#### Another State Off The List

BYU has now played an NCAA Tournament game in 23 different states with today's matchup Duquesne in Omaha, Neb. The Cougars have played in eight states multiple times including four times in Utah.

# In A League Of Their Own

BYU has now played an NCAA Tournament game against 16 different conferences as Thursday marked the Cougars' game against a school from the Atlantic 10 in the Big Dance.

#### Bench Success

BYU entered Thursday's game ranked sixth in the nation in bench points per game and the Cougars showed why as the second unit finished with 40 points. Jaxson Robinson and Fousseyni Traore combined for 36 of those points with Robinson finishing with a game-high 25 points.

#### Get To 70 Points

BYU finished the season 1-7 when scoring less than 69 points with the lone winning coming against UCF on January 13, 2024 in Orlando, Fla.

### Coming Off A Loss

The Cougars' five-game winning streak following a loss was snapped with their defeat to Duquesne.

# Trailing With 5:00 Minutes Left

The Cougars dropped to 1-11 on the year when trailing or tied with five minutes left in the game. On the flip side, BYU finished its season 22-0 when leading with five minutes to go.

#### 3YU

BYU finished the season with a program record 378 3-pointers. It's 1,087 attempts are also the most in a single season in program history.

The Cougars' 23 victories this season are tied for the third-most wins in a season for head coach Mark Pope in his career leading a program.

# Big 12 Success

In its first year as a member of the Big 12, BYU notched 10 conference victories, the most since the Cougars won 10 WCC games in the 2020-21 season.

# Leading Scorer Robinson

Robinson scored a team-high 25 points on 8-for-15 shooting from the floor. Robinson, who went 5-of-11 from 3-point range, scored the most points in an NCAA Tournament game for BYU since Tyler Haws had 33 points against Ole Miss in 2015.

# Double-Double Johnson

Spencer Johnson secured his fourth double-double of the season, finishing with 11 points and 16 rebounds which are the third-most in a NCAA Tournament game in program history. He finished the season with a team-high 58 offensive rebounds.

# Deck the Halls

Dallin Hall had six assists in the setback giving him 172 on the season which is the sixth-most in a single season in program history. The sophomore also had a career-high four steals.

#### Movin' On Un

With his 11 points in the loss, Fousseyni Traore moved up to 52nd on the all-time scoring list with 1,026 points.

# Opening Statement

"Tons of congratulations to Duquesne. They are on a great run, and they earned the win. Certainly fought like crazy and earned the win. So congratulations to them.

Just a devastating day for us for sure. It's devastating because we lost. It's devastating because we won't move on. And mostly it's devastating because we don't get to get in the gym together again.

So major congratulations to Duquesne. And so proud of my guys. This is incredibly painful. But I know how this goes. It will dissipate to some degree and will be replaced with an insane amount of gratitude for these guys sitting here, what they've dedicated to each other and to BYU, and the things that they were able to accomplish this year.

And that will stay with us forever."

# On his message to the team following the game

"It's a terrible time. Just seeing the locker room universally devastated, and there's nothing to do to fix it, and there's not another game to go make it better.

And so just very briefly expressed, you know, how much I love these guys and how grateful I am for them and everything that they've done for each other this year and grateful for the ride that they've taken us all on

And it's been beyond incredible, and just profoundly sad that it's over."

#### On having a young roster and moving forward

"We understand what a multi-year process it is. From year one last year to year two was epic growth and progression. I think our program is hungry to continue getting better. We've made massive strides in that area.
