To jam with an Indigenous band.




Singing and playing as one.

Playing the city of Perth.




They say their beaches are the best.

Western Australia is a big place.


You can see it from outer space.

Then, to the Isle of Tasmania.




Singing at local fairs.

Are the friendly words we hear.


G'day mate, G'day! We're pleased to see you here.

And, Can Do Band rock we play.




On we go to the Australian Capital Territory.

Going north to New South Wales.




Aussies tell many tales.




Of old colonial days.

In Sydney, we play at the Opera House.




Near here the First Fleet arrived.



Colonists settled on these lands.


Where the Harbour Bridge now stands.

Can't see a cloud in the sky.




Sun, surf and sea, every day.

Oh, what a place for a holiday!




We see koalas, emus, cockatoos.




Kangaroos, crocs and colourful fish.

Tropical islands, wonderful views.


It's everything you can wish.
