OPENING TIP

- TCU led by as many as 23 points and shot 50 percent from the field in its 81-67 takedown of BYU on Dec. 30 to begin conference play.
- Madison Conner tallied 21 points vs. the Cougars in December while Agnes Emma-Nnopus (14 points, 11 rebounds) was one of three Frogs to finish with a double-double.
- TCU and BYU are the top-two 3-point shooting teams in the Big 12. The Horned Frogs and Cougars combined for 17 in their December meeting.
- TCU held BYU's Lauren Gustin (17.1 ppg) to a season-low 10 points in their first battle as Big 12 foes.
- The Horned Frogs snapped a 25-game road losing streak with their win in Cincinnati on Saturday.
- TCU is 3-1 against the Big 12's four conference newcomers this season.

FROG FOCUS

- TCU and BYU checked in at 47th and 74th, respectively, in the NCAA NET ratings, providing the Horned Frogs with a chance to pick up their second Quad 1 win of the season.
- Madison Conner scored 31 points behind a 7-15 clip from downtown in her return to the court at Cincinnati. Conner missed TCU's previous six games due to injury.
- Conner regained her status as the Big 12's active leading scorer at 21.5 points per game.
- Conner is eight 3-pointers away from breaking Zahna Medley's 2015-16 single-season program record (87).
- Conner ranks second in the country in 3-pointers per game (4.2). She has knocked down at least seven on four occasions this season.
- Conner has produced three 30-point games, second among all players in the Big 12 and the second-most in a single season in school history.
- Sydney Harris and Conner rank second and fourth, respectively, in the nation in 3-pointers per 40 minutes. Harris' average of 5.3 trails only Caitlin Clark for the national lead.
- Harris scored a TCU career-high 27 points vs. the Bearcats, 22 of which came in the second half.
- Harris is shooting a Big 12 best 45.6 percent from long range.
- TCU drained a season-high 14 three-pointers for the third time this year at Cincinnati. The Horned Frogs shot 8-17 behind the arc in the first half, with Conner connecting at a 6-9 clip.
- TCU is one of just two teams alongside Gonzaga ranking in the top-10 nationally in 3-pointers per game (5th, 9.7), 3-point percentage differential (9th, .099) and 3-pointers (9th, 243).
- TCU is producing the third-best single-season 3-pointers per game average in the 25-year history of the Big 12.
- The Horned Frogs are the only team in the country with two 20-point-per-game scorers in Conner and Sedona Prince (21.2 ppg), the latter of whom is expected back before the end of the season. They rank 13th and 16th in scoring among all D1 players.
- TCU ranks second only to No. 8 Kansas State in the Big 12 in assist-to-turnover ratio, opponent field goal percentage, 3-point percentage defense and blocks per game.
- TCU has hit double figures in 3-pointers in 13 of its 25 games.
- The Horned Frogs have held teams under their season scoring average 19 times, including all five of their games vs. ranked opposition.
- TCU doubled its overall win total from the previous year for the seventh time in its 47-season existence with Saturday's win. Mark Campbell also became the first first-year TCU head coach to accomplish the feat.
- Agnes Emma-Nnopus leads all Big 12 guards and ranks 10th in total rebounding (7.1 rpg).
- Emma-Nnopus ranks 13th among all guards 5-11-or-shorter in offensive rebounds (62).
- Emma-Nnopus has scored at least 18 points in three of her last six outings.

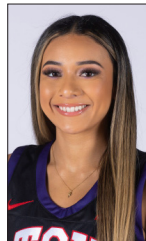

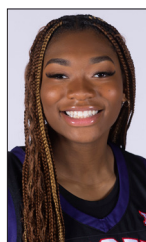

CONNER'S CLIMB TOWARD BIG 12 HISTORY

Madison Conner already snatched the NCAA record for most 3-pointers in a 10-game stretch to begin a season from Oklahoma standout Taylor Robertson and now has a slew of Big 12 milestones in her sight as she prepares to return from the disabled list.

- Conner is averaging 4.2 three-pointers per game, a mark that sits behind only Taylor Robertson's 2019-20 mark of 4.4 per game atop the Big 12 single season records list.
- Conner needs 27 three-pointers to become the 26th player in the history of the league to reach triple digits.
- Conner continues to lead the Big 12 in 3-pointers and 3-pointers per game. No Horned Frog has ever led the league at year's end in either category.
- Conner is the Big 12's active leading scorer with four regular season games remaining. TCU has never produced the conference's leading scorer.

HOW GOOD HAS HARRIS BEEN?

Sydney Harris has proven herself one of the most efficient 3-point shooters and high-volume scorers in the Big 12 and country since making her TCU debut on Jan. 6.

- Harris tops the Big 12 in 3-pointers made per 40 minutes (5.2).
- Harris 3-pointers per 40 minutes average is the second-best clip in the country, trailing only reigning National Player of the Year Caitlin Clark (6.1).
- Harris ranks second in the country in 3-pointers per game among players 6-1-or-taller, averaging 2.6 makes from distance per night.
- Harris is fourth among all players 6-1-or-taller in total 3-pointers over the last five weeks.
- The sophomore leads the Big 12 in 3-pointers and is second in 3-point percentage (.489) since Jan. 13.
- Harris has scored in double figures in seven of her last eight outings, including five straight from Jan. 13-Feb. 7. She is one of only three Frogs to hit double digits in five consecutive outings alongside Sedona Prince and Madison Conner.
- Harris is on pace to break TCU's single-season record for 3-point percentage.

CERTIFIED STRETCH FIVE

Aaliyah Roberson earned her first start at the five in

place of the injured Sedona Prince at No. 10 Texas on Jan. 10. Playing in front of more than a dozen former club teammates, the San Antonio native Aaliyah Roberson put on in front of fan-friendly in a performance that proved a springboard into what has been a transformational four-week stretch for the sophomore.

- Roberson finished with 15 points, six rebounds, three blocks and two steals in her third career start at post. She led TCU in scoring and tied for the game-high in blocks. Roberson was the contest's leading scorer and rebounder at halftime, as she entered the locker room with eight points and five rebounds. Roberson finished 7-8 from the field and knocked down her first seven attempts.
- Roberson has averaged 9.6 points and 5.9 rebounds per game over her last eight starts.
- Roberson has scored in double figures in six of her last nine games.
- Roberson's 24 three's are the third-most in the Big 12 among players 6-2-or-taller. She leads all forwards in 3-point percentage (.395).
- Roberson also finished with three blocks for the third straight game vs. the Longhorns on Jan.. She has swatted 16 shots in league play and ranks eighth in the conference in blocks per game.

BACKBONE ON THE BOARDS

- Agnes Emma Nnopus's season rebounding average (7.1) is the 25th-best mark nationally among all guards 5-11-or-shorter.
- Emma-Nnopus also leads TCU and ranks 13th in the country at her position in total offensive rebounds (62).
- Emma-Nnopus ranks seventh among her Big 12 peers in offensive rebounds. She leads all Big 12 guards in rebounds per game.
- Emma-Nnopus averaged 9.4 rebounds per game in December and finished with 10-plus in three-of-seven games.
- Emma-Nnopus has snagged at least seven rebounds in 16 games.
- Emma-Nnopus has pulled down three-plus offensive rebounds 11 times this season, including a career-high eight as a part of a 14-rebound game vs. ACU. Her eight offensive rebounds were the second most by any D1 guard in 2023-24.

EMPHASIZING THE 'FREE' IN FREE THROWS

TCU has been at its best at the charity stripe in key moments in several of its single-digit wins.

- TCU canned 18 free throws to win the St. Pete Showcase championship vs. Nebraska on Nov. 25. The Horned Frogs went 9-10 at the line over the game's final 43 seconds and closed the out win by making eight consecutive free throws.
- The Horned Frogs closed their 66-60 win on Jan. 23 against UCF on a 9-0 run. Agnes Emma-Nnoku went 4-4 from the stripe over the final 18 seconds. For the game, TCU knocked down 10-12 free throws.
- TCU put a 79-72 win at Cincinnati on Feb. 17 on ice by converting 10-12 free throws over the game's final 1:48. Madison Conner, who led all players with 31 points, was 6-6 at the line in the fourth quarter.

FROGS IN PARIS

TCU has representation at the 2024 Summer Olympics, as alumnae Amy Okonkwo (2019) and Tomi Taiwo (2023) will compete for Team Nigeria in Parris

- Okonkwo, a two-time All-Big 12 second team player, averaged 13.1 points and 6.6 rebounds over her three years in Fort Worth. She helped TCU produce a 59-43 combined overall record and reach the WNIT semifinals in 2018 and 2019.
- Okonkwo plays professionally in France for Saint-Amand Hainaut Basket in the Ligue Féminine de Basketball.
- Taiwo started 30-of-31 games for the Horned Frogs in 2022-23 and lead the team in scoring (14.5 ppg) and steals per game (1.77).

HEBARD HEADED TO MINNEAPOLIS

TCU assistant coach Ruthy Hebard inked a training camp deal with the Minnesota Lynx on Feb. 16.

- The one-year deal signifies Hebard's fifth season in the WNBA.
- Hebard appeared in 95 games across four seasons for the Chicago Sky from 2020-2023, helping the franchise win a WNBA Championship in 2021. She averaged 4.5 points and 3.2 rebounds across 13 minutes per game during her stay in the Windy City.

CHASING 300

TCU is on pace to reach 300 three-pointers during the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.

- The Horned Frogs will become the seventh team in the history of the conference to achieve the milestone should they connect 300 times from deep.
- TCU's 3-pointers per game average of 9.7 is the third-best mark in a season in Big 12 history.
- For reference, the 2021-22 Iowa State squad holds the Big 12 single season records for 3-pointers made (357) and 3-pointers per game (10.2). The Cyclones played 35 games.

THE PRINCE IS ON A QUEST TO RETURN

Sedona Prince's right hand injury required surgery, but is not expected to be a season-ender. Prince made public comments on her personal Instagram account expressing her intent to return to the court before the end of the regular season.

PRINCE NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD MIDSEASON TOP-25 WATCH LIST

In spite of her injury - she finished with a 20-point, 10-rebound double-double while compromised at Baylor - Prince played her way into consideration for college basketball's most prestigious honor with her selection to the Wooden Award Midseason Top-25 Watch List on Jan. 10.

- Prince is the third Horned Frog in program history to be named to the Wooden Award Watch List, joining All-Americans Sandora Irvin (2004-05) and Helena Sverssdottir (2010-11).
- Prince was one of three newcomers making her debut on the Wooden Watch alongside Hannah Hidalgo of Notre Dame and LSU's Mikaylah Williams. Prince is also one of five centers to receive the recognition. The Big 12 placed three players on the Watch List, with Ayoka Lee (Kansas State) and Rori Harmon (Texas) joining Prince.
- On the date of the Watch List reveal, Prince was - and still is - the only player in the country ranking in the top-20 nationally in scoring, rebounding, blocks and double-doubles (10). Her blocks per game clip was the fourth-best mark among all D1 players. She ranked second in the Big 12 in points and rebounds per game.

PRINCE IN CONTENTION FOR POSITION'S MOST PRESTIGIOUS AWARD

Prince added to her queen's ransom of accolades on Jan. 26, as she was named one of 10 finalists for the Lisa Leslie Center of the Year Award.

- Prince is the first TCU center to ever be in final consideration of the award. She was one of three Big 12 players honored as a Lisa Leslie Award finalist, joining Ayoka Lee (Kansas State) and Taylor Jones (Texas).
- Finalists were voted on by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA).

OWENS, TURNER TO MISS REMAINDER OF SEASON

TCU lost its point guard and backup post in a matter of days during its two-step through the southern half of the Lone Star State to play Texas and Houston on Jan. 10-13.

- Jaden Owens suffered a torn ACL and meniscus in her right knee in a non-contact injury of the first quarter of TCU's 77-66 defeat to the Cougars.
- The injury is a college career-ender for Owens, a fifth-year senior. Owens appeared in 126 games across her five-year college career. She accumulated 573 points and 421 assists. Owens was a four-time NCAA Tournament participant at UCLA (2019-20) and Baylor (2020-23).
- Turner sustained a left ankle injury during practice that required season-ending surgery. The 6-3 sophomore attempted to play through the injury vs. the Longhorns and Cougars before an MRI scan revealed more significant damage than initially anticipated. Turner has two years of eligibility remaining.

CONNER'S 41-POINT CLINIC

Madison Conner authored perhaps the greatest offensive performance Fort Worth has borne witness to in her 41-point showcase vs. Tulsa on Dec. 5.

- Conner joined Emily Carter as one of just two players in program history to score 40-or-more points in a game.
- Conner's 41 points were the most in a game in regulation by a TCU player.
- Conner became the eighth Horned Frog ever to produce multiple 30-point games.
- Her 41 points are the ninth-most in a game in 2023-24 across the D1 ranks

THE BEST SHOOTER TO STEP FOOT ON CAMPUS

Conner is cementing her status as arguably the greatest 3-point shooter in the history of TCU men's and women's basketball

- Conner canded the second-most 3-pointers in a game in program history on Dec. 5 against Tulsa and became the fourth Horned Frog to convert at least nine looks from deep in a single game.
- Four days later, Conner became the first player in program history to drain nine-or-more 3-pointers twice in the same season after shooting 9-19 from distance vs. ACU.
- Conner set the NCAA record for most 3-pointers in a 10-game stretch to begin a season, canning 52 from Nov. 6-Dec. 10. She surpassed Taylor Robertson's previous mark of 51, which she attained in 2019-20 and 2021-22.
- Conner also matched Keke Calloway of Mercer (2018) for the most 3-pointers made in back-to-back games in six seasons. Conner drained 19 combined in wins over Tulsa and ACU on Dec. 1-5.

CONNOR COMPARED TO CAMPBELL'S GREATS

Head coach Mark Campbell said in a pair of interviews with the Fort Worth Star-Telegram Madison Conner is one of the three best pure shooters he has ever coached.

- Campbell said only Sabrina Ionescu and Taylor Mikesell, the No. 13 overall pick in the 2023 WNBA Draft, can match Conner's prowess from behind the arc.
- Giving grist to the head coach's sentiment, Conner canded 25 consecutive 3-pointers in a shooting drill during an October practice.

FLORES JOINS TCU ROYALTY

Victoria Flores flourished in TCU's 85-41 win against Prairie View A&M, finishing with a game and career-high 19 points across 25 minutes off the bench.

- Flores' 19 points were the most in a game by a TCU freshman in a decade.
- Flores joined Zahna Medley - second in program history in career points (1,975) - as one of just two freshmen since 2012 to score 19-or-more points in a game.

SHOOTERS SHOOT

Few freshmen scored the basketball with the same volume as TCU sophomore Sydney Harris last season.

- Harris concluded her freshman campaign 11th nationally in 3-pointers per game (2.97) and tied for 25th in 3-point field goals (86).
- Harris averaged 17.4 points per game in her lone season at Central Michigan. The figure ranked fourth among all freshmen.
- Harris made her TCU debut against Oklahoma State on Jan. 6 after being sidelined for the entirety of nonconference play with an ankle injury.

BEFORE THE INJURY BUG HIT...

TCU's clash at Baylor on Jan. 3 in a battle of unbeaten is a date that will live in infamy as the Horned Frogs' roller coaster of a season continues to unfold. Sedona Prince suffered a hand injury seven seconds into the contest, igniting a spiral of injuries that rendered TCU in need of walk-ons to finish out the 2023-24 campaign exactly two weeks later.

- Prior to TCU's trip to Waco, the Horned Frogs led the country in 3-point percentage differential (.170).
- TCU ranked second nationally in both 3-pointers (148) and 3-pointers per game (10.6).
- TCU was the sole D1 team ranking in the top-five in 3-pointers, 3-pointers per game and 3-point percentage defense.
- TCU topped the Big 12 and ranks third in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.81).
- TCU occupied the No. 23 post in The Associated Press poll for two consecutive weeks leading into Baylor, marking its highest AP top-25 ranking in five seasons.
- TCU ranked second nationally in 3-pointers per game and 3-point percentage defense.
- The Horned Frogs kept 13 of their 14 foes at or below a 33 percent clip from distance.
- TCU ranked 12th nationally in scoring margin (+27.1).
- The Horned Frogs were averaging a season-high 80.5 points per game.
- TCU's rebounding margin was a season-best +9.9 heading into Waco.
- TCU assumed a season-high NCAA NET Rating of 23rd.
- TCU was one of just seven remaining undefeated teams and one of just two unbeaten with a first-year head coach alongside West Virginia.
- The Horned Frogs were the only team in the country with two active players averaging 20 points per game in Conner (22.4 ppg) and Prince (21.3 ppg).
- Prince was tied for second nationally in double-doubles with 10.
- Jaden Owens became the NCAA leader in assist-to-turnover ratio (4.59) after finishing with 10 assists in TCU's conference-opening victory against BYU on Dec. 30.
- Owens was also the Big 12's active leader and ranked second in the country in assists per game (7.8).
- Madison Conner was the Big 12's active scoring leader at 21 points per game prior to TCU pausing play on Jan. 17. Conner ranked third among all D1 players in total points (378) before suffering an injury leading into TCU's contest vs. Kansas State.
- Conner led the Big 12 in 20-point games (eight) at the time of her setback.
- Conner was also one of only five active players averaging at least 20 points, five rebounds and three assists per game.
- Conner and Prince combined to make TCU the only team in the country with two players averaging 20 points per game.

TCU is emitting across the national radar as one of the most proficient squads from behind the arc on both sides of the court.

- The Horned Frogs were the only team in the nation ranking in the top-10 in 3-point percentage offense and defense for the entirety of nonconference play. TCU also ranks ninth the nation in 3-point percentage differential (.099).
- TCU ranks fifth and ninth, respectively, in 3-pointers per game and 3-pointers.
- TCU is surrendering just 5.3 three's per game.
- The Horned Frogs have kept 19 of their 25 foes at or below a 33 percent clip from distance
- TCU has held seven opponents below 20 percent from behind the arc; Oral Roberts, Rice, Tulsa, PVAMU, Lamar, Mount St. Mary's and UCF.
- Only eight teams have knocked down seven-or-more looks from deep against TCU.

PORTAL PLUG-INS

Head coach Mark Campbell sold playing time to his six transfer players during their recruit and more than delivered on his preseason promise.

- Before injuries set in, TCU was the only team across the Power Six conference ranks whose starting lineup was comprised entirely of first-year transfers.
- Just two other Division I teams - Utah State and Mercer - started five transfers on a nightly basis during nonconference play.
- TCU, along with the Aggies and Bears, was also one of only six teams starting four-or-more transfers night in and night out. NC State, Pepperdine and Tennessee's primary starting lineups include four transfers.

KEEP IT 50 MPH

- The Horned Frogs have won 39 straight games where they have limited the opponent to 50 points or less.
- TCU has held four opponents (TAMUK, Rice, PVAMU, Mount St. Mary's) under 50 points this season.
- The last time a TCU team lost to an opponent when allowing 50-or-fewer points came in the Jeff Mittie era, when the Horned Frogs dropped a 49-48 decision to Oklahoma State on Jan. 29, 2014.
- Head coach Mark Campbell's teams are 13-0 when preventing opposing teams from eclipsing the 50-point threshold.

HOME COOKIN'

- TCU is an impressive 56-7 (.887) overall in all non-conference games played inside Schollmaier Arena since the venue reopened in December 2015.
- Inside Schollmaier Arena, TCU is undefeated in postseason contests with a mark of 7-0.
- TCU's career record inside the venue stands at 101-53.
- TCU's 12-game home winning streak to begin 2023-24 was the third-longest in school history.
- The longest home winning streak ever came in 2008-09 when TCU pitched an undefeated 15-0 record inside Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

BIG NIGHT ON THE GLASS VS. OMAHA

- TCU finished with a 59-27 rebounding advantage in its 96-56 win against Omaha on Dec. 20.
- The 59 rebounds were TCU's most in a game since 2004 and largest haul in its Big 12 era.
- The Horned Frogs' plus-32 margin on the glass was also their largest as a Big 12 affiliate.
- Of the rebounds, 20 came on the offensive glass, which were tied for the most in a game since TCU pulled down an identical number vs. Nicholls and SMU in 2019.
- Sedona Prince snagged 17 of TCU's rebounds, which were the most ever in a game by a Horned Frog since TCU joined the Big 12.

SEEING 20-20

TCU's two primary point guards are among the most efficient floor generals nationally and within the Big 12.

- Jaden Owens was leading the Big 12 in total assists (115) and assists per game (6.8) and ranked in the top-five nationally in both categories prior to her season-ending injury.
- Owens dished out 19 assists against just one turnover in TCU's trio of opening week wins vs. ORU, TAMUK and Rice. She amassed 13 assists in the first pair of victories and did not commit her first turnover until the closing moments of TCU's 25-point triumph over Rice.
- Owens finished with a TCU career-high 11 dimes in consecutive games vs. Tulsa and ACU on Dec. 1-5.

- Owens' 2022-23 assists per game clip (5.8) was third-best among all Big 12 players and placed her 15th nationally. Her 184 total assists were the 16th-most among all D1 players.
- Owens has finished with at least five assists in 35 of her final 49 college games. She has reached double figures seven times and finished with seven-or-more assists 17 times in her career, including six games this season.
- Sedona Prince called Owens "the best point guard in the country" in an interview with Spectrum News 1 on Nov. 14. That's lofty praise, given that Prince has played alongside the likes of WNBA guards Sabrina Ionescu, Rhyne Howard and Ashley Jones.
- Una Jovanovic ranked second in the Big West in both assists per game (3.8) and total assists (115) last winter.
- Jovanovic led Cal State Fullerton in assists in 16-of-30 games and finished with five-or-more assists nine times.
- Jovanovic recorded a TCU career-high seven assists in her first start at point guard vs. Mount St. Mary's.

TAKE FIVE

- Madison Conner has drained five-or-more 3-pointers 10 times collegiately and on eight occasions in purple and white.
- Conner's 10 triple showcase against Tulsa was her second of three games with 7-or-more 3-pointers this season.
 - She knocked down 7-15 looks from deep in TCU's 88-51 win against Army on Nov. 19 and went 9-19 behind the arc on Dec. 5 vs. ACU.
 - Conner's most recent five 3-pointer game came at the expense of Cincinnati on Feb. 17, when she shot 7-15 from downtown and led all players with 31 points.

30-BURGERS WITH A SIDE OF 10+ REBOUNDS

- Sedona Prince and Madison Conner have both scored at least 30 points and pulled down 10-or-more rebounds in a game this season.
- Conner delivered arguably the best debut performance in program history. She finished with a career-high 30 points and 11 rebounds vs. Oral Roberts on Nov. 6. The 30 points were the most in program history by a Frog playing her first game in purple and white.
 - Prince racked up 33 points and 16 reboundds - both career-highs - 13 days later in TCU's 37-point win over Army.
 - Conner and Prince became the 20th and 21st players, respectively, in program history to score 30 points in a game.
 - The duo also earned the distinction of becoming the fourth and fifth Horned Frogs since 1999-00 and first since Amy Okonkwo (2019) to finish with at least 30 points and 10 rebounds in a game.

SUPER-SIZED SEDONA SUPERLATIVES

- Sedona Prince's 10 double-doubles are her most in a single season. She recorded two in her first year on the court at Oregon in 2020-21.
- Prince snagged a career-high 17 rebounds in 27 minutes against Omaha as a part of a double-double. She recorded nine rebounds and eight points in the first quarter.
- Prince set a single-game career-high in field goals made (12) vs. Army in addition to points.
- Prince has scored in double figures in 14 straight games. She never eclipsed 10 points in more than three consecutive games in her two years on the court at Oregon.
- Prince has rejected 46 shots across 14 appearances. She totaled 68 blocks combined in her past two seasons.

PRINCE, THE PROTECTOR OF THE RIM

- Sedona Prince hosted a block party unlike any before in TCU's 12-year Big 12 era in her 24-point, 10-block clinic on Dec. 5 vs. ACU.
- Prince's 10 rejections matched Latricia Lovings identical tally vs. SFA on Dec. 4, 2013 for the most by a Horned Frog in TCU's Big 12 era.
 - Prince tied Lovings for fourth on TCU's individual single games record list in blocks
 - Prince also became one of just 31 players in the last 13 seasons to tally 10-or-more blocks in a game.

A TALL TASK AT HAND

Standing at 6-7, Sedona Prince towers over both her TCU and Big 12 peers anytime she takes the court.

- Prince is the second-tallest player to ever suit up for the Horned Frogs. She is also one of just five players 6-6-or-taller to ever don the purple and white. Only Patricia Morris (2020-23) and Kim Estes (1995-96) matched Prince's height during their TCU tenures.
- Lindsey Prewitt, who stood at 6-8 while playing for the Horned Frogs from 2001-03, ranks as the tallest player ever on the women's basketball team.
- Prince is the second-tallest player in the Big 12 in 2023-24. Texas' Abbie Boutillier, 6-9, is the lone player ahead of Prince on the stadiometer.
- Prince is also the tallest player Oregon women's basketball ever signed. She amassed 476 points, 221 rebounds and 68 blocks in two seasons on the court in Eugene from 2020-2022.

TEARING UP THE TRANSFER PORTAL

Mark Campbell is panned in the industry as one of the sport's elite recruiters, and the first-year head coach promptly made a global splash in the transfer portal upon his arrival in Fort Worth. In an article published by Just Women's Sports on May 12, Eden Laese wrote, "The Horned Frogs haven't had much success in recent years, winning just eight games last season, but first-year coach Mark Campbell is guiding the program in the right direction," before declaring TCU among the nation's winners of the 2023 transfer portal. Laese is hardly in the minority with her sentiment.

- TCU couped the nation's No. 11 overall transfer class in the 2023 recruiting cycle according to the On3's Team Transfer Portal Index. The ranking is tops among all Big 12 programs.
- Campbell signed three players featured in World Exposure Report's expanded top-100 player rankings among 2023 transfers; No. 25 Sedona Prince, No. 66 Madison Conner and No. 92 Agnes Emma-Nnopus.
- The Horned Frogs' six-player transfer class includes a pair of consensus five-star talents in Prince, who was graded the No. 8 overall prospect in the class of 2018 by ESPN.com, and Jaden Owens, the nation's 13th-best talent and No. 3 point guard prospect in 2019, along with four-star guards Conner and Emma-Nnopus

BREAKING RANKS

- Despite not earning a top-25 victory last season, the Horned Frogs have still managed to defeat a ranked team in 17 of the past 21 seasons.
- TCU has tallied 29 victories over top-25 ranked teams since the 2000-01 season.
- The Horned Frogs most recent ranked win came via an 87-75 triumph over No. 18 Texas A&M on Dec. 12, 2021 in Fort Worth.

TOP-100 TCU

Half of the Horned Frogs' 14-player roster for 2023-24 is comprised of players who were featured in the top-100 of the ESPN HoopGurlz Recruiting Rankings in their respective graduating classes.

• TCU's roster also includes consensus four-star talents in Agnes Emma-Nnopus and Tara Manumaleuga, who ventured overseas in 2019 following decorated prep careers in their native Australia.

DR. NNOPU

Agnes Emma-Nnopus has played six straight seasons for Basketball Australia and aspires to compete in the 2028 Summer Olympics, yet despite her entrenchment as a fixture in her native country's international pursuits, it's equally likely Emma-Nnopus will be spotted in a doctor's office as it is the hardwood in the years to come.

- Emma-Nnopus graduated from Stanford with a bachelor's degree in human biology with a concentration in neuroscience and human performance in three years.
- During her official visit to TCU, Emma-Nnopus said the university's elite academic profile and alignment with her master's program factored prominently into her decision to trade in cardinal for purple.
- Emma-Nnopus is pursuing a master's degree in biology

at TCU.

- Emm-Nnopus's chief occupational goal is to one day open her own clinic in Australia, saying, "I'm very interested in the brain, and I think there's a lot of caveats that we haven't explored yet. I want to be a part of helping find treatments specifically for neurodegenerative diseases, I've just always wanted to help people."

SOCIAL MEDIA SLEUTHS

Two of TCU's most followed and influential student athletes on social media belong to Horned Frog women's basketball.

- Jaden Owens and Sedona Prince rank first and second, respectively, in total Instagram followers among all student athletes. Owens account has garnered more than 248,000 followers, nearly 65,000 more than Prince's equally robust tally of 184,000.
- Prince and Owens rank sixth and 10th, respectively, among all amateur women's basketball players in NIL valuation. Prince has earned \$361,000 in 2023-24 while Owens has capitalized to the tune of a robust \$158,000.
- Prince's NIL valuation hovered around \$530,000 at the conclusion of the 2022-23 season. The figure was the sixth-highest among all women's amateur athletes.

TCU TAKES NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK HONORS

TCU was named U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) Team of the Week after punctuating its best start to a season in its 47-year existence.

- TCU won its pair of games vs. Omaha and Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 20-22 by an average of 46.5 points.
- TCU's 53-point margin of victory in its 87-34 defeat of Mount St. Mary's was its largest in six seasons. The 34 points surrendered were tied for the seventh-fewest in a game in the program's existence.
- The Horned Frogs notched the longest winning streak in program history following their 96-56 win over Omaha.
- TCU's victory against Mount St. Mary's capped the program's first undefeated finish to nonconference play.

Madison Conner and Sedona Prince's anointings as conference player of the week in November marked the first time in TCU's 12-year Big 12 era the program has had multiple players receive Big 12 Player of the Week recognition in the same season.
- Conner was first recipient of the award in 2023-24. She also became the seventh Horned Frog to garner Big 12 Player of the Week accolades and first since Lauren Heard on March 9, 2021.
 - Conner averaged 24 points and nine rebounds per outing while tallying two double-doubles in TCU's trio of opening week wins over ORU, TAMUK and Rice. She scored a career-high 30 points - the most ever by a player making her TCU debut - to pair with 11 rebounds against the Golden Eagles.
 - Prince garnered her first-ever conference player of the week accolade on the strength of her showing at the St. Pete Showcase. She averaged 21 points, nine rebounds and four blocks per outing to lead TCU to the tournament title via wins over Nebraska and UTEP. She collected a 23-point, 11-rebound double-double in the championship game vs. the Cornhuskers.

- THE PRINCE (SS) OF PURPLE DOES IT AGAIN**
Sedona Prince repeated as Big 12 Player of the Week on Dec. 26, becoming one of just three players in 2023-24 to win the award twice.
- Prince averaged 24 points, 16 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 blocks per game in TCU's home wins over Omaha and Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 20-22.
 - Her 32 total rebounds were the most by any D1 player for the week of Dec. 18-24
 - oined Lauren Heard (2020) as one of just two Horned Frogs to be named Big 12 Player of the Week twice in the same season.
 - She is the first TCU post player to twice garner Big 12 Player of the Week credentials.

- PRESEASON LOVE FOR PRINCE**
Sedona Prince single-handedly added a new insert in the Individual Awards and Honors section of the TCU Women's Basketball Fact Book ahead of her first-and-only season in Fort Worth.
- Prince became the first Horned Frog to ever be named to the Lisa Leslie Award Watch List on Oct. 20. The

- award honor's the nation's top center and is annually presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA)
- Prince was also one of five Big 12 centers chosen to the watch list, alongside Taiyanna Jackson (Kansas), Ayoka Lee (Kansas State), Liz Scott (Oklahoma) and Taylor Jones (Texas).
 - The 6-7 center was also honored as a Preseason All-Big 12 Team honorable mention selection on Oct. 4. She joined Amy Okonkwo (2018) as one of just two forwards in TCU's 12-year Big 12 era to receive the recognition.
 - Prince is one of four players in program history to be deemed a Preseason All-Big 12 honoree, joining Okonkwo, Lauren Heard (2020, 2021) and Zahna Medley (2015, 2016).
 - Prince has twice been deemed a preseason all-conference player, having been chosen to the Preseason All-Pac-12 Team in 2020-21 ahead of her second season in Eugene and first on the court.

- UNA OF A KIND**
Una Jovanovic left an imprint on the Cal State Fullerton women's basketball history book in her second-and-final season in southern California.
- Jovanovic was one of only two players and the lone Big West guard to be crowned a two-time conference player of the week as a sophomore in 2022-23. She received the award twice in a three-week span on Jan. 16 and Jan. 30
 - She also became the first Titan guard in three seasons to receive postseason All-Big West Conference recognition as a second team selection.

- SUPER SYD**
Sydney Harris' MAC Freshman of the Year honor in March 2023 marked the first time Chippewa claimed the award in seven years. Harris was also just the fourth player in the 40-year history of the award to win it for Central Michigan.

- SMART FROGS**
Nine Horned Frogs have received Academic All-Conference or institutional academic achievement recognition at least once in their collegiate careers.

QUACK ATTACK

TCU's Fort Worth campus and Eugene, Oregon, are separated by 2,006 miles, yet the connection the Horned Frogs' staff shares with the state's flagship institution is stronger than ever. All five members of TCU's coaching staff played and/or coached at Oregon and/or share a familial tie to the Willamette Valley.

- Mark Campbell and associate head coach Xavier Lopez spent four seasons together in Eugene as assistant coaches from 2017-2021. Lopez served as the Ducks' athletic performance coach in the two years prior to his assistant coaching appointment.
- Minyon Moore played her senior season for Campbell and Lopez in 2019-2020. Moore was named to the Pac-12 All-Defensive Team and served as Oregon's point guard in a season that saw the Ducks sweep the Pac-12 regular season and tournament titles and post a 31-2 overall record.
- Nia Jackson worked alongside Campbell and Lopez as Oregon's director of creativity in 2019-2020. Jackson, an All-Pac-12 first team honoree in 2012, scored more than 1,000 points during her playing career at Oregon. She still ranks in the program's all-time top-10 records list for career assists (355) and steals (104).
- Campbell rounded out his inaugural staff with the hire of three-time All-American Ruthy Hebard as an assistant coach on Oct. 2. Hebard was coached in high school by TCU assistant coach and director of operations Jessie Craig before being mentored into a four-time All-Pac-12 player at Oregon under Campbell's tutelage.
- Campbell's wife, Ashley, played high school basketball 100 miles north of Eugene at Oregon City High School before starring at Vanderbilt.
- Lopez's wife, Megan, is a Corvallis, Oregon native and was the Ducks' director of operation during he and Campbell's stay in the Willamette Valley.

A WNBA LUXURY

TCU's hire of former Minnesota Lynx forward Ruthy Hebard as an assistant coach on Oct. 2 levied the Horned Frogs the distinction of being one of just six teams with an active WNBA player on its 2023-24 staff. TCU joined Florida, Oregon, Minnesota, Penn State and Vanderbilt in the elite company.

AN ALL-BIG 12 AND NBA LINEAGE

Should Jade Clack follow in her father's footsteps, she'll become the second All-Big 12 player and NBA/WNBA draft pick in her family's storied basketball pedigree.

- Clack's father, Kris, earned All-Big 12 honors as a small forward for Texas in 1998 and 1999. He concluded his collegiate career with 1,552 points and 771 rebounds.
- He also was tabbed to the All-Big 12 Defensive Team twice in 1997 and 1998.
- Kris Clack was selected in the second round of the 1999 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics and went on to enjoy a nine-year professional playing career that spanned four clubs in Italy, the NBA Developmental League and International Basketball League.

POSTSEASON PEDIGREES

TCU's ambition is to return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2010, and the program has postseason success littered across its roster as it looks to become a fixture in the Big Dance. Five Horned Frogs notched at least one NCAA Tournament victory at their previous school before transferring to Fort Worth.

- Sedona Prince boasts four NCAA Tournament caps. She played in three NCAA Tournament games over her two-year run on the court at Oregon. Prince led the Ducks to the Sweet 16 as a No. 6 seed in 2021. She delivered a defining 22-point, five-rebound and four-block performance in Oregon's Round of 32 win over No. 10 Georgia. Prince was also a freshman on a Texas team that earned a first round appearance in 2019.
- Madison Conner dressed in 11 NCAA Tournament games while in Tucson. She guided Arizona to consecutive Round of 32 berths in 2022 and 2023. Conner scored five points in 19 minutes in the Wildcats' opening round 72-67 win vs. No. 12 seed UNLV in 2022 and chipped in three points in a 13-point takedown of West Virginia in the Round of 64 last season.
- Manumaleuga saw her first NCAA Tournament action in Arizona's first round win vs. Stony Brook in 2021.

- Agnes Emma-Nnoku leads TCU in NCAA Tournament appearances (13) in addition to being an NCAA Champion. As a sophomore in 2022, she staked Stanford to the Final Four as a key reserve. Last season, Emma-Nnoku scored seven points over 26 combined minutes in opening round tilts vs. Sacred Heart and Ole Miss.
- Bre'Von White advanced to the Round of 32 as a freshman at Oklahoma in 2021-2022

THE CAVINDER EFFECT

TCU won the ultimate mid-season transfer portal prize with the signing of four-time All-Conference point guard Haley Cavinder to its 2024-25 roster on Nov. 15.

- Cavinder's pledge marks the fourth straight season in which Campbell has plucked a graduate student point guard from the transfer portal. Campbell inked eventual Big Sky MVP's Kahlaiah Dean (2023) and Lianna Tillman (2022) during his tenure at Sacramento State, then pried Jaden Owens away from Baylor in May.
- Cavinder led the Hurricanes in points (12.2 ppg), 3-point field goal percentage (.804), free throw percentage (.878) and minutes (30 mpg) per game and guided the Hurricanes to the Elite Eight in 2022-23.
- Cavinder is one of just 19 active collegians to score 2,000-or-more points.
- Cavinder was crowned Mountain West Player of the Year her sophomore season at Fresno State in 2020-21. As a junior, she set an NCAA record for free throw percentage (.973), canning 109-112 attempts at the charity stripe and became the 20th player in NCAA history to record three triple-doubles in a season.
- During the pandemic, Cavinder and her twin sister, Hanna, augmented their audience on TikTok (@cavindertwins) to the tune of its current tally of 4.5 million followers. Their joint account is the second-most followed among all college athletes. Cavinder announced her verbal commitment to play for TCU and head coach Mark Campbell to more than 700,000 Instagram followers. She capped the 2022-23 season with an NCAA women's basketball-leading NIL valuation of \$835,000.

A DECEMBER OF FIRSTS FOR CAMPBELL

Mark Campbell, an eight-time NCAA Tournament participant and conference champion coach, ticked new coaching milestones off the box throughout TCU's memorable December run.

- Campbell became the first first-year head coach to lead his/her team to an AP Top 25 ranking in 2023-24.
- Campbell ran the table in nonconference play for the first time in his 17 seasons as a college basketball head or assistant coach.
- TCU's 13 nonconference victories were the most earned by Campbell in a season.
- TCU's 14-game winning streak to begin the season was the third-longest of Campbell's career. Campbell's 2019-20 Oregon team closed the season as winners of 19 straight. His 2018-19 Final Four squad in Eugene won 17 consecutive games from December-February.
- Campbell concluded nonconference play as one of just two undefeated first-year head coaches in the nation alongside West Virginia's Mark Kellogg.

COACH OF THE WEEK CITATION FOR CAMPBELL

- TCU's head coach was recognized as ESPN's Coach of the Week for Nov. 20-26 in the sports channel's weekly College Women's Basketball Power Rankings after guiding TCU to a St. Pete Showcase Championship via victories over UTEP and Nebraska.
- The two-step over the Miners and Cornhuskers signified the second straight Thanksgiving holiday hoops tournament title Campbell has captured. His 2022-23 Sacramento State squad won the Holiday Beach Classic in San Luis Obispo, California on the strength of victories against Cal Poly and UTEP.

A BIG WIN OVER THE BIG TEN

- TCU's 88-81 win over Nebraska on Nov. 25 marked the program's first win at the expense of a Big Ten opponent since downing No. 13 Michigan State 80-75 on Nov. 28, 2004 to win the Rainbow Wahine Classic.
- TCU also won its third Thanksgiving holiday tournament and first since capturing the 2018 Warner Center Marriott Thanksgiving Classic in Northridge, California.

SEDONA AND SANDORA

- Sedona Prince tallied 20 points and recorded a double-double in consecutive games from Dec. 20-Jan. 5 against Omaha, Mount St. Mary's, BYU and Baylor.
- She is the first Horned Frog to register at least 20 points in four straight games since all-time leading scorer Lauren Heard accomplished the feat from Feb. 10-20, 2021.
- Prince will become the program's first player since three-time All-American Sandora Irvin from Dec. 9-29, 2004, to score 20 points and/or record a double-double in five straight contests should she tick either milestone off the box in her next outing.

10 X 15 FOR NO. 3

- Madison Conner supplanted Lauren Heard as the most recent Horned Frog to score at least 10 points in 15-or-more games with her 11-point effort at No. 6 Baylor on Jan. 3.
- Heard, who tallied 2,006 points in her five-year TCU tenure, reached double figures on 15 straight occasions from Jan. 20, 2019-Feb. 19, 2020.
- Conner has reached double digits in every game in 2023-24.

THE BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

TCU's 14-0 start to the 2023-24 campaign was nothing short of unprecedented within Horned Frog basketball history and across the national ranks.

- The Horned Frogs 14 straight wins to begin the winter was the longest winning streak to start a season in the history of TCU men's and women's basketball.
- TCU earned its longest winning streak ever via its 12th win of the season on Dec. 20 against Omaha. The dozen wins in a row surpassed a string of 11 straight the 2000-01 Horned Frogs' squad notched. That team went on to win the Western Athletic Conference regular season championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, signifying the program's first conference title and berth to the Big Dance.
- TCU joined the 2017-18 Horned Frogs men's basketball team as one of just two in school history to run the table in nonconference play.
- The Horend Frogs entered the single-season record books well before punctuating a perfect 13-0 nonconference slate via a 87-34 takedown of Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 22. TCU notched its best start to a season ever on the strength of an 82-50 win against Tulsa three weeks prior. The win sent TCU to its first 8-0 start to a season and trumped the 2019-20 Horned Frog team's run of seven straight victories to begin the winter.
- TCU also became the first team with a first-year head coach to enter The Associated Press poll in 2023-24. The Horned Frogs first cracked the national rankings on Dec. 18 when they were tabbed 25th in the AP Top 25. TCU's ranking was its earliest in 13 seasons.
- The program was honored as U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) National Team of the Week for the first time in its existence on Dec. 27.
- Individually, TCU attained a league-leading and single-season program record Big 12 Player of the Week citations during nonconference play. Sedona Prince accounted for two of the accolades, in turn becoming the first frontcourt player ever to be honored as Big 12 Player of the Week twice in the same season.
- Madison Conner's 30 points in TCU's season-opening win against Oral Roberts were the most ever by a player making her TCU debut vs. Oral Roberts. Conner then torched Tulsa for 41, which were the second-most points scored by a TCU player ever and most in the Horned Frogs' Big 12 era.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE TROUBLE

The Horned Frogs currently rank second the Big 12 in double-doubles (20), with Sedona Prince accounting for a team-leading 10.

- Prince became the first Horned Frog in four seasons (Amy Okonkwo, 2019) and Lauren Heard (2021) to record double-doubles in three consecutive games from Nov. 6-12. She accomplished the feat a second time from Dec. 20-Jan. 3, tallying four straight in wins over Omaha, Mount St. Mary's and BYU.
- Agnes Emma-Nnoku ranks second on the team with three. She stuffed the stat sheet en route to her

first-ever double-double vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville, scoring 14 points to pair with 10 rebounds and four steals. Emma-Nnoku earned her second of the season via a 15-point, 10-board effort on Dec. 22 vs. Mount St. Mary's. She picked up double-double No. 3 in TCU's conference opener, collecting 14 points and a team-best 11 rebounds against BYU.

- Jaden Owens earned the second and third double-doubles of her career against Lamar and BYU, finishing with 10 assists in both contests.
- Madison Conner has produced two double-doubles of her own. She racked up 30 points and 11 rebounds over 28 minutes vs. Oral Roberts her first career game in purple and white. Conner matched her opening-game output on the glass vs. Rice while accumulating a game-high 19 points.
- Aaliyah Roberson has garnered double-doubles in three. She finished with 14 points and a career-high 12 rebounds on Dec. 20 against Omaha. Ten days earlier, Roberson earned her first career double-double and gave TCU its 10th of the season on Dec. 10 vs. PVAMU, tallying 14 points and 10 rebounds. Roberson checked in with her third double-double at Texas Tech on Jan. 27, pairing 15 points with a game-leading 10 boards.

CHEF OWENS

- Jaden Owens came two assists shy of matching TCU's single-game record after finishing with 11 against both Tulsa and ACU. Zahna Medley set the all-time high with 13 vs. Oklahoma on Jan. 9, 2013.
- Owens also became the eighth Horned Frog to record 11 assists in a game.
- Owens' 71 assists over TCU's first 10 games were the most-ever in a 10-game stretch in program history.
- The fifth-year point guard needed just 70 assists to break Natasha Lacy's single-season record for assists (184), set during the 2004-05 season before suffering her season-ending knee injury.
- At the time of her injury, Owens had recorded the sixth-most assists by any D1 player over the last two seasons. She accumulated 294 assists across 47 games since 2022.

PUSHING FOR A QUARTER TON

- Jaden Owens was 79 assists away from reaching 500 for her career.
- Had Owens reached the milestone, she would have become one of just four players with 500 career assists to suit up for TCU, joining Helena Sverrisdottir (2007-11), Lauren Heard (2017-22) and Zahna Medley (2012-16).
- Only 25 active collegians had recorded 500 career assists at the time of her injury.

MAY I LEND AN ASSIST?

- TCU is assisting on 66.8 percent of its field goals (428-640) through 25 games.
- The Horned Frogs have been credited with an assist on at least 75 percent of their buckets 10 times this season (Incarnate Word, Army, Tulsa, ACU, PVAMU, Lamar, Mount St. Mary's, UCF, Kansas, Texas).
- The Horned Frogs produced their highest single-game assist rate in their Big 12 era vs. Kansas on Feb. 3, assisting on 23 of 25 field goals.
- TCU assisted on a season-best 86 percent (18-21) of its makes from the field against Incarnate Word on Nov. 15.
- TCU finished with a season-high 29 assists and 38 field goals vs. Mount St. Mary's.
- TCU has dished out 20-or-more assists in 10 games.

EFFECTIVELY EFFICIENT

- The Horned Frogs rank 20th nationally third in the big 12 in effective field goal percentage (.525). Effective field goal percentage accounts for the added difficulty in making a 3-pointer and that 3-pointers possess a higher value than all other field goals and free throws.

FROGS IN THE PROS

A review of the top performing Horned Frogs alumnae, who are currently playing basketball professionally.

Updated on Feb. 9

- Anneli Maley** (6'1"-F-1998, played in 2018-19, plays pro in Australia). She could not help Perth Lynx (16-8) to beat Boomers (11-8) in the Australian WNBL. Maley scored 8 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in 27 minutes. Perth Lynx lost 76-90 on the road to the lower-ranked (#3) Boomers. There are only three games left until the end of the Regular Season. So now every game will be critical. Maley has relatively good stats this year 13.9ppg, 12.4rpg, 2.7apg and 1.1spg in 18 games she played so far.

Amy Okonkwo (6'2"-F-1996, played in 2015-15, plays in France) was not able to help one of league's weakest teams Bretagne (3-11) in their last game on Sunday. Despite her good performance Bretagne was edged 78-75 at home by the higher-ranked Roche (#10). Okonkwo was the second best scorer with 14 points. She also added 5 rebounds. It's Okonkwo's first season with the team. Okonkwo has individually a very good year with high stats. She averages 16.6ppg, 6.6rpg, 1.8apg and 1.6spg. Okonkwo is a naturalized Nigerian.

WE SCORE, YOU DON'T

- Prior to Sedona Prince's injury, TCU ranked 11th in the country in points per game differential (+27.1).
- TCU has held 19 of 25 opponents under their season scoring average thus far. The Horned Frogs are surrendering 55.4 points per game at home.
- Only Kansas, Nebraska and Houston have exceeded 75 points vs. TCU. The Horned Frogs have limited 15 teams to 60-or-fewer points.
- TCU has held 10 teams under 55 points.
- All-but-four of the Horned Frogs' victories have been by 14-plus points.
- Ten opponents have failed to shoot 33 percent-or-better from the field vs. TCU

FREAKY FAST FROGS

A fast start by Mark Campbell-led and TCU teams as a whole over the last three seasons has been as close to a surefire foreshadowing of a Horned Frog victory.

- Since 2021-22, the Horned Frogs are 27-5 when leading after the first quarter and 28-3 when taking a lead into halftime.
- Campbell's Sac State and TCU teams have combined to give the head coach career records of 46-8 when in possession of a first quarter lead and 49-6 when entering the intermission atop the scoreboard.
- TCU's 55 first half points vs. Omaha on Dec. 20 were the program's most through the opening 20 minutes since scoring an identical tally against SMU on Nov. 18, 2015. The Horned Frogs output was also tied for the seventh-most first half points scored in program history.
- TCU has surrendered 40 first half points just once.

A once in a lifetime opportunity to play Division I basketball



TCU held open tryouts for the first time in the modern era on Jan. 18-19 in search of full-time TCU students interested in walking-on for the remainder of the 2023-24 season. The search for walk-ons commenced in the wake of TCU's forfeiture of its games vs. Kansas State and Iowa State due to compounding injuries that left the Horned Frogs with just six healthy players. A total of 40 candidates participated in one of two tryout dates. The group included a 19 members of the TCU Women's Club Basketball Team. Head coach Mark Campbell extended a preferred walk-on invitation to three candidates, Piper Davis, Ella Hamlin and Mekhayia Moore, and offered dual-sport athlete Sarah Sylvester a spot on the squad. This is the story of how it all unfolded.

THE CALL ACROSS CAMPUS

TCU shared a flyer advertising open tryouts at 3 p.m. on Jan. 17, four-and-a-half hours following the official cancellation of its games vs. K-State and at Iowa State. The flyer received more than 1.2 million views and generated nearly 2,000 combined likes or reposts on X within 48 hours.

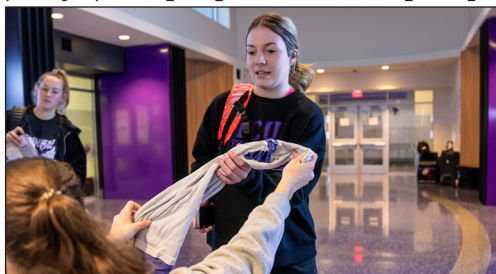
HOW IT LOOKED, FELT AND SOUNDED

Both tryouts lasted exactly one hour. Each night commenced with a brief warm-up headed by TCU's human performance coach. The tryout transitioned to lay-ups and a series of shooting drills thereafter. Candidates competed in groups of three or four to knock down 15 shots from various spots on the floor, including both elbows and the top of the 3-point arc. Campbell then split the tryout pool into three teams for a sequence of full court 4 on 4 games, with candidates receiving equal playing time. The final 15 minutes of tryouts concluded with half court 3 on 3 before a breakdown at center court.



FROM THE REC CENTER TO SCHOLLMAYER ARENA

Forty TCU students, both undergraduate and master's level, flocked to the Schollmaier Basketball Complex practice gym. Candidates were issued a number and penny upon signing in. Both evenings began with a 30 minutes of free shooting.

SUPPORT FROM SCHOLLMAYER ARENA'S CO-OWNER

TCU quickly determined Sylvester had a spot on the squad provided the Horned Frog volleyball program gave its blessing. Campbell talked with volleyball head coach Jason Williams, whose program endured a forfeit of its own in 2022. Williams had no hesitation in helping women's basketball in a time of need. He was also keenly aware of Sylvester's original love for basketball. She fielded a handful of offers from mid-major Division I programs as a high school underclassman before committing to volleyball.



'YOU MADE THE TEAM'

Campbell and his staff huddled in "Scoop Headquarters," the program's conference room inside the Schollmaier Basketball Complex, immediately following the second night of tryouts. Davis, Hamlin and Moore were deemed the best overall players. Associate head coach Xavi Lopez suggested inviting the trio for an in-person get-to-know-you interview on Saturday, Jan. 20, to ensure the players' personalities and goals aligned with the program's culture and needs for the remainder of the season. Interviews took place during the afternoon of the 20th, where the walk-on . TCU men's basketball hosted Iowa State that day. Davis had plans to go to the game, but left during the tail-end of the first half and walked across the Schollmaier Arena hall to the SBC to receive the good news. The walk-on trio took in TCU's Sunday practice, where they were introduced to TCU's 14 scholarship players, filled out a new student-athlete bio sheet alongside the Horned Frogs' athletic communications team, and were given a tour of the athletics facilities.

A DUAL SPORT STAR IS BORN

Sylvester's addition to the roster was publicized during the afternoon of Sunday, Jan. 21, less than 48 hours from TCU's return to the court vs. UCF. She began practicing with the team ahead of the trio of walk-ons that day, as she did not need clearance from compliance. Her official announcement garnered more than 256,000 views and 1,300 likes on 'X.' A subsequent, shared Instagram post between TCU women's basketball and volleyball yielded more than 7,000 likes within 24 hours. Sylvester's addition led to a front page story on ESPN.com by national NCAAAW writer Alexa Philippou and a personalized post on 'X' by Front Office Sports among numerous other story shares.



TCU women's basketball adds walk-on, to resume play Tuesday

TCU women's basketball has added Sarah Sylvester, who also plays on the school's volleyball team, to its roster as a preferred walk-on after the program did not have enough healthy players to compete in a pair of games this past week.

The Horned Frogs forfeited contests to [Kansas State](#) and [Iowa State](#) because a slew of injuries left them with only six available players. The program held open tryouts Thursday and Friday in search of a walk-on addition.

TCU -- which started the season 14-0 before dropping four straight games -- now is able to return to the court Tuesday against UCF.

EDITOR'S PICKS



Sylvester, a 6-foot-3 post player, had four years of varsity basketball in high school, averaging 11.3 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks as a senior and earning all-league honors as a junior and senior. The sophomore is a middle blocker for TCU's volleyball team, which advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament the past two seasons.



THE (ACCELERATED) ONBOARDING PROCESS

Typically completed during summer workouts and fall practices, TCU was truly working against the clock to clear Davis, Hamlin and Moore in time for its game vs. UCF. On Monday, Jan. 21, TCU's athletic communications and creative content team put the walk-ons through an abbreviated media day to gather individual action shots and head shots to send to ESPN, share on their roster cards on GoFrogs.com and utilize on internal video board content. All three players needed to be formally added to TCU's NCAA roster. The players also had to take a blood sample and heart scan as a part of their clearance. Each athlete met with TCU athletics' academic services office to alter their class schedule to match the program's morning practice block. Their signings were publicized around 5:30 p.m. on the 21st, exactly 24 hours before tipoff against the Knights. The three walk-ons first official practice was shootaround on game day, just eight hours from go-time.

AN EMOTIONAL WEEK ENDS ON SPORTSCENTER

Faced with improbable circumstances, TCU stole the national spotlight once more in 2023-24, defeating UCF 66-60 with just seven scholarship players in its return to the court. Sylvester entered the game with TCU trailing 48-47 with 1:08 remaining in the third quarter and promptly helped the Horned Frogs take a one-point lead entering the final frame. TCU erased a five-point fourth quarter deficit and scored the ballgame's final nine points to seal the win. Following the final horn, Campbell hopped on SportsCenter with host Nicole Briscoe to discuss the program's roller coaster of a week. The segment began with a spotlight of Sylvester's dual-sport status before transitioning into a highlight melt from the game and one-on-one interview between Briscoe and Campbell.

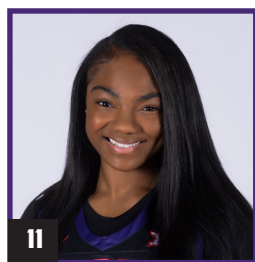
