BYU ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

The three National Championship teams from BYU men's volleyball (1999, 2001 and 2004) were inducted into the BYU Athletics Hall of Fame in September 2023 at BYU's 46th Annual Induction Banquet. The teams were then honored at halftime during the BYU vs Sam Houston football game in LaVell Edwards Stadium on September 2, 2023.

BYU has won a total of 12 national championships in NCAA competition history, with men's volleyball earning 25% of those titles. Current BYU men's volleyball head coach Shawn Olmstead helped the Cougars to National Championships in 2001 and 2004 as a libero.



1999

The National Championship was the perfect ending to a 1999 season, marked by unprecedented success. It took Carl McGown just 10 years to assemble one of the greatest collegiate volleyball teams ever, posting a record of 30-1 in 1999. The Cougars were able to avenge their only loss of the season by defeating Long Beach State to capture the university's first-ever volleyball national championship. For his efforts, McGown was named the 1999 AVCA National Coach of the Year.

After compiling a 25-1 regular-season mark, BYU defeated Pacific, Hawaii and USC to win its first MPSF title and advance to the NCAA Final Four for the first time in history.



2001

Led by seniors Mac Wilson and Scott Bunker, the BYU Men's Volleyball team knocked off 18-time National Champs UCLA in 2001.

After defeating Penn State 3-1 in the semi finals, BYU swept the Bruins 3-0, marking the 15th three-game sweep for the Cougars during the 2001 season. The 2001 team was the most decorated in BYU history.

The team finished with a record of 23-4, the second-highest winning total in school history. Coach Carl McGown was honored a second time as the AVA National Coach of the year, while Hector Lebron was named Volleyball Magazine National Player of the Year.



2004

The Cougars set a new school record of 21-straight victories and spent 10-straight weeks ranked No.1 in the nation. BYU head coach Tom Peterson also made NCAA history by becoming the first men's volleyball coach to win a National Championship with two different schools. Peterson led Penn State to a national title in 1994.

With the 15-30, 30-18, 20-30, 32-30, 19-17 win over Long Beach in the finals, the Cougars finished the year with a 29-4 record — the second highest single-season win total in BYU history.

This Week's Matchup

First Road Trip of the Season

BYU traveled to the state of Illinois to face two teams this week: Loyola Chicago and Lewis. On Saturday evening, BYU faces Lewis for a matchup at Neil Carey Arena. First serve is scheduled for 7 p.m. CST, with the game broadcast streaming live on YouTube.

Luke Benson named MPSF Player of the Week

Junior outside hitter Luke Benson was named the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation's Offensive Player of the Week, the conference announced Monday evening.

Benson led the Cougars through two sweeps at home against No. 11 Ball State, totaling 23 kills on a .541 clip. On Friday, Benson boasted 17 kills on a career-high .762 clip. He also led the Cougars in digs with seven on the night. Benson recorded another career-best on Saturday night with four aces as BYU totaled 6 for the match.

This is Benson's first-ever weekly honor from the MPSF of his career, and first of the 2024 season for BYU. In 2023, BYU achieved Player of the Week status four times, with three coming from middle blocker Teon Taylor and one from outside hitter Miks Ramanis.

Seven-Game Win Streak Over Lewis

The Cougars have not lost to the Flyers since 2014, going on a seven-game win streak. Most recently, the Cougars hosted Lewis in Provo and won in four sets 3-1 (25-20, 23-25, 25-17, 25-17). Shawn Olmstead is also a perfect 6-0 against Lewis since his first season as the men's head coach in 2016.

Three Games, Three Wins

With a victory over Loyola Chicago, the Cougars improve to 3-0 on the season. In 2023, BYU's longest win streak was nine games. Leading the offense, Luke Benson finished with a career-high 21 kills, along with six digs, four blocks and 39 attempts on a .333 clip against Loyola. Benson also had four of BYU's five aces, tying his career-high. Kupono Browne recorded double-digit kills with 13, followed by Teon Taylor and Trent Moser with eight kills apiece. Libero Bernardo Adam recorded a team-high and career-high of 15 digs combined with setter Noa Haine's career-high of 14.

Struggles on the Road

Last season, all of BYU's losses happened outside of Provo, with a 19-7 overall record going 4-7 on the road. Of those seven losses in 2023, six of them were against opponents ranked in the top-10, including UCLA, GCU and Ball State.

Lewis falls to UCLA

Lewis University is coming off a loss to No. 1 UCLA, falling 3-1 (23-25, 25-22, 26-28, 23-25) in a tight match against the reigning NCAA Champions. In the three sets that the Flyers dropped against UCLA, all were decided by just two points.

Max Roquet led in kills with 21 and Christian Prayer from St. Louis, Missouri followed with 10 kills. For digs, three players tied with nine, including Christian Prayer (9), Max Roquet (9) and Nico Paula from Tampa, Florida.

Leading in assists was setter Tyler Morgan from Dike, Iowa with 45. For blocks, Piotr Wymoczyl from his home stats of Arlington Heights, Illinois led with four. Two Flyers had two aces as well, Christian Prayer and Max Roquet.

Before UCLA, the Flyers traveled to Pennsylvania and split two games, defeating Central State University 3-0 and falling to Penn State in five sets.

2024 Season Preview

BYU men's volleyball achieved a perfect 14-0 home record in the Smith Fieldhouse for the first time since 2014.

Head coach Shawn Olmstead accomplished 150 career wins as the BYU men's volleyball head coach when the Cougars defeated Stanford in four sets on April 14, 2023.

The Cougars bring back outside hitter Miks Ramanis who was an All-American honorable mention by the American Volleyball Coaches Association as part of its 2023 awards. It was the sophomore's first honor from the AVCA. Ramanis was also named to the 2023 All-MPSF First Team. Middle blocker Gavin Julien was named 2023 All-MPSF Honorable Mention and Trent Moser was named to the 2023 MPSF All-Freshman Team. Both Julien and Moser return for the 2024 season.

During the summer, Trent Moser traveled with USA Volleyball to South America and West Asia on the U.S. Men's U21 National Team. The team earned silver in the 2023 Pan American Cup in Cuba and landed in 13th place at the 2023 Men's U21 World Championship in Bahrain. In the championship match against Cuba at the Pan American Cup, Moser tallied 23 kills on a .304 clip.

On the defensive side, junior middle blocker Teon Taylor returns as a 2023 finalist for Off the Block's Blocker of the Year, finishing the 2023 season with a career-high of 14 solo blocks and 135 total blocks.

BYU finished in fifth for most blocks per set with an average of 2.39 blocks per set, totaling 102 blocks as a team in the 2023 season.

Overall, the Cougars were ranked for 12 consecutive weeks in the 2023 campaign. BYU held a top-10 ranking in the AVCA Coaches Poll for all but four weeks during the regular season. The Cougars entered the 2023 season unranked.

BYU led the MPSF in attendance, with an average of 3,890 fans per home game. BYU led the nation in percentage capacity, with home games averaging 77.79% full attendance in 2023. BYU drew 5,071 fans at its home game against Ohio State in the Smith Fieldhouse, for a top-two attendance record in the last five years.

The team finished with 1,220 kills, 1,157 assists, 117 aces, 786 digs and 259 blocks in 2023.

SHAWN OLMSTEAD

Shawn Olmstead has been the head coach of the BYU Men's Volleyball program since 2015, with the 2016 season being his first. Olmstead has advanced BYU to the national championship match of the NCAA Tournament three times so far in his coaching career: 2016, 2017 and 2021. He also helped BYU to three-straight NCAA Final Four appearances for the first time in program history from 2016-2018. Olmstead led BYU to three MPSF regular-season titles in his first three seasons as head coach from 2016-2018 as well. Along with this, he guided BYU to three MPSF Tournament championships in 2016, 2018 and 2021. He is a four-time MPSF Coach of the Year (2016, 2018, 2020, 2021). Nine athletes that he has coached are All-Americans, with a total of 19 AVCA All-America honors. At the end of the 2020 season, his winning percentage of .784 (105-29) is the highest of any active men's volleyball coach in the NCAA Division I-II. Olmstead coached BYU to a winning record for six years in-a-row (2016-2021) at the helm of the program. For the first time since 1996 in BYU Men's Volleyball history, the Cougars finished with a losing record last season in 2022. When asked about the 2022 season, Olmstead said, "I was proud of our team and the way they stayed the course throughout the entire season. It was a difficult season no doubt as it relates to overall wins and losses. Despite this, the team never hung their heads and never shied away from the task at hand. I'm proud of them for that. The amount of gratitude we have as a coaching staff for them and their heart, can't be put into words." Two seasons prior, Olmstead and the Cougars got their magical 2020 season devastatingly cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During that time, Olmstead guided BYU to a 17-1 (6-0 MPSF) record and No. 1 national ranking. He also coached the AVCA National Player in 2020 as well, Gabi Garcia Fernandez. Throughout Olmstead's career, he's coached six AVCA First Team All-Americans, namely Gabi Garcia Fernandez (2021, 20), Davide Gardini (2020, 21, 22), Wil Stanley (2020), Brenden Sander (2018, 16), Ben Patch (2016) and Jake Langlois (2017). In his first year with the men's volleyball team, Olmstead coached the squad to the national championship match of the 2016 NCAA Tournament. He led his team to an outright MPSF regular-season and tournament title while being named the 2016 MPSF Coach of the Year. The Cougars finished with a 27-4 (19-3) record in 2016.

BYU Women's Volleyball Era

Olmstead saw his most successful season as head coach of the BYU women's volleyball team in 2014. He coached BYU to the national championship match of the NCAA tournament for its first time in program history. The Cougars became the first unseeded team in tournament history to make it to the final match. To get there, BYU upset No. 11 Arizona, No. 6 Florida State, No. 14 Nebraska and No. 2 Texas. The Cougars also won an outright West Coast Conference title after Olmstead led his squad to a 16-2 league record. Olmstead coached three All-Americans in 2014, including Jennifer Hamson, Alexa Gray and Amy Boswell. In 2012, Olmstead led the Cougars to their first conference title since 2005 and best season record (28-4) since 1998. Olmstead and the Cougars hosted the first two rounds of the 2012 NCAA tournament before losing in the round of 16 to No. 5 seeded Oregon, who went on to play in the natty against Texas. In 2011, Olmstead's first year as head coach and BYU's first year in the WCC, he led the team to a 21-9 record, its first season with 20 or more wins since 2007.

Assistant Coach Devin Young

Former Cougar Devin Young joined the BYU men's volleyball team as an assistant coach ahead of the 2019 season. Young played middle blocker for the Cougars from 2008, 2011-14.

As a player, Young helped the Cougars win the 2013 and 2014 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation regular-season and tournament titles. BYU played in the NCAA tournament both years and advanced to the national championship match in 2013.

Young was named to the All-MPSF Second Team as a senior and made the MPSF All-Tournament Team in both 2013 and 2014. During his career, he averaged 1.38 kills per set as well as 1.09 blocks per set.

After graduating from BYU with a degree in business management, Young moved to Wisconsin where he stayed close to volleyball by coaching high school and club teams. In 2017, he returned to Utah to work for VolleyMetrics, a volleyball analytics company, where he worked with Division I volleyball coaches from across the country.

Young served a mission in Long Beach, California, after redshirting during the 2008 season. He hails from McMurray, Pennsylvania, and is married to Marie. The couple have three children.



Assistant Coach Otavio Souza

Souza came to BYU with three years of experience as the assistant coach for Cal's women's volleyball team, as well as two-year stints at both Saint Mary's College and Missouri Western State. Before that, he also coached at Georgetown. In Souza's first year at SMC in 2018, the Gaels finished the regular season 19-9, their best winning percentage since going 20-8 in 2010. The Gaels also went 2-0 against Pac-12 programs that season and punched their first ticket to the NCAA Tournament since 2012.

Souza wore a BYU jersey from 2009-2011, starting in 22 matches during his senior year, while collecting 119 kills, 94 blocks, 35 digs, 16 assists and seven service aces, with a .431 hitting percentage.

"Playing volleyball in the Smith Fieldhouse in front of thousands of fans at BYU is where I created great memories as a student-athlete," Souza said. "Our program has been competitive for many years. Coming back now as a coach is something really special for me to be a part of."

A Florianópolis, Brazil native, Souza went on to play professionally for Itajai Pro-Volei and Florianopolis Voleibol in Brazil, along with the Florida Wave.

Souza debuted as an assistant coach on January 6th, 2023 for Brigham Young University.

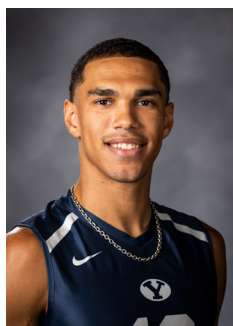

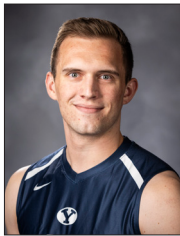
