## THE LEAD

Iowa State returns to Hilton Coliseum for its annual Play4Kay game while facing BYU for the second time this season. The Cyclones picked up an 80-75 win at the Marriott Center in Provo on January 6.

## KEY STORYLINES

- Audi Crooks is three points from claiming the Iowa State all-time freshman record for points in a season. Crooks' total sits at 458 with three games to play in the regular season.
- Iowa State has outrebounded its opponent 22 times through 25 games this season and ranks 10th in NCAA Division I with +9.6 rebound margin.
- Audi Crooks and Addy Brown each finished with double-doubles at Houston, the second time this season the freshman duo has managed the feat.
- Addy Brown is one of three NCAA Division I players and the only player from a Power 5 program to tally at least 330 points, 210 rebounds and 125 assists this season.
- Emily Ryan is 37 assists from setting a new Iowa State record for career dimes. She has finished with at least one assist in every game as a Cyclone.
- Iowa State is one of 12 NCAA Division I teams to secure two AP Top 10 wins this season and one of 20 to win three games against AP Top 25 opponents.
- Crooks and Brown have claimed five Big 12 weekly awards this season. Crooks was most recently named the league's Freshman of the Week on Jan. 29.
■ Bill Fennelly earned his 600th win as Iowa State's head coach on Jan. 6 at BYU. Fennelly has accounted for 72 percent of ISU's women's basketball program wins and is the winningest coach, regardless of sport, in school history.
- Addy Brown is the only player in NCAA Division I to average at least 13.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists.

■ Iowa State's "fab five" freshmen contibute the highest percentage of team points, rebounds and minutes across all Power 5 programs.

■ Named Iowa State's sixth head women's basketball coach in 1995.

■ Has coached 10 Associated Press AllAmericans at Iowa State

■ Coached consensus All-American Ashley Joens, the three-time Cheryl Miller Award winner.
■ Coached consensus All-American Bridget Carleton, the 2019 Cheryl Miller Award winner.

- Led Iowa State to school-record 28 wins in 2021-22. Has 10 seasons with at least 25 wins at Iowa State.

■ Iowa State captured Big 12 Tournament titles in 2000, 2001 and 2023 and has played in the championship game seven times.

- A three-time finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year Award (2001, 2002, 2005).

■ His 770 career wins is tied for eighth among active women's coaches in NCAA Division I and makes him the 25thwinningest NCAA women's basketball coach all-time.

- Fennelly is also tied for the secondlongest tenured Power 5 basketball coach in men's or women's basketball.

## LAST TIME OUT

Iowa State won its first road contest since Jan. 6 with a 76-64 triumph over Houston.

- Audi Crooks led the Cyclones with her fourth-straight 20-point game, scoring 25 points on 9-of-11 shooting from the floor.
■ Crooks' point total brought her to 458 career points, just three from setting a new program best by a freshman in a single season.
- Crooks and Addy Brown each finished with double-doubles. Crooks pulled down 12 boards while Brown added 16 points and a game-high 13 rebounds.
- Emily Ryan was near a triple-double with nine points, 11 rebounds and seven assists.
■ Hannah Belanger also scored in double figures with 11 points. With her third 3-pointer, she became the sixth active NCAA women's basketball player to make 350 career triples.


## INSIDE THE SERIES

Iowa State and BYU meet for the fourth time ever and the second time this season on Saturday night.

- BYU is one of four conference opponents ISU faces twice this season.
- The Cyclones snagged an 80-75 win in Provo on Jan. 6 as part of a 6-0 start to conference play.
- The Cougars' two program wins over Iowa State occured in 1992 and 2002.

■ The Cougars have lost each of their last two contests (Kansas and TCU) but have tallied three of their five conference wins in the month of February.

■ Two-time Big l2 Player of the Week Lauren Gustin leads BYU with 17.1 points and 15.4 rebounds per game.
■ Gustin is shooting nearly 53 percent from the floor while also leading the Cougars with 36 minutes per game.

- BYU also relies on two freshmen, Kailey Woolston and Amari Whiting, averaging double-figure scoring.
■ Whiting leads the team with 110 assists while Woolston has knocked down 70 3-pointers.


## NOTABLE MILESTONES

Iowa State players and coaches have reached several impressive milestones throughout the season.
■ Audi Crooks scored her 400th career point against No. 7 Kansas State on Feb. 14. With 458 points this season, she owns the second-highest total by a Cyclone freshman behind Megan Taylor's 460 in 1997-98.

- Crooks also passed Colleen Peterson's freshman record for field goals made with her 164th career make. Crooks' season total sits at 180 with three regular season games remaining.
■ Emily Ryan passed out her 700th career assist at Texas on Feb. 17. Ryan is the third Cyclone and ninth active NCAA women's basketball player to reach the career mark.
- For the 2lst-straight season, the Cyclones have made more than 200 3-pointers in a season. Iowa State's season total sits at 212 makes.

■ Head coach Bill Fennelly earned his 600th win at Iowa State with an 80-75 victory at BYU on Jan. 6. Fennelly is Iowa State's all-time winningest coach, regardless of sport.

- Hannah Belanger recorded her 2,000th career point against Kansas on Jan. 3 with a season-high 19 points and six 3 -pointers. Belanger was the 14 th active NCAA player to reach 2,000 career points.
■ Belanger also made her 350th career 3 -pointer at Houston. She has made 56 triples for ISU this season.
- Isnelle Natabou recorded her 1,000th career point at St. Thomas (Nov. 29) and followed up with her 700th career rebound against UNI (Dec. 20) less than a month later. She became the 49th active NCAA DI player to reach both milestones.

■ Hannah Belanger is 36 assists from 400 career assists and 35 rebounds from 500 career rebounds.

■ Jalynn Bristow 10 points from 150 career points.

- Addy Brown is three assists from 130 dimes and 17 points from 350 points.
- Audi Crooks is 11 rebounds from 200 rebounds this season.
- Crooks is also 20 makes form 200 made field goals and five makes from 100 made free throws.
- Nyamer Diew is seven rebounds from 300 boards at Iowa State and five points from 600 career points.
- Arianna Jackson is six points from 125 career points.
- Kelsey Joens is three points from 150 career points.
- Isnelle Natabou is five rebounds from 750 career rebounds and 23 blocks from 100 career blocks.
- Emily Ryan is 20 rebounds from 500 career rebounds and 24 points from 1,200 career points.


## EMILY RYAN DISH-TRIBUTION CENTER

Emily Ryan is one of Iowa State's most prolific point guards, recording top 10 career marks in both assists and steals while becoming the program's 34th 1,000 point scorer last March.

■ The Claflin, Kansas native has recorded 709 career assists and is third all-time in program history.

■ Over four seasons, she has tallied singlegame assists at every mark, 1-17. Ryan has never finished a game with less than one assist through 111 career games.

- Ryan is currently ninth among all NCAA active women's basketball players and fifth in Division I with her career assists total. She has reached the mark in the fewest games (1ll) among those in the top 10.
■ In the last five seasons, there have been four Big 12 individual performances of 14 or more assists. Ryan owns three of the four following a 14 -assist performance against Oklahoma State on Jan. 31.

■ The "Floor General" has also posted a top-3 carer free throw percentage through 111 games. Her 867 clip sits behind only Kelsey Bolte (.879, 211-240) and tied with Jadda Buckley (.867, 326376).

- Also a scoring threat, Ryan is Iowa State's 27th all-time leading scorer with 1,176 points.

■ On Mar. 10, 2023 against Baylor, she became the 34th player in Iowa State history to record l,000 career points.

- Ryan cracked the Top 10 steals leaders at Iowa State with her 145th career swipe.

## REIGNING FROM THREE

As has been the case for decades, Iowa State is one of the top 3-point shooting teams in the country.

- Hannah Belanger leads the ISU effort from deep, canning 53 triples through 24 games and connecting on 36.6 percent of her attempts from deep.
■ This season, ISU is 23rd in NCAA DI and second in the Big 12 with 8.5 triples per game.
- The Cyclones have made 212 3-pointers this season, posting 10 or more made triples in seven games this season.

■ In 2022-23, the Cyclones were 12th in the country at 8.8 3-pointers per game. That effort was led in part by Ashley Joens, who had a team-high 89 3-pointers and led the Big 12 in 3 -pointers per game (2.78).
■ Iowa State finished 282 3-pointers last season, the seventh-most in a season in Iowa State history. All of the top seven have come under the tenure of head coach Bill Fennelly.

- Iowa State was second in the country in 2021-22 with 357 made 3-pointers. In six seasons prior to Bill Fennelly's arrival at Iowa State (the first six with the 3-pointer in women's basketball], ISU combined for 345 3-pointers.
■ Iowa State's 357 surpassed the previous school record for 3-pointers in a season of 303 by the 2018-19 squad and the old Big 12 record of 325 by Kansas State's 2012-13 team.

Iowa State point guard Emily Ryan is one of the best distributors of the basketball in the country and in program history. Her teammates at Iowa State have greatly benefited from her court vision.

- As a freshman, Addy Brown has been a triple threat; scoring, rebounding and assisting. With a team-high 127 assists through 25 games, she reached the top 5 freshmen assists leaders.

- Brown is the 20th player in NCAA DI since 1999-00 to average over 8.0 rebounds per game and 5.0 assists per game in a season.
- Brown is one of three players in NCAA Division I and the only player from a Power 5 program to post at least 333 points, 213 rebounds and 127 assists this season.


## CROOKS COOKS

Iowa State freshman Audi Crooks has garnered national attention as one of the nation's most exciting freshmen.

- Audi Crooks is one of the top players in NCAA Division I for field goal percentage, shooting at a 57.7 percent clip through 25 games. Iowa State single-season records for field goal percentage range from . 661 (Angie Welle, 2002) to .579 (Shelly Coyle, 1990) in the top 10.
- Crooks also reached 100 field goals made with 10 against Baylor. She holds the best mark by a freshman in ISU history with 180 makes.

- She is 21 made field goals from reaching the top 10 in ISU history regardless of class.
- Crooks has scored 458 points to lead the Cyclones this season, second among the top 5 best marks by a freshman in a single season. Her total sits behind Megan Taylor (460) after passing Ashley Joens (408) and Colleen Peterson (408).
■ Drawing contact under the basket, Crooks has made a team-high 144 trips to the free throw line this season. With 95 makes, she tied the third-best mark by a freshman at Iowa State.

- Crooks has scored in double figures in 24 of 25 games and finished with $20+$ points 12 times this season.
■ She posted a career high with 29 points against OSU on 14-of-21 shooting, the most makes by a Cyclone in a league game since Bridget Carleton's 16 against OSU (Jan. 2018) and the most by a Cyclone freshman in program history.
■ The in-state icon led Iowa State with 20 points to its most recent AP Top 10 win over No. 7 Kansas State, playing a career-high 35 minutes in the Cyclones' double overtime victory.
■ One of the nation's most efficient freshmen, the Algona, Iowa native averages 18.3 points per game to lead ISU to go along with 7.6 rebounds per game.
■ In week 11, Crooks led Iowa State to two AP Top 25 wins with two 20-point games (22 vs. No. 24 West Virginia, 23 vs. No. 4 Baylor).
- Her efforts earned her the first Big 12 Player of the Week honor for a Cyclone freshman in program history.
■ Crooks also pulled down a then-career-high 11 rebounds against the Mountaineers.

■ She has earned Big 12 weekly awards four times this season (Dec. 18, Jan. 2, Jan. 15, Jan. 29).


## NATION'S LONGEST 3-POINT STREAK

■ The Iowa State women's basketball team owns women's basketball's longest streak for consecutive games with a 3 -pointer, sitting at 919 .

■ The streak began on Feb. 19, 1995 at Colorado when Tara Gunderson netted a triple and is still active.
■ The Cyclones reached 900-consecutive games with a made 3-pointer at St. Thomas (Nov. 29, 2023) when Kelsey Joens knocked down a triple for ISU's first points of the contest.
■ Iowa State has made 7,442 triples over the course of the streak and made 10 or more in a game 280 times.
■ Iowa State has hit 200 or more 3-pointers in a season 2l-straight seasons, which is an NCAA record.
■ Iowa State hit 357 triples in 2021-22 season, reaching the 300s for the fourth time in program history.

## SHARE AND SCORE

Iowa State has reached the 25-assist threshold in six games this season (25, Nov. 20 vs. Southern; 25, Nov. 25 vs. Syracuse; 25, Dec. 3 vs. UNCW; 26, Dec. 17 vs. Troy; 27, Jan. 31 vs. Oklahoma State; 25, Feb. 14 vs. No. 7 Kansas State].
■ The Cyclones rank 12th in NCAA DI and third in the Big 12 through 25 games with 18.8 assists per game.
■ Addy Brown leads ISU with 127 assists this season, the most by a Cyclone freshman since Emily Ryan set the best single-season mark with 164 dimes.

- Against Kansas State, ISU assisted on 25 on its 28 made field goals.


Two Iowa State freshmen have top 10 field goal percentages among NCAA DI freshmen. Audi Crooks (lst) and Addy Brown (7th] also rank second and sixth among all Big 12 players.

- Emily Ryan (14) and Addy Brown (9) combined for 23 of ISU's 27 assists against Oklahoma State. It was the first time in the Fennelly era multiple Cyclones had posted nine or more assists in a single contest.
- In the last five seasons of Big 12 contests, Emily Ryan has posted 14 or more assists three times. Every other conference player has only managed the feat once.
- The last time Iowa State had a season of recording $25+$ assists in multiple games was 2021-22 when they posted marks of 27 vs. Prairie View A\&M (Dec. 19, 2021), 26 vs. West Virginia (Jan. 1, 2022) and 25 vs. TCU (Feb. 12, 2022).
- The Cyclones have posted $25+$ assists in at least three games in a single season six times. In 1999-2000, ISU posted at least 25 assists in a game six times, the top total for single season in program history.
- Iowa State's 16 assists in the first half against Southern were the most in a half this season before the Cyclones matched the total in the second half against Oklahoma State on Jan. 31.


## BELANGER AMONG NCAA'S TOP ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS

Graduate transfer Hannah Belanger had a record-breaking career at NCAA DII Truman State before joining the Iowa State squad in June.

- The Grafton, Wisconsin native is averaging 8.8 points per game for the Cyclones through 25 contests.
- Belanger is seventh for career 3 -pointers among active NCAA players across all divisions with 350 made triples. She has reached the mark in 133 career games, the fourth-fewest number of games of those in the top 10 .

## IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Early into the season, the Iowa State freshmen are making an impact not only on their team but nationally as well.

- Audi Crooks leads NCAA freshmen in field goal percentage and is second in the Big 12 , shooting nearly 58 percent.
■ Crooks, an Algona, Iowa native, leads ISU with 18.3 points per game. That mark is fourth among all Big 12 players.
- Addy Brown is second on the team in both scoring average (13.3 PPG) and field goal percentage (.467) while posting a team-high 8.5 rebounds per game.
- Brown ranks l20th nationally for season field goal percentage and is sixth in the Big 12.
- Arianna Jackson has averaged 6.0 points per game in conference play and knocked down 21 triples through 14 Big 12 contests.


The Cyclones own one of the top marks in NCAA DI assists per game. ISU is dishing out 18.8 dimes per game. The mark is 12th in the nation and third among league teams.


Iowa State is one of the nation's best 3-point shooting teams, canning 212 triples this season. ISU ranks 24th in NCAA DI for 3-pointers per game and ranks second in the Big 12 with 8.5 triples per game.


The Cyclones have made at least one three-point field goal in an NCAA women's record 919 consecutive games, a streak which encapsulates the entirety of the Bill Fennelly Era at Iowa State.

## FAB FIVE FRESHMEN

With five freshmen earning significant playing time, Iowa State's Fab Five have proven themselves worthy of national attention.

- The group has contributed 64 percent of team points (1,197-1876), 63 percent of team rebounds (652-1043) and 57 percent of team minutes.
■ The group has also combined for 71 starts through 25 games with at least three freshmen starting in 20 of ISU's last 24 contests.
■ The five young Cyclones lead all other Power 5 freshmen groups in each category.
■ Audi Crooks leads ISU with 18.3 points per game while Addy Brown averages over 13 points and 8.5 rebounds per game.
■ Brown also leads the Cyclones with 33.6 minutes per contest.


## HERE FOR THE LONG HAUL

The Iowa State women's basketball coaching staff is the longest tenured full staff in the country.
■ The Iowa State staff of head coach Bill Fennelly, associate head coach Jodi Steyer, assistant coaches Latoja Schaben and Billy Fennelly and director of operations Josh Carper are in their 14th season together. The group has combined for 103 years with Cyclones women's basketball.

## \#HILTONMAGIC

The Cyclones have been phenomenal at home during Bill Fennelly's tenure, compiling a 378-82 record (.822) in Hilton Coliseum, including a 187-9 (.954) mark against regular-season non-conference opponents. Iowa State has gone undefeated at home three times, most recently during the 2004-05 season.
■ Iowa State's 16 wins at Hilton Coliseum in 2021-22 was tied for the third-most in a season in school history.
■ ISU's 5-0 non-con home record in 202223 marked the 22nd time Iowa State has gone undefeated at home in regular season non-conference contests under head coach Bill Fennelly.

## KEEPING UP WITH THE JOENS'

While Ashley Joens graduated as one of the best players in program history and was drafted into the WNBA, Iowa State will not be missing a Joens from the roster. Kelsey Joens is one of five freshmen making an immediate impact in 2023-24.

- Kelsey scored a season-high 17 points at St. Thomas (Nov. 29) on 6-of-8 shooting from the floor and 3-of-4 shooting from deep, including the first triple of the game that allowed Iowa State to reach 900-consecutive games with a made 3-pointer.
- The younger Joens also chipped in 13 points in ISU's win over No. 7 Kansas State, arguably her most impressive performance in conference play.
■ Kelsey knocked down three 3-pointers and was 4-of-4 from the charity stripe while corralling seven rebounds and playing 30 minutes.
- Ashley and Kelsey have combined to hit the first 3-pointer in a game 47 times over the course of their six total seasons as Cyclones.
- 25 games into her Cyclone career, Kelsey has knocked down 33 3-pointers, recorded a 384 3-point percentage and swiped a team-high 25 steals. She averages 5.9 points per game and 4.0 rebounds per game.
- The younger Joens is the fourth of five sisters in her family and the fourth to be playing Division I basketball. Courtney (Illinois) and Ashley (Iowa State) have completed their respective collegiate careers while Aubrey is a senior at Oklahoma this season.


## TOP-25 OPPONENT WIN WEEKS

In the Fennelly era, Iowa State has faced at least two AP top-25 regular season opponents in the same span of one week 29 times.

- Iowa State will faced consecutive Top 25 opponents for the second time this season, hosting No. 24 Oklahoma (Feb. 10) and No. 7 Kansas State (Feb. 14) before traveling to No. 5 Texas (Feb. 17).
■ The Cyclones went l-2, dropping an 86-72 contest to the Sooners before surviving a double overtime thriller, 9693 , against the Wildcats. ISU finished out the stretch with an 81-60 loss at Texas.
- The Top 10 week with Kansas State and Texas marks the first time since 2014-15 that the Cyclones faced consecutive Top 10 opponents and just the third time in program history during the regular season.
■ Iowa State rose to the challenge earlier this season as well to take down thenNo. 24 West Virginia, 74-64, and then-No. 4 Baylor, 66-63, to complete the feat for the first time in 14 years.
- When playing AP top-25 opponents back-to-back, Iowa State has now won consecutive games three times, previously during the 2009-10 season when it knocked off No. 20 Texas in overtime (73-71, Jan. 23, 2010) before defeating No. 11 Oklahoma (63-56, Jan. 27, 2010).


## NEW TO IOWA STATE

The future is bright for Iowa State as the Cyclones signed the No. 13 freshman class of 2023.
■ The five freshman are averaging 47.9 of Iowa State's 75.0 points per game through 25 games this season.
■ Audi Crooks (18.3) and Addy Brown (13.3) lead the Cyclone scoring effort while Brown also leads the team in rebounding (8.5 RPG) and assists (127).

- Kelsey Joens has knocked down 33 triples and swiped a team-high 25 steals through 25 games.
- Iowa State also welcomed three transfers to the 2023-24 roster: Hannah Belanger (Truman State), Isnelle Natabou (Sacramento State) and Alisa Williams (LSU).
- Belanger has earned a spot in the starting lineup and Natabou has averaged 5.2 points and 4.3 rebounds per game as a strong defensive presence in the paint. Williams will redshirt the 2023-24 season.
