#### TIP-OFF (TL;DR)

- CU is led by 10th-year head coach **JR Payne**, who has led the Buffs to a **181-124 (.593)** record as CU's eighth head women's basketball coach. Coach Payne has been extended through the 2028 season and has led the Buffs to three NCAA appearances, two WNIT appearances and one WBIT appearance.
- In its second year back in the Big 12, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Big 12 Preseason Poll. Colorado is **117-154 (.432)** overall in Big 12 conference play.
- The Buffs return four from the 2024-25 roster: **Sr. F Jade Masogayo, So. G Kennedy Sanders, 5th C JoJo Nworie and So. F Tabitha Betson**.
- Colorado welcomes 10 newcomers for the 2025-26 season, five transfers and five freshmen. The five transfers include **Jr. G Zyanna Walker (Kansas State), Jr. G Desiree Wooten (North Texas), Jr. G Claire O'Connor (Gonzaga), Jr. G Maeve McErlane (DePaul) and Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat (Rhode Island)**. The five freshmen include **G Erianna Gooden (Fork Smith, Ark./Northside H.S.), C Jade Crook (Albury, Australia/Basketball Australia Center of Excellence/Lake Cinninderra College), G Isa Hämäläinen (Lorentzweiler, Luxembourg/European School of Luxembourg 1), F Logyn Greer (Lansdowne, Pa./Friends' Central School) and F Sophie Zadel (San Antonio, Texas/Alamo Heights H.S.)**.
- Sr. F Jade Masogayo** cracked the top-25 in points per game (12.4) and is 14th in conference for free throw percentage (78.7%). She is tied for 17th for blocks per game (0.8). Masogayo scored 20 points in the win at Houston and had two blocks (Feb. 11). Masogayo was named to the **Big 12 Starting Five** this week as a **Top Performer** for her showings in last week's games. She scored a career-high 23 points against then-No. 14 TCU, adding three rebounds, a steal and two assists (Feb. 8). Against then-No. 20 West Virginia, she had 13 points, five rebounds, a block and an assist (Feb. 4).
- Jr. G Zyanna Walker** is fourth in conference for steals per game (2.2) and tied for 20th for assists per game (2.6). She totaled eight points, three rebounds, an assist and a steal in the win at Houston (Feb. 11).
- Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat** is fourth in the Big 12 for rebounds per game (8.2) and leads the conference in total offensive rebounds (48). She is tied in first in offensive rebounds per game (3.7) and is also tied for 13th for steals per game (1.7). She scored 12 points and had 13 rebounds, including six offensive rebounds, in the win at Houston (Feb. 11). This was her fifth double-double of the season, 11th of her career.
- Jr. G Desiree Wooten** is tied for 22nd in the conference in points per game (12.4) and is 19th in free throw percentage (76.4%). She scored 14 points and tallied four assists in the win against Houston (Feb. 11).
- As a team, the Buffs are sixth in the Big 12 for rebounding margin (6.0), fourth for steals per game (10.24), fourth for offensive rebounds per game (13.4), sixth for scoring defense (61.1), seventh for rebounds per game (38.4), sixth for turnover margin (2.20) and seventh for free throw percentage (73.1%).
- CU will honor Colorado women's basketball's first All-American in program history and current assistant coach, Shelley Sheetz, during the Buffs' game against BYU.

## COLORADO WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HEAD COACH JR PAYNE



- 10th year as CU head coach, 17th season overall as a head coach
- **181-124 (.593)** record at CU
- Career record of **282-237 (.543)**
- Record since 2020-21: **114-61 (.651)**
- Earned the No. 5 seed in the 2024 NCAA Tournament, marking CU's third straight appearance
- Women's NIT appearance in 2014 at Southern Utah, 2016 at Santa Clara and 2017 and 2021 at Colorado
- Women's BIT No. 1 seed and host in 2025
- Has coached three All-Americans, three conference players of the year, 45 all-conference players and 45 all-academic team members as an assistant and head coach
- Has been a part of three NCAA Tournament team (2007 as assistant at Boise State, 2022, 2023 at CU) and seven Women's NIT teams as an assistant and head coach

### At Colorado

- Named the eighth head coach in CU history on March 28, 2016
- Had contract extended in the spring of 2023
- Replaced Linda Lappe, who was at CU for five seasons
- Had career win No. 100 at CU against Western Michigan (Nov. 30, 2021) and career win No. 200 overall against Chicago State (Nov. 27, 2022)
- Coached five players who've earned postseason awards from the Pac-12, including Kennedy Leonard (2017-18), Mya Hollingshead (2021-22), Quay Miller (2022-23), Jaylyn Sherrod (2022-23, 23-24) and Aaronette Vonley (2023-24).
- In 2021-22, led CU to its first 20 win season since 2012-13 and its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017
- Upset No. 1 Stanford 77-72 in overtime, claiming CU's first win over a No. 1 opponent in school history (1/17/21)
- Opened 2019-20 with a 12-game winning streak, CU's best start since the 2011-12 season
- Guided the Buffs to one of the best single-season turnarounds in school history in 2016-17 as they more than doubled their win total from the previous year, finishing the year 17-16 overall and tied for ninth in the Pac-12, a year after a last-place finish in the conference in 2015-16.
- The Buffs also reached the third round of the WNIT in 2016-17, their first postseason appearance since 2014.
- CU started the 2016-17 season 10-0 for just the fifth time in school history, including a win over No. 15/19 Kentucky
- Became just the second CU coach to begin her career with 10 straight wins and the first since 1980.
- In Pac-12 play, the Buffs' signature win came on Feb. 12 when they upset No. 24 California on the road, their first win over a ranked team on the road since 2007.

- Led Colorado to the second round of the WBIT in 2025

### At Santa Clara

- Spent two seasons at Santa Clara and had a 34-27 record
- Led SCU to a 23-9 record in 2015-16, tying for third in the West Coast Conference with a 13-5 league mark
- Santa Clara reached its first postseason appearance in 10 years in 2016, qualifying for the Women's NIT
- Signature wins included defeating No. 13 Stanford 61-58 in 2015-16 and LSU 69-67 in 2014-15, SCU's first win over an SEC team in 19 years
- SCU ranked third in the nation in steals (12.6), sixth in forced turnovers (21.7) and 29th in rebounding margin (+7.2) in 2015-16

### At Southern Utah

- Spent five seasons at Southern Utah
- Her second season at SUU went 16-14 in 2010-11, the first winning season in seven years
- Led SUU to a school record for wins and a share of the Big Sky Conference regular season championship in her final season in 2013-14 with a 23-10 record and reached the postseason for the first time in school history, playing in the Women's NIT

### Assistant Coaching Experience

- Served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Gonzaga under Kelly Graves (current Oregon head coach), helping the Bulldogs go from 5-23 in her first season (2000-01) to 28-4 in her last (2004-05)
- Moved to Boise State as an assistant for three seasons (2005-06 through 2007-08)
- Was the top assistant at Santa Clara for one season in 2008-09 before becoming head coach at Southern Utah the following season
- Helped Gonzaga to two Women's NIT appearances and Boise State to an NCAA Tournament in 2007 and an NIT appearance in 2006

### Education/Personal

- Earned bachelor's degree in French at Saint Mary's (Calif.) in 1999
- Earned four letters for the Gaels and helped them to a 26-7 record and their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament as a senior in 1998-99
- Was named first-team all-West Coast Conference and led the team in with 131 assists as a senior
- Guided Saint Mary's to two WCC Tournament championships
- Born in Jackson, Tenn., but her family moved to North Vancouver, B.C., when she was a toddler
- Husband Toriano Towns is the team's associate head coach
- "JR" is not her given name; her birth name is Ali-Marie, but she earned the nickname from her dad after J.R. Ewing because he was tough and she would fight with her older brothers (she does not use the periods between letters, however)

This will be the first of two upcoming meetings between the teams in as many weeks. The Buffs head to Provo in the season finale on Feb. 28. With a victory, CU will already match last year's regular season conference win total (9).

**ROAM WITH THE BUFFS:** The Buffs' game versus BYU will be streamed on ESPN+. The Buffs are on the radio via the CUBuffs.com website and Varsity app for every game. The pregame show, Buffs Warm-up, starts a half-hour before tip and includes a pregame interview with Coach Payne. At halftime, stay tuned for a get-to-know interview with players and coaches. Colorado broadcasts on the iHeart Radio station, 'Denver's Talk Station' AM 630 KHOW. Available on the Varsity app. Fans can also follow Colorado games through live stats with links available at CUBuffs.com.

**LAST TIME OUT:** On Wednesday, the Buffs took down Houston, 73-63, on the road (Feb. 11). Colorado's defense came out strong, only allowing nine points in the first quarter, taking a seven-point lead early in the game. CU took advantage of turning Houston over 12 times in the first half alone, scoring 14 points off those turnovers. The Buffs were led by senior forward Jade Masogayo's 20 points. This was the third straight game in which Masogayo led Colorado in scoring. Junior guard Desiree Wooten had 14 points off the bench, and senior forward Anaëlle Dutat had her fifth double-double of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds. Colorado also scored 60 points in the paint, a new season high.

**EVEN MORE CATS??:** This Saturday, the Buffs head into their first matchup with BYU since their nail-biting 67-66 victory in Provo last season (Jan. 29, 2025). Colorado will face BYU for the 17th time in program history, looking to extend their current winning streak against the Cougars to eight. This will be the first of two upcoming meetings between the teams in as many weeks. The Buffs head to Provo in the season finale on Feb. 28. With a victory, CU will already match last year's regular season conference win total (9).

**WELL, SHEETZ!** As a member of the CU women's basketball team from 1991 to 1995, Shelley Sheetz capped a brilliant career in Boulder by becoming the program's first Kodak All-American following the 1994-95 season. That year, she helped lead the Buffaloes to a 30-3 record and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. During her career, CU earned a 106-21 overall record, including a 49-7 mark and three Big Eight championships. Sheetz was named first-team All-Big Eight three times and was named Big Eight Player of the Year as a senior. That same year, she received first-team recognition from the Associated Press, Basketball Times, and the USBWA, and was one of five finalists for the Naismith Award. Upon graduation, she was ranked second in program history in scoring and assists, and third in free throws made, attempted, and steals. She finished as CU's career leader in three-pointers made, which also set the Big Eight Conference record. She later competed for Team USA, played professionally in the American Basketball League with the Colorado Xplosion and Portland Power, and continued her career overseas in Germany.

**BIG 12 POWS:** Sr. F Jade Masogayo (Fort Worth, Texas/Fossil Ridge HS) was named to the Big 12 Women's Basketball Starting Five as a Top Performer this week, the Conference announced Monday, Feb. 9. Masogayo earns her second conference weekly recognition of her career, her first in the Big 12, as well as the Buffs' second in the 2025-26 season. This is the 34th conference player of the week (non-freshman) recognition earned by a WBB Buff, which includes honors earned in the Big Eight, Big 12 and Pac-12. Masogayo achieved a career-high 23 points against then-No. 14 TCU on Sunday, Feb. 8, including a game-winning and-one free throw to take an 80-79 victory. She also had three rebounds, two assists and a steal in CU's first top-15 victory since the Buffs upset No. 10/8 Kansas State at CU Events Center, 63-53, on Jan. 25, 2025. Earlier in the week, she had 13 points, five rebounds, one assist and one block against then-No. 20 West Virginia (Feb. 4). Last week, Masogayo averaged 27.9 minutes per game, 50.0% from the field, 4.0 rebounds per game and 18.0 points per game. In the Big 12, she currently ranks 25th for points per game with 12.0, 14th for free throw percentage with 77.5%, and is tied for 18th in blocks per game with 0.8. This is the fifth time in program history that the Buffs were awarded back-to-back weekly honors, including freshmen of the week, and the first time earning consecutive awards for two different athletes. Last week, junior guard Zyanna Walker was awarded Big 12 Women's Basketball Starting Five Top Performer as well for her performances against her former school, K-State, and Kansas (Jan. 29, Feb. 1).

**BIG 12 BUFFS:** Colorado is **117-154 (.432)** overall in the Big 12, playing its second season back in the Conference.

**DOUBLE OR NOTHING:** At Houston, Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat had her 11th career double-double and fifth of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds (Feb. 11). This was the Buffs' seventh double-double on the season.

**MILESTONE WATCH:** Fr. C Jade Crook has 81 points, 19 away from 100. Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat has 698 points,

two away from 700, and 885 rebounds, 15 away from 900. Sr. F Jade Masogayo has 198 assists, two away from 200, and 597 rebounds, three away from 600. Jr. G Maeve McErlane has 94 rebounds, six away from 100, and she has 188 points, 12 away from 200. Jr. G Zyanna Walker has 383 rebounds, 17 away from 400.

**MILESTONE CHECK:** Jr. G Zyanna Walker reached 800 career points against TCU, and Jr. G Desiree Wooten reached 200 career assists (Feb. 8).

**BIG 12 STATS:** Sr. F Jade Masogayo cracked the top 25 in points per game (12.4) and is 14th in conference for free throw percentage (78.7%). She is tied for 17th for blocks per game (0.8). Jr. G Zyanna Walker is fourth in conference for steals per game (2.2) and tied for 20th for assists per game (2.6). Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat is fourth in the Big 12 for rebounds per game (8.2) and leads the conference in total offensive rebounds (48). She is tied in first in offensive rebounds per game (3.7) and is also tied for 13th for steals per game (1.7). Jr. G Desiree Wooten is tied for 22nd in the conference in points per game (12.4) and is 19th in free throw percentage (76.4%).

**WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER:** As a team, the Buffs are sixth in the Big 12 for rebounding margin (6.0), fourth for steals per game (10.24), fourth for offensive rebounds per game (13.4), sixth for scoring defense (61.1), seventh for rebounds per game (38.4), sixth for turnover margin (2.20) and seventh for free throw percentage (73.1%).

**ASSISTED BY:** The Buffs have had double figures in assists in all but three games this season. CU has had 20 or more assists twice -- 20 versus Boise State (Nov. 18), and 20 against Arizona (Dec. 31). Colorado is averaging 14.3 assists per game as a team.

**GIMME THAT!**: Colorado has had 15 games this season with 10 or more steals as a team, averaging 10.2 steals per game.

**FIGURE THAT:** Four Buffs scored in double-figures against the Cougars (Feb. 11), the 13th time this season CU has had four or more players with double-digit points. The Buffs are 10-3 in games where four or more players are in double-digits. Versus Houston, Sr. F Jade Masogayo had 20 points, Jr. G Desiree Wooten had 14, Fr. F Logyn Greer had 11, and Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat had 12 points.

**ROLLING DEEP:** The Buffs have seen six different starting lineups through the 24 games so far this season, with 10 of the 14 rostered players seeing starts.

**STACKED SCHEDULE:** During the nonconference schedule, the Buffs saw opponents from eight conferences outside of the Big 12: ACC, A-10, Big Sky, CAA, MAC, Mountain West, WAC and SEC. CU finished nonconference play with a 9-3 record, ending on a four-game win streak.

**ON CLOUD NINE:** Colorado finished ninth overall in its first season back in the Big 12. Ahead of the 2024-25 season, the Buffs were picked to finish ninth in the Big 12 Preseason Polls and went 9-9 in conference play.

**PRESEASON RECOGNITION:** Early in October, Sr. F Jade Masogayo was selected to the 2025-26 Preseason All-Big 12 Team. Masogayo played and started in all 33 games in the 2024-25 season for the Buffs. She led Colorado with a career-high 12.5 points per game, averaging 4.8 rebounds and 1.4 assists. She reached double-digit points in 24 games, shooting 59.9 % from the field overall which ranked 12th in the NCAA. In the team's win over Arizona last season, Masogayo logged her first double-double at CU with 19 points and 14 rebounds (Feb. 5). Against No. 8 TCU, she recorded a season-high 22 points, and against No. 10 Kansas State, she tied the CU record for blocks in a quarter with three in the fourth quarter, finishing the game with a season-high four blocks. Following the conclusion of the season, she earned Big 12 All-Conference Honorable Mention along with Frida Formann.

**PORTAL PROWESS:** Colorado introduces five transfers to the 2025-26 roster in Jr. G Zyanna Walker (Kansas State), Jr. G Desiree Wooten (North Texas), Jr. G Claire O'Connor (Gonzaga), Jr. G Maeve McErlane (DePaul) and Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat (Rhode Island).

**BABY BUFFS:** The Buffs welcome five new freshmen to the squad this season in G Erianna Gooden (Fork Smith, Ark./Northside H.S.), C Jade Cook (Albury, Australia/Basketball Australia Center of Excellence/Lake Ginninderra College), G Isa Hämäläinen (Lorentzweiler, Luxembourg/European School of Luxembourg 1), F Logyn Greer (HometownLansdowne, Pa./Friends' Central School) and F Sophie Zadel (San Antonio, Texas/Alamo Heights H.S.).

**10/10 WOULD RECOMMEND:** Both head coach JR Payne and associate head coach Toriano Towns are entering their 10th year at CU. Payne and Towns have led Colorado to a **180-124 (.592)** record.

**NEW TO THE HERD:** The Colorado Buffalo coaching staff made the addition of Jordynn "Jojo" Hernandez for the 2025-26 season. Hernandez is the newest assistant coach for the Black and Gold. Hernandez joins the Buffaloes bench after spending the last two seasons as an assistant at Stephen F. Austin. Prior to SFA, Hernandez spent two years at UT Arlington, starting as a graduate assistant during the 2021-22 season. She was promoted to the Director of Player Development for the 2022-23 season, and prior to coaching, was an athlete at UTA.

**RETURNING BUFFS:** The Buffs return three others besides Sr. F Jade Masogayo from last year's roster-- So. G Kennedy Sanders, 5th C JoJo Nworie and So. F Tabitha Betson. Sanders started in one and played in 29 games for the Buffs last season, making her CU debut at Wyoming on Nov. 4, 2024. She registered her first career start against Baylor (Feb. 19, 2025) and scored a season-high 18 points against Houston (Feb. 15, 2025). Sanders averaged 4.9 points, 2.3 assists and 1.7 rebounds on the season, and she averaged 9.7 points, 3.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists in the Big 12 Tournament. She also had a season-high six assists at Texas Tech (May 1, 2025). Nworie saw action in 10 games for CU, making her Colorado debut against Southern Utah on Dec. 7, 2024. She averaged 2.5 points per game on the season. Betson played in 30 games for the Buffs and started in 13, averaging 5.4 points per game and 1.3 assists per game. She totaled 163 points, 115 rebounds, 39 assists, 16 steals and 10 blocks in her freshman campaign (2024-25). She also had double-digit points four times -- 10 against Southern University (Nov. 17), 11 against Texas Tech (Feb. 2), 15 at Utah (Feb. 12) and 16 against Arizona (Mar. 6).

**LOCKED DOWN DEFENSE:** With the addition of Wooten, Walker and Dutat to the Buffs' 2025-26 roster, CU boasts three new All-Defensive team selections, honing in on the team's defense focus.
