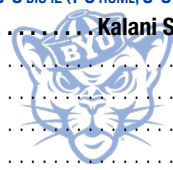

STORYLINES

THE SERIES. BYU and SMU are meeting for the fifth time in series and the first time in the regular season since 1997, with BYU owning a 4-0 record in the series. The two schools met recently at the 2022 New Mexico Bowl where the Cougars hung on for a 24-23 victory, stopping the Mustangs on a two-point conversion to secure the victory. The last time the two schools met in the regular season, BYU won 19-16 in OT.

HISTORIC. The two schools took part in one of the most historic comebacks in college football in the 1980 Holiday Bowl. Down 45-25, with just over 4 minutes remaining, BYU scored 21 points, culminating in a Hail Mary pass from Jim McMahon to Clay Brown. VS. THE ACC. SMU joined the Atlantic Coast Conference for the 2024 season. After winning the Athletic in 2023, the Mustangs now join the 17-team league. The Cougars have played 15 games previously against ACC teams (not including SMU) and are 6-9 overall.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS. The Cougars have played 11 regular-season Friday games under Kalani Sitake with a record of 8-4 in those contests. Last year, BYU defeated Cincinnati 35-27 for its first Big 12 victory. The Cougars have two Friday night contests scheduled in 2024 with SMU this week and Oklahoma State on Oct. 18.

YEAR TWO IN BIG 12. After its inaugural run in the Big 12 in 2023, BYU is anxious to take a step forward in year two as it continues to get used to life in a Power 4 Conference after more than a decade as an independent program. After a 2-7 finish in league play, it doesn't get any easier in 2024 as BYU gets the top five teams in the Big 12 Media Preseason Poll on the schedule, however it does include matchups with four of those at home. The Cougars play at No. 1 Utah and then host No. 2 Kansas State, No. 3 Oklahoma State, No. 4 Kansas and No. Arizona. Arizona State, Colorado and BYU are the only teams to play all of the top five teams from the Big 12's media poll.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE. Last season, BYU's schedule finished as the 11th-toughest in the Sagarin schedule rankings. College Football News ranked BYU's 2024 schedule No. 15 nationally and Sports Illustrated ranked it at No. 26. The 2024 schedule features five opponents ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25. The Cougars face No. 12 Utah, No. 17 Oklahoma State, No. 18 Kansas State, No. 21 Arizona and No. 22 Kansas. SMU, BYU's week two opponent is receiving votes in the poll. It is the first time the Cougars will face five preseason Top 25 teams in a regular season. BYU also gets matchups against eight teams who played in a bowl game in 2023 (SMU, Wyoming, Arizona, Oklahoma State, Kansas, Kansas State, UCF, Utah). SMU won the American Athletic Conference in 2023 before departing for the Atlantic Coast Conference and Oklahoma State played in the Big 12 Championship game. BYU's 2024 opponents had a combined record last year of 90-65 (.581) with the eight bowl teams earning a .679 winning percentage.

A basic transcript of Sitake's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided with additional player quotes upon availability. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews in-person as directed by site host.

THIS IS COUGAR COUNTRY

- Entering 2024, the Cougars rank **tied for No. 9 in total wins over the past 50 seasons, winning 431 games.** Only Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Georgia, Michigan, Nebraska, Penn State and Florida State have won more games.
- **BYU ranks No. 23 in bowl invitations with 40 games.**
- The Cougars have also spent 266 weeks in the Associated Press Top 25, tied for **No. 36 overall in college football.**
- BYU boasts **23 total conference championships** in its history, which **ranks tied No. 16 in college football.**
- Players at BYU have **won the Heisman Trophy (1), Maxwell Award (1), Doak Walker Award (1), Outland Trophy (2), Sammy Baugh (7) and Davey O'Brien Awards (4).**
- BYU has had **14 consensus All-Americans** and touts **seven College Football Hall of Fame members**, including legendary head coach LaVell Edwards.
- **BYU won the 1984 National Championship**, one of just 42 schools to claim a title.
- The Cougars have **17 players currently on NFL rosters.** Those 17 include **wide receiver Puka Nacua (Rams)**, who recently set the NFL's rookie records for receptions and receiving yards, and **Fred Warner (49ers)**, regarded as one of the league's best linebackers.
- **Kansas City head coach Andy Reid is also a BYU football alum (78-80)**, playing offensive line for the Cougars and getting his coaching start under LaVell Edwards. Reid is coming off of back-to-back Super Bowl rings, and three in the last five years. Reid is the NFL's active leader with 258 career regular-season wins, 26 postseason wins and is No. 4 in all-time wins in the NFL.



REMEMBERING LAVELL EDWARDS

Legendary BYU head football coach LaVell Edwards passed away Dec. 29, 2016 at the age of 86 surrounded by his wife Patti and their family.

Edwards, a coaching icon in college football, led the Cougars for 29 seasons from 1972 to 2000. He amassed 257 victories, which ranks eighth in NCAA Division I history. In addition, Edwards led BYU to the 1984 National Championship and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2004. Before Edwards, BYU had won just 173 games in over 49 seasons and had never been to a bowl game. Since Edwards, the Cougars have won 438 games and attended 40 bowl games.

Known for his stoic sideline demeanor and quick-witted humor, Edwards was once labeled by USA Today as a "national coaching treasure." Beloved not only in coaching circles and all of Cougar Nation, but especially by the many hundreds of players under his tutelage, including current head coach Kalani Sitake who was a fullback and team captain for the Cougars.



LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 62,073-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. In 2024, new seating renovations and other upgrades changed capacity to 62,073. It was renamed LaVell Edwards Stadium in 2000 at Coach Edwards' final home game of his career.

MARRIED PLAYERS

AVERAGE AGE

The average age of BYU's player is 21.5 years old entering the 2024 season. BYU's youngest player turned 18 in the summer just before the season started while its oldest is 27.

POLYNESIAN PIPELINE

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. More than 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. His staff includes Polynesians Fesi Sitake Harvey Unga, Justin Ena, Jack Damuni, Al Pupunu and Vince Feula.

FORMER PLAYERS ON STAFF

There are 17 former BYU football players on the football and athletic administration staff. Members of the staff were part of Cougar teams that won the 1980 "Miracle Bowl," the 1984 National Championship, 1996 Cotton Bowl along with many other accolades.

BYU'S HISTORY

The establishment of the Brigham Young Academy in 1875 offered an academically stimulating and gospel-oriented education to 29 students. The one-acre school grounds presided over by Karl G. Maeser have since developed into nearly 600 acres and more than 300 buildings. Today, BYU provides an outstanding education in an atmosphere consistent with the standards and principles of its sponsor, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The University is widely recognized for its deep commitments to inspired religious values and rigorous intellectual learning.

MISSIONS

Missionary service has been a staple within the BYU football program since its inception. There are 56 current BYU football players have served full-time, voluntary missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Each year, it is close to half of the team. While those within the Church understand the details of what a mission entails, they can be foreign to those not of the faith.

The Church’s missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Latter-day Saint missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities. Missions last 18 months to two years. They are voluntary and self-funded. BYU student-athletes who chose to serve missions do so out of a love for Jesus Christ and a desire to serve others. Some BYU student-athletes elect to fulfill their missionary service after they graduate high school and defer their enrollment to BYU. Others take a break from studying and competing at BYU and perform their missionary service partway through their time as a student-athlete. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent to countries all throughout the world where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Due in part to the many international missionary service experiences among BYU students, more than 60 percent of the BYU student body speaks a second language.

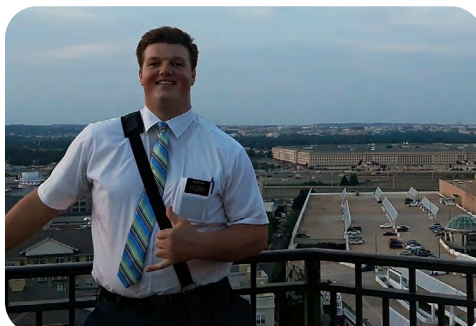

YEAR TWO IN THE BIG 12 CONFERENCE

BYU looks to take a step forward in year two in the Big 12 Conference. Year one was a learning experience with a 2-7 league record for the Cougars after finishing the Independence Era with a record of 99-56. The 99 wins tied for No. 18 in college football over those 11 seasons. After joining the conference last year along with Cincinnati, Houston and UCF, now the Big 12 grows in 2024 with Arizona, Arizona State, Utah and Colorado following the departure of Texas and Oklahoma.

BIG 12 BIOGRAPHY

The Big 12 enters its 29th year as one of the nation's premier conferences in college athletics under the leadership of Commissioner Brett Yormark. Since joining the Conference in August 2022, Yormark has elevated the Big 12 to new heights, emphasizing marketing, brand building and instilling an innovative strategy that has resonated across the college athletics landscape. Starting Aug. 2, 2024, the Conference is composed of 16 universities spanning 10 states and four time zones. The Big 12 members include Arizona, Arizona State, Baylor, BYU, UCF, Cincinnati, Colorado, Houston, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas Tech, Utah and West Virginia.

The Big 12 began play in 1996 and is the home of 87 team NCAA national championships, and 764 individual national champions. The Big 12 Conference office is located in Irving, Texas. The league sponsors 25 sports. Men's sports include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's sports include basketball, beach volleyball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, lacrosse, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball. The Conference currently conducts postseason championships for 24 of its 25 sports. The league has been home to more than 800 Academic All-America recipients.

Did You Know?

One observer said the 1980 Holiday Bowl between BYU and SMU was actually two ball games--a contest which lasted most of four quarters and another of four minutes duration. SMU controlled the "first game," leaving the Cougars behind 20 points with only minutes remaining. Unfortunately, many fans either turned off their TV sets or left the stadium in San Diego before the "second game" began. In the final four minutes, BYU surged to a stunning 46-45 win. For 56 minutes the Mustangs taught the Cougars a lesson in running the football. The Mustangs' two great running backs, Craig James and Eric Dickerson, rushed for a combined total of 335 yards. With 4:07 remaining in the game, SMU scored to go ahead, 45-25. From there the Cougars connected on a TD pass, recovered an on-side kick, scored on a one-yard run by Scott Phillips and blocked a punt. Finally, with three seconds left on the clock, Jim McMahon connected on a "Hail Mary" pass of 41 yards to Clay Brown.

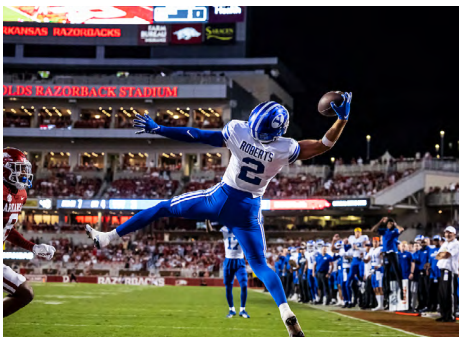

TEAM BY THE NUMBERS

- 27** BYU recorded 27 first downs against the Salukis in the opener. That number topped the 2023 season-high of 23 first downs at Kansas.
- 10** Ten different receivers caught balls for the Cougars on Saturday night. Last season, a total of 18 different players caught passes.
- 348** The Cougars 348 total passing yards were nine yards shy of the 2023 season high, 357, thrown against Kansas on the road. The 348 matched the output against FCS Southern Utah last season. Those two games were BYU's only 300-yard game in 2023.
- 527** BYU rolled up 527 yards of total offense against Southern Illinois. The Cougars did not top 400 yards of total offense in one game in 2023, hitting 394 as a season high against Southern Utah last season. 527 was the most since 676 against Utah Tech in 2022.
- 1** BYU's defense recorded their first interception against SIU with Jakob Robinson's interception. Last year the BYU defense had 14 interceptions, ranking No. 4 in the Big 12 and No. 19 nationally.
- 108** The Cougar defense only allowed 108 passing yards in the opener. That number ranks No. 19 overall after week one of college football. It is the fewest passing yards the team has allowed since 85 at Coastal Carolina in 2020.
- 7** BYU recorded seven tackles for loss against Southern Illinois. The seven stops behind the line of scrimmage ranked No. 44 overall and No. 5 in the Big 12 for the opening weekend.
- 77.2** The passing defense held SIU to an efficiency rating of just 77.2, good for the No. 17 mark nationally after week one.
- 39:14** BYU held the ball for 39:14 in the game against the Salukis. That led the Big 12 for the weekend and ranked No. 3 nationally. Last season, BYU averaged 28:19 per game.

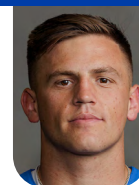

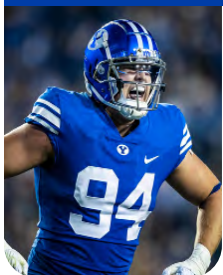

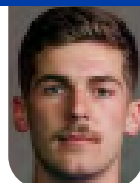

He was 2 for 2 against Oklahoma State, including a 42 and 48-yarder. Ferrin was 2 for 2 against Texas, Texas Tech and Kansas this year. He was 11 of 14 overall

50 Placekicker Will Ferrin connected on a career-long 50 yards field goal just before the half in BYU's season opener vs. Southern Illinois. His successful attempt could have been good from 60 yards. His 50-yard field goal is BYU's first make from 50 yards since Jake Oldroyd hit a 50-yarder versus San Diego State in 2020.

2 The Cougars played two punters, punting only twice, in BYU's season opener vs. Southern Illinois. Pittsburgh transfer Sam Vander Haar placed his only attempt 36 yards inside the 20-yard line, while Landon Rehkov delivered a 48-yard boot on his only kick, placed it out of bounds at the opponent's 21-yard line.

KALANI SITAKE - HEAD COACH

YEARS AT BYU: 9th year at BYU (61-41) **YEARS OVERALL:** 9th year as head coach, 24 years in coaching

kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay



Kalani Sitake (kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) enters his ninth season overseeing the BYU football program in 2024.

In his 24rd overall season as a coach, Sitake leads the program he once played for under legendary Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards. A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history and just the fourth since 1972, when Edwards took over the program. Sitake is the first former player under Edwards to be named head coach at BYU.

With a career record of 62-41, Sitake and his program moved from the ranks of FBS independents to join the Big 12 Conference in 2023 and look to take another step forward in 2024 in year two of the league.

During his tenure, Sitake has helped the Cougars achieve notable wins over Arkansas, Texas Tech, Baylor, Wisconsin, Michigan State, Mississippi State, Tennessee, USC, Utah, Arizona, Arizona State, Washington State and Boise State, among others. He has also championed BYU's Built4Life career development and NIL program. Built4Life is designed to support BYU student-athletes in developing critical life skills, facilitating professional development opportunities and connecting classroom learning directly to relevant employment opportunities.

During his coaching career, Sitake has helped his teams to 14 bowl games. Sitake has been on the winning side 11 times in bowl appearances, including a 4-2 mark as a head coach.

Named BYU's head coach on December 19, 2015, Sitake returned to his alma mater from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator in 2015 under head coach Gary Andersen. Sitake took the helm at BYU after 15 years in the college coaching profession, which included seven seasons serving as a defensive coordinator and four years as an assistant head coach.

Prior to Oregon State, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah under head coach Kyle Whittingham, also a former Cougar. Sitake started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012. While at Utah, Sitake coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014).

During his career, Sitake has helped mentor 33 NFL Draft picks, including 13 Cougars since taking over the program in 2016. Last year's draft saw left tackle Kingsley Suamataia selected by the Kansas City Chiefs. In 2023, three Cougars taken, including Blake Freeland (4th round), Jaren Hall (5th round) and Puka Nacua (5th round). Nacua earned All-Pro status while finishing as the Offensive Rookie of the Year runner-up after a record-breaking first season in the league. In 2022, running back Tyler Allgeier went to the Atlanta Falcons, where he set a Falcon's rushing record for a rookie with a 1,000-yard season. Allgeier followed the footsteps of other recent Cougar draft picks under Sitake, such as No. 2 overall pick Zach Wilson and offensive tackle Brady Christensen among five players drafted in the 2021, linebackers Sione Takitaki and Fred Warner in 2019 and 2018 and running back Jamaal Williams in 2017. Among their many accomplishments, Williams, BYU's all-time rushing leader, also rushed for more than 1,000 yards in 2022 while leading the NFL in rushing touchdowns, while Warner again earned All-Pro honors being widely regarded as one of the top linebackers in the NFL.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002 under Gary Crowton. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

He began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards. A team captain as a senior, Sitake's last game as a player was also the last game coached by the legendary Edwards, who was a great mentor for Sitake.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake is the nation's first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. Sitake and his wife Timberly have four children.

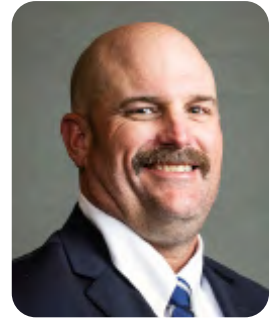
