NEWS & NOTES

- Idaho State enters the matchup at 5-3, continuing to rank among the Big Sky's best defensive teams. The Bengals hold opponents to 56.8 points per game and 36.1 percent shooting, both No. 1 in the conference, while forcing 19.5 turnovers per contest with a +4.9 turnover margin.
- Idaho State leads the Big Sky in scoring defense (56.8) and field-goal percentage defense (36.1), while also limiting opponents to just 31.0 rebounds per game and carrying a +4.9 turnover margin.
- ISU continues to shoot effectively from deep, hitting 31.7 percent from three, a top-four mark in the Big Sky
- The Bengals control possessions behind a +6.6 rebounding margin and opponents committing 19.5 turnovers per game.
- Idaho State's top trio continues to drive production: Tasia Jordan (15.8 PPG), Piper Carlson (12.0 PPG, 8.0 RPG), and Kacey Spink (6.9 RPG, 3.8 APG).
- Kacey Spink remains one of the Big Sky's most disruptive defenders, totaling 26 steals (No. 2 in the conference) and averaging 3.25 per game.
- Piper Carlson ranks among the Big Sky's most efficient scorers at 53.9 percent from the field while leading ISU at 8.0 rebounds per game.
- The Bengals continue to receive balanced scoring from Sophia Covello (8.5 PPG) and Maeva Gauffrenet (7.1 PPG).
- ISU ranks among the conference leaders with 13.0 offensive rebounds per game.
- Idaho State is averaging 13.5 assists per game, with Kacey Spink ranking top-six in both assists and assist-to-turnover ratio.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Idaho State and BYU meet for the 19th time in a series that has been played across five different decades, with the Cougars holding a 15-3 advantage. The matchup has historically tilted toward BYU, particularly in Provo, where the Bengals are 1-10 all-time. Idaho State's three wins in the series came in 1990, 1995, and 2000, highlighted by a 73-55 home victory in 1995 and a narrow 58-56 win in Pocatello in 2000.

Recent meetings have been tightly contested, including Idaho State's overtime battle in Provo

BENGAL BITES

- Idaho State averaged 61.9 points per game in 2024–25, its highest team scoring average since 2022.
- The Bengals finished the year ranked top-100 nationally in rebound margin (+4.3) and top-3 in the Big Sky in total rebounding.
- ISU held opponents to just 40.0 percent shooting and 33.2 percent from three, both among the conference's top defensive marks.
- Idaho State's 37.4 rebounds per game ranked second in the Big Sky, led by Piper Carlson (7.3 rpg) and Kacey Spink (7.8 rpg).
- Tasia Jordan led the Bengals in scoring (10.9 ppg) and shot 46 percent from the field, while Sophia Covello hit 37 percent from beyond the arc.
- Piper Carlson finished the season as one of just four Big Sky players to shoot over 52 percent from the floor with 200+ field-goal attempts.
- Kacey Spink led ISU in assists (3.8 apg) and steals (2.6 spg), earning her second straight Big Sky All-Defensive Team nod.
- ISU recorded its best three-point percentage (.336) in five years and ranked top-60 nationally in offensive rebounding rate.
- Idaho State went 8–5 at home last season and averaged 904 fans per game inside Reed Gym, its best attendance figure since 2019.
- The Bengals posted season highs of 91 points and 23 assists in their opening win over Arizona Christian, shooting a season-best 55.7 percent from the floor.
- Idaho State opened the season with a dominant 99–47 win over Westminster, shooting 59.3 percent from the field while forcing 22 turnovers. The Bengals led wire-to-wire, highlighted by Tasia Jordan's 26 points and Piper Carlson's 13-point, 11-rebound double-double.
- In the Bengals win over UC-Irvine Kacey Spink passed Angela Munger for 2nd all-time in career steals in Idaho State women's basketball history. Spink sits at 205 headed into the game with South Dakota.
- 3-0 start is the best for the Bengals since the 2017-18 season (They started 4-0)
- ISU is one of three Big Sky Schools to start the season 3-0 (ISU, Montana State, Northern Colorado)
- The Bengals closed out the 2025 Bank of Hawai'i Classic 1-1 with a 1 point thriller win over Portland 58-57 and a tough 71-52 loss to LMU.
- The Bengals had one of the best rebounding games of the last 20 years 12/3 against the Omaha Mavericks, Idaho State finished the game with 57 rebounds, most since 2005 against Boise State. Idaho State finished with a +30 rebound margin.
- Idaho State had 28 offensive rebounds, a team-record, surpassing the 26 they had against Carroll College in 2021.
- Piper Carlson had her 2nd double-double of the season against the Omaha Mavericks on 12/3. Her 19 Pt. 11 RB line was a career best for the Bengal post.
- Against the Omaha Mavericks on 12/3, the Bengals held UNO to consecutive single-digit scoring quarters in the 2nd half, the fewest 4th quarter points allowed up to this point in the season (9) and held them to just 2 points off of turnover, a season-best to this point.
- Oral Roberts held Idaho State to their worst 3-point shooting performance of the season, 1-of-12, this is the 3rd time in the last two seasons ISU has been held to just 1 made three-point field goal.

BYU enters the week at 8–1, one of the strongest starts in the Big 12, and will face Idaho State after a road test at Portland. The Cougars have the look of a program quickly reinventing itself under first year head coach Lee Cummond, a former BYU standout who spent time on both the men's and women's staffs before taking over this season. Cummond has emphasized a renewed confidence within the program, a shift from last year's up and down 13–17 campaign, and early results suggest a group that now expects to win rather than hopes to compete. BYU remains relatively young, but blends key returners with transfers from Charleston, Santa Clara, and Buffalo, along with a roster that features six international players and several decorated recruits.

Offensively, the Cougars have undergone one of the most noticeable stylistic changes in the Big 12. Cummond wants tempo, early offense, and a long leash from the perimeter, giving most of the roster a green light from three. BYU averages over 74 points per game and takes 26 three pointers per outing, ranking inside the national top 35 in attempts while averaging eight makes per game. When healthy, number 11 Delaney Gibb is the engine of the attack, a complete shot maker who rewrote BYU's freshman record book and earned Big 12 Freshman of the Year honors last season. Her combination of pull up shooting, range, and poise has made her one of the league's most dynamic guards, and she scored 22 points in last year's meeting in Pocatello. The backcourt also features number 2 Benally, a two time Gatorade Player of the Year in New Mexico, and number 8 Williams, who has returned from two knee injuries and is shooting over 50 percent from three. In the frontcourt, number 13 Rohkohl provides physicality and production after posting 10 double doubles last season at Charleston, while number 23 Hudgins from Santa Clara and number 24 Cannon from Shelley round out a capable and versatile starting five.

Defensively, BYU leans primarily on man to man coverage but will show occasional zone and selective full court pressure. The pressure is designed less for steals and more to force opponents deeper into the shot clock and disrupt rhythm. The Cougars are allowing opponents to shoot in the low 40s from the field, but their ability to rebound remains a key variable, especially after offensive rebounding proved decisive in last year's matchup. In the November 2024 meeting in Reed Gym, BYU collected 15 offensive rebounds and turned them into 19 second chance points, pulling away late for a 77–68 win. Gibb led the charge with 22 points, while Idaho native Cannon and Santa Clara transfer Hudgins contributed on the glass.



Depth is still taking shape under the new staff, but BYU has multiple rotation players with notable pedigrees. Number 7 Hamlin, originally committed to Nebraska, brings athleticism and back to back Utah 4A Player of the Year honors. Number 14 Barber, a former Idaho 5A Player of the Year at Rigby, adds local familiarity to the rivalry. Number 21 Hamson, the latest in a long line of standout Hamson post players, continues a family tradition rooted deeply in BYU women's basketball history.

Saturday's matchup will be the 19th meeting between the programs, with BYU holding a 15–3 series lead and winning the last six. Idaho State pushed the Cougars in both recent matchups, including a 2023 overtime game in Provo, but the rebuilt BYU offense, the expected return of Gibb, and the Cougars' improved perimeter shooting present a significant challenge. ISU's defensive discipline and rebounding will be central to preventing BYU from generating the early threes and second chance scoring opportunities that have fueled their strong start.

Get to Know: Aspen Caldwell | By Piper Carlson for ISU Sports Information

Idaho State women's basketball player Aspen Caldwell has officially returned to her roots. The Idaho Falls native had been on Coach Seton Sobolewski's radar for years.

"This past spring was his third time recruiting me, so over the years I've built a really good relationship with Coach Sobo," Caldwell said. That connection, combined with ISU's winning program and the chance to be close to home, made the decision easy.

Caldwell's path to Pocatello took a few turns. She began her collegiate career at the University of Idaho as a freshman before transferring to Utah Valley University for her sophomore season. Now, she's back in her home state wearing Bengal orange.

Basketball has been a part of Aspen's life since she was young. "My dad put me in it when I was little, but I really fell in love with it in eighth grade," she said. By her freshman year of high school, she knew she wanted to compete at the collegiate level. She played for the Idaho Flash club team, gaining college interest by her sophomore year.

Being a student-athlete comes with its challenges. "Staying on top of schoolwork and not procrastinating is the hardest part," Caldwell said. But she keeps things in perspective thanks to advice from her brother: "You are not your sport." This mindset helps her separate basketball from the rest of her life and not let a bad game define her.

The youngest in her family, Caldwell says she enjoys her role as "the baby." "I get spoiled," she laughed. She's also proud to be the first collegiate athlete in her extended family.

Family played a huge role in her decision to transfer closer to home. "I wanted that supportive factor and for them to be able to come to games. Plus, I really like the state of Idaho—Southeastern Idaho is way better than Northern Idaho," she said with a smile.

Representing a school near her hometown is special. "It's super rewarding, especially for the community and younger girls from my hometown. I hope I can be someone they can look up to," Caldwell said. Coming from a bigger high school where it's uncommon to go play Division I sports, she hopes to inspire the next generation.

As for the season ahead, Caldwell's goals are clear: win the conference, make it to the NCAA tournament, and make a positive impact on the team—whatever her role may be

For Idaho State women's basketball player Tae Jordan, the game has always been about growth, connection, and stepping out of her comfort zone. A Chicago native, Jordan says her hometown is all about the skyline, the food, and—most importantly—her family.

Basketball became her sport of choice early on, although her start was far from perfect. “I just liked all the running in basketball, but at first, I’d just run out of bounds—I didn’t quite get the concept,” she laughed.

What kept her coming back was the connections she built through the game and the joy of seeing her own progress. By her second year of AAU basketball in 7th grade, she realized the sport could take her far. “Just seeing the opportunities in front of me made me want to play in college,” she said. When it came time to choose Idaho State University, Jordan was ready for something new. “I felt wanted by the team, and I knew it would be out of my comfort zone—in a good way,” she explained.

Her love for the game runs in the family. Jordan’s biggest inspiration is her grandmother, who was a standout high school player. “She was a beast,” Jordan said proudly. She also carries advice from her junior college coach everywhere she plays: “Trust yourself and trust your game—trust all the time and work you’ve put into it.”

For Jordan, that means letting go of mistakes quickly and believing in the preparation she’s put in. As a “super senior,” Jordan heads into her final season with big goals: win the conference, earn First Team conference honors, boost her three-point confidence, and be more positive with herself.

Looking ahead, she hopes to play overseas but isn’t sure exactly where yet. More than anything, she wants to be remembered as “an explosive, high-energy, and impactful player on and off the court.” Heading into her last year, she’s feeling all the emotions. “I’m anxious, but in a good way,” Jordan said. “I’m ready for the ride.”

Seton Sobolewski enters his 18th season as head coach of the Idaho State women's basketball team. He was named the 12th Head Coach in program history in 2008.

He quickly established a winning culture and soon became the winningest coach in program history with his 94th win on Feb. 1, 2014 against his alma mater Northern Arizona. He also led Idaho State to its third Big Sky Conference Title and was named Big Sky Conference Women's Basketball Coach of the Year during the 2011-12 season.

Everything Idaho State's head coach does is with his players in mind. In his 16 seasons with ISU, he has coached:

- 23 Big Sky All-Conference Team members including eight first-team members
- Four Big Sky Preseason All-Conference Team member
- 14 Big Sky Conference All-Tournament Team members including MVPs Chelsea Pickering (2011-12) and Estefania Ors (2020-21)
- One Big Sky All-Conference Newcomer of the Year
- One Big Sky All-Conference Freshman of the Year
- One Big Sky All-Conference Defensive Player of the Year
- Two Big Sky Conference Top Reserves
- One Big Sky Conference NCAA Woman of the Year Nominee
- 72 Big Sky All-Academic Team members
- One Big Sky Conference Scholar-Athlete
- 20 Big Sky Conference Players of the Week.

Through 17 seasons at Idaho State, Sobolewski has compiled a 286-237 record overall with an 172-117 Big Sky record. Prior to the change in the Big Sky conference tournament structure where every team makes post-season play, Sobolewski led ISU to 11-straight tournament appearances, the second longest streak in the Big Sky during the same time period.

In 2021, one of the best years of Sobolewski's career, the Bengals went 22-4 overall and 15-2 in conference play. They won the Big Sky Regular Season Championship and the 2021 Big Sky Tournament. The Bengals faced the University of Kentucky where they fell 71-63, the first Big Sky team to keep within single-digit points in an NCAA tournament game since 1997.

Dora Goles was named to the All-Big Sky preseason team and to the first-team All Big Sky. Diaba Konate earned second-team All-Big Sky. Montana Oltrogee and Callie Bourne were named to the 2021 All-Tournament Team and Estefania Ors was named the 2021 Big Sky Tournament MVP.

The 2021 Big Sky Tournament Championship win also marked Sobolewski's 400th career game coached.

He earned two coaching honors in 2021 including WhoopDirt.com national DI coach of the week and the Big Sky Conference Co-Coach of the Year.

In 2020, the Bengals went 18-13 overall and 13-7 in conference play. They finished the regular season sitting No. 3 seed and would go on to make it to the semifinals of the Big Sky Tournament.

Dora Goles and Callie Bourne were named Second Team All-Big Sky. Estefania Ors was named to the Preseason All-Conference team.

In 2019, Idaho State went 20-11 for his third-best win percentage of his career. They went 15-5 in conference play to lead to a No. 3 seed in the Big Sky Tournament.

Grace Kenyon was named to First Team All-Big Sky, Saylair Grandon was named to Second Team All-Big Sky and Estefania Ors earned honorable mention recognition.

In 2018, Sobolewski's squad tallied a 21-11 record for the second-best win percentage of his career. The Bengals went 11-7 in conference play to clinch the No. 5 seed in the Big Sky Tournament.

The Bengals continued to make noise in the postseason, advancing to the semifinals after mounting the biggest comeback in tournament history against Weber State. Idaho State was trailing by 25 in the third before winning the game 113-109 in overtime. The Bengals fell in the semifinals to Northern Colorado, the eventual conference champion.

Saylair Grandon was named to the Big Sky All-Tournament Team and Brooke Blair and Grace Kenyon earned Second Team All-Big Sky honors. Estefania Ors also earned Top-Reserve honors. Additionally, the Bengals won the Most Improved Field Goal Shooting Award from the NCAA after shooting 45.8 percent from the floor.

During the 2017 season, Sobolewski led the Bengals to their second-straight Big Sky Conference tournament championship game appearance, this time as the No. 6 seed after finishing conference play with a 10-8 record. Three Bengals earned all-conference recognition as Freya Newton earned Co-Defensive Player of the Year honors, Estefania Ors was named Outstanding Freshman while Saylair Grandon earned Third Team All-Big Sky honors.

As a team, Idaho State finished atop the conference in five categories: scoring defense, rebounding defense, rebounding margin, defensive rebounding percentage and offensive rebounding percentage.

In 2016, Idaho State finished ninth in Big Sky play with an 8-10 record with nine games decided by five points or less. Three Bengals finished in the top 15 in scoring (Apiphany Woods, 11th; Brooke Blair, 14th; Anna Policicchio, 15th), while Policicchio led the league and ranked 24th in the nation in blocked shots with 2.7 per contest.

The Bengals had a memorable post-season run, knocking off No. 1 Montana State in the semifinals of the Big Sky Conference tournament off a last-second three from Juliet Jones. ISU advanced to the championship of the BSC tournament for the first time since 2012 and the fifth time in school history, losing to No. 3 Idaho 67-55. Both Policicchio and Blair earned All-Tournament honors.

The Bengals returned to the Big Sky conference tournament in 2015 and lost to tournament host and eventual champion Montana 69-67 in the quarterfinals. ISU boasted two all-conference selections in 2015 as senior guard Apiphany Woods was selected as the Big Sky Newcomer of the Year and sophomore Megan Hochstein was one of three players to be named the Big Sky Conference Top Reserve.

In 2014, ISU fell to tournament host and eventual Big Sky Tournament Champion North Dakota 78-53 in the tournament semifinals after defeating Eastern Washington 70-65 (OT) in the quarterfinals of the 2014 tournament.

In 2013 Sobolewski led the Idaho State to the second straight postseason tournament. The Bengals were awarded an at-large bid to the WNIT. It was ISU's first trip to the WNIT and the first since 2008. The Bengals lost to BYU 69-54 in the first-round.

In 2012 Sobolewski led the Bengals to their third regular-season and Big Sky Conference Tournament Championship. Under his leadership, ISU made its third trip to the NCAA Tournament in program history, facing the Miami Hurricanes in the first round. The 2012 season was Sobolewski's most successful. He accumulated 24 overall wins, the second most wins in a single season in program history. His 14 conference victories during the same season is also the second most conference wins in a single season in program history. His success during the season earned him his first Big Sky Coach of the Year honors.

Since his first season, Sobolewski has helped the Bengals continuously improve its win total and for the sixth straight season posted a winning conference record.

During the 2010-11 season the Bengals opened with a 10-game home win streak and finished 12-1 for the year. Over the 2010 and 2011 seasons, Sobolewski's Bengals held a 14-game home win streak, the second longest in school history.

In 2011, Sobolewski led the Bengals to an 18-12 record for the third most wins in a single season in Idaho State school history. The Bengals also defeated Utah for the first time in school history.

He led the Bengals to a three-way second place tie in the Big Sky regular season with a 10-6 record during the 2009-10 season. He led the Bengals to a .500 overall record (15-15) and helped Idaho State make its 12th Big Sky championship appearance. He led the Bengals to 15 victories to tie for the sixth most victories in a single season at Idaho State.

In his first season Sobolewski helped the Bengals to a fourth-place finish in the Big Sky regular season where ISU had a near upset of Montana in the Big Sky semifinal tournament game.

In coming to Idaho State, Sobolewski took over one of the top programs in the Big Sky Conference, as the Bengals have qualified for the postseason seven times in the past twelve seasons, winning regular season titles in 2001, 2006 and 2012 winning the conference tournament in 2001, 2007 and 2012, advancing to the NCAA Tournament all three seasons. The Bengals have also qualified for the WNIT in 2004, 2006, 2008, and 2013.

Before Idaho State, Sobolewski was a major part of UC Riverside's success as a Division I program that won a Big West regular season title, two Big West Tournament titles, made two NCAA appearances, and nearly upset No. 8 Arizona State in the 2007 NCAA tournament. The last four of those years were spent serving under John Margaritis, who was a former associate head coach at Northern Arizona.

While serving as recruiting coordinator at UC Riverside, Sobolewski recruited and coached 2007 Big West Conference player of the year Kemie Nkele. The players brought in during his time as recruiting coordinator earned one Big West Conference player of the year award, one freshman of the year award, one defensive player of the year award, three Big West Conference tournament MVP awards, four All-Big West tournament awards, five first team All-Big West Conference awards, three second team All-Big West Conference awards, seven honorable mention All-Big West Conference awards, five All-Big West freshman team awards, eight Big West Conference player of the week awards, and three Big West academic all-conference award winners. These awards were won over three seasons.

Sobolewski served one year as an assistant with the men's program at Yavapai Junior College where the team advanced to the region tournament after going 19-12 for the year. In 2000-01, Sobolewski served as an assistant with the girls' basketball program at Coconino High School in Flagstaff where he served under Head Coach Jenny Shayani. Coconino improved nine games that year to 15-12 overall.

Sobolewski attended Eastern Arizona College, starting on the men's basketball team for two years from 1995-97. He then moved to Oklahoma Panhandle State University a Division II school in Goodwell, Okla., where he played from 1997-99. In 1998, he was selected to Who's Who in America's Colleges and Universities. A 2001 graduate of Northern Arizona University with a bachelor of sciences degree in biology with an emphasis in secondary education, Sobolewski got his start by serving as a manager under former NAU Head Coach Meg Sanders for the 1999-2000 season.

The Bengal's head coach hails from Flagstaff, Ariz. where his parents reside. He is married to the former Katie Haan of Upland, Calif. They have two daughters, Aubrey and Emery.

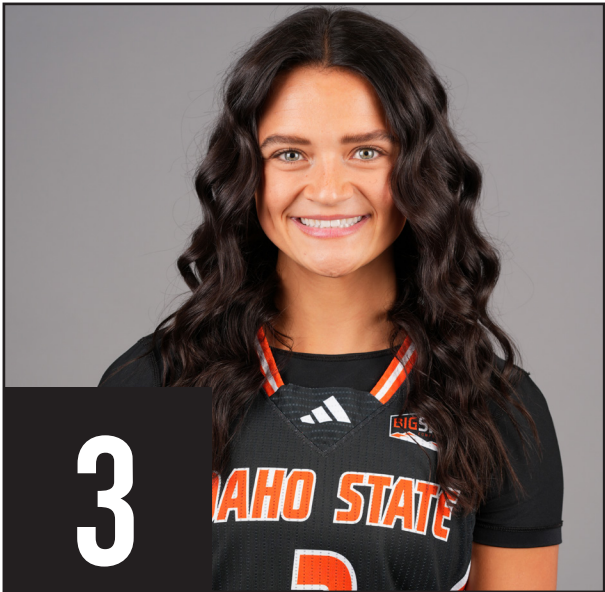
