FIRST SERVE (TL;DR)

- CU is led by ninth-year head coach **Jesse Mahoney**, who has led the Buffs to a **135-114 (.542)** record as CU's fifth head volleyball coach. Coach Mahoney has been extended through 2027 and has led the Buffs to three NCAA appearances.
- For the first time since the 2010 season, Colorado are playing volleyball in the Big 12 Conference. The Buffs are **146-154 (.487)** in Big 12 conference play and **18-20 (.474)** all-time in conference openers.
- Colorado will face its first ranked opponent since Nov. 17, 2023; a 3-0 home loss to No. 11 Washington State. The last time CU beat a ranked opponent on the road was Nov. 18, 2022; a 3-0 win over No. 21 Washington. The last time the Buffs defeated a ranked opponent at home was Oct. 22, 2023; a 3-0 win over No. 17 Arizona State.
- **Sr. S Taylor Simpson** has reached 472 assists this season (2,451 in her career) and is currently averaging 9.63 assists per set.
- **So. MB Cayla Payne** has 51.0 blocks on the season (122 in her career) and averaging 1.04 blocks per set.
- The Buffs match against CSU on Friday (Sept. 20) marked **Jr. MB Bella Simkus**'s third match in a row with zero hitting errors.

COLORADO VOLLEYBALL HEAD COACH JESSE MAHONEY



Jesse Mahoney, who has led the Buffs to three NCAA appearances, is in his ninth season (2024) as head coach of the Colorado volleyball team. He was named head coach on Dec. 17, 2015, after coaching previously at Denver University.

Under his leadership, Mahoney's Buff teams have produced a **135-114 (.542)** record. In 2022, Colorado went 20-11 and was 12-8 in the Pac-12 to finish fifth in the regular season standings, and the Buffs made it to the NCAA First Round. Previously, in 2019, Mahoney brought the PrepVolleyball.com 10th-ranked volleyball class to CU with eight new players. In 2018, Colorado made an NCAA First Round appearance, going 18-14 on the season and 10-10 in conference. In 2017 -- Mahoney's second season coaching Colorado -- the Buffs made their first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance since 1997 and won over 23 games for the first time since 1993 with a 24-10 overall record (12-8 Pac-12). In 2016, the Buffs went 14-15 in Mahoney's debut season.

In addition to the team's success, several Buffs had outstanding individual seasons. Junior outside hitter Alexa Smith became CU's first AVCA Second Team All-American and was also named to the AVCA All-Pacific South Region and All-Pac-12 Teams.

Freshman setter Brynna DeLuzio had one of the best freshman seasons for a Buff, earning AVCA All-America honorable mention honors in addition to the VolleyballMag.com All-Freshman Team and PrepVolleyball.Com All-Freshman Second Team. DeLuzio was the first Buff to earn the AVCA Pacific South Region Freshman of the Year award and was also selected to the AVCA all-region honorable mention team. She was a Pac-12 All-Freshman Team honoree and earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention honors.

Three other Buffs earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention status: junior middle blocker Naghede Abu, senior right side hitter Joslyn Hayes and junior outside hitter Frankie Shebby. After the conclusion of the 2023 season, rising sophomore outside hitter Lily Dwinell was named to the Pac-12 All-Freshman Team.

Prior to coming to CU, Mahoney spent the previous four seasons at the University of Denver, where he guided the Pioneers to an 88-41 mark, including back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2015). The Pioneers finished with a 27-8 mark this past fall after falling to No. 5 Washington in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. In 2014, DU was 27-7, its season ending in the first round of the tournament, on that occasion to No. 13 Colorado State, also in the first round. The Pioneers accumulated a 46-18 conference mark with Mahoney at the helm, winning the Summit League regular season championship the last two seasons with identical 13-3 league records; Denver also claimed the postseason tournament title both years. The 2014 crown was the school's first in the sport after joining the league in 2013, in which Mahoney coached the Pioneers to a 10-4 league mark and runner-up finishes in both the regular season and the postseason tourney. That team was 17-13 overall, as was his first team at DU in 2012, when the Pioneers were members of the Western Athletic Conference (with a 10-8 mark in conference play).

While at Denver, Mahoney coached 17 all-conference selections, including a pair of 2014 AVCA Division I Honorable Mention All-Americans. His 2014 recruiting class was tabbed No. 28 by PrepVolleyball.com. Nationally, the Pioneers' offense was ranked in the top 25 in hitting efficiency three times (2013-15) and this fall the defense cracked the top 25 in opponent hitting efficiency.

Prior to his success at DU, Mahoney served as an assistant coach at Colorado State (2005-11), including four as the associate head coach. In his time under head coach Tom Hilbert, the Rams participated in seven consecutive NCAA Tournaments and won five Mountain West titles. CSU compiled a 162-51 record during his time on the staff. While with the Rams, he helped to assemble three recruiting classes ranked in the top 25 by PrepVolleyball.com. His primary responsibility in practice was working with the middle blockers and CSU was ranked nationally in the top 10 in blocking five of his seven seasons. He tutored two All-American middle blockers as well as multiple All-Conference and All-Region performers.

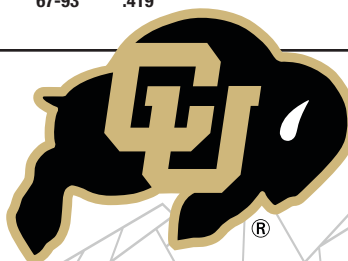
Mahoney joined the staff at CSU after six seasons as the head coach at Fort Hays State, where the Tigers recorded a 107-82 overall record under his direction. FHSU tallied an impressive 56-12 record over his last two years there (2003-04), which included a 31-5 mark and No. 11 final national ranking in 2004.

His first varsity coaching position was as an assistant coach at Colorado Christian, which followed his first foray into the profession -- the head coach of the CU men's club volleyball team from 1995-98. Mahoney has also coached in the club circuit as a member of the Front Range Volleyball Club, guiding the 18-Black to the 1998 USA Junior Rocky Mountain Region title.

Mahoney, a Boulder native, is no stranger to the University of Colorado, having earned a bachelor's degree in Psychology in 1995 and a Juris Doctorate degree from CU's Law School in 1999. He is married to the former Gwen McEntyre and the couple has three children: Macy, Griffin and Declan.

ROAM WITH THE BUFFS: Both Buff road matches will be broadcast on ESPN+. Fans also can follow Colorado matches through live stats with links available at CUBuffs.com.

LAST TIME OUT: Colorado split its two matches last week in its annual home-and-home series against CSU (Sept. 19-20). Though the Buffs recorded a 3-1 loss at home on Friday, they soared over the Rams on their home turf with a 3-1 win of their own.

THE BUFFS RETURN: For the first time since the 2010 season, Colorado are playing volleyball in the Big 12 Conference. The Buffs are **146-154 (.487)** in Big 12 conference play and had an 88-32 (.733) record in the Big Eight. Colorado's two conference championships came in the Big Eight in 1992 and again in 1993 when the Buffs defeated eighth-ranked Nebraska in a five-set thriller.

PERFECT 10: Colorado was picked to finish 10th in a preseason poll of Big 12 Volleyball head coaches. Last season, in the Pac-12, the Buffs were chosen to finish sixth and went 8-12 to take seventh place in the final standings. Colorado is **18-20 (.474)** all-time in conference openers.

MILESTONE WATCH: So. OH Ana Burilović currently sits at 194 career digs, six away from 200, and 47 career aces, three away from 50. She also has 278 career kills, 22 away from 300. So. OH Sydney Jordan sits at 97 digs on the season, three away from 100. So. OPP Lily Dwinell currently has 275 career-kills, 25 away from 300. Jr. DS/L Sarah Morton currently has 911 career-digs (including her digs from Auburn).

MILESTONE CHECK: So. DS/L Avery Bolles surpassed 100 digs on the season, ending the weekend with 102 and reached 139 in her career. Sr. S Taylor Simpson reached 100 career kills over the CSU matches. So. OPP Lily Dwinell recorded her 100th block.

DOUBLE OR NOTHING: So. OH Sydney Jordan recorded her second double-double of the season against CSU (Sept. 20), her second of her career, with 11 digs and 10 kills.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME: In a nine-match span from Sept. 6 - Sept. 20, Colorado played eight out of those matches times at home in CU Events Center. In all, Colorado will play 17 of its 30 regular season matches at Events Center, and it hosted both Buffs Classic (Georgia, Fresno State, Washington) Sept. 6 - 8 and Buffs Invitational (UC Irvine, California, Wyoming) Sept. 13 - 15 to open the fall. Between those two tournaments, the Buffs played Northern Colorado on Sept. 11, and the annual home-and-home with nonconference rival Colorado State followed Buffs Invitational on Sept. 19 and 20. The Buffs went 5-4 in this nine match span.

FIVE-SET FUN FACT: With its win over UC Irvine on Friday, Sept. 13, Colorado played its fifth five-set match of the season. This is the most five-set matches played in the first 10 matches of the season in CU Volleyball history.

AT YOUR SERVICE: So. DS/L Avery Bolles was the Buffs serving specialist in 2023, ending her freshman season with 52 aces. This includes a career-high five at Colorado State (Sept. 15) which she matched a week later against Utah (Sept. 21).

FANTASTIC FOUR: The Buffs welcomed four freshmen to the squad this season in DS/L Katie Salonga (Pleasanton, Calif./Foothill HS), OH Gwen Schiff (Urbana, Ill./Urbana HS), MB Maria Sptawska (Stezyca, Poland/GKS Wiezyca 2011 Stezyca) and MB Tatum Johnson (Laguna Beach, Calif./JSerra Catholic HS).

MIDWEST MAYHEM: Five Buffs hail from Midwestern states. DS/L Emma Torstenson and DS/L Avery Bolles are each from Minnesota, OH Kendall Meller and DS/L Sarah Morton each from Indiana, and OH Gwen Schiff is from Illinois.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN': Another six Buffs are from the Golden State. S Taylor Simpson (Calabasas), MB Tatum Johnson (Laguna Beach), OH Annelise Rising (Pasadena), OH Lily Dwinell (San Clemente) and MB Cayla Payne (Carlsbad) are all from Southern California. DS/L Katie Salonga (Pleasanton) is the only Buff from the Bay Area.

NEW HORIZONS: Colorado returns one core starter in Sr. S Taylor Simpson for the 2024 season, who saw action in 30 matches and started all but one. So. OH Ana Burilović and So. MB Cayla Payne each started 17 matches for the Buffs last fall.

BUFF BIG LEAGUERS: The Buffs currently have 21 former players on professional volleyball teams. The two most recent additions were on the Buffs' 2023 team: Lexi Hadrych, who signed with Terville-Florange in

France, and Skyy Howard, who now plays for UYBA Volley Busto Arsizio in Italy.

MISS ALABAMA: Junior DS/L Sarah Morton recently joined the Buffs as a transfer from Auburn. She totaled 773 digs, 192 assists and 42 aces for the Tigers, and is on trend to hit 1,000 career digs this season with the Buffaloes.
