ADMISSIONS PROCESS CHANGES

The Admissions office has made some modifications to the enrollment and advisement processes for this semester to ensure Carl Albert efficiently serves students throughout the upcoming enrollment period. The following processes describe how each type of student will be helped:

First-Time Freshmen:

These students will be required to register and attend an Enrollment Session. During these sessions, students will create their schedule, go on an in-depth campus tour, and discuss important topics such as online resources (Vikeconnect, Blackboard, Student Email), Housing options, Student ID's, Financial Aid, and much more! Students can find the Enrollment Session registration form located on our enrollment website (www.-carlalbert.edu/enrollment) and students are also sent the link in an automated email after they apply.

**If Enrollment Sessions are not offered due to COVID-19, the students will be contacted via email and/or phone to complete their enrollment. Students will be contacted closer to the date of their Enrollment Session confirming or denying the occurrence of the session. **

Transfer and Readmit Students:

These students have the option to contact any advisor (Advisement Specialists or Faculty Advisors) to get enrolled! They are given contact information for all advisors via the Academic Advisors' list.

Continuing Students:

Continuing first-semester freshmen are being advised by Advisement Specialists through Freshman Orientation! This will now be conducted via email and/or phone. All other continuing students have been sent advisement emails containing electronic degree plans with recommendations on what classes they should enroll in for the fall semester. We have encouraged these students to contact their faculty advisor to enroll in courses and have provided contact information via the attached advisors' lists, but they also have the option of contacting our Advisement Specialists to get enrolled as well. The last option for these students is to self-enroll. CASC has provided the students with step-by-step instructions on how to complete this through Vikeconnect. The following image is an example of a detailed electronic degree plan that has been sent to a continuing student. The highlighted courses represent our recommendations for the next semester. We also include several explanations and notes throughout the email.
