'One CGIAR' refers to a future, more unified and integrated CGIAR, as set out in the recommendations of the System Reference Group (SRG) and endorsed by the CGIAR System Council at its 9th meeting in November 2019. MESSAGE FROM THE CO-CHAIRS OF THE TRANSITION CONSULTATION FORUM (TCF)

Dear CGIAR colleagues and stakeholders,

We trust this finds you all well and that you have had an excellent start to the year 2020.

At the beginning of this year, Juergen Voegele, Chair of the CGIAR System Council, proposed a broad-based Transition Consultation Forum (TCF) to promote consultation, inclusive communication, and co-creation in the transition to One CGIAR. The TCF comprises members of the CGIAR System Council, all members of the CGIAR System Management Board (SMB), all Center Board Chairs and Directors General, and the Chair of the Independent Science for Development Council. Juergen invited the four of us to co-chair this forum with a view to ensuring close collaboration and communication across our respective constituencies.

We have accepted this task and discussed and agreed on the following overarching modalities of work:

- Marco Ferroni as SMB Chair will serve as our convener, working closely with and supported by the co-chairs' group as a whole;
- As TCF co-chairs, we will communicate regularly with the broad TCF and wider stakeholder groups, aiming to foster close interaction not just one-way communication;
- We will work as a team and seek to ensure that the four of us participate in all key conversations on the transition going forward;
- Our work will be supported by a dedicated Transition Management Unit, once established, and we will rely on the System Management Office until such time.

Over the coming weeks, we will work with the SMB and other members to further develop the terms of reference and working modalities of the TCF as well as other means to engage CGIAR stakeholders and experts in the transition process.

We will hold a first TCF call on Wednesday, 19 February at 14:00 Central European Time and we are actively exploring the feasibility of holding a first in-person meeting of the TCF in connection with the General Assembly of the Centers during the period 23–25 March.

The bi-weekly newsletter is intended as one among a number of tools to keep all CGIAR stakeholders informed of the transition. This first edition has been sent to all TCF members and posted on the <u>CGIAR website</u>, but we hope that you can circulate it broadly to ensure that as many as possible have direct access to each newsletter. Equally important will be ensuring that the newsletter contains information that is helpful to as many people as possible. Please therefore provide your feedback on the topic areas that we could periodically include in the newsletter series, via email to <u>tcf@cgiar.org</u>. This will help us ensure that the information we share here is useful, relevant, and easy to understand.
