Jones has teed it up in all ten events so far in the 2023-24 season with a 70.18 season scoring average. Out of the nine stroke play events, Jones has recorded eight top-25 finishes. With his recent win at the Arizona N.I.T., the Junior has now registered three individual wins during his collegiate career. Jones carded rounds of 65-69-64 to finish 18-under-par at Omni Tucson National Resort to secure the individual title.

He was a three-time 5A All-State honoree ('17, '18, '19) and was recruited by ASU, Colorado, Michigan, UCLA and Utah. BRUCE BROCKBANK
HEAD COACH - 32ND SEASON

Brockbank has coached 24 All-Americans at BYU, including four-time All-American Andy Miller, who qualified for the PGA Tour in 2002, as well as PGA Tour standouts Daniel Summerhays and Zac Blair. As an assistant in 1992, he helped coach All-American and 2003 Masters Champion Mike Weir.

In 1990, Brockbank earned a bachelor's degree in recreation management with a minor in health education from BYU. He completed a master's degree in the same subject in 1992. He married Lisa Carman in 1986. They are the parents of four children; a son, Jordan, and three daughters, McCale, McKenzie and Ashton.

Bruce Brockbank was named head coach of the BYU men's golf program in April 1992. Prior to that he served as an assistant coach for four seasons under the tutelage of GCAA Hall of Fame coach Karl Tucker.

Over the past 30 seasons, his student-athletes have earned 54 all-conference citations. Four have captured conference championship titles - Todd Pence (1995), Miller (1997), Manuel Merizalde (1999) and Nick Becker (2005), and four have been named conference golfer of the year - Jake Ellison (2006), Blair (2013), Patrick Fishburn (2017, 2018) and Peter Kuest (2019). He has also coached 20 GCAA All-America Scholar Athletes.

A native of Provo, Utah, Brockbank joined the BYU golf team in 1983 after a stellar prep career. Following an LDS mission to South Carolina, Brockbank returned to the Cougar squad in 1985 and was named first team All-WAC twice as well as earning GCAA third team All-America and GCAA All-America Scholar accolades during his senior season in 1988. As a senior he also won medalist honors at the prestigious Western Intercollegiate in Santa Cruz, Calif.

In his 32 years at the helm of the Cougar golf team, Brockbank has led BYU to 62 tournament wins, including conference titles in 1995, 1999, 2001, 2007, 2014, 2017 and 2023. In 2000, he led BYU to seven tournament wins (more than any other team in the nation) and was named the 2000 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. He has earned conference coach of the year honors seven times (1994, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2007, 2014 and 2023). Brockbank has also been named GCAA District VII Coach of the Year four times (1999, 2000, 2006 and 2007), and led the Cougars to NCAA Tournament 10 times, including a fourth place finish in 2005.

Brockbank was a member of the GCAA National Advisory Board from 2006-13 and served as the organizations president from 2010-11. He also served on the GCAA Division I All-America committee for four years and on the GCAA All-America Scholar/Team Academic Awards committee for 11 years. Brockbank has been a member of the NCAA Golf Committee since 2013.

Brockbank won the Utah State Amateur title in 1987, between his junior and senior years at BYU, and again in 1988 after completing his eligibility. He was named Utah Amateur Golfer of the Year in 1983 and again in 1988. A member of the PGA of America, Brockbank turned pro in 1989 and competed throughout the Utah area in sectional events.

A natural leader on and off the golf course, Coach Miller utilizes his experience and knowledge of the game as a coach for the Cougars.

Miller played four seasons for the Cougars and became the first player in the Bruce Brockbank era to achieve citations of All-American, Academic All-American and Academic All-Conference.

Miller grew up in Napa, Calif., where he played junior golf and won four Northern California Championships. He came to BYU as a highly touted recruit and played two solid seasons before leaving to serve an LDS Church mission in Chile. Soon after returning from his mission, Miller found himself leading the nationally ranked Cougars.

During his junior campaign, he led the Cougars in four events and was named

All-America Honorable Mention. He played a leading role in the Cougars' ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, where he placed 30th individually.

Miller continued his solid play throughout the summer following his junior season, reaching the finals of the Utah State Amateur. Entering a senior season in which the Cougars returned all of their players, Miller continued to contribute to the Cougars' success, garnering Academic All-America and Academic All-Conference honors.

"He's a great coach because he's always energized and helps us raise our level of intensity," former BYU Cougar Daniel Summerhays said about Miller. "He also helps us with our mental game out on the course. He's all about service to his players, and he probably pampers us more than he should."

Miller and his wife have four children.

Former BYU All-American and Academic All-American Todd Miller is the director of golf for both the men's and women's programs. He has served as the associate head golf coach after four years as the assistant men's golf coach at BYU.

In his first year as an assistant, Miller helped guide BYU to a 15th-place NCAA Championship finish and maintain a spot among the nation's Top 10 for the majority of the season. In his second season, he helped guide the Cougars to an MWC Championship and a Top-20 ranking throughout the season.

BYU AT THE WESTERN INTERCOLLEGIATE

Although this will only be BYU's fifth trip to the Western Intercollegiate since 2000, BYU has a rich history at the event.

The Cougars are the fourth winningest team in the history of the Western having won the event seven times in program history. ('68, '70, '71, '75, '76, '78, '81) BYU teams have also earned three runner-up finishes, 23 top 5s and have never finished outside the top 10 in 33 trips to Pasatiempo.

Six Cougars have also taken home the individual title at the Western including NBC golf announcer Johnny Miller (1968), four-time All-American Mike Brannan (1976), two-time Fred Haskins Award winner Bobby Clampett (1980), three-time All-American and 1981 national champion Rick Fehr (1982), Rafael Ponce (1989) and All-American and current head coach Bruce Brockbank (1988).

BYU senior Carson Lundell tied for 1st in the 2021 edition after shooting 5-under par (68-66-71-205). He followed that performance with a runner-up finish in 2022 after posting scored of 70-72-67-212 to finish 2-over-par.

1977 U.S. AMATEUR CHAMPION

On July 15, 2007 BYU's Daniel Summerhays (right) etched his name in the record books when he became the first amateur to win a Nationwide Tour event. The BYU junior calmly collected a two-stroke victory at the Nationwide Children's Hospital Invitational in Columbus, Ohio by shooting a final round two-under 69.



In the summer of 2005, BYU's Clay Ogden (left) claimed one of the biggest amateur victories in BYU golf history when he captured the U.S. Amateur Public Links Championship. His quarterfinal victory over Michelle Wie drew all the headlines and a spot on ESPN Sportscenter, but his championship come-from-behind victory was the most impressive. He rallied from a four-hole deficit after the first nine holes of the 36-hole final match to defeat Martin Ureta, 19, of Chile, 1 up, to win at Shaker Run Golf Club.
