
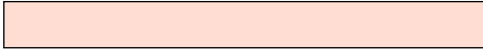

Business Purpose:		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Violation of HIPAA privacy practices can result in heavy fines and prison terms. This training aims to decrease the number of HIPAA violations that occur at Hospital X by 50%. To do so, this course will describe HIPAA privacy policy and provide opportunities for the learner to practice responding to situations that commonly lead to HIPAA violations. The most common HIPAA violation is failure to ensure patient privacy and to protect personal health information (PHI). This training will increase patient privacy and protection of PHI by outlining the protocols that are in place to do so. To increase the awareness of Hospital X's Notice of Privacy Policies, which describes the responsibilities of healthcare workers with respect to HIPAA.

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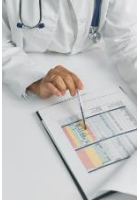
