

- Entering 2024, the Cougars rank tied for No. 9 in total wins over the past 50 seasons, winning 431 games. Only Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Georgia, Michigan, Nebraska. Penn State and Florida State have won more.
- After attending its 40th bowl game, BYU ranks No. 23 in bowl invitations.
- The Cougars have also spent 266 weeks in the Associated Press Top 25, ranking No. 36 overall in college football.
- BYU boasts 23 total conference championships in its history, which ranks No. 16 in college football history.
- Players at BYU have won the Heisman Trophy, Maxwell Award, Doak Walker Award, Outland Trophy, Sammy Baugh and Davey O'Brien Awards.
- BYU has had 14 consensus All-Americans and touts seven College Football Hall of Fame members, including legendary head coach LaVell Edwards.
- BYU won the 1984 National Championship, one of just 42 schools to claim a title.

BYU'S HISTORY. The establishment of the Brigham Young Academy in 1875 offered an academically stimulating and gospel-oriented education to 29 students. The one-acre school grounds presided over by Karl G. Maeser have since developed into nearly 600 acres and more than 300 buildings. From its inception, the goal of Brigham Young University has been to offer "a new kind of education" for Zion, one based on



precepts "revealed by the Lord," as Maeser once remarked. Today, BYU provides an outstanding education in an atmosphere consistent with the standards and principles of its sponsor, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The University is widely recognized for its deep commitments to inspired religious values and rigorous intellectual learning.

BYU MISSION STATEMENT. The mission of Brigham Young University — founded, supported, and guided by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints ---- is to assist individuals in their quest for perfection and eternal life. Los Angeles Rams Drafted 5th Round, 2023 NFL Draft 177th overall

Nacua stepped into a starting role with the Rams early in the season while Cooper Kupp was recovering from injury and quickly established himself as one of the best receivers in the league. He set rookie NFL records with 105 receptions and 1,486 yards. He also set the NFL rookie record for receptions in a single game with 15 and most receiving yards by a rookie in a playoff game with 181. He was named to the Pro Bowl, a second-team All-Pro and the PFWA All-Rookie Team. He was a finalist for the NFL's Rookie of the Year Award.




