- supporting policies to promote the possibility of a two-state solution while we work to advocate for greater acceptance of a diplomatic solution among American Jews and Israeli Jews.

- investing in educational programs that bring the Jewish people closer together by relying on proven pedagogies for encouraging *makhloket l'shem shamayim* instead of learning in silos.
- creating the space for honest discussions about how to best strengthen civil society, advance the goals of a shared society, and assure the independence of Israel's world-renowned judiciary.
- implementing a vision of Israel that lives up to the dreams of the early Zionist thinkers of a secure, democratic, and just Jewish state in our spiritual homeland.

We hope our participation in the Congress will add to the chorus of voices representing the modern mosaic of Jewish life within the Zionist movement.
