### 2023 W1 Budget Update

### Purpose

This document sets out an update to the System Council on the current position on designations of pooled funding, and the finalization of the Window 1 Budget Paper. It also explores the desired budgeting process for the 2024 budgeting cycle.

### Action Requested

This document is provided for information purposes, with the System Council invited to provide guidance relating to the challenges identified around designation of funding to support the budgeting process.

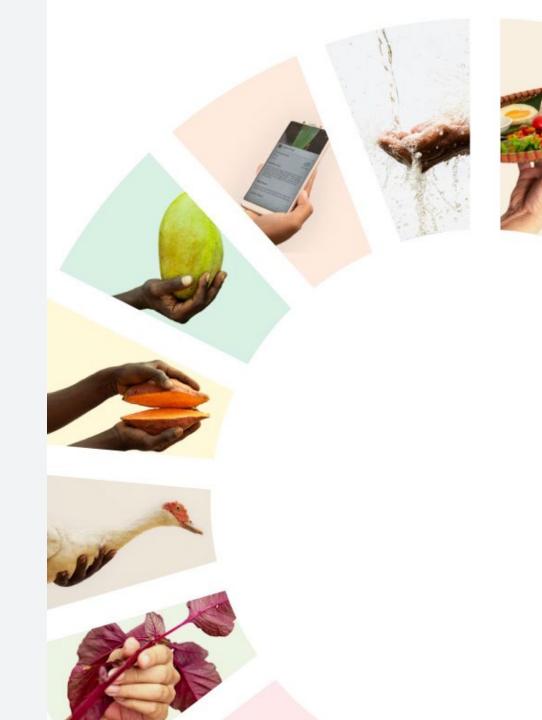

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# 2023 W1 Budget Update



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- 2. W1 Budgeting Process for 2024

### Context





Funders provided their Window 1 estimates for 2023 in autumn 2022. These informed the W1 Provisional Budget Paper which was approved in January 2023 by the System Council.

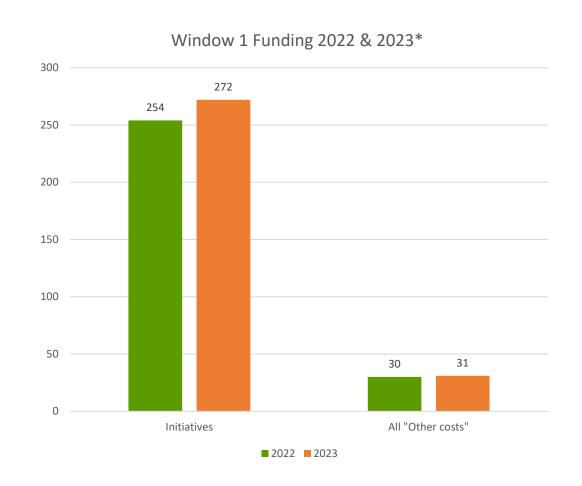
From mid-January, Funders were asked to confirm their estimates and advise how their 2023 funding would be designated. This was to be provided by 3 February 2023.

To date we are on track to receive the total expected W1 funding of \$303m. We have received partial or complete designations from 16 Funder designations, with the others pending their respective internal approvals. *Provisional* designations were anticipated in March but have not been forth coming. These pending internal approvals are anticipated by May 2023.

In the absence of these designations (worth \$84m) we are unable to finalize the Window 1 budget paper.







Despite the incomplete designations, the overall estimates show that the funding is on track to meet the \$270m funding target for Initiatives as originally stated in the provisional W1 Budget Paper. The funding is also on track to meet \$30m portion of "other costs"/System Entities costs, (which include System Board, System Council, CGIAR Integration costs, etc.)

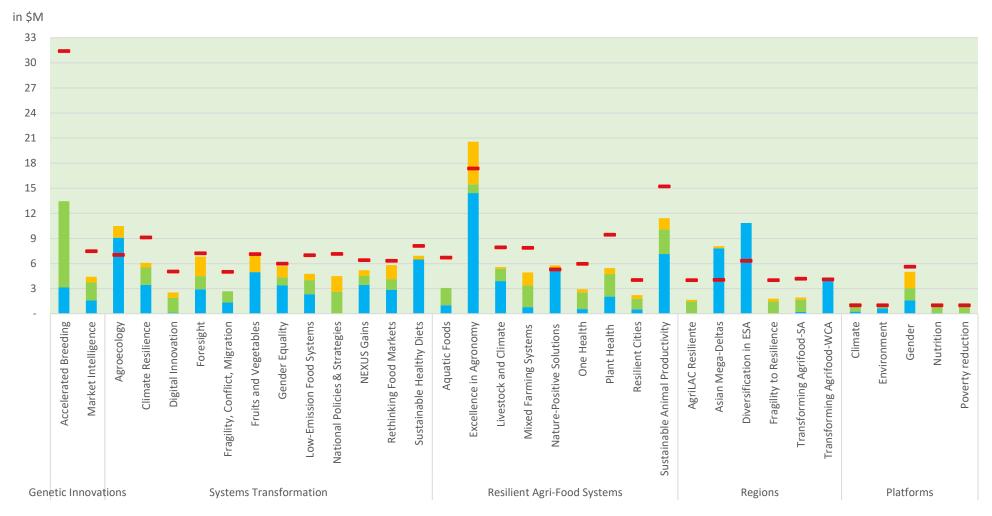
Total available funding for Window 1 has increased from \$288m in 2022 to \$332m in 2023.

Portfolio funding has reduced to \$107m in 2023 to \$120m in 2022.

The impact is that while there is more available funding across Initiatives, some are over subscribed, and others under subscribed, with limited portfolio funding to fully subscribe them. As a result, some Initiatives may not receive sufficient funding in 2023, unless adjustments are made.

# **Current view of Designations**





■ Designated ■ Portfolio ■ 2022 Carryover ■ Budget

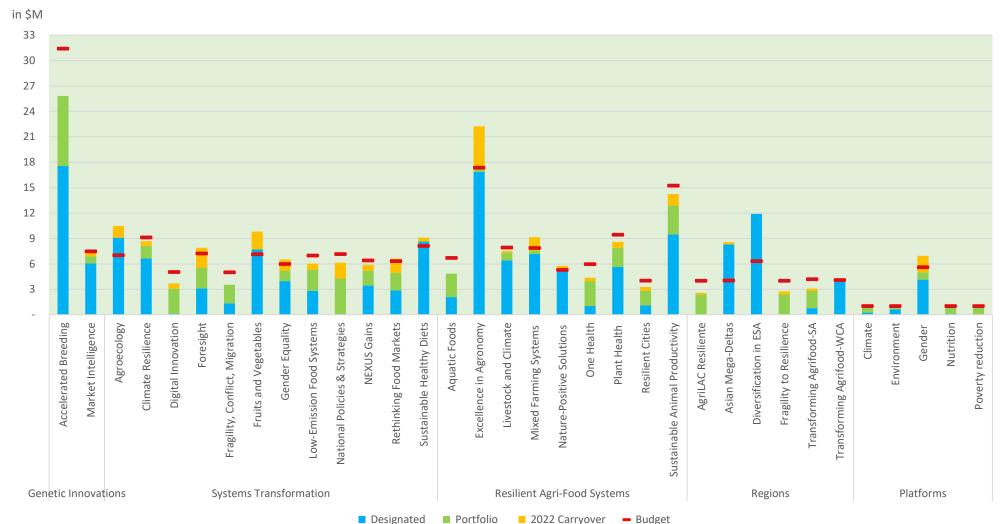
This graph provides the current designations with what has been formally designated.

It **excludes \$84m** worth of unallocated funding.

As it stands, over 20 Initiatives and Platform Areas are under subscribed. 10 fully or over subscribed

# View of Designations (assuming 2022 allocations for the outstanding Funders)





Assumes outstanding funders designate broadly as they did in 2022.

Half of the Initiatives and Platform areas would be fully or over subscribed with the other half (18) undersubscribed.

\$14m of the \$84m is excluded as more complex to predict.

# In summary





Without clarity on the final designations, we run the risk of overspending on a number of designations, or stalling activities that may not need to be stalled.



Providing designations before the end of the first quarter of the year is important to stabilize research across the Initiatives.



For the 2024 cycle we invite Funders to provide estimates and designations at the end of the summer to help facilitate a timely budgeting cycle.

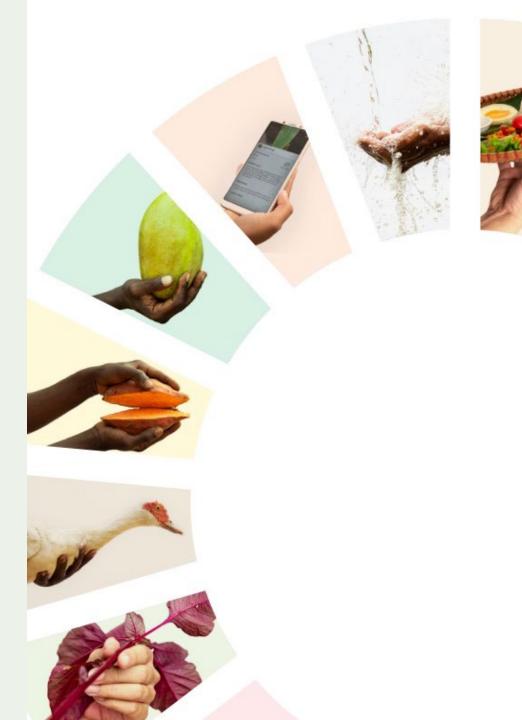
# **Next steps**



- Secure pending designations from outstanding funders
- Share with SMDs and EMT for review, adjustments (following reflect process) and review;
- Discuss with SC members where designation adjustments maybe necessary; and
- Finalize the W1 budget paper hopefully before end of May though this is dependent on when we receive the designations.



# **W1** Budgeting Process for 2024

- Funder indications received
- Budget envelopes per Initiatives and Impact Areas prepared by Science Group Managing Directors.
- High level budgets for 2023 and 2024 developed by Initiative Leads in conjunction with Researchers across Centers.
- Centers provided with Flow of Funds – the estimated W1 funds to the Center for Center Plan of Results (POR).
- AFRC and System **Board receive** Draft W1 budget paper and update of 3-year Financial Plan.
- System Council receive Draft W1 budget paper, update of 3-year Financial Plan and Business Plan.
- Funder Designations requested from **Funders**
- Report-Reflect-**Plan Process** commences (Technical Reporting Arrangement endorsed by SIMEC).
- Final W1 Budget paper updated reflecting designations, carry over and assessment process. Issued to System Council with necessary pre-approvals.
- Annual Portfolio Report issued to System Council.





Following discussions with Funders, it is clear not all Funders can provide three-year estimates and designations at the start of a business cycle, or even on an annual basis.

### **Process:**

In the absence of this, the 2024 budgeting cycle aims to start earlier in the year (August 2023) and run to December 2023, shortening the budgeting cycle from 8 months to four months. Critical success factors include:

- Funders provide their funding estimates and designations in August.
- Roles and Responsibilities of key stakeholders is agreed on, approved and applied as intended.
- Stakeholders engage in the budgeting process in the timeframes and in the spirit of trust and collaboration.

### **Constraints:**

A prevailing challenge remains in the budgeting process – there is an ongoing lack of synchrony between the budgeting cycle and the REFLECT process. Funders and Science Directors ideally need the Plan of Results at the start of the budgeting cycle to inform any strategic adjustments needed.

Further, not all funders can provide their funding estimates and designations so early in the year and in the timeframe required. This may lead to the challenges we currently face in finalizing the Window 1 Budget Paper.

### **Implications:**

There is likely to be in-year financial adjustments and potential volatility across Initiatives, despite efforts to provide predictability and free up staff time.
