It's simple. Drive through and drop off your e-waste! Help Camptonville Prepared and CCP to raise money in order to provide resources to you, the community of Camptonville. CEAR (California Electronic Asset Recovery) is hosting this event with community non-profits, and providing manpower and support.

E-waste is a broad term. It's anything that has an electrical cord attached (or, was attached). That means more than just computers. You may recycle any light fixtures, curling irons, old house phones, toaster ovens, or old power tools that have died. For a complete list, visit the community website at www.camptonville.com.

This event is free; and, it's easy to participate. You load up your vehicle and drive to Rebel Ridge Market Field. Follow the traffic controller's directions at the field; stay in your car; and, we will unload (drive through-drop off).

For <u>seniors and disabled residents</u>, we will arrange for a day-of-event pick-up. You need to call in advance so we can arrange a pick-up schedule. If you need assistance and wish to recycle your e-waste, please call Judy at 288.1228, or Cathy at 288.9355, and we'll do the rest.

Proceeds will help purchase emergency rescue equipment for our beloved pets to be carried on all CVFD fire vehicles. Other emergency preparedness information and materials will also be procured.

USFS Update

Burn permits are still suspended until further notice. Under these restrictions, campfires are only permitted in developed campgrounds and other designated sites. Portable stoves, including those that use gas, jellied petroleum, or pressurized liquid fuel are permitted in back country areas with a valid campfire permit. Propane-type barbeques can be used outside designated sites where camping is permitted; charcoal barbeques can only be used in designated sites.

Smoking is only permitted in an enclosed vehicle or developed recreation site.

The Canyon Timber Sale is starting Monday 8/13/2012 on the 25-17 road and the 35 road. Haul will be going in and out on the 35 to the 25-17 and then out the 25 road; so please watch out for logging trucks. This sale will be operating until the snow flies. Oregon House Farm Store ... A Template for Local Prosperity

Think sustainability; think value added; think Oregon House Farm Store. You can also wrap your cogitating mechanism around fresh, organic, and locally grown, and you have the winning combination offered by Jenny Cavaliere in every season. If I add diversity to the list, you may get tired of my ramblings, and that wouldn't be good; but it would be true. At the age of four, Jenny knew that if you have a good product, a captive audience, and a means of transportation (or venue) you can sell anything. The entrepreneurial spirit took off as Jenny picked her dad's prize tomatoes and sold them all to friends and neighbors alike.

At the farm store, Jenny showcases local produce, agricultural products like honey and olive oil, as well as her USDA certified High Sierra grass-fed beef, poultry, pork, lamb, and fresh eggs. All products are C.C.O.F. certified as well as being non-GMO. In addition, there are freshly baked pies, enticing scones, excellent breads, and finely crafted jams. There are always products to taste. Plum butter, Italian-style crust bread, muffins, and flavored olive oils were offered for the curious palate to savor and experience.

It *is* an experience going to the Oregon House Farm Store, where you can sit in an overstuffed armchair and chat with Jenny about some of her favorite subjects (and mine): promoting the local economy, food sovereignty (food sold directly from producer to consumer), North Yuba Grown, geo-tourism, and the area's history. Jenny thinks of the Farm Store as a business incubator because it is a place where anyone in the Yuba Foothills area can sell their organic ag products. This is fantastic for young ag businesses. The store works on a commission basis where the seller receives 75 percent of the profit from their products, and the store receives 25 percent.

The property is a pastoral beauty. For history buffs, there are plans for a small museum. And for gastronomes, Jenny is hoping to have a commercial kitchen ready by winter for the legal processing of value-added food products. There are farm tours, wildflower tours, children's pumpkin seed plantings, and harvest activities. There are many Maidu grinding rocks on the property, and much more history that is well worth the trip to Oregon House.

The Oregon House Farm Store is a fine example of innovative ways to boost the local economy, and to realize personal as well as community visions for heathy families, a cleaner environment, and sustainable businesses. Give Jenny a call, or drop in, maybe arrange for a tour to see for yourself what a little determination and following one's joy can really do. 
