 10 losses have been by a combined 86 points (8.6 ppg). Those 27 wins are the third-most in the West behind Oregon (32) and Stanford (29).

- Utah State's defense has forced 11 turnovers in its last three games, intercepted 23 passes in its last 14 games, and recorded a total of 58 turnovers in its last 27 games.
- Utah State has scored three defensive touchdowns this season and six defensive touchdowns in its last 12 games.
- Utah State is 4-1 following a loss and 3-0 following a bye or multiple weeks off under current head coach **Matt Wells**. Overall, USU has won five of its last six games following a loss and has lost back-to-back games just once in its last 37 games dating back to 2011.
- Junior WR **JoJo Natson** needs four receptions for 100 in his career as he would become just the 17th player in school history with 100 career receptions.
- Utah State has led at the half in 25 of its last 32 games and is 21-4 in those outings.

PRACTICE SCHEDULE

Practices are closed to the media. Requested coaches and players will be available for post-practice interviews on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. There is no media availability following Monday, Thursday and Friday practices.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

All player and assistant coaching staff interview requests should be directed to Doug Hoffman. Requests for post-practice interviews should be made at least 24 hours in advance. Personal phone numbers will not be made available to media. Players have been instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted without prior approval from the media relations staff.

UTAH STATE PLAYS AT BYU FRIDAY NIGHT ON ESPN

Utah State (2-2, 0-0 MW) plays at No. 18 BYU (4-0) in its third road game of the season on Friday, Oct. 3 at 8:15 p.m. The game will be nationally televised by ESPN with Dave Flemming (play-by-play), Mike Bellotti (analyst) and Allison Williams (reporter) on the call. Live audio of the game is also available on www.UtahStateAggies.com.

A LOOK AT UTAH STATE

Utah State is 2-2 on the season following its 21-14 overtime loss at Arkansas State in its last game. USU began the year with a 38-7 loss at Tennessee, followed by a 40-20 home win against Idaho State and a 36-24 home win against Wake Forest. Offensively, USU is led by senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** who is 51-of-92 passing for 426 yards (142.0 ypg) with two touchdowns and four interceptions. Junior WR **JoJo Natson** leads the team in rushing with 158 yards on 17 carries (9.3 ypc), and junior WR **Hunter Sharp** leads the team in receiving with 23 catches for 305 yards (13.3 ypr) with two touchdowns. Defensively, sophomore LB **Nick Vigil** leads the team with 40 tackles, including 5.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks, while senior LB **Zach Vigil** has 37 tackles, including 6.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks, and sophomore FS **Devin Centers** has 34 tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks. As a team, USU is averaging 24.2 points and 368.8 yards of total offense (214.8-passing, 154.0-rushing) and allowing 25.8 points and 334.8 yards of total offense (256.5-passing, 78.2-rushing) per game.

UTAH STATE LOSES OVERTIME GAME AT ARKANSAS STATE

Utah State fell to 6-5 all-time in overtime, including a 4-3 record in single overtime games, following its 21-14 loss at Arkansas State in its last outing. USU had 413 yards of total offense (268-passing, 145-rushing) against the Red Wolves for its second-most yards this season. USU, who led 7-0 at the end of the first quarter and half, and 14-7 following the third quarter, was 10-0 when scoring first, 8-0 when leading after one quarter, 9-1 when leading at the half, and 11-0 when leading after three quarters entering the game under **Matt Wells**.

AGGIE DEFENSE FINDING THE END ZONE OFTEN

- Utah State's defense scored a pair of touchdowns against Wake Forest as senior LB **Zach Vigil** returned an interception 35 yards for a score and sophomore FS **Devin Centers** returned a fumble 47 yards for a score. The last time USU scored two defensive touchdowns in the same game was in a 28-16 home win against Kansas State (10/17/92) as **David Balls** returned an interception 50 yards for a touchdown and **Jermaine Younger** returned an interception 59 yards for a score.
- Utah State also scored a defensive touchdown against Idaho State as freshman CB **Jalen Davis** returned an interception 44 yards for a score. The last time USU had defensive touchdowns in back-to-back games was in 2003 when **John Chick** had a 37-yard fumble return for a score against North Texas and **Terrance Washington** had a 26-yard interception return for a score against Arkansas State.
- With its three defensive touchdowns this season, the Aggie defense has now scored six defensive touchdowns in its last 12 games dating back to last year as it has four interception returns and two fumble returns for touchdowns.

UTAH STATE DEFENSE FORCES FOUR TURNOVERS AT ARKANSAS STATE

- Utah State's defense forced four turnovers in its last game at Arkansas State with one interception and three fumble recoveries. Overall, USU has now forced 11 turnovers in its last three games with three against Wake Forest and four against Idaho State. During its last three games, USU has recorded six interceptions and recovered five fumbles.
- Utah State has recorded 23 interceptions in its last 14 games, which has included multiple interceptions in seven of those 14 games. USU has also intercepted at least one pass in nine of its last 10 games dating back to last year, including six in its last three outings.
- Utah State has forced at least one turnover in 26 of its last 27 games dating back to the 2012 season and has forced a total of 58 turnovers in its last 27 games.
- Utah State's defense has held each of its last two opponents (Wake Forest and Arkansas State) and 20 of its last 30 opponents overall without a first-half touchdown, while seven of its last 31 opponents have been held scoreless in the first-half. In its last 32 games, USU has led at the half 25 times and is 21-4 in those contests.
- Utah State has also held its opponent out of the end zone in the first quarter in 27 of its last 33 games, and scoreless in the first quarter in 20 of its last 33 games. Overall, USU has led at the end of the first quarter in 25 of its last 32 games and is 21-4 in those contests.

DID YOU KNOW?

Utah State sophomore QB **Darell Garretson** completed an 81-yard touchdown pass to junior WR **Hunter Sharp** against Arkansas State, which is tied for the 13th-longest pass play in school history and longest since 2012 when senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** connected with **Kerwynn Williams** for an 86-yard touchdown pass at No. 19 Louisiana Tech.

A QUICK LOOK AT BYU

BYU is 4-0 on the season and ranked No. 18 in the latest Associated Press poll following its 41-33 home win against Virginia in its last game. BYU began the year with a 35-10 road win at Connecticut, followed by a 41-7 road win at Texas, and a 33-25 home win against Houston. The Cougars are led by junior QB Taysom Hill who is 80-of-121 passing for 876 yards (219.0 ypg) with six touchdowns and three interceptions. Hill also leads the team in rushing with 428 yards on 79 carries (5.4 ypc) with seven touchdowns, and senior WR Jordan Leslie has caught 19 passes for 227 yards (11.9 ypr) with one touchdown. Defensively, senior LB Sac Stout has a team-best 26 tackles, which includes 3.5 tackles for loss, while senior DB Craig Bills also has 26 tackles, which includes 0.5 tackles for loss. As a team, BYU is averaging 37.5 points and 449.2 yards of total offense per game (230.2-rushing, 219.0-passing) and allowing 18.8 points and 364.0 yards of total offense (275.5-passing, 88.5-rushing). BYU returns 14 starters (O-8, D-6) and 44 lettermen (O-25, D-19) from last year's team that went 8-5 and lost to Washington, 31-16, in the Fight Hunger Bowl. The Cougars are coached by Bronco Mendenhall who is 86-34 in his 10th season as a collegiate head coach at BYU.

UTAH STATE AND BYU TO PLAY UNDER FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS AGAIN

For the seventh-straight year and 17th time in the last 21 meetings dating back to 1987, Utah State and BYU will be playing one another on Friday night under the lights.

AGGIES AND COUGARS SERIES HISTORY

Utah State trails in the all-time series against BYU, 34-46-3, which includes a 16-27-1 road record. The first game played in the series was on Oct. 7, 1922 in Provo with USU winning, 42-3. BYU won the last game played in the series, 31-14, in Logan on Oct. 4, 2013. BYU also won the last meeting between the two teams in Provo, 6-3, on Oct. 5, 2012. The last time USU defeated BYU was on Oct. 1, 2010 in Logan, 31-16, and its last win in Provo was on Oct. 7, 1978 by a final score of 24-7.

MORE ON THE AGGIES AND COUGARS SERIES HISTORY

Utah State's 34 wins against BYU are the second-most in school history behind USU's 36 wins against Wyoming. The USU-BYU series is the second-most played in school history as this weekend's 84th meeting trails only USU's 111 games played against Utah. USU and BYU began their series in 1922 and have played every year except 1943, 1944, 1945, 1995, 1998, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007.

BATTLE FOR THE OLD WAGON WHEEL

Utah State and BYU will be playing for possession of 'The Old Wagon Wheel', the traveling trophy between the two schools, this Friday night. The Old Wagon Wheel became part of the rivalry in 1948. Since its inception, BYU holds a 38-22 advantage in the series and currently holds possession of the traveling trophy after its 31-14 win in Logan last year. USU last claimed the trophy in 2010 after defeating the Cougars in Logan, 31-16.

UTAH STATE AND BYU SERIES MOVING FORWARD

Utah State and BYU will play the second game of a four-game contract in Provo this weekend. In 2015, the two teams will play in Logan on Saturday, Nov. 28. And in 2016, the two teams will play in Provo on Saturday, Nov. 26.

UTAH STATE VERSUS FBS INDEPENDENTS

Utah State is 35-46-3 all-time against current Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Independents with a 34-46-3 record against BYU and a 1-0 record against Army.

Utah State head coach **Matt Wells** is 0-1 all-time against BYU as a head coach, and has faced the Cougars six times as an assistant including twice while at Utah State, as well as three times as an assistant at New Mexico and once as an assistant at Tulsa.

BYU ONE OF FIVE BOWL TEAMS ON AGGIES' 2014 SCHEDULE

UTAH STATE AND BYU CONNECTIONS

Utah State assistant head coach and offensive line coach **Mark Weber** spent six seasons (2007-12) as BYU's offensive line coach, helping the Cougars to six bowl games and a conference championship in 2007. USU offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Kevin McGiven** spent three years at BYU (2002-04) as an offensive graduate assistant. USU offensive administrative assistant **Naufahu Tahi** played running back at BYU from 1999, 2003-05. BYU's stadium namesake **LaVell Edwards**, is a 1952 Utah State alum, and was a three-year letterman for the Aggies from 1949-51, collecting unanimous all-Skyline Six Conference honors in 1950 at linebacker. Edwards was inducted into USU Athletics' Hall of Fame in 2011. Utah State University President **Stan Albrecht** worked at BYU for 18 years (1974-92), including three years as Academic Vice President and Associate Provost. BYU inside linebacker coach **Paul Tidwell's** hometown is Logan and he played fullback at USU from 1974-76. BYU outside linebackers coach **Kelly Poppinga** was a USU linebacker from 2003-04. And BYU Director of Operations **Zach Nyborg** spent three years at USU serving as the assistant to the head coach, recruiting coordinator, and as an offensive graduate assistant.

Senior SS Frankie Sutera has five tackles in one game. Junior DE Jordan Nielsen has five tackles, including 0.5 tackles for loss, in two games. Sophomore DE Ricky Ali'ifua has five tackles in one game. Senior NG Elvis Kamana-Matagi has three tackles and one QB hurry in three games. Senior DE B.J. Larsen has two tackles, including 1.0 tackle for loss, in two games. Senior CB Rashard Stewart has 1.0 sack in two games. Sophomore FS Devin Centers has one blocked kick in one game. Senior P Jaron Bentrude has punted 10 times for an average of 43.1 yards with a long of 64 yards in one game. Senior PK Nick Diaz is 0-for-1 on field goals and 2-for-2 on extra points in one game. And sophomore K Jake Thompson has kicked off three times for an average of 65.0 yards with two touchbacks in one game.

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State lost to Brigham Young, 31-14, on Friday, Oct. 4, 2013 at a chilly, sold-out Merlin Olsen Field at Romney Stadium.

The Aggies (3-3) totaled 397 yards of total offense with 186 rushing and 211 passing, while the Cougars (3-2) collected 438 yards of total offense with 278 through the air and 160 on the ground.

Junior QB **Craig Harrison** was 18-of-41 passing for 185 yards with one touchdown, coming on in place of fellow junior QB **Chuckie Keeton** in the first quarter after Keeton went down with a knee injury and never returned. Keeton was 4-of-10 passing for 26 yards and a touchdown, adding three rushes for 17 yards before the injury.

Senior RB **Joey DeMartino** rushed for 80 yards on 16 carries, while Harrison rushed for 38 yards on six carries and freshman RB **Kennedy Williams** rushed for 37 yards on six rushes.

The senior duo of WR **Travis Reynolds** and TE **D.J. Tialavea** each had four receptions, with Reynolds totaling 47 yards and Tialavea tallying 21 yards. Junior TE **Keegan Andersen** matched Reynolds with 47 yards on three catches.

Senior LB **Jake Doughty** registered a team-high 14 tackles, while sophomore LB **Kyler Fackrell** tallied 13 stops. Doughty logged 2.5 tackles for loss, while Fackrell recorded a pair of tackles for loss. Junior LB **Zach Vigil** notched 11 tackles and senior SS **Maurice Alexander** forced a first-quarter fumble to set up USU's first touchdown of the night.

The Cougars were led by Taysom Hill's 17-of-31 passing for 278 yards with three touchdowns, all to Mitch Mathews, who finished with five catches for 112 yards. Jamaal Williams totaled 79 yards rushing on 14 carries. Uani 'Unga led BYU's defense with a game-high 16 stops, while Robertson Daniel added 10 tackles.

BYU started its scoring on the first play from scrimmage, as Kyle Van Noy jumped in the middle of a Keeton pass and snared it and returned it 17 yards to the end zone for an early 7-0 Cougar lead.

The Aggie defense generated a score two series later, with Alexander forcing a Hill fumble after a scamper and junior FS **Brian Suite** recovered at the BYU 10. Three plays later Keeton threw a 7-yard pass to senior WR **Travis Van Leeuwen**, and sophomore PK **Nick Diaz** hit the extra point to tie the score at 7-7 with 10:48 on the first quarter clock.

On the Cougars' next possession, Hill led the charge with a 14-play, 67-yard drive end-

ing with a Justin Sorensen 27-yard field goal with 7:04 to go in the first frame.

BYU added to its lead with a 30-yard touchdown toss from Hill to Mathews, the first of their three touchdown connections on the night, for a 17-7 Cougar lead at the 10:30 mark of the second quarter, which remained the score into halftime.

Hill and Mathews connected with two more touchdowns in the third quarter, first on a 6-yarder with 12:06 to go and again on a 43-yard strike with 5:52 on the third quarter clock for a 31-7 Cougar lead and capping BYU's scoring.

The Aggies added an 8-yard touchdown from Harrison to junior WR Ronald Butler with 1:34 left in the game to conclude the scoring at 31-14.

PROVO, Utah - Utah State lost to Brigham Young, 6-3, on Oct. 5, 2012 in a nationally televised game on ESPN. The nine combined points between the Aggies (4-2) and Cougars (4-2) was the fewest in the series since a 0-0 tie in 1946.

Utah State was held to 243 yards of total offense as sophomore QB **Chuckie Keeton** was 22-of-38 for 202 yards. USU had a season-low 41 rushing yards. Keeton had 23 yards on 10 carries, while senior RB **Kerwynn Williams** had 18 yards on 14 carries. Senior WR **Matt Austin** led the team with seven catches for 72 yards, while Williams added five catches for 39 yards.

Senior FS **McKade Brady** led the Aggie defense with 14 tackles, while the linebacker duo of sophomore **Zach Vigil** and redshirt freshman **Kyler Fackrell** followed with 10 each. Fackrell also snared his first career interception.

BYU was led by freshman QB Taysom Hill who had 235 passing yards, completing 24-of-36 passes. Hill also had 19 rushes for a total of 80 yards. Junior WR Cody Hoffman led the BYU receiving corps with eight catches for a total of 114 yards.

The Cougar defense was led by Brandon Ogletree with seven stops, while Preston Hadley and Spencer Hadley had six tackles each.

The Aggies opened the scoring with a 26-yard field goal from junior PK **Josh Thompson** with 34 seconds left in the first quarter, capping a 13-play, 49-yard drive.

The score would remain 3-0 until three seconds were left in the half when BYU scored on a 3-yard pass from Hill to JD Falslev, but Riley Stephenson's PAT attempt was wide left, leaving the score 6-3 in BYU's favor heading into halftime.

On USU's first possession of the second half, the Aggies fumbled and BYU recovered at the USU 9, but the Aggie defense forced a Cougars' field goal attempt. BYU tried a fake field goal but the USU defense sniffed it out, as the Aggies chased BYU holder Falslev and he fell down for a 16-yard loss back to the 23-yard line.

The teams traded punts back-and-forth until early in the fourth quarter when Fackrell snared his first career interception, batting the ball out of the air and then snaring it, to

give the Aggies the ball at their own 48. USU's offense took over with 10:21 to go and drove down to the BYU 20, but Thompson's 38-yard field goal attempt floated wide left, leaving the score still at 6-3.

USU's defense forced BYU to punt and got the ball back with 5:06 to go, but were 94 yards from the end zone. The Aggies got out to the 30, but the drive stalled and they had to punt it back to the Cougars with just over two minutes to play and USU with two timeouts.

Facing a 3rd-and-6 from the BYU 28, the Cougars picked up the first down with 1:44 left, and ran out the clock for the win.

ZACH VIGIL RECOGNIZED BY COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS

Senior LB **Zach Vigil** was named an honorable mention national Linebacker of the Week by College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) last week as he recorded a career-high tying 3.0 tackles for loss, which included a career-high tying 2.0 sacks, as part of his career-high 14 tackles to go along with one pass breakup against Arkansas State. Overall, it was Vigil's second double-digit tackle outing of the season and the 13th of his career and now has 9.5 career sacks and 29.0 career tackles for loss.

LT FILIAGA RECOGNIZED BY COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS

Junior LB **LT Filiaga** was named an honorable mention national Linebacker of the Week by College Football Performance Awards for his performance at Arkansas State two weeks ago as he tied his career high with 10 tackles, which includes 1.0 tackle for loss and one pass breakup and a career-high two fumble recoveries. Overall, it is Filiaga's second career double-digit tackle outing as he also had 10 stops earlier this year against Idaho State.

DEVIN CENTERS RECORDS CAREER-HIGH 11 TACKLES AT ARKANSAS STATE

Sophomore FS **Devin Centers** recorded his second double-digit tackle outing of his career in his last game against Arkansas State as he had a career-high 11 tackles, which included a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss and a career-high tying 1.0 sack. Center also recovered his second fumble in as many weeks against the Red Wolves. In his previous game against Wake Forest, Centers scored his first career touchdown on a 47-yard fumble return, which was his first career fumble recovery. Centers began the 2014 season with career-high tackles in back-to-back games as he had nine stops in his first career start at Tennessee and then recorded a career-high 10 stops against Idaho State.

HUNTER SHARP HAS BACK-TO-BACK 100-YARD RECEIVING GAMES

Junior WR **Hunter Sharp** has had back-to-back 100-yard receiving games in his last two outings against Wake Forest and Arkansas State. Against the Demon Deacons, Sharp caught a career-high 12 passes for a career-best 138 yards. Those 12 receptions for Sharp are the most by an Aggie since **Kevin Curtis** had 13 receptions against Middle Tennessee in 2002. Furthermore, the 138 receiving yards are the most for USU since current senior WR **Ronald Butler** had 145 receiving yards at No. 24 Fresno State in the 2013 Mountain West Championship game. At Arkansas State, Sharp had nine catches for 130 yards, including an 81-yard touchdown reception to rank tied for the 13th-longest pass play in school history. Prior to the Wake Forest game, Sharp had just two career receptions in two games. Overall, Sharp is the first Aggie to have back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since **Travis Reynolds** accomplished the feat during the 2013 season against Hawai'i and UNLV.

GARRETSON PLAYS WELL IN FIRST START OF THE SEASON AT ARKANSAS STATE

Sophomore QB **Darell Garretson** played well in his first start of the season at Arkansas State as he was 27-of-46 passing for 268 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. The 27 completions by Garretson were the second-most of his career, and just one behind his careerhigh of 28 completions against Hawai'i last year. Garretson also attempted a career-high 47 passes, while his 268 passing yards are the third-most of his career. Overall, Garretson now has three touchdown passes this year and 13 in his career. For his career, Garretson is 6-2 as a starter and won his first five starts to set the school record. He also set the freshman school record with 1,446 passing yards a year ago.

FRANKIE SUTERA RECORDS THIRD CAREER INTERCEPTION AT ARKANSAS STATE

Senior SS **Frankie Sutera** recorded his second interception in as many weeks and third of his career in his last game at Arkansas State. Sutera's first interception of the season was against Wake Forest, as he added a career-high nine tackles against the Demon Deacons.

TORREY GREEN CONTINUES TO PLAY WELL

Junior LB **Torrey Green** continues to play well for Utah State as he had his second sack in as many weeks at Arkansas State, while adding a career-high two QB hurries. In his previous game against Wake Forest, Green recorded a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss as part of his career-high six tackles, which included his first career sack. And against Idaho State, Green tied his career-high with four tackles, while forcing and recovering his first career fumble.

NICK VIGIL PERFORMS WELL AT ARKANSAS STATE

Sophomore LB **Nick Vigil** continued his solid play during his last game at Arkansas State as he recorded eight tackles, recorded his 14th career tackle for loss, and forced his second career fumble. Against Wake Forest, Vigil had nine tackles, which included 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack. Vigil also had a career-high 3.0 QB hurries against Wake Forest and forced his first career fumble that was returned 47 yards for a touchdown by sophomore S **Devin Centers**.

DID YOU KNOW?

Utah State has won 15 straight games when it has a 100-yard rusher, with its last loss coming against Ohio (24-23) in the 2011 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. USU has also won 14 of its last 15 contests when rushing at least 40 times in a game.





BUTLER RECORDS SEASON-HIGHS AT ARKANSAS STATE

Senior WR **Ronald Butler** had his best game of the season in his last outing at Arkansas State as he tied his career-high with five receptions for a season-best 80 yards. Butler also caught his first touchdown of the season and fourth of his career from 41 yards. In his previous game against Wake Forest, Butler threw his first career touchdown pass to junior WR **JoJo Natson** from 44 yards. Butler is the first non-quarterback to throw a touchdown pass for Utah State since 2011 when **Stanley Morrison** threw a 34-yard touchdown pass to **Robert Turbin**.

JARON BENTRUDE CONTINUES TO PUNT WELL

Senior P **Jaron Bentrude** has had 13 of his 29 punts this season downed inside the 20-yard line, including three in each of his last two games against Arkansas State and Wake Forest and six in his game before that against Idaho State, giving him 44 punts downed inside the 20-yard line during his career. Bentrude has also had three punts downed inside the 10-yard line this season for 14 career punts downed inside the 10-yard line in his career. Bentrude has also had three 50-yard punts on the season and just one of his punts has been a touchback, while 14 have been fair caught. As a junior, Bentrude had 31 punts downed inside the 20-yard line to rank 11th in the nation , while 11 of his punts were downed inside the 10-yard line to rank 16th nationally.

THREE AGGIES THROW TOUCHDOWN PASSES AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Utah State had three different players throw touchdown passes last weekend against Wake Forest in senior QB **Chuckie Keeton**, sophomore QB **Darell Garretson** and senior WR **Ronald Butler**. Through three weeks of the 2014 season, USU is the only Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team who has had three different players throw a touchdown pass in the same game. And according to available records, it is also the first time in school history that USU has had three players throw a touchdown pass in the same game.

AGGIES UTILIZE TIGHT ENDS AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Utah State's two tight ends both had career games against Wake Forest as sophomore **Wyatt Houston** had a career-high four receptions for 32 yards, including a 5-yard touchdown, which is the third of his career. Senior **Jefferson Court** also had a career-game with a career-high two receptions for seven yards, including his first career touchdown from six yards. During the 2013 season, USU set a school record as Aggie tight ends caught nine touchdowns.

JALEN DAVIS STARTS GAME ONE AS A TRUE FRESHMAN

True freshman CB **Jalen Davis** started his first collegiate game at Tennessee, marking the first time Utah State has started a true freshman in a season opener since **Chuckie Keeton** did so at Auburn in 2011. According to available records, Davis is the first true freshman in school history to start the season opener at cornerback.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

Utah State has had 13 players make their first career start this season as sophomore S **Devin Centers**, senior TE **Jefferson Court**, freshman CB **Jalen Davis**, junior OG **Taani Fisilau**, junior CB **Bryant Hayes**, sophomore OT **Jake Simonich**, sophomore OC **Austin Stephens** and senior OG **Bill Vavau** all made their first career starts at Tennessee, while junior LB LT **Filiaga** and junior WR **Hunter Sharp** both made their first career starts against Idaho State, freshman WR **Damoun Patterson** made his first career start against Wake Forest, and junior RB **Rashad Hall** and redshirt freshman OG **Tyshon Mosley** both made their first career starts at Arkansas States.

TWENTY AGGIES GET FIRST DIVISION I EXPERIENCE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

Utah State had 18 players play in their first-ever Division I game against Tennessee in freshman CB Jalen Davis, redshirt junior S Marwin Evans, junior CB Tyler Floyd, redshirt junior RB Rashad Hall, junior CB Bryant Hayes, junior CB Deshane Hines, freshman RB LaJuan Hunt, redshirt freshman OL Tyshon Mosley, sophomore CB Jentz Painter, freshman WR Damoun Patterson, junior WR Hunter Sharp, redshirt sophomore OC Austin Stephens, sophomore DE Siua Taufa, junior DE John Taylor, freshman LB lan Togia, redshirt freshman WR Hayden Weichers, redshirt freshman WR Tyler Weese and junior LB Anthony Williams. USU also had two players get their first-ever Division I experience against Idaho State in redshirt freshman OL Brandon Taukeiaho and redshirt freshman WR Braelon Roberts.

DID YOU KNOW?

Utah State has lost a pair of starters this year to season-ending injuries in junior LB **Kyler Fackrell** (knee) and junior WR **Brandon Swindall** (achilles). During the 2013 season, USU lost five offensive starters to season-ending injuries, including four during a two-week period in September and October as OG **Kyle Whimpey** and junior RB **Joe Hill** both suffered season-ending knee injuries against San José State (9/27/13), while junior QB **Chuckie Keeton** (knee) and senior TE **D.J. Tialavea** (foot) suffered season-ending injuries against BYU (10/4/13). USU then lost its fifth offensive starter in WR **Travis Reynolds** to a season-ending knee injury against Colorado State (11/23).

UTAH STATE RANKS TIED FOR FOURTH IN THE NATION IN RUSHING DEFENSE

Utah State's defense currently ranks first in the Mountain West and tied for fourth in the nation in rushing defense as it is allowing just 78.2 rushing yards per game. USU also ranks first in the MW and 32nd in the nation in total defense (334.8 ypg), second in the MW and tied for 19th in the nation in sacks (3.25 pg), second in the MW and 30th nationally in passing efficiency defense (112.0), seventh in the MW and tied for 69th nationally in scoring defense (25.8 ppg), and seventh in the MW and 88th nationally in passing defense (256.5 ypg).

UTAH STATE RANKS EIGHTH IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST IN SCORING

Utah State's offense ranks eighth in the Mountain West and tied for 92nd in the nation in scoring with 24.2 points per game. USU also ranks tied for sixth in the MW and tied for 52nd in the nation in sacks allowed (1.75 pg), seventh in the MW and 81st in the nation in completion percentage (.577), seventh in the MW and 82nd in the nation in passing offense (214.8 ypg), eighth in the MW and 79th nationally in rushing offense (154.0 ypg), ninth in the MW and 94th in the nation in total offense (368.8 ypg), and 11th in the MW in passing efficiency (108.9).

UTAH STATE RANKS 18TH IN THE NATION IN PUNT RETURN DEFENSE

Utah State ranks second in the Mountain West and 18th nationally in punt return defense (2.75 ypr) and fourth in the MW and 24th in the nation in kickoff return defense (17.70 ypr). Last year, USU ranked first in the MW and second in the nation in punt return defense (1.30 ypr) and first in the MW and fifth in the nation in kickoff return defense (17.58 ypr). USU also ranks third in the MW and tied for 39th in the nation in turnover margin (0.50 pg), sixth in the MW and 73rd in the nation in kickoff returns (20.4 ypr), seventh in the MW and tied for 77th nationally in punt returns (7.7 ypr), and eighth in the MW and 68th in the nation in net punting (37.7 ypk).

UTAH STATE'S DEFENSE GETTING OFF THE FIELD ON THIRD DOWN

Utah State ranks second in the Mountain West and tied for 26th in the nation as its opponents are converting only 31.8 percent of its third downs into first downs (21-66).

AGGIES IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST AND NCAA RANKINGS

Junior WR/PR JoJo Natson ranks tied for first in the Mountain West and tied for third in the nation with one punt return for touchdown, second in the MW and 19th in the nation in punt return average (13.3 ypr), and seventh in the MW in all-purpose yards (102.5 pg). Sophomore FS Devin Centers ranks tied for first in the MW and tied for fourth in the nation in fumbles recovered (0.50 pg), tied for first in the MW and tied for 51st in the nation in sacks (0.75 pg), fifth in the MW and tied for 78th in the nation in tackles (8.5 pg), and 10th in the MW in tackles for loss (1.1 pg). Sophomore LB Nick Vigil ranks second in the MW and tied for 13th in the nation in fumbles forced (0.50 pg), second in the MW and tied for 32nd in the nation in tackles (10.0 pg), tied for sixth in the MW and tied for 40th in the nation in tackles for loss (1.4 pg), and tied for fifth in the MW in sacks (0.50 pg). Senior DE B.J. Larsen ranks tied for first in the MW and tied for 51st nationally in sacks (0.75 pg), and tied for second in the MW and tied for 21st in the nation in tackles for loss (1.5 pg). Freshman CB Jalen Davis ranks tied for third in the MW and tied for 31st in the nation in interceptions (0.50 pg), and tied for third in the MW and tied for 46th in the nation in passes defended (1.25 pg). Senior LB Zach Vigil ranks tied for second in the MW and tied for 21st nationally in tackles for loss (1.50 pg), and third in the MW and tied for 48th in the nation in tackles (9.2 pg). Senior SS Frankie Sutera ranks tied for third in the MW and tied for 31st nationally in interceptions (0.50 pa), tied for fifth in the MW and tied for 91st in the nation in fumbles forced (0.50 pa), and tied for 45th in the MW in tackles (5.0 pg), Junior WR Hunter Sharp ranks third in the MW and 52nd in the nation in receiving yards (76.2 pg), and sixth in the MW and tied for 47th in the nation in receptions (5.8 pg). Junior LB Torrey Green ranks tied for fifth in the MW and tied for 33rd in the nation in fumbles recovered (0.25 pg), tied for fifth in the MW and tied for 91st in the nation in fumbles forced (0.50 pg), and eighth in the MW and tied for 45th in the nation in tackles for loss (1.25 pg). Sophomore CB **Daniel Gray** ranks tied for seventh in the MW in passes defended (1.0 pg). Senior FS Brian Suite ranks tied for 40th in the MW in tackles (5.2 pg). Senior QB Chuckie Keeton ranks ninth in the MW in completion percentage (.554), 10th in passing (142.0 ypg), and 10th in the MW in passing efficiency (92.8). Sophomore RB Kennedy Williams ranks eighth in the MW and 85th nationally in kickoff return average (20.9 ypr). Senior P Jaron Bentrude ranks ninth in the MW and 92nd in the nation in punting (38.8 ypk). And senior PK Nick Diaz ranks tied for seventh in the MW and tied for 82nd in the nation in field goals (0.75 pg), ninth in the MW and tied for 79th in the nation in field goal percentage (.600), and ninth in the MW in scoring among kickers (4.8).

Utah State ranks first in the Mountain West and second in the nation with an average of 9.5 tackles for loss per game. USU also ranks second in the MW and 19th nationally with its six interceptions, while its 11 forced turnovers thus far this year ranks second in the MW and 14th nationally.

- Under head coach **Matt Wells**, Utah State is 10-1 when it scores first; 8-1 when leading after the first quarter; 9-2 when leading at halftime; 11-1 when leading after three quarters; 10-2 when scoring 20-plus points; 8-0 when scoring 30-plus points; 9-1 when allowing less than 20 points; 4-0 when allowing less than 10 points; 7-0 with a 100-yard rusher; 10-3 when it out-gains its opponent; 10-4 when it has less turnovers than its opponent; and 9-4 when it controls the time of possession.

Utah State has had great success with its walk-on program recently and currently has nine former walk-ons who appear on its depth chart including senior P **Jaron Bentrude**, junior LB **Torrey Green**, senior QB **Craig Harrison**, redshirt freshman LB **Alex Huerta**, senior DE **B.J. Larsen**, junior DE **Jordan Nielsen**, senior SS **Frankie Sutera**, sophomore K **Jake Thompson**



In fact, Harrison, Larsen, Sutera and Vigil have all started at least one game for Utah State, while Larsen and Vigil were both named second-team all-Mountain West in 2013, while Vigil and Nielsen both earned all-league honors in 2012. Another former walk-on for USU is **Jake Doughty** who was a two-time first-team all-conference selection.

AGGIES IN OVERTIME

With its 21-14 overtime loss at Arkansas State on Sept. 20, 2014, Utah State is now 6-5 all-time in overtime, including winning three of its last four. All-time, USU is 4-3 in single-overtime games, 2-1 in double-overtime games, and 0-1 in triple overtime games.

DID YOU KNOW?

Utah State's top two quarterbacks in senior **Chuckie Keeton** and sophomore **Darell Garretson** are a combined 25-13 as a starter as Keeton is 19-11 under center, while Garretson is 6-2. Those 19 career wins by Keeton rank second all-time in school history behind only **Tony Adams'** (1970-72) 22 career wins.

CHUCKIE KEETON IN THE AGGIE RECORD BOOK

Senior QB Chuckie Keeton ranks among the top 10 in school history in the following categories:

- First all-time with a career completion percentage of 65.4 percent (568-869).
- First all-time with an interception percentage of 0.020 as he has thrown just 17 interceptions in 869 pass attempts.
- Second all-time with 58 career touchdown passes. **Jose Fuentes** (1999-2002) holds the school record at 60.
- Second all-time with 568 career completions. Fuentes holds the school record with 704.
- Third all-time with 7,621 yards of total offense (6,387-passing, 1,234-rushing). Fuentes holds the school record with 8,791 yards, while while **Diondre Borel** (2007-10) is second with 8,096 yards.
- Third all-time with 6,387 passing yards. Fuentes holds the school record with 9,168 yards.
- Fourth all-time with 869 career pass attempts. Fuentes holds the school record with 1,270.
- 20th all-time with 1,234 career rushing yards (272 carries, 4.5 ypc). **Demario Brown** (1996-99) holds the school record with 4,053 yards, while Borel holds the school record with 1,398 yards by a quarterback. Overall, Keeton is just the 25th player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards and just the second quarterback.
- Set single-season school records as a sophomore in 2012 for touchdown passes (27), passing yards (3,373), total offensive yards (3,992), completions (275) and completion percentage (.676), and broke his own completion percentage record as a junior (.694).
- Is the only quarterback in school history to have five touchdown passes in three games as he tied the single-game school record against both Air Force (9/7/13) and Weber State (9/14/13) during his junior season, as well as against Wyoming (10/8/11) as a freshman.
- Set a single-game school record with an 88.0 percent completion percentage against Southern Utah (8/30/12) during his sophomore season as he was 22-of-25 passing.
- Tied the single-game school record for rushing yards by a quarterback with 121 yards on a career-high tying 17 carries in a 48-41 overtime win at No. 19 Louisiana Tech (11/17/12) during his sophomore season. **Tony Adams** set the record in 1972.

WHAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN FOR KEETON IN 2013

Senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** was putting up some gaudy numbers during his junior season before missing the final eight games with a knee injury suffered against BYU on Oct. 4. Through his first five games, Keeton ranked second in the nation with 17 touchdown passes, while also ranking first in the Mountain West and second in the nation in points responsible for (22.8 pg), second in the MW and 22nd in the nation in passing efficiency (161.6), third in the MW and eighth in the nation in completions (26.4 pg), third in the MW and 11th in the nation in completion percentage (.710), third in the MW and 18th in the nation in total offense (317.2 ypg), and fourth in the MW and 25th in the nation in passing (272.4 ypg). Keeton concluded his junior campaign completing 136-of-196 passes for 1,388 yards (231.3 ypg) with 18 touchdowns and two interceptions, while rushing for 241 yards on 55 carries (40.2 ypg/4.4 ypc) with two more scores. Those 18 touchdown passes rank tied for ninth all-time at USU, while his completion percentage of 69.4 percent ranks first all-time.

DID YOU KNOW?

Senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** is one of just eight active quarterbacks at the FBS level who holds their school's single-season passing record along with Shane Carden (East Carolina), Garrett Grayson (Colorado State), Jard Goff (California), Connor Halliday (Washington State), Brett Hundley (UCLA), Sean Mannion (Oregon State) and Brandon Doughty (Western Kentucky). Keeton set the USU record with 3,373 passing yards during his sophomore season in 2012.





NICK DIAZ IN THE AGGIE RECORD BOOK

Senior PK **Nick Diaz** ranks among the top 10 in school history in the following categories:

- Second all-time in extra points made with 101. **Brad Bohn** (1997-2000) holds the school record with 107.
- Second all-time in extra point attempts with 105. Bohn holds the school record with 119.
- Third all-time in field goal percentage at 73.2 percent (29-38). **Russ Moody** (1988-89) holds the school record at 84.6 percent (22-26).
- Sixth all-time in extra point percentage at 96.1 percent. Willie Beecher (1981-84) and Russ Moody (1988-89) are tied for first as neither missed an extra point during their careers as Beecher was 64-of-64 and Moody was 44-of-44.
- Seventh all-time with 30 field goals made. Bohn holds the school record with 59.
- Eighth all-time with 41 field goal attempts. Bohn holds the school record with 89.
- Ninth all-time in scoring with 191 points. **Robert Turbin** (2007-11) holds the school record with 308 career points.
- Ranked second following the 2013 season in both extra points made (51) and attempted (52), while his extra point percentage (.980) ranked ninth for a single-season in school history.
- Ranked fifth following the 2013 season with 17 made field goals and seventh with his 23 field goal attempts.



Senior LB Zach Vigil recorded a career-high 14 tackles in his last game at Arkansas State to give him 270 tackles in his career moving him ahead of Shawn Miller (259, 1979-82) and into 19th-place all-time in school history. As a junior, Vigil recorded 124 tackles (47-solo, 77-assist) marking the 60th time in school history that a player has recorded 100 or more tackles in a single-season. Vigil concluded the 2012 season with 105 tackles and is one of just 15 players in school history to record 100 or more tackles multiple times during a career. Overall, Vigil had six double-digit tackle outings last year and has 12 in his career.

ZACH AND NICK VIGIL RANK FIRST AMONG ACTIVE BROTHERS IN TACKLES

Senior LB **Zach Vigil** has recorded 270 tackles during his career and sophomore LB **Nick Vigil** has recorded 98 career tackles. Overall, the two brothers have combined for 368 career tackles to rank first at the FBS level as far as active brothers ahead of Duke's Kelby and Kyler Brown who have combined for 323 career tackles.



KYLER FACKRELL IN THE AGGIE RECORD BOOK

- Junior LB **Kyler Fackrell** has intercepted four passes during his career for 125 return yards, which ranks tied for ninth all-time in school history along with **Rob Fuhriman** (1972-74). Fackrell is the only linebacker among USU's top 10 career leaders in this category. The school record for career interception return yards is 373 set by **Henry King** (1965-66).
- Fackrell's 99-yard interception return for a touchdown against Hawai'i in 2013 ranked as the third-longest in school and Mountain West history. Those 99 interception return yards also rank Fackrell 10th on USU's single-season lists.

JOJO NATSON IN THE AGGIE RECORD BOOK

Junior WR/PR **JoJo Natson** ranks third all-time in school history with a punt return average of 11.6 yards as he has returned 37 punts for 431 yards during his career. The school record for career punt return average is 18.8 yards set by **Tom Larscheid** (1959-61).

AGGIES DEFENSE AMONG THE BEST IN THE NATION THE LAST TWO YEARS

Utah State's defense has been among the best in the nation during the past two seasons as it has ranked among the top 15 teams each year in scoring defense, total defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense.

- Utah State is one of just three teams to rank among the top seven nationally in scoring defense in each of the past two seasons along with Alabama and Florida State as USU allowed just 15.4 points per game in 2012 and just 17.1 points per game in 2013. During the past two seasons, USU ranks fourth nationally allowing an average of just 16.26 points per game trailing only Alabama (12.37 ppg), Florida State (13.43 ppg) and Michigan State (14.70 ppg). Overall, it is the first time USU has allowed less than 18.0 points per game in consecutive seasons since 1965 and 1966.
- Utah State is one of just five teams to rank among the top 13 nationally in rushing defense in each of the past two seasons along with Alabama, Michigan State, Rutgers and Stanford as USU allowed just 113.8 rushing yards per game in 2012 and just 106.7 rushing yards per game in 2013. During the past two seasons, USU ranks fifth nationally allowing an average of just 110.1 rushing yards per game trailing only Alabama (90.7 ypg), Michigan State (92.4 ypg), Stanford (93.2 ypg) and Rutgers (99.0 ypg).
- During the 2013 season, Utah State allowed just two 100-yard rushers, just nine rushing touchdowns and just six rushes of 20 or more yards in 14 games, while its longest rushing touchdown allowed was from seven yards. USU ended the 2013 season by holding five of its last six opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, including each of its last four.
- Utah State is one of just six teams to rank among the top 14 nationally in total defense in each of the past two seasons along with Alabama, Bowling Green, Florida, Florida State and Michigan State as USU allowed just 322.1 yards of total offense per game in 2012 and just 330.9 yards of total offense per game in 2013. During the past two seasons, USU ranks eighth nationally allowing an average of just 326.6 yards of total offense per game trailing only Michigan State (262.9 ypg), Alabama (267.6 ypg), Florida State (267.8 ypg), Florida (300.3 ypg), Virginia Tech (308.4 ypg), Bowling Green (309.5 ypg) and Wisconsin (314.1 ypg).

MORE DEFENSIVE NOTES DURING THE PAST TWO SEASONS

- Utah State has led at the half in 22 of its last 29 games dating back to 2011 and is 19-3 in those contests. USU has also led or been tied at the end of the first quarter in 20 of its last 29 games and is 18-2 in those contest, but 1-5 during its last 29 games when trailing at the end of the first period and 2-5 during its last 29 games when trailing at the end of the first half.
- Utah State has not allowed a first quarter touchdown in 24 of its last 30 games dating back to the 2011 season as USU was the only Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team in the nation not to allow a first quarter touchdown during the 2012 season. Furthermore, USU has held 16 of its last 26 opponents without a first half touchdown, while six of those 26 opponents have been held scoreless in the first-half.

UTAH STATE STARTED THREE DIFFERENT QB's IN 2013

Utah State started three different quarterbacks last year in juniors **Chuckie Keeton** and **Craig Harrison**, along with freshman **Darell Garreston**, which ranked tied for the second-most in the nation along with Hawai'i, Nevada, Temple, Western Kentucky and West Virginia. Air Force led the nation in most quarterbacks started with four. Of those seven schools who started at least three quarterbacks last year, Utah State had a 9-5 record, Western Kentucky was 8-4, West Virginia was 4-8, Nevada was 4-8, Air Force was 2-10, Temple was 2-10 and Hawai'i was 1-11.

AGGIES THREW JUST 10 INTERCEPTIONS IN 2013

Utah State threw a total of just 10 interceptions in 2013 to rank fourth in the Mountain West and 35th in the nation. Freshman quarterback **Darell Garretson** threw seven interceptions in 209 attempts, junior quarterback **Chuckie Keeton** threw two picks in 196 attempts and junior quarterback **Craig Harrison** threw one pick in 74 attempts.

AGGIES AT HOME

Utah State has won five straight home games and 14 of its last 16 home games overall, including 11 of its last 13 home games against non-conference opponents.

DID YOU KNOW?

Along with all of its success on the field, Utah State has also excelled in the classroom as it had 22 football players earn academic all-Mountain West honors in 2013, including five Mountain West Scholar-Athletes, both of which ranked second in the league. Over the past five years, USU has had 106 players earn academic all-league honors and 129 players have graduated from Utah State.





AGGIES IN THE NFL

Utah State currently has 10 players on NFL rosters and has had eight players drafted into the NFL in the past four years. According to *Emory Sports Marketing Analytics*, USU is the fifth-most efficient program in the nation at converting high school talent into NFL draft picks during the past three years.

LOOKING BACK ON 2013

Utah State ended the 2013 season with a 9-5 record, which is tied with the 1960 and 1961 teams for the second-most wins in school history, and trailing the 2012 team that set the single-season school record with 11 wins. USU ended the 2013 season with two votes in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' polls to rank tied for 37th in the nation in both polls. Overall, Utah State recorded back-to-back-back winning seasons for the first time since 1978-80 as it went 7-6 in 2011, 11-2 in 2012 and 9-5 in 2013.

WELLS NAMED 2013 MOUNTAIN WEST COACH OF THE YEAR

Second-year head coach **Matt Wells** was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2013 as he led Utah State to a 9-5 record and a Mountain Division Championship with a 7-1 league record, despite losing five offensive starters to season-ending injuries including junior QB and Heisman Trophy candidate **Chuckie Keeton**. Wells also set the single-season school record for wins by a first year head coach with nine, bettering **Tony Knap** whose Aggies went 8-2 in 1963. Overall, Wells became just the fifth coach in school history and second in as many years to earn conference coach of the year honors as **Gary Andersen** earned WAC Coach of the Year accolades in 2012, while **Bruce Snyder** (1978), **Chuck Shelton** (1991) and **John L. Smith** (1997) all earned Big West Coach of the Year honors. Wells is also just the fourth individual to earn Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in his first season joining BYU's Gary Crowton (2001), Utah's Urban Meyer (2003) and Air Force's Troy Calhoun (2007).

AGGIES WIN BACK-TO-BACK BOWL GAMES FOR FIRST TIME EVER

Utah State played in its third-straight bowl game for the first time ever as it posted a 21-14 win against No. 24 Northern Illinois in the 2013 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. Overall, USU has now won back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history and is 3-6 all-time in nine bowl game appearances.

AGGIES WIN MOUNTAIN DIVISION, PLAY IN MW CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Utah State finished its first season in the Mountain West by going 7-1 in league play to win the Mountain Division title and advance to the inaugural Mountain West Championship game, where it lost at No. 24 Fresno State, 24-17. USU's seven league wins in 2013 are a school record, bettering the six league wins set in 1936 and 2012. Overall, USU has won 18 of its last 19 league games dating back to 2011, including a school record 11 straight on the road, and won a school record 13 straight conference games before falling to Boise State, 34-23, at home on Oct. 12, 2013.

UTAH STATE HAS 13 PLAYERS ON ITS ROSTER WITH BACHELORS DEGREES

Entering the 2014 season, USU has 13 players who have already graduated from USU in senior P Jaron Bentrude, senior QB Craig Harrison, senior WR Shaan Johnson, senior NG Elvis Kamana-Matagi, senior DE B.J. Larsen, junior LB Michael Okonkwo, senior CB Rashard Stewart, senior FS Brian Suite, senior OC Joe Summers, senior SS Frankie Sutera, senior LB Zach Vigil, senior OL Bryce Walker and senior OT Kevin Whimpey. Those 13 graduates on an active roster ranks tied for third at the FBS level with Cincinnati and Minnesota and behind Alabama (15) and Boston College (15).

AGGIES WHO ARE MARRIED

Utah State has 10 players on its active roster who are married in sophomore OL **Austin Albrecht**, sophomore DE **Ricky Ali'ifua**, senior TE **Jefferson Court**, junior LB **Kyler Fackrell**, junior LB **LT Filiaga**, senior QB **Craig Harrison**, senior OC **Joe Summers**, redshirt freshman OL **Brandon Taukeiaho**, freshman WR **Zach Van Leeuwen** and senior OT **Kevin Whimpey**.

UTAH STATE ENTERING SECOND SEASON IN MOUNTAIN WEST

Utah State is entering its second year as a member of the Mountain West and has been a Division I-A football playing school in each of its 116 seasons of competition. USU joined the Mountain States/Skyline Conference in 1938 until 1961. USU then played as a football independent from 1962-77 when the Aggies became members of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association in 1978. The PCAA changed its name to the Big West Conference in 1988. Following the 2000 season when the Big West no longer sponsored football, USU spent two years as an independent (2001-02) and two years in the Sun Belt Conference (2003-04), before joining the Western Athletic Conference for eight seasons from 2005-12.

DID YOU KNOW?

Utah State's coaching staff had just two changes during the off-season, and both were on the defensive side of the ball. Second-year head coach **Matt Wells** hired **Joe Lorig** as the linebackers coach and **Ikaika Malloe** as the defensive line coach. Lorig replaces **Kevin Clune** who was named the defensive coordinator at Hawai'i, while Malloe replaces **Frank Maile** who was named the defensive line coach at Vanderbilt.

- · Matt Wells wasted little time putting his stamp on the Aggie football program in his first season as head coach, as he led Utah State to the inaugural Mountain West Championship game after winning the Mountain Division of the conference with a 7-1 record in 2013.
- Wells also led Utah State to just its third-ever bowl victory as it posted a 21-14 win against No. 24 Northern Illinois in the 2013 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl.
- Wells was named the 2013 Mountain West Coach of the Year as he set the school record for wins by a first-year head coach as the Aggies finished the 2013 season with a 9-5 record, tying the 1960 and 1961 teams for the second-most wins in school history.
- During his first year as Utah State's head coach, Wells mentored 14 Aggies who earned various all-Mountain West honors, including three All-Americans as Tyler Larsen was named a second-team All-American by USA Today Sports, Nevin Lawson was named a third-team All-American by College Sports Madness, and Kyler Fackrell was named an honorable mention Sophomore All-American by College Football News.
- · Wells also coached a school-record four players who were invited and participated in the 2014 NFL Combine in Larsen, Lawson, Maurice Alexander and D.J. Tialavea, while a total of 11 players from the 2013 roster were invited to NFL camps, including Alexander (St. Louis Rams) and Lawson (Detroit Lions) who were both selected in the fourth round of the 2014 NFL Draft.
- Overall, Wells is the second USU coach in as many years and fifth in school history to garner conference coach of the year honors along with Bruce Snyder (1978), Chuck Shelton (1991), John L. Smith (1997) and Gary Andersen (2012). Wells is also the fourth individual to earn MW Coach of the Year honors in his first season along with BYU's Gary Crowton (2001), Utah's Urban Meyer (2003) and Air Force's Troy Calhoun (2007).
- Wells, who is the 12th-youngest head coach at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level and one of just 13 coaches to lead his alma mater, is just the second Utah State graduate to be appointed its head football coach joining Chris Pella, who graduated from USU in 1965 and coached the Aggies from 1983-85.
- Prior to being named the head coach at his alma mater, Wells spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach at Utah State, including serving as the team's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2012 campaign. In 2011, Wells coached USU's quarterbacks and was the team's recruiting coordinator.
- During his three years at Utah State, Wells has been part of a Utah State program that has played in back-to-back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, and won consecutive bowl games for the first time ever, while posting a 27-13 record.
- As offensive coordinator in 2012, Utah State concluded its most successful season in school history with a school-best 11-2 record. USU also won its first outright conference championship since 1936.

JONESBORO, Ark. - Utah State had a 38-yard field goal blocked at the end of regulation and failed to score in overtime as it lost on the road at Arkansas State, 21-14, on Sept. 20, 2014. Both teams are now 2-2 on the season.

Utah State had a chance to win the game in regulation as the Aggies' defense forced its fourth turnover of the game late in the fourth quarter as junior LB **LT Filiaga** recovered his second fumble of the night at the Arkansas State 38-yard line with 0:47 seconds remaining. USU then drove the ball down to the ASU 21-yard line and called timeout with 0:03 seconds to play, but had its 38-yard field goal blocked to send the game into overtime.

During the extra period, Arkansas State had the ball first and scored on its second play from scrimmage on a 24-yard pass from Fredi Knighten to Dijon Paschal for the Red Wolves first lead of the game. USU then got the ball and had a fourth-and-seven at the ASU 22-yard line, but was unable to pick up the first down, losing the game as the Aggies are now 6-5 all-time in overtime.

Utah State finished the game with 413 yards of total offense (268-passing, 145-rushing) as compared to 316 yards (190-passing, 126-rushing) for Arkansas State. USU also won the time of possession, 31:56 to 28:04 as well as the turnover battle as the Aggies forced three fumbles and one interception for four total turnovers, and committed just one turnover.

Sophomore QB **Darell Garretson** was 27-of-46 passing for Utah State for 268 yards with two touchdowns and one interception, while junior WR **Hunter Sharp** had nine receptions for 130 yards, including an 81-yard reception from Garretson, which is tied for the 13th-longest pass play in school history.

Arkansas State took the opening kickoff and drove 65 yards in eight plays before sophomore LB **Nick Vigil** forced a Red Wolves fumble at the USU 19-yard line that was recovered by Filiaga.

Two series later, Utah State scored the first points of the game on an 81-yard pass from Garretson to Sharp on the first play of the series to give the visitors a 7-0 lead.

Utah State's defense forced two more turnovers in the first-half, but the Aggie offense was unable to convert them into any points as Garretson threw an interception in the red zone and sophomore PK **Jake Thompson** missed a 46-yard field goal late in the second quarter as the Aggies went into the locker room with a 7-0 lead.

Arkansas State tied the game at 7-all midway through the third quarter as senior P **Jaron Bentrude** fumbled the snap on a fourth-down punt play that resulted in a turnover at the USU 13-yard line. Three plays later, ASU's J.D. McKissic scored on a 12-yard rush

Utah State answered Arkansas State's touchdown on its next drive as senior WR **Ronald**

Butler scored on a 41-yard touchdown pass from Garretson to cap an 8-play, 75-yard drive to give the Aggies a 14-7 advantage with 3:43 remaining in the third quarter.

Arkansas State tied the game at 14-all with 4:58 to play on a 4-yard run by Johnston White. USU then went three-and-out on its next offensive series before the Aggie defense forced its fourth turnover of the night to set up what would have been the game-winning field goal.

Utah State's defense was led by senior LB **Zach Vigil** who had a careerhigh 14 tackles, and tied his careerhigh with 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Sophomore FS **Devin Centers** added a career-high 11 tackles, while Filiaga tied his career-high with 10 stops to go along with his two fumble recoveries.



Filiaga tied his career-high with 10 Senior LB Zach Vigil (53) had a career-high 14 tackles stops to go along with his two fumble against the Red Wolves, which included a career-high tying 2.0 sacks and a career-high tying 3.0 tackles for loss.

Junior WR Hunter Sharp (4) had a career-high 12 receptions for a career-best 138 yards in Utah State's 36-24 home win against Wake Forest, its first-ever win against an ACC opponent.

LOGAN, Utah - Behind a dominant defense that scored two touchdowns and limited Wake Forest (1-2) to negative 25 yards rushing, Utah State (2-1) rallied from an early 7-0 deficit with 29 unanswered points to beat the Demon Deacons, 36-24, for its first-ever win against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent.

Along with its two touchdowns, Utah State's defense sacked Wake Forest quarterback John Wolford a total of six times, spearheaded by three from senior DE B.J. Larsen. The Aggies also intercepted Wolford twice, including once by senior LB Zach Vigil, who returned it 35 yards for a touchdown to open Utah State's scoring after Wake Forest had scored on a 70-yard interception return of its own. Sophomore S Devin Centers also had a defensive score, scooping up a fumble and darting 47 yards to the end zone. Senior SS Frankie Sutera had the other interception, snaring a Wolford pass at midfield and returning it 24 yards to the WF 26-yard line, which set up the Aggies for a 6-yard touchdown toss from senior QB Chuckie Keeton to senior TE Jefferson Court at the 4:46 mark of the second quarter for Court's first career score.

Sutera and sophomore LB Nick Vigil led Utah State with nine tackles apiece, with Nick Vigil logging 2.5 tackles for loss. In all, the USU defense posted a total of 14 tackles for loss. Wake Forest finished with 232 yards, gaining 257 passing, as Wolford was 20-of-50 with two interceptions and two touchdowns. The negative 25 yards rushing allowed by USU is the third-best defensive performance in school history.

Utah State accumulated 391 yards of total offense with 331 through the air and 60 on the ground. Keeton was 20-of-27 passing for 166 yards with one touchdown, all in the first half, before not returning to action due to an injury. Sophomore QB Darell Garretson was 11-of-16 passing for 121 yards with one touchdown in relief.

Junior WR Hunter Sharp had 12 catches for 138 yards, both not only game-highs but career-bests as well, and were the most receptions by an Aggie receiver since Kevin Curtis in 2002. Junior WR JoJo Natson had six receptions for 78 yards with a touchdown on a 44-yard catch from senior WR Ronald Butler with 8:21 to go in the second quarter. Natson also led Utah State's rushing attack with 49 yards on eight carries.

Wake Forest scored the first points of the game on a 70-yard interception return only to see the Aggies counter-attack with Zach Vigil's oskie return for a score on WF's next possession to even the score at 7-7.

Utah State got its first offensive touchdown in the second quarter on Butler's 44-yard pass

to Natson. On the Demon Deacons' ensuing possession, Wolford was sacked by Nick Vigil and fumbled, then Centers scooped up the loose ball and ran it back 47-yards to the

After Sutera's snare set up USU at the WF 26, Keeton connected with Court to cap the short Aggie drive for a 26-7 Aggie advantage. Senior PK Nick Diaz then added a 26-yard field goal as time expired to give the home team a 29-7 halftime lead.

Wake Forest closed to 29-21 after back-to-back third quarter touchdowns. The Aggies, however, countered with a 5-yard Garretson touchdown pass to sophomore TE Wyatt Houston.

Wake Forest added a 30-yard field as neither team scored again.

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State (1-1) scored 27-straight points spanning the second and third quarter to pull away from a 6-6 tie and open up a 33-6 lead en route to a 40-20 win against Idaho State (0-2) Saturday night at Merlin Olsen Field at Romney Stadium.

Utah State finished with 427 yards of total offense (rushing - 311, passing - 116) and ISU had 408 yards of total offense (passing - 307 through, rushing - 101).

Senior QB Chuckie Keeton threw for 116 yards on 13-of-30 passing, while rushing for a team-high 74 yards on eight carries with a 10-yard scoring scamper. Junior RB Rashad Hall rushed for a career-best 69 yards on 11 carries with a 5-yard touchdown run, and senior RB Joe Hill also ran for 69 yards on 15 carries with a 1-yard score.

Sophomore WR JoJo Natson led Utah State's receiving corps with 59 yards on six catches, adding a 29-yard rush that would have been a touchdown but was called back due to a penalty. Natson did find the end zone on a 52-yard punt return.

Utah State's defense was led by sophomore S Devin Centers and junior LB LT Filiaga with 10 tackles apiece, with Centers posting one sack, while Filiaga was in on half of a tackle for loss. Freshman CB Jalen Davis snared two interceptions, including returning one 44 yards for a touchdown. Senior FS Brian Suite also added an interception.

Idaho State QB Justin Arias ended 23-of-47 passing for 307 yards with two touchdowns, while Xavier Finney finished with 88 yards on the ground with 23 carries. Mario Jenkins led the Bengal defense with 16 tackles.

Utah State took the opening kickoff and marched down the field to the ISU 37 before the drive thwarted and sophomore PK Jake Thompson attempted a 54-yard field goal, but it was partially blocked by ISU's Hayden Stout.

Davis ended the Bengals' ensuing possession with his first interception, setting up the Aggies at the ISU 22. USU couldn't move the chains and settled for a 31-yard field goal by senior PK Nick Diaz for a 3-0 lead at the 10:13 mark of the first quarter. Diaz later drilled a 24-yarder with 1:16 to go in the first frame for a 6-0 Aggie advantage.

Idaho State opened the second quarter with a 21-yard field goal from Zak Johnson, and later evened the score at 6-all with another Johnson upright split, this time from 49-yards out with 9:59 to go in the half.

Hall broke up the field goal party with his 5-yard touchdown with 2:33 left in the half for a 13-6 USU lead. The score stayed that way for just over a minute, as the Aggie defense limited the Bengals to a three-and-out, then Natson took the ISU punt and returned it 52-yards for his third career punt return for a touchdown for a 20-6 USU halftime lead.

Suite snared his interception on ISU's opening possession of the second half, giving USU the ball at the Bengal 17. Three plays later Hill darted around the right side and dove into the end zone, putting the Aggies ahead 26-6 as Diaz' extra point bounced off the upright.

Idaho State's ensuing possession lasted all of two plays as Davis snared an Arias pass, and took it 44-yards to the house on the pick-six for a 33-6 Aggie advantage with 12:09 to go on the third-quarter clock.

Following ISU's first touchdown of the night, Keeton scored on a 10-yard scamper for USU's final points.

ISU ended the game's scoring with a 52-yard pass, catch and run from Arias to KW Williams with 2:35 left and victory of the season.



USU ran out the clock to seal its first Junior WR JoJo Natson (9) returned a punt 52 yards against ISU for his third career punt return for touchdown. He also had six receptions for 59 yards and one rush for 29 yards.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - Utah State fell behind Tennessee, 14-0, in the first five minutes of the game and never recovered as the Volunteers rolled to a 38-7 win in the first-ever meeting between the two teams here Sunday night at historic Neyland Stadium.

In his first action since a knee injury forced him to miss the final eight games of the 2013 season, senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** completed 18-of-35 passes for 144 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions, while adding 12 yards on the ground on eight carries. Junior WR **JoJo Natson** was USU's leading rusher as he had 47 yards on two carries, while adding three receptions for 18 yards. Fellow junior WR **Brandon Swindall** had a team-best five catches for 37 yards.

Utah State's only points in the game came early in the fourth quarter as Natson rushed for 38 yards and Keeton hit junior WR **Hunter Sharp** from 37 yards for the score to cap a 2-play, 75-yard drive that took all of 30 seconds.

Sophomore LB **Nick Vigil** recorded a career-high 15 tackles, which included 1.0 sack and 2.0 tackles for loss to lead the Aggie defense. Senior LB **Zach Vigil** added 10 stops for his 12th career double-digit tackle outing and sophomore S **Devin Centers** posted a career-best nine tackles.

Utah State's defense took the field first and forced Tennessee into a three-and-out to start the game. However, USU followed with a three-and-out of its own on its first possession. UT then drove 70-yards in just six plays on its following possession for the first score of the game and then scored two plays later as the Aggies fumbled the ensuing kickoff at its own 12-yard line. Following the turnover, UT's Justin Worley connected with Brendan Downs for the 12-yard touchdown to make the score 14-0 early on.

Utah State's defense keep the Aggies in the game throughout the first-half as it held the Volunteers without any points during its next five drives before UT kicked a 36-yard field with 1:00 to play in the half for a 17-0 halftime advantage.

Utah State had its best drive of the game on its first possession of the second-half as it went 34 yards in nine plays, but was unable to get any points as sophomore PK **Jake Thompson** just missed a 48-yard field goal.

Tennessee added another touchdown in the third quarter and then reached pay dirt again on the first play of the fourth quarter to push its lead to 31-0 before Utah State answered with its only touchdown of the game. UT finished the scoring with a final touchdown two series later to make the final score 38-7.

Utah State finished the game with 244 yards of total offense (144-passing, 100-rushing)

as compared to 383 yards of total offense for Tennessee (273-passing, 110-rushing). In all, USU was just 3-of-14 on third downs, while UT was 8-of-18. USU was also 0-of-1 on fourth down.

Utah State also had three turnovers in the game that led to 17 Tennessee points, while the Volunteers did not turnover the ball over once. UT also controlled the clock as it had a 34:35 to 25:25 advantage.

Tennessee was led by senior QB Justin Worley who was 27-of-38 passing for 273 yards with three touchdowns, while sophomore linebacker Jalen Reeves-Maybin had 10 tackles and senior LB A.J. Johnson had nine tackles to go along with an interception and a forced fumble.
