CGIAR's leadership's strategic priorities are to move from reform to an operating business model





CGIAR's community has come together in a spirit of unity and shared purpose, moving us from a period of reform to one of strategic growth.

We are building key assets through our work




A global study has been launched to study our current assets and build the business case for growing these assets, as well as identifying areas within our work that are proving to be relevant and substantial future assets.

- Which assets should be maintained to deliver on the CGIAR 2030 research strategy?
- What is the cost of upgrading and maintaining these assets?
- Where do we see redundancies in the asset base that need to be fixed?
- Where do we opportunities and capabilities to build new assets?

Progress and pathway to \$2bn / year

- Since 2018, overall funding has grown at an average of 7%/year
- To reach the investment case target of \$4bn in 2025—27/\$1.4bn in 2027, growth needs to pick up to 8.5%—10%
- Sustained 10% growth needed to reach 2bn/ year by 2030
- Meeting targets needs both bilateral and pooled to grow, as well as new sources of funding




