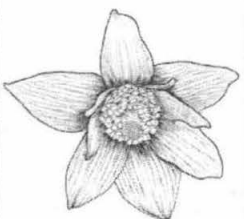

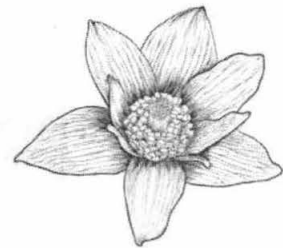

A grant from the Feather River Air Quality Management District paid for 90% of the total cost (\$135,217.) of this brand-new, 49-passenger, Blue Bird school bus. The school board and Norm Ross, our bus driver, are pleased that the bus meets all current safety and environmental standards: three point seat belts, high backed seats, automatic chains for snow and ice, heating and air conditioning and a powerful, yet very low emission, 260 HP Cummins Diesel engine. This will enable us to transport our students comfortably and safely in all types of weather. This new bus replaces the 1986 bus which lacks the safety features and power of the new bus. The old bus will be sold for scrap. Call Norm at the school, 288-3277, to check it out.
