### **CALIFORNIA FIRE PREVENTION**

By now all property owners in the area should have received a fee invoice from the State Board of Equalization, for \$150.00 per habitable structure. This is for the so-called "California Fire Prevention Fee". While the legality of this fee is being challenged in the courts, it must be paid. This article is written to help citizens of Camptonville get the best refund possible. Here's what you need to know:

- Everybody living in and around Camptonville lives in the "SRA", the "State Responsibility Area". Please don't waste any time trying to prove otherwise, you won't succeed. If you live on Federal Land, you might be able to prove you don't live in the SRA.
- · You <u>must pay the fee</u>, and do it before the deadline or you will be fined.
- · Look at your Yuba County Property Tax bill where it lists "Voter Approved Taxes". If the list includes "CAMPV COM SER DIST", which is an aborted abbreviation for Camptonville Community Services District, then you live in a "Fire Protection District" and you are eligible for a \$35.00 rebate on this \$150.00 tax.
- You must petition the state to get this \$35.00 back. There is a flyer in this newsletter which shows a sample filled-in petition form, and on the flip-side includes a letter from the Camptonville Community Services District that certifies that the district provides fire protection services.
- If you have been charged for more "habitable structures" than are really on your property, you can also petition for rebate of the improperly levied fee (They apparently have used Google maps to count roof tops). You must submit proof with the petition; see the instructions in the petition.
- Get the blank form on-line at http://www.firepreventionfee.org/. Look for the link that says "Petition for Redetermination".
- Download the form, fill it out. Mail the form and the letter from CCSD found in the Courier to the address given. You must do this now! There is a deadline for the petition, 30 days from the due date on your tax bill.
- Don't send the petition with your payment, and don't send your payment with the petition. Mail the payment in the envelope provided with the bill. Send the petition to the address shown on the form in an envelope provided by you.

This fee is not a Camptonville Community Services Fee. We will see none of this money; it all goes to Calfire. Please do exercise your rights and discuss this with your state representatives, as you see fit. ### MARIJUANA ORDINANCE PASSED

After over an hour and 45 minutes of closed session on December 18, 2012, with a 4-1 vote, Yuba County Supervisors passed the revised medical marijuana land use ordinance. Planning Department Kevin Mallen explained to Supervisors if folks lived on less than one acre they would be allowed only six plants outside regardless of how many recommendations they posted. If there were multiple recommendations on this size parcel the others would have to grow elsewhere. Attorney Jeffrey Lake said the amendment will make the county more in line with the municipal law and brings code up to state law, but is not considered with criminal law. It does not address the medical validity of cannabis but rather looks at how land use is regulated within the county. He added that the ordinance is the product of a lot of hard work by many, with many compromises. He was thankful that Yuba County amended the Ordinance which will now serve as a great working model for the state. A Representative from the Yuba County Growers Association (http://www.ycgainfo.com/) was pleased with the decision they have fought so hard over. The new rules are posted on their website.

### **BIO ENERGY IN CAMPTONVILLE**


Sometimes you're just in the right place at just the right time. Exciting news for our community. CA Legislators passed SB 1122, allowing small (3 Mega Watt or under) bioenergy power plants to become feasible and viable in California. Great news is that back in 2010 CCP was able to suggest the old Sierra Mountain Mill as a site to locate such a power plant. Yuba County Fire Safe Council conducted a feasibility study (TSS Consultants). As a result, the Camptonville site was ranked as the number one best location in the Yuba foothills. Celestial Valley property owner Walt Whittlesey likes the idea as well. Ours is one of nine possible projects in the state.

To find out more information, in December I attended a full day workshop in December at the US Forest Service Training Center in Sacramento regarding Community Scale Bioenergy Facilities and SB1122 http://www.aroundthecapitol.com/billtrack/text.html?bvid=20110SB112292CHP This bill would require the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), by June 1, 2013, to collectively procure at least 250 megawatts of cumulative rated generating capacity from developers of bioenergy projects (of not more than 3MW) to commence operation on or after June 1, 2013. Biomass supply and forest fire threat coincide in the same areas. Some of the most at risk areas include the Tahoe and Plumas National Forests.

I also learned there is \$27 million in funding available and have requested that CCP be invited into the state working group process. We will work closely with the Fire Safe Council and other community partners to see if we can qualify to be included in this exciting alternative energy project with it's potential to generate local income and jobs. Forety-six percent of mills closed in the last decade. Only 34 are left in operation statewide.

Abandoned mills are good sites for these plants. SB1122 also helps to address sustainability. Current forest consist of a lot of trunks per acre, half will die due to competition for water. Biomass does not pay for itself without other co-located business. Biomass is a cheaper fuel than wind, hydro, solar but more expensive than natural gas. There are also two valuable by-products of a small bioenergy plant: heat and char. Currently char (unburned biomass residue) sells for \$.79lb or \$10,000 a truck! The heat can be channeled to other uses such as a kiln for drying lumber or even hot tubs or green houses! We could grow lot's of local food and have a great educational AG project! This could be fun!

### MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

**SANDY ROSS** 

Dear Community,

The pain and heartbreak of what happened at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Connecticut hits every one of us with great significance. There is no way to understand the pain that parents and loved ones are feeling now, and how they will cope with their loss. Any tragedy awakens our senses to how fragile we are, but when faced with ongoing tragedies that affect our most vulnerable population, our children, we begin to ask many questions about our individual and collective responsibilities to these precious creatures. On Friday morning, we rang our school bell twenty-six times to join the nation in remembering and mourning those children and teachers who were victims of the terrible violence. I apologize for waking anyone up or alarming anyone that morning, but it was encouraging to note that folks were quick to respond and check on the safety of our school and our town.

As a parent, a teacher, and now an administrator, I cannot hide my head in the sand and pretend that something like this could never happen in our little town or at our school. It is our duty to protect children when they are entrusted to our care, and that is a responsibility that is taken very seriously at Camptonville School. We will be scrutinizing our School Safety plan and policies very carefully to determine what changes need to be made and what measures should be enhanced in order to improve school safety. But we cannot act alone, and we must all be aware of the human factors that lead to such tragedies. So I ask all of you to help us to be responsive to our friends and neighbors in the community who may be in need and don't hesitate to report

any concerns to school administration or the sheriff's office.

On a bright note, we have a dedicated and generous community. I see signs every day that Camptonville is strong in loving and caring for our children. I wish you all a safe, peaceful, healthy and prosperous New Year and look forward to the year ahead with anticipation of many wonderful things to come.
