THE VVD

The People's Party for Freedom and Democracy wants to give people the capacity to make something extraordinary out of their lives in the Netherlands. To not just let their lives pass by, but to let them live with fervour.

The VVD provides opportunities for the hard-working Dutchman who wants to give form and meaning to the future. For professionals such as teachers, police officers and care workers. For people with the guts to start their own business. The VVD wants to be there for everyone who wants to give meaning to their lives. By not making people dependent on the government, but helping them to stand on their own feet.

The VVD is optimistic. About the future and the opportunities for the future generations. About the Netherlands as a strong, leading country, in Europe and worldwide. The Netherlands has a rich tradition of initiative, optimism and boldness. The Dutch dream is closely tied to the liberal dream.

LIBERALISM

The VVD is a liberal party. It considers individual freedom, both in a mental a material sense, as our greatest asset. Every human being has the right to freedom of speech and respect of their privacy, integrity of their own body and self-determination. Freedom and responsibility are inextricably linked. In freedom, each human being not only bears responsibility for himself, but also takes account of the freedom of others, of the interests of the elderly, of future generations and of the free society as a whole.

Other liberal principles emanate from freedom and responsibility: equality, tolerance and social justice. The VVD is open to anyone who shares its liberal principles. The VVD wants to be a place for anyone who wants to commit himself with reason and passion to increasing the liberal content of society.

HISTORY

Liberals are writing history. The ideas of the liberal Thorbecke formed the basis of the Dutch Constitution, and our state system is based on his vision as well. The liberal party formation started in the late 19th century and on 24 January 1948 resulted in the founding of the People's Party for Freedom and Democracy: the VVD.



24 JANUARY 1948

Founding of the People's Party for Freedom and Democracy by liberals Pieter Oud and Dirk Stikker. Between 1948 and 1952 the VVD participated in the Drees I and Drees II Cabinets.

1970s

As chairman of the Second Chamber faction (Parliament) of the VVD, Hans Wiegel brings the party much success. The VVD wins considerably at the 1977 elections.

1982

Ed Nijpels, Hans Wiegel's successor, leads the VVD to a big election victory: 36 seats in the Second Chamber (Parliament).

1994

Under the leadership of Frits Bolkestein, the VVD forms the first 'purple' Cabinet with the PvdA (the Dutch Labour Party). 1995

At the Provincial Council elections the VVD becomes the Netherlands' largest party for the first time.

Under the leadership of Frits Bolkestein, the VVD wins 38 seats at the Parliamentary elections!

1998

31 MAY 2006

Mark Rutte is elected list leader and chairman in the Second Chamber (Parliament) after a close race with Rita Verdonk.

NOVEMBER 2006

During the Parliamentary elections the VVD has a disappointing result: 22 seats.

2010

The CDA-PvdA Cabinet falls. Under the leadership of Mark Rutte the VVD wins 31 seats at the Parliamentary elections. For the first time, the VVD is the largest party in the Second Chamber (Parliament).

12 SEPTEMBER 2012

The VVD - CDA Cabinet with tacit support from the PVV falls. At the Parliamentary elections the VVD scores a historic election result with no fewer than 41 seats.

NOVEMBER 2015

The VVD's party structure is thoroughly amended. The party goes 'from stronghold to network'.

Hans van Baalen is elected president of the ALDE party.

2015

15 MARCH 2017

Mark Rutte does it again! With 33 seats the VVD is the largest party at the Parliamentary elections.

MAY 2019

After European Parliamentary elections the VVD has now 4 seats in the European Parliament.
