

Please file FY26 Appropriations requests! Member requests for Fiscal Year 2026 are due soon to the Appropriations committees – the <u>House deadline</u> is May 16 and the <u>Senate deadline</u> is May 22. The ONE Campaign urges Members to request the continuation of current funding levels (most recently signed into law by President Trump on March 15) for the following, specific activities with longstanding bipartisan support and proven effectiveness – they save millions of lives, keep disease at bay, and drive economic growth and self-sufficiency. Continuing this funding is not at odds with administration efforts to restructure the State Department.

- President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR): Continue annual funding for PEPFAR at \$4.7 billion (exclusive of Global Fund contributions, listed separately below). This will ensure that more than 20 million people continue to receive lifesaving antiretroviral treatment and 83 million people receive HIV testing services, including mothers and their children.
- The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria: Provide \$1.65 billion for U.S. contributions to the Global Fund, a public-private partnership that has helped save 65 million lives. Every \$1 invested in the Global Fund generates estimated returns of \$31 in health and economic benefits.
- Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance: Continue annual appropriations of \$300 million for U.S. contributions to Gavi, a public-private partnership that immunizes millions of children in low-income countries, with vast economic benefits. Gavi drives self-sufficiency: 19 countries have graduated and are now self-financing their vaccine programs. In the last five years, Gavi has purchased \$4 billion of American-made vaccines, nearly two and a half times more than what the U.S. has spent on Gavi.
- The Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC): Continue to appropriate \$930 million for the MCC, an innovative USG assistance agency created by Congress that promotes sustainable economic growth through rigorously monitored assistance compacts with countries that demonstrate commitment to good governance and economic reform. MCC's ongoing work is expected to benefit nearly 400 million people across 47 countries. Abruptly ending MCC programming would be profoundly self-defeating.
- U.S. International Development Finance Corporation (DFC): Continue to appropriate not less than §571 million for the DFC, to support economic growth and advance U.S. strategic interests by mobilizing private capital. With a \$50 billion portfolio of investments in 114 countries, the DFC is competing with the People's Republic of China, whose lending practices are seeking to expand China's global influence.
- International Development Association (IDA): Provide \$1.38 billion for U.S. support to IDA, which provides zero/low-interest loans and grants to the 75 lowest-income countries to support activities to build economic growth, job creation, higher incomes, and better living conditions.

Conversely, failing to fund these longstanding efforts would endanger countless lives, upend decades of progress, and damage trust in the United States and its global leadership.
