

## Update on the implementation of the Integrated Governance Arrangements Recommendations of the 2023 Unified Governance Review

### Purpose

Based on the [report of the independent review of CGIAR's unified governance arrangements](#) undertaken by Morrow Sodali in 2023, the [CGIAR Memorandum on the Implementation of Governance Recommendations](#) ('the Memorandum') was developed and approved in November/December 2023 by all Parties to the CGIAR Integration Framework Agreement, and the System Council. In their unanimous approvals, the IFA Parties and the System Council agreed to work in good faith to implement the Memorandum's recommendations.

This document sets out the background to, and the overall approach to implementation of the Memorandum, as well as a status update on each of the 'three pillars' of the approach. The document is provided as a pre-read to inform discussions during SC20, noting that there may be additional updates to share during the meeting on activity since its date of issue.

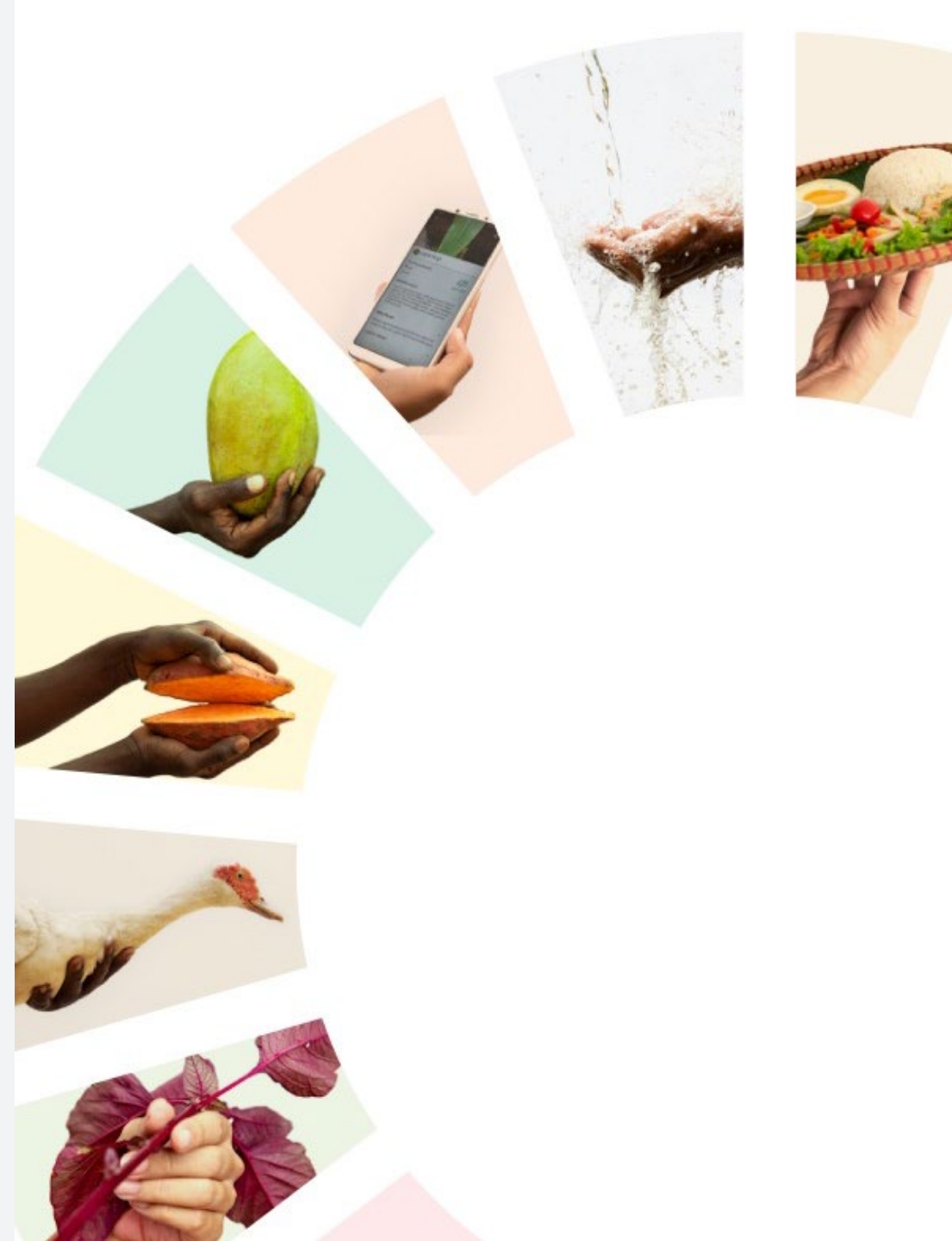

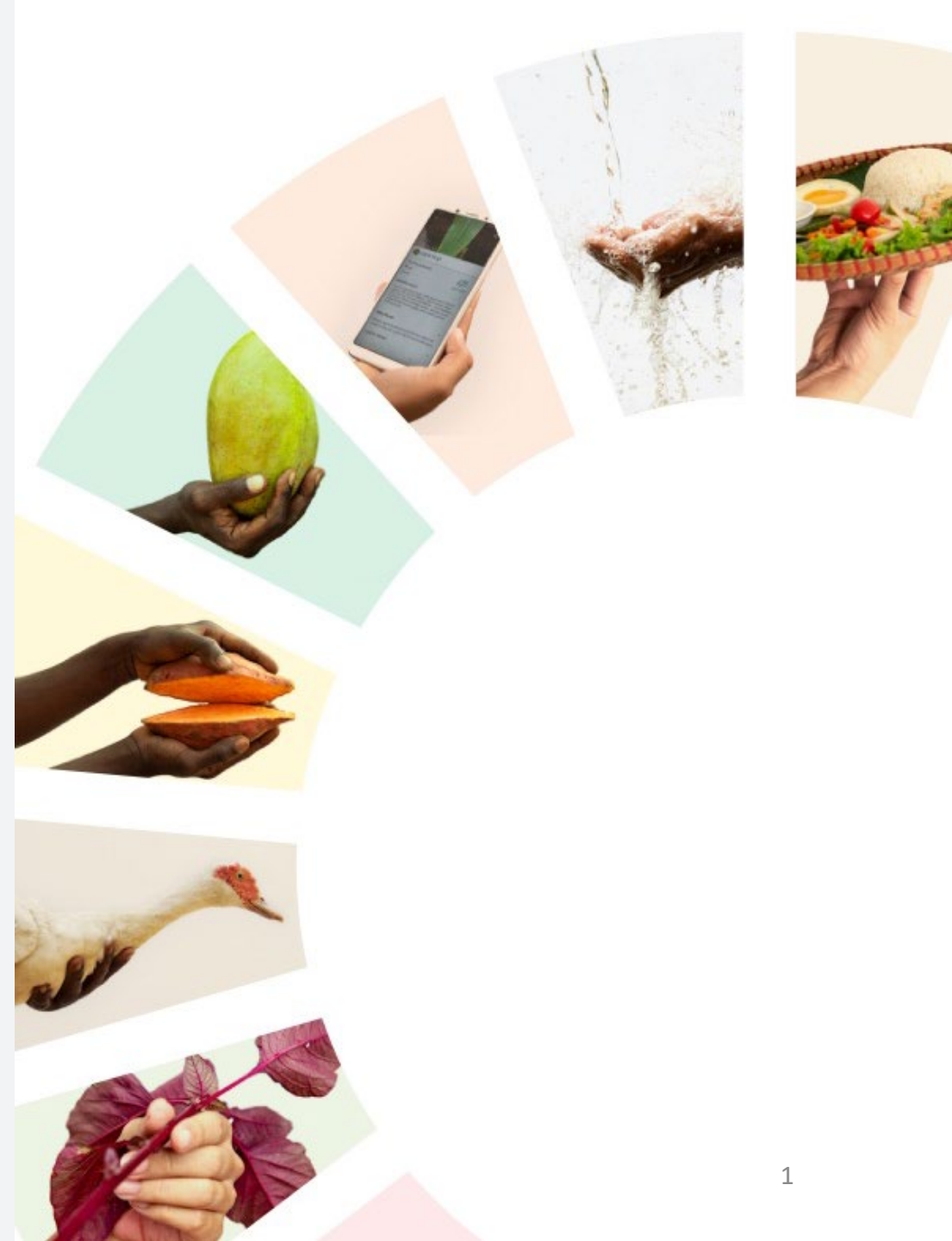
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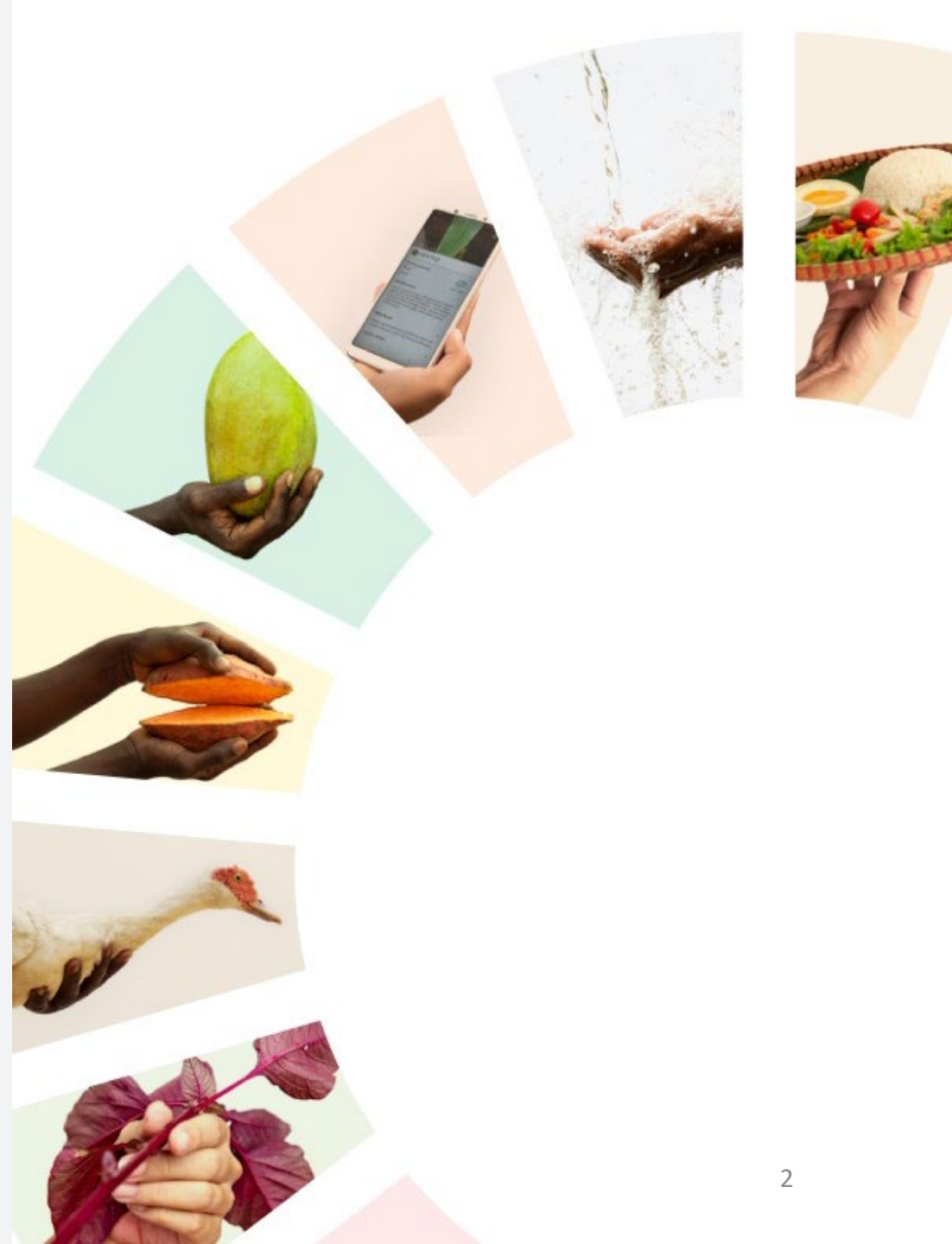

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# Rabat Workshop on Unified Governance

## Recalling conclusions reported to SC19

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- The intent of Chengdu will be best achieved by ***moving from unified governance*** (with voting majority of common members) to ***integrated governance***, fit-for-purpose for the integrated partnership enshrined in the IFA
- ***A pragmatic way forward that can be achieved in a timely way - by refining and building on what works in current model***
- Key elements of a recommended new design:
  - A reduced number of SB members on each Center board (2 SB members, one AFRC member) along with other members including host country members as defined by their own governing instruments;
  - An expanded number of SB members with appointments made by the SC based on a nomination committee with broader representation;
  - The SB will now be the integrated partnership board, with governance of the full system, not just the System Organization;
  - Certain policies and operating agreements for the center boards will be required, with the center boards accountable to the SB for compliance;
  - The Roles of the SC and SB to be simplified, clarified, replacing a long list of tasks with few but broad roles and responsibilities taken by each;
  - Further definition of Partner Country roles in governance, such as providing input to the slate of potential SB members

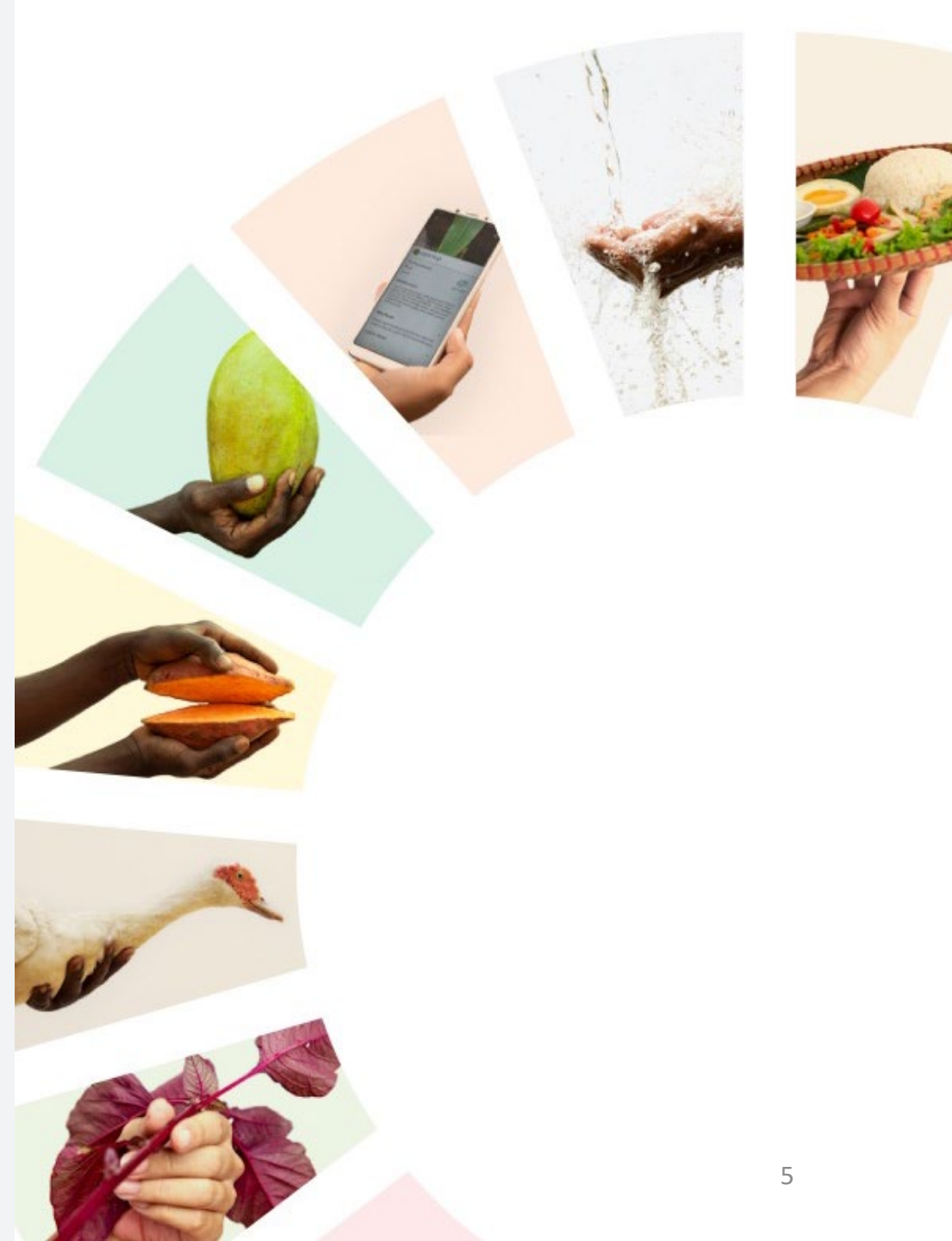

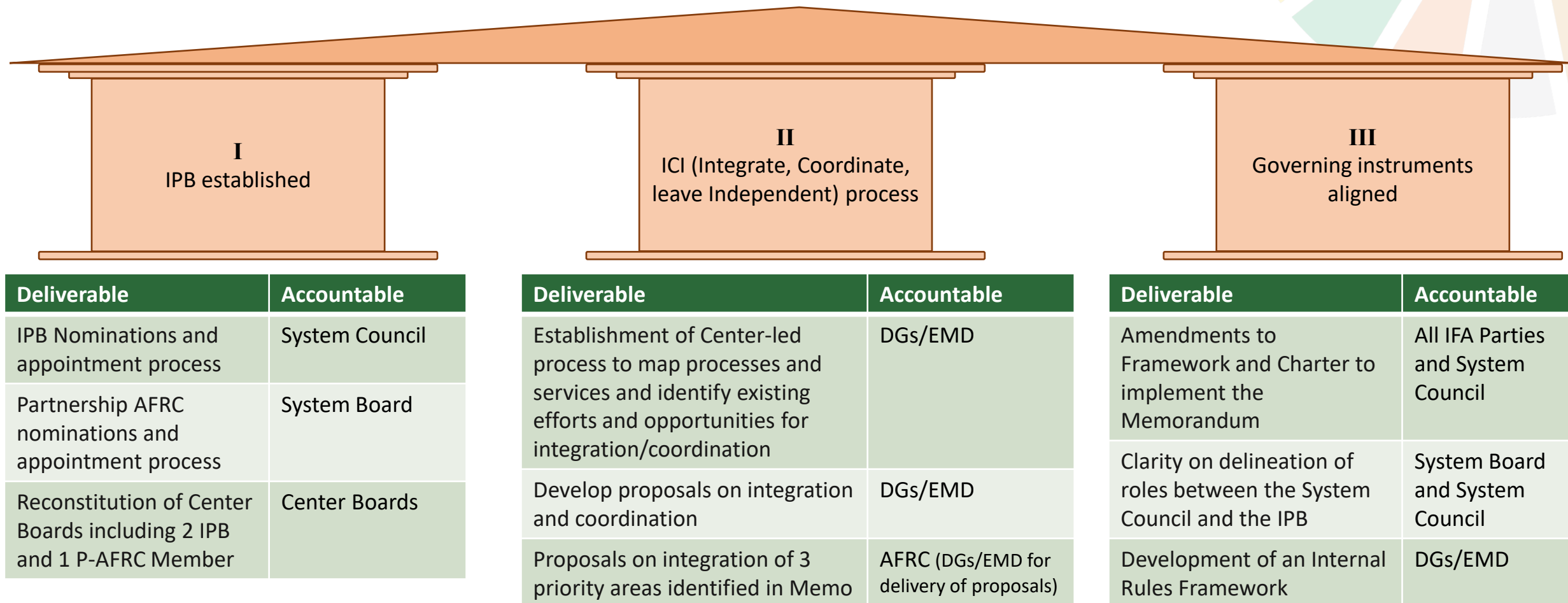

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# Three Pillars of implementation of integrated governance

- Implementation structured under three interconnected pillars
- All pillars overseen by a Sounding Board (*see next slide*) and guided by a plan of deliverables/decisions required





# Oversight of the 3 Pillars – The Sounding Board

## Role (summarized)

### Oversight of the Implementation pillars (i.e. IPB establishment, ICI, Governing instruments)

- Ensure that the Implementation pillars is resourced in a representative way with the appropriate expertise
- Provide guidance and make recommendations to the Implementation pillars in relation to progress, sequencing, prioritization or other queries arising

### Liaison with stakeholders:

- Provide guidance and make recommendations on appropriate stakeholder consultation processes in relation to the deliverables
- Raise any anticipated changes to delivery timings or prioritization with stakeholder at the earliest opportunity.
- Ensure that timely notice is provided to the relevant decision-making bodies of forthcoming decisions to enact the Memorandum's proposals.

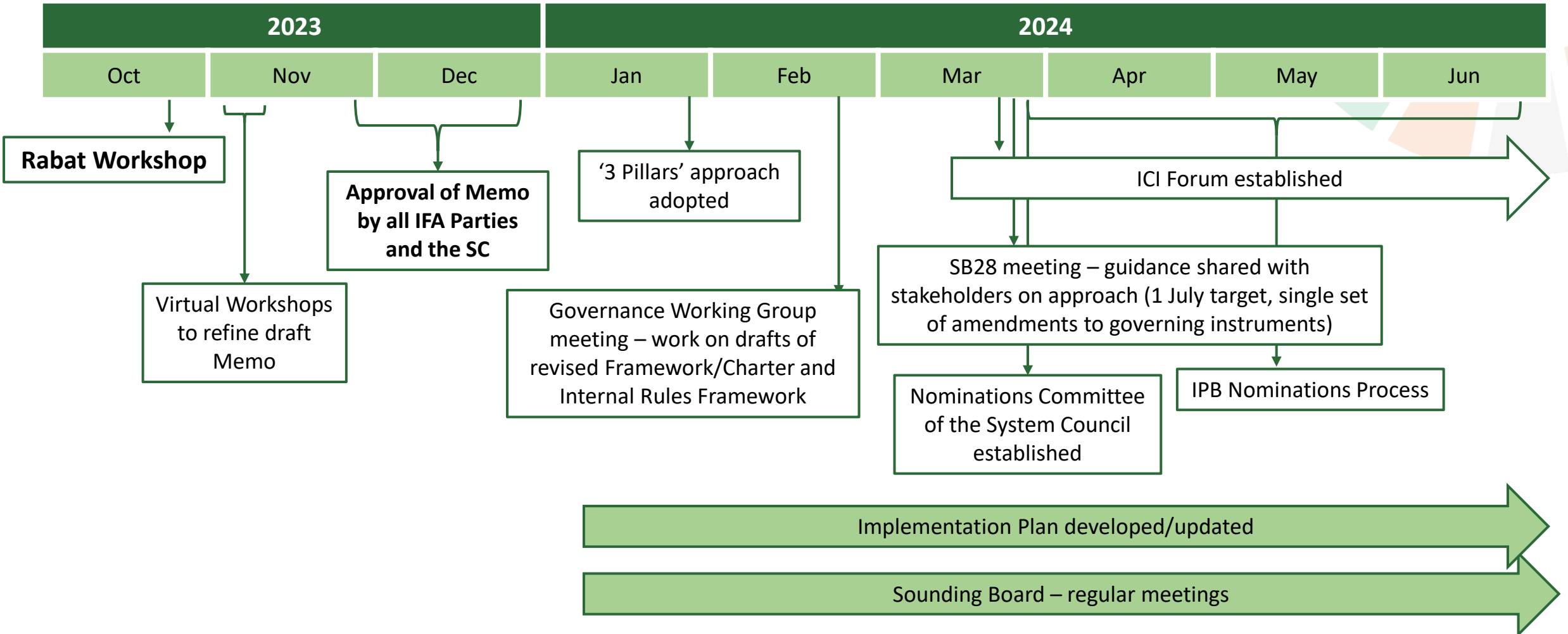
### Reporting to the Parties and the System Council

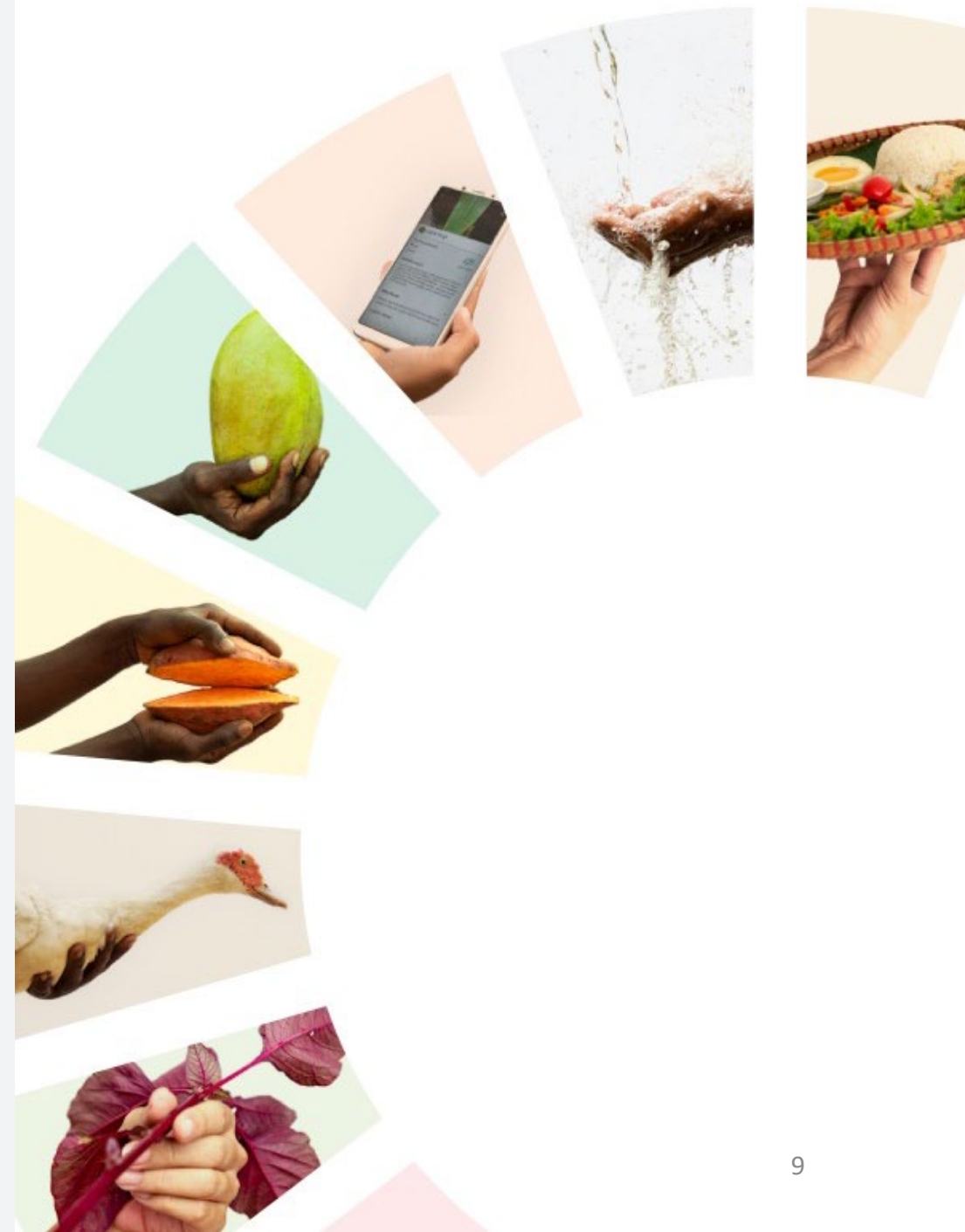

## IPB established (Pillar 1)

- Adhoc Nominations Committee established by the System Board

### ICI Process (Pillar 2)

- ✓ A **robust and durable approach** to identification, prioritization and implementation of integration and coordination across CGIAR
- ✓ A way to **bring together and systematize existing integrated/coordinated efforts** (without pausing or discouraging what is already underway)
- ✓ **Center-led and consensus-driven** – supported by expertise from across the Centers and by Communities of Practice, CGIAR global and ad hoc groups
- ✓ Structured around **business cases** to objectively assess rationale for an approach against a set of agreed principles
- ✓ A dynamic approach based on **continuous improvement**
- ✓ A clear pathway to **identification of CGIAR policy needs**

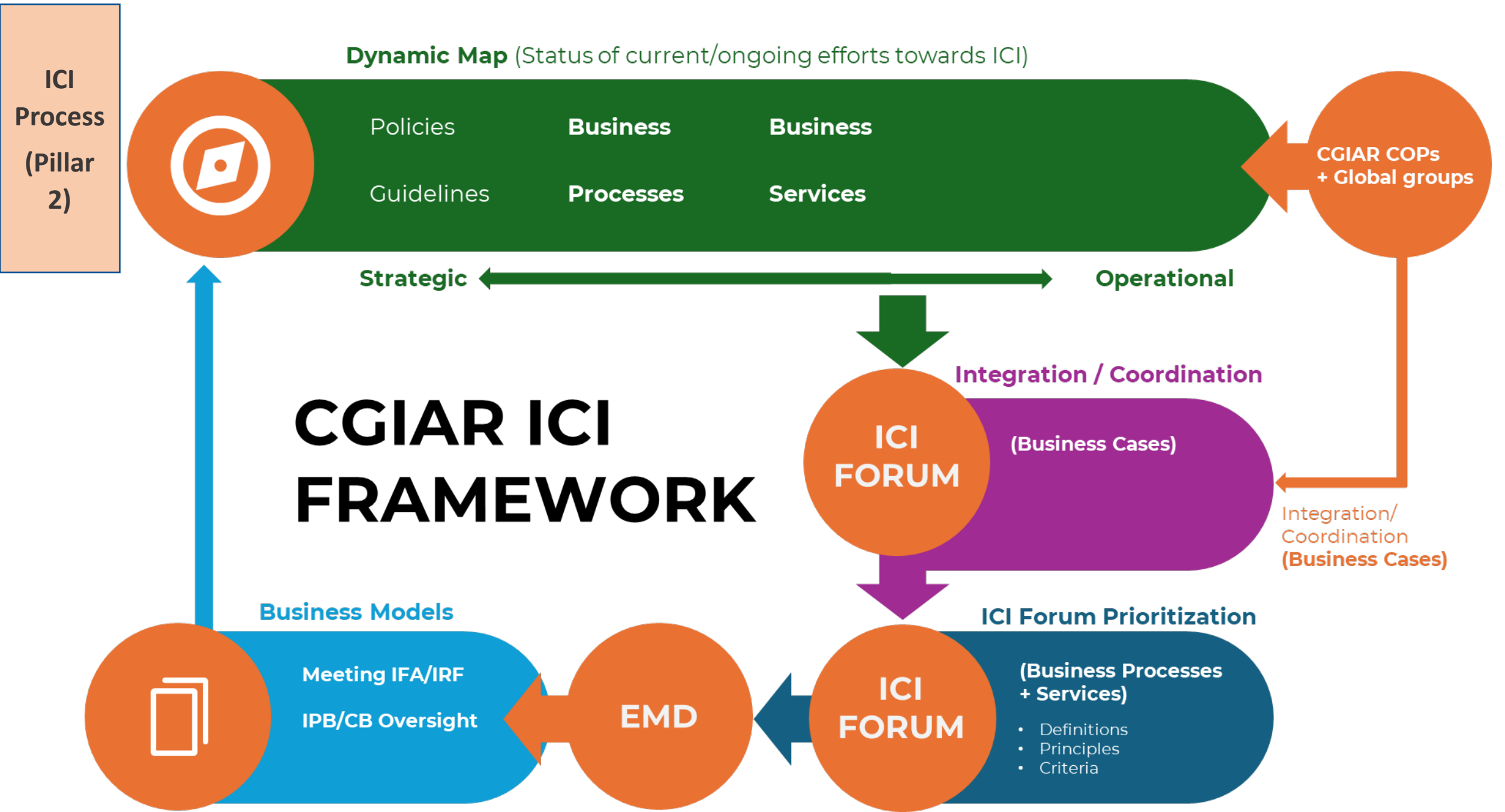


### Dynamic Map

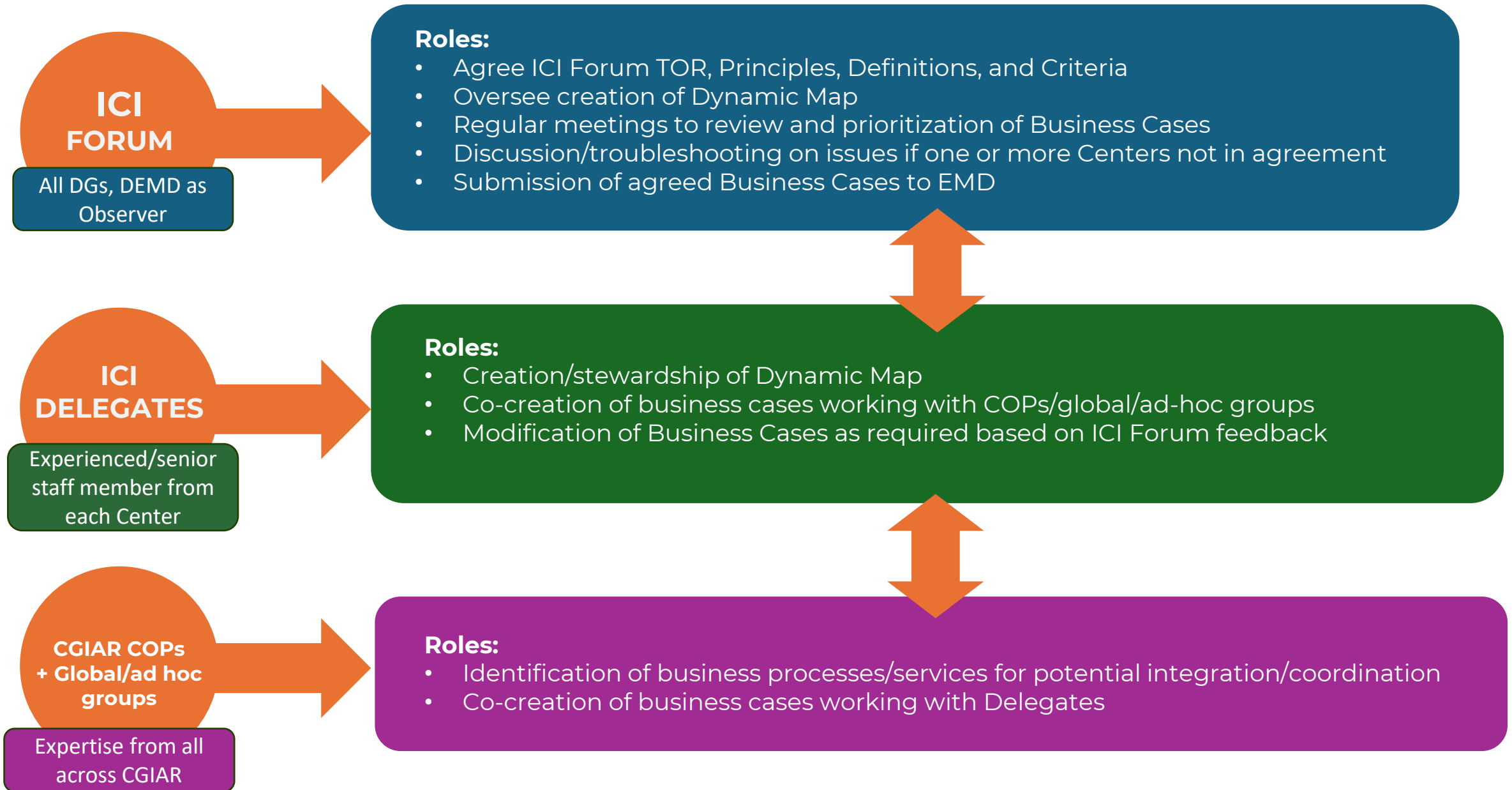
- Interactive tool that maps business processes and services across the main functional areas of the Integrated Partnership

#### Purpose:

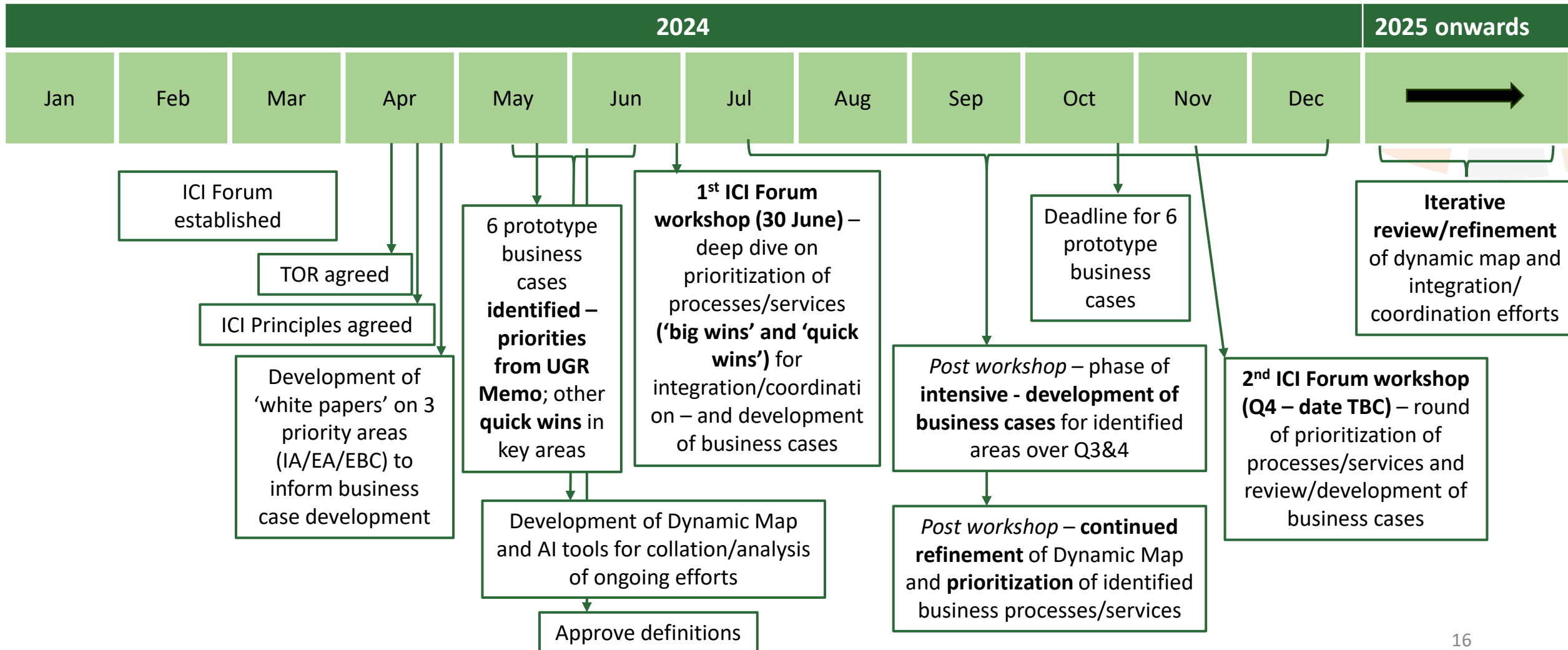
- To identify opportunities for, and facilitate prioritization of, development of business cases for integration or coordination.

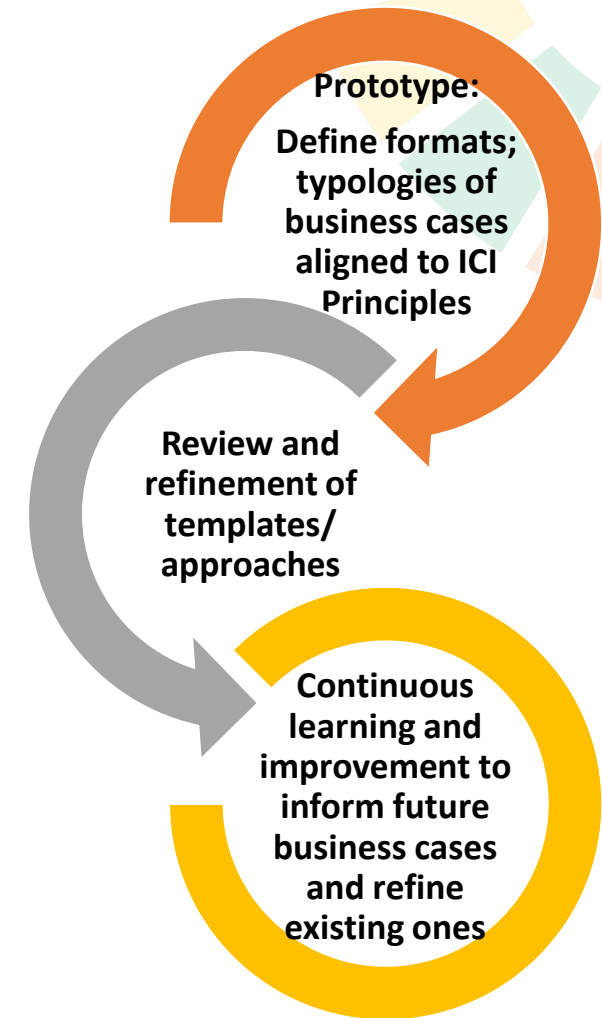

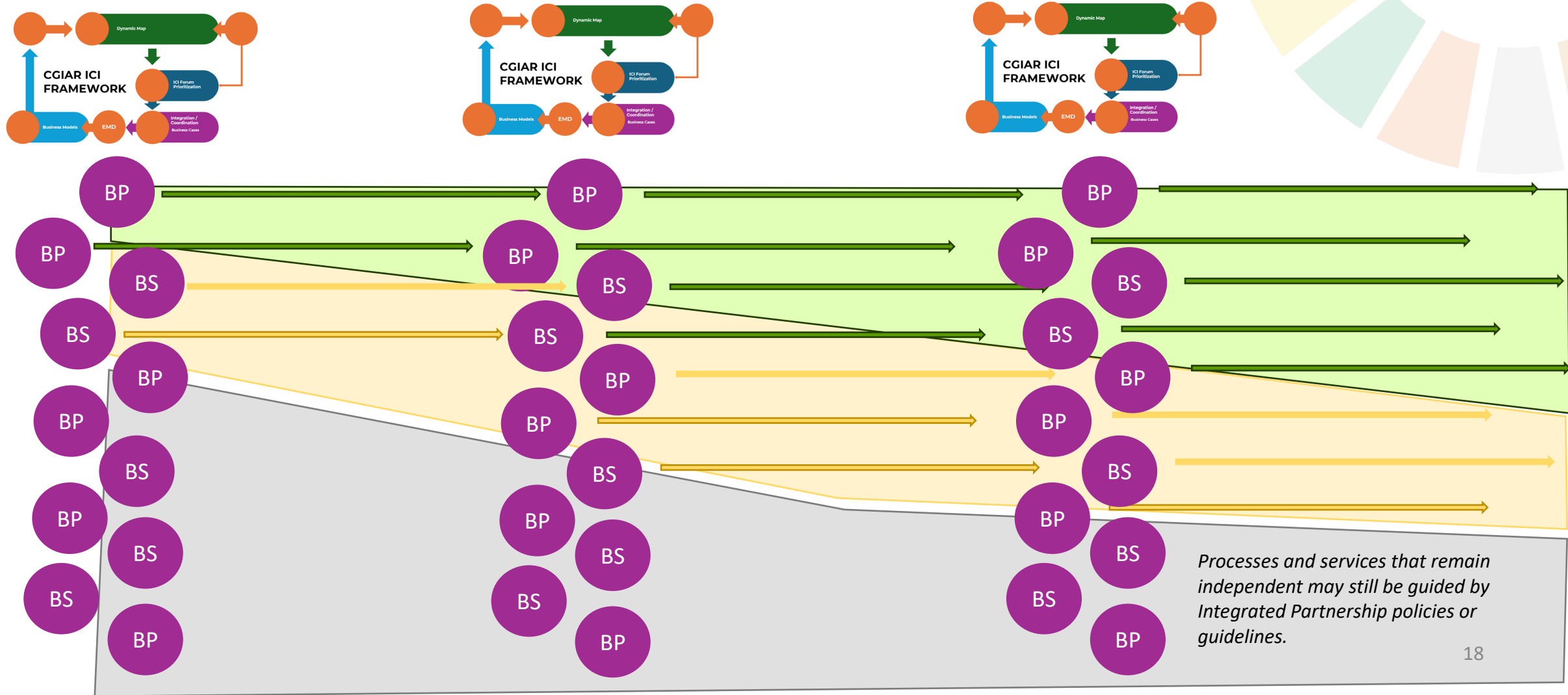
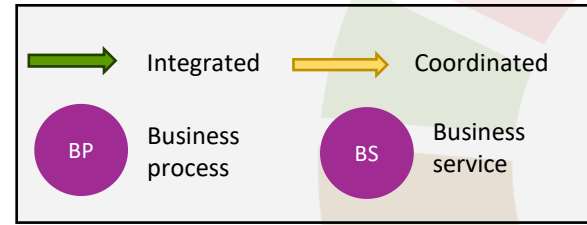

## Changes to CGIAR's governing instruments

### Governing instruments aligned (Pillar 3)

- The System Board recommended that on 1 July 2024 the changes to the System Framework and the Charter of the System Organization become effective
- Initially conceived as a '2-phase' approach, the Governance Working Group followed guidance to develop a proposed single set of changes to implement the UGR Memo
- Drafts circulated on 22 May for consultation among System Council, System Board and Centers (deadline for feedback of 5 June)
- Based on inputs received, final versions to be developed by the Governance Working Group and circulated for decision (approval of changes then required by System Council, System Board and 2/3 of Centers)
- **Targeting approval ready for 1 July 2024 effective date**

## Extract from Memo – High-level roles of the System Council & IPB

### Governing instruments aligned (Pillar 3)

From Proposal 4 of the Memo (first para, page 8) and Proposal 5a (page 9) and 5c (page 11):

**System Council** has overall oversight for the vision, strategic direction, impact, continued relevancy, adequate governance, and programmatic performance of the Integrated Partnership in a rapidly changing landscape of food, land and water systems research for development.

The System Council will ensure appropriate resources to support the delivery of the System Council approved CGIAR Strategy and Results Framework while ensuring the adequate assurance of use of funds.

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**Integrated Partnership Board** provides overall governance and assurance, and is accountable to the System Council, with respect to the implementation of the Integrated Partnership's vision, strategic direction, governance and financial and programmatic performance of the Integrated Partnership.

The Integrated Partnership Board shall be the governance body of the CGIAR System Organization and of the Integrated Partnership, setting the strategic direction and priorities for the Integrated Partnership.

## Development of Internal Rules Framework

### Governing instruments aligned (Pillar 3)

- The IFA called for a “CGIAR Common Internal Rules Framework, subject to the approval of each Party, that will set out the collective approach regarding the development, adoption, applicability, and enforcement of Common Internal Rules”
- The Memo also set out that the Internal Rules Framework would be developed, in line with Morrow Sodali’s recommendation on this
- At the date of issue, the Governance Working Group is finalizing a draft, setting out:
  - Principles for Internal Rules
  - A proposed process of identification, development, consultation and approval of internal rules
  - Revised roles on policy identification and approval aligned to those set out in the Memo for the SC and IPB
- Approval of the IRF will be required from all IFA Parties - targeted early Q3.
