Estimated Program Cost: Students can complete this degree in four semesters (15-16 per semester).

The estimated cost of this program is approximated at: 63 credit-hours x \$146.00 per credit hour = \$9,198.00 (Please know that this cost does not include textbooks, supplies, developmental coursework, and other expenses, and is designed as an ESTIMATE only). Actual program cost is based on Fall 2024 in-state tuition amounts and final costs will vary from this estimate.
