### ARIZONA NOTES & NUMBERS

» The Arizona Wildcats travel to face the BYU Cougars. FOX will have the broadcast with Gus Johnson (Play-by-play), Joel Klatt (Analyst), and Jenny Taft (Sideline) providing the commentary. FOX pregame show Big Noon Kickoff will have coverage live in Provo, Utah prior to the game.

» This is the 26th all-time meeting between the two schools dating back to 1936. Arizona and BYU are tied in the all-time series 12-12-1 with BYU winning the last three matchups. Arizona is 3-4 all-time in Provo.

» BYU is 4-1 over the last five games and 7-3 over the last 10 games with a three-game winning streak matching the longest winning streak in the series for BYU.

» Arizona owns the longest winning streak in the series, four games from 1970-1973.

» Arizona defeated No. 10 Utah, 23-10, two weeks ago, marking the first win over an AP Top 25 opponent for Head Coach Brent Brennan. It was the first loss for Utah to an unranked team at home since falling 21-7 to Washington on Sept. 15, 2018.

» That game also marked the Wildcats first road win at Utah since 2014. Arizona has won back-to-back games over Utah for the first time since rattling off four straight victories from 2012-14.

» In the season-opening 61-39 win over New Mexico, Tetairoa McMillan became the first player in FBS history to have a game with 10-plus receptions, 300-plus receiving yards, 30.0-plus yards per reception, and 4-plus receiving TD (per OptaSTATS).

Wide receiver Tetairoa McMillan's **ten** 100-yard performances are the fourth most in program history; he is one 100-yard game away from tying Mike Thomas (2005-08) and Juron Criner (2008-11) for third all-time with 11 career 100-yard receiving games.

McMillan improved his career receiving yards total to 2,768 and is now just **91** yards shy of moving past Juron Criner (2,859 yards, 2008-11) for fourth all-time.

McMillan currently leads the Big 12 Conference and ranks fifth among all FBS players with **664** receiving yards.

Tyler Loop set a program record with **five** made field goals against Texas Tech. He finished the night 5-for-6 on FG attempts. There were nine previous four FG performances before Loop's record-breaking night.

Loop has **299** career points, the fourth most in program history. He is 14 points shy of passing Ka'Deem Carey (312 points, 2011-13) for third all-time.

**INTERVIEW REQUESTS**

The Arizona Athletics Communication Services office will make every attempt to fulfill phone interview requests for media members. Interview requests for head coach Brent Brennan, Arizona players, and Arizona Football staff members should be directed to **Jeff Bowe** ([jeffb1@arizona.edu](mailto:jeffb1@arizona.edu)). Please submit requests well in advance to allow time for an interview to be scheduled. However, some requests may not be granted based on academic schedules and other team responsibilities. All in-season player availability will be on Tuesdays.

**WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCES**

Head Coach Brent Brennan is available twice weekly at press conferences each Monday and Thursday of game weeks during the regular season. Press conferences begin at approximately **11:20 AM MST** in the east concourse press conference room. A live web stream and archive of the press conferences are both available on the Arizona Athletics YouTube channel, accessible at [YouTube.com/@ArizonaWildcats](http://YouTube.com/@ArizonaWildcats).

**PRACTICES**

The first 30 minutes of in-season practices are open to media on Tuesdays and Wednesdays only. All interviews with Coach Brennan and student-athletes will take place on Monday (coach), Tuesday (offensive players), Wednesday (defensive players), and Thursday (coach) afternoons in the east concourse press conference room. Contact **Jeff Bowe** or **Brett Gleason** for more specific information on the weekly availability throughout the season.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

Arizona has a closed locker room policy after games. There is no player availability on the field immediately after the game. Head coach Brent Brennan will address the assembled media only after his postgame radio show responsibilities have been completed both at home and on the road. At home games, Coach Brennan will hold a postgame press conference in the east concourse press conference room. Selected offensive and defensive players will also be available after games. For road games, each locker room situation will dictate postgame protocol. Please direct any specific requests for players to **Jeff Bowe** and **Brett Gleason** with the UA Communication Services staff.

**FACILITIES ACCESS FOR MEDIA**

The team locker room, practice sites, sports medicine center and strength and conditioning center are off limits to media unless special arrangements have been made through **Jeff Bowe**.

**PHOTO/VIDEO USAGE**

Usage of imagery, audio and video taken at Arizona Athletics events is restricted to editorial purposes; these guidelines are covered in materials issued to reporters, editors and photographers upon receipt of credentials and/or access. They include guidelines on live Internet reporting, notably live description of statistics and/or play-by-play and uses of visual imagery — rules strengthened for televised games.

**AGAINST BYU:** The Arizona Wildcats (3-2, 1-1 Big 12) travel to face the BYU Cougars (5-0, 2-0 Big 12). This is the 26th all-time meeting dating back to 1936. Arizona and BYU are tied in the all-time series 12-12-1 with BYU winning the last three matchups. Arizona is 3-4 all-time in Provo and 8-6-1 at home. The Cougars and Wildcats have played three neutral site games and Arizona holds a 1-2 record in those matchups. BYU is 4-1 over the last five games and 7-3 over the last 10 games with a three-game winning streak matching the longest winning streak in the series for BYU. Arizona owns the longest winning streak in the series, four games from 1970-1973. The last time these teams faced off was Sept. 4, 2021, at Allegiant Stadium. The Wildcats fell 24-16 and in that game quarterback Gunner Cruz completed 34-of-45 passes for 336 yards and one touchdown. Runningback Michael Wiley rushed for 64 yards on 15 carries and receiver Stanley Berryhill III made 12 receptions for a team-leading 102 yards. BJ Casteel reeled in the only touchdown pass for the Wildcats in the loss. Berryhill III set a then career-high in receptions with 12 and receiving yards with 102. At that time, he was the first Wildcat to eclipse 100 receiving yards in a game since Tayvian Cunningham in the 2020 season opener vs. USC.

**LAST GAME:** Tahj Brooks ran for 128 yards and three touchdowns. Jacob Rodriguez forced a late fumble and Texas Tech rallied after blowing a 15-point lead to beat Arizona 28-22 on Saturday night. Texas Tech (5-1, 3-0 Big 12) got consistent pressure on Arizona quarterback Noah Fifita, forcing him to get rid of the ball quickly or throw it away. The Red Raiders also intercepted two of his passes and forced a turnover on downs deep in their own end while building an 18-3 halftime lead. The Wildcats' defense kept them within reach, forcing two Brooks' fumbles to take a 19-18 lead early in the fourth quarter. After Arizona's Tyler Loop missed a 48-yard field goal, Texas Tech finally found a rhythm, setting up Gino Garcia's 41-yard field goal for a 21-19 lead. Arizona (3-2, 1-1) took over at its own 25 with 2:21 left, but Rodriguez stripped Tetairoa McMillan on the first play and the Red Raiders recovered. Brooks then burst 32 yards up the middle for a touchdown, sending Texas Tech to its fourth straight win since losing to Washington State the second game of the season. Brooks scored on a 3-yard run in the first quarter and the Red Raiders spent the rest of the half shutting down the Wildcats. Texas Tech held Arizona to a field goal late in the first quarter, then stopped the Wildcats on fourth-and-1 at the Red Raiders' 20. Texas Tech's Quincy Ledet intercepted a pass by Fifita that was tipped at the line of scrimmage and Brooks followed with his second TD run, from nine yards out. Fifita had another pass intercepted by CJ Baskerville in the end zone late in the second quarter and Texas Tech marched quickly down the field for Garcia's last-second 30-yard field goal to lead 18-3. Arizona moved into Texas Tech's end twice in the third quarter - the second after a fumble by Brooks at the 32 - and had to settle for two more field goals. The Wildcats finally broke through when Quali Conley scored on a 3-yard run and forced another Boyd fumble - after a review overturned the original call - to set up Loop's 37-yard field goal for a 19-18 lead.

Select weeks throughout the season, Big Noon Kickoff will host a three-hour special. For these shows, the tailgate will begin an hour earlier at 7:30AM Eastern and the show will go live at 9AM Eastern. Watch Big Noon Kickoff every Saturday at 10am ET on FOX. Fiesta Bowl. The Wildcats held the Utes to just 10 points, marking the fewest first half points by Utah since scoring seven against Northwestern at the 2023 Las Vegas Bowl. Ten points is Utah's lowest scoring output against a conference team since losing 6-35 to Oregon in 2023. Arizona limited the Texas Tech offense to 28 points, the Red Raiders average 39.33 points per game this season. Texas Tech managed just 14 first downs in the contest, threw two interceptions, and fumbled twice. The Wildcats held the Red Raiders to 2-of-11 on third down conversion attempts. The Wildcats defense held the Red Raiders to just 118 rushing yards, their lowest output on the ground since going for 110 yards against then No. 7 Texas in 2023. The Wildcats are tied for 16th nationally in fourth down conversion defense (3-for-9, .333).

- Kicker Tyler Loop set a school record with five made field goals. He finished the night 5-for-6 and connected on field goals of 47, 40, 30, 37, and 52 yards. He has made 8 of his last 10 field goal attempts.
Loop has 299 career points, the fourth most in program history. He is 14 points shy of passing Ka'Deem Carey (312 points, 2011-13) for third all-time.
WR Tetairoa McMillan recorded the tenth 100-yard receiving game of his career and finished with 161 receiving yards on eight receptions.
McMillan improved his career receiving yards total to 2,768 and is now just 91 yards shy of moving past Juron Criner (2,859 yards, 2008-11) for fourth all-time.
McMillan's ten 100-yard performances are the fourth most in program history; he is one 100-yard games away from tying Mike Thomas (2005-08) and Juron Criner (2008-11) for third all-time with 11 career 100-yard receiving games.
DL Stanley Ta'ufo'ou recorded the third sack of his career on Saturday night, and now boasts sacks in back-to-back games.
DB Genesis Smith logged a pair of pass breakups against Texas Tech, a career high.

TOUGH LOSS: Arizona's loss to Texas Tech is the Wildcats' first loss to an unranked team since the Mississippi State game last year. First loss to an unranked opponent at home since Washington State in 2022. It was the first home loss in over a year for the Wildcats (Last: No. 7 Washington, 31-24). The Wildcats are 10-2 in their last 12 games dating back to last season.

THE TRE WAY: Arizona defensive lineman Tre Smith is third nationally in hurries, getting after the quarterback 18 times so far through three games this season (Per PFF). Smith joined the Wildcats prior to the 2024 season as a transfer from San Jose State. Smith has recorded 112 total tackles (53 solo, 59 ast) over 29 games. He has 11-career sacks and 19.5 tackles for loss combined between Arizona and San Jose State. He is 17th in the Big 12 in tackles for loss (4.5).

WE'RE BREAKING UP: Defensive back Tacario Davis recorded five pass breakups during last Saturday's game at Utah. He is tied for first in the Big 12 with five pass breakups. Davis has 22 total passes defended in his career. As a unit, the Arizona defense logged a season-high eight pass breakups, with Davis contributing five on his own. Arizona's eight PBU at Utah were their most since logging nine against Southern Utah in 2018, while Davis' five PBU were tied for the most in a single game by a Wildcat since 2007.

MAKING MANU: Linebacker Jacob Manu once again leads the Wildcats in tackles with 41 (18 solo, 23 ast) so far this season. Manu is 10th in the Big 12 in total tackles,



averaging 8.2 per game which is 5th in the Big 12.

**RUNNING CATS:** The Wildcats rushed for 161 total yards at Utah with Kedrick Reescano (74 yards) and Quali Conley (75 yards) combining for 149 of those yards. It was the third of four games that the Wildcats have rushed for more than 160 yards combined on offense. Arizona has rushed for 282 yards over the last two games against Utah (161) and Texas Tech (121). The Wildcats averaged 5.4 yards per carry against Utah and 4.0 yards per carry against Texas Tech.

**RISE OF QUALI:** Running back Quali Conley recorded his first 100-plus yard rushing game with Arizona (112 vs. NAU, 9/7), and since he rushed for 155 yards against San Diego State on 11/18/23. Conley broke off a 58-yard rush on Arizona’s first drive of the game, marking his longest rush with the Wildcats and the second longest of his career (Longest: 68 yards vs. New Mexico, 10/14/23). Conley matched his career-high in receptions with five against NAU (9/7) (2x; last: vs. Air Force, 9/22/23).

**BIG RANKED WIN:** Saturday was the Wildcats first road win at Utah since 2014. They have now won back-to-back games over Utah for the first time since rattling off four straight victories from 2012–14. Arizona now boasts nine wins while unranked over AP Top 10 ranked teams in the last 20 seasons. Arizona picked up its second road win versus a top 10 opponent in the last 10 seasons. (Won at #9 UCLA in 2022). The 23-10 win over No. 10 Utah on Saturday, Sept. 28, was the first win over an AP Top 25 program for head coach Brent Brennan. The 23-10 victory for Arizona is the first loss for Utah to an unranked team at home since falling to Washington 21-7 on Sept. 15, 2018.

**QB 1:** Quarterback Noah Fifita continues to climb up the Arizona passing record charts with another outstanding performance to open the 2024 season, throwing for 422 yards and four touchdowns. In 16 of 20 games played over his career, Fifita has finished with a completion percentage above 60%. He has thrown more than one interception in any single game once in his collegiate career, 2 vs. Texas Tech on Oct. 5, 2024. Fifita's career-completion percentage is 67.8% (360-531) for 4,358 yards and 33 touchdowns, which leads the program history by one percent over Nick Foles (66.8%, 360-for-531). Fifita has surpassed the 1,000-yard passing mark through four games with 1,361 yards this season. He has thrown seven touchdowns and six interceptions. Fifita recorded 301 passing yards, which are the second-most in a single game this season (1st; 422 vs. New Mexico). It was the second time this year that he passed for more than 300 yards in a single game.

**ON A LOOP:** Tyler Loop has led the program in multiple kicking records, first the most consecutive extra-points made (115) and he is chasing down the top-career field goal percentage (84.85%, 56 of 66) in program history. Loop is chasing the record for the most consecutive games with a made field goal (24) in program history. He is fourth in career-scoring in program history (283; 2022-present). Loop is currently 14th in career-field goal percentage. (.847%) in college football history, which is third among active kickers in FBS (1st; Jonah Dalmás, 88.3% - Boise State), (2nd; Kenneth Almendares, .850 - Louisiana), ahead of last year's Lou Groza Award winner Graham Nicholson (Alabama, 83.6%). Loop was a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2023. He booted a career-long 54-yarder against New Mexico on Aug. 31. He also made two-of-three field goal attempts against NAU, booting a long of 48 yards against the Lumberjacks. Arizona's all-time leading scorer, Max Zendejas, was the honorary captain prior to the NAU game. Loop made a 53-yarder among three made field goals at Utah in the 23-10 win. **WELCOME TO THE BIG 12:** The Arizona Wildcats embark on a new journey in a new conference after joining the Big 12 in Aug. 2024. The Wildcats end an era of Pac-10/12 that began in 1978 and finished with a 277-256-7 record, including a 171-202-6 Conference record over 45 years in the conference. The legendary Dick Tomey led the Wildcats through 13 years of the Pac-10/12 Conference and recorded the most wins of any head coach in program history (95).

**THE CATS ATTACK:** The Wildcats recorded 627 yards of total offense in the season-opening win over New Mexico on Aug. 31. It marked the most since recording 673 (178 rush, 495 pass) against Colorado in 2022. The offensive output tied for 8th in program history (627; California, Sept. 20, 2014). Despite the loss, the Wildcats recorded 422 total yards of offense against Texas Tech (10/5), outgaining the Red Raiders 422 to 331. It marked the first time this season that the Wildcats have outgained their opponent and lost the game.

**LOOP NAMED BIG 12 SPECIAL TEAMS POTW:** Arizona kicker Tyler Loop earns Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors, as announced today by the conference.





Loop made a program record five of six field goal attempts with kicks of 47, 40, 30, 37, and 52 yards to score 15 of the Wildcats 22 points against Texas Tech on Saturday. This is the first Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honor for Loop and he is the third Wildcat to earn a conference weekly honor this season. Arizona has had a player earn a Big 12 Player of the Week honor in back-to-back weeks with Tacario Davis taking home the Defensive Player of the Week accolade after the 23-10 win over Utah in Week 5. The senior from Lucas, Texas set a new Arizona Football program record with five made field goals and has made eight of his last 10 field goal attempts. Loop booted five of six kickoffs into the end zone and made one extra point. Loop has 299 career points, the fourth most in program history. He is 14 shy of passing Ka'Deem Carey (312 points, 2011-13) for third all-time. He is third among active FBS kickers in career-field goal percentage (84.7%, 61-of-72).

**WILDCATS IN THE NFL:** Arizona currently has 10 players on NFL rosters during the 2024 season. Former offensive lineman Jordan Morgan was selected by the Green Bay Packers in the first round (25th overall) following the 2023 season. He was the first first-round selection since Antoine Cason was picked 27th overall in 2008. He joined a list that includes Cason (2008; 27th, San Diego), Trung Canidate (2000; 31st, St. Louis), Chris McAlister (1999; 10th, Baltimore), John Fina (1992; 27th, Buffalo), Chris Singleton (1990; 8th, New England), Anthony Smith (1990; 11th, Oakland), Rickey Hunley (1984; 7th, Cincinnati), Mike Dawson (1976; 22nd, Arizona), Bill Lueck (1968; 26, Green Bay), and Walt Nelson (1939; 10th, New York Giants) to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft. Wide receiver Jacob Cowing was picked in the fourth round (135th overall) by the San Francisco 49ers and became the highest wide receiver selected since Mike Thomas in 2009 (4th Rd, 107 overall by Jacksonville) and the first wide receiver since Juron Criner (5th Rd, 168th overall by Oakland) in 2012. Tight End Tanner McLachlan was the third Wildcat selected in the 2024 NFL Draft when the Cincinnati Bengals picked him the 6th round (194 overall). The three draft picks matched the most selected in one draft since 2014 when Ka'Deem Carey (4th Rd, 117 overall), Shaquille Richardson (5th Rd, 157th overall), and Marquis Flowers (6th Rd, 212 overall) were picked in the 2014 NFL Draft.

**LAS VEGAS (AP)** — Quarterback Jaren Hall accumulated 243 total yards and two touchdowns as BYU defeated Arizona 24-16 at Allegiant Stadium on Saturday night in the season opener for both teams.

Hall, the redshirt sophomore from Spanish Fork, Utah, made his third career start and first in the post-Zach Wilson era. Hall went 18-of-28 passing for 198 yards with two touchdowns for the Cougars, who won have won 12 of their last 13 games.

Hall also added one catch for nine yards and 36 yards on the ground, including a 39-yard dash down the left sideline that set up his second touchdown pass.

BYU's Neil Pau'u caught eight passes for 126 yards and both of Hall's touchdown passes.

Arizona, which played its first nonconference game in 721 days, lost its 13th consecutive game dating to 2019. It was also the debut for Wildcats coach Jedd Fisch, the former quarterbacks coach for the New England Patriots. Fisch replaced Kevin Sumlin, who went 0-5 in 2020.

Gunner Cruz was 34-for-45 passing for 336 yards with a touchdown and an interception as the Arizona starter. Cruz split time with Will Plummer, who amassed only nine yards passing on three attempts before Cruz finished the game.

THE TAKEAWAY

BYU: Even as the designated road team, the BYU contingent traveled well to Allegiant Stadium. The Cougars benefited greatly from a heavy blue-clad crowd after a slow start in the first quarter, when they had just 69 yards of offense.

Arizona: Despite going 2 for 2 on fourth down in the first half, the Wildcats only mustered three points. Lucas Havrisik missed two of three field goals, a 31-yard attempt in the second quarter and a 44-yarder in the third.

A former wide receiver during his playing days, Brennan has long been regarded as an exceptional offensive mind. Players recruited and coached by Brennan litter the San José State receiving record books, while his time at Oregon State from 2001-15 included the mentorship of numerous standouts highlighted by 2013 Biletnikoff Award winner Brandin Cooks.

Prior to his second stint in San José, Brennan logged six seasons coaching wide receivers at Oregon State where he and the offensive staff fielded some of the most dangerous offenses in the country. The Beavers passing attack was explosive and relentless, ranking top 20 nationally in 2011 (19th), 2012 (20th), and 2013 (3rd).

Brennan also logged time with Cal Poly (2001-04) as an assistant coach. He opened his coaching career with Woodside High School in California before securing a trio of one-year graduate assistant positions at Hawai'i (1998), Washington (1999), and Arizona (2000).

His playing career spanned five seasons at UCLA as a wide receiver, where he lettered as part of the Bruins 1993 Rose Bowl team. Brennan earned a degree in history from UCLA in 1996.

Brennan and his wife Courtney are the proud parents to two daughters, Blake and Casey, and one son, Scott.

Brent Brennan became the next Head Coach of Arizona Football in January of 2024. Brennan enters his first season following seven seasons leading the San José State University football program where he steered the Spartans to three bowl game appearances and earned 2020 Mountain West Coach of the Year.

Brennan, 51, is an experienced leader in college football who enjoyed two stints coaching under legendary Arizona head coach Dick Tomey, the winningest coach in program history. The San José native first learned under Tomey with the Wildcats as a graduate assistant in 2000, and again from 2005-09 at SJSU as an assistant coach. The ties between Brennan and the University of Arizona run deep, with Brent's brother Bradley playing five years as a wide out in Tucson under Tomey, and Brent's wife Courtney being an alumna of the University.

Among a multitude of accomplishments at San José State, Brennan became the first head coach in SJSU history to lead the Spartans to three bowl games in a four-year span. He also steered SJSU to back-to-back winning seasons in 2022 and 2023, marking the first time it had been accomplished by the Spartans since the 1991-92 campaigns.

Throughout Brennan's lengthy and accomplished career, he helped develop five All-Americans and 19 Professional Football players, including six who enjoyed NFL careers of five-plus seasons.

The 2023 season at San José State saw Brennan's Spartans charge down the final stretch of the season, winning six consecutive conference games to close out the regular season and earn a bowl berth. During that six-game stretch Brennan's offense averaged over 38 points per game while the defense held opponents to a meager 17.8 points per game. SJSU's offensive efforts were fueled by ball security, turning the ball over just 10 times, the best mark in the Mountain West and the ninth best in the nation. The trend was continued from the 2022 campaign in which the Spartans led the country with only six turnovers on offense and a +12 turnover margin that led the MWC.

Across time as a coach and player, Brennan has been part of nine teams that reached bowl games including in each of the last two years at San José State. The highlight of his SJSU tenure was a remarkable 7-1 campaign in 2020 that secured the Spartans their first Mountain West Conference championship and the school's first outright conference championship since topping the Big West in 1990.

Since that impressive 2020 season under Brennan's leadership, the Spartans have posted a 20-10 record against Mountain West competition and went 26-19 overall.

Brennan twice had the opportunity to learn from Dick Tomey, first as a graduate assistant at Arizona in 2000 and again as an assistant coach at San José State from 2005-09. His crossover with Tomey at SJSU included the Spartans impressive 9-4 campaign in 2006 that concluded with a victory over the University of New Mexico in the New Mexico Bowl. That 2006 season orchestrated by Tomey and Brennan still stands as one of just 14 nine-plus win seasons in SJSU history.

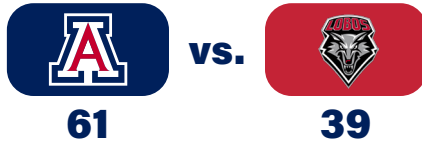

**RECAP**

**TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) —** Tetairoa McMillan had a school-record 304 yards receiving and matched another with four touchdown catches - all from Noah Fifita - and No. 21 Arizona opened coach Brent Brennan's first season with a 61-39 win over New Mexico on Saturday night.

The Wildcats (1-0) put on an offensive show in their first game as a Big 12 member, with McMillan and Fifita headlining.

Arizona's stars connected on a 69-yard touchdown on the Wildcats' opening drive and kept gouging New Mexico's defense for big chunks.

McMillan averaged 30.4 yards on 10 catches and broke the Arizona single-game record of 283 yards receiving set by Jeremy McDaniel in 1996. McMillan matched Jacob Cowing's touchdown catches record set against Southern California last season and fell 10 yards short of the Big 12 record set by Baylor's Terrance Williams in 2012.

Fifita finished with 422 yards and four touchdowns on 19-of-31 passing with an interception. Quali Conley ran for 90 yards and three touchdowns to round out an Arizona offense that racked up 627 total yards.

The Lobos (0-2) opened coach Bronco Mendenhall's first season by blowing a 17-point lead in a 35-31 loss to Montana last week.

New Mexico's issue for the second straight week came on defense, particularly McMillan.

Arizona's first preseason AP All-American also had touchdown catches of 17 and 78 yards in the first half, then added a 40-yarder in the third quarter to help Arizona pull away after leading 27-24 at halftime.

The chemistry between Fifita and McMillan played a huge role in the high expectations for Arizona in Brennan's first season.

**TUCSON, Ariz. (AP)** — Quali Conley ran for 112 yards, Noah Fifita threw for 173 yards and a touchdown and No. 20 Arizona overcame a four-point halftime deficit to beat Northern Arizona 22-10 on Saturday night for its ninth consecutive win, tying the school record for consecutive victories.

The Wildcats (2-0) extended the longest active win streak in FBS by outscoring the Lumberjacks 16-0 in the second half after trailing 10-6 at the break. The nine straight wins matches the school record set in 1974-75 and matched in 1997-98.

Conley, a transfer from San Jose State, led the way as Arizona gained 188 yards on the ground. Receiver Tetairoa McMillan, who had a school-record 304 yards and four TDs in the 61-39 season-opening win over New Mexico, was limited to two catches for 11 yards.

Northern Arizona (1-1) finished with only 198 yards of total offense, 91 after halftime. Quarterback Ty Pennington threw for 84 yards on 14 of 24 passing and added 39 on the ground.

Arizona forced a turnover on downs in Northern Arizona territory to open the second half and converted that into points as Jeremiah Patterson scored on a 17-yard touchdown pass from Fifita for a 13-10 lead with 12:06 left in the third.

The Wildcats' Chubba Ma'ae tackled running back Darvon Hubbard in the end zone for a safety with 11:33 left in the fourth, upping the lead to 15-10. And after getting the ball back, Arizona made it 22-10 on a 56-yard scoring run by Kedrick Reescano with 9:32 remaining.

Arizona only led 3-0 after the first quarter after settling for a red zone field goal on its first drive and punting the next two. Northern Arizona took a 7-3 lead with 10:24 left in the half on a trick play, with receiver Isaiah Eastman throwing a 25-yard TD pass to tight end Xander Werner.

A Fifita interception led to more points for the Lumberjacks, with Marcus Lye converting on a 38-yard field goal to make it 10-3 with 6:20 left in the first half.

The Wildcats cut Northern Arizona's lead to 10-6 with 32 seconds left in the first half on a 48-yard field goal from Tyler Loop.

**UP NEXT**

The Wildcats hit the road for the first time, taking on Big 12 conference foe Kansas State on Friday, September 13 in a non-conference game scheduled before Arizona joined the Big 12.

**MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP)** — Avery Johnson threw two touchdown passes, Dylan Edwards returned a punt 71 yards for a score and No. 14 Kansas State beat No. 20 Arizona 31-7 on Friday night in a rare nonconference matchup of new Big 12 rivals.

The loss ended Arizona's nine-game winning streak, the longest active streak in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Johnson had 156 yards passing and 110 yards rushing, and D.J. Giddens added 86 yards rushing and a score, as Kansas State (3-0) rebounded from a lackluster road win over Tulane with an emphatic victory over the desert Wildcats.

Noah Fifita had 268 yards passing for Arizona (2-1) with an interception. Tetairoa McMillan had 11 catches for 138 yards, but the potential first-round NFL draft pick was unable to turn any of those grabs into a big play or touchdown.

The schools agreed to the matchup before Arizona left the Pac-12 for the Big 12. And with neither having enough time to find a replacement opponent, Kansas State and Arizona kept the game but without it counting in the conference standings.

The teams traded grinding, time-consuming touchdown drives to start the game, but otherwise the first 30 minutes was plagued by penalties, mental mistakes and dumbfounding miscues from two teams trying to make a statement.

Arizona failed to cover a poor punt that Edwards returned untouched for a touchdown. On the next drive, Fifita lazily threw over the middle into double coverage and was picked off by Kansas State's Keenan Garber in the end zone.

Johnson made perhaps the most embarrassing gaffe. He was sacked at the Arizona 19 with 24 seconds left in the first half. On the next play, the freshman needed only to step out of bounds to stop the clock and bring on the field-goal team, but he instead reversed field and ran the other way, allowing the clock to expire without the chance for an attempt.

Kansas State still led 14-7 at the half, and the mistake didn't matter in the end.

The fleet-footed Johnson began to sling it in the second half, leading his team on back-to-back TD drives. The first featured a 48-yard pass to Jayce Brown on third-and-12, setting up Johnson's scoring toss to Brayden Loftin. The next included a 21-yard throw to Loftin before Giddens plowed into the end zone to give Kansas State a 28-7 lead.

Kansas State stuffed Arizona on fourth down a few minutes later, and merely had to run out the clock in the fourth quarter.

Arizona might have fared better had it not repeatedly hurt itself with flags. It committed 30 yards worth of penalties on a single drive in the first half, and finished with nine penalties for 74 yards in the game.

Kansas State's defense had something to prove after allowing Tulane to throw for 342 yards and pile up 491 in last week's 34-27 comeback win. The Wildcats held Arizona to 324 yards of total offense.

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Noah Fifita threw for 197 yards and two touchdowns and Arizona's defense stopped No. 10 Utah four times on fourth down to help the Wildcats beat the Utes 23-10 on Saturday night.

Arizona (3-1, 1-0 Big 12) turned in a stellar defensive performance with two interceptions, eight pass breakups and seven tackles for loss.

Utah (4-1, 1-1 Big 12) played without QB Cam Rising again. Freshman Isaac Wilson moved the ball but couldn't convert in the red zone and threw a pair of interceptions.

Fifita hit Tetairoa McMillan for a 41-yard pass on third-and-11 and then threw a 35-yard touchdown to Keyan Burnett on another third-and-11 to make it 23-10 with 8:13 to play.

Tao Johnson intercepted Fifita in the end zone on the first play of the fourth quarter before Wilson drove the field and found Caleb Lohner for a 20-yard TD reception to cut the lead to 16-10 with 11:54 to play. But the Wildcat defense held strong .

In the third quarter after Tyler Loop's 53-yard field goal, Wilson was intercepted by Genesis Smith on the next play. Loop's ensuing 33-yard field goal gave the Wildcats a 16-3 lead.

Fifita used quick passes to avoid Utah's pass rush and capped a seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 3-yard TD pass to Jeremiah Patterson to give Arizona a 10-3 lead at halftime.

Fifita completed all seven passes on the Wildcats opening drive but it was Kedrick Reescano's 23-yard run that set up Loop's 47-yard field goal.

The Wildcats stopped the Utes first two possessions on downs - both inside the Arizona 10-yard-line on fourth-and-2.

Utah fans and the team waited to see if Rising would be able to play after hurting his throwing hand on Sept. 7. Again, it was a game-time decision, but Wilson was the one who ran out with the offense. Rising, a seventh-year senior, has only played four total quarters this season after missing all of last season.

Arizona now has a 6-31-1 road record against AP Top 10 teams.

**TUCSON, Ariz. (AP)** — Tahj Brooks ran for 128 yards and three touchdowns, Jacob Rodriguez forced a late fumble and Texas Tech rallied after blowing a 15-point lead to beat Arizona 28-22 on Saturday night.

Texas Tech (5-1, 3-0 Big 12) got consistent pressure on Arizona quarterback Noah Fifita, forcing him to get rid of the ball quickly or throw it away. The Red Raiders also intercepted two of his passes and forced a turnover on downs deep in their own end while building an 18-3 halftime lead.

The Wildcats' defense kept them within reach, forcing two Brooks' fumbles to take a 19-18 lead early in the fourth quarter.

After Arizona's Tyler Loop missed a 48-yard field goal, Texas Tech finally found a rhythm, setting up Gino Garcia's 41-yard field goal for a 21-19 lead.

Arizona (3-2, 1-1) took over at its own 25 with 2:21 left, but Rodriguez stripped Tetairoa McMillan on the first play and the Red Raiders recovered. Brooks then burst 32 yards up the middle for a touchdown, sending Texas Tech to its fourth straight win since losing to Washington State the second game of the season.

Brooks scored on a 3-yard run in the first quarter and the Red Raiders spent the rest of the half shutting down the Wildcats.

Texas Tech held Arizona to a field goal late in the first quarter, then stopped the Wildcats on fourth-and-1 at the Red Raiders' 20. Texas Tech's Quincy Ledet intercepted a pass by Fifita that was tipped at the line of scrimmage and Brooks followed with his second TD run, from nine yards out.

Fifita had another pass intercepted by CJ Baskerville in the end zone late in the second quarter and Texas Tech marched quickly down the field for Garcia's last-second 30-yard field goal to lead 18-3.

Arizona moved into Texas Tech's end twice in the third quarter - the second after a fumble by Brooks at the 32 - and had to settle for two more field goals.

The Wildcats finally broke through when Quali Conley scored on a 3-yard run and forced another Boyd fumble - after a review overturned the original call - to set up Loop's 37-yard field goal for a 19-18 lead.
