

### Wildfire Protection Plan Meeting -February 19

Hi Folks,

If you are like me, one of our biggest fears is a nearby wildfire raging out of control. What would you do? What can be done to help make Camptonville more fire safe? The Yuba Watershed Protection & Fire Safe Council (YWP&FSC) is holding meetings in all five Yuba County fire districts to receive community input for the update of Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP). This is a critical document for fire protection and for the YWP&FSC to leverage resources to fund Yuba's fire safety efforts. It is also an opportunity for local property owners to have input into the CWPP. Deer Creek Resources will facilitate the meetings (funded by the Yuba County Water Agency) and will preview a computer-simulated "fire scenario" to show how a fire, if ignited on Sleighville Creek Road, could affect our community. Camptonville's meeting will be in the School Gym, Wed., February 19, 6:30 pm. For guestions, call the Resource Center 288-9355. Camptonville Community Partnership (CCP) has hired Chris Friedel to coordinate efforts for a forest-based business center having as a focal point a small 3MW bioenergy facility.
